FIG. 4 is a front view of the subject invention;

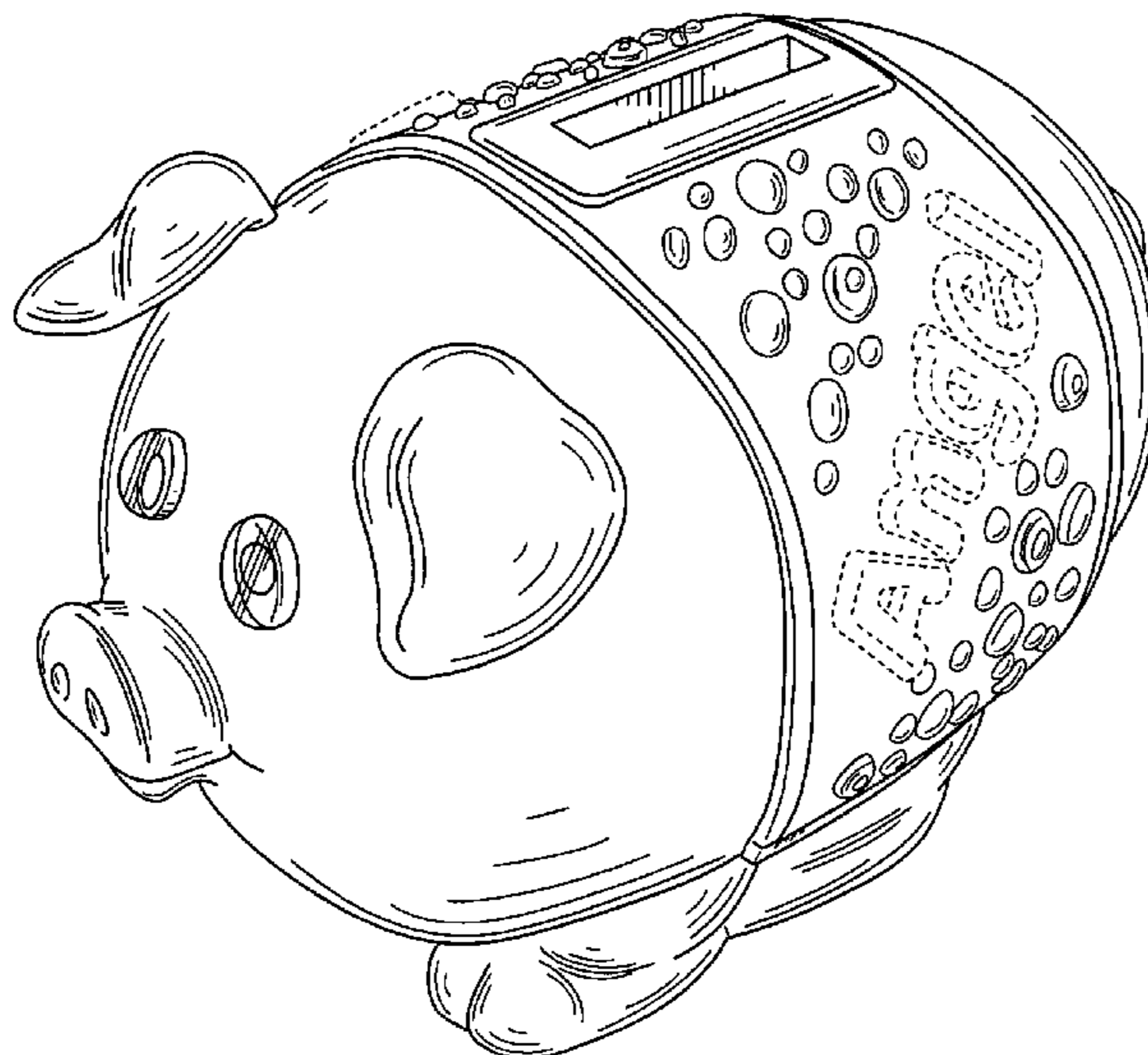
FIG. 5 is a rear