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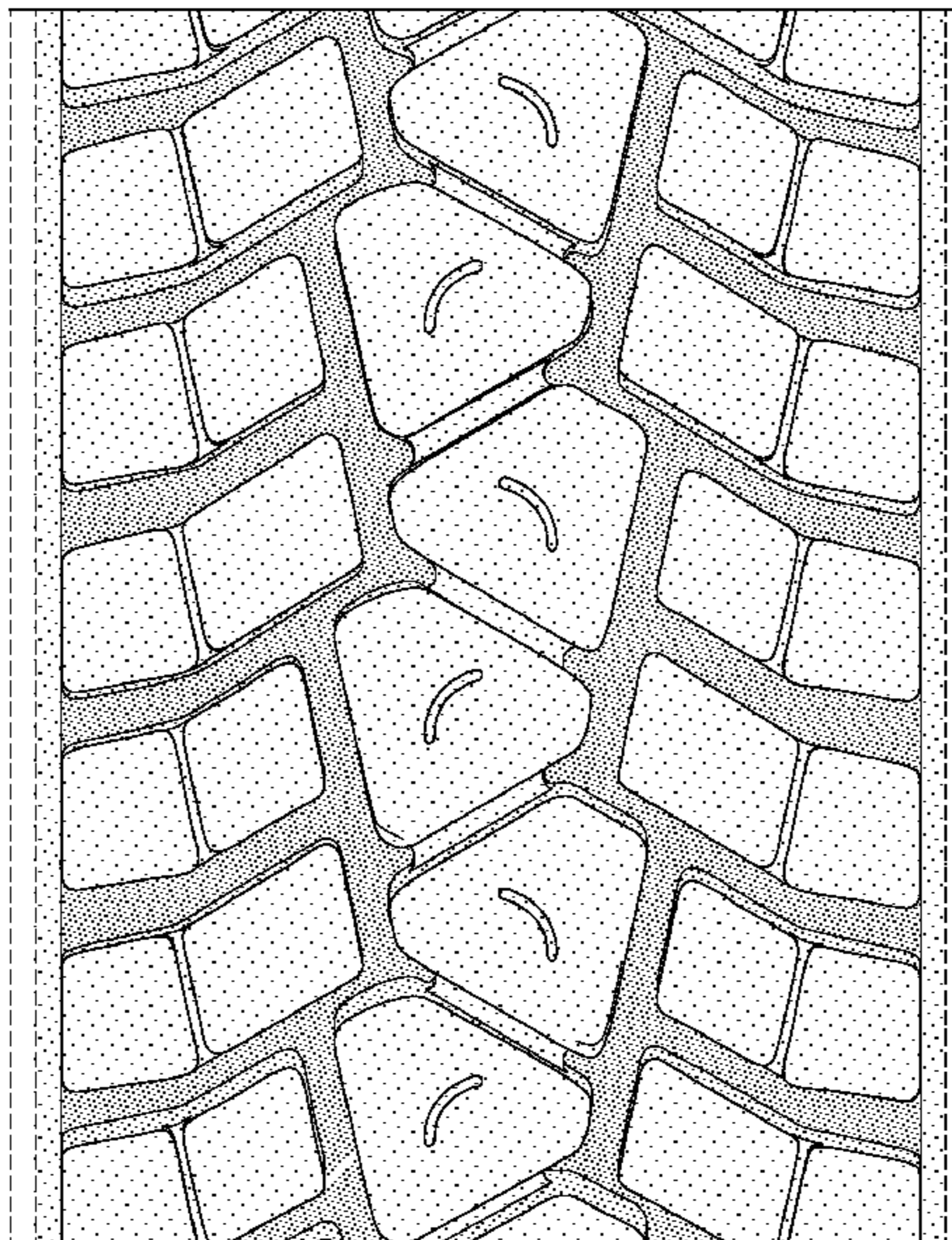
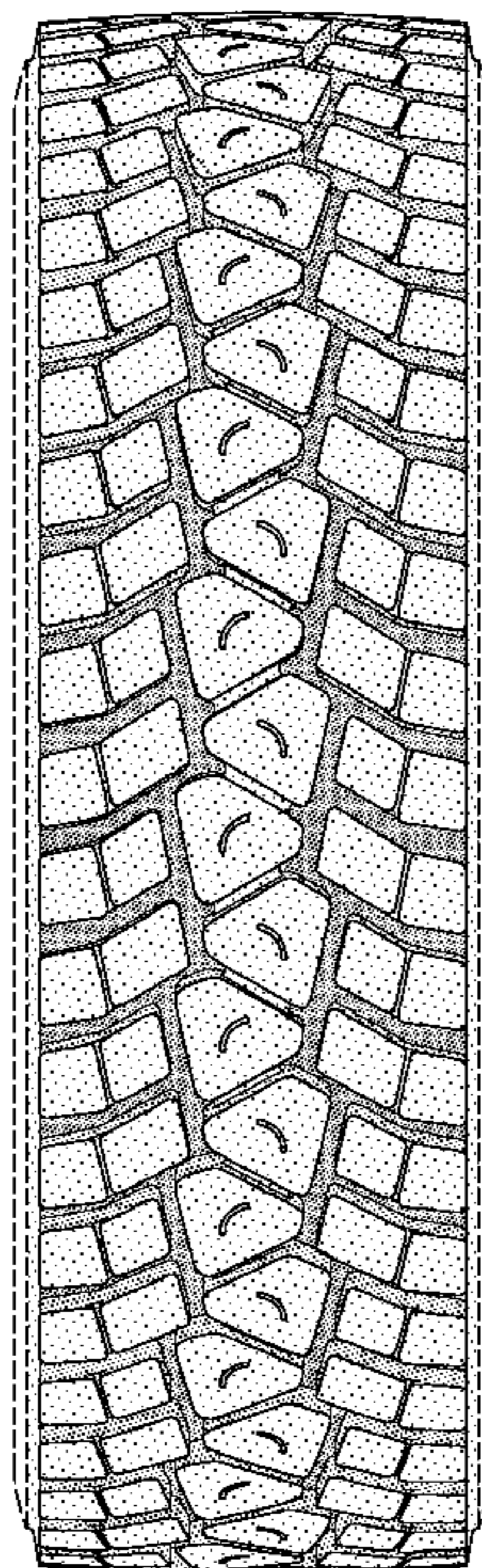
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FIG. 5 is a perspective view of a second embodiment of a tire

being understood that an enlarged fragmentary view thereof
would be substantially identical to that shown in FIG. 4, with
the exception of the inclusion of the sidewall in solid lines.

bead and the peripheral boundary between the tire tread and
the sidewall in FIGS. 1 through 4 are for illustrative purposes
only and form no part of the claimed design.

