DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top perspective view of an exercise apparatus with the broken lines showing elements, such as a cushioning element and footings, for illustrative purposes and forming no part of the claimed invention;

FIG. 2 is a bottom perspective view of the exercise apparatus of FIG. 1 with the broken lines showing elements, such as cushioning elements and footings, for illustrative purposes and forming no part of the claimed invention;




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
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
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