view of the subject invention;

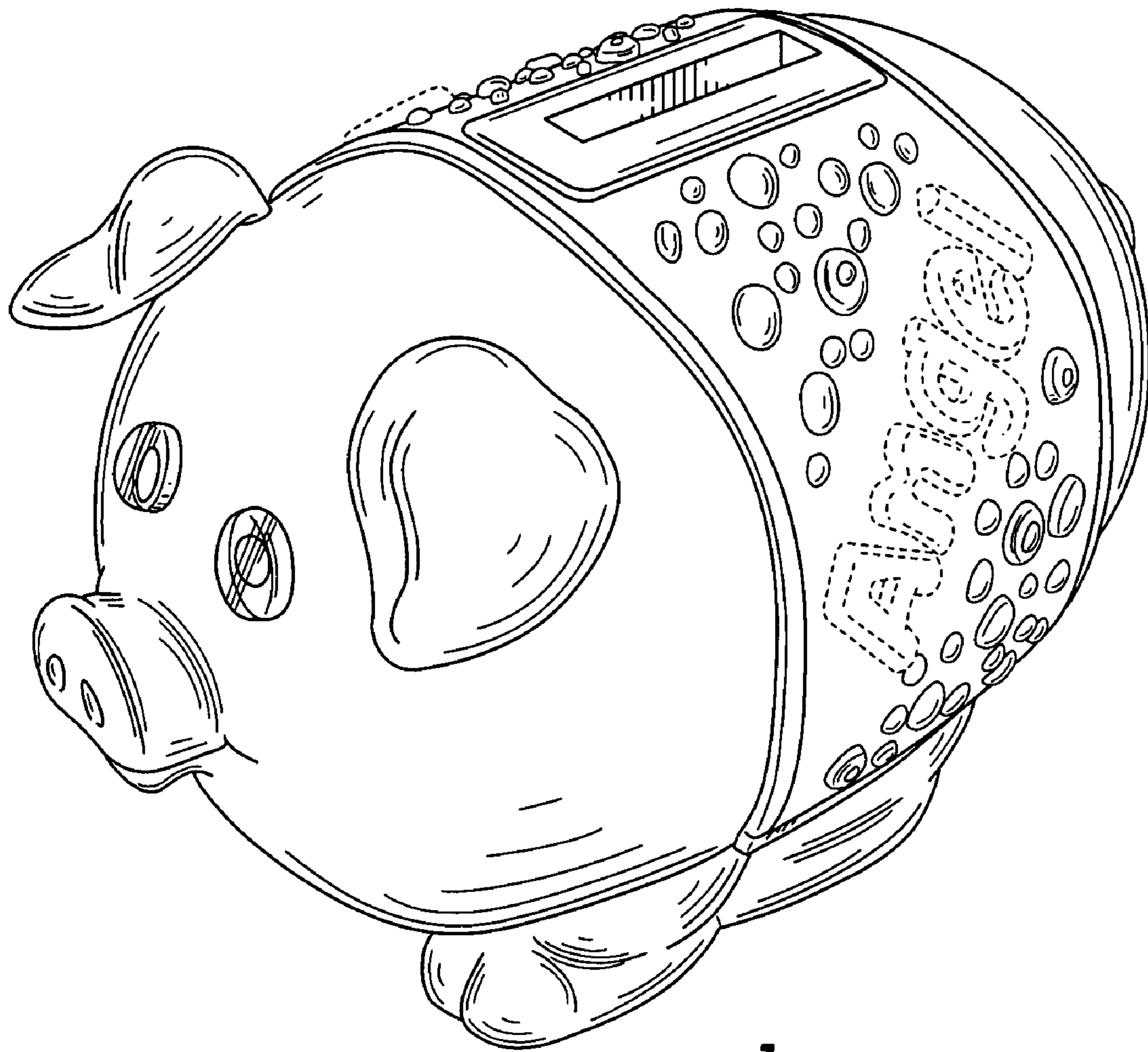

