FIG. 2 is a top view thereof;

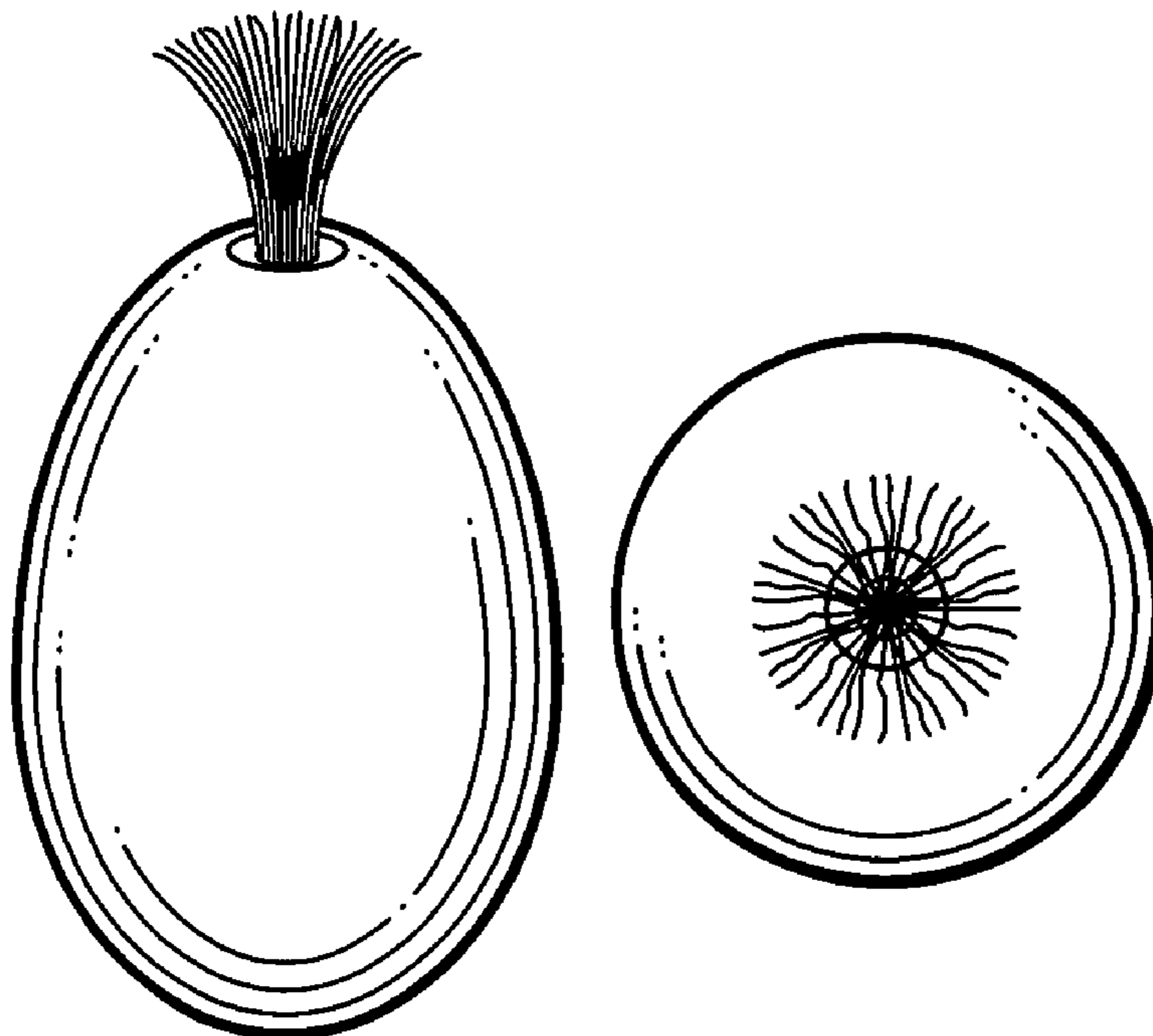
FIG. 3 is a bottom view thereof;

The design consists partly of hair-like bristles. Inconsisten-
cies between the way the bristles appear in the different
views are understood to be caused by the variations in the
organic material of the bristles, and to the different view-
points from which the claimed design is shown.

