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(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for an L-shaped bracket for dual band cellular/GPS antennas, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

The article is a bracket for mounting an antenna on the roof of a vehicle.

FIG. 1 is a front isometric view of an L-shaped bracket for dual band cellular/GPS antennas showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a top view of the bracket.

FIG. 3 is a bottom view of the bracket.

FIG. 4 is a left side view of the bracket.

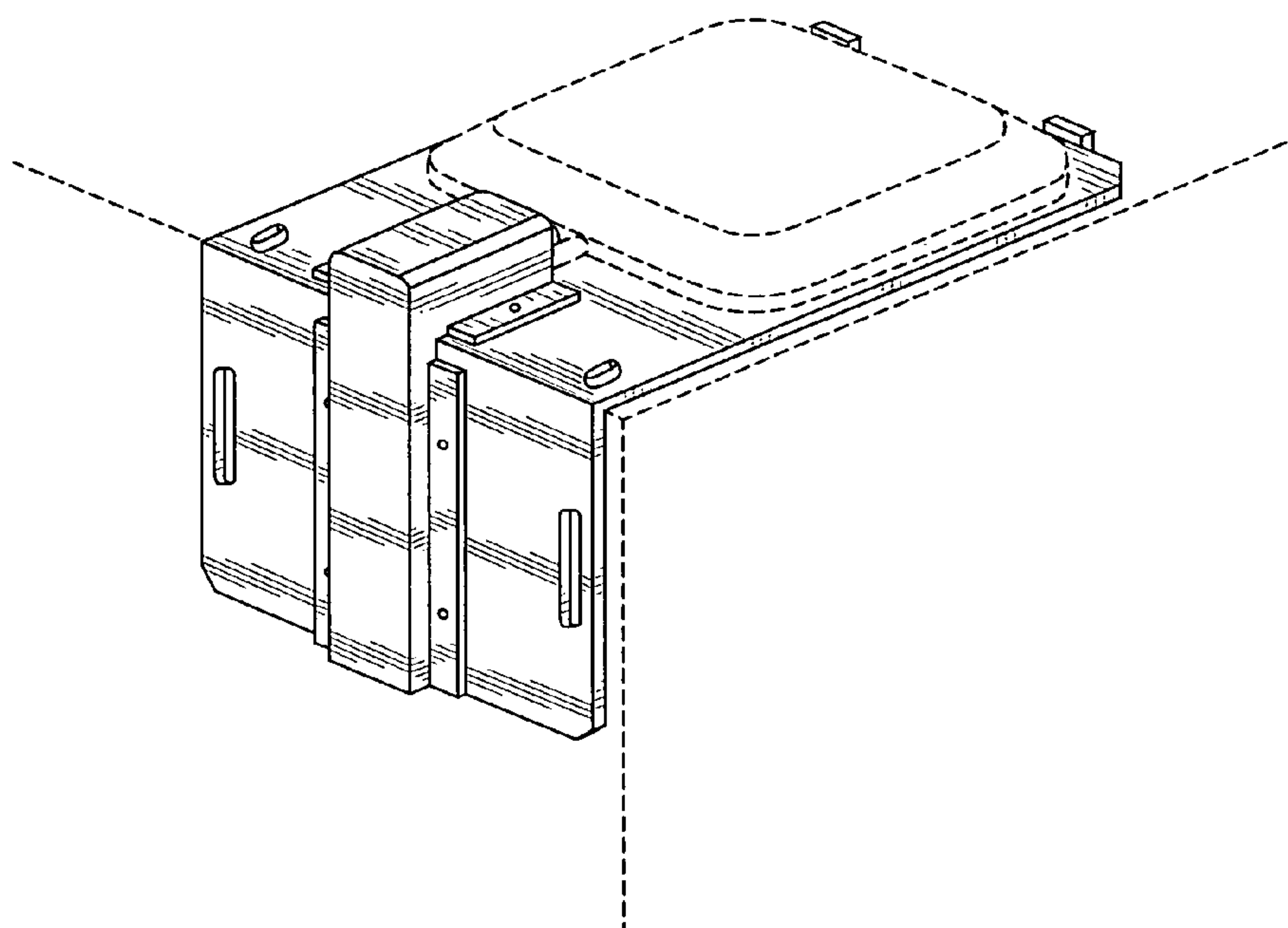
FIG. 5 is a front view of the bracket; and,

FIG. 6 is a rear view of the bracket.