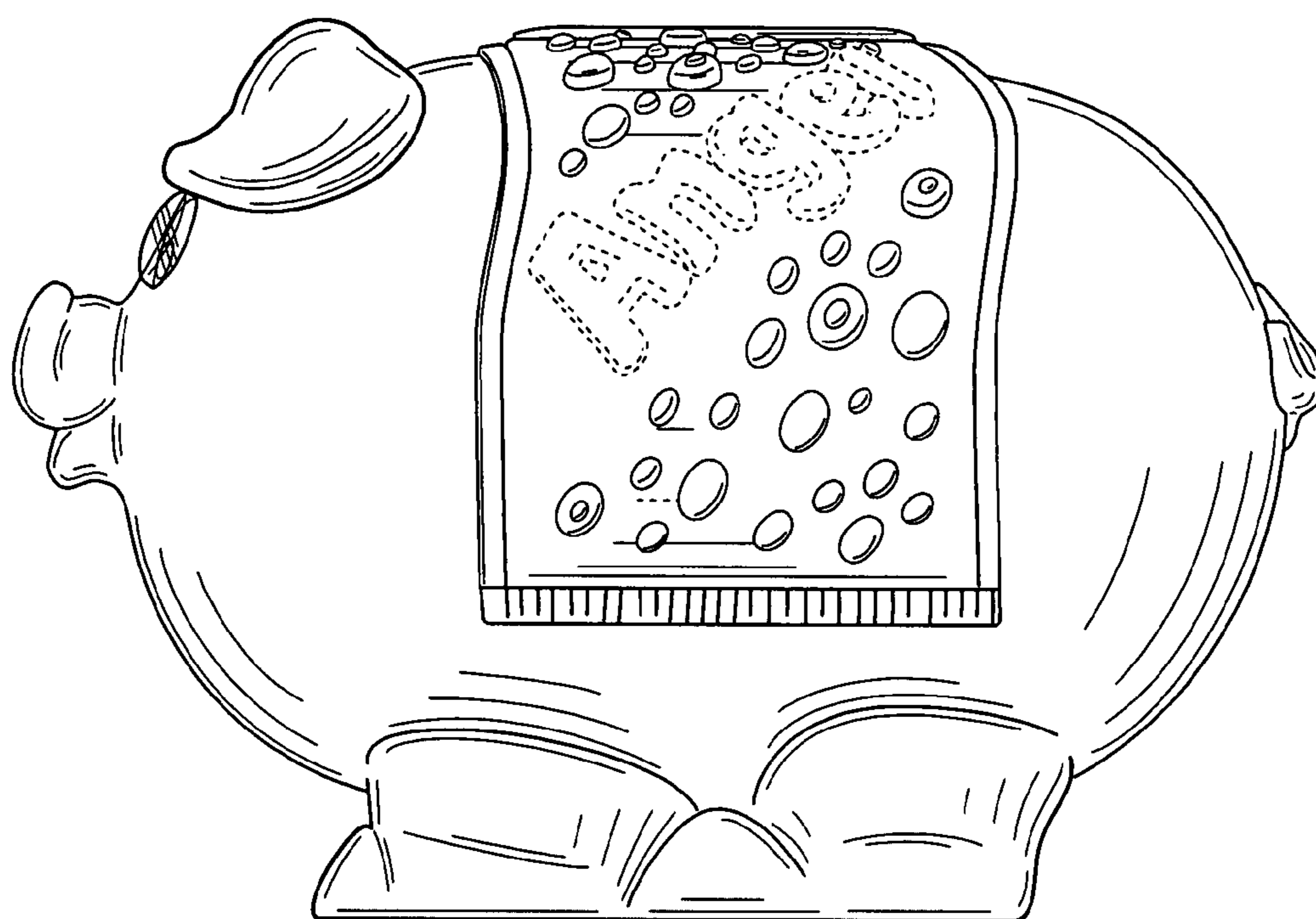