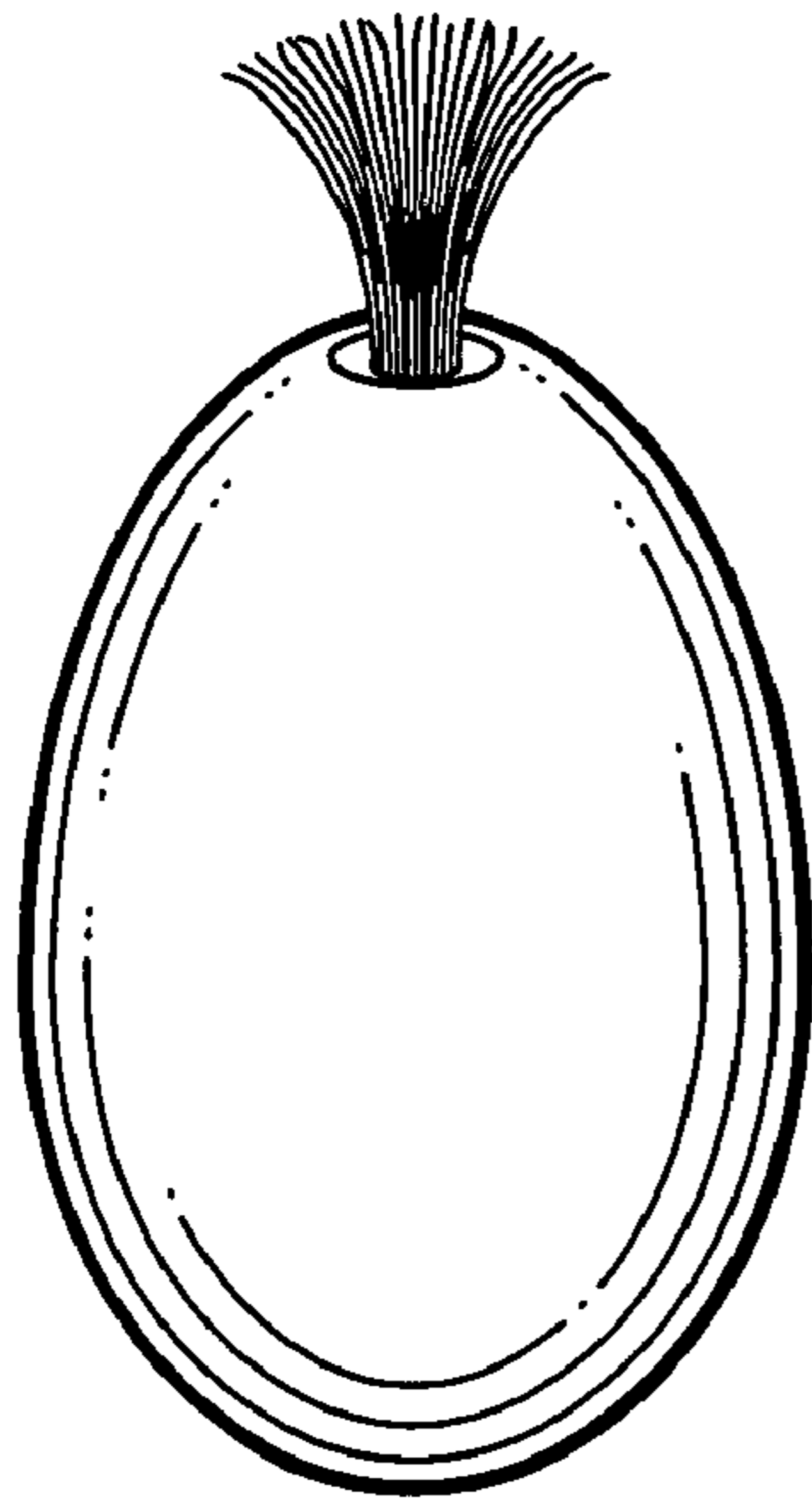

