(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a cutlery set, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a cutlery set consisting of a knife, fork and spoon showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a top view of the knife for the cutlery set;

FIG. 3 is a left side view of the knife, with the right side view being a mirror image thereof;

FIG. 4 is an end view of the knife as seen from the blade end;

FIG. 5 is an end view of the knife as seen from the handle end;

FIG. 6 is a top view of a fork for the cutlery set;

FIG. 7 is a bottom view of the fork;

FIG. 8 is a left side view of the fork, with the right side view being a mirror image thereof;

FIG. 9 is an end view of the fork as seen from the tines end;

FIG. 10 is an end view of the fork as seen from the handle end;

FIG. 11 is a top view of the spoon for the cutlery set;

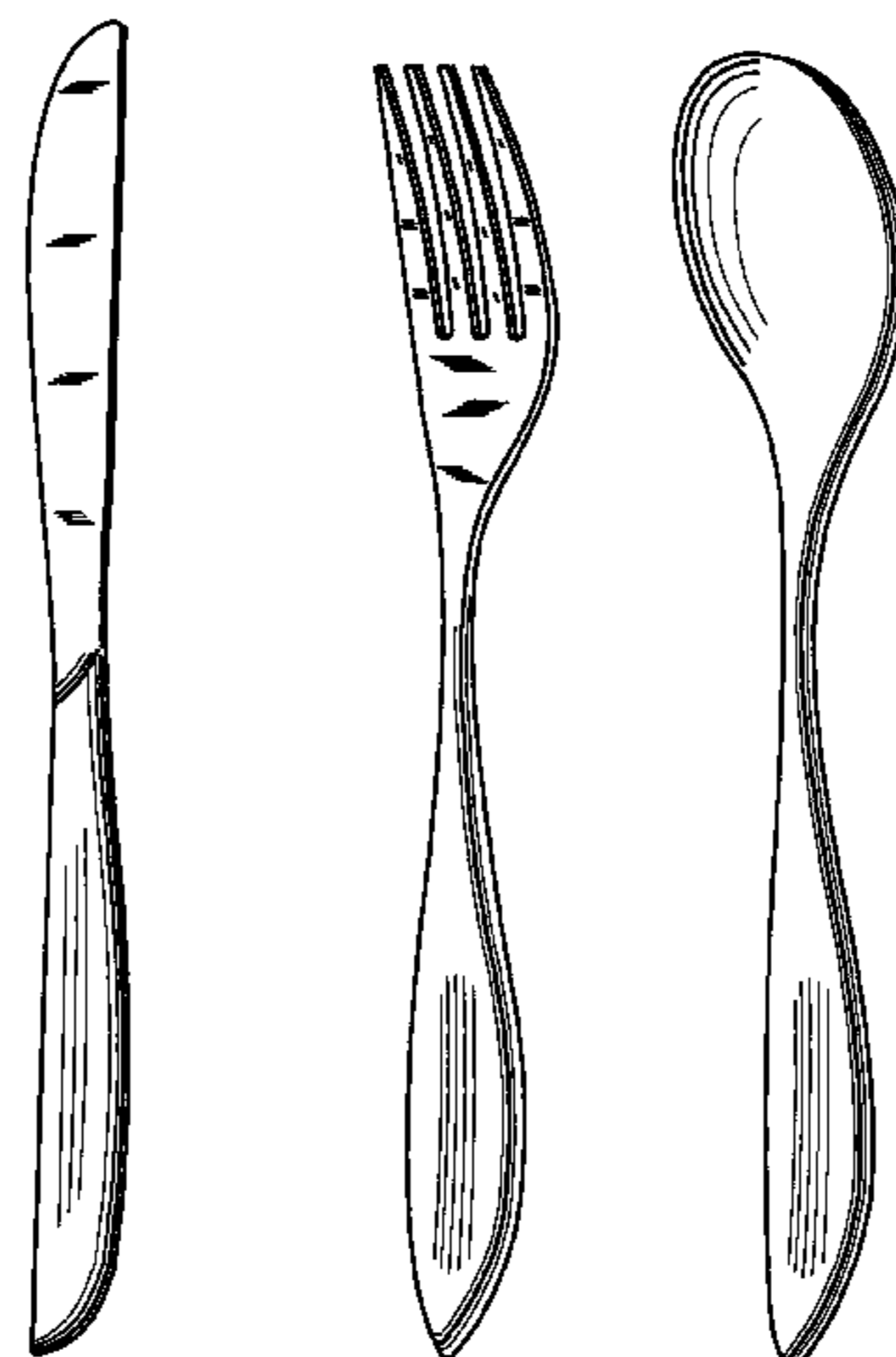
FIG. 12 is a bottom view of the spoon;