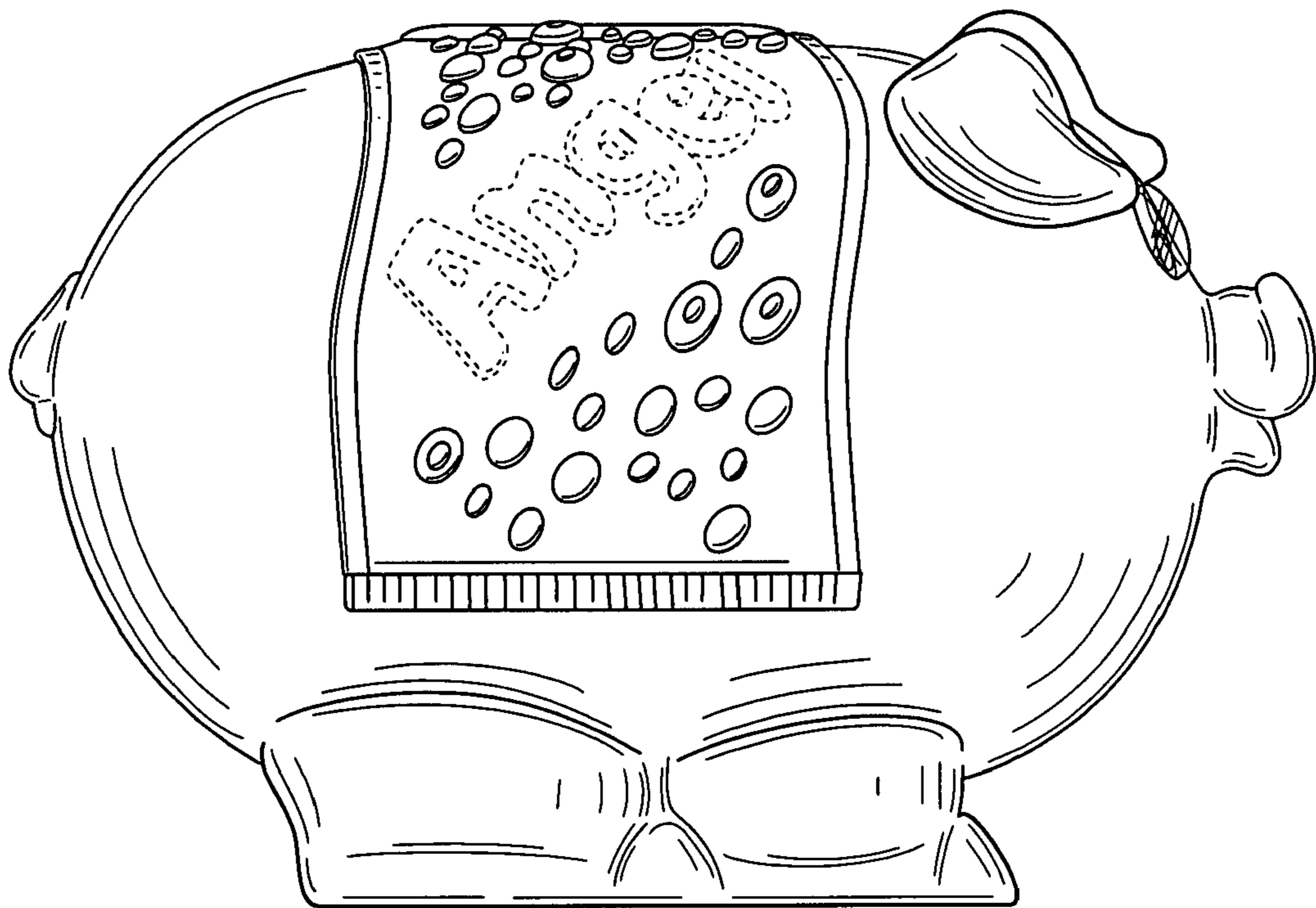

