FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view from the top thereof;

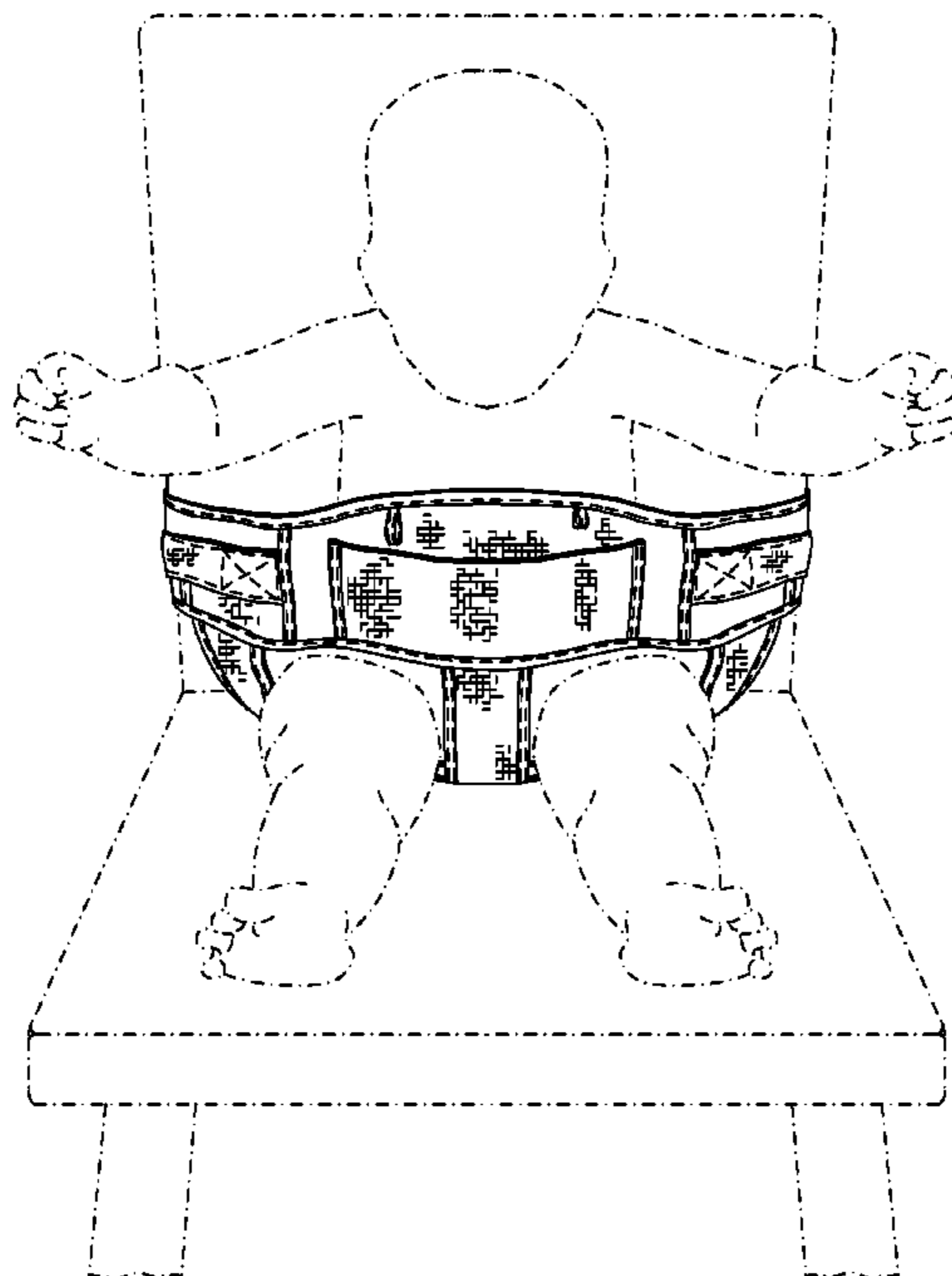
FIG. 4 is a top plan view