(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a door, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a first embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 2 is a fragmentary perspective view taken along the line 2—2 of FIG. 1, viewed in the direction of the arrows, illustrating the profile of our design;

FIG. 3 is a fragmentary end view of the front-molded panel shown in FIG. 2.

FIG. 4 is a fragmentary front elevational view showing the profile of FIG. 2;

FIG. 5 is a front elevational view of a second embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 6 is a front elevational view of a third embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 7 is a front elevational view of a fourth embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 8 is a front elevational view of a fifth embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 9 is a front elevational view of a sixth embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 10 is a front elevational view of a seventh embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 11 is a front elevational view of an eighth embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 12 is a front elevational view of a ninth embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 13 is a front elevational view of a tenth embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 14 is a front elevational view of an eleventh embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

FIG. 15 is a front elevational view of a twelfth embodiment of our design, with the rear view being a mirror image thereof and with the profile of FIGS. 2–4 being incorporated therein;

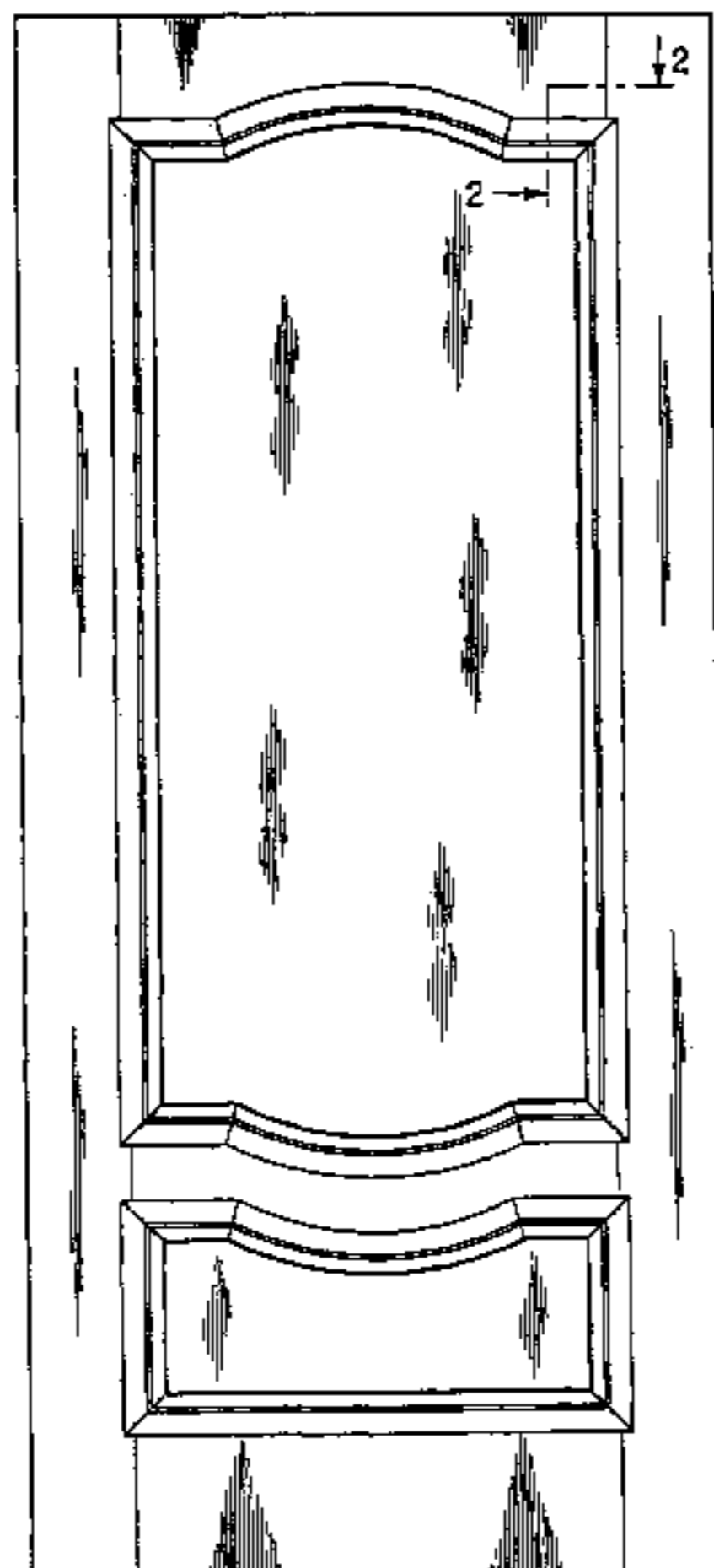

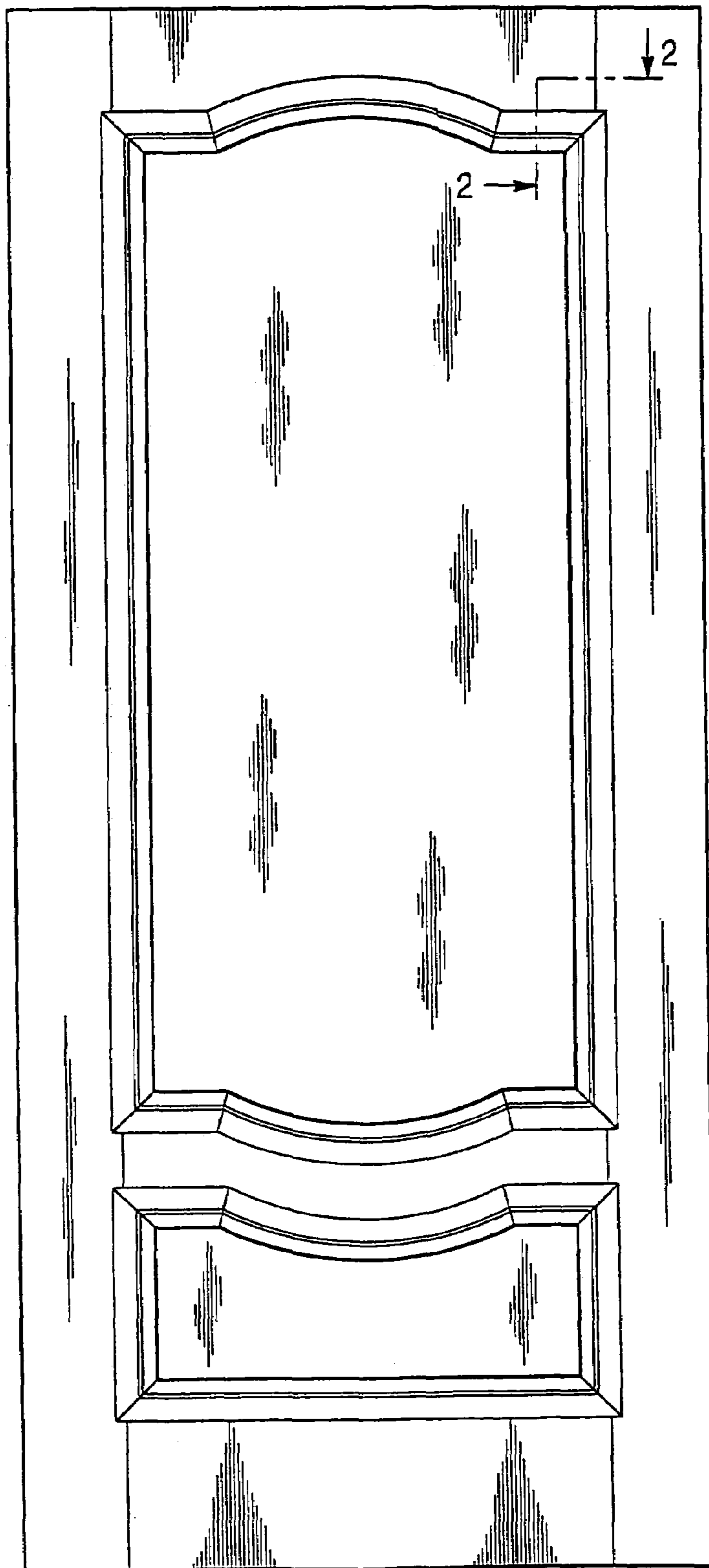

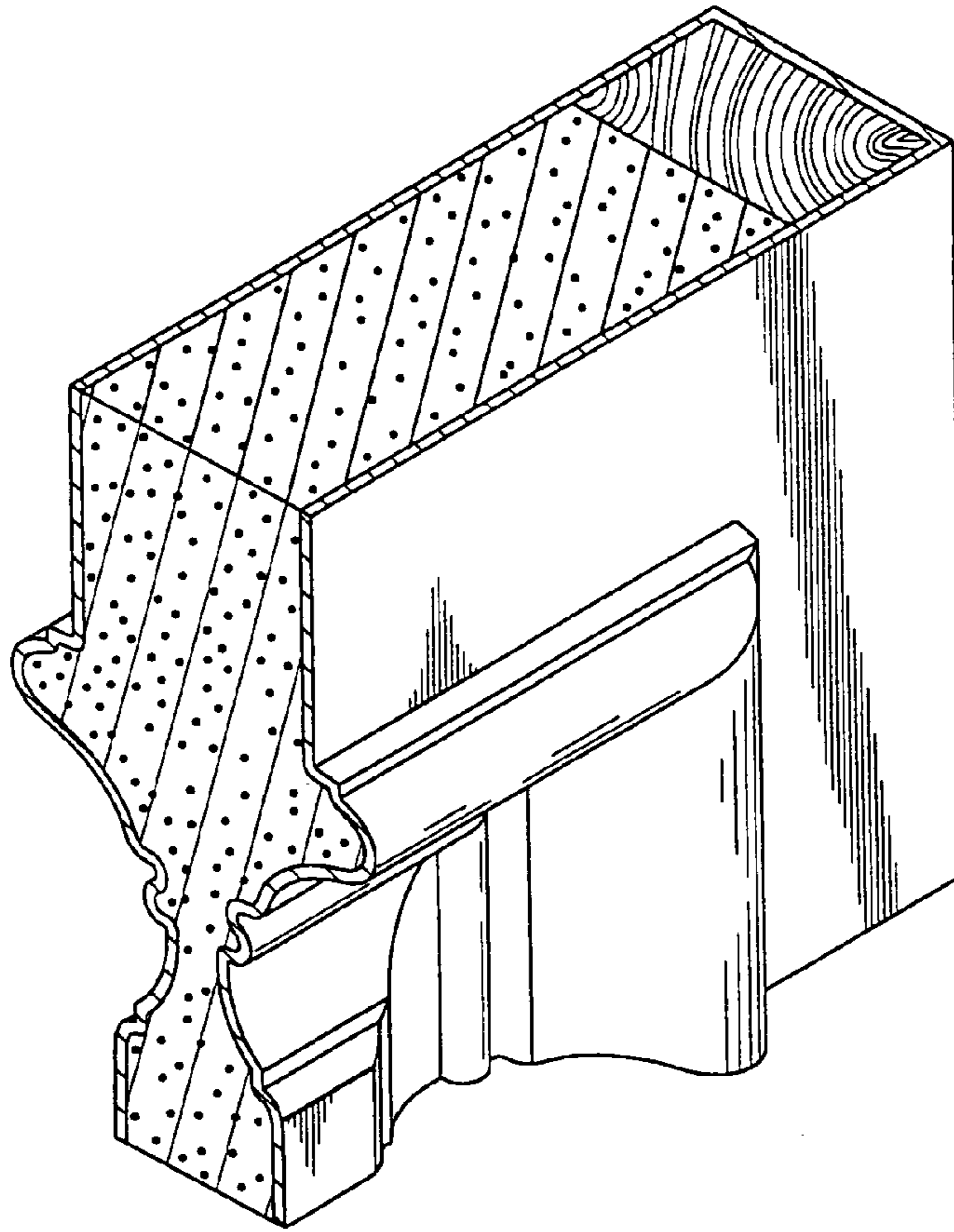

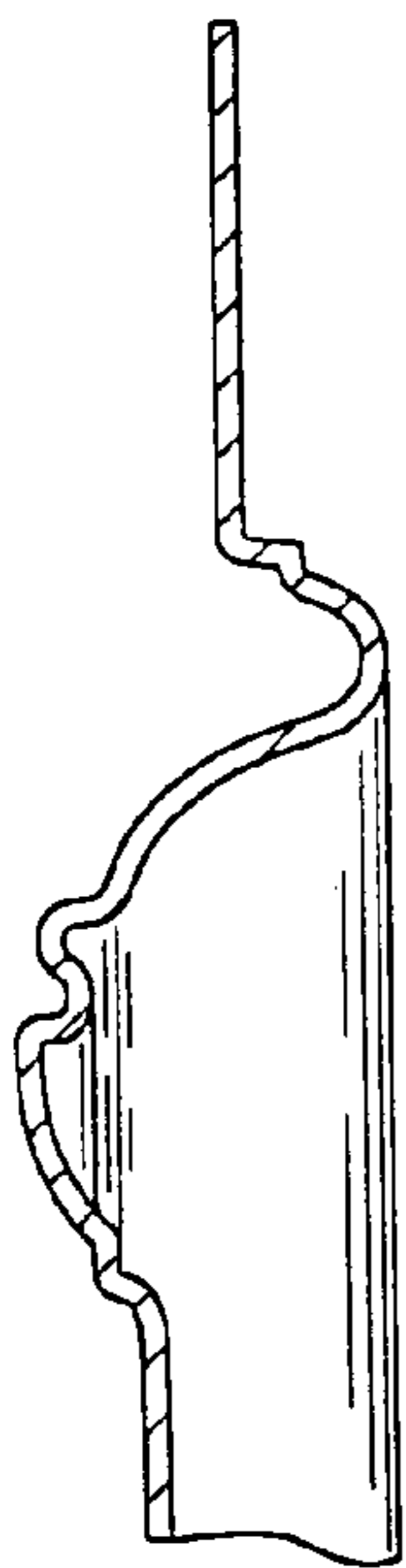

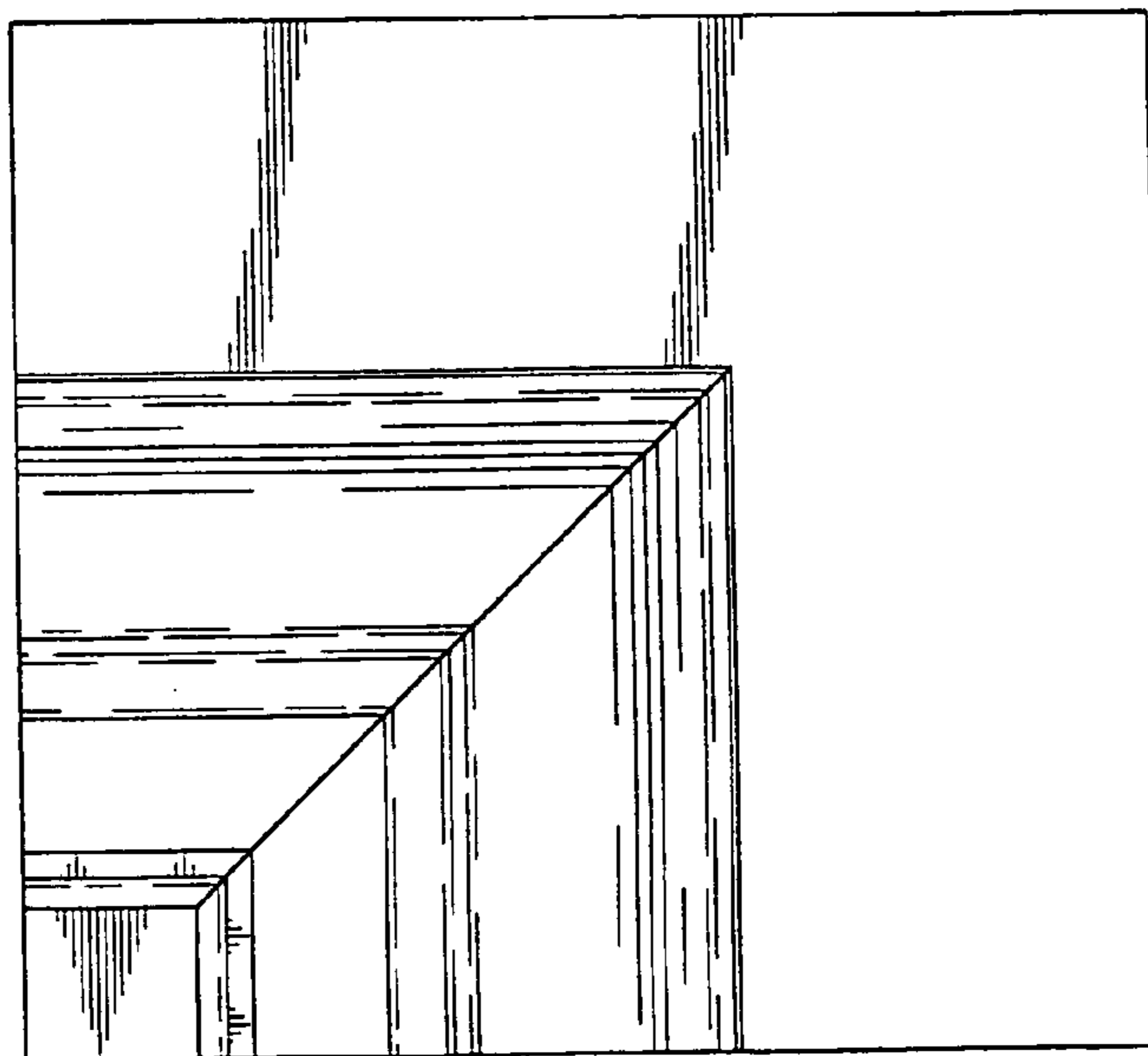

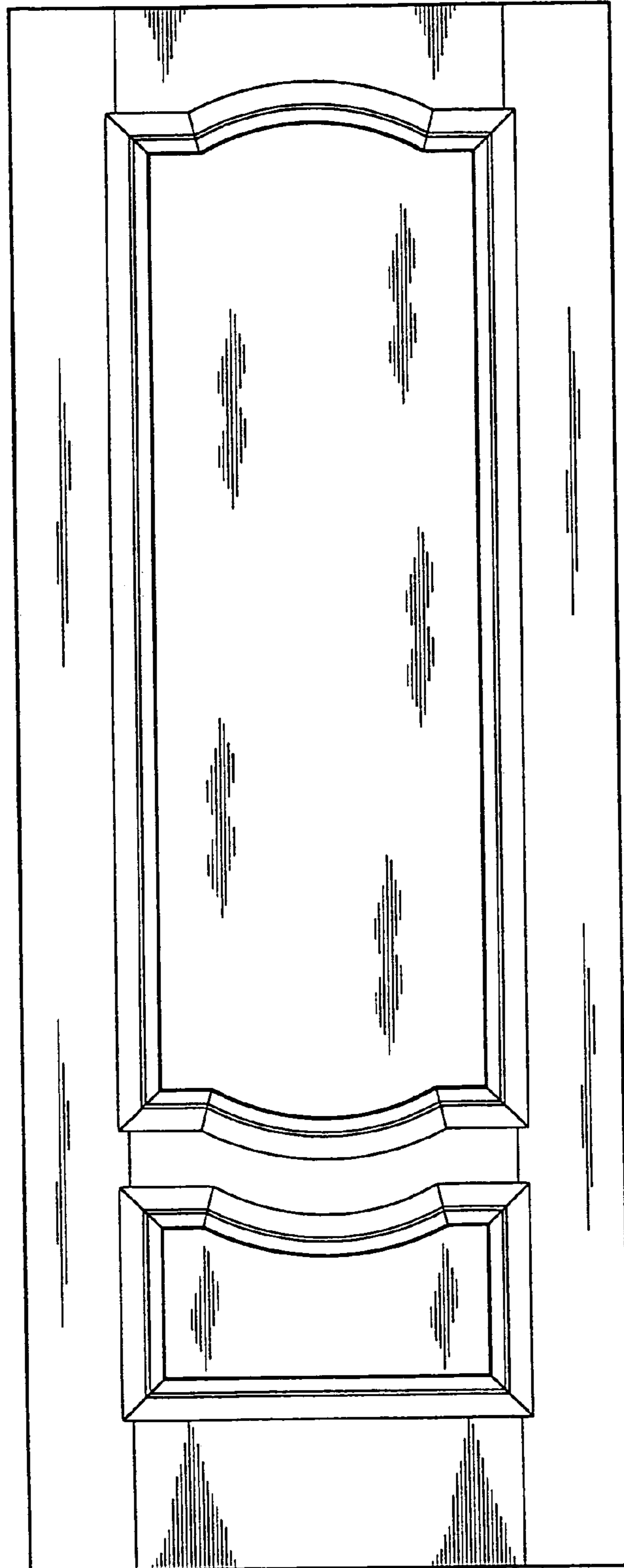

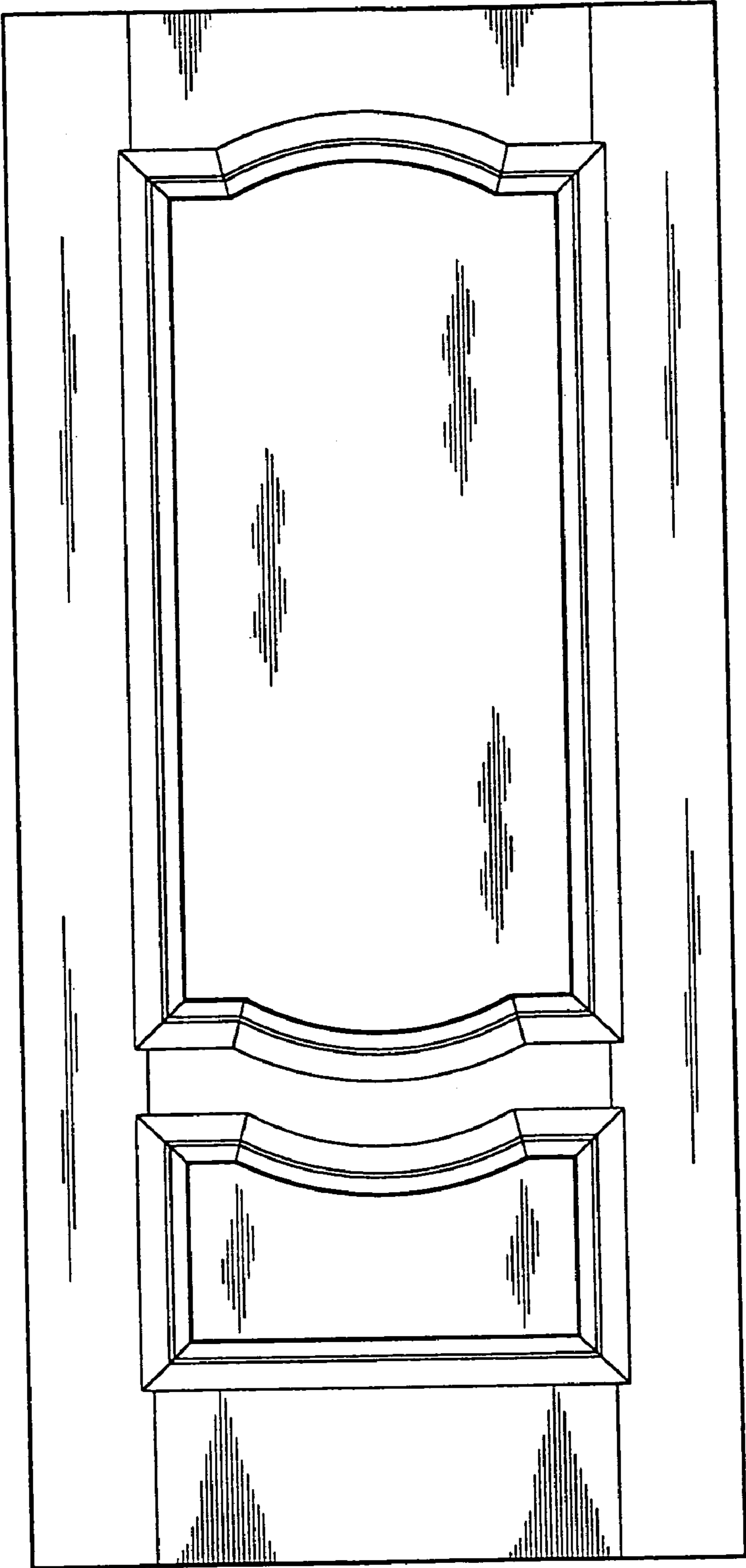

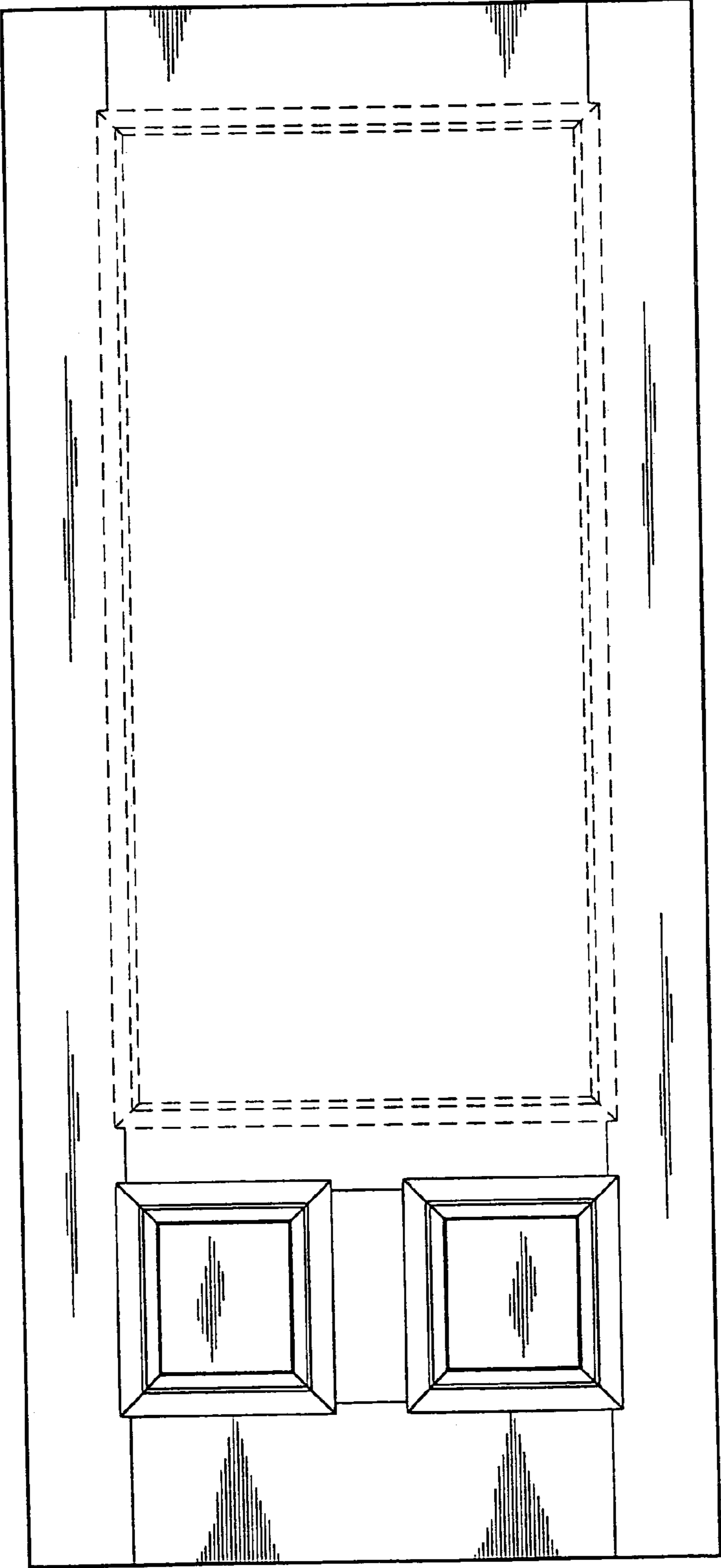

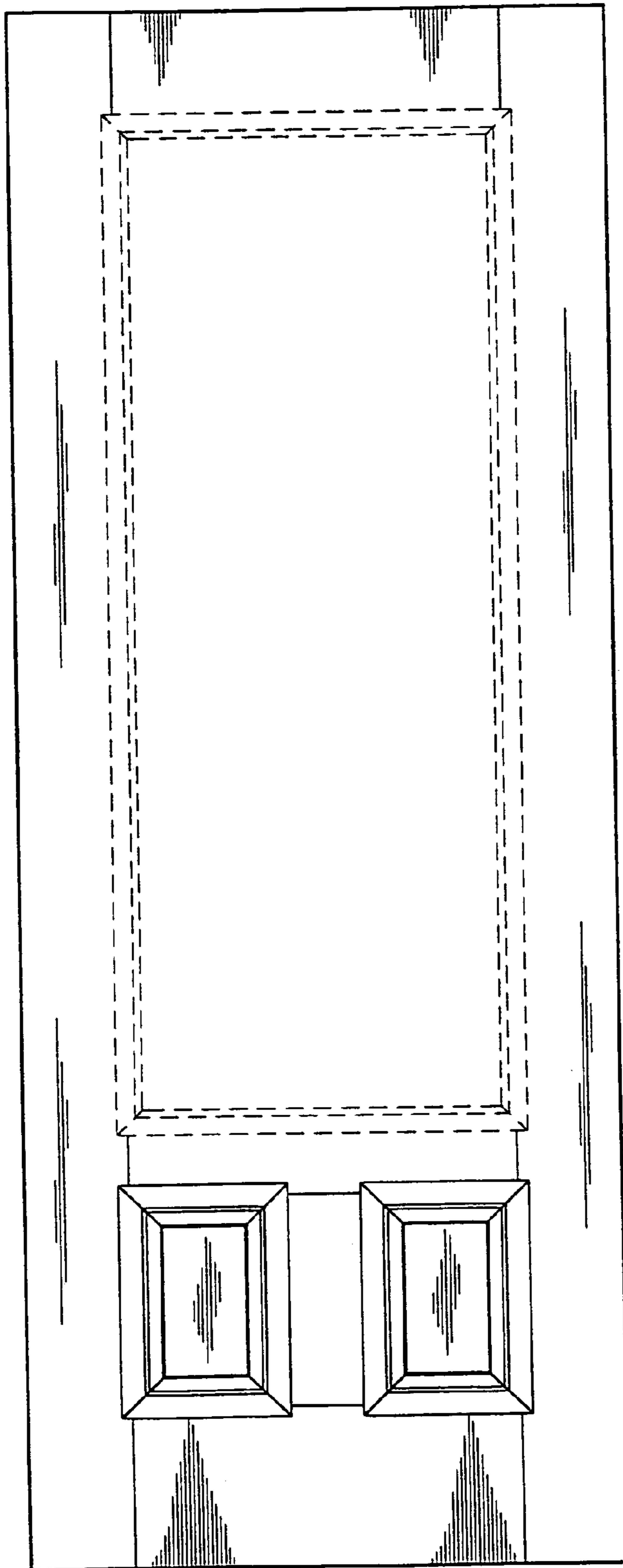

