What is claimed is the ornamental design for a wireless access point, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective front view of a wireless access point showing our new design;

FIG. 4 is a front view of the ornamental design of FIG. 1;

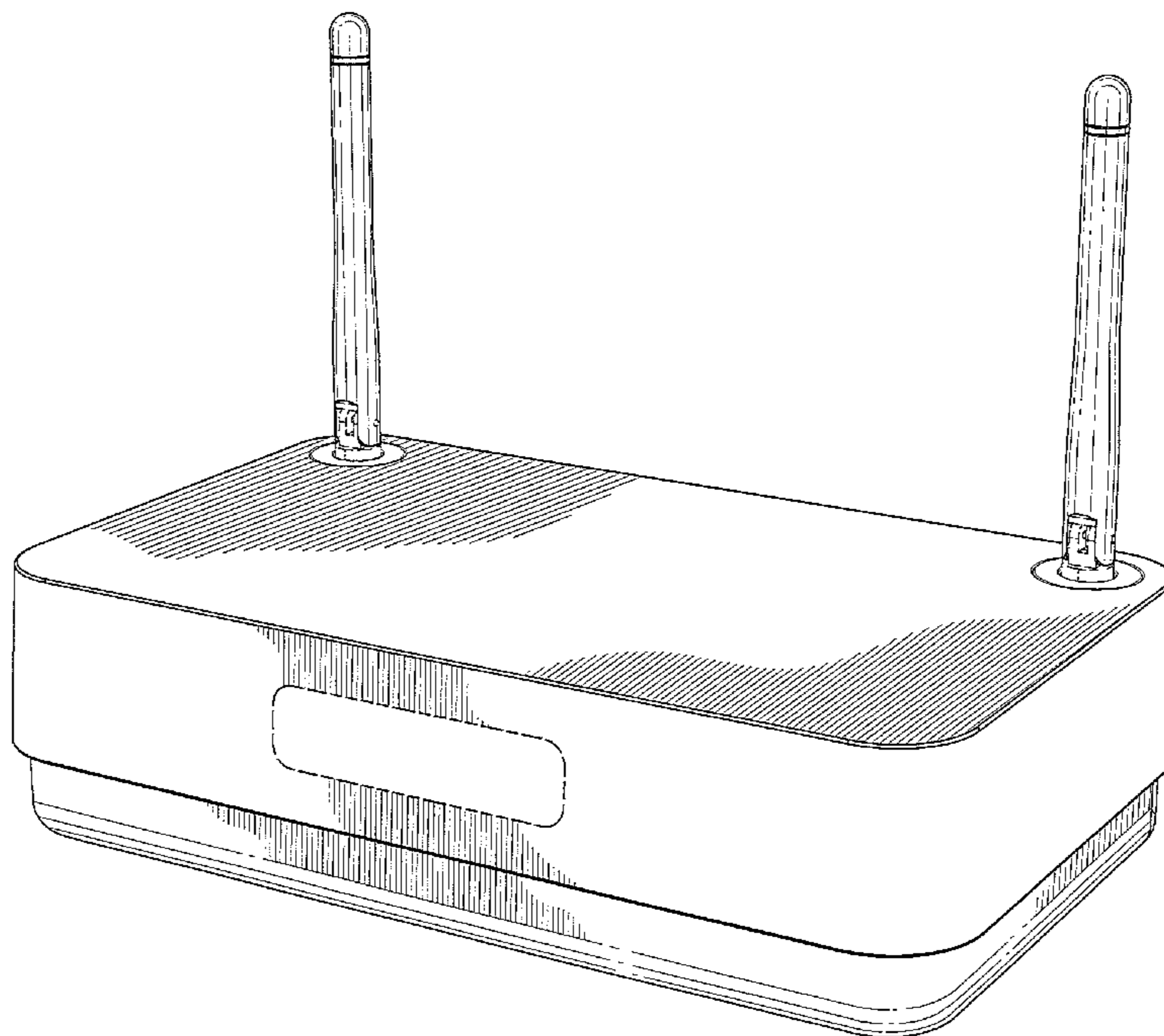