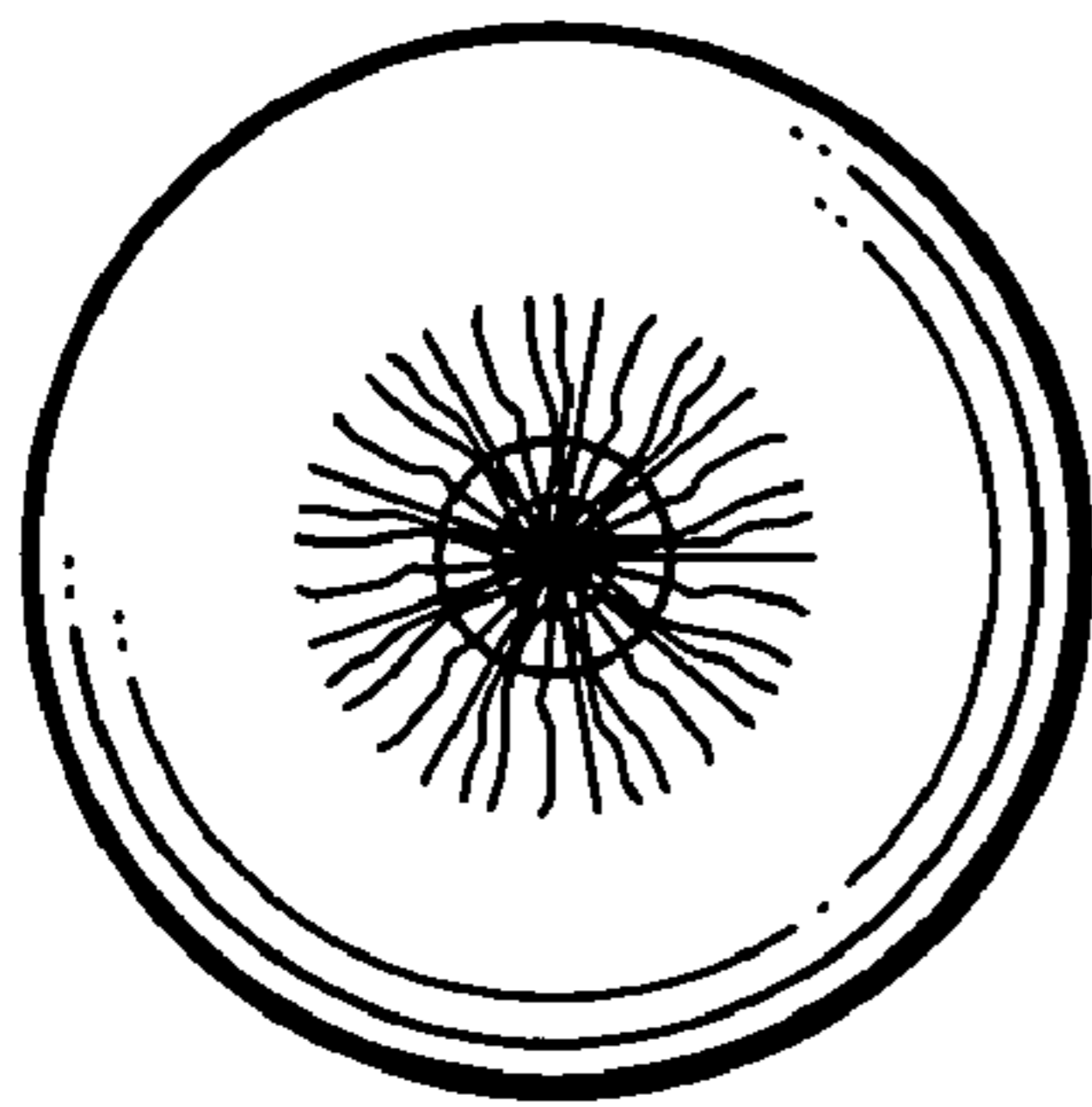

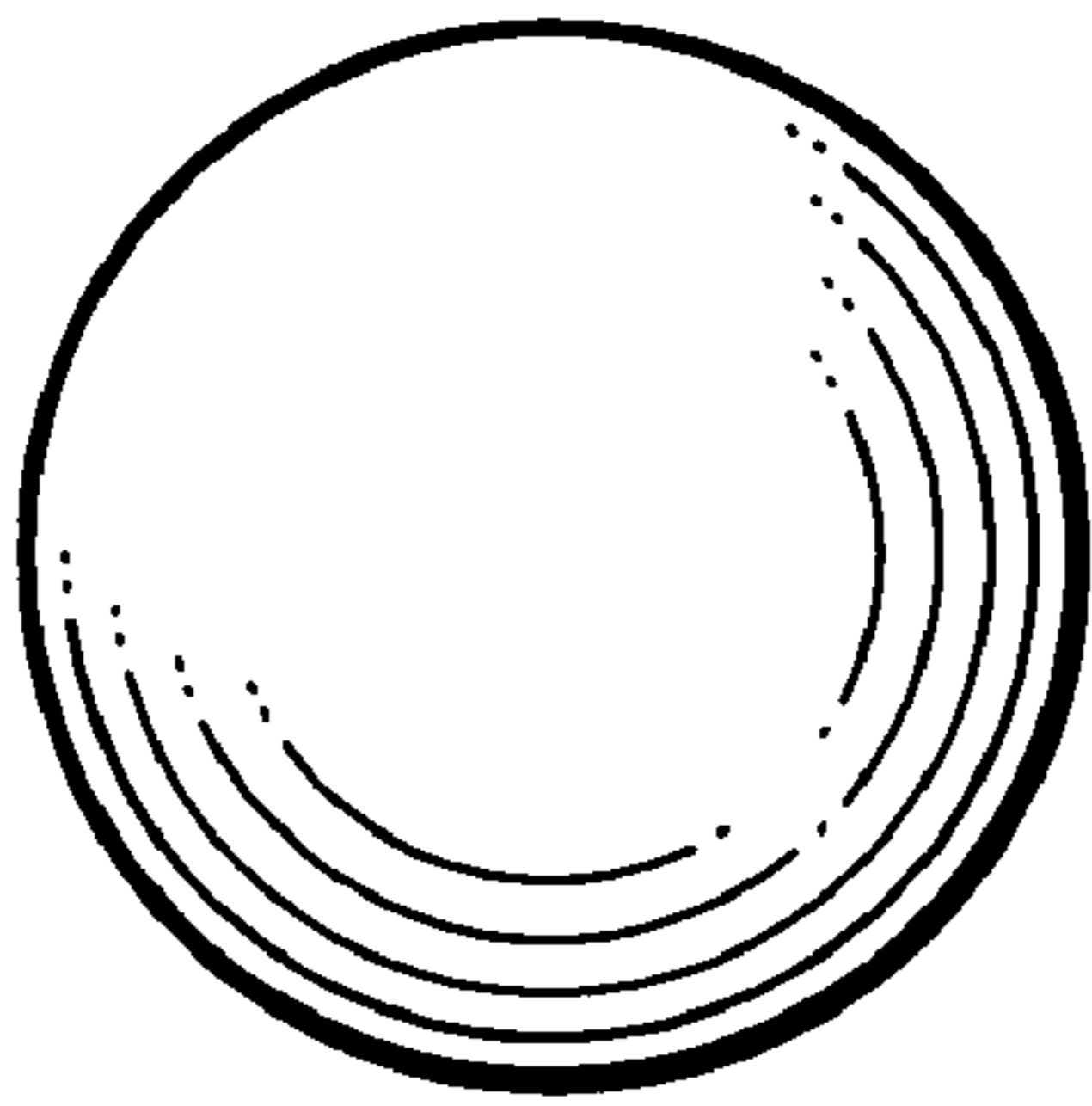

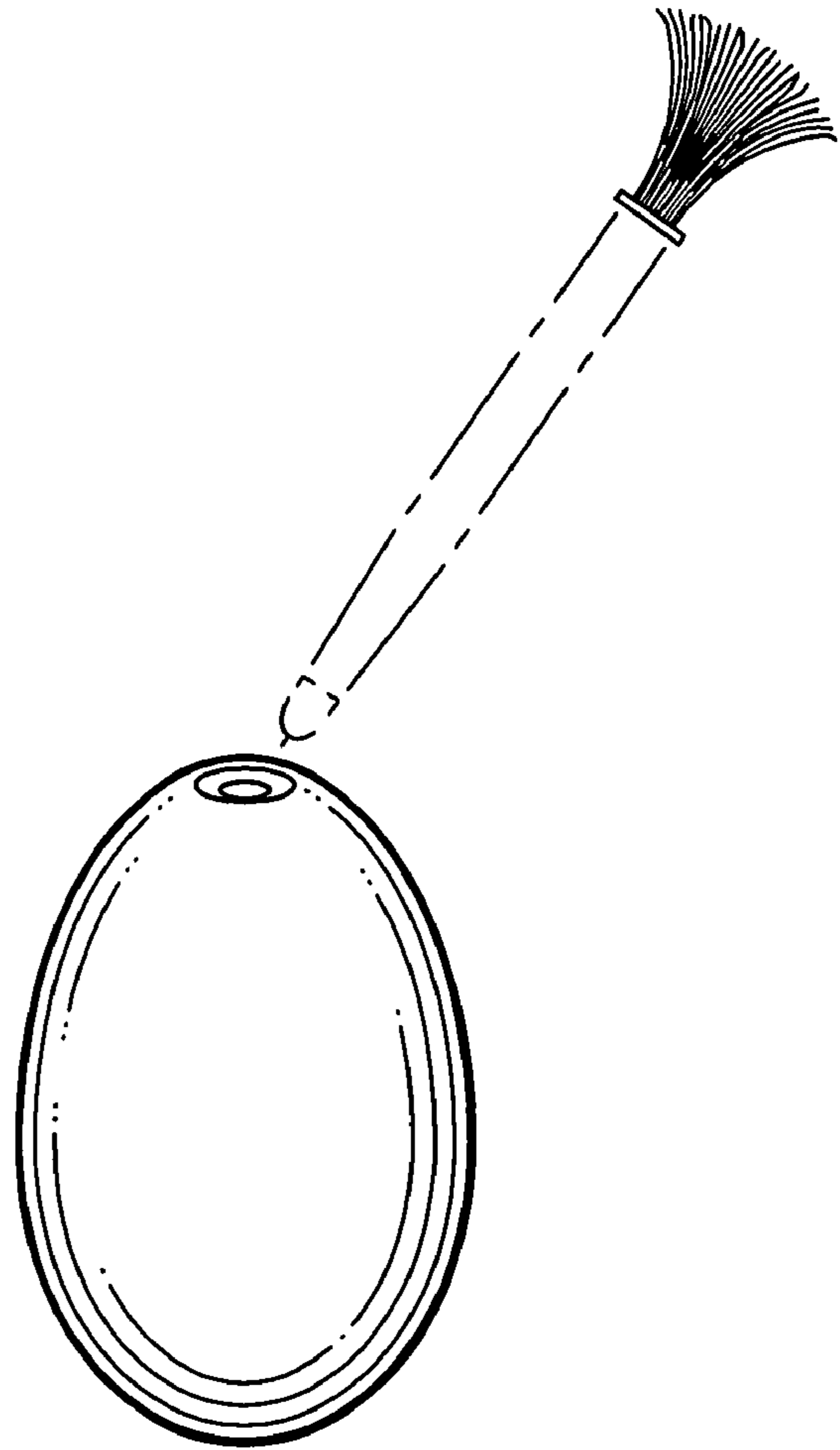