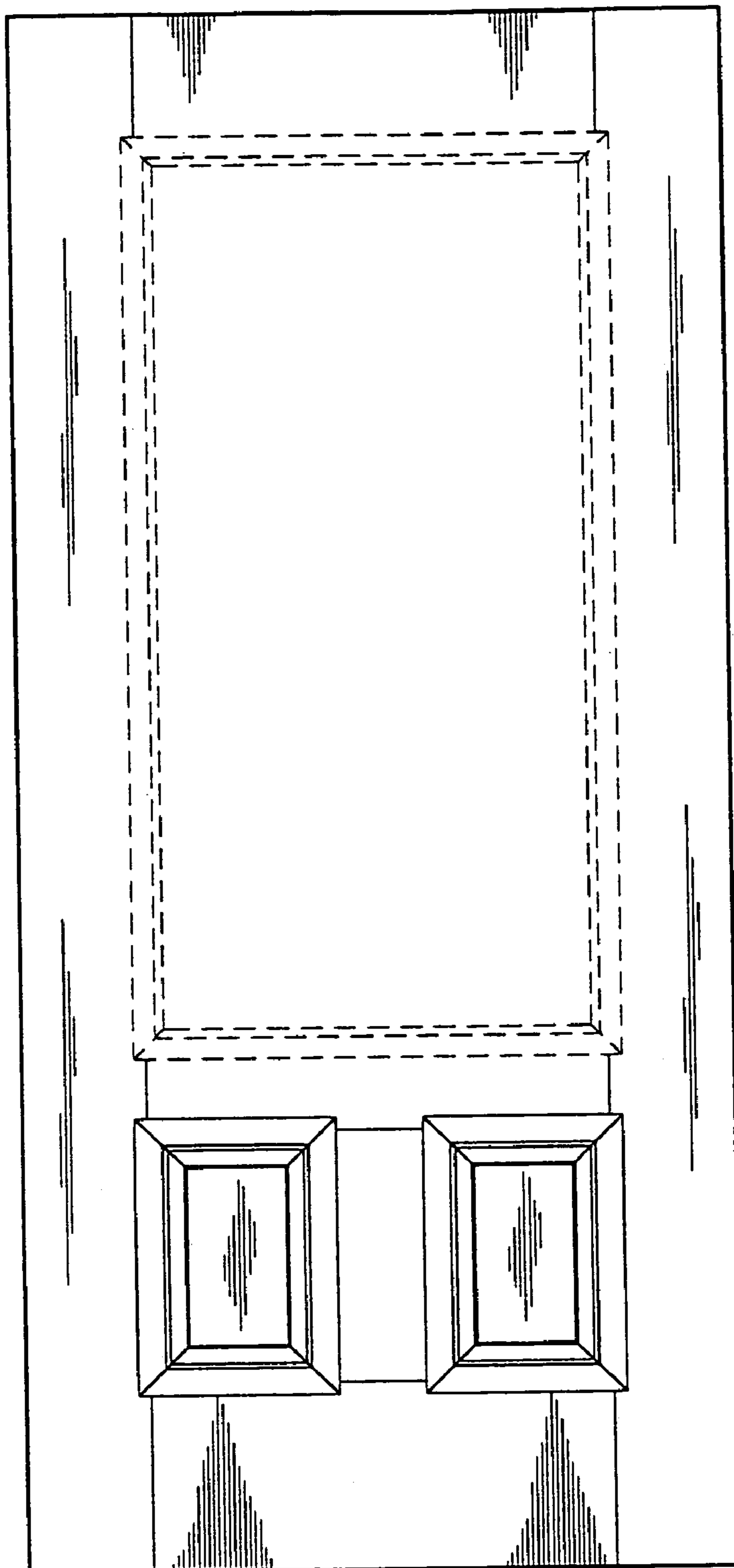

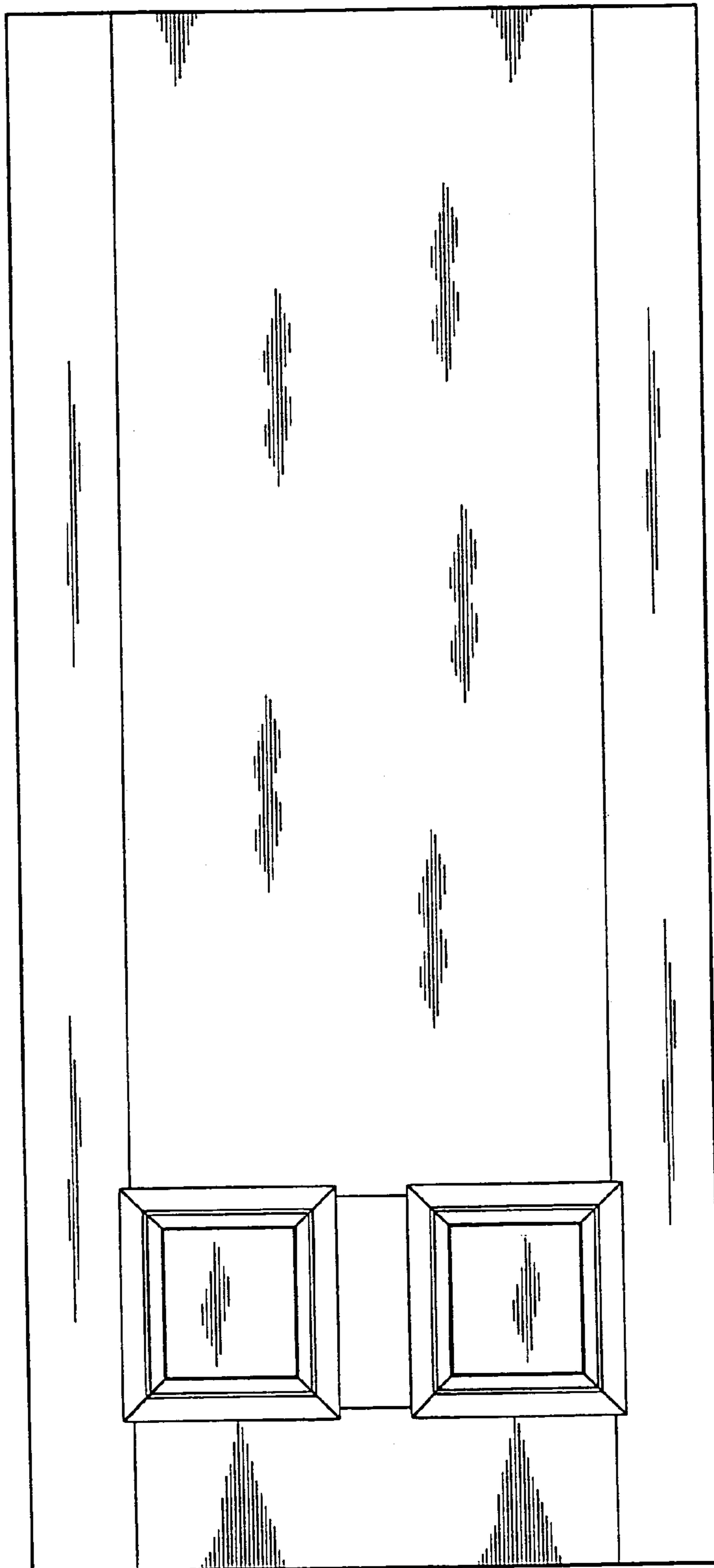

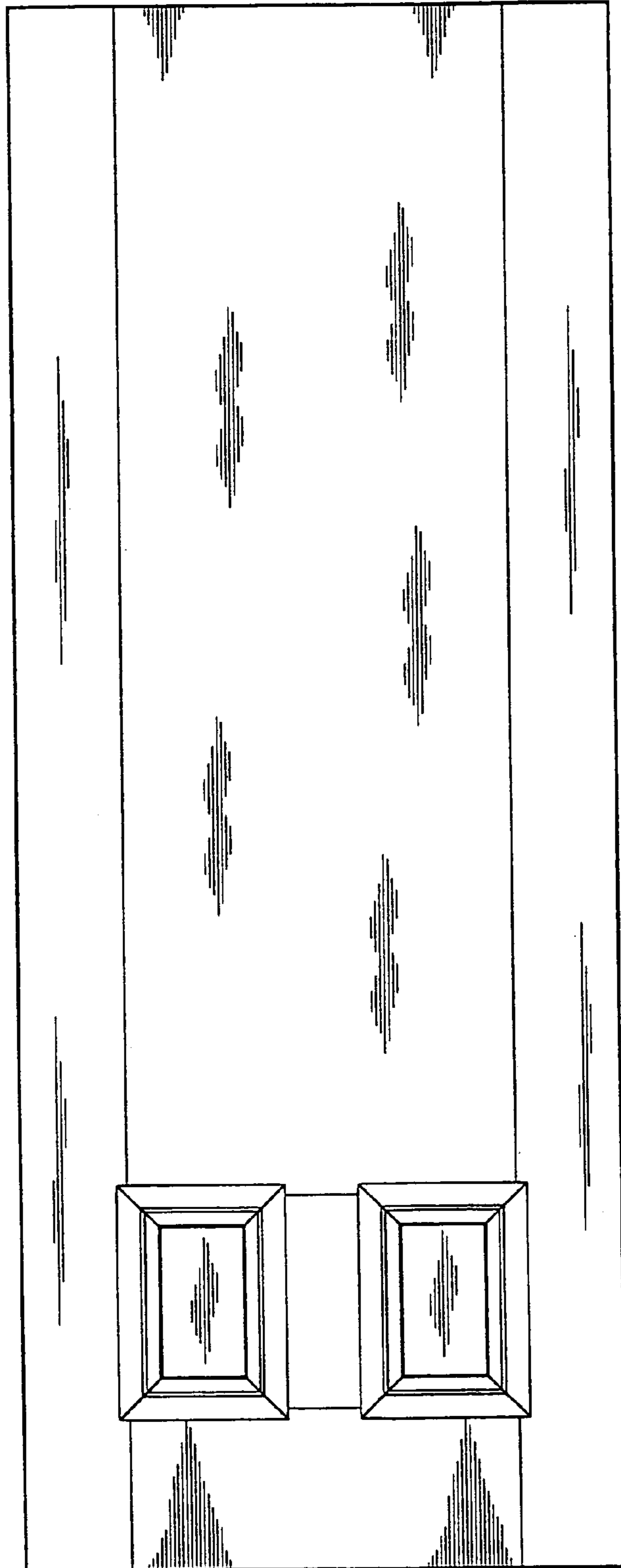

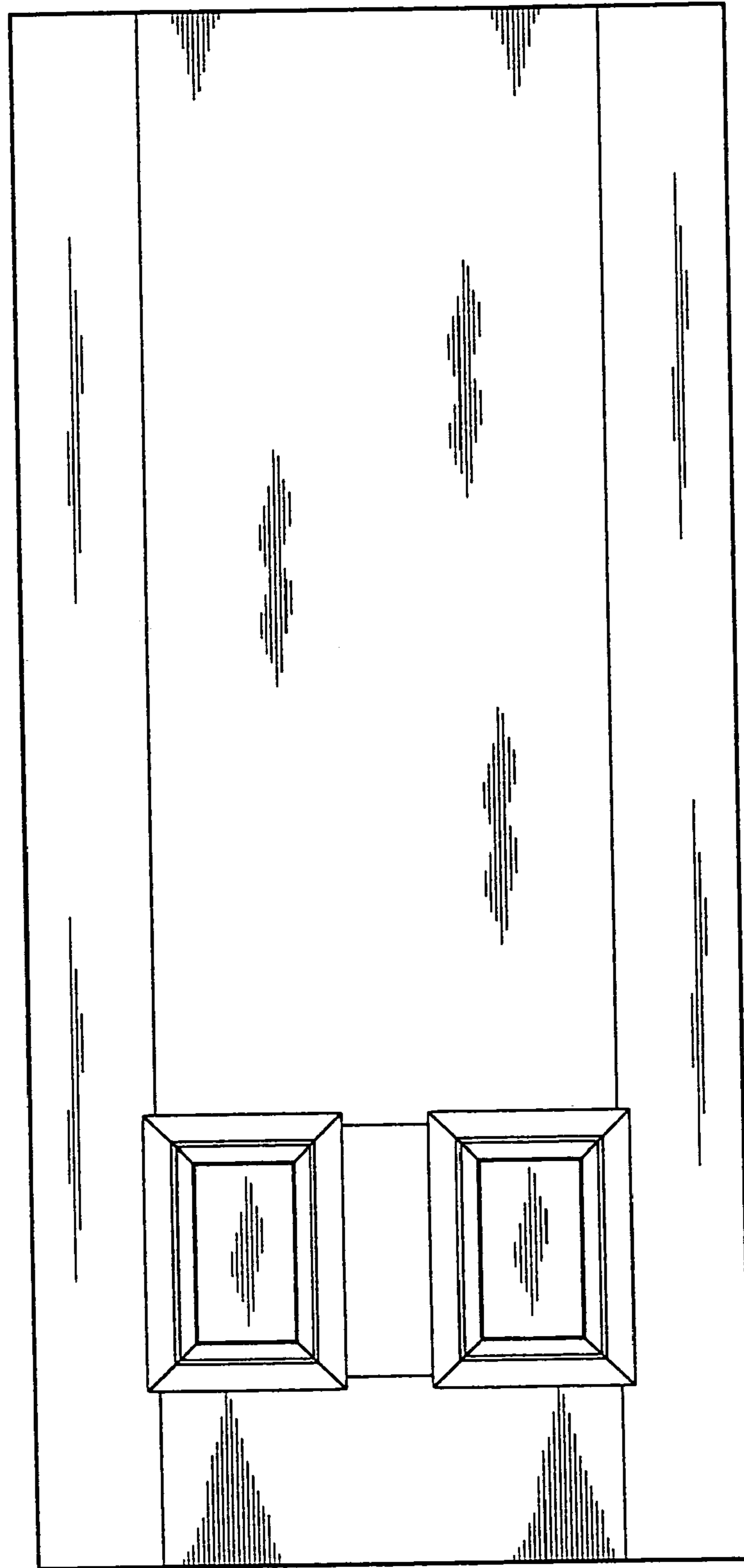

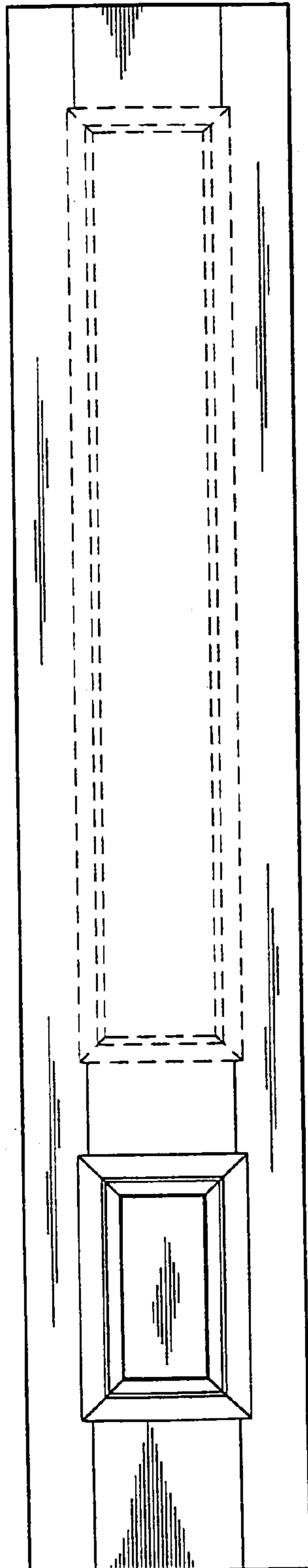

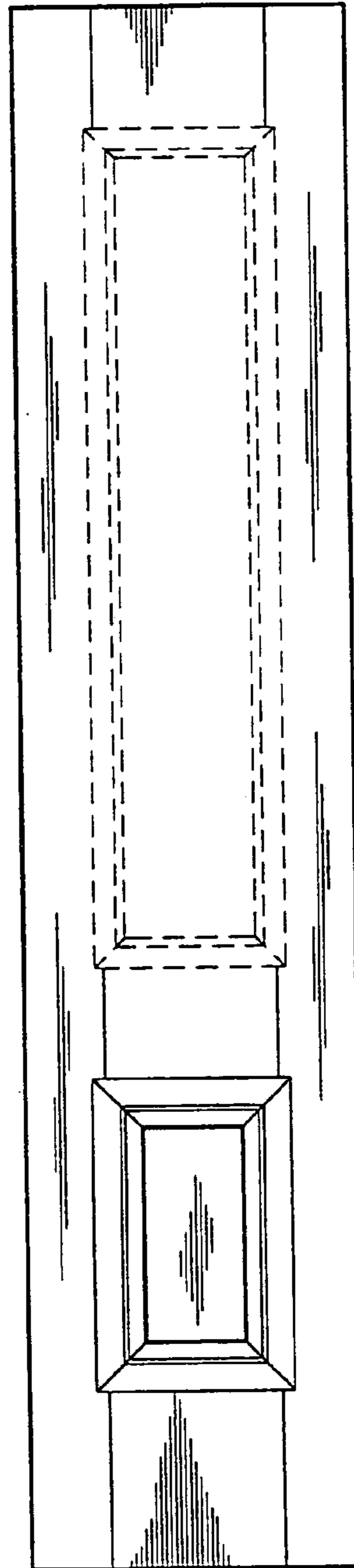

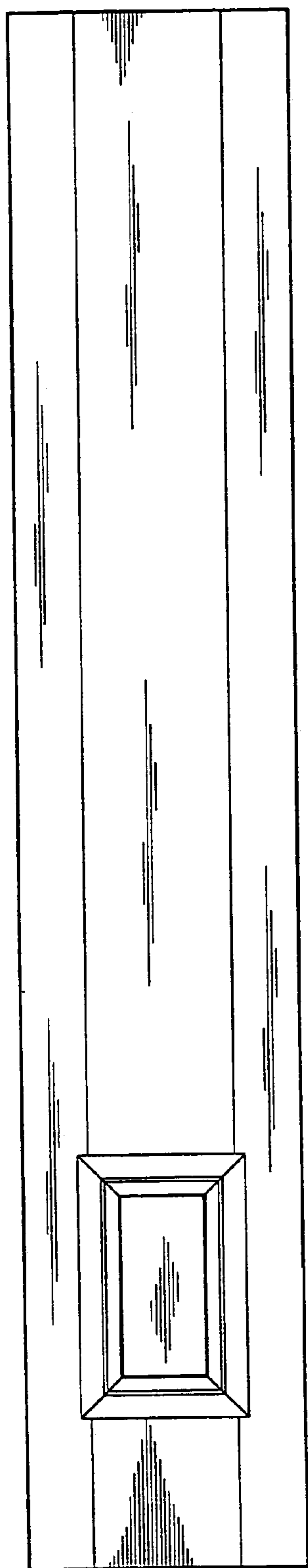

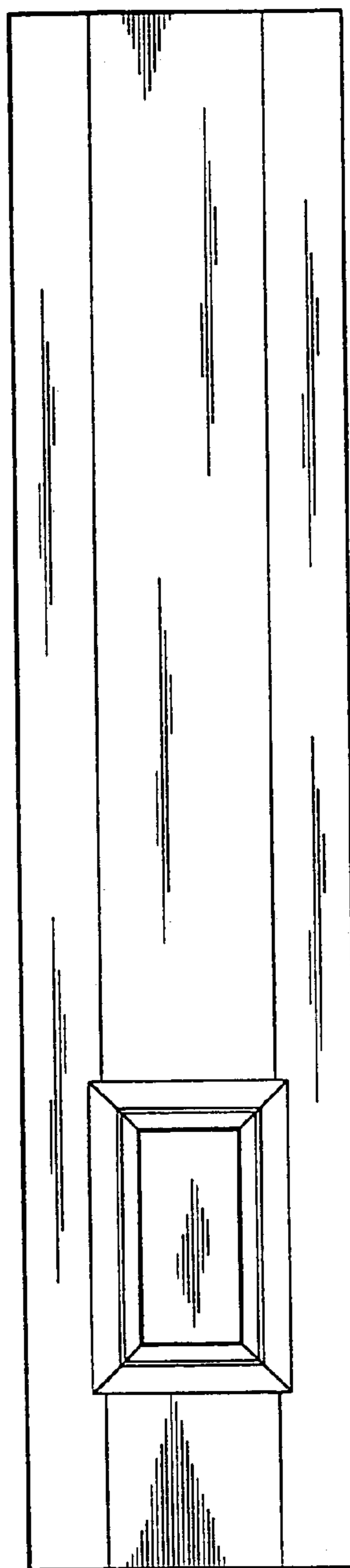

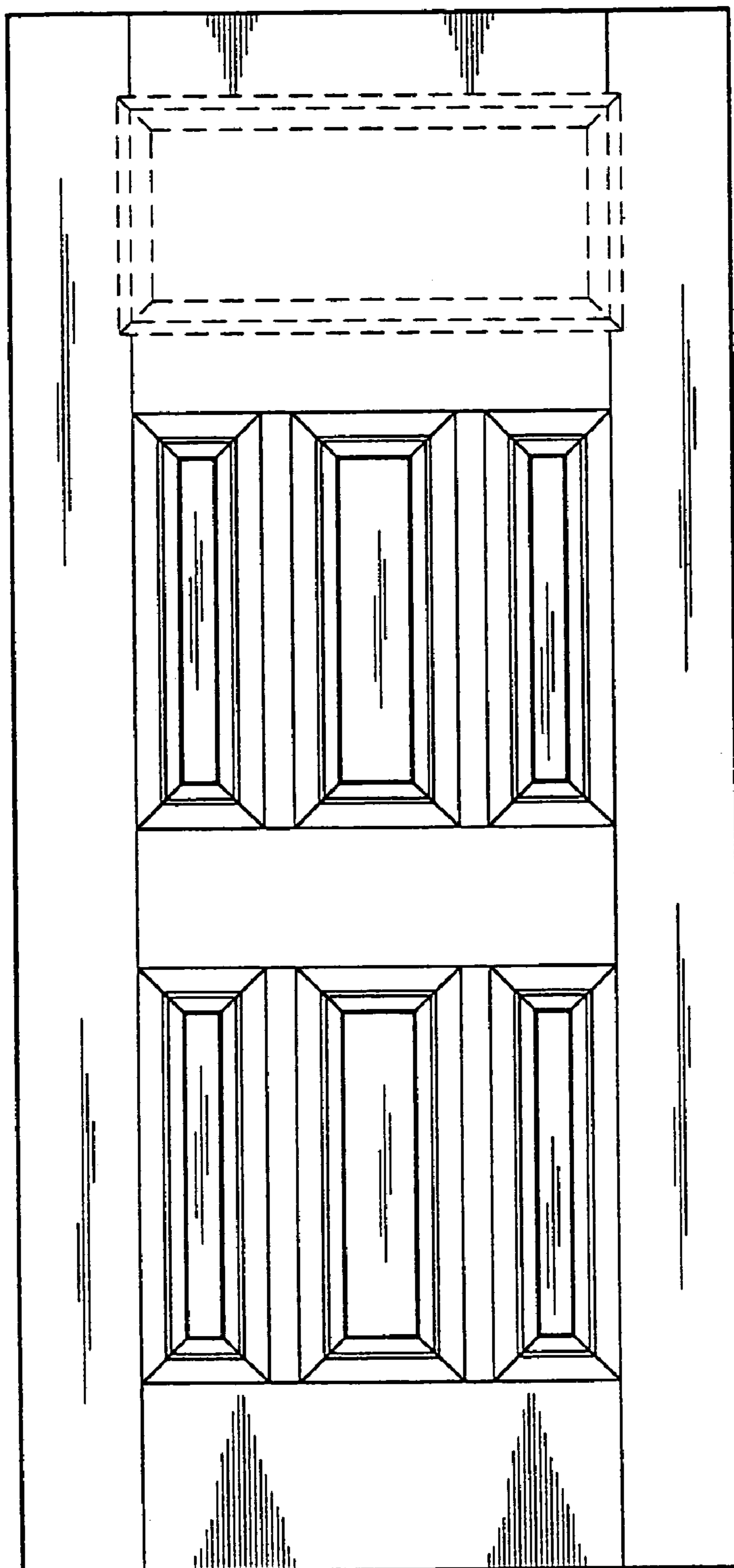
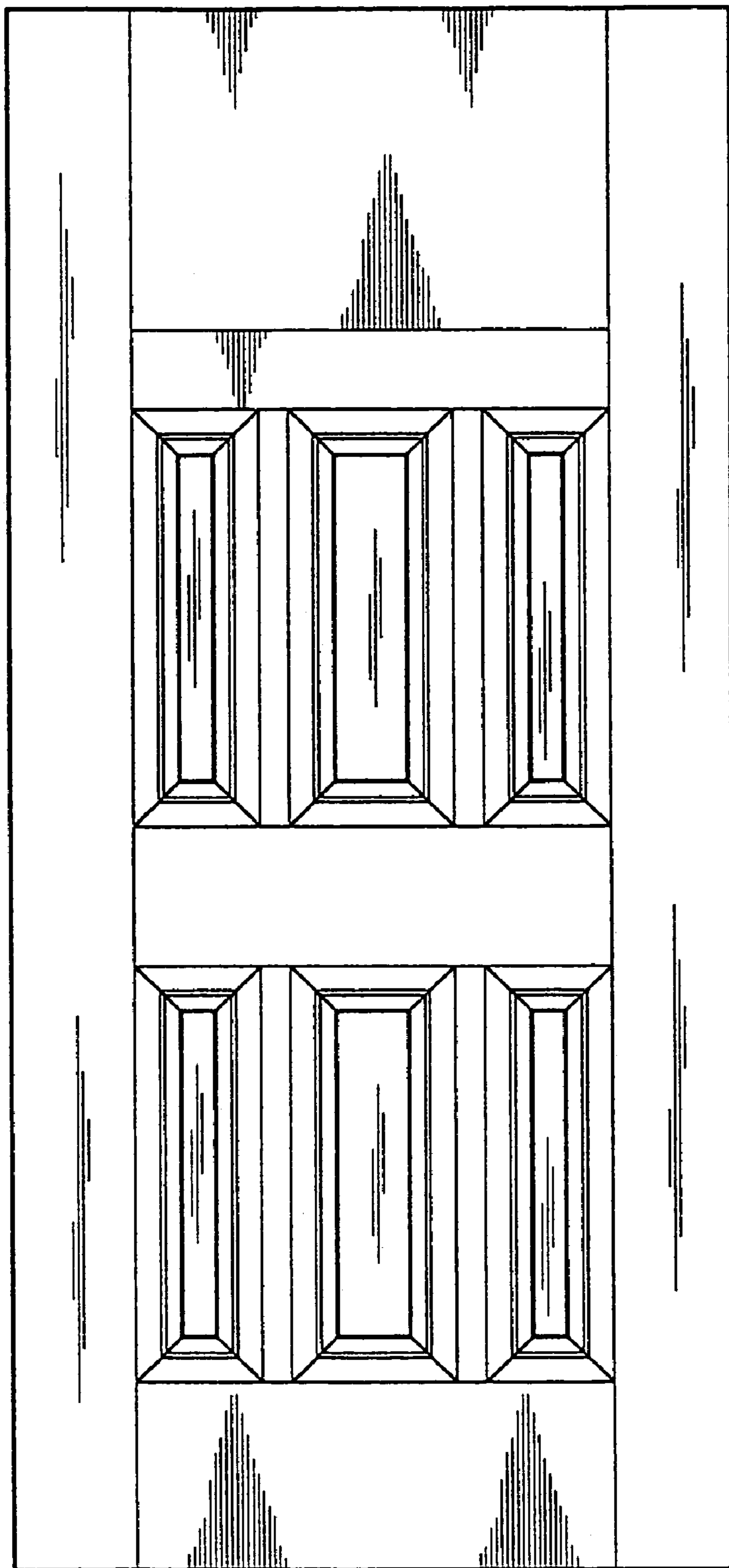