FIG. 13 is a left side view of the spoon, with the right side view being a mirror image thereof;

FIG. 14 is an end view of the spoon as seen from the bowl end; and,

FIG. 15 is an end view of the spoon as seen from the handle end.

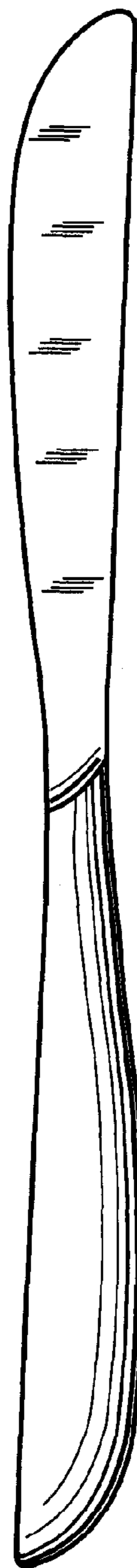

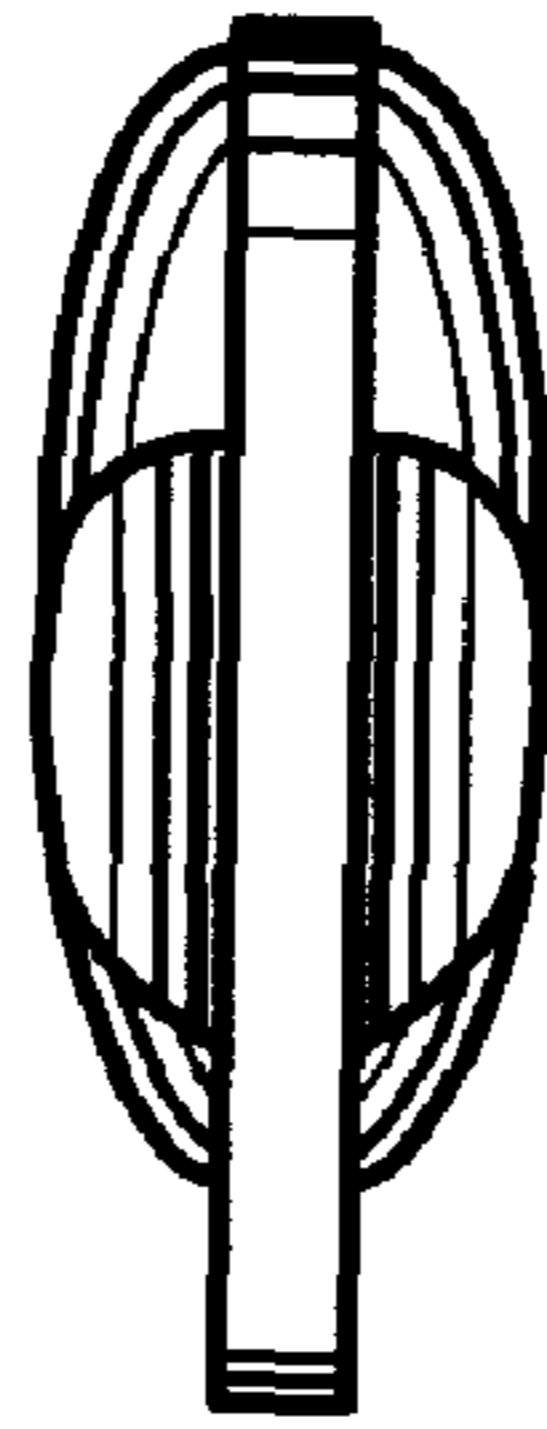

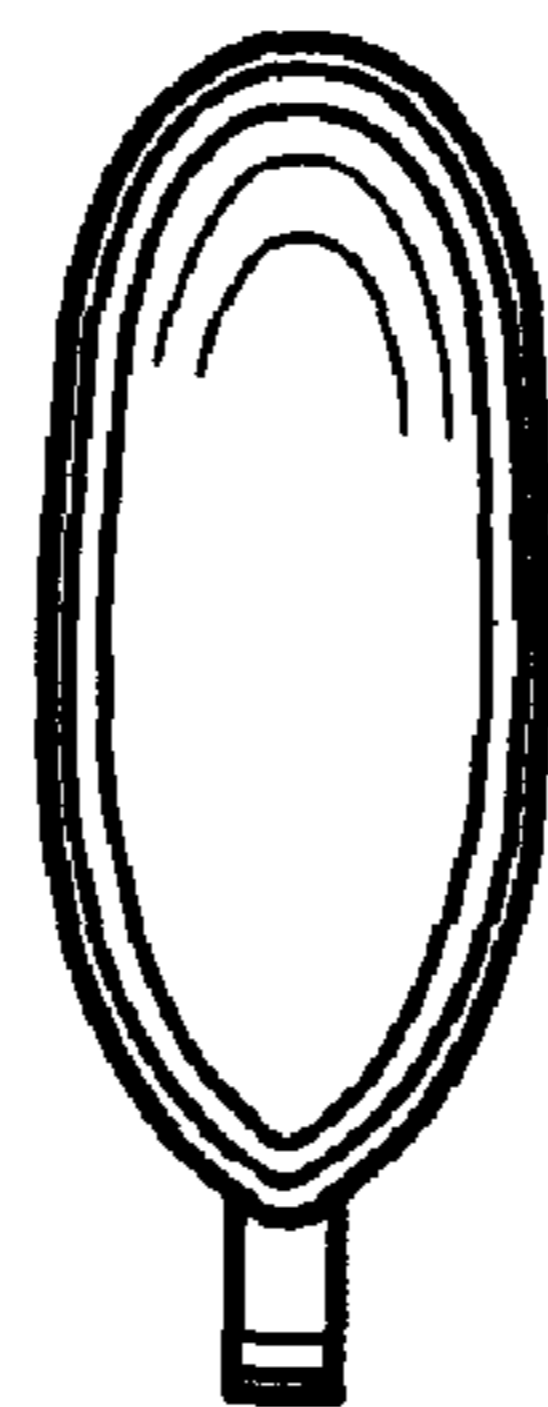
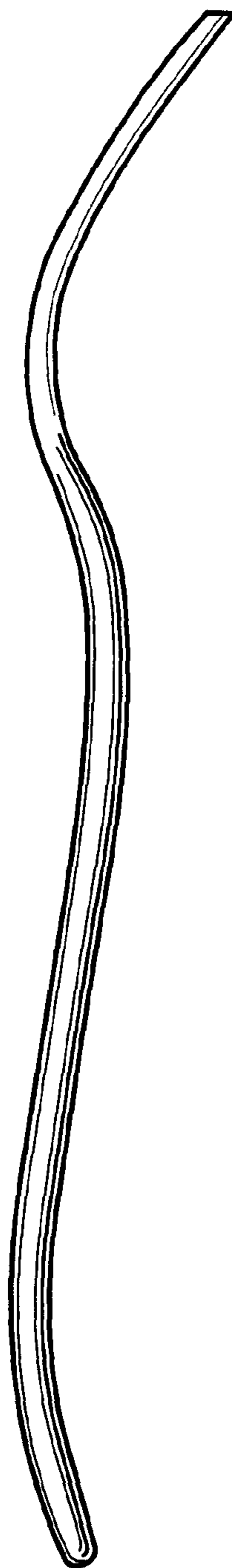
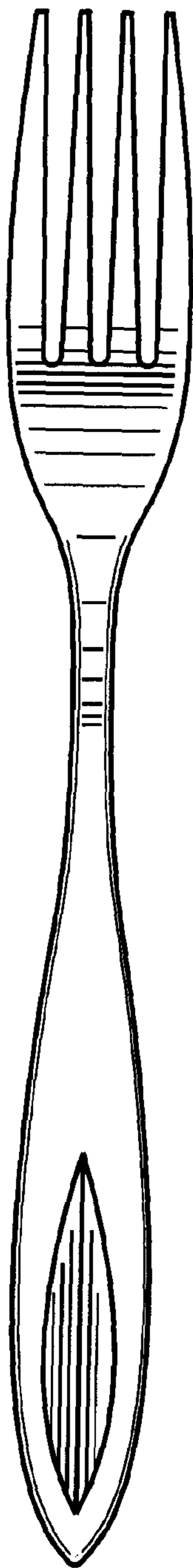
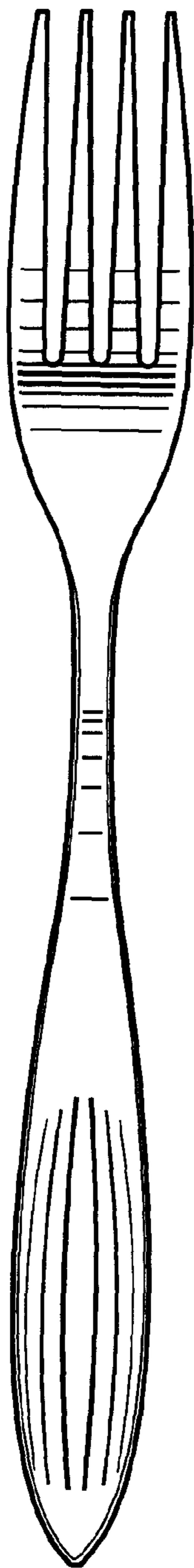


