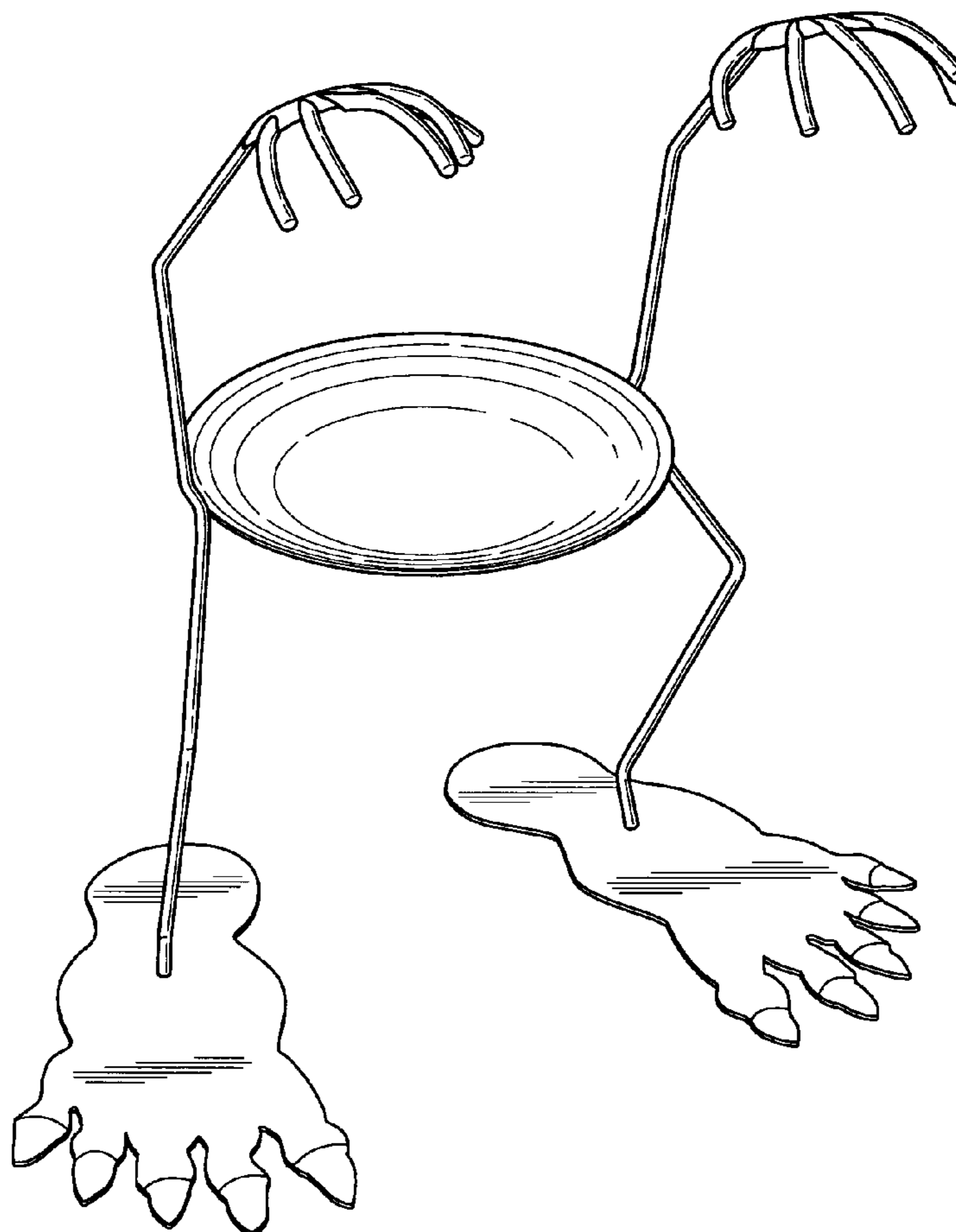
(57) **CLAIM**

**DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view showing my new design;

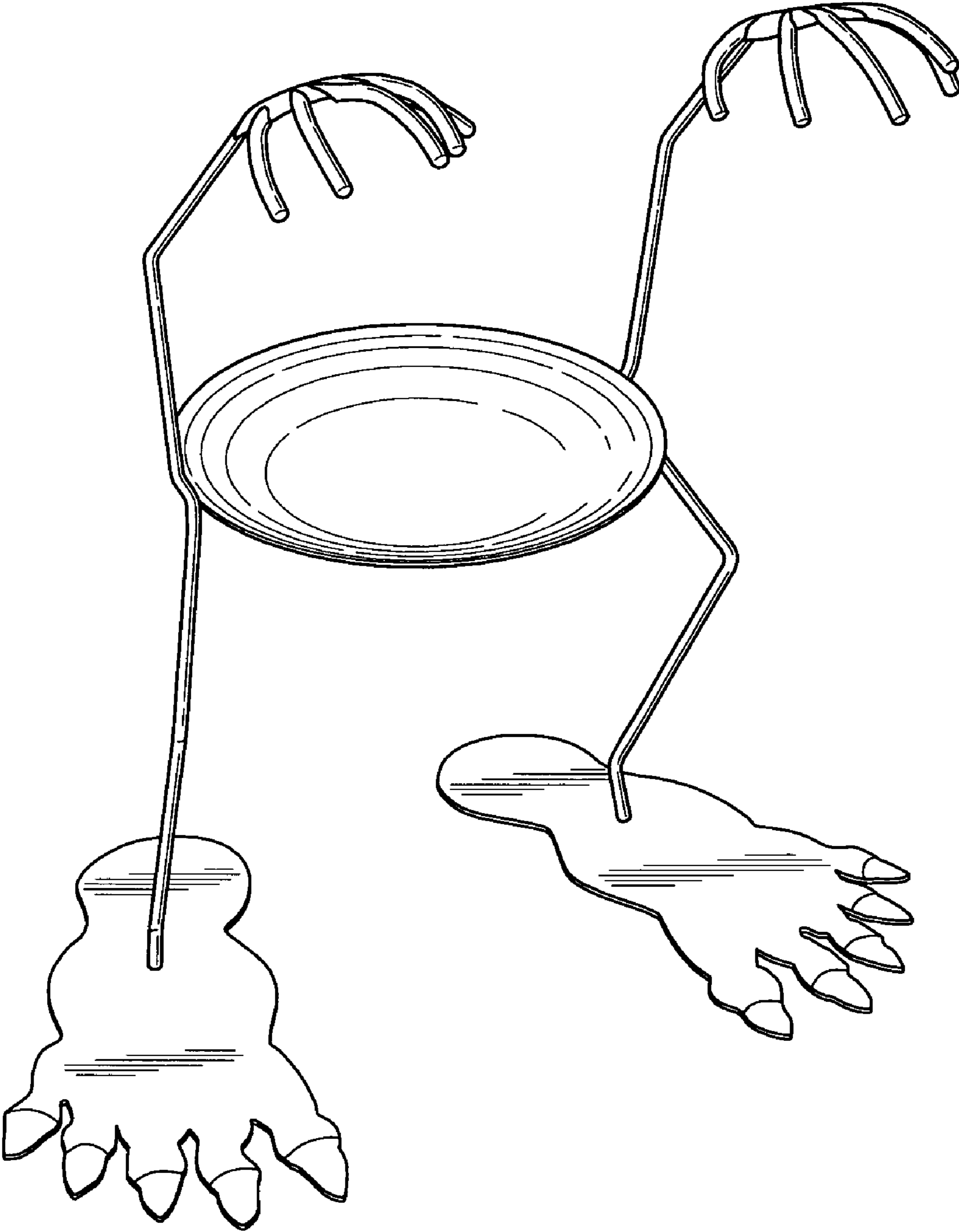

