DESCRIPTION

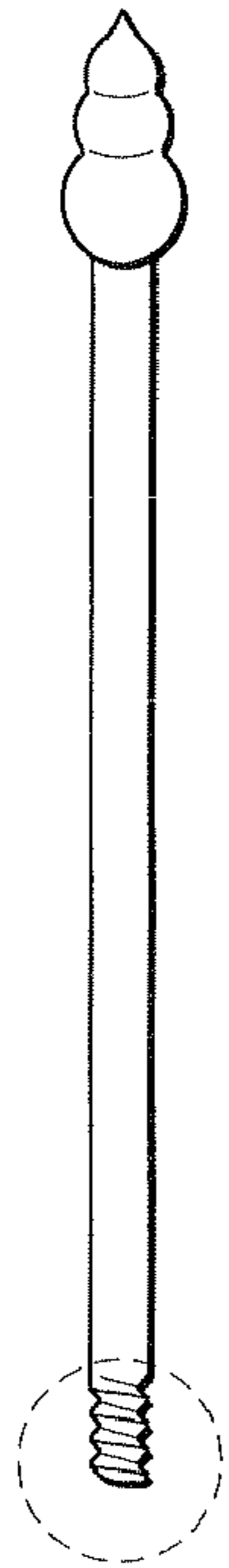

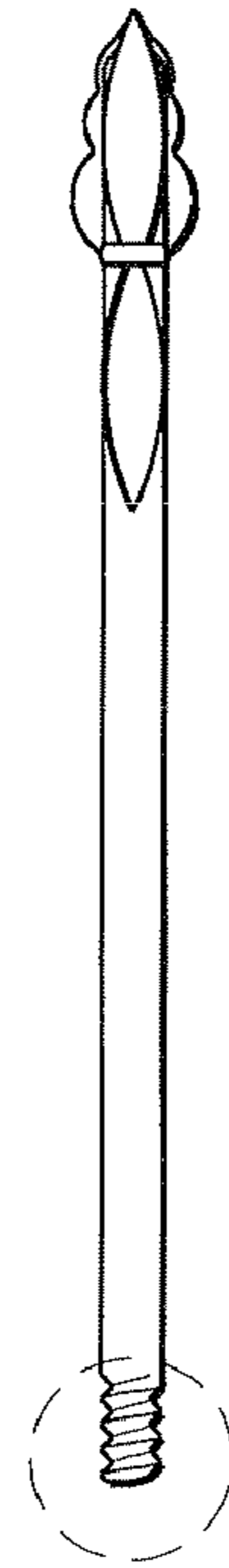