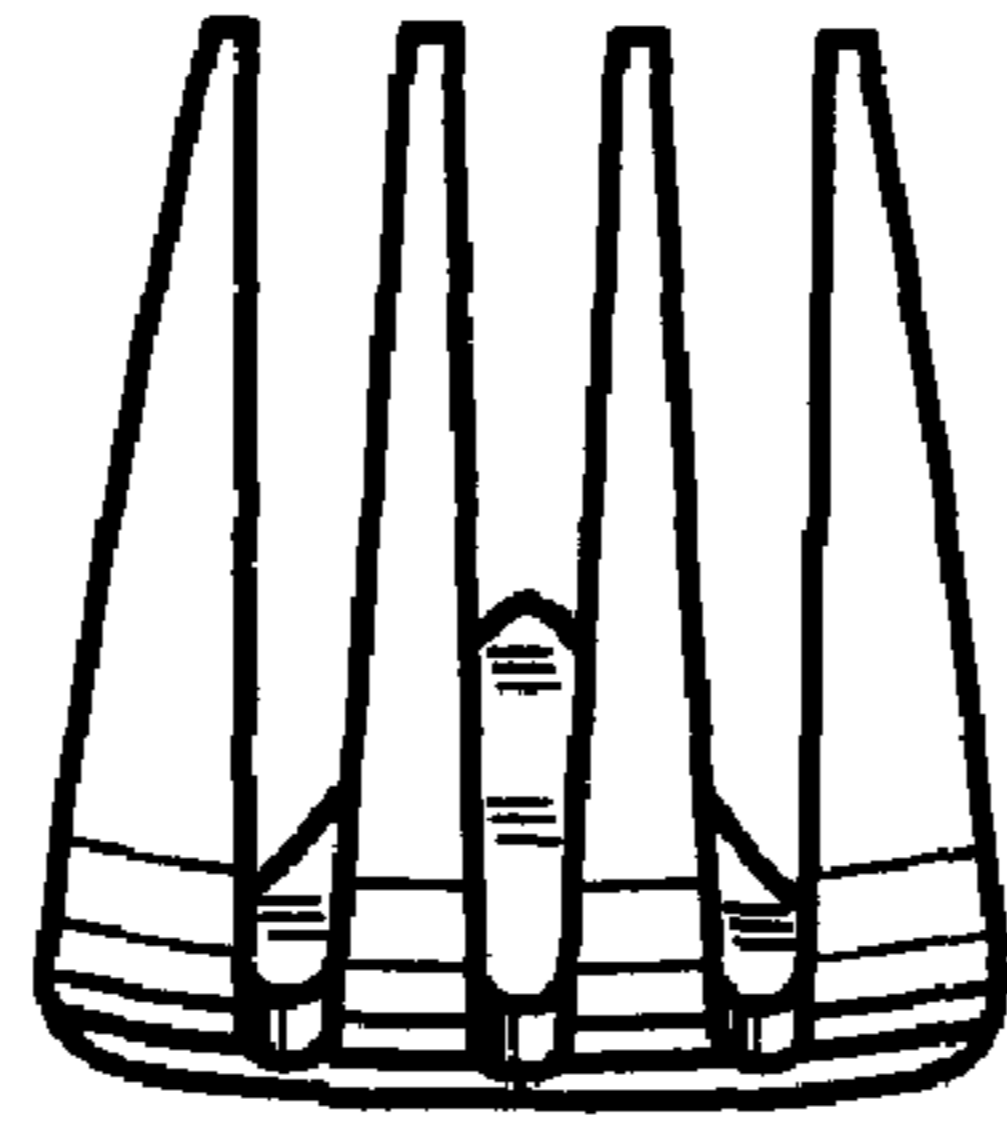