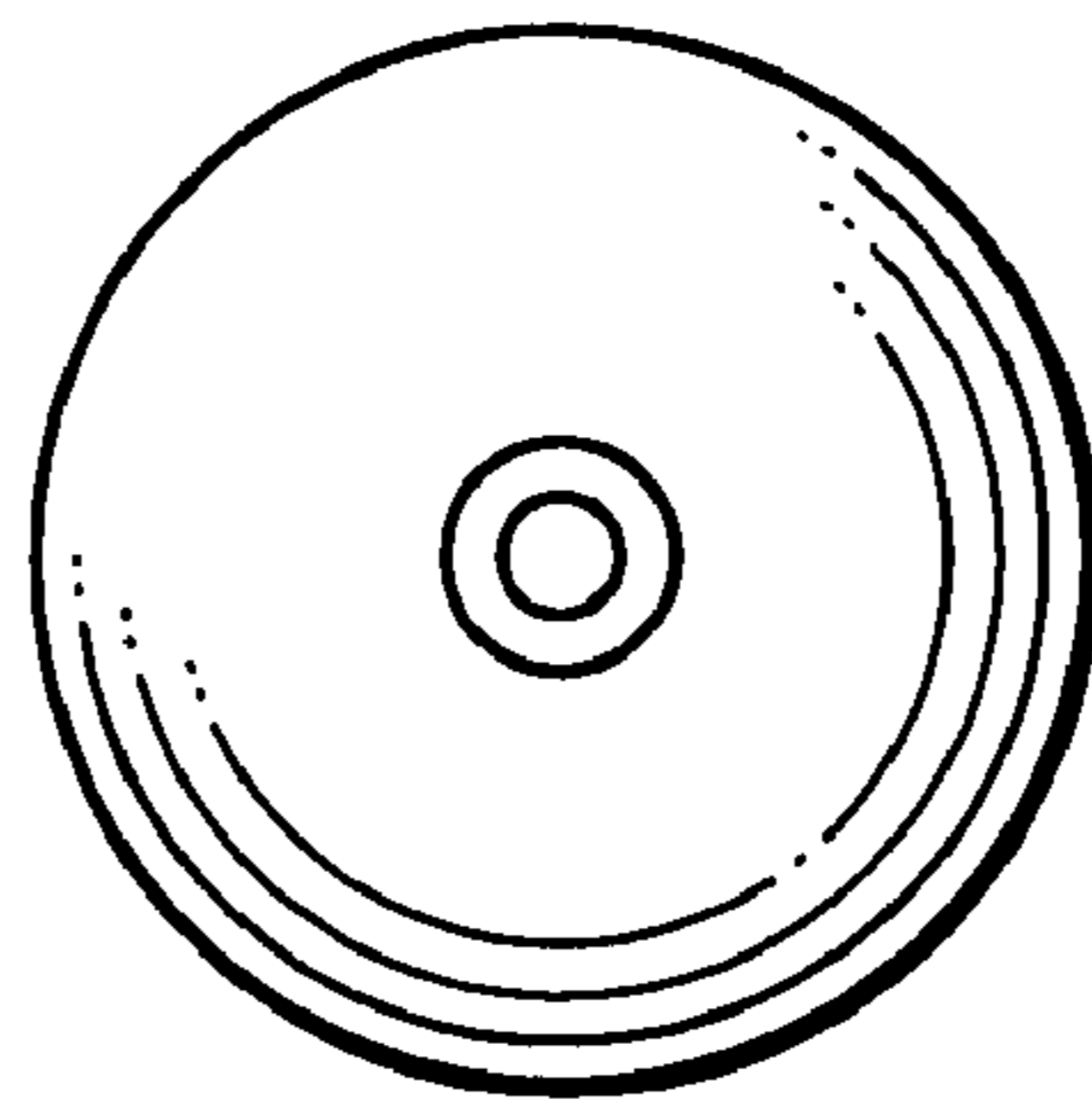
