FIG. 9 is an enlarged front view thereof; and,

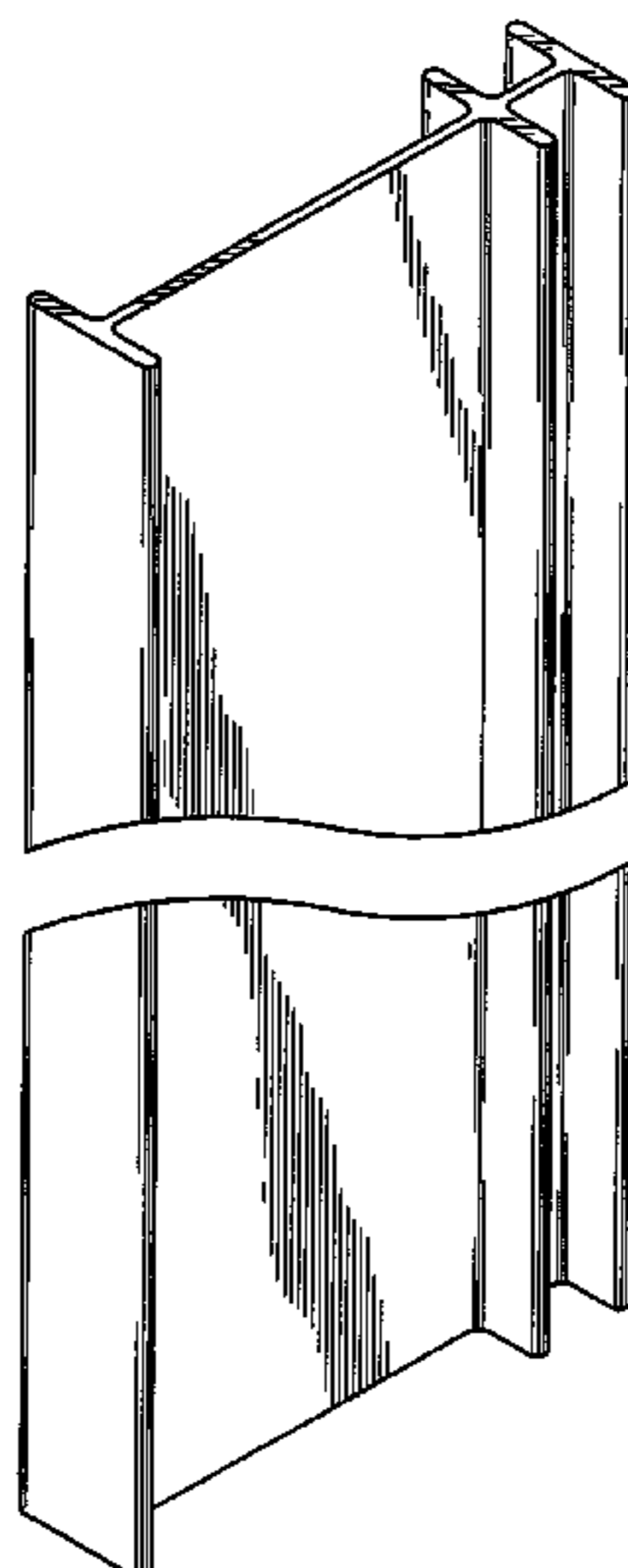
FIG. 10 is a top plan view thereof. The bottom view is identical to the top view.

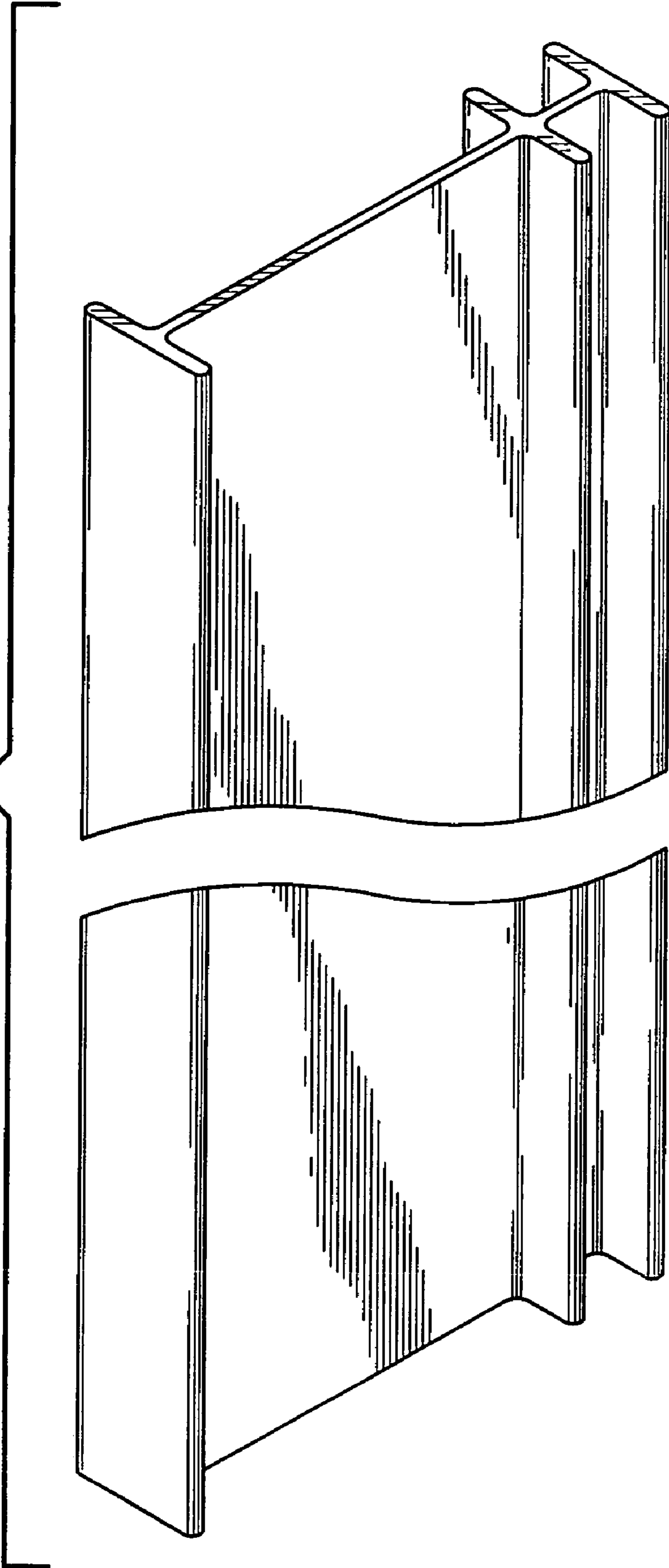

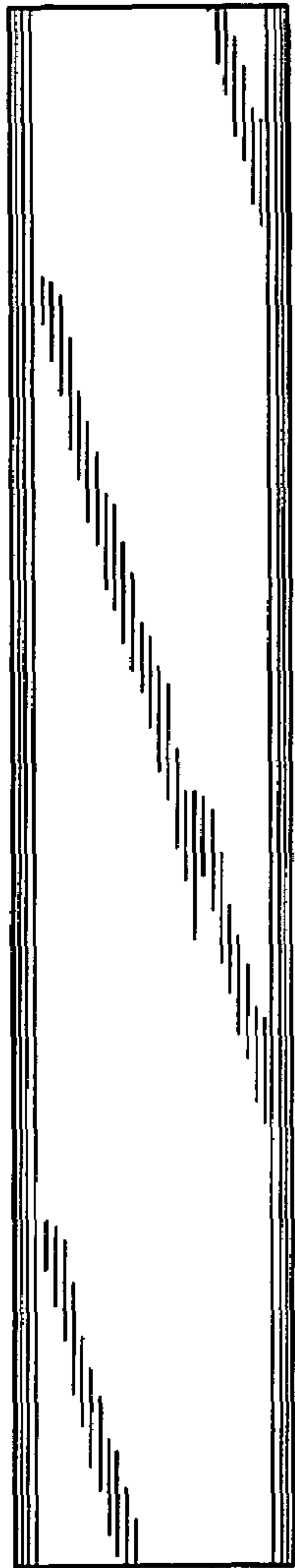

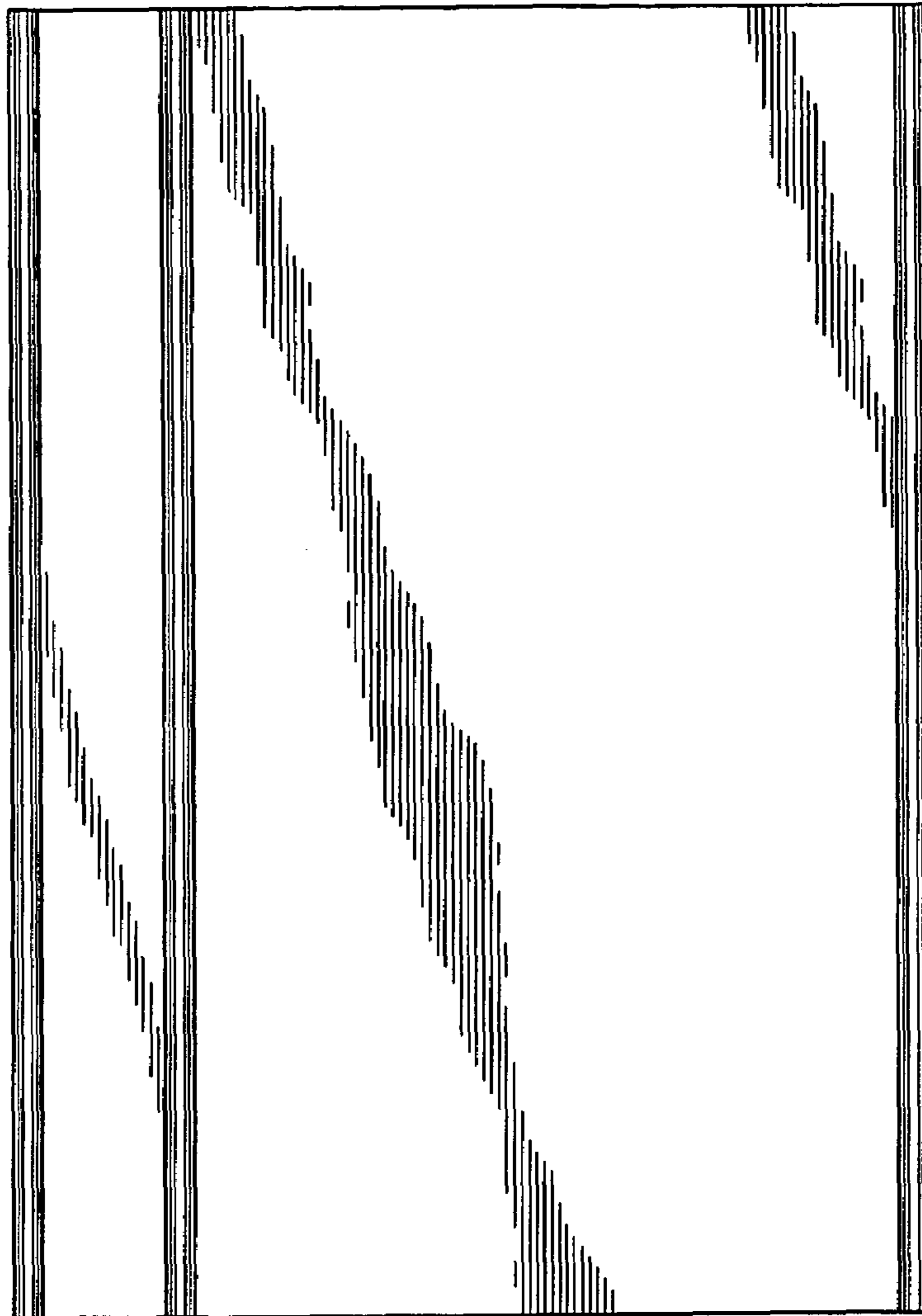