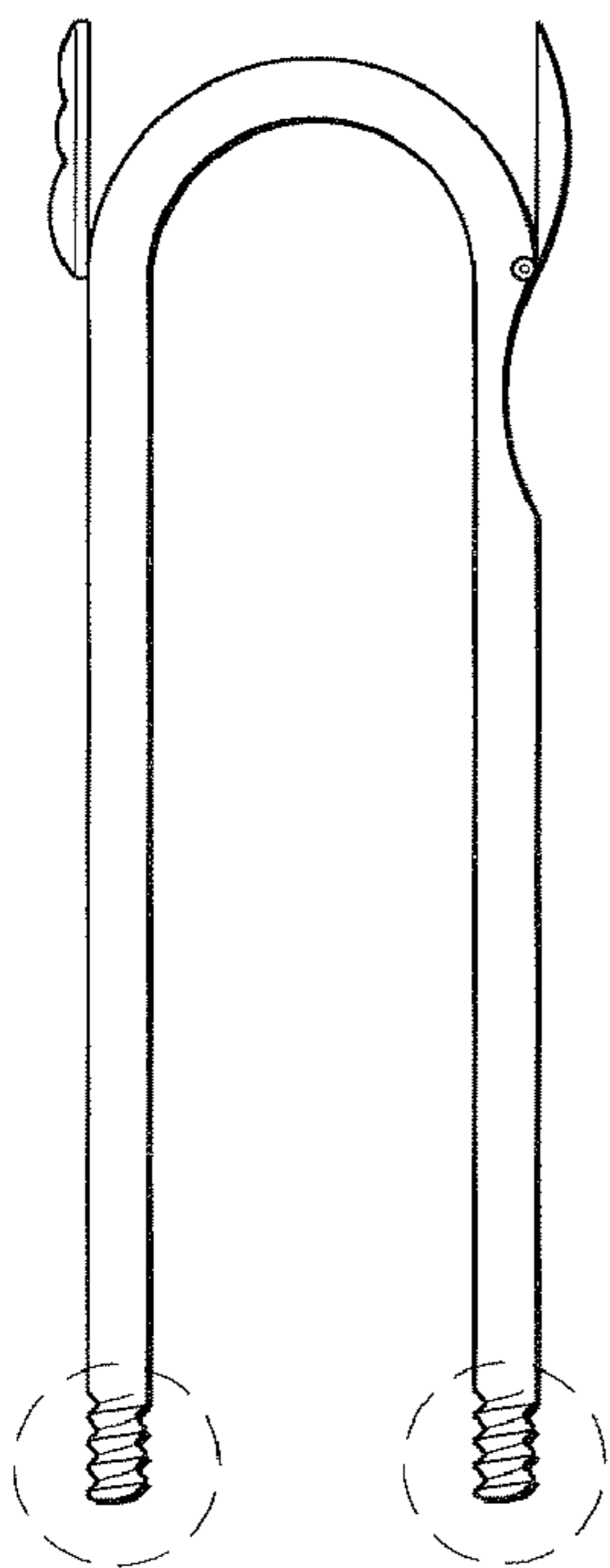

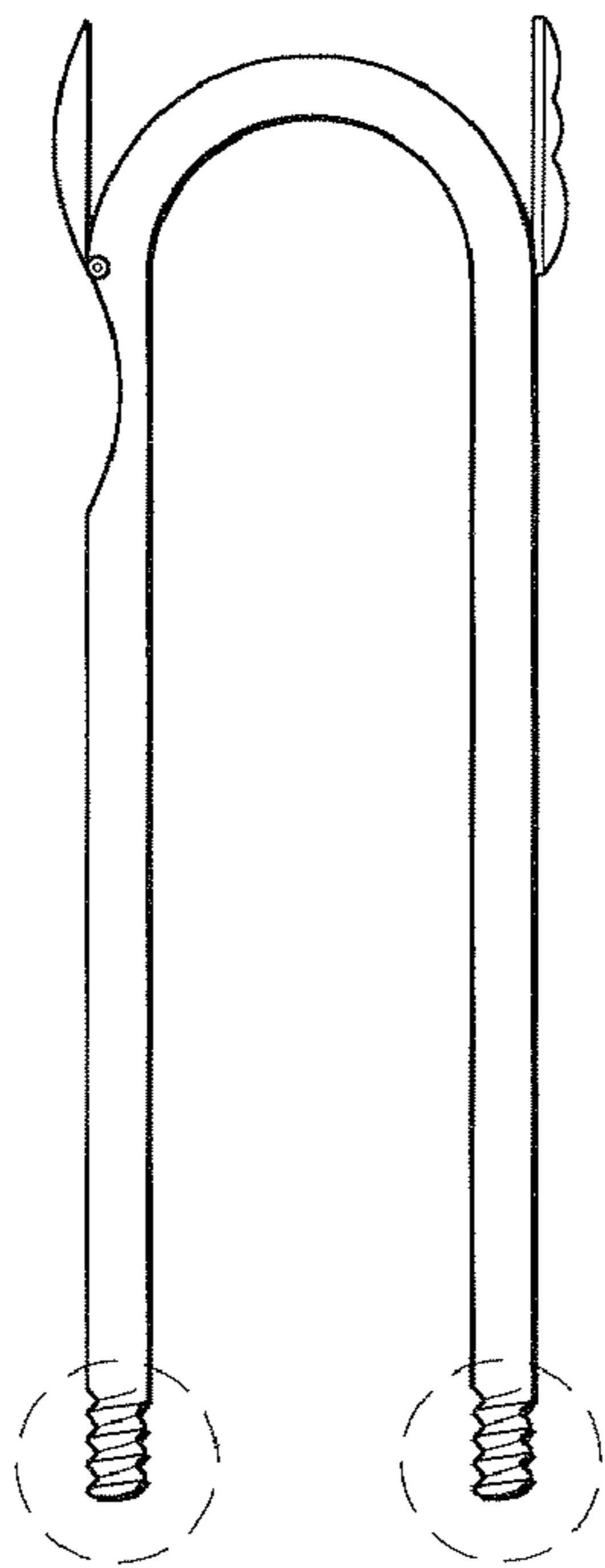