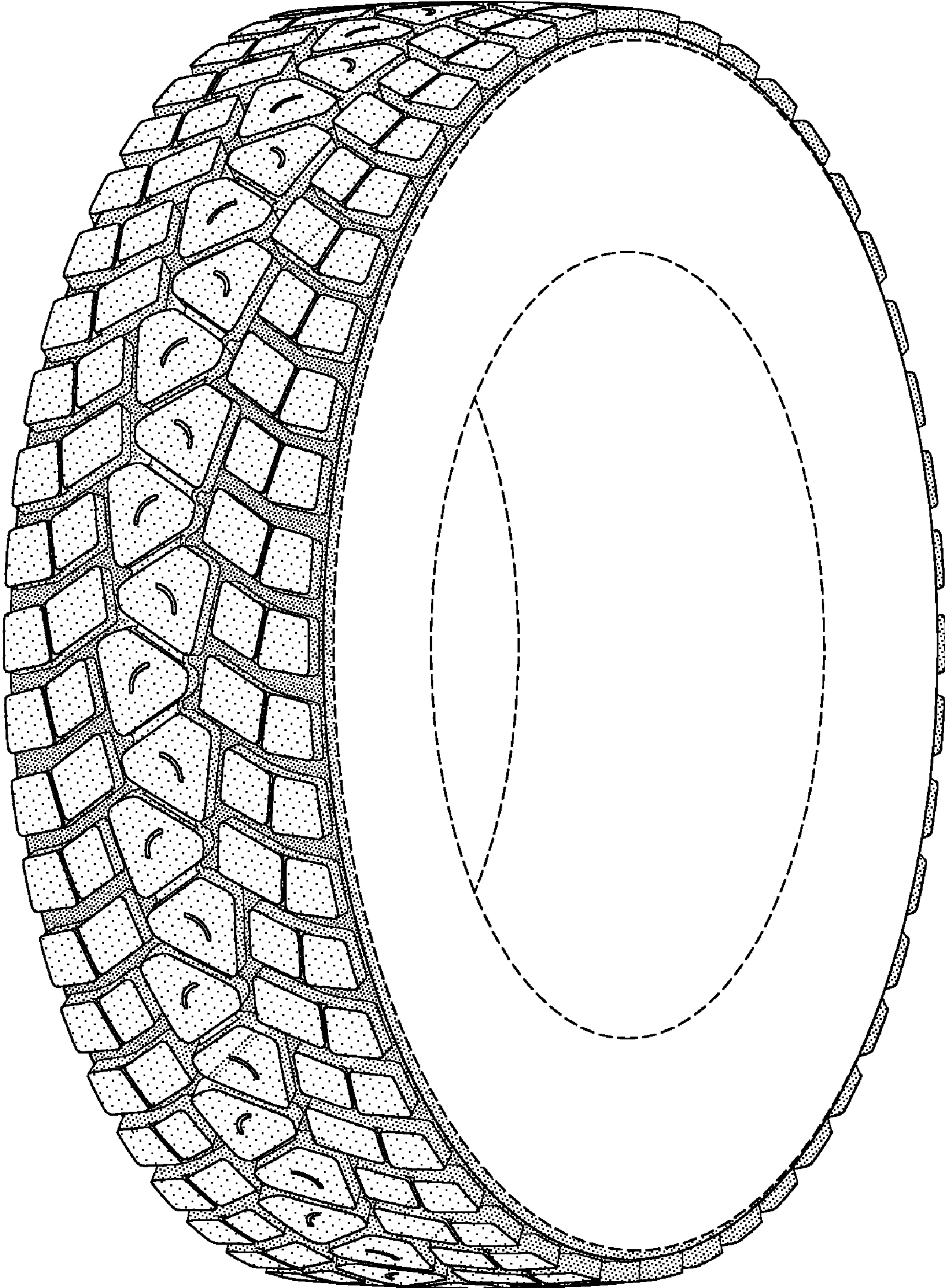

