The ornamental design for furniture, as shown and described.

#### DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of furniture showing my new design.

FIG. 2 is an enlarged front elevational view thereof.

FIG. **3** is a right-side elevational view thereof, with the leftside elevational view thereof being a mirror image.

FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof.

FIG. 5 is a cross-sectional view taken along line 5—5 of FIG. 2 depicting the configuration of the front surface thereof.

FIG. 6 is a cross-sectional view taken along line 6—6 of FIG. 2 depicting the configuration of the front surface thereof.

FIG. 7 is a bottom plan view thereof; and,

FIG. 8 is a rear elevational view thereof.