as depicted in use with an infant and chair;

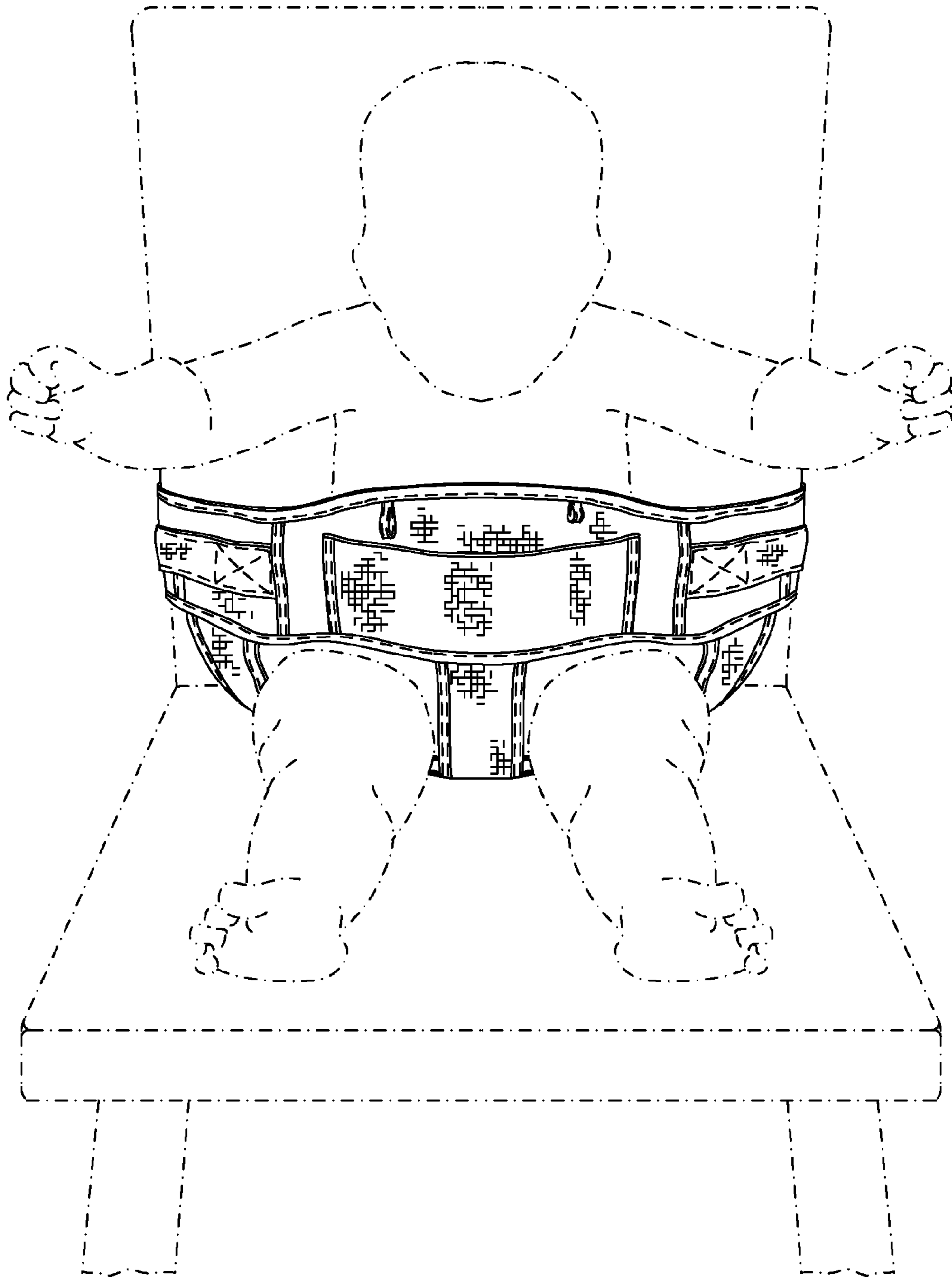