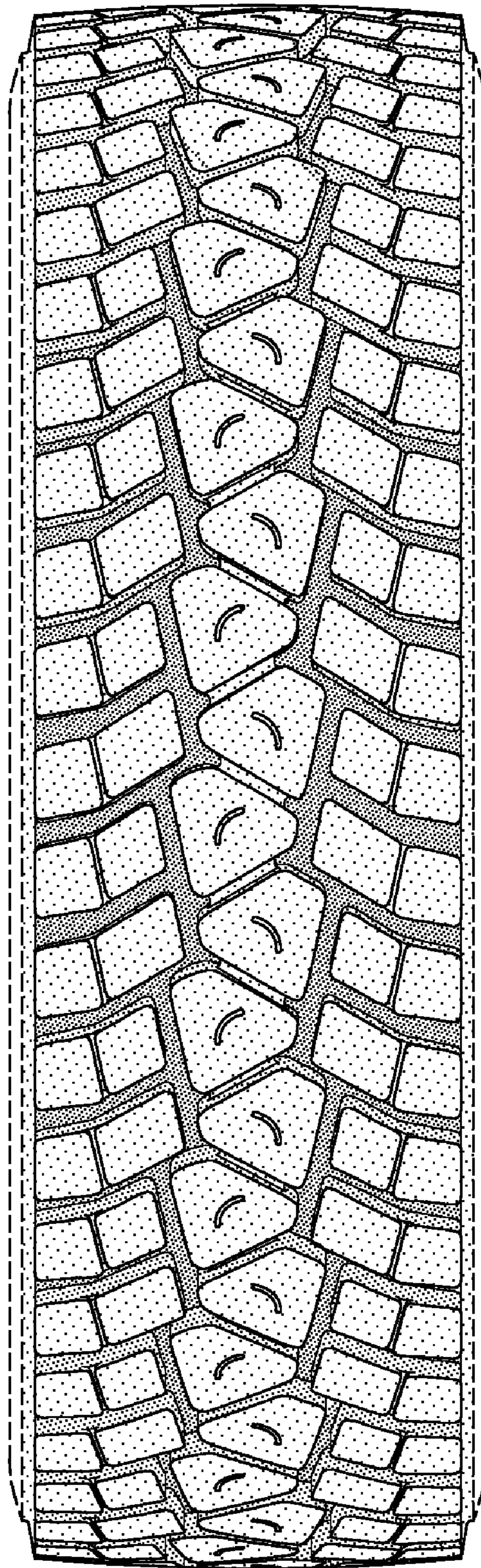