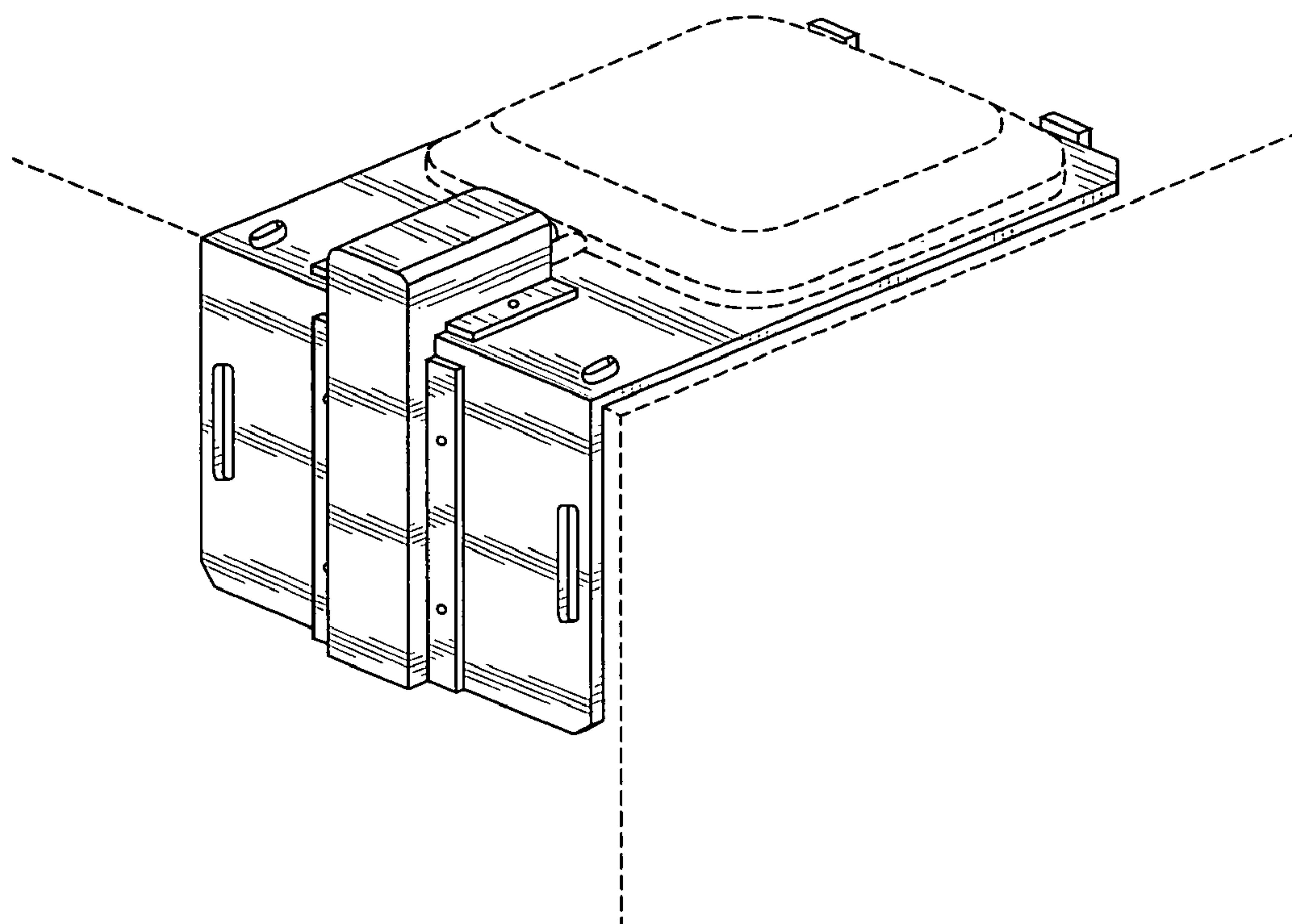