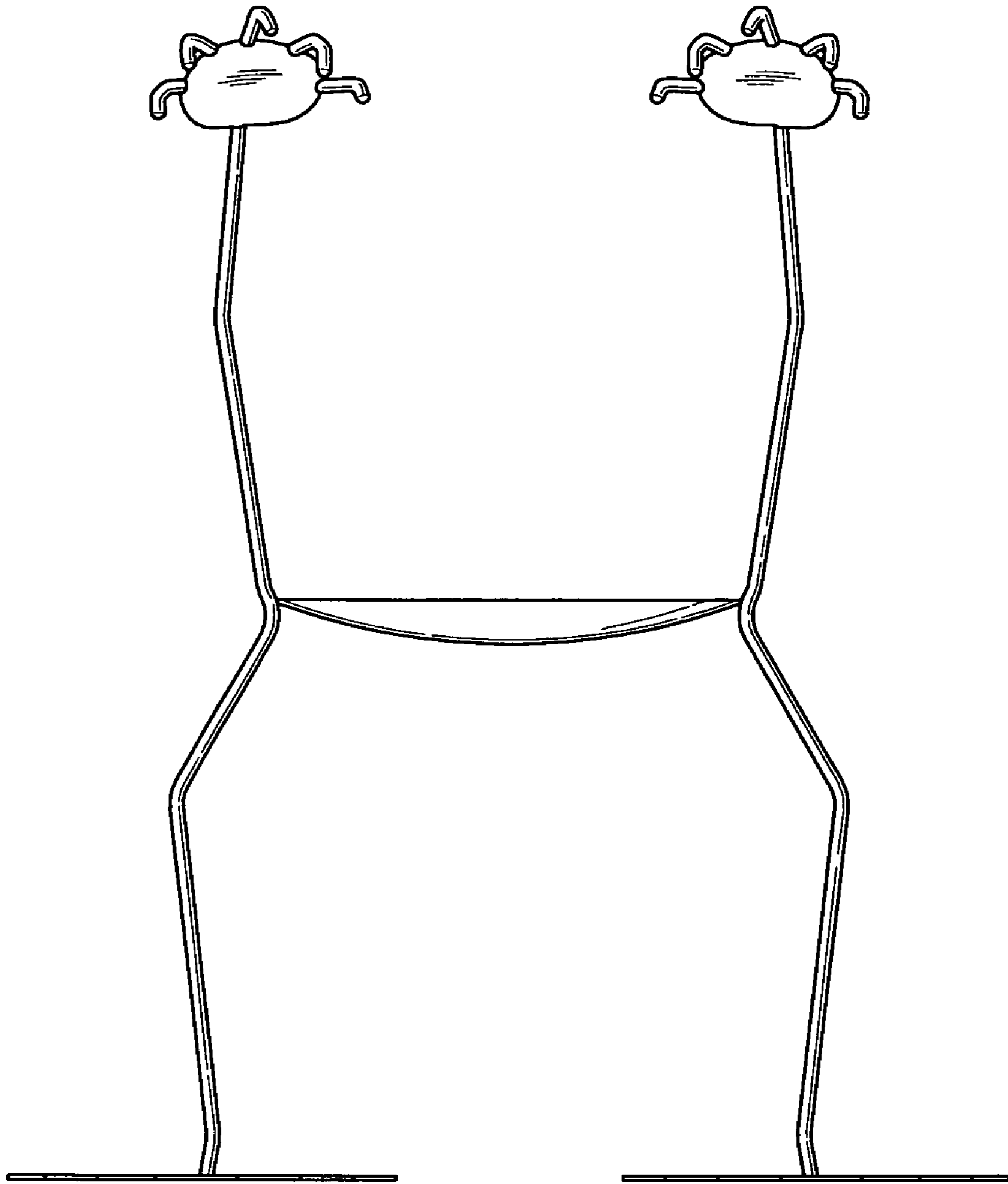

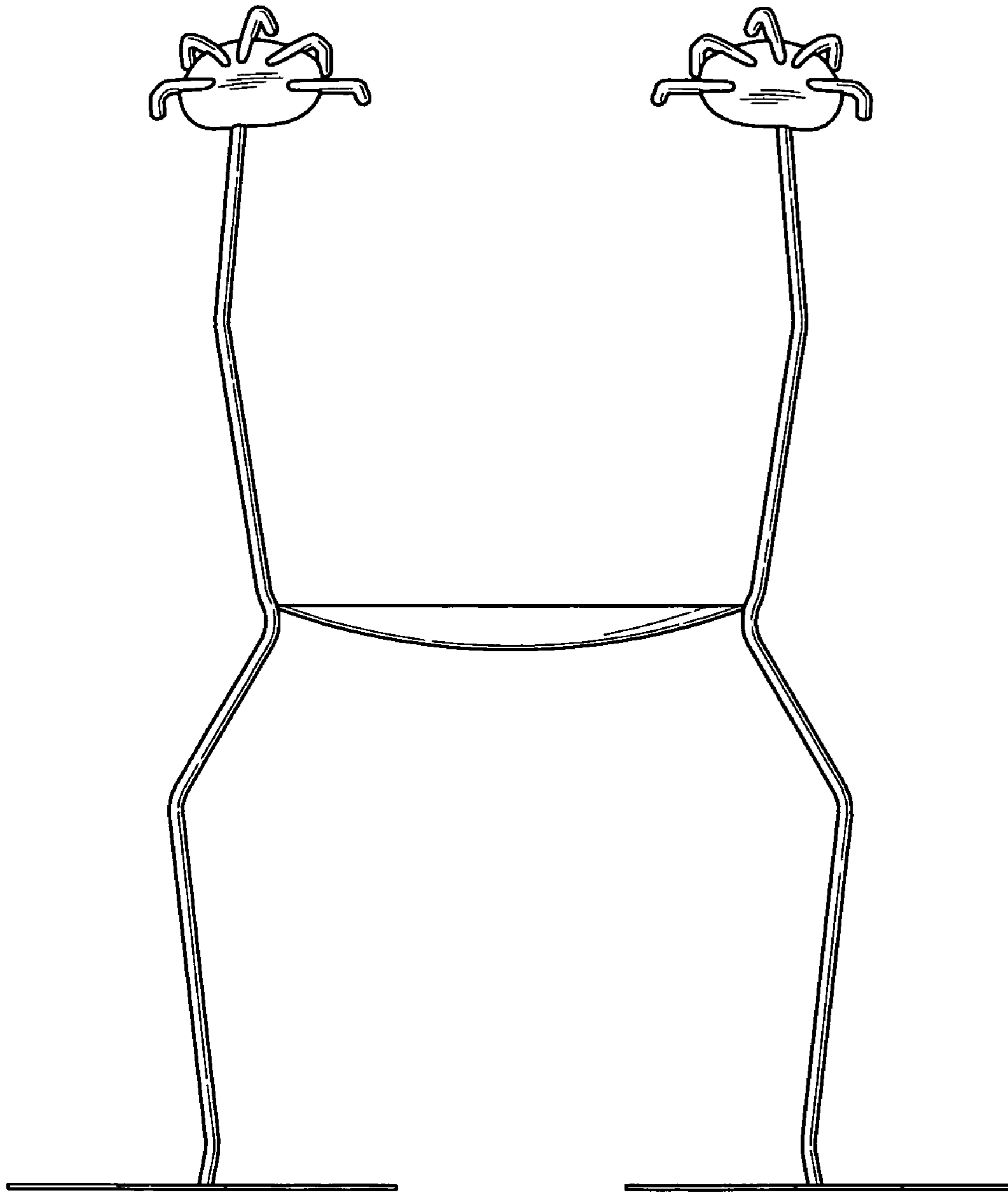

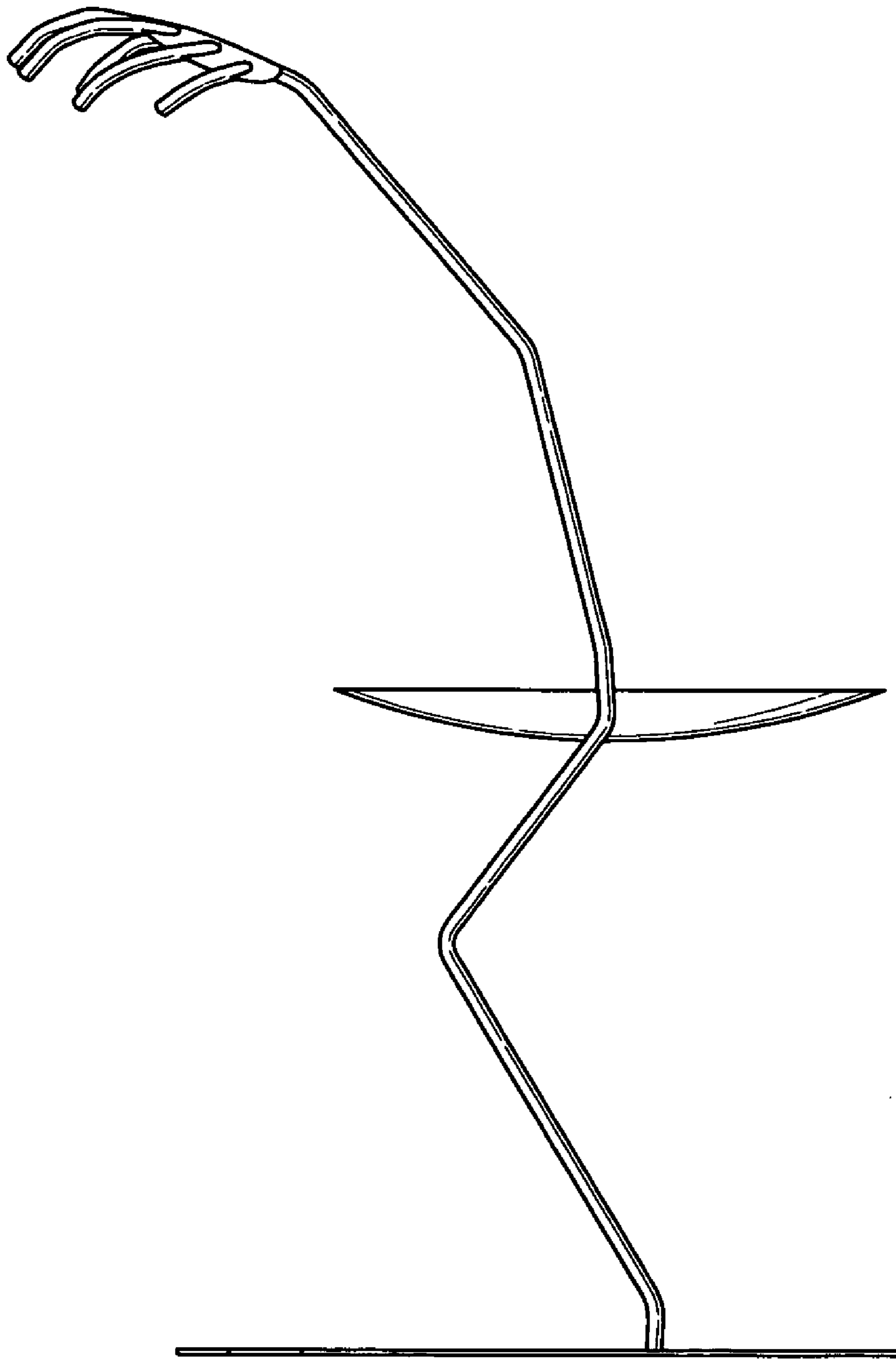

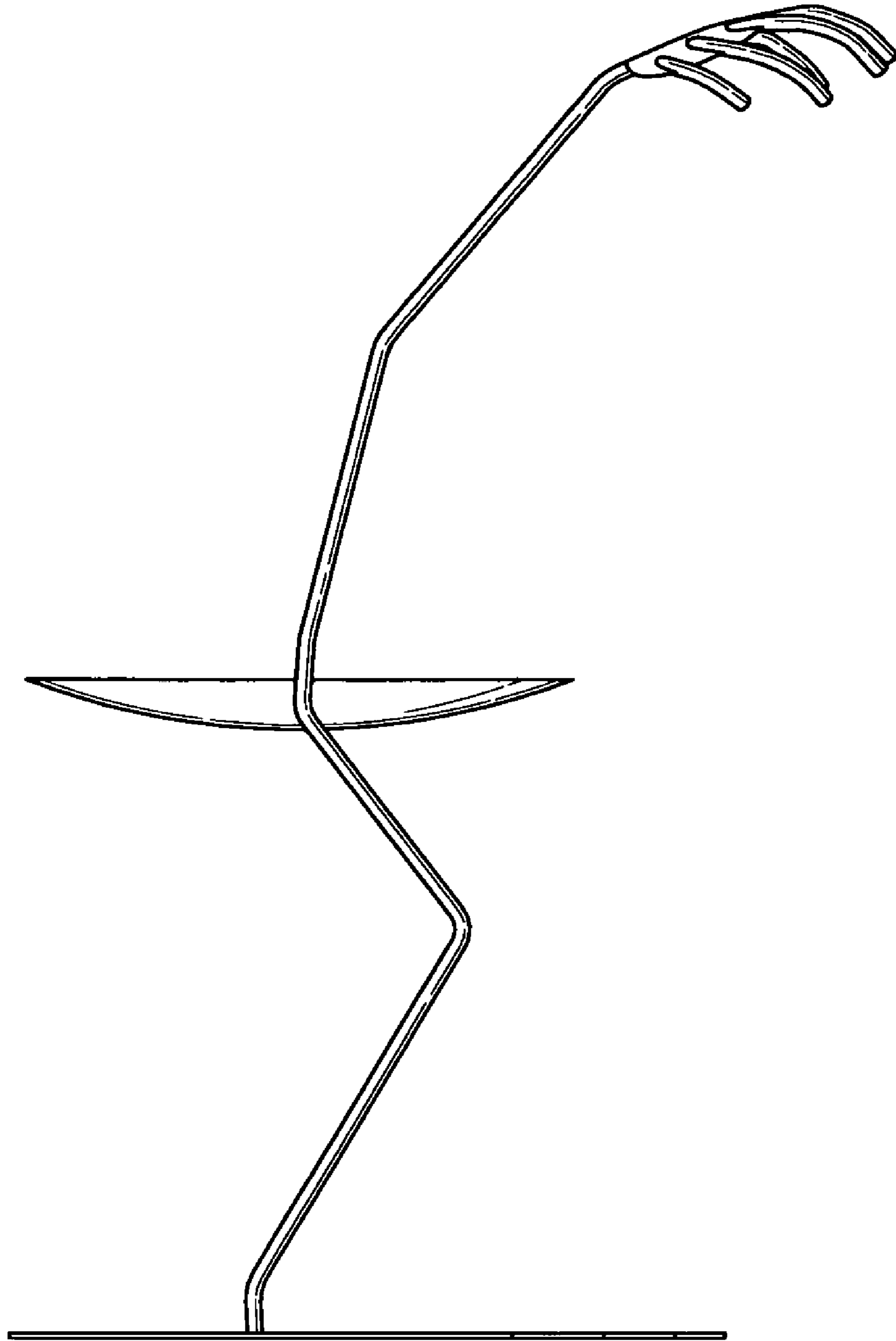