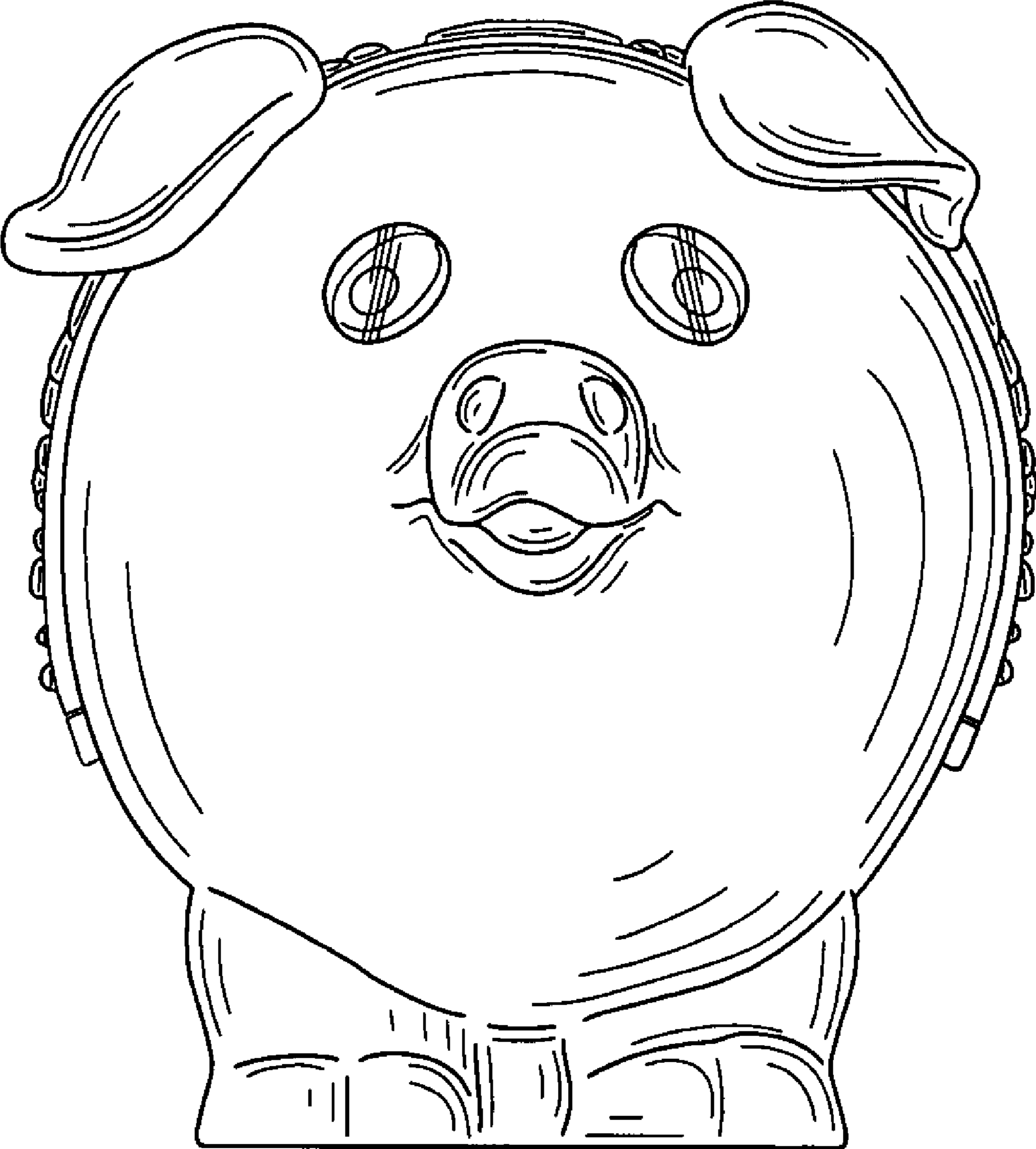

