(57) **CLAIM**

I claim the ornamental design for a seat, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 9 is a perspective view of this further embodiment of the seat.

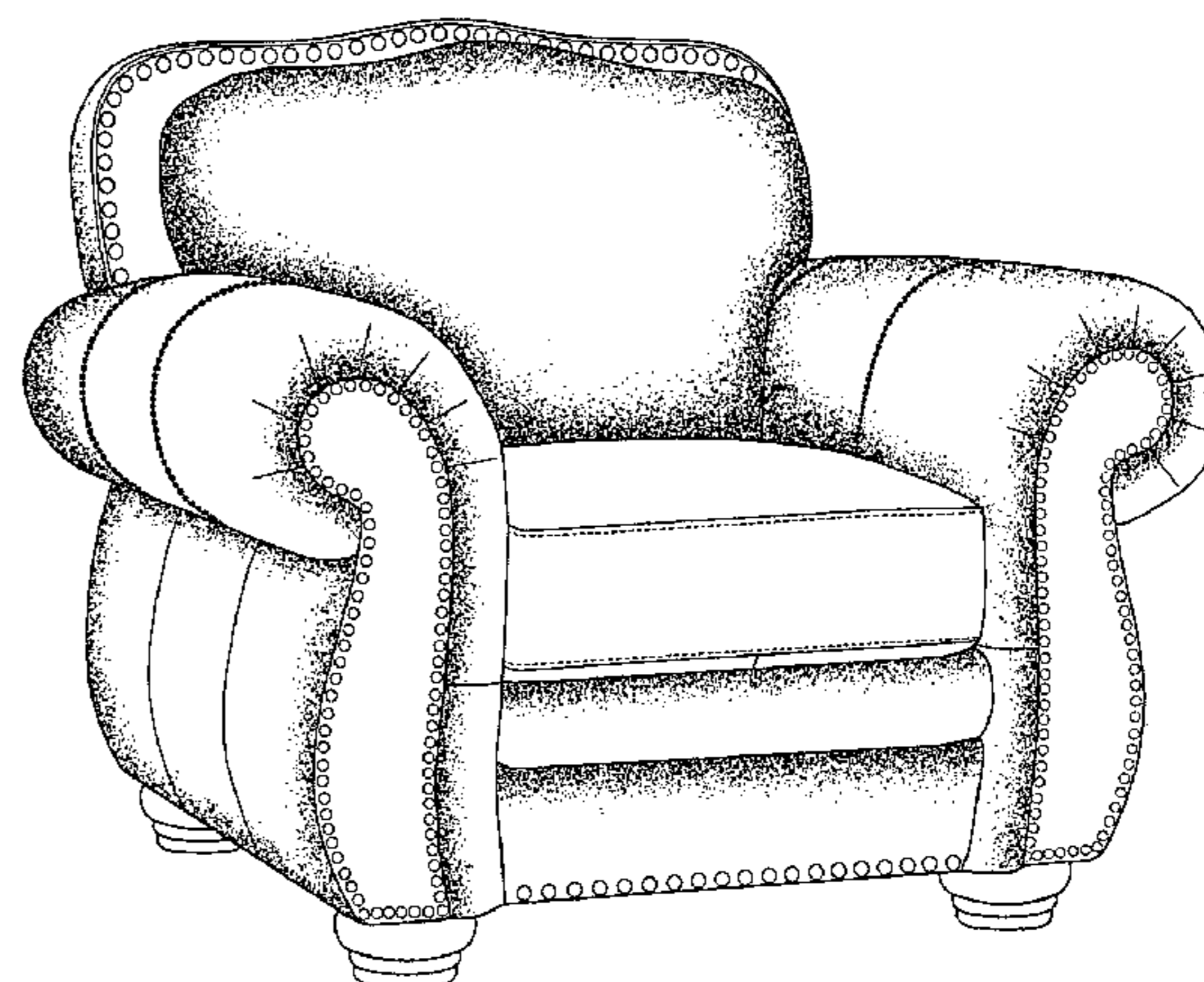
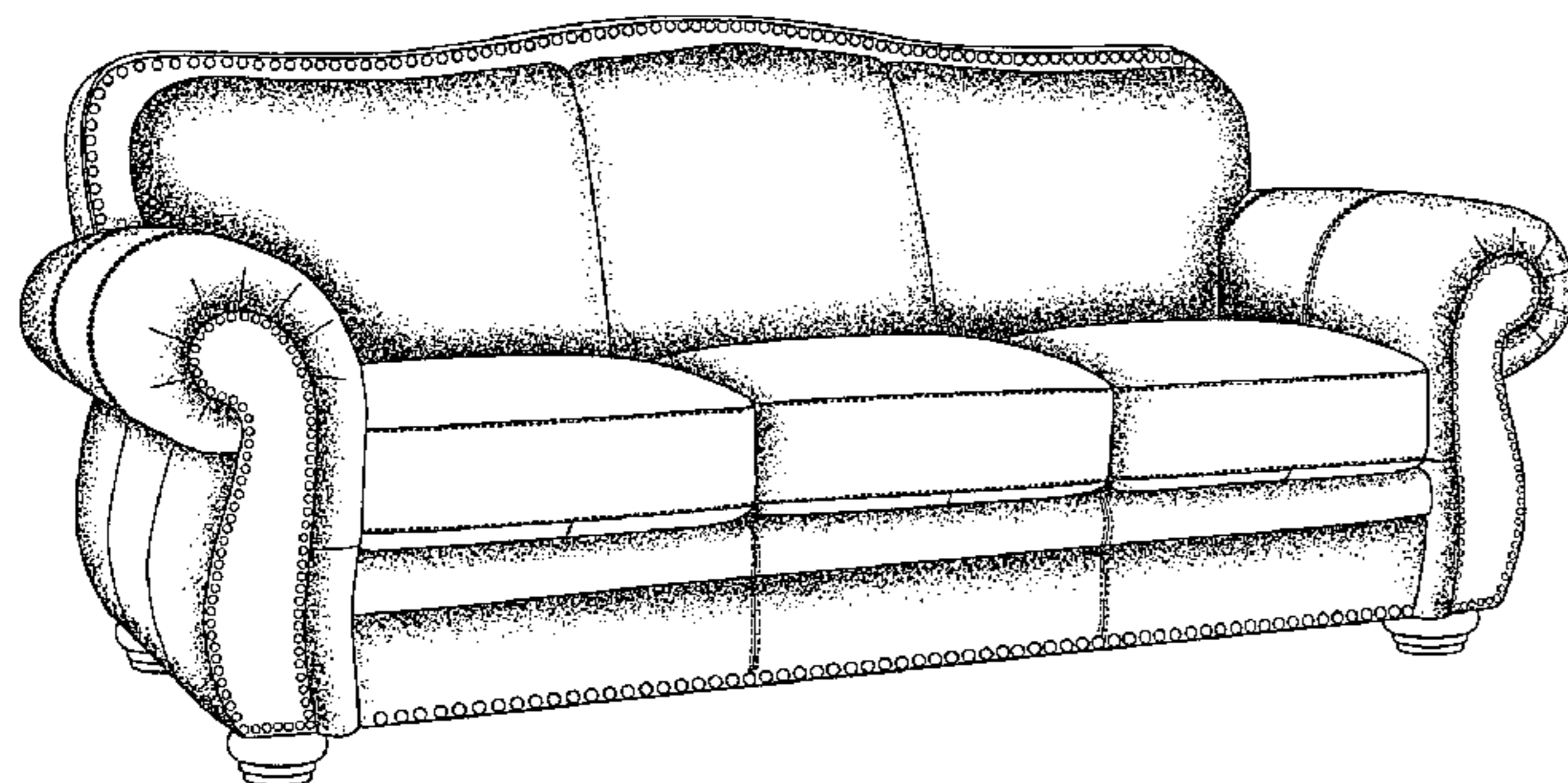
FIG. 10 is a rear view of this further embodiment of the seat.