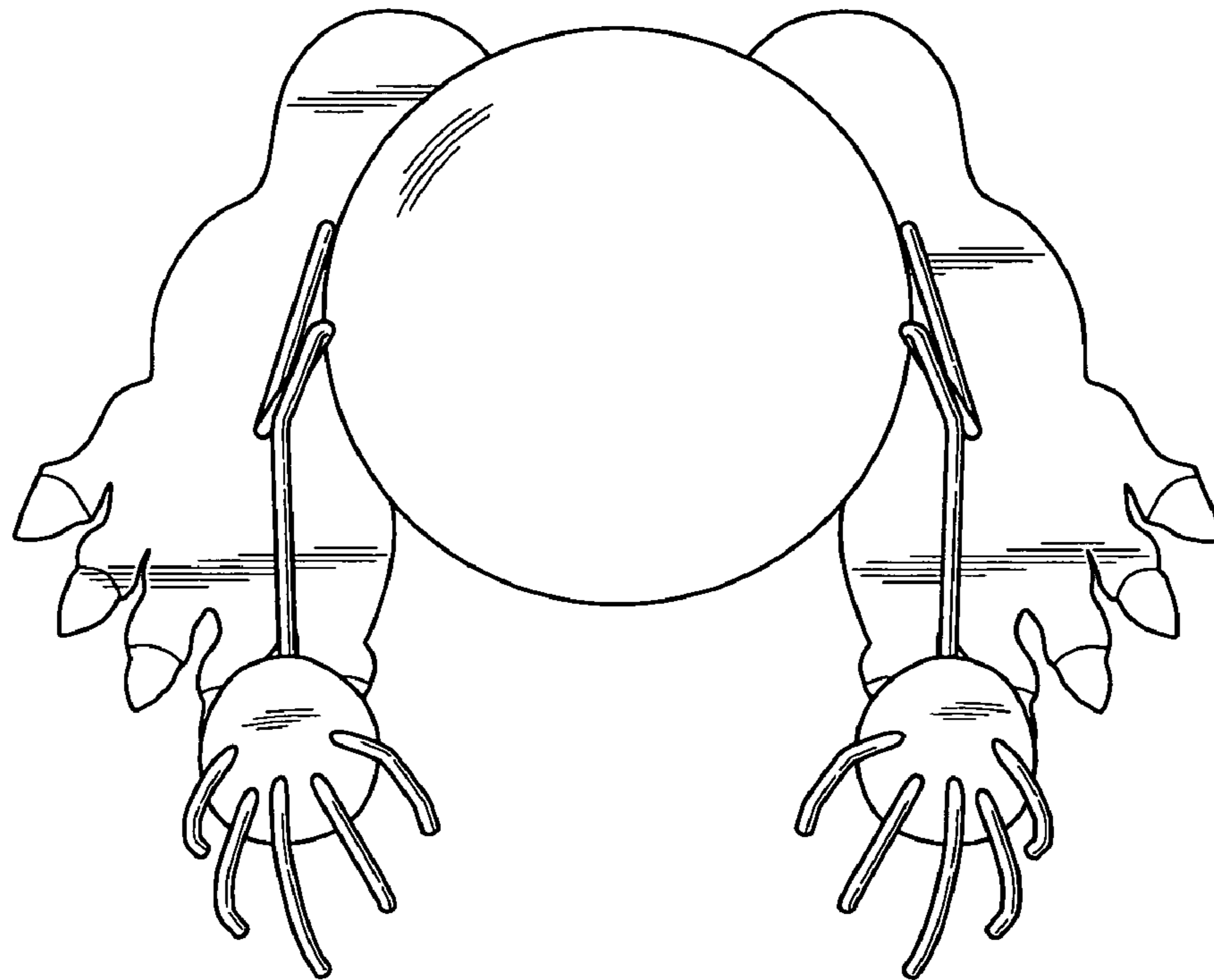
