
The ornamental design for the water dispensing device, as shown and described.


DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view from a side of a water dispensing device showing our new design being supported by an environment, the broken lines depicting environment and forming no part of the claimed design.

- FIG. 2 is an end elevational view of the invention, the broken lines depicting at least part of an environment and forming no part of the claimed design.
- FIG. 3 is another end elevational view of the invention, opposed to the end shown in FIG. 2 and having broken lines depicting at least part of an environment and forming no part of the claimed design.
- FIG. 4 is a side elevational view of the invention showing the new design being supported by an environment, the broken lines depicting environment and forming no part of the claimed design.
- FIG. 5 is another side elevational view of the invention, opposed to the side shown in FIG. 4 and having broken lines depicting an environment and forming no part of the claimed design.
- FIG. 6 is a top plan view of the invention showing the new design being supported by an environment, the broken lines depicting environment and forming no part of the claimed design.
- FIG. 7 is a bottom plan view of the invention showing the new design being supported by an environment, the broken lines depicting environment and forming no part of the claimed design; and,
- FIG. 8 is a perspective view from another side of the invention in FIG. 1 showing the new design being supported by an environment, the broken lines depicting environment and forming no part of the claimed design.