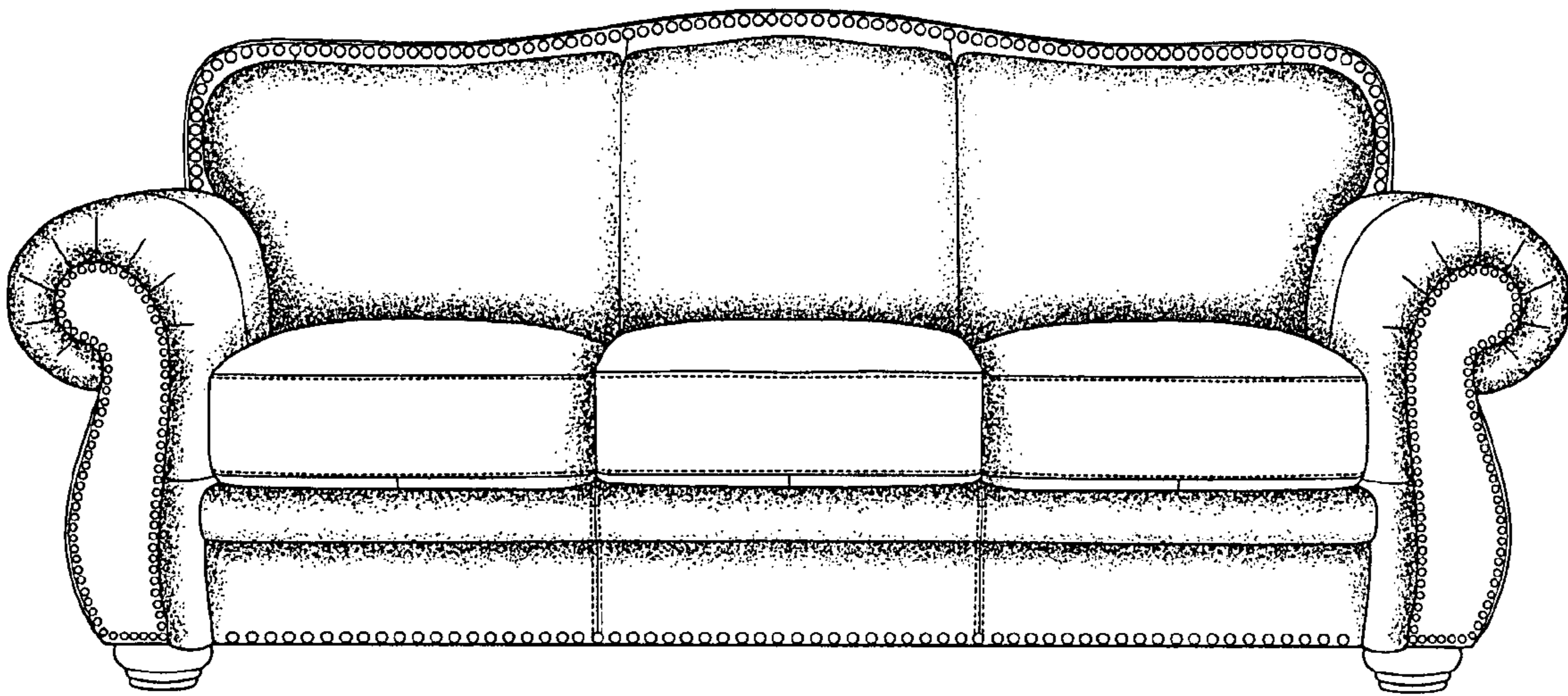

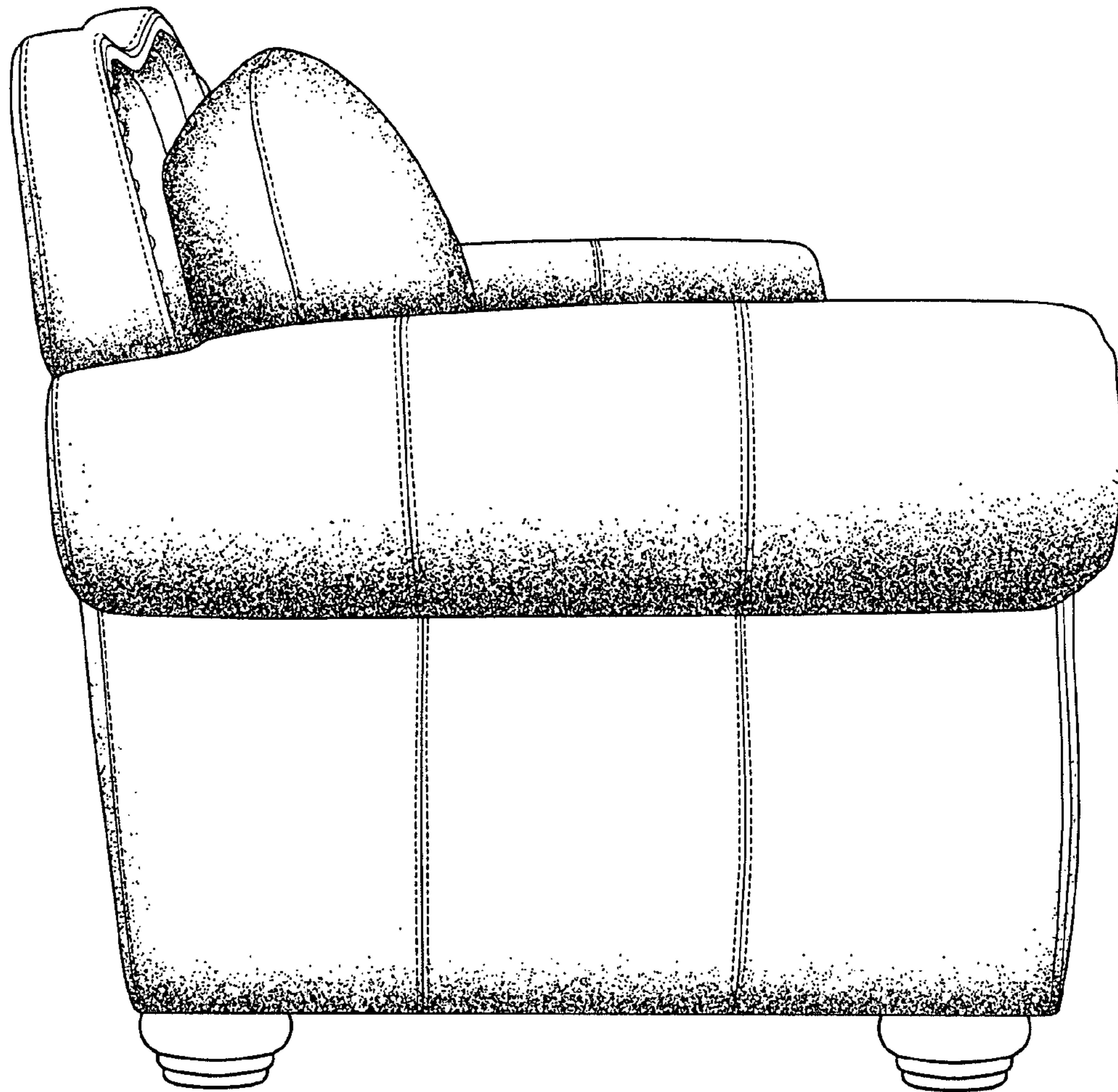

