FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a shoe outsole showing my new design;

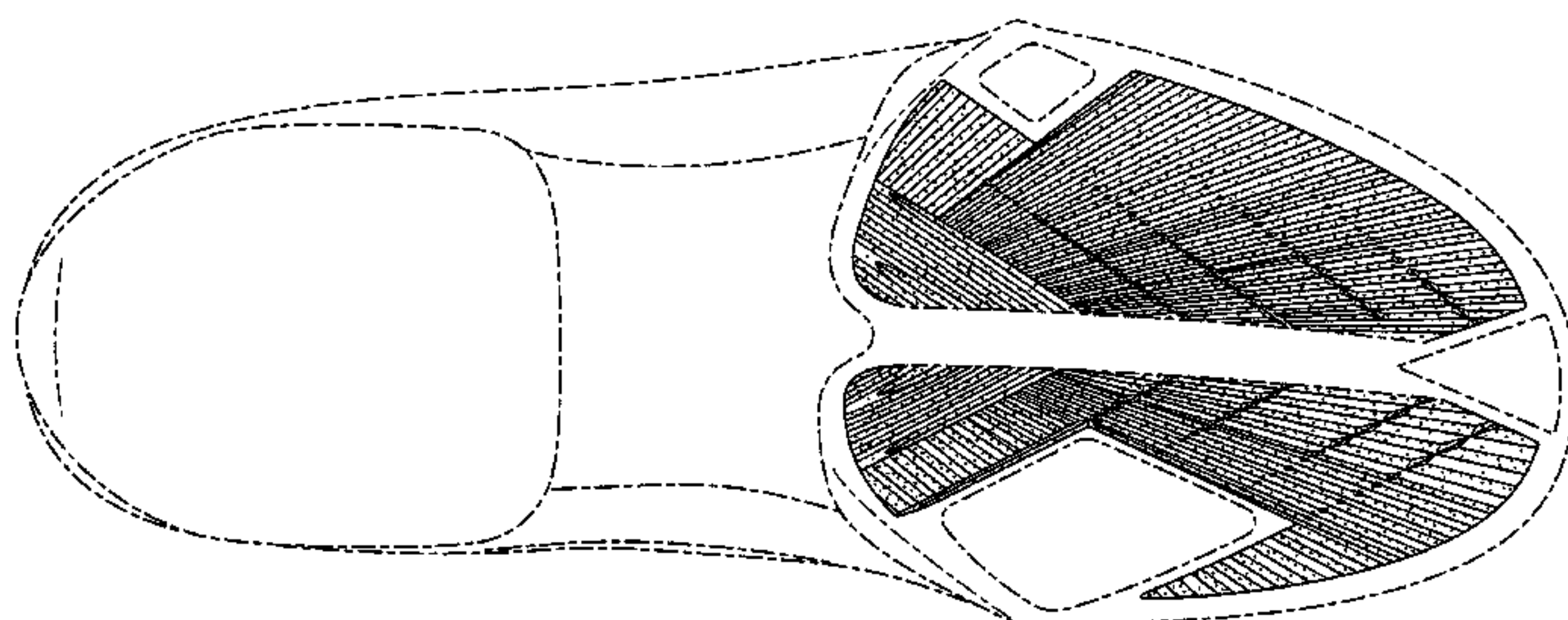
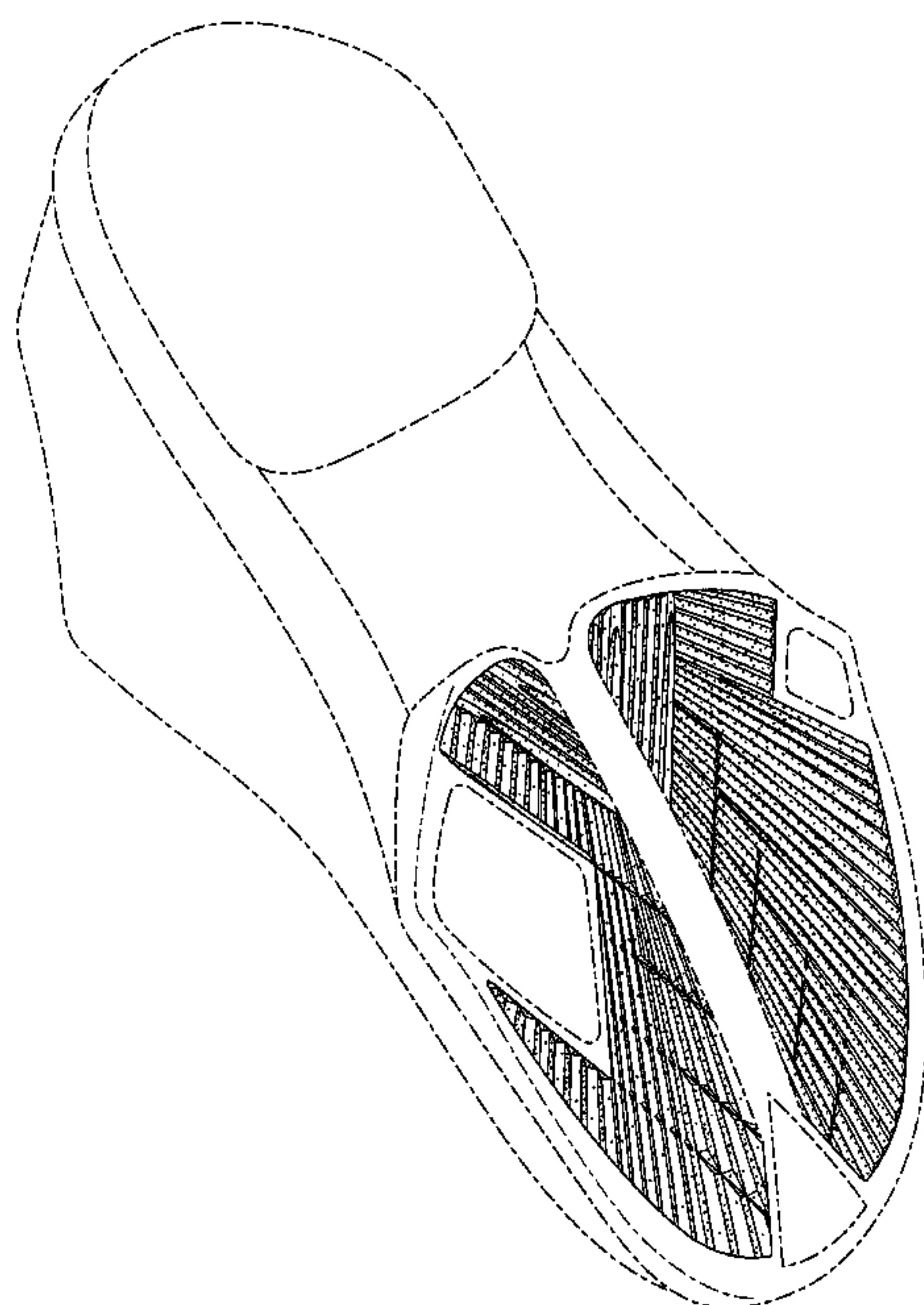