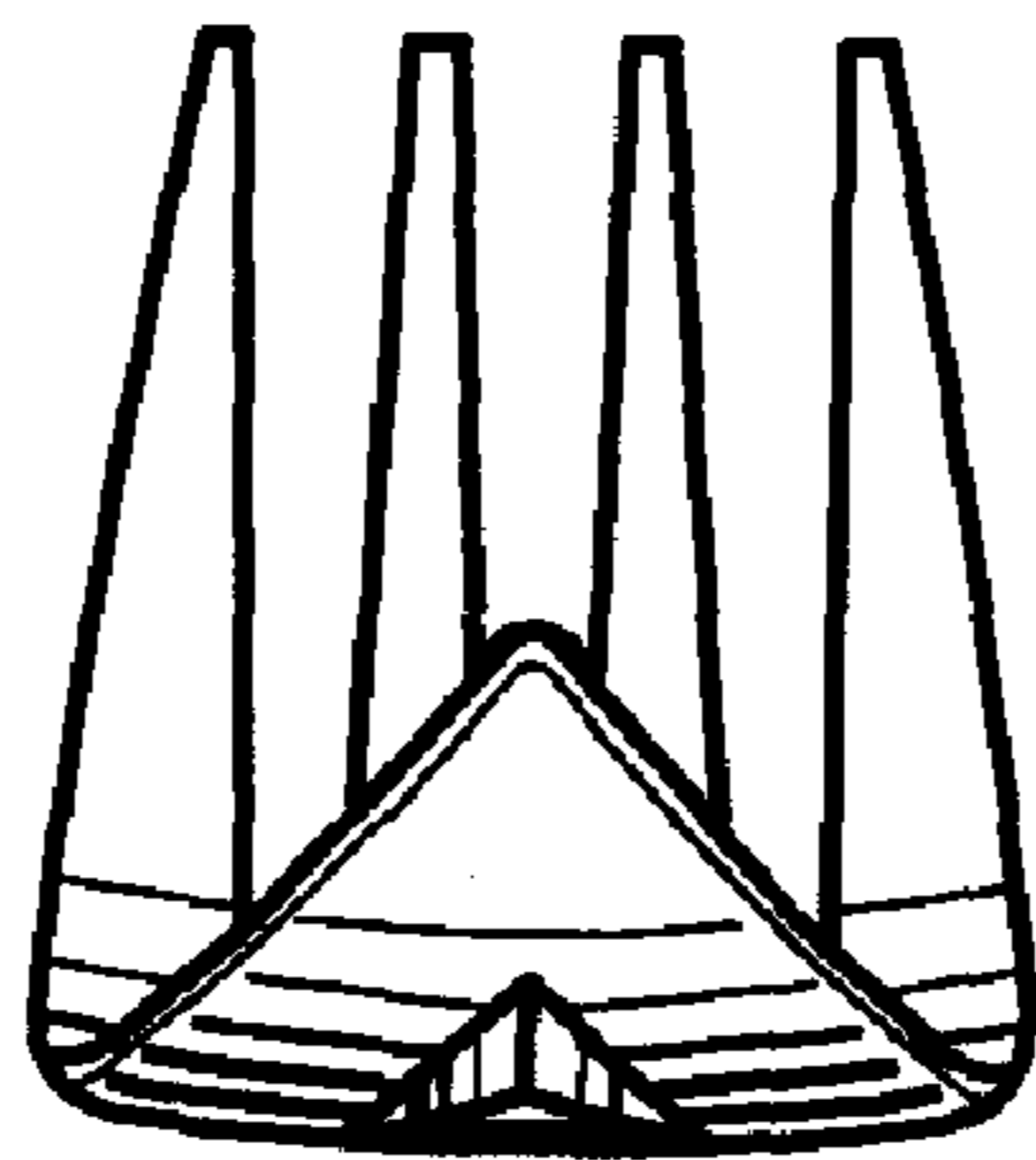