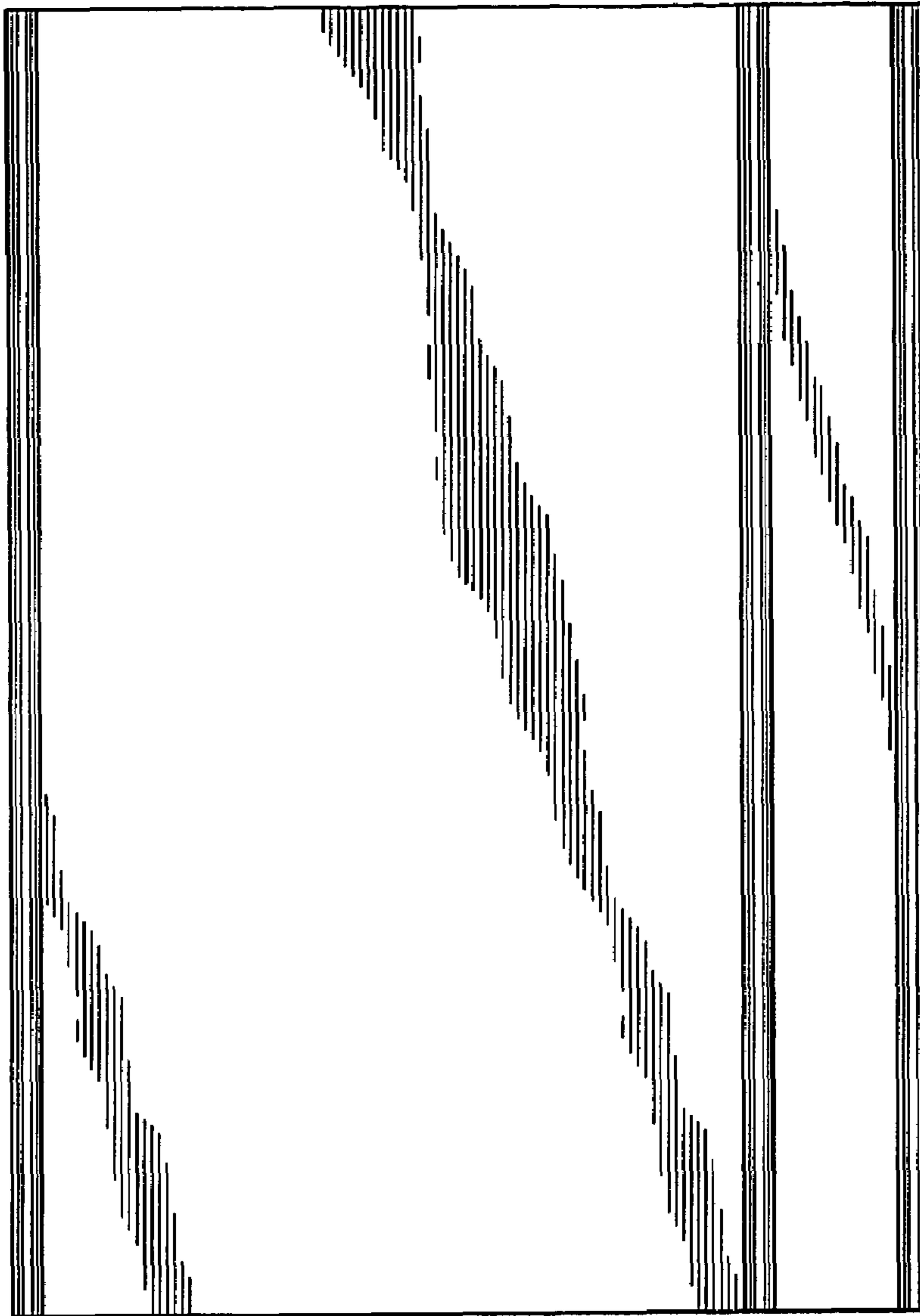