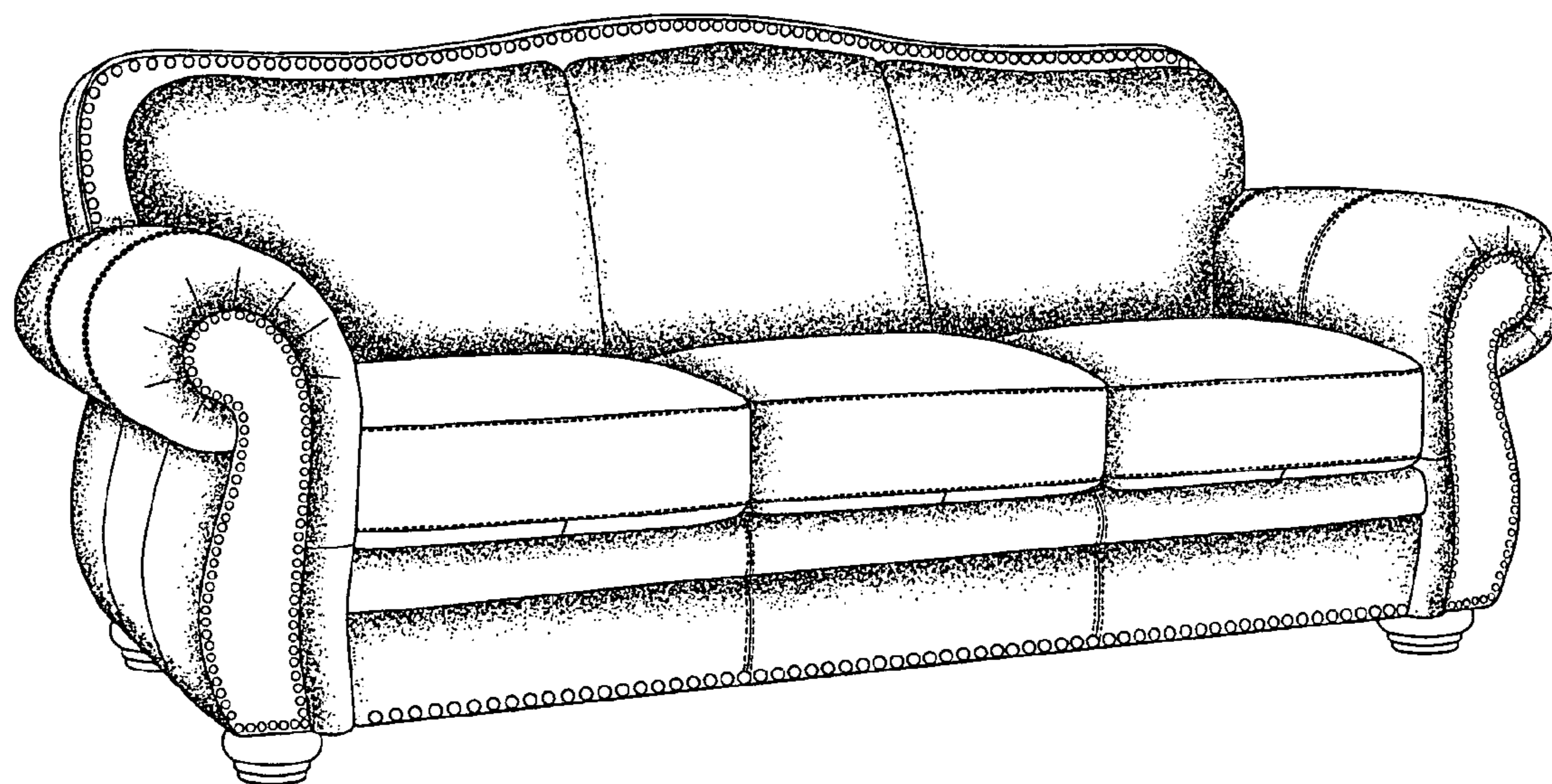

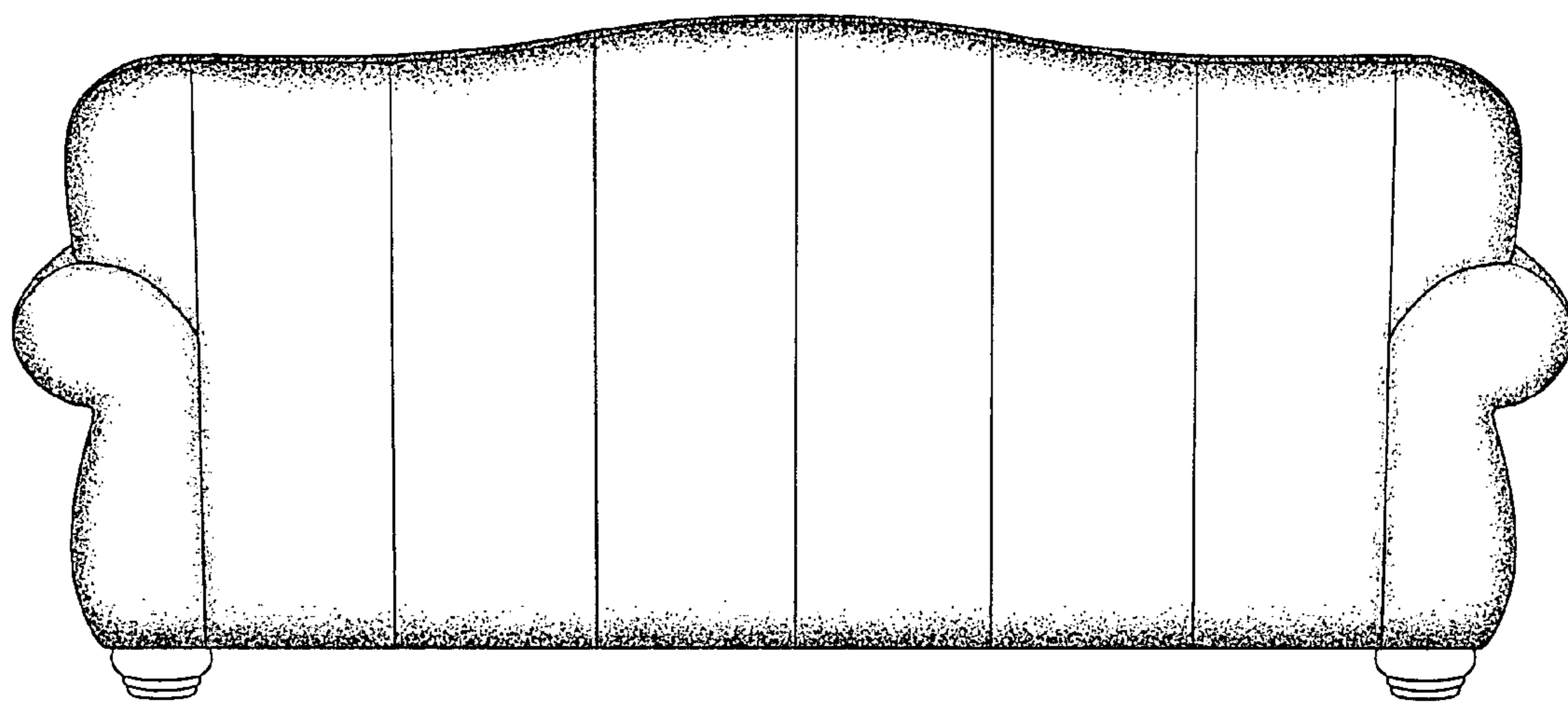

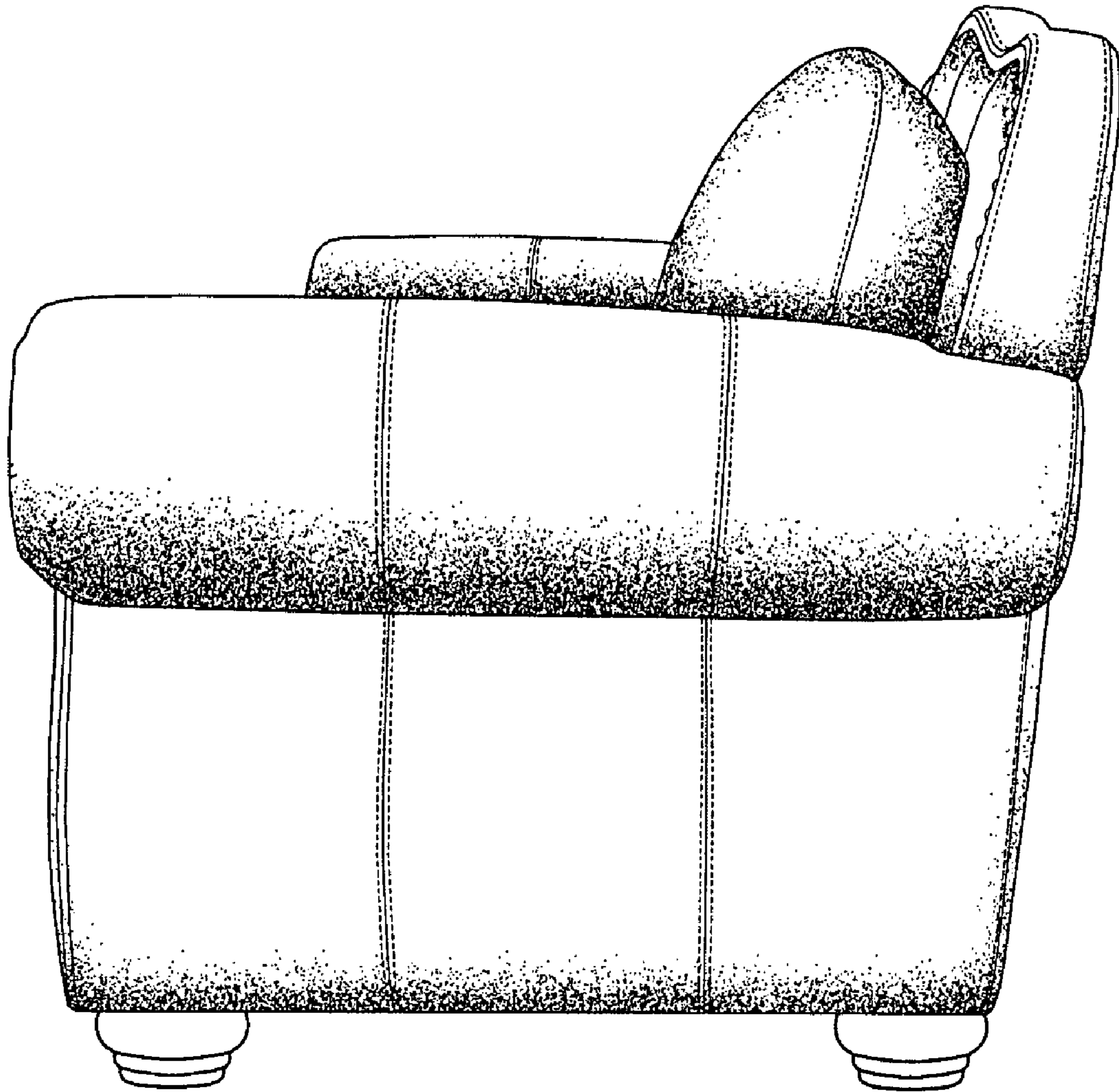

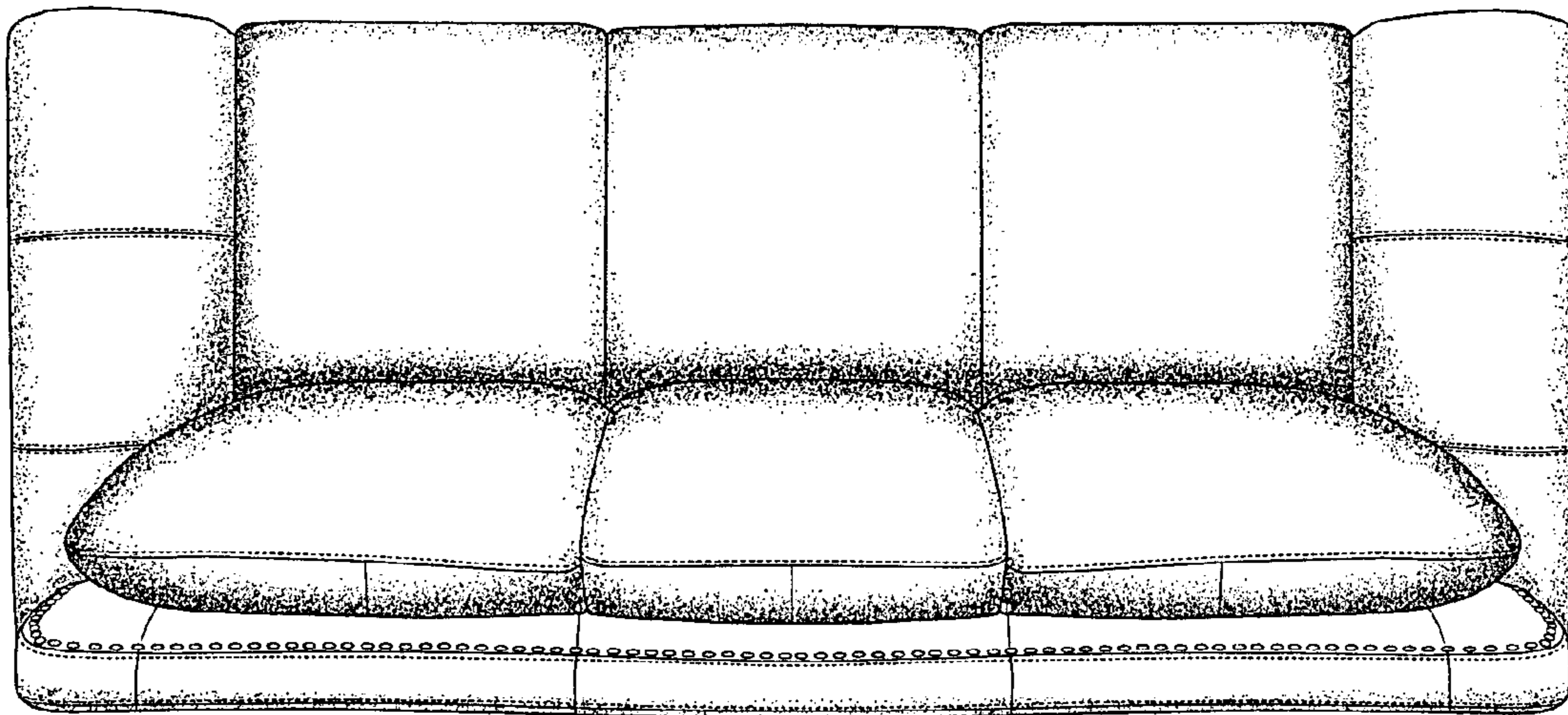

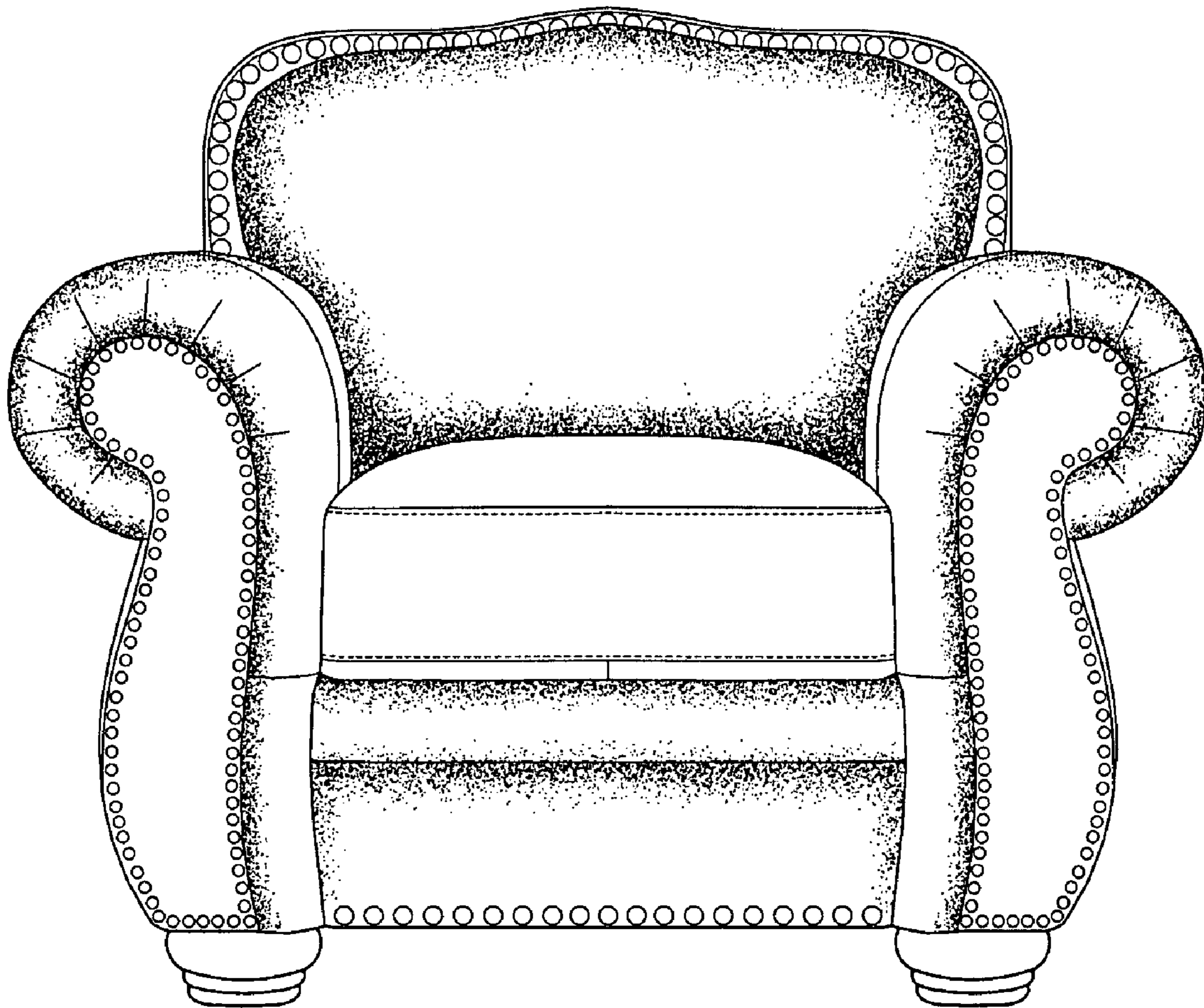