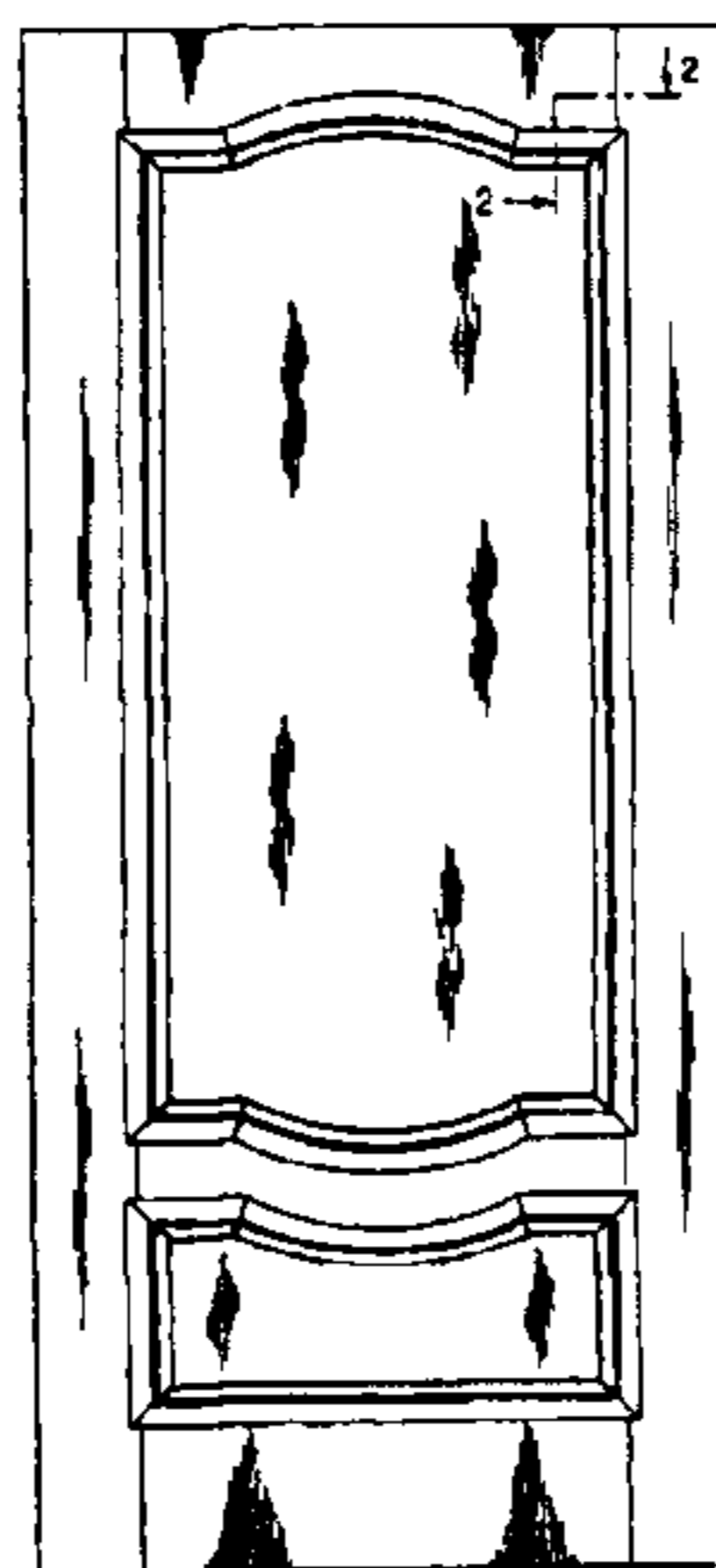

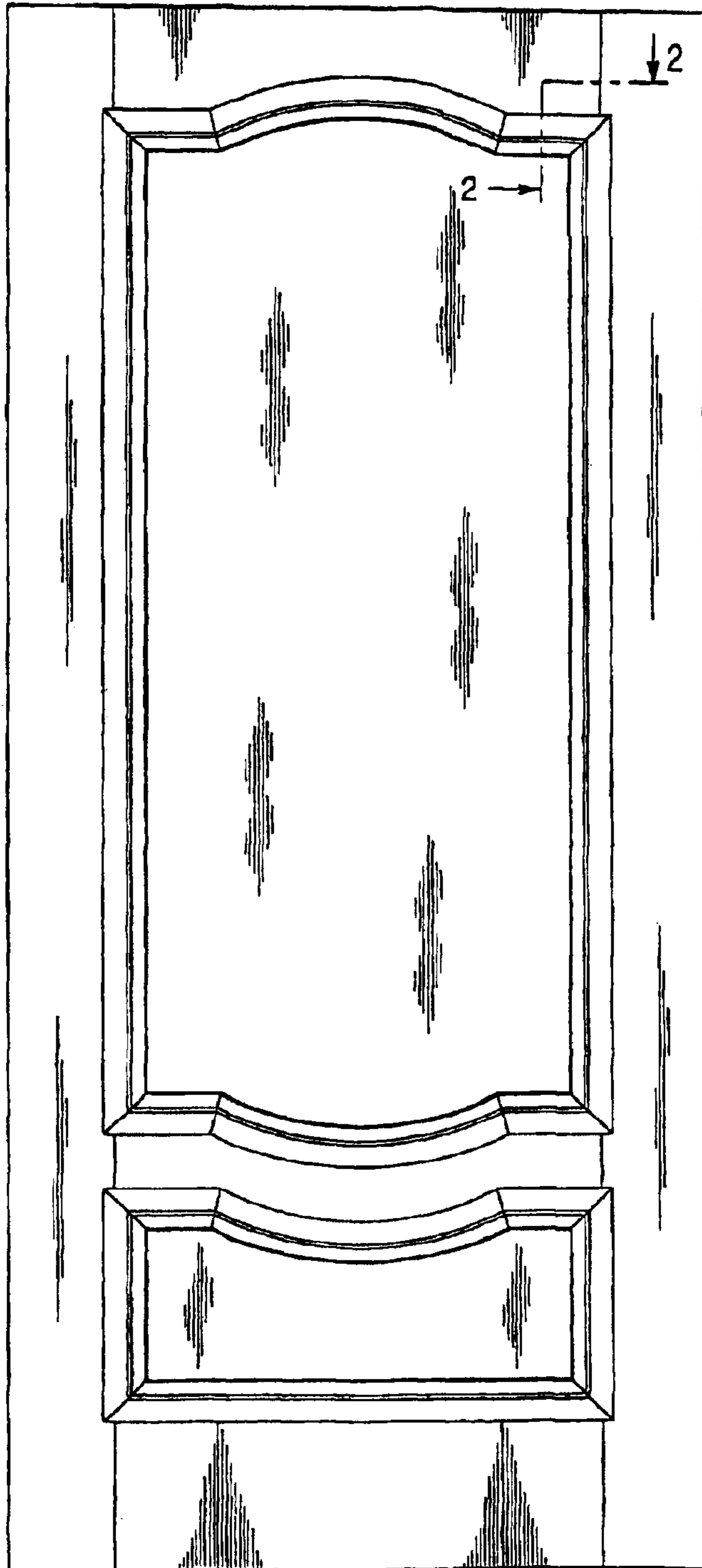

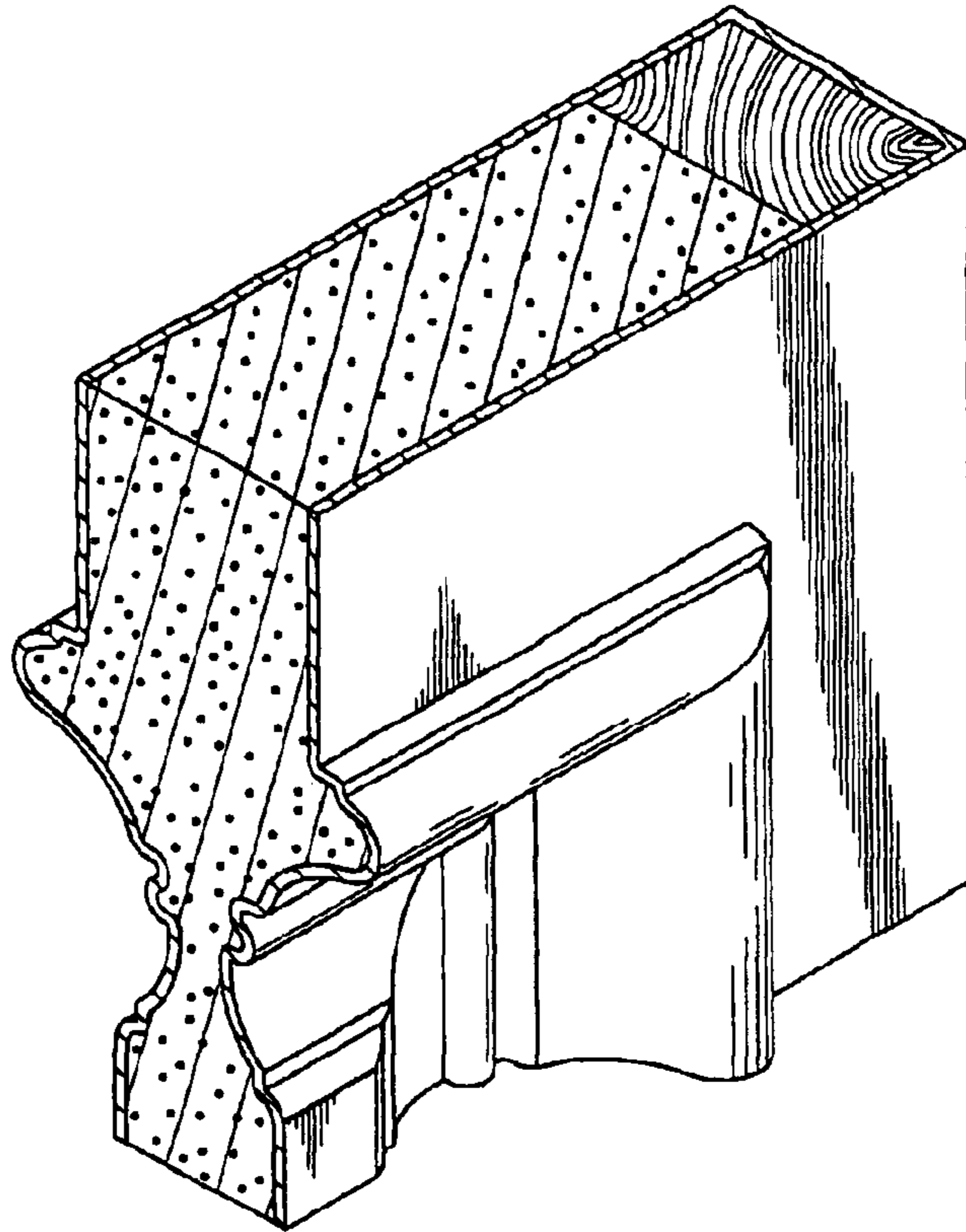