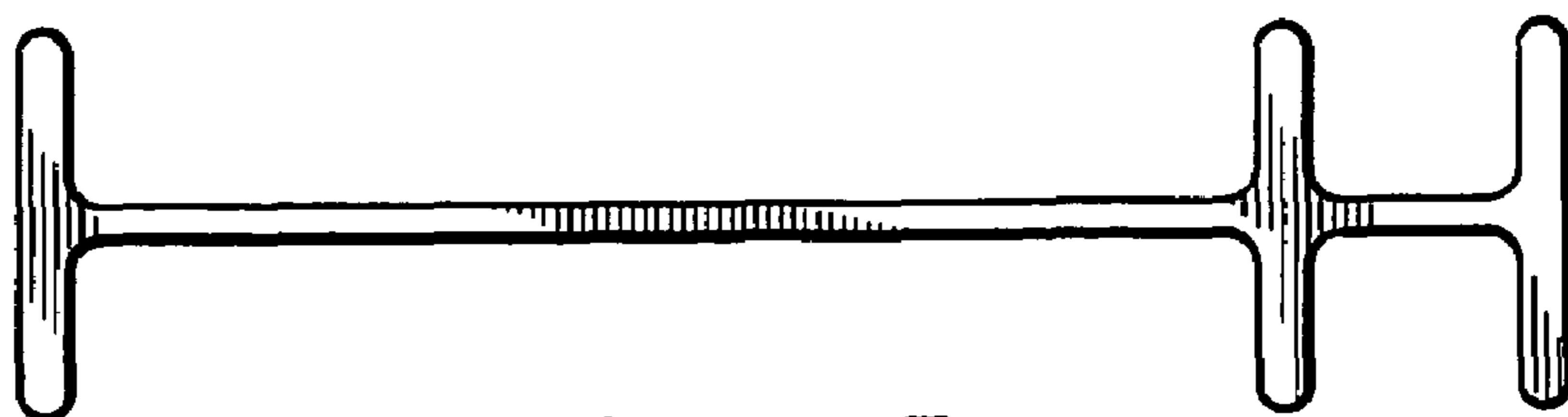

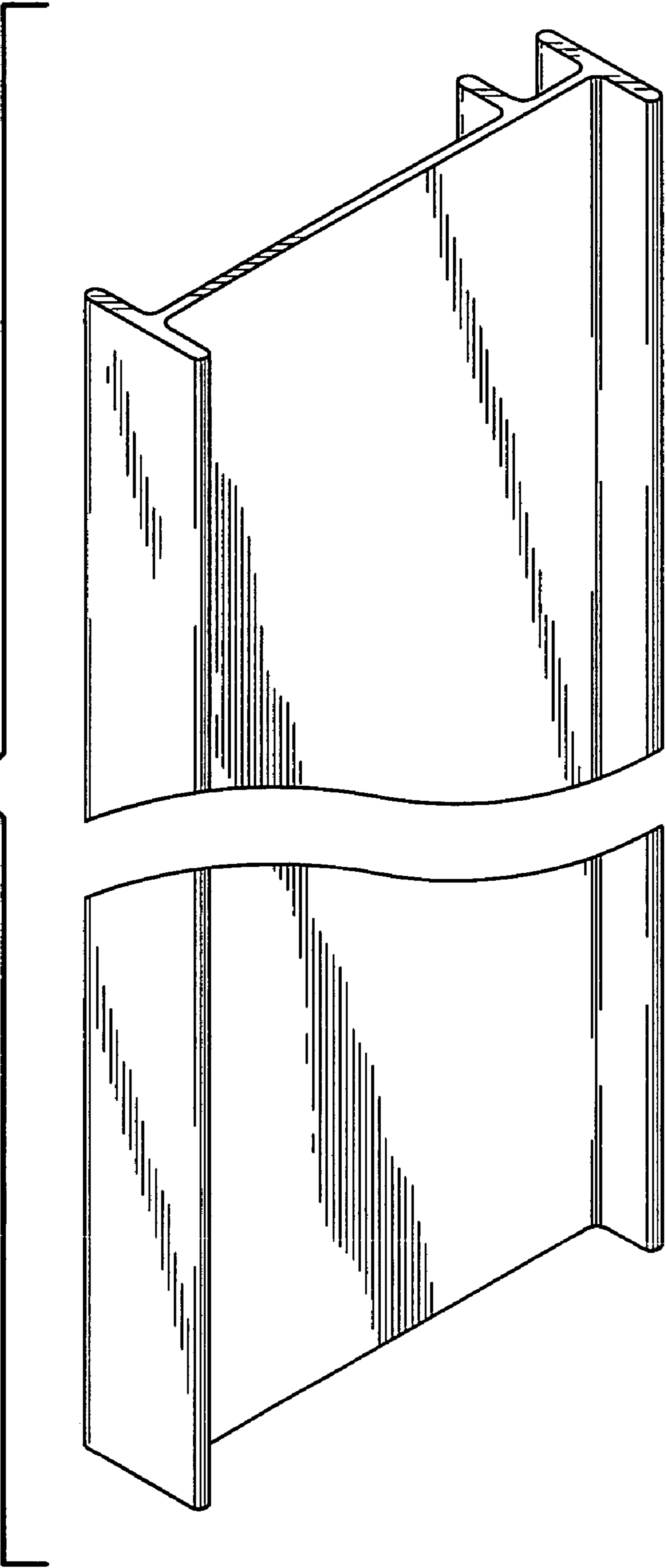