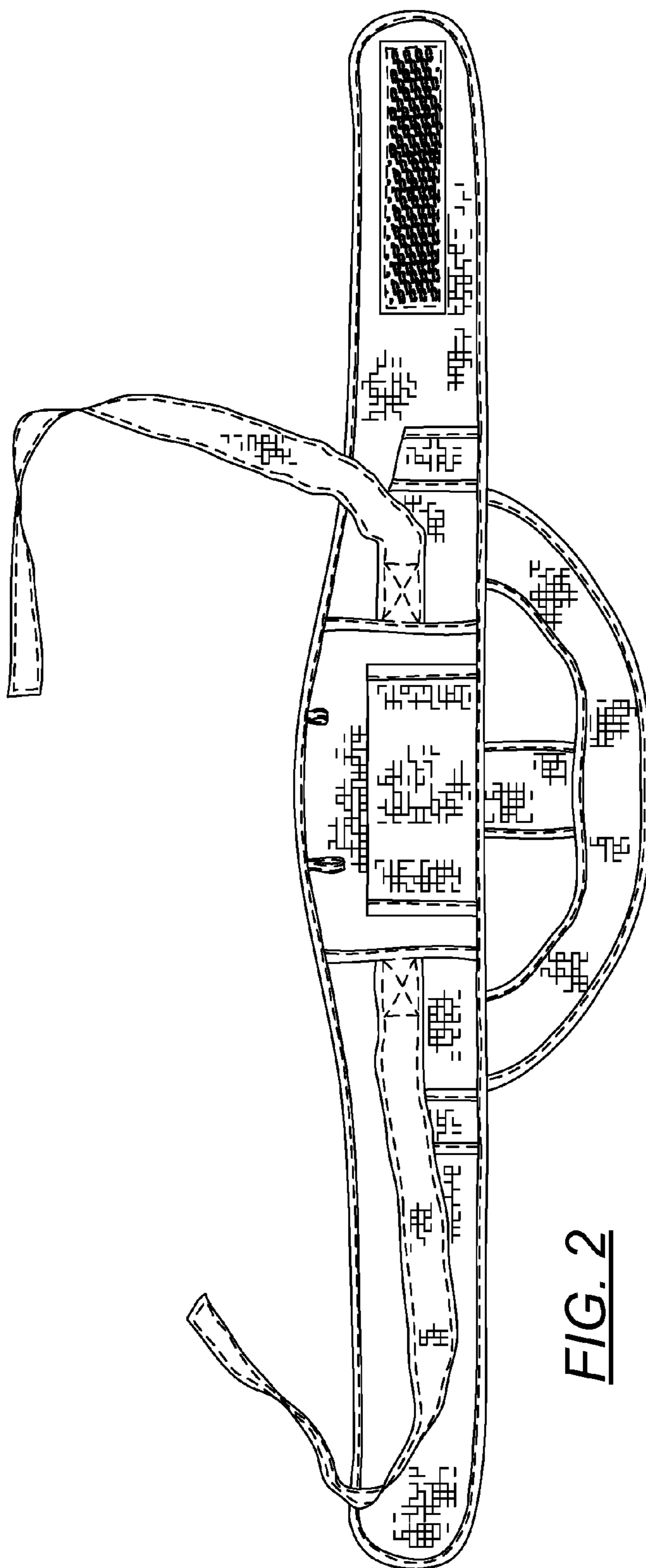