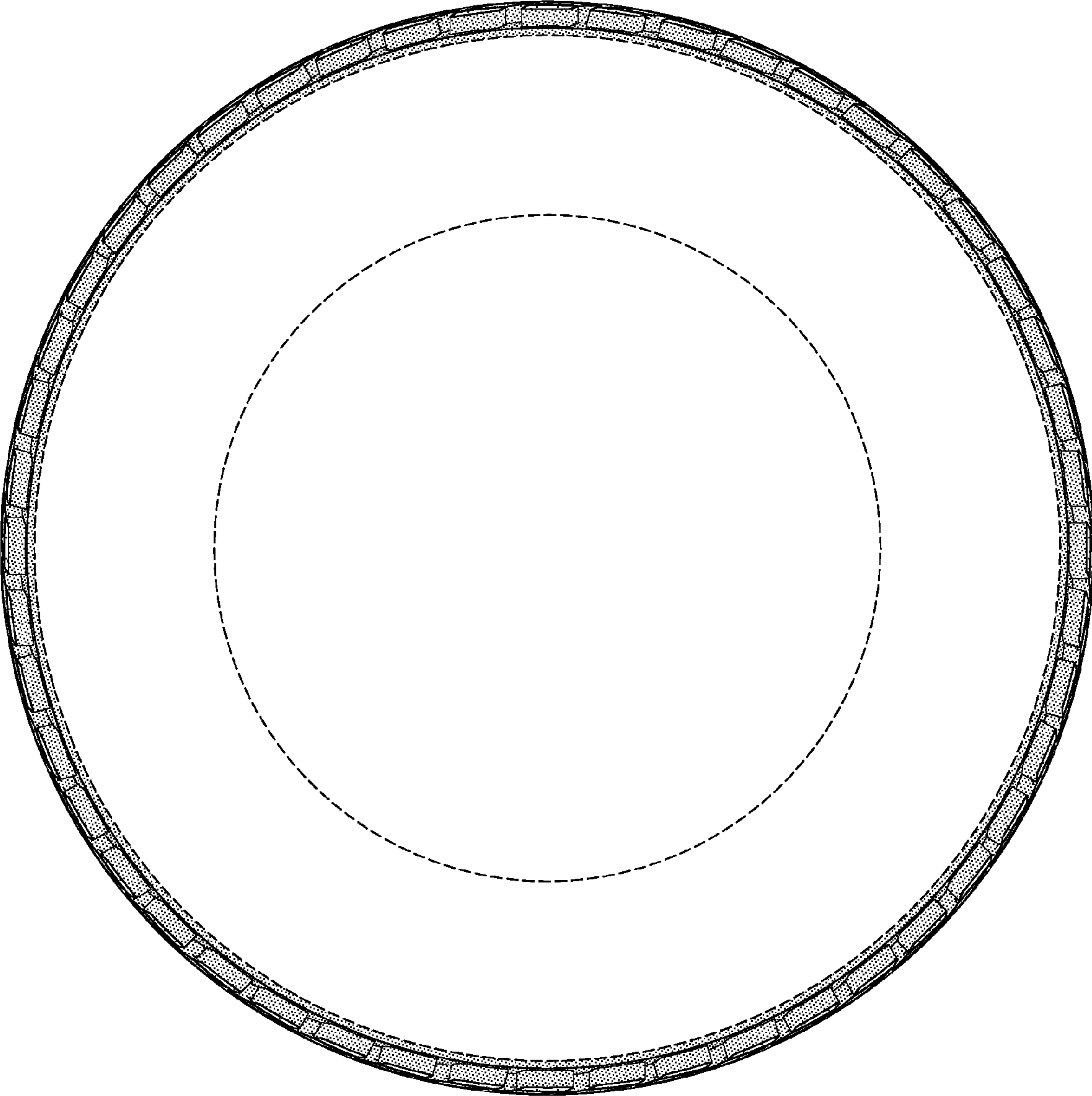

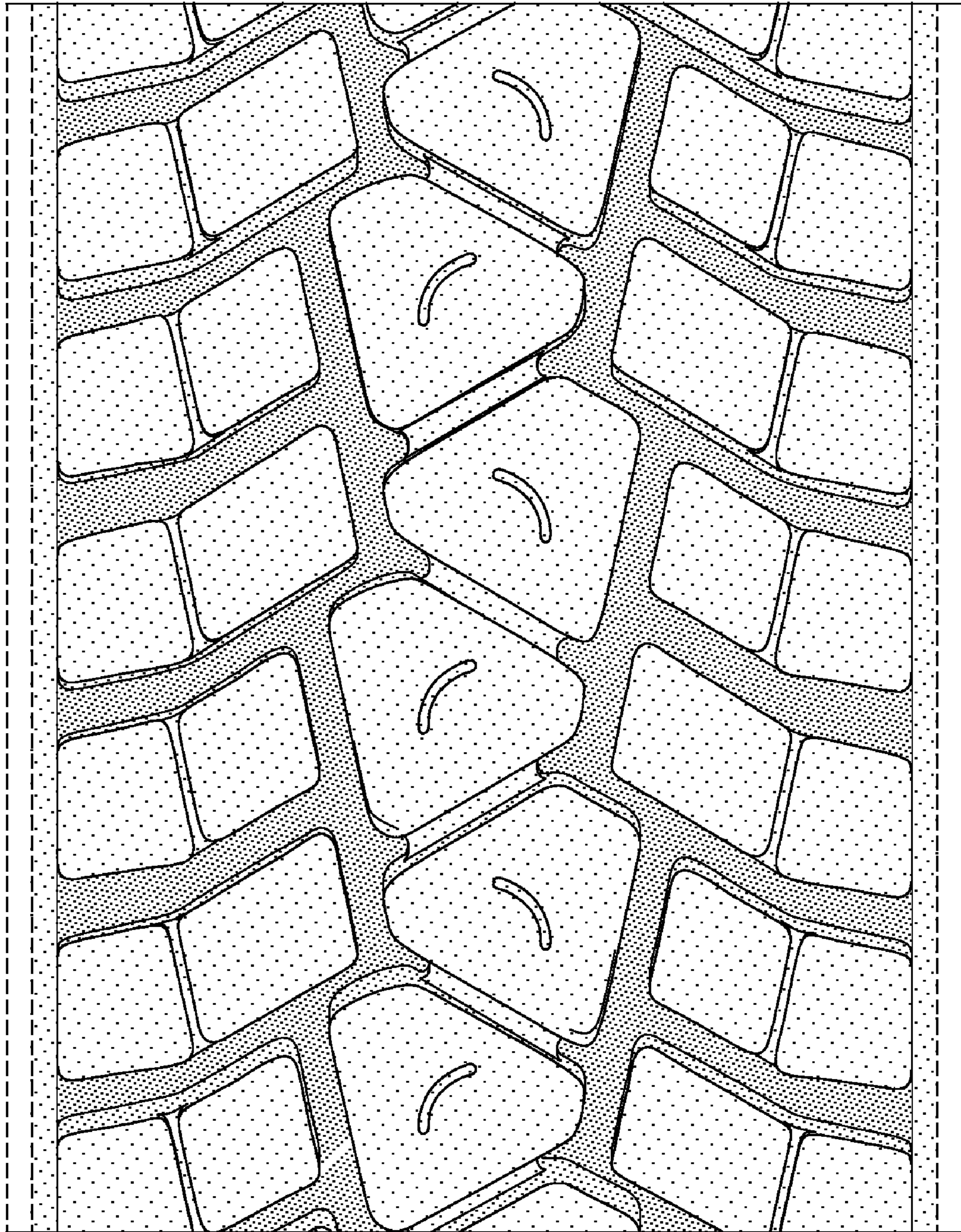