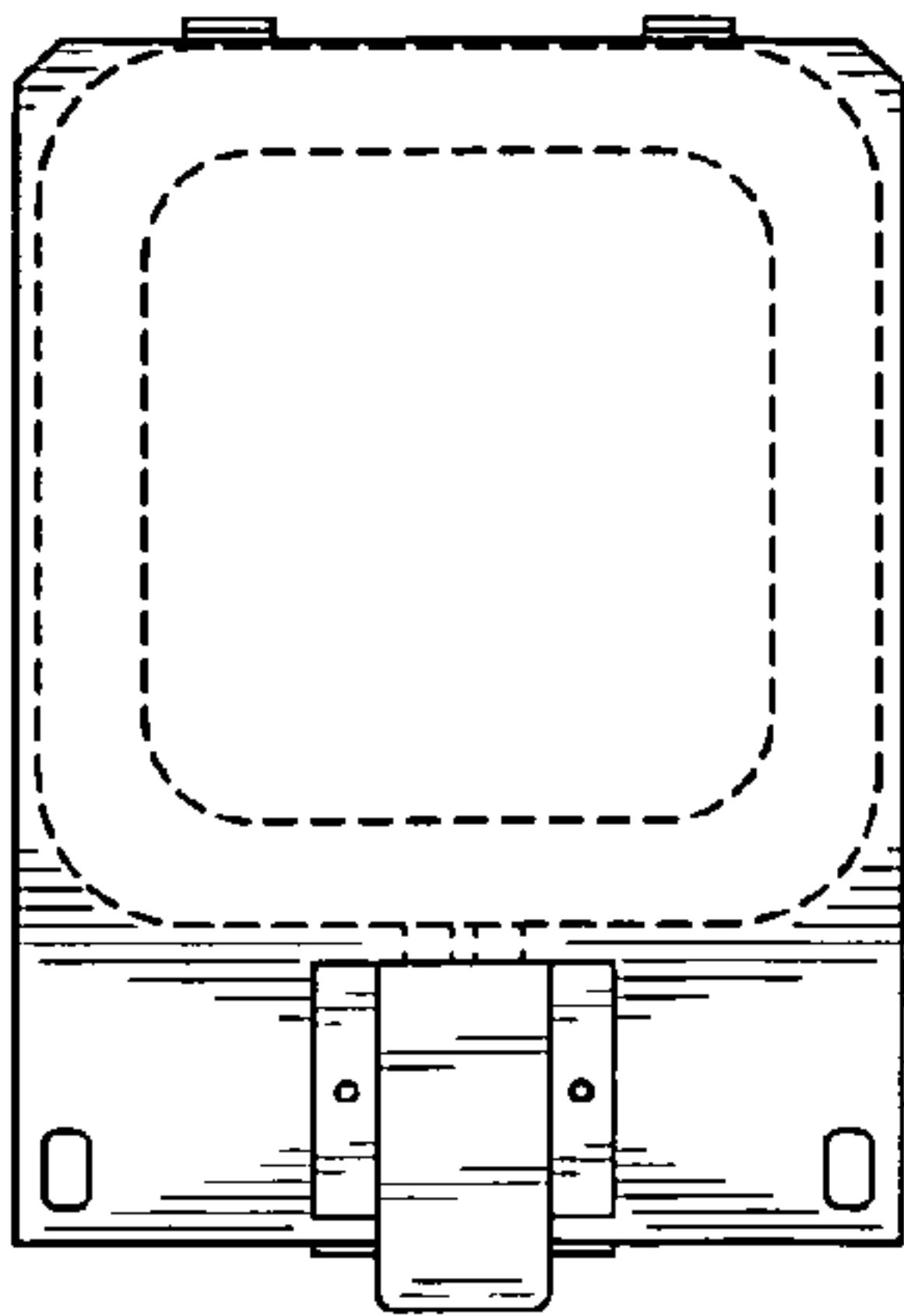