FIG. 2 is a rear perspective view thereof; and,

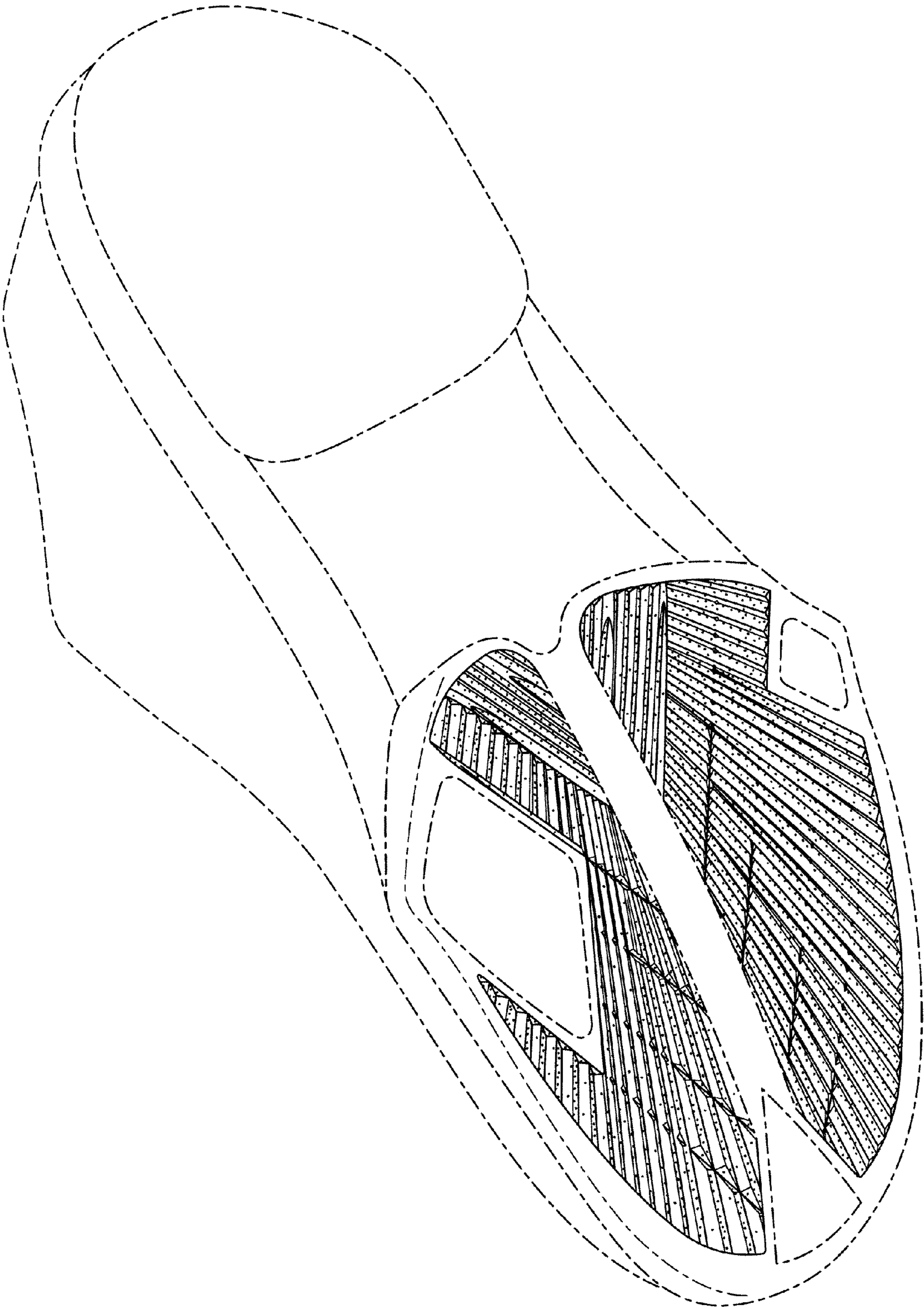