FIG. 5 is a rear view of the ornamental design of FIG. 1;

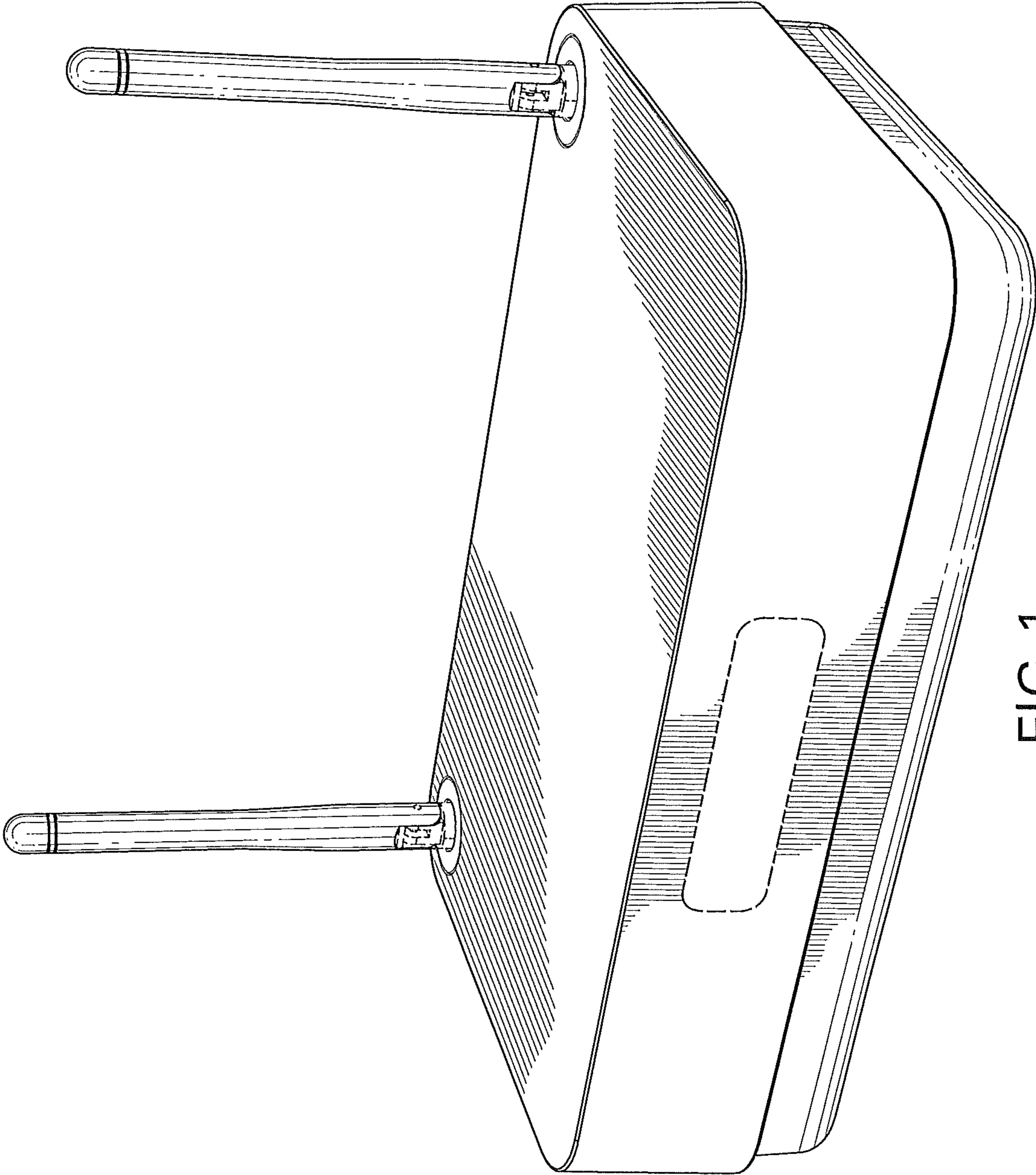

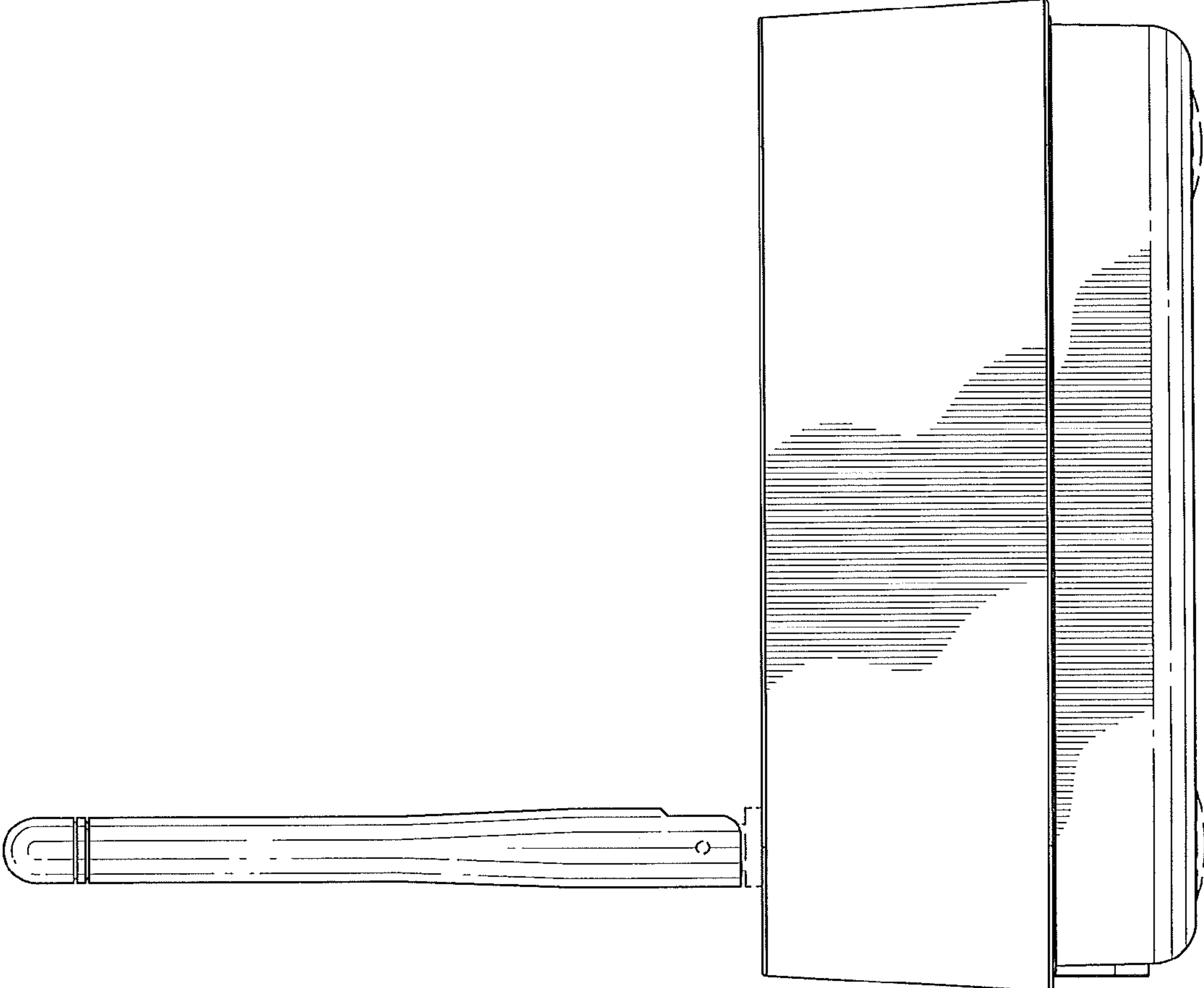