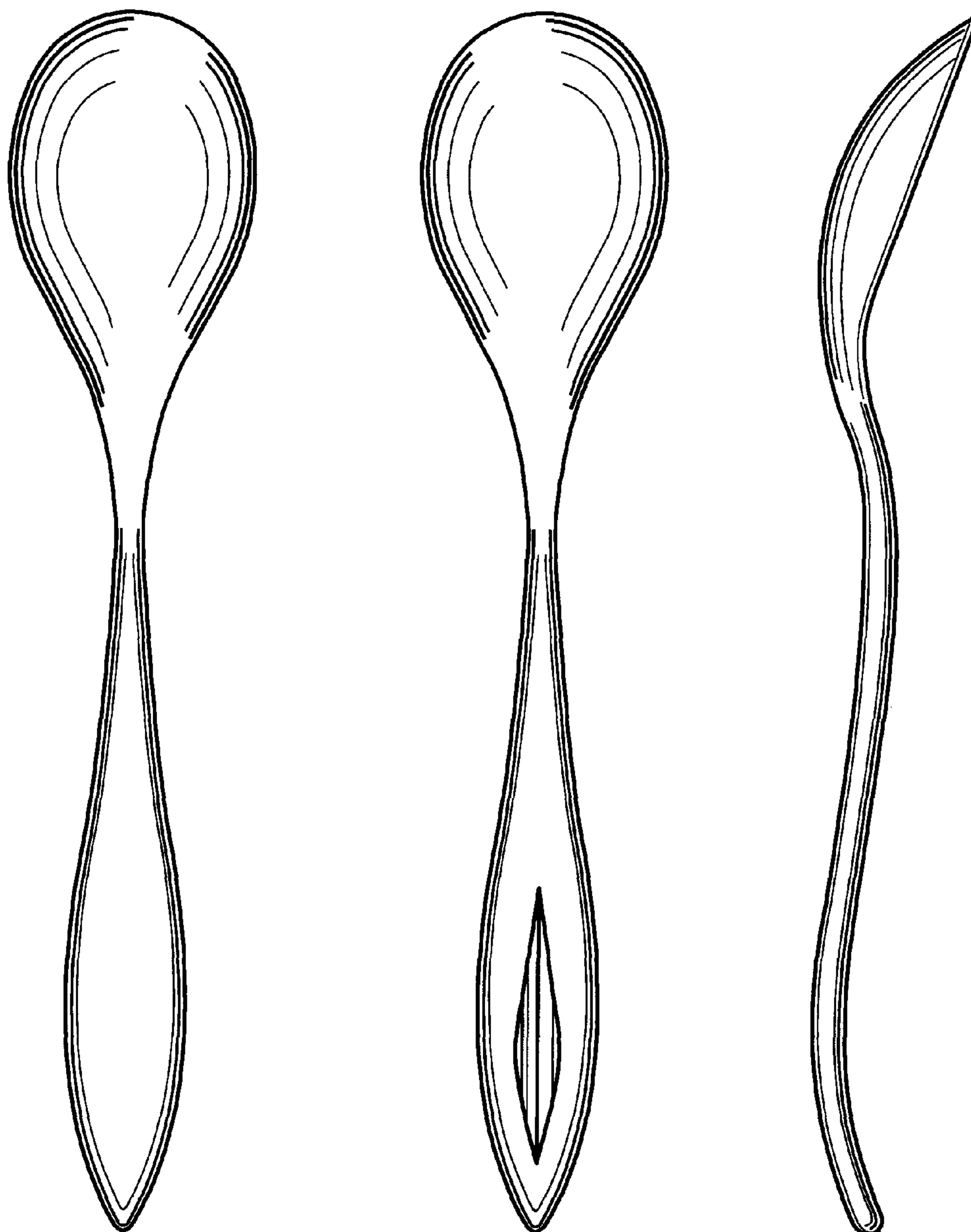

