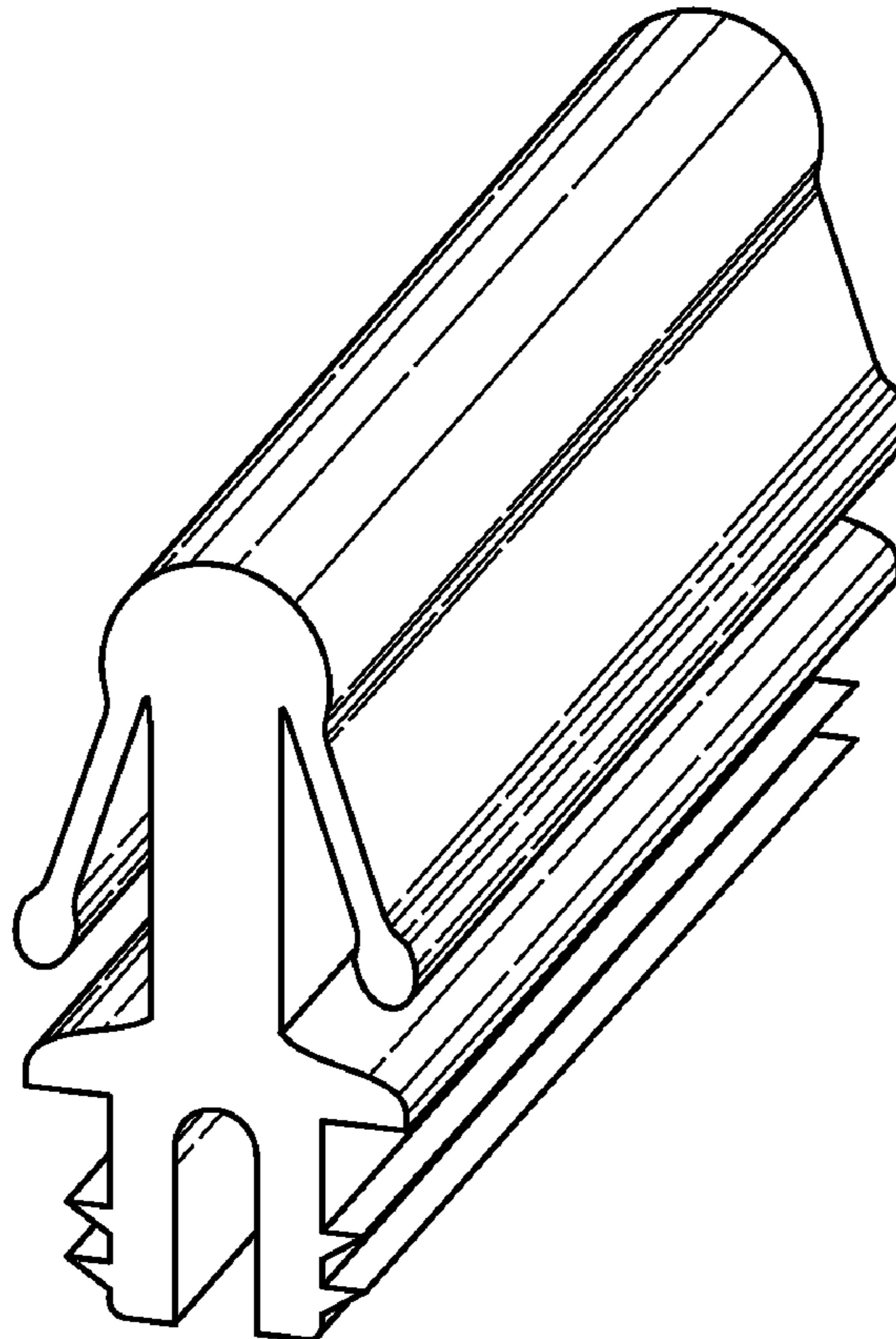

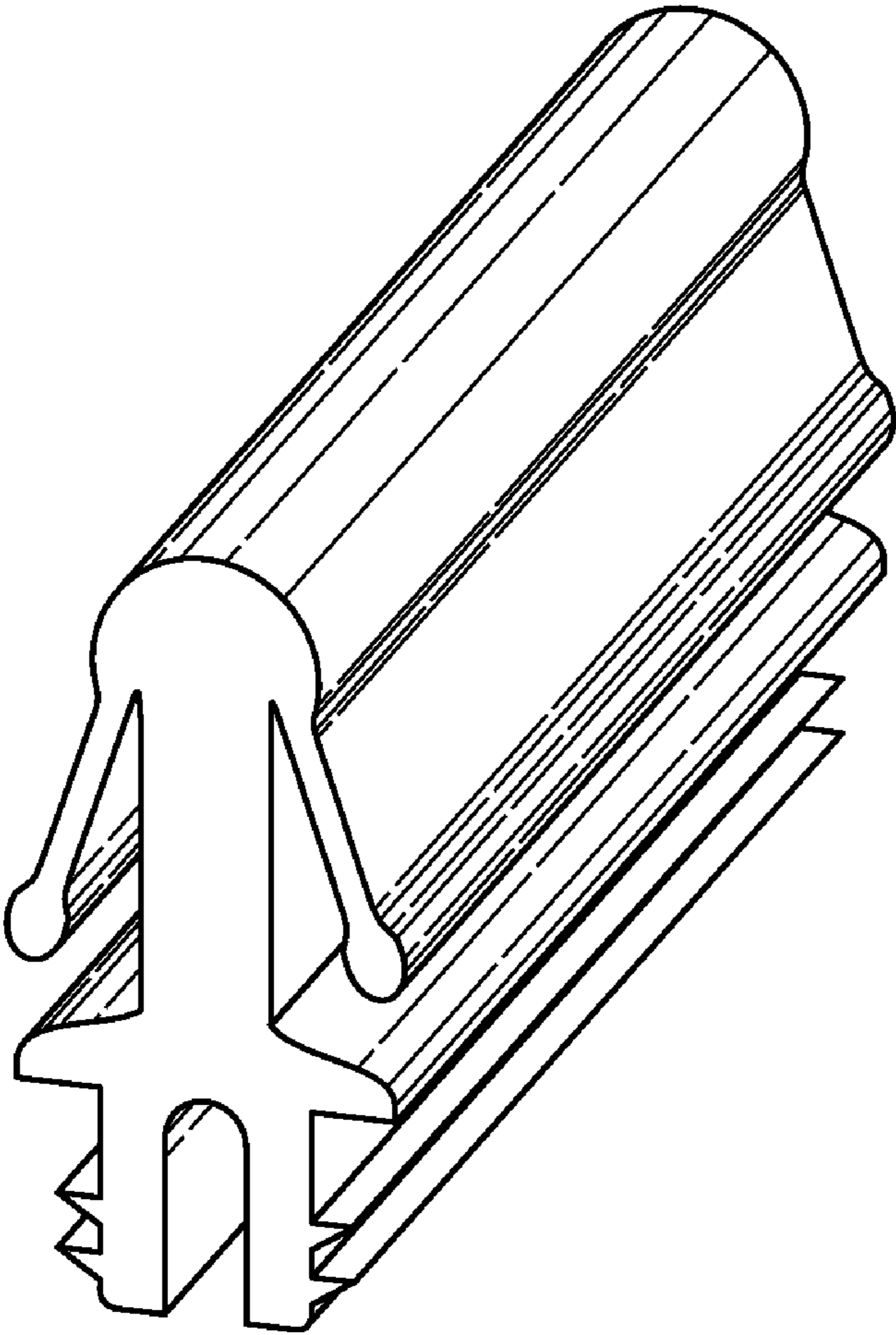