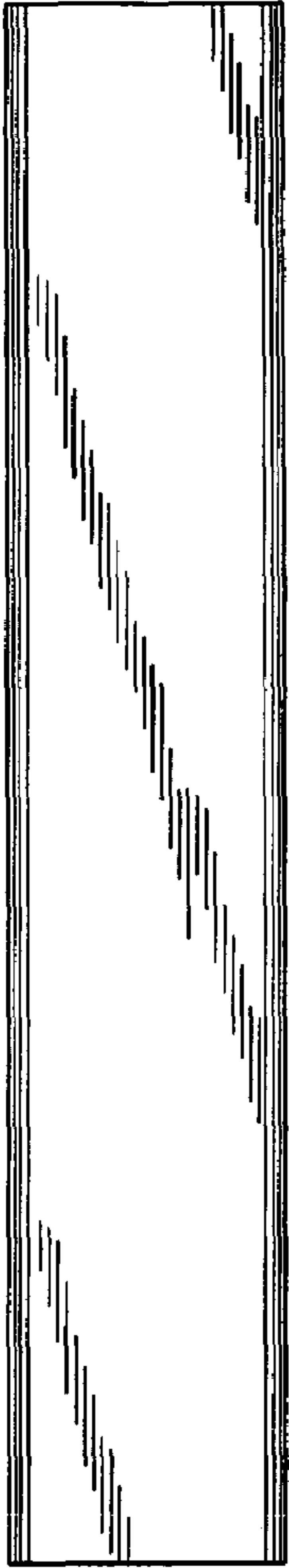