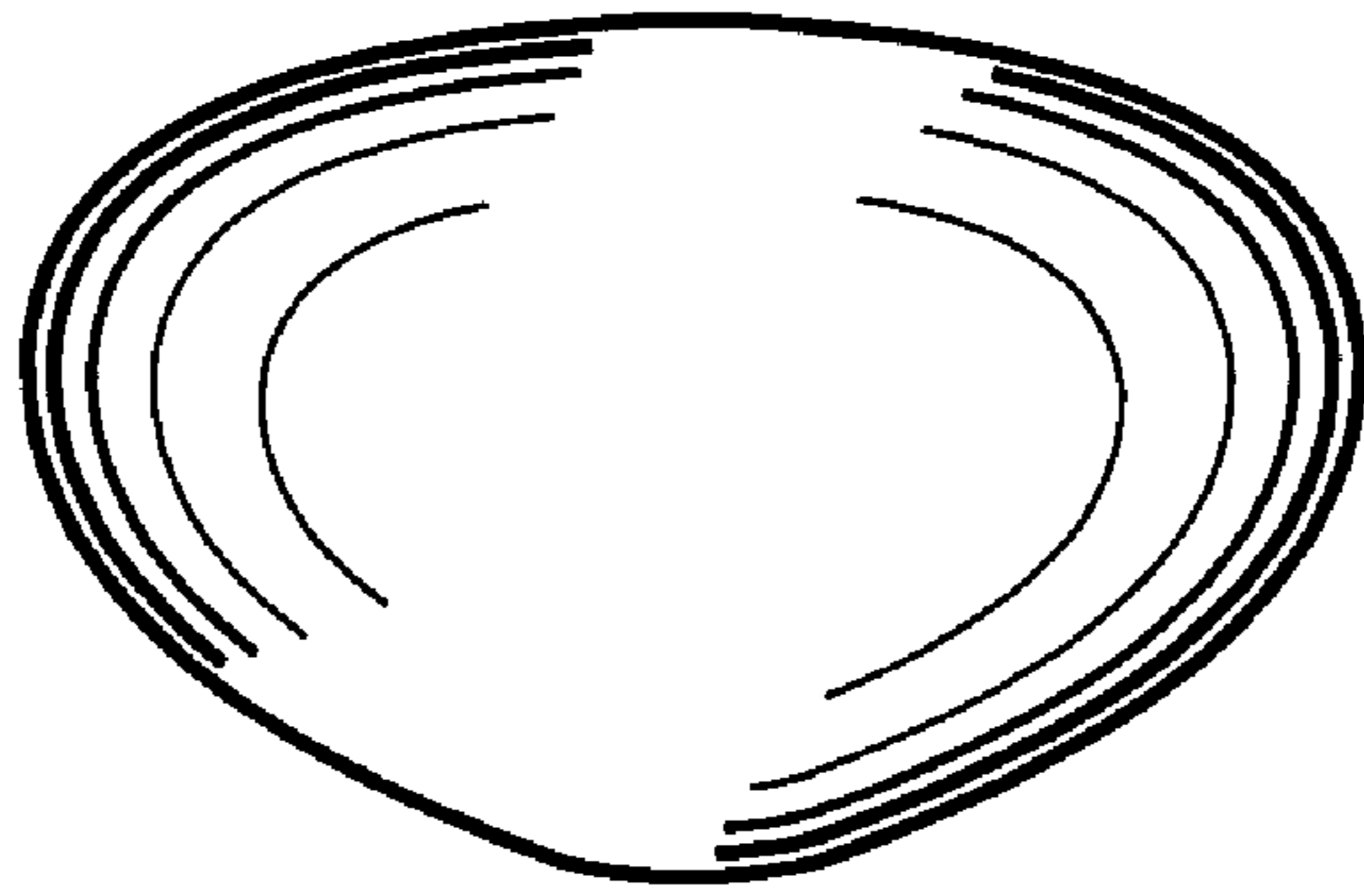