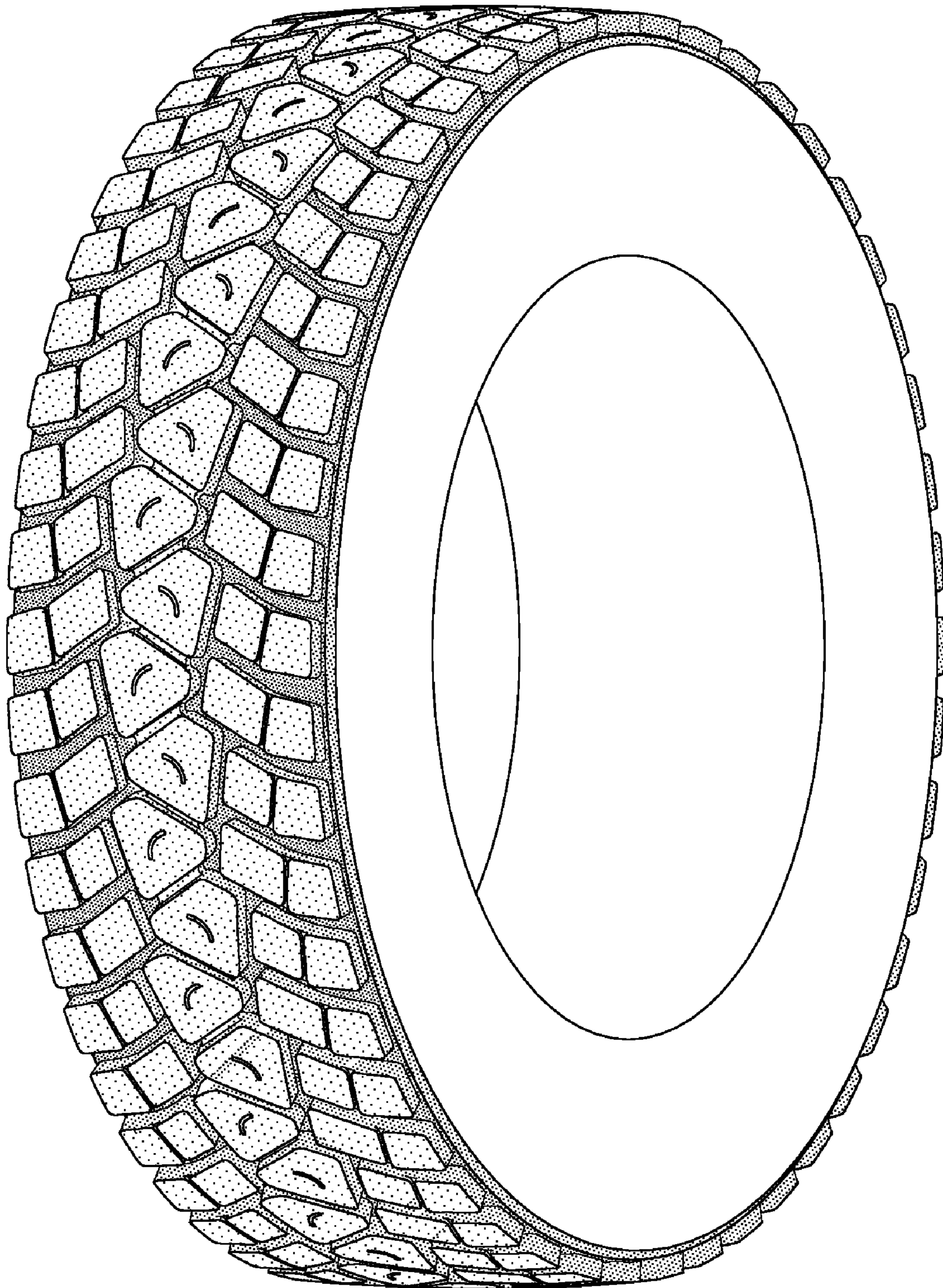