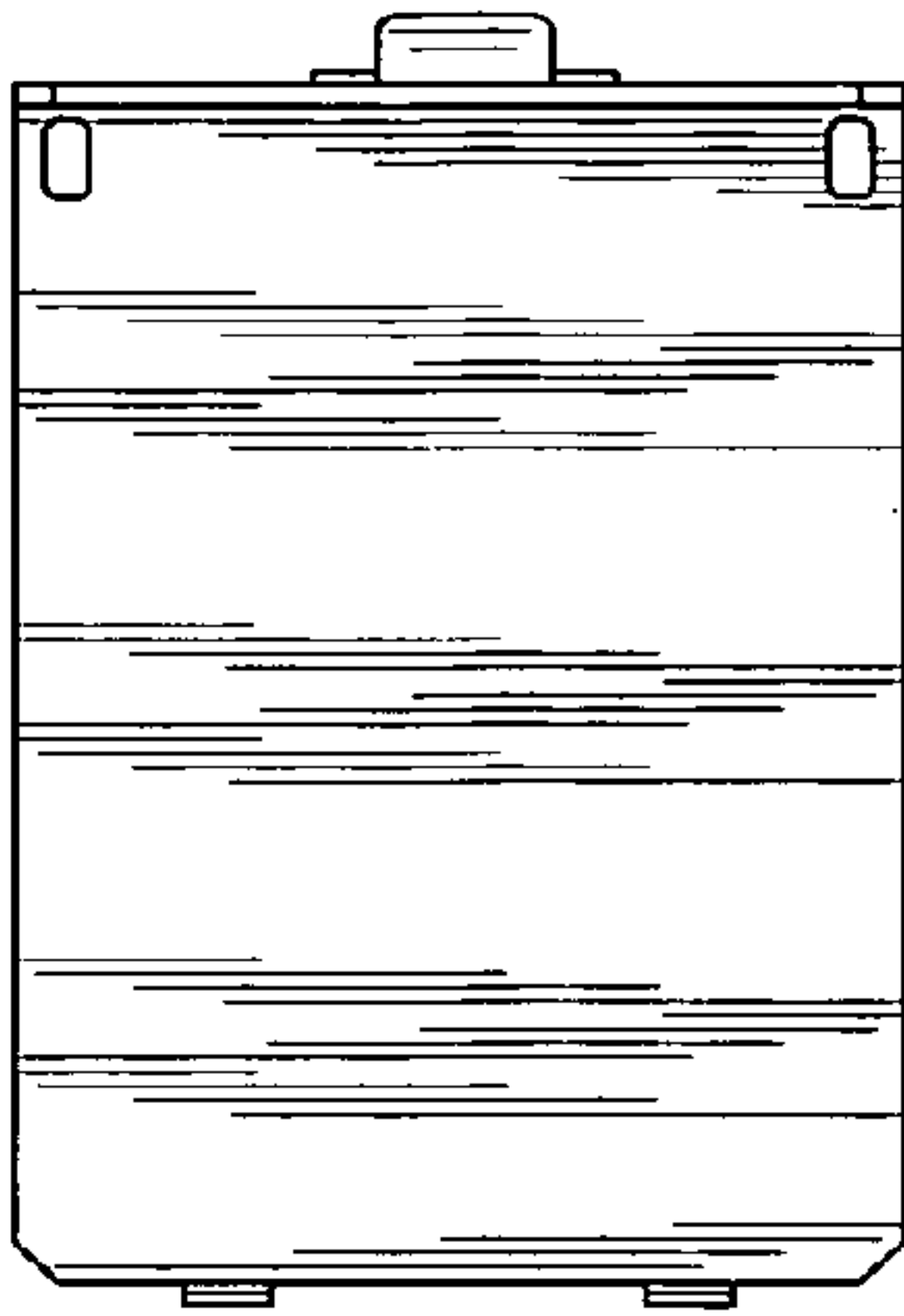