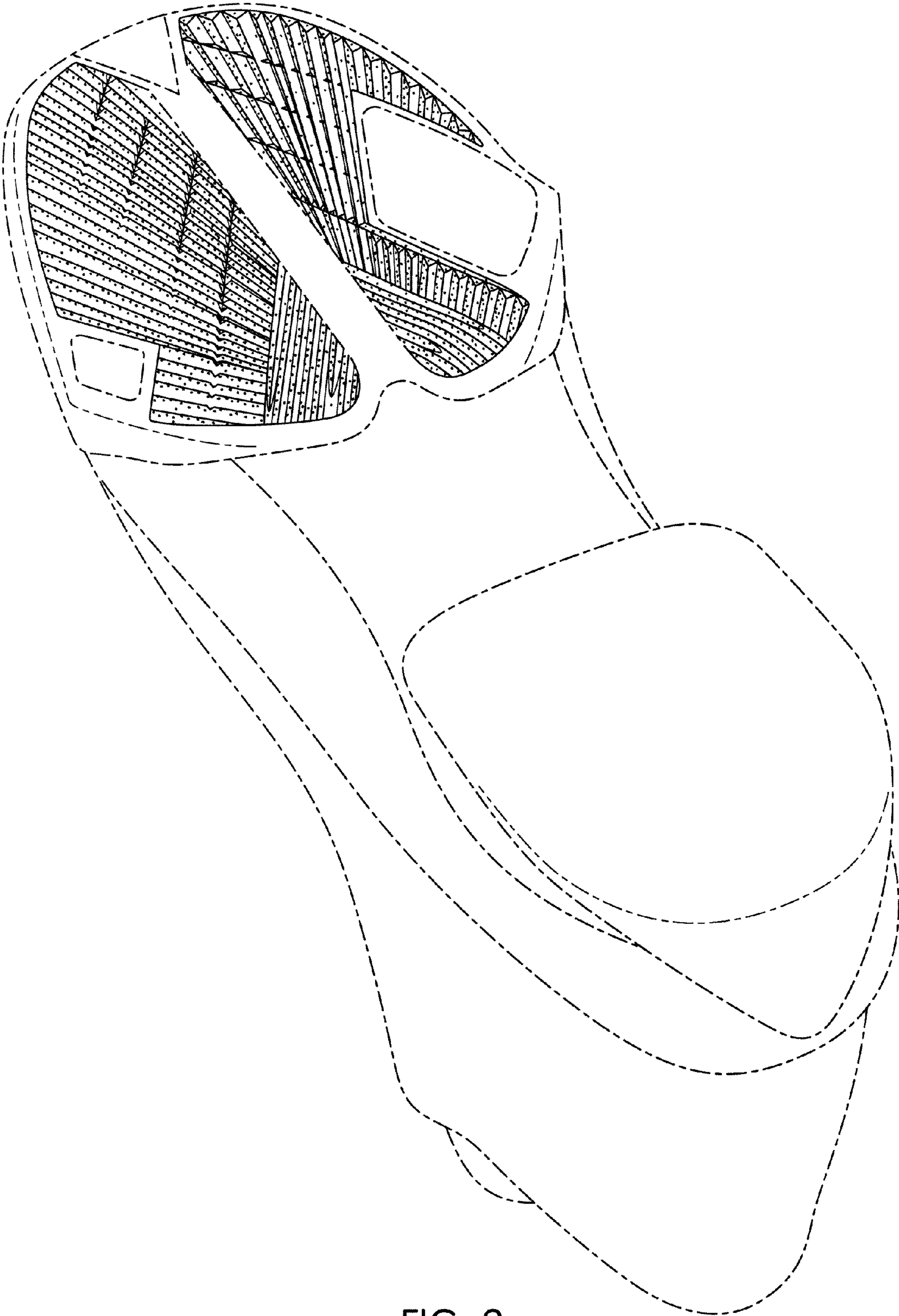

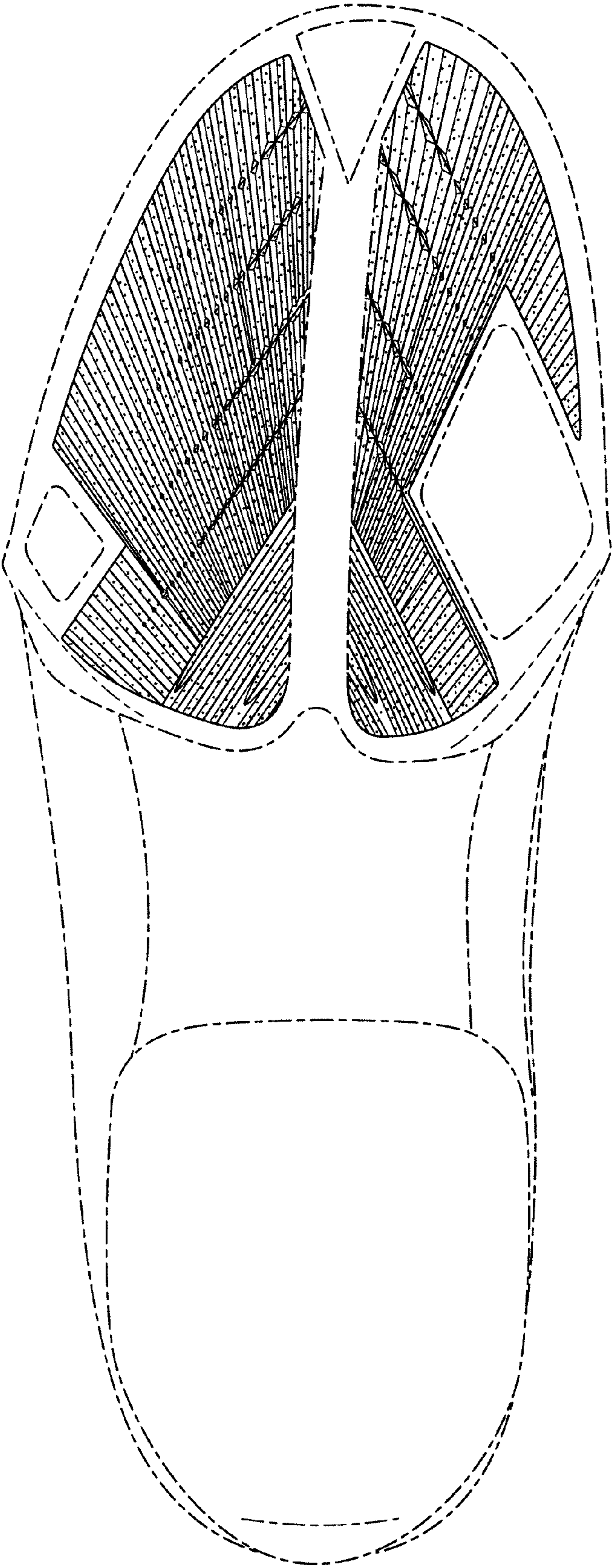