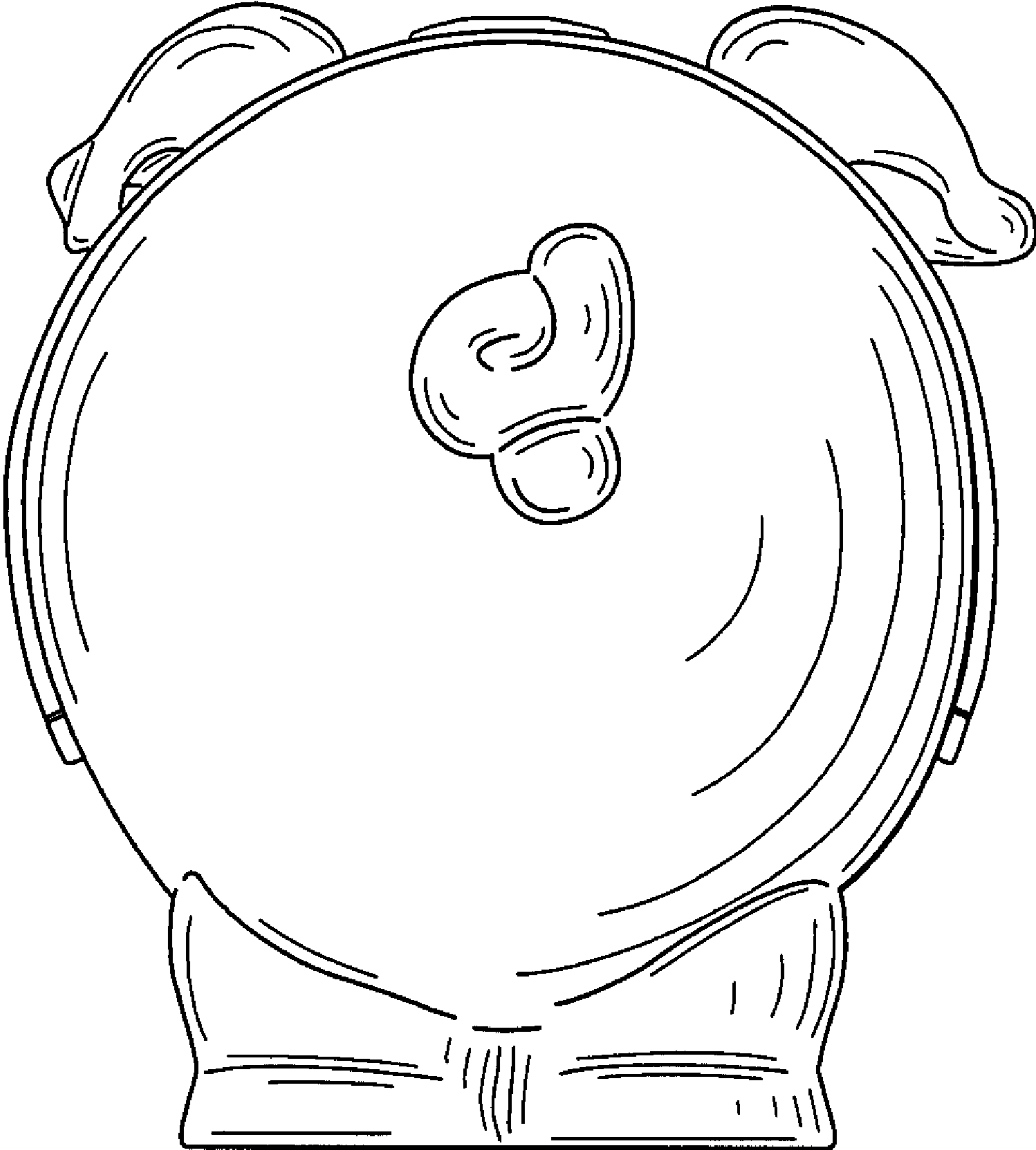

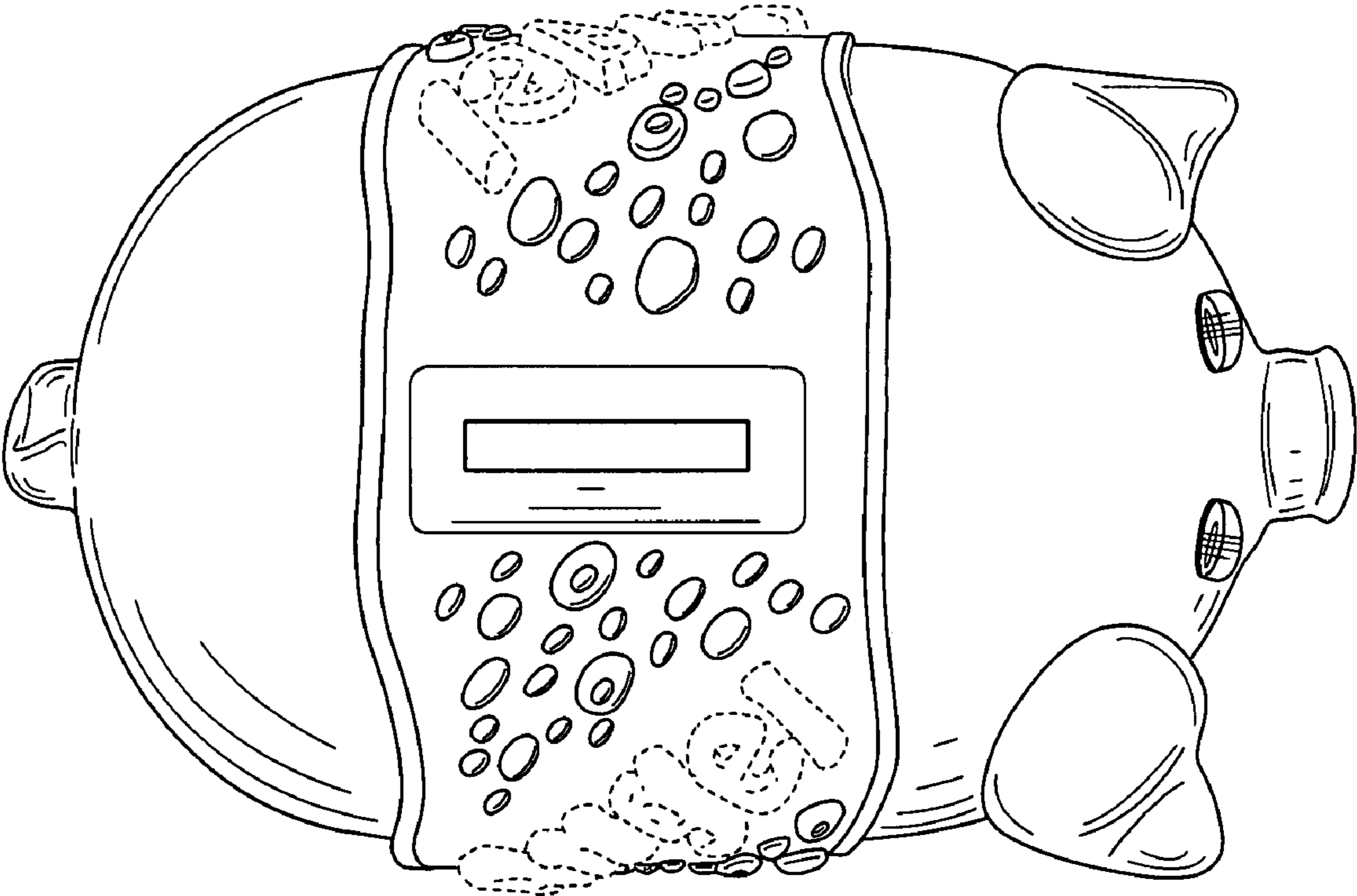