The ornamental design for a weather strip, as shown and described.

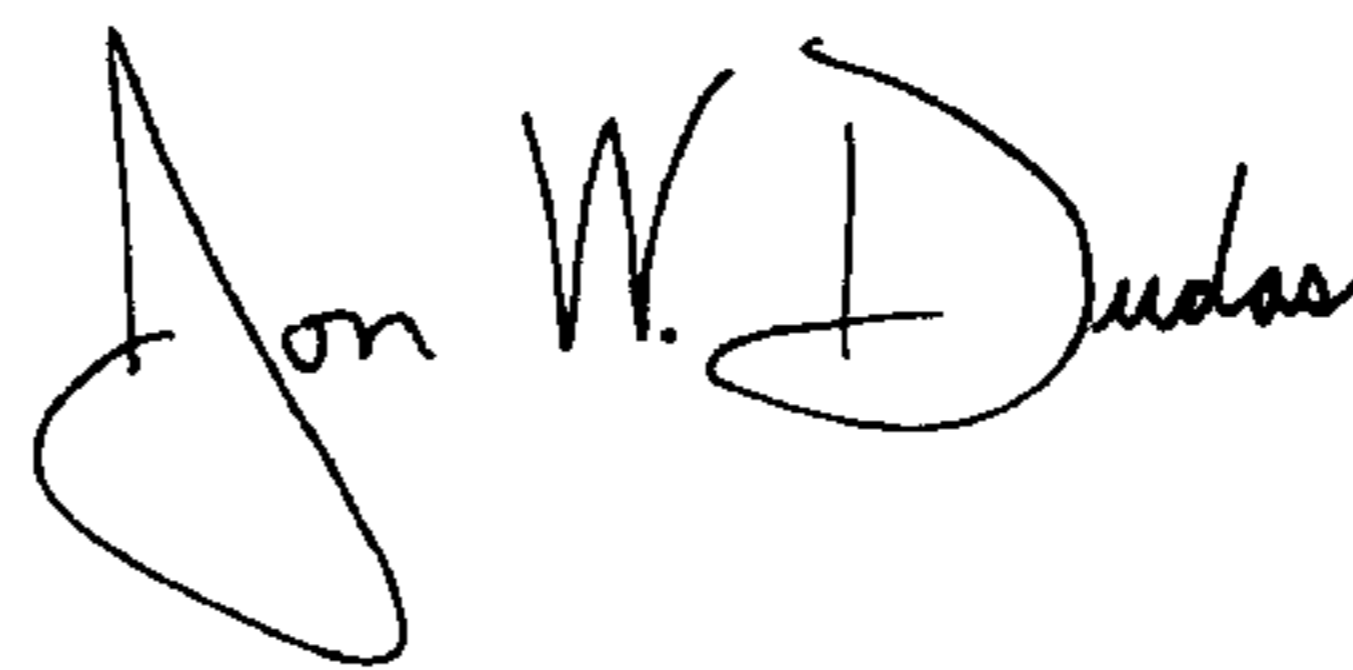