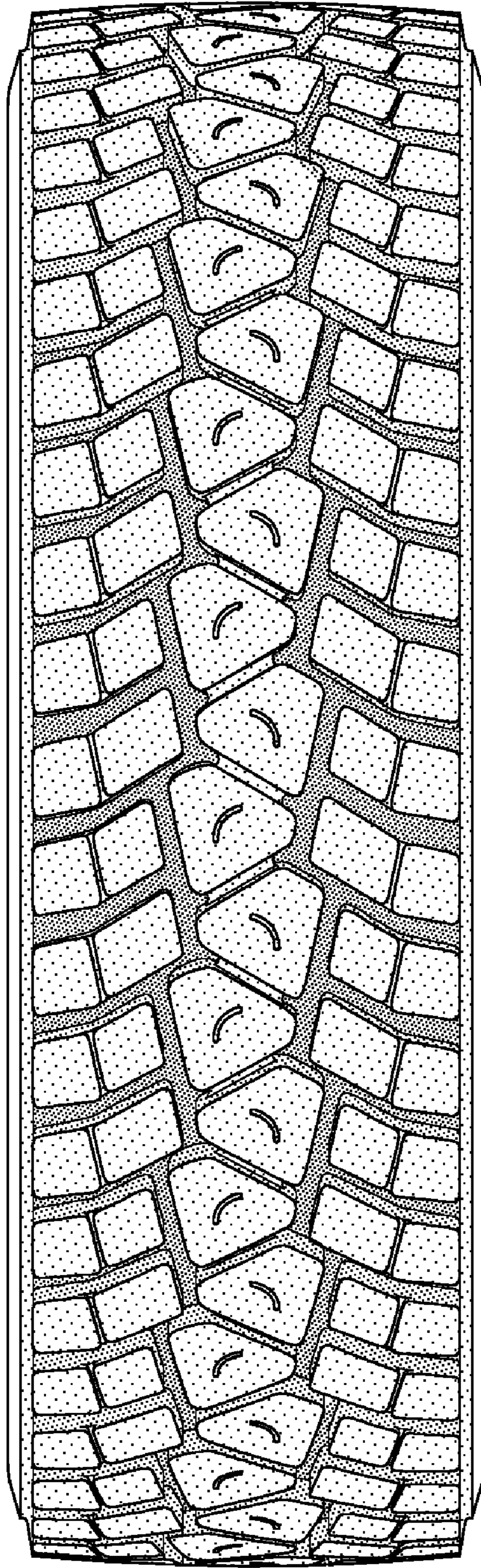