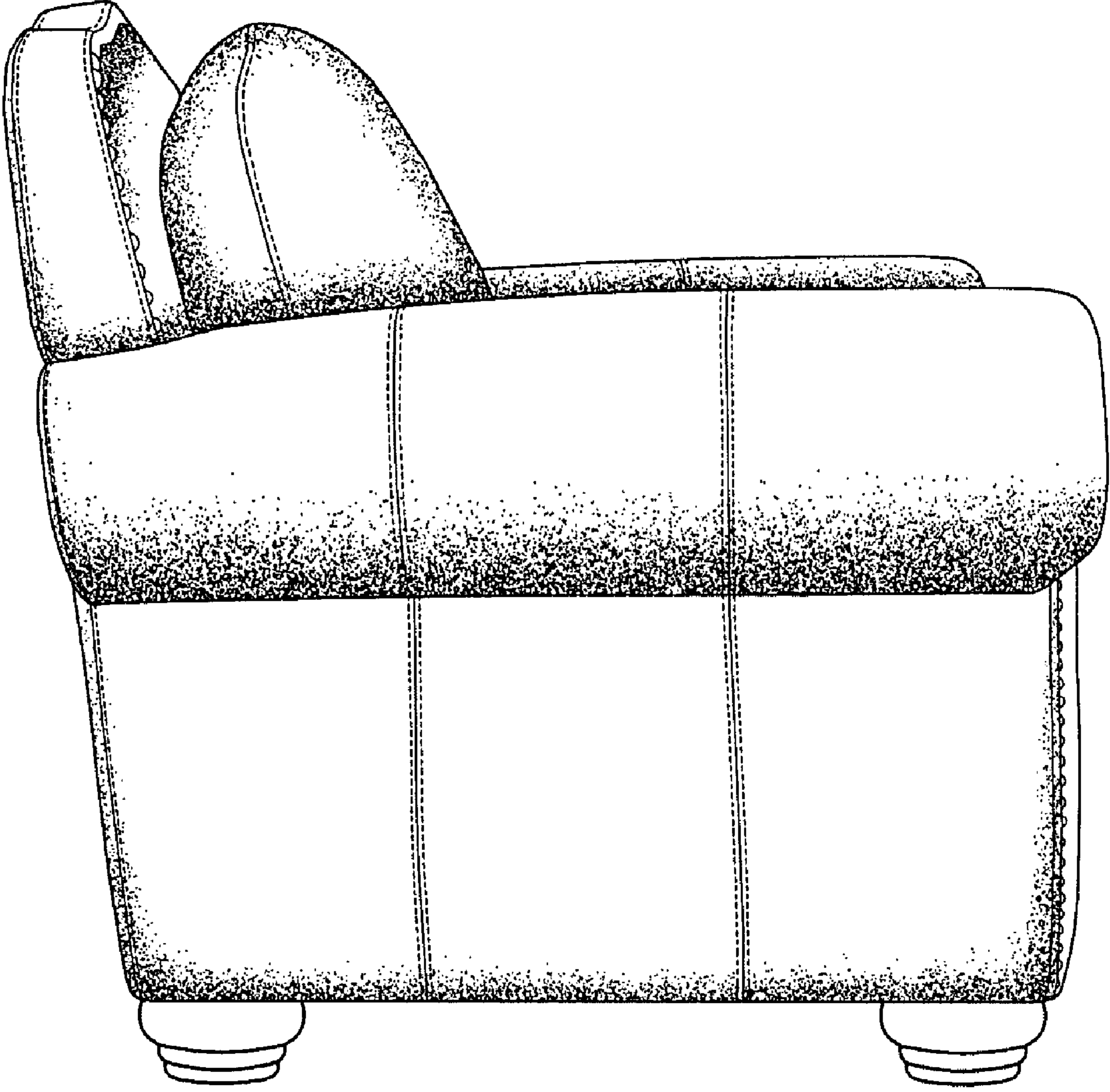

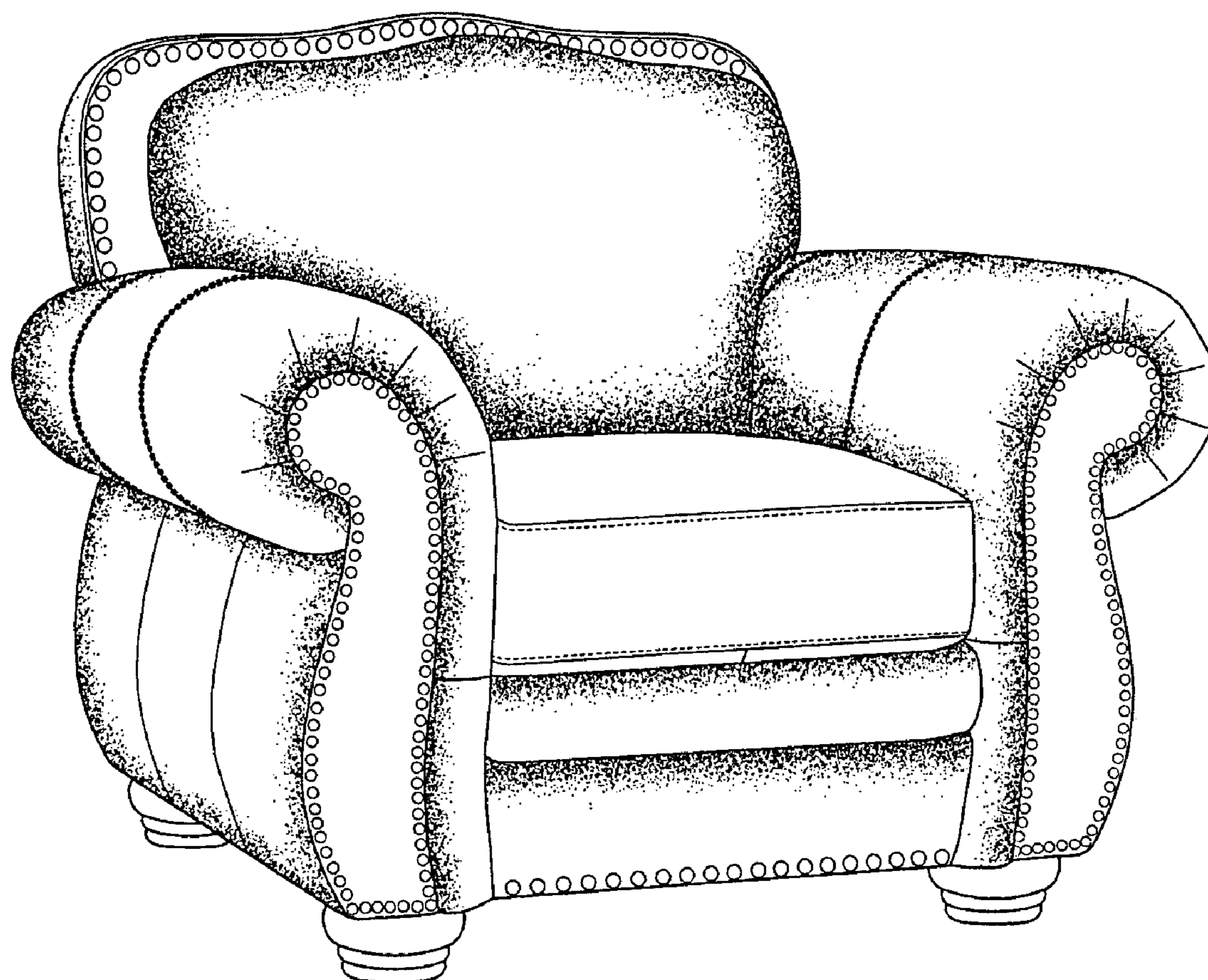