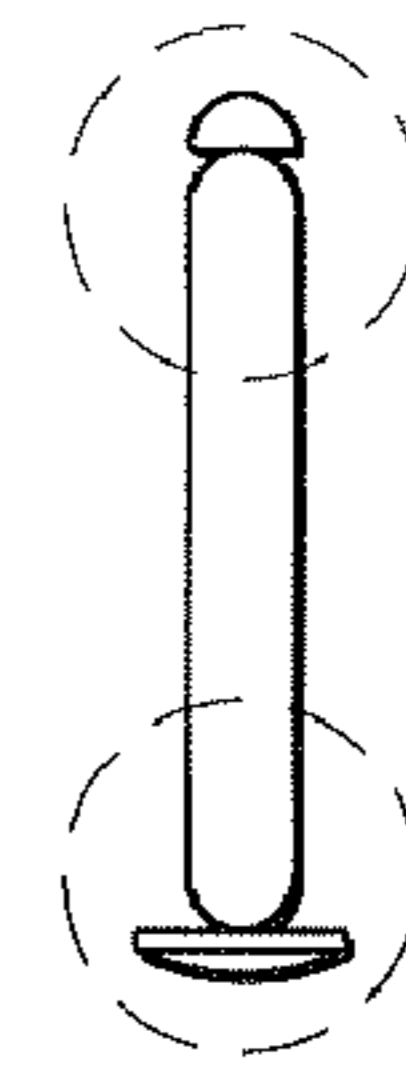

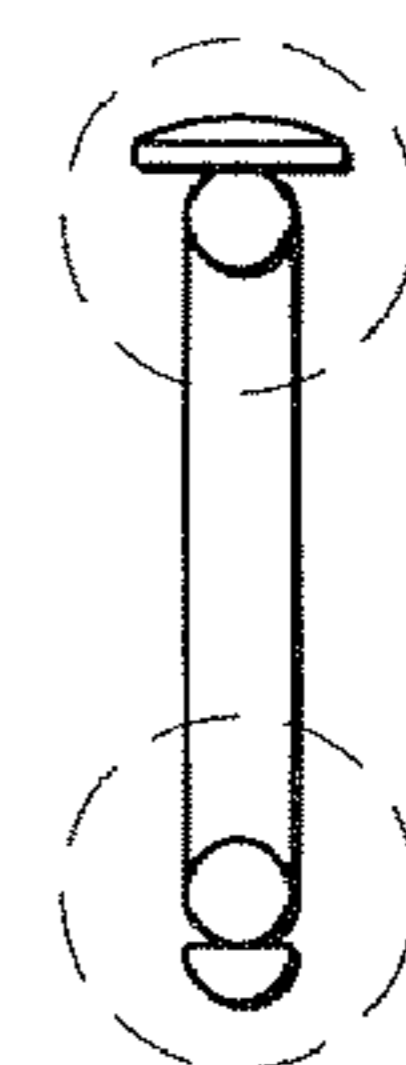