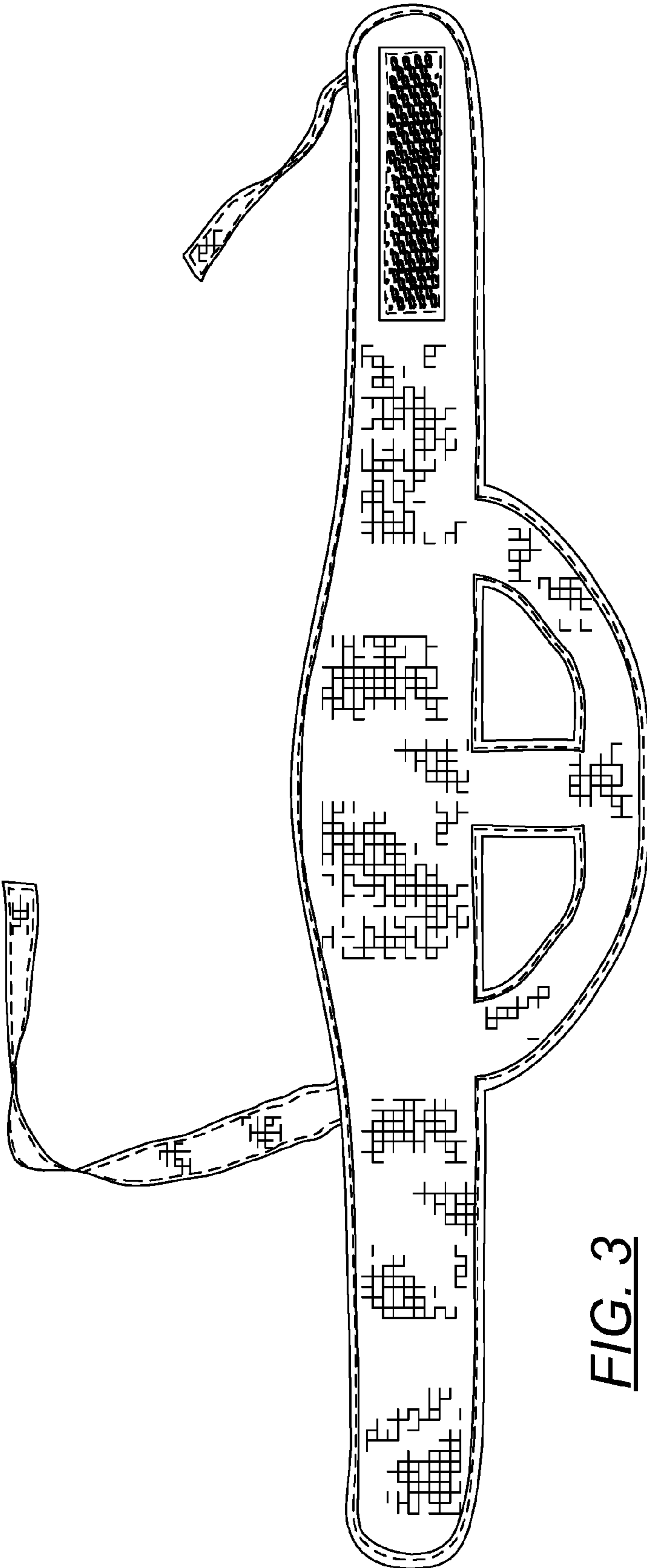

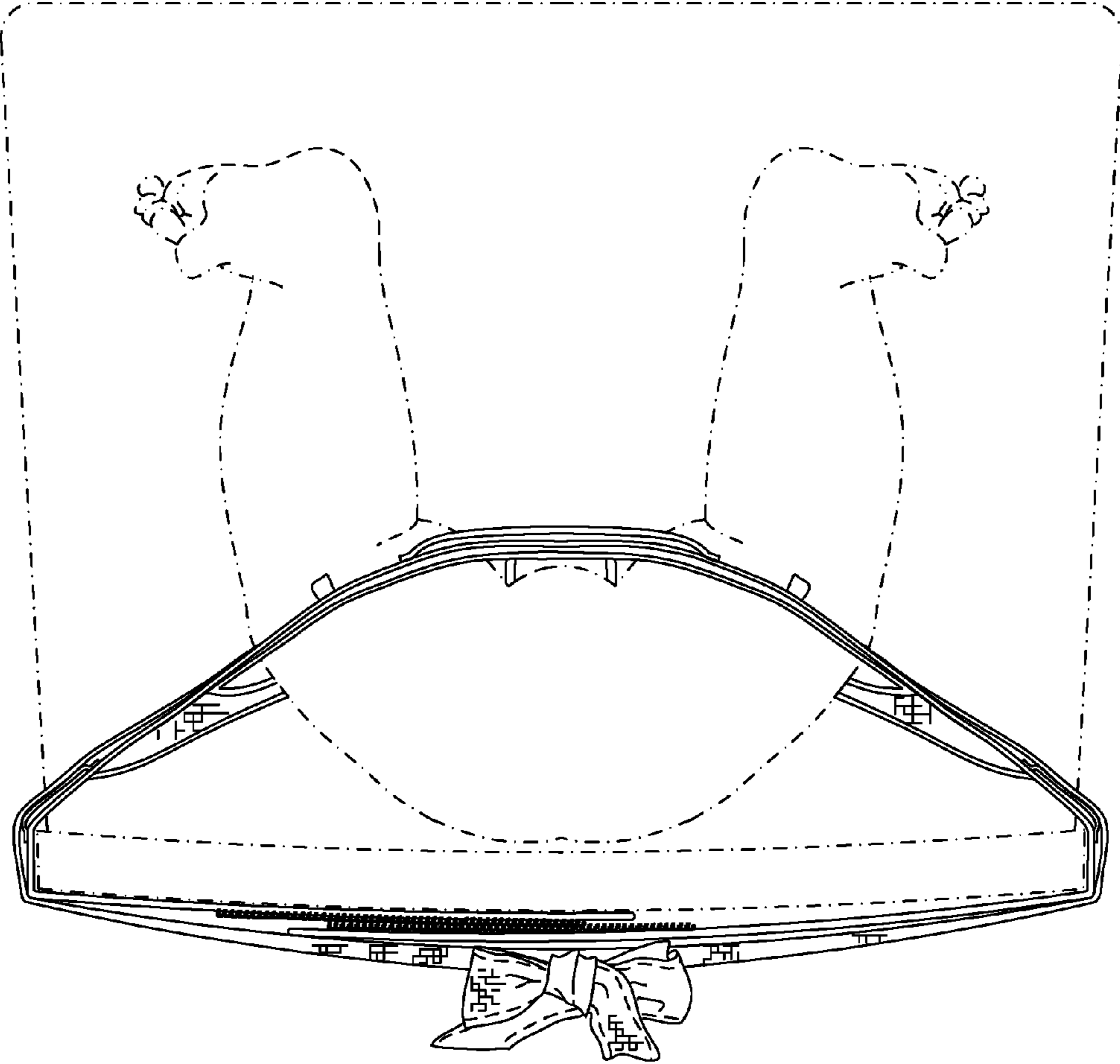