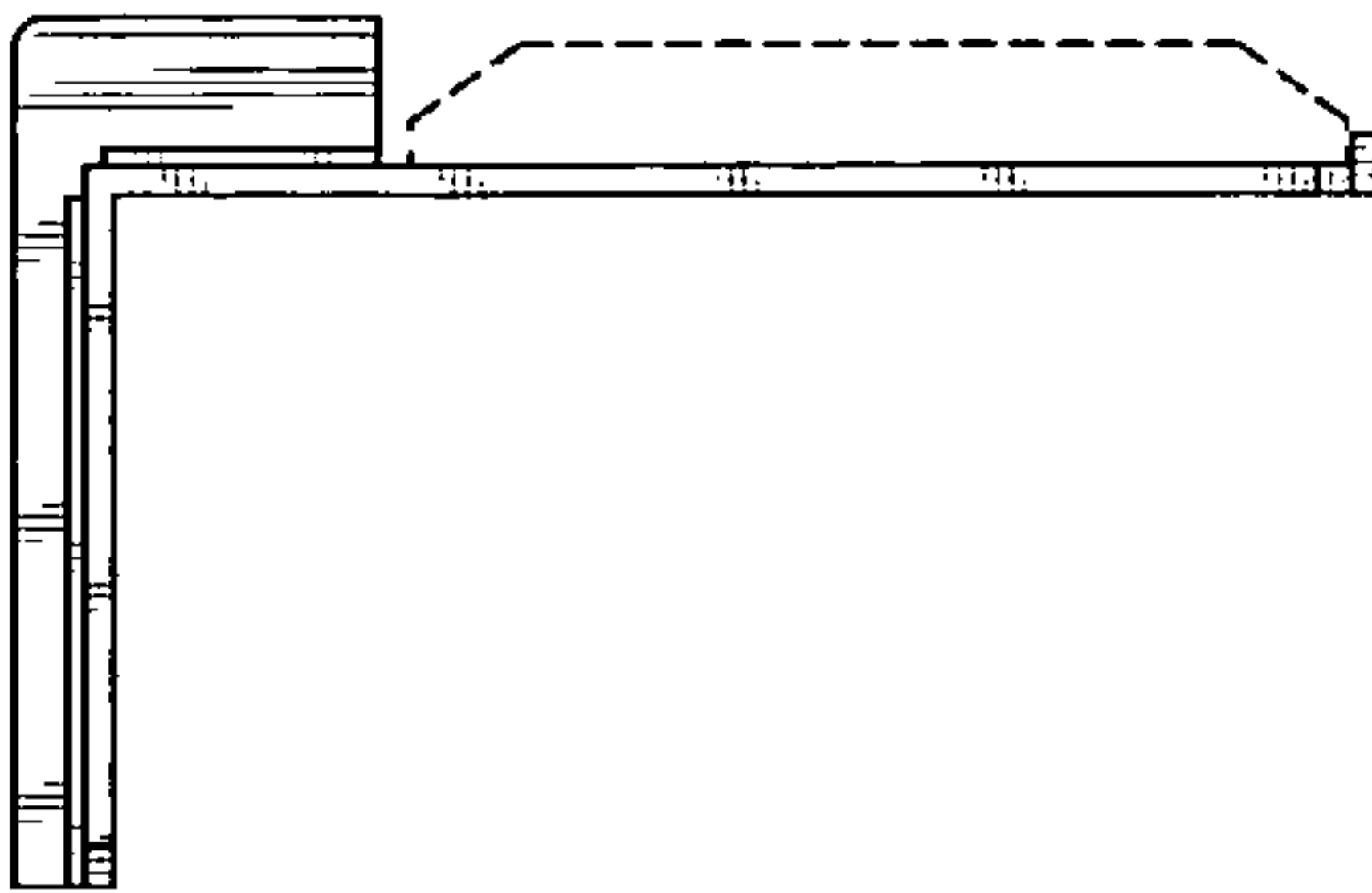