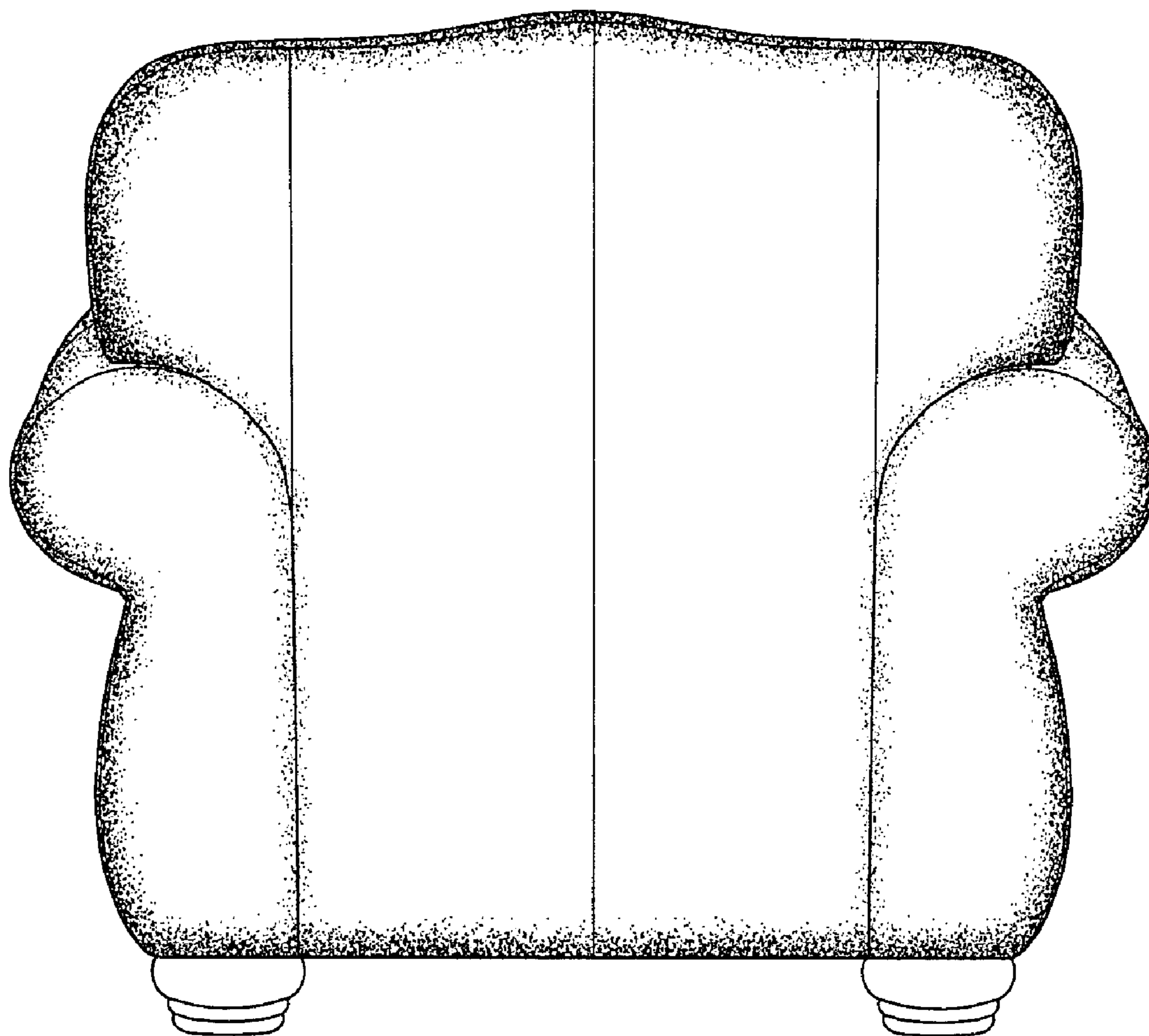