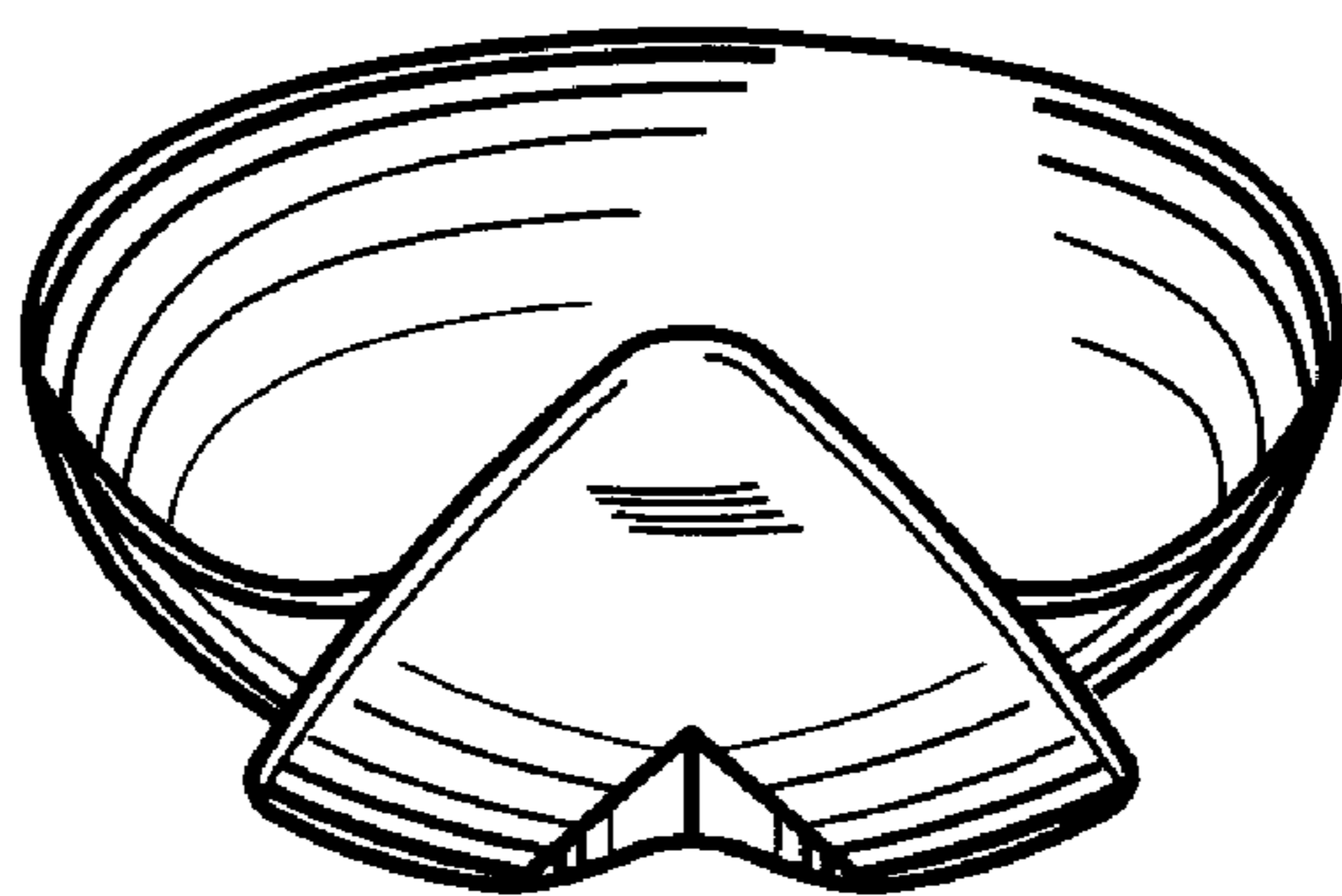