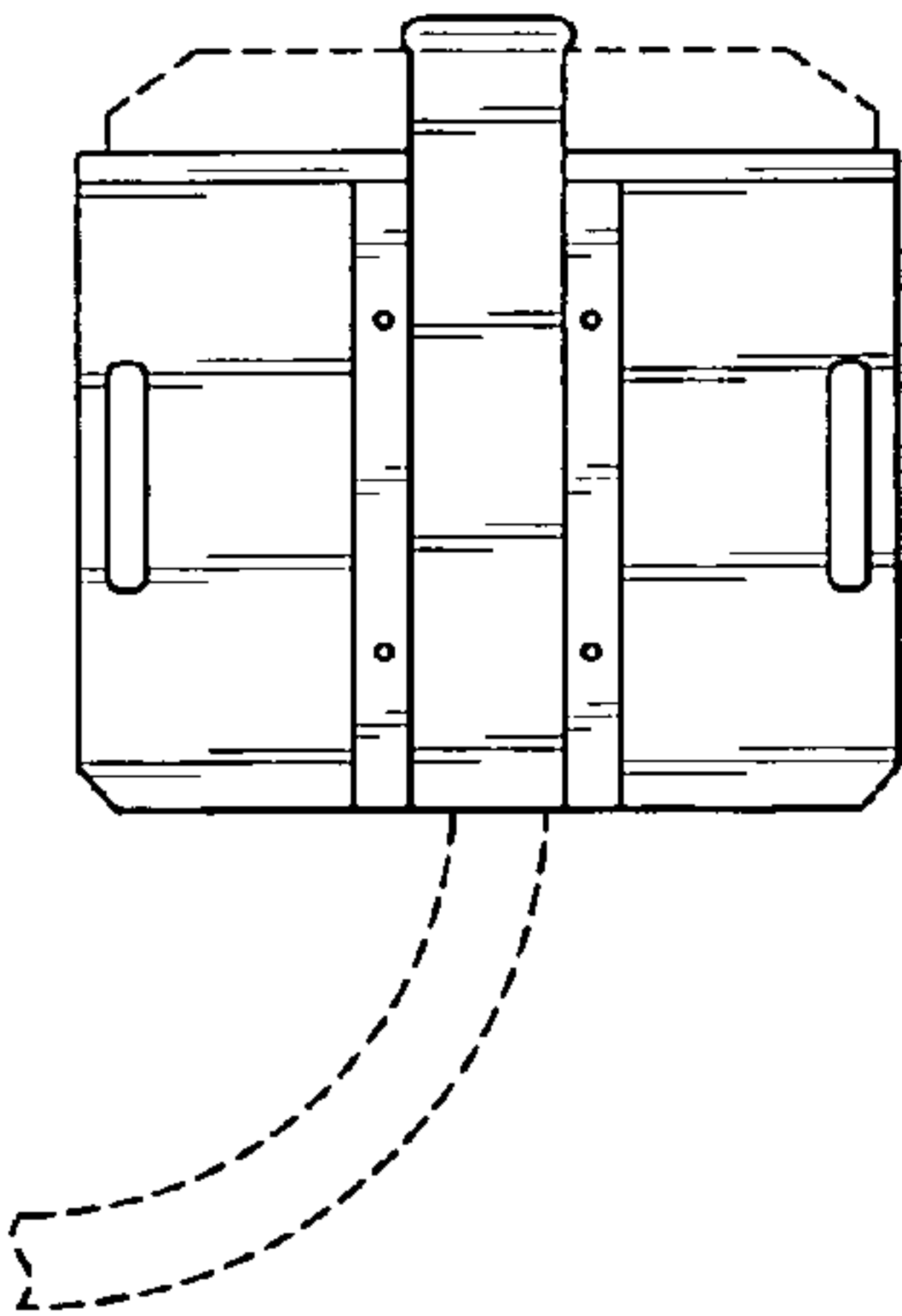