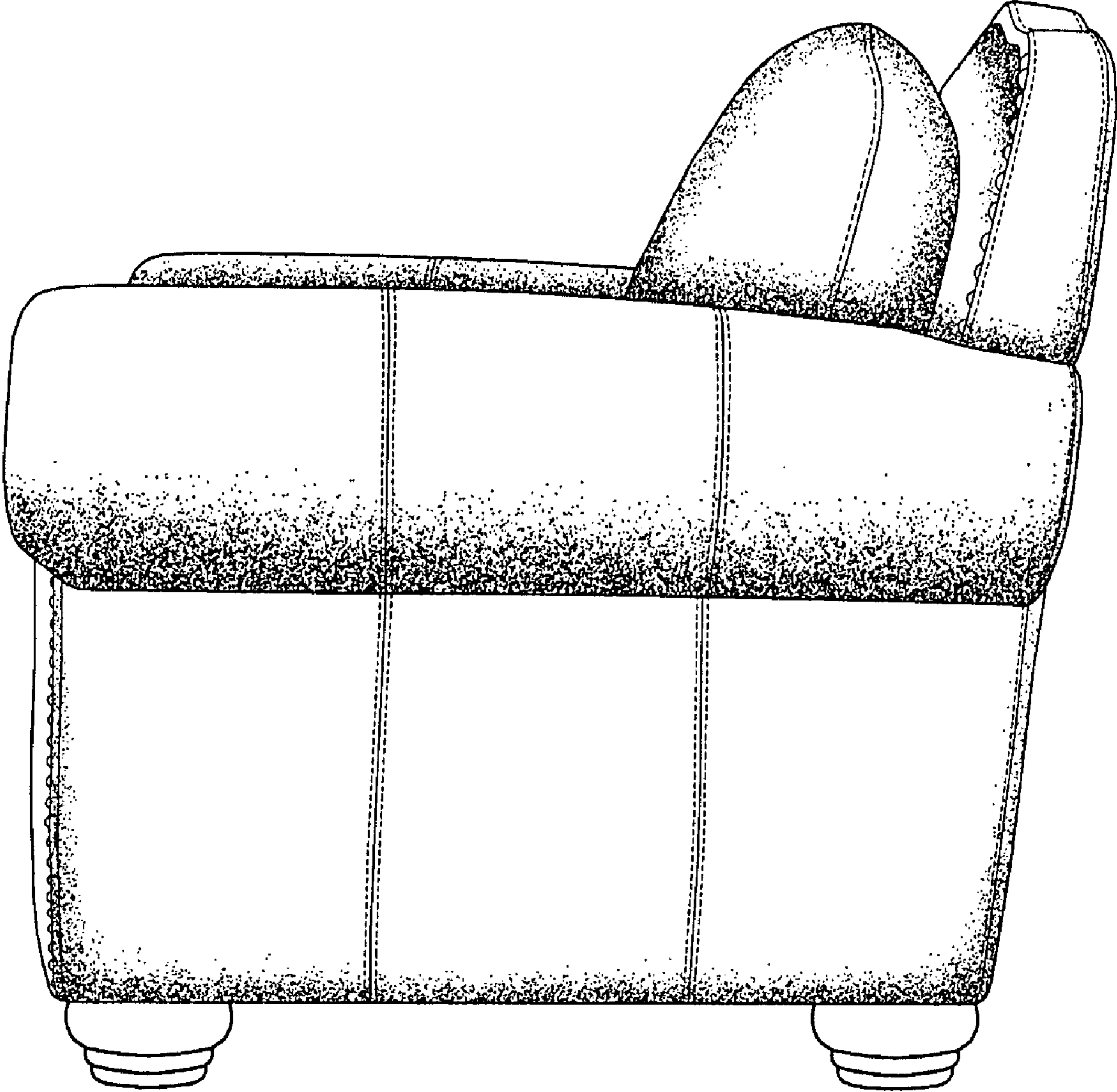

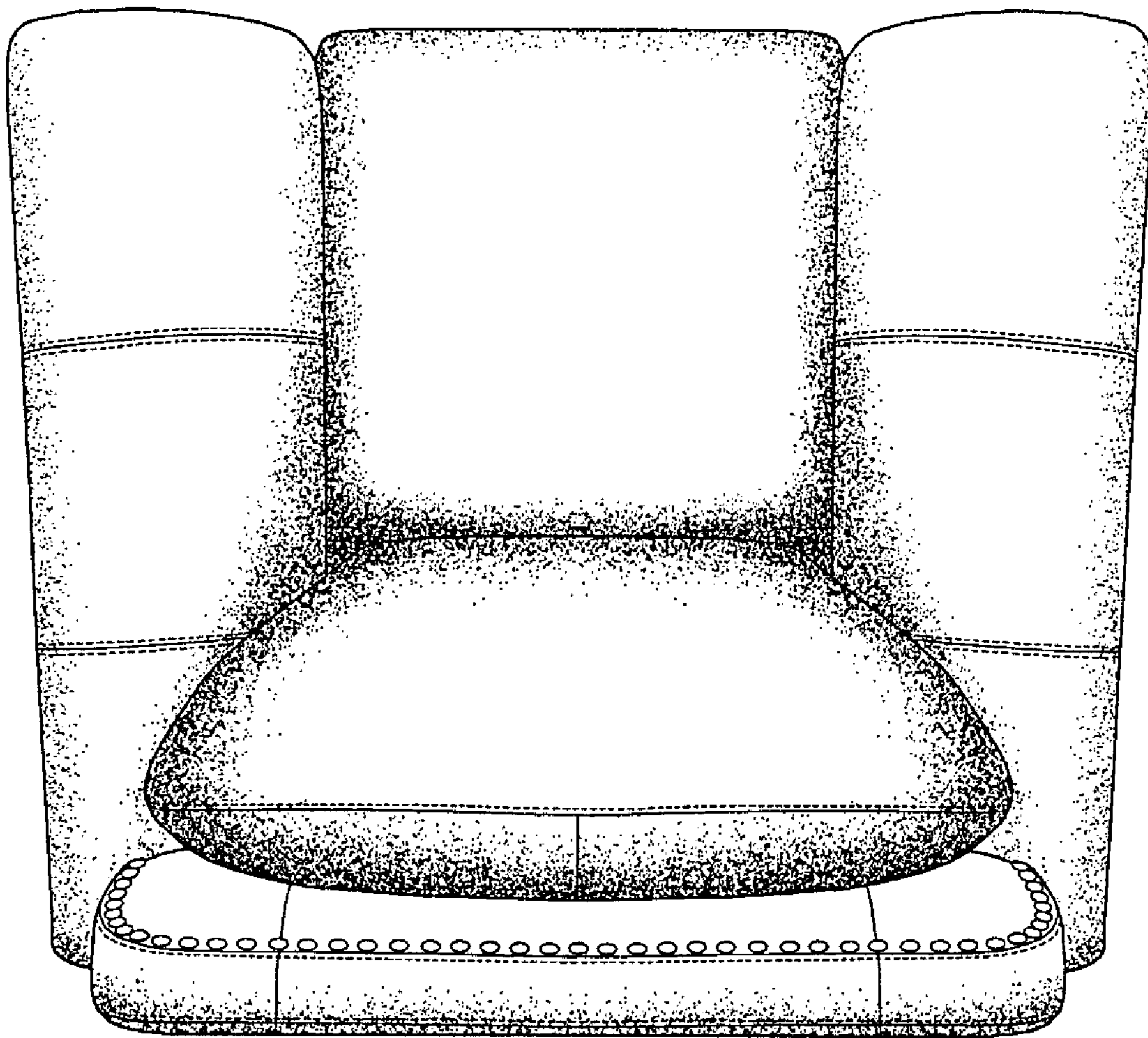