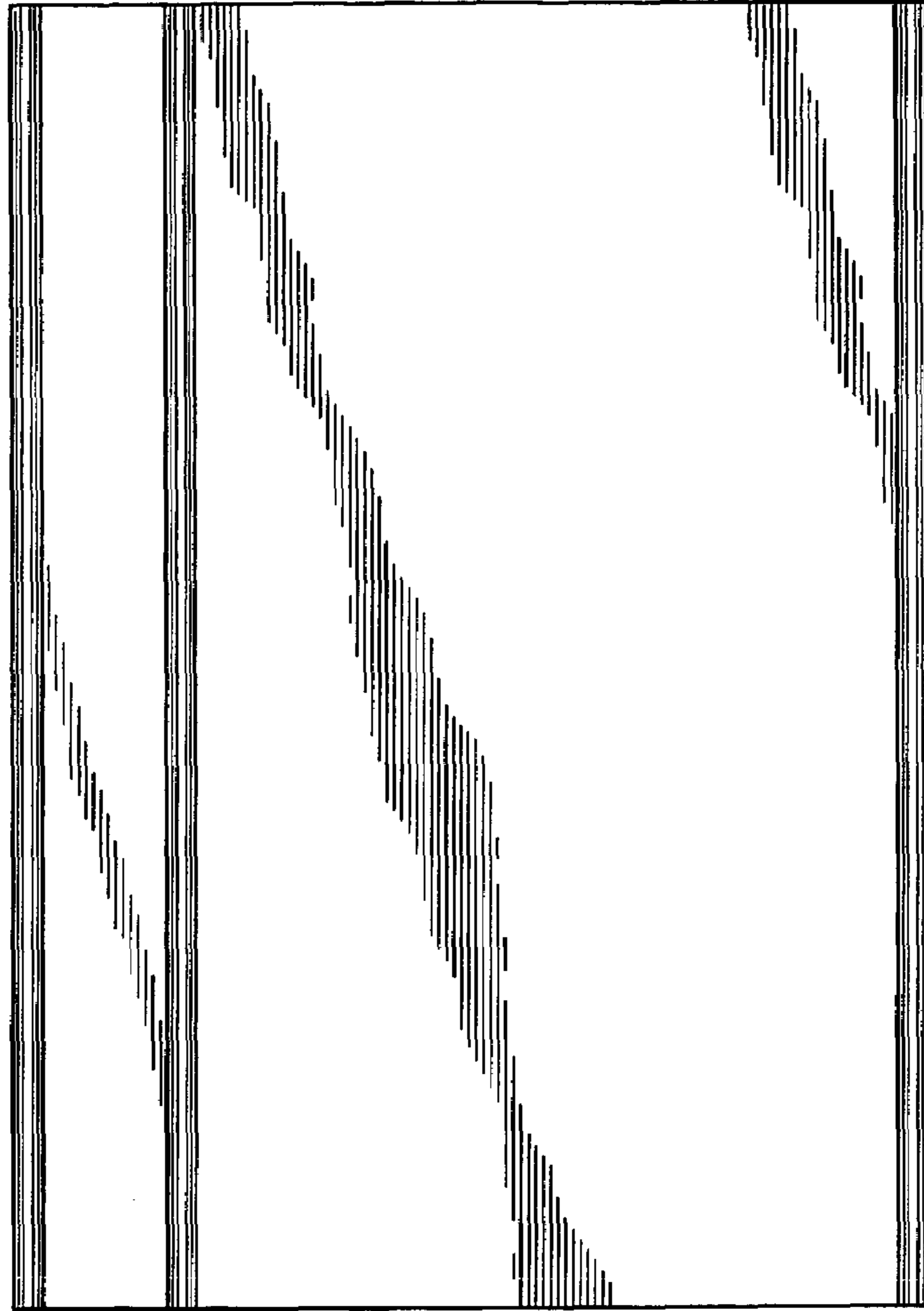

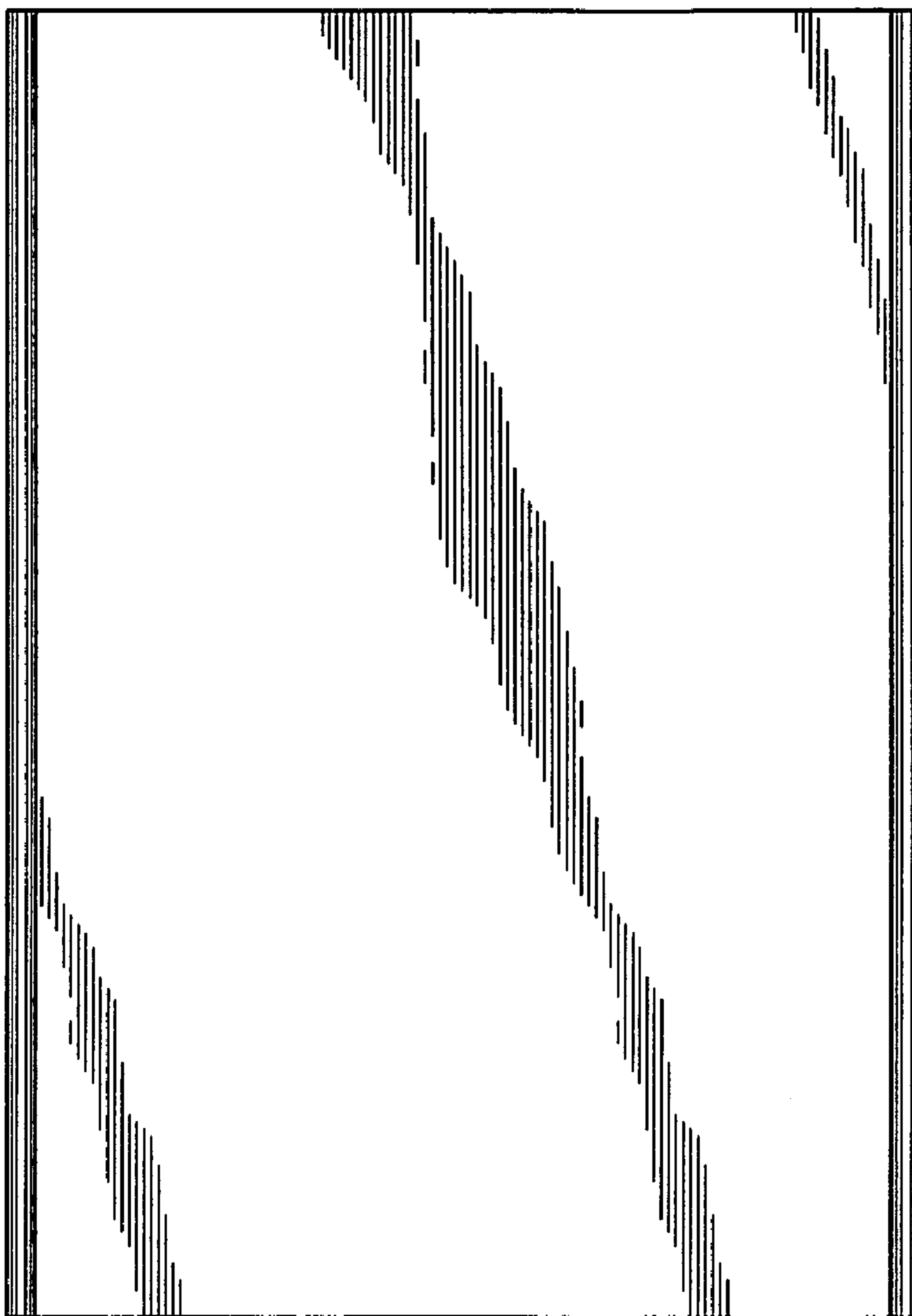