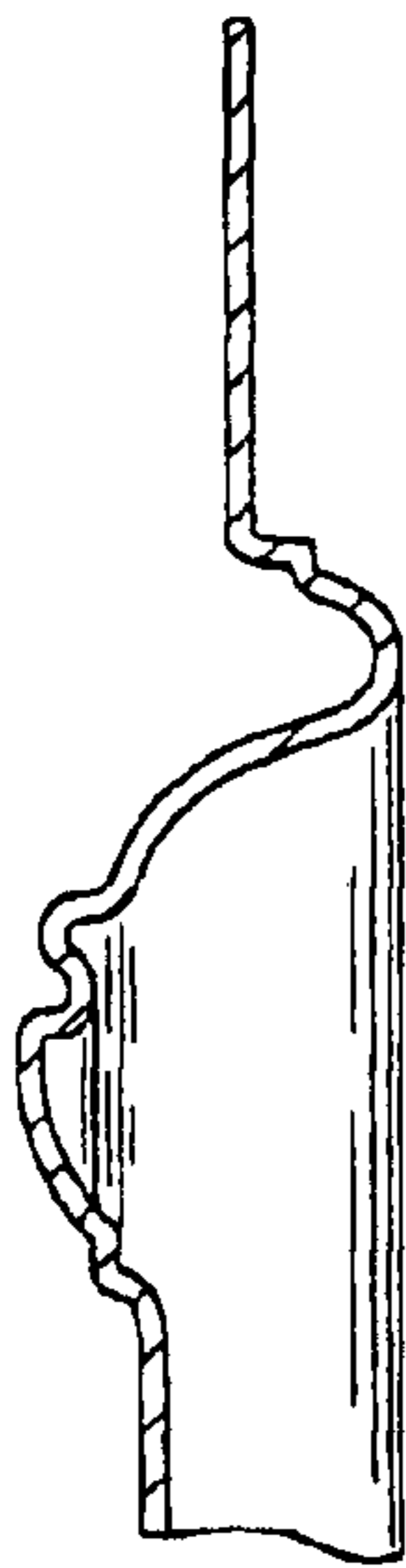

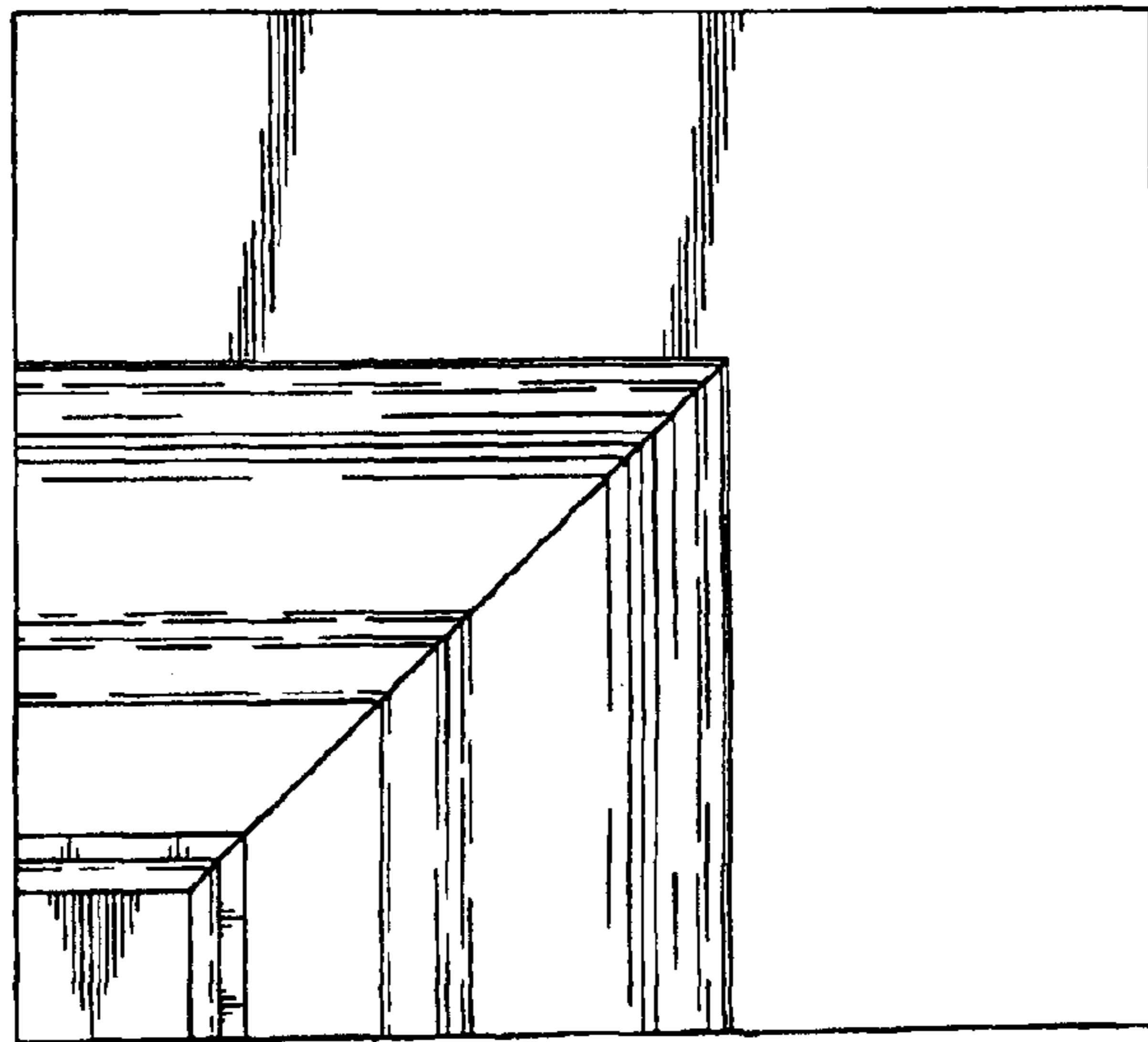

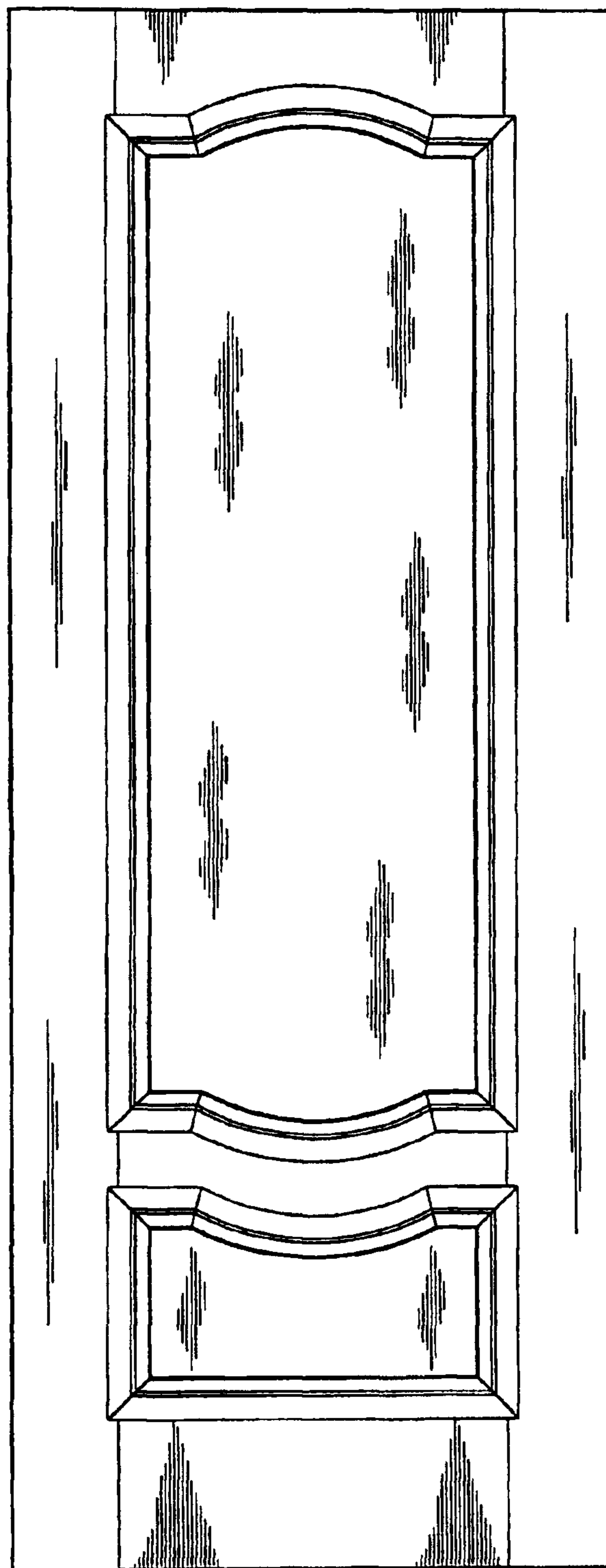