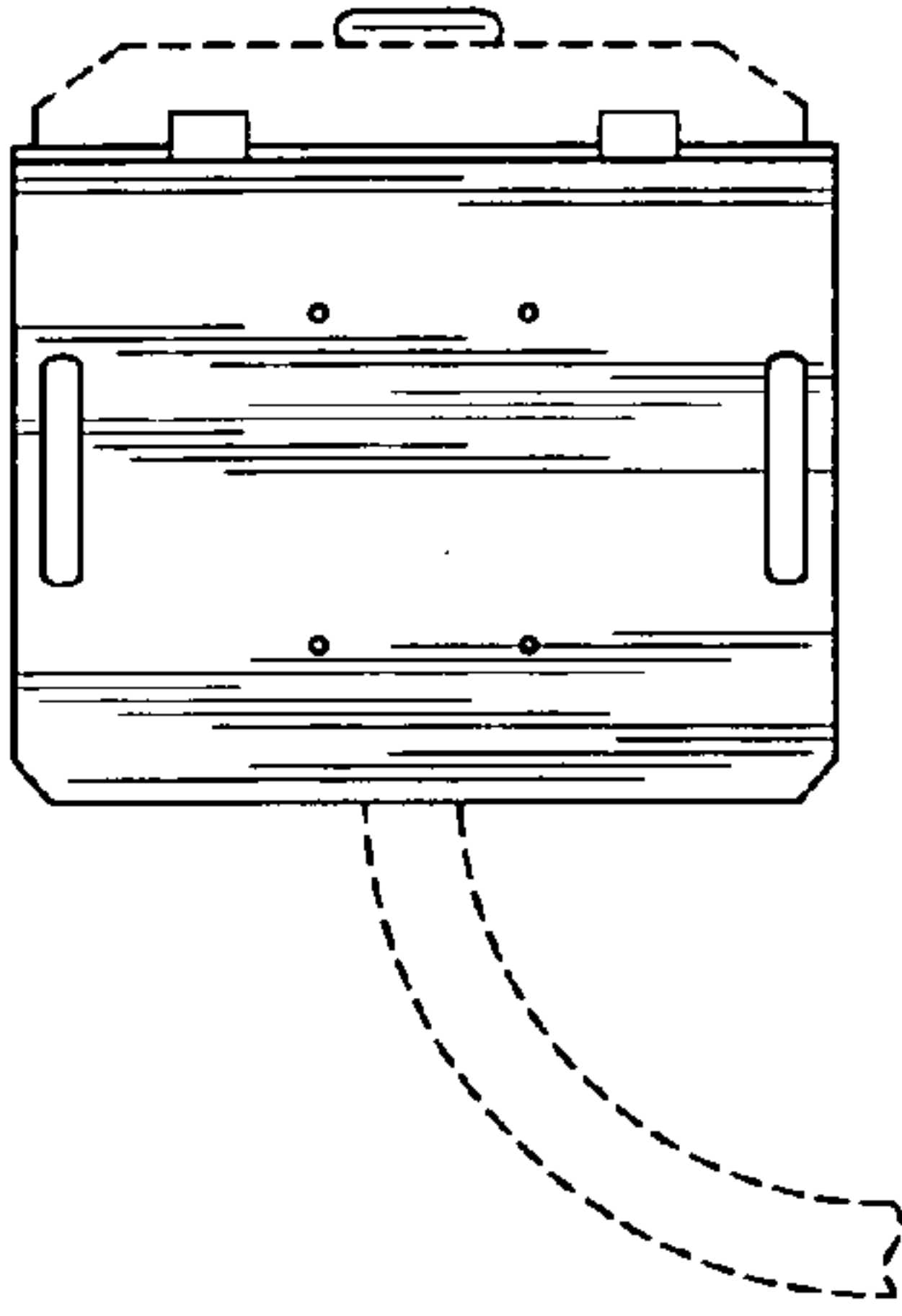