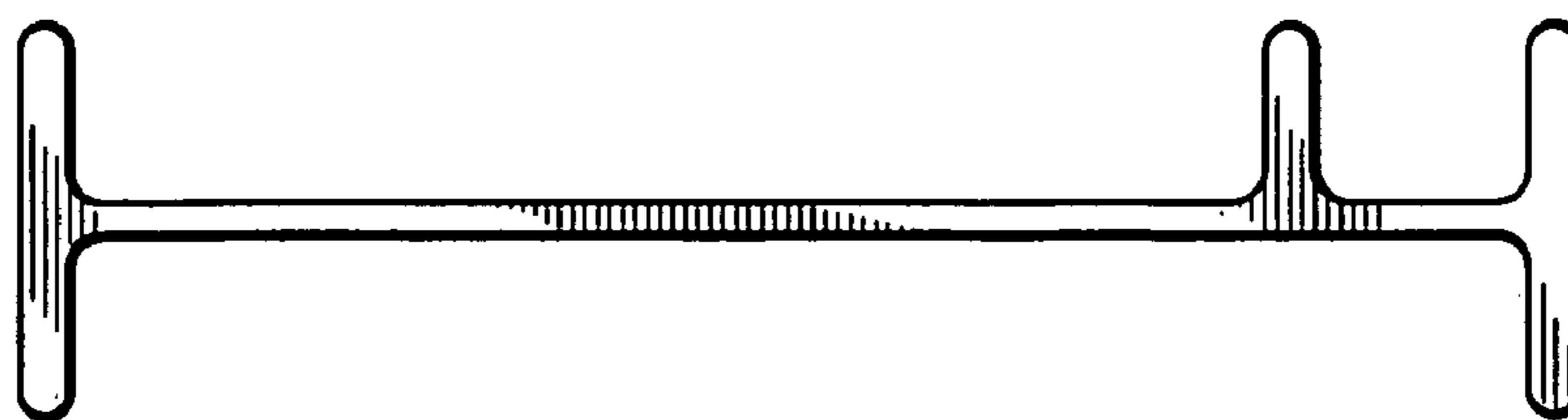