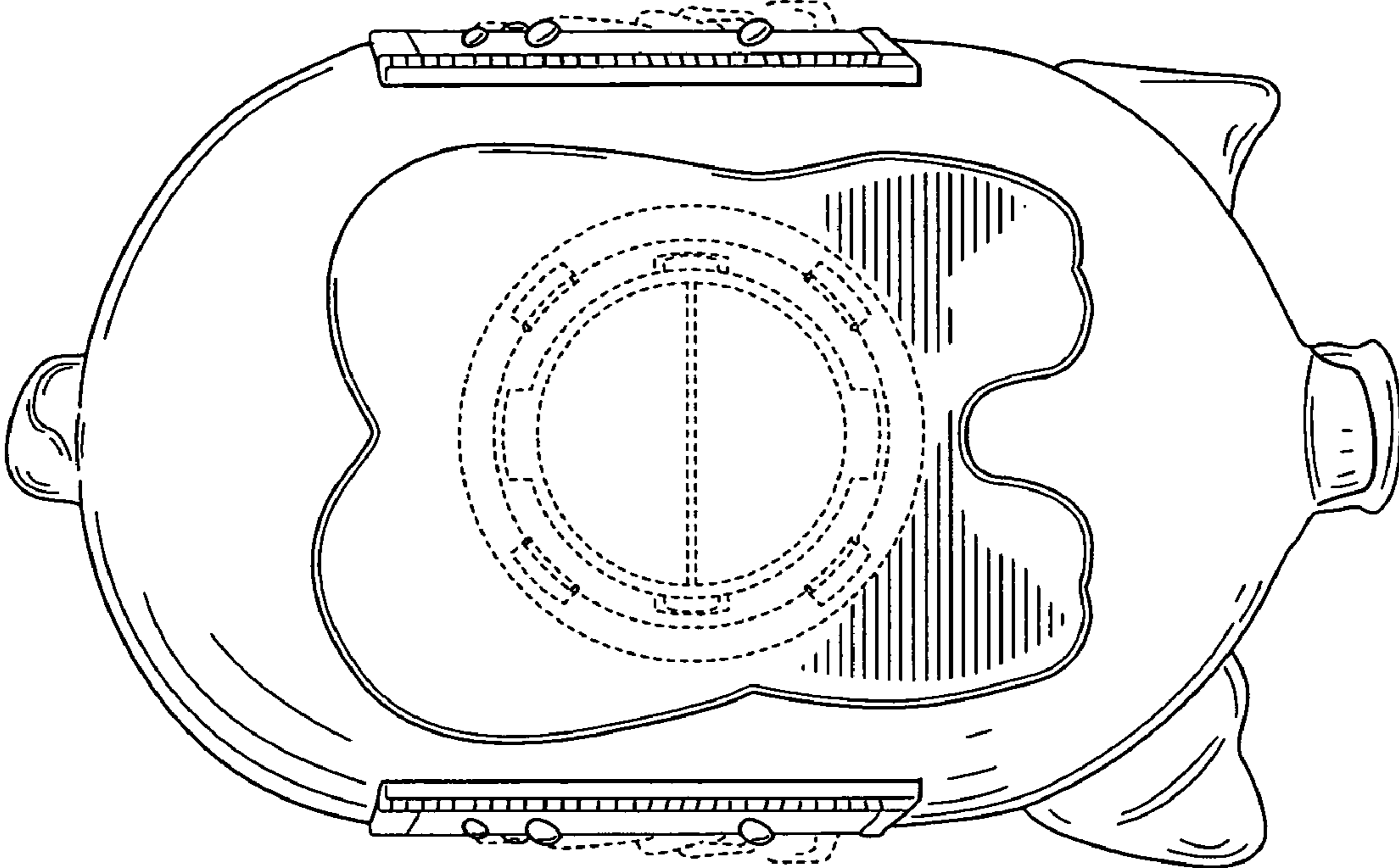