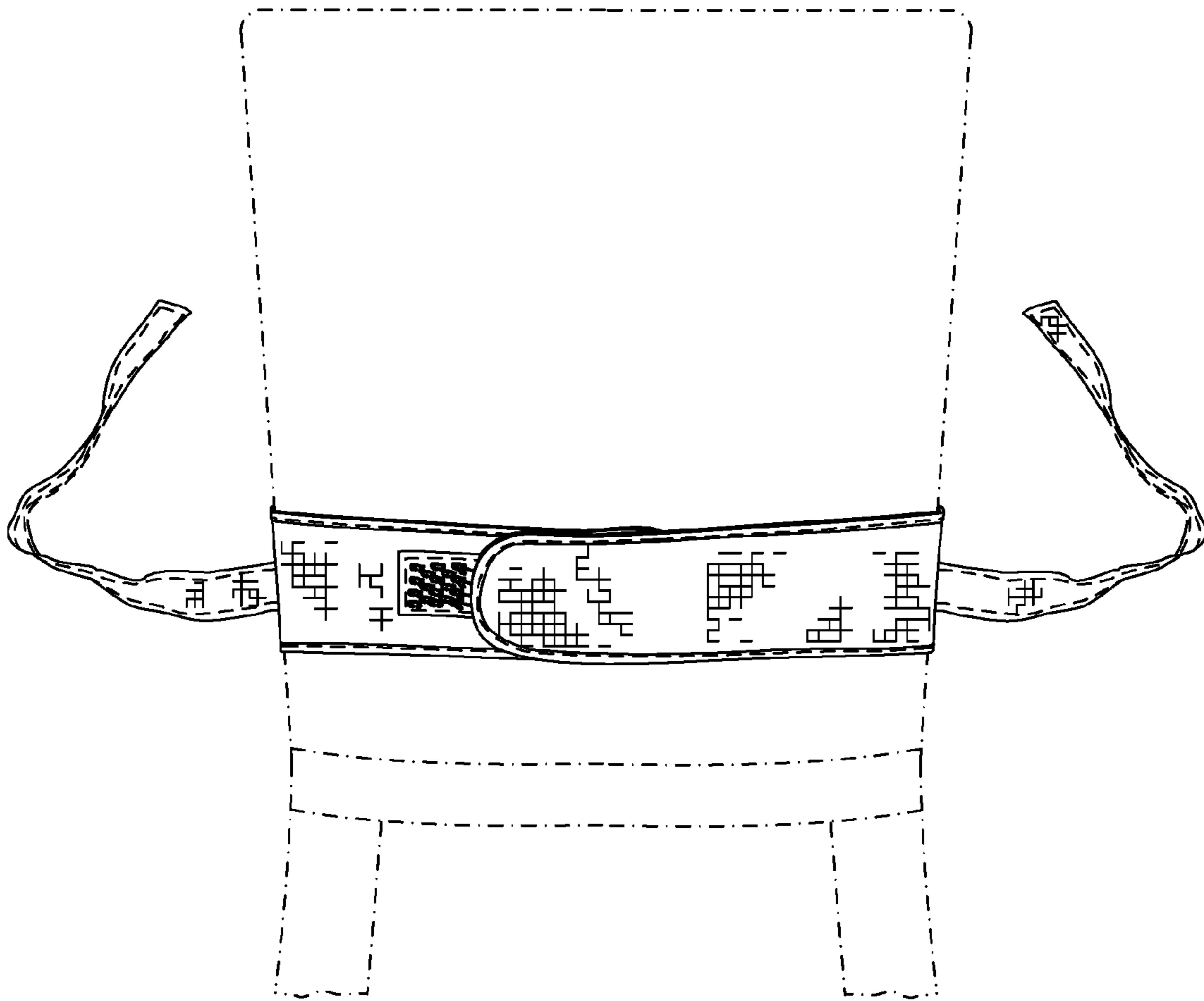

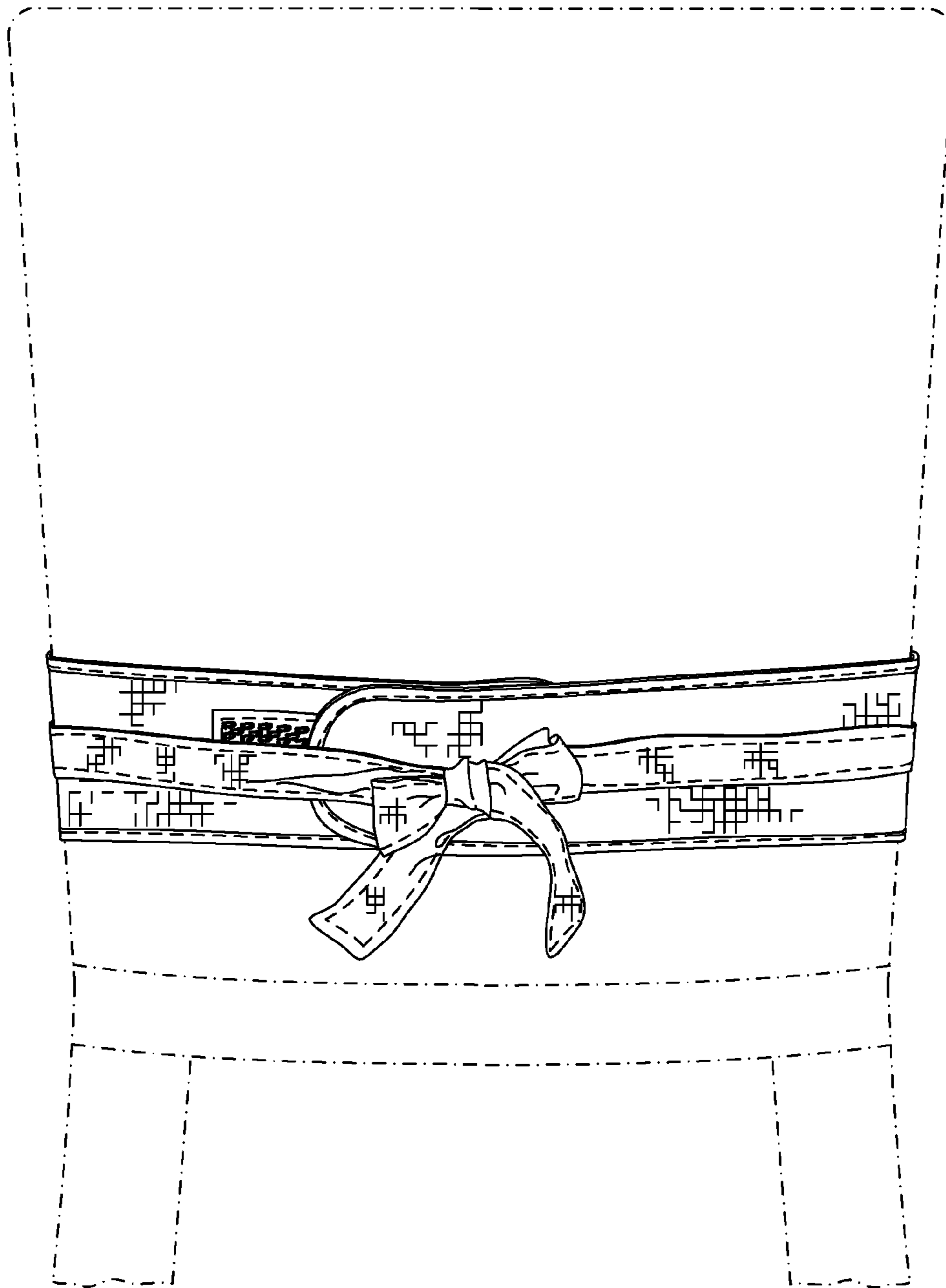
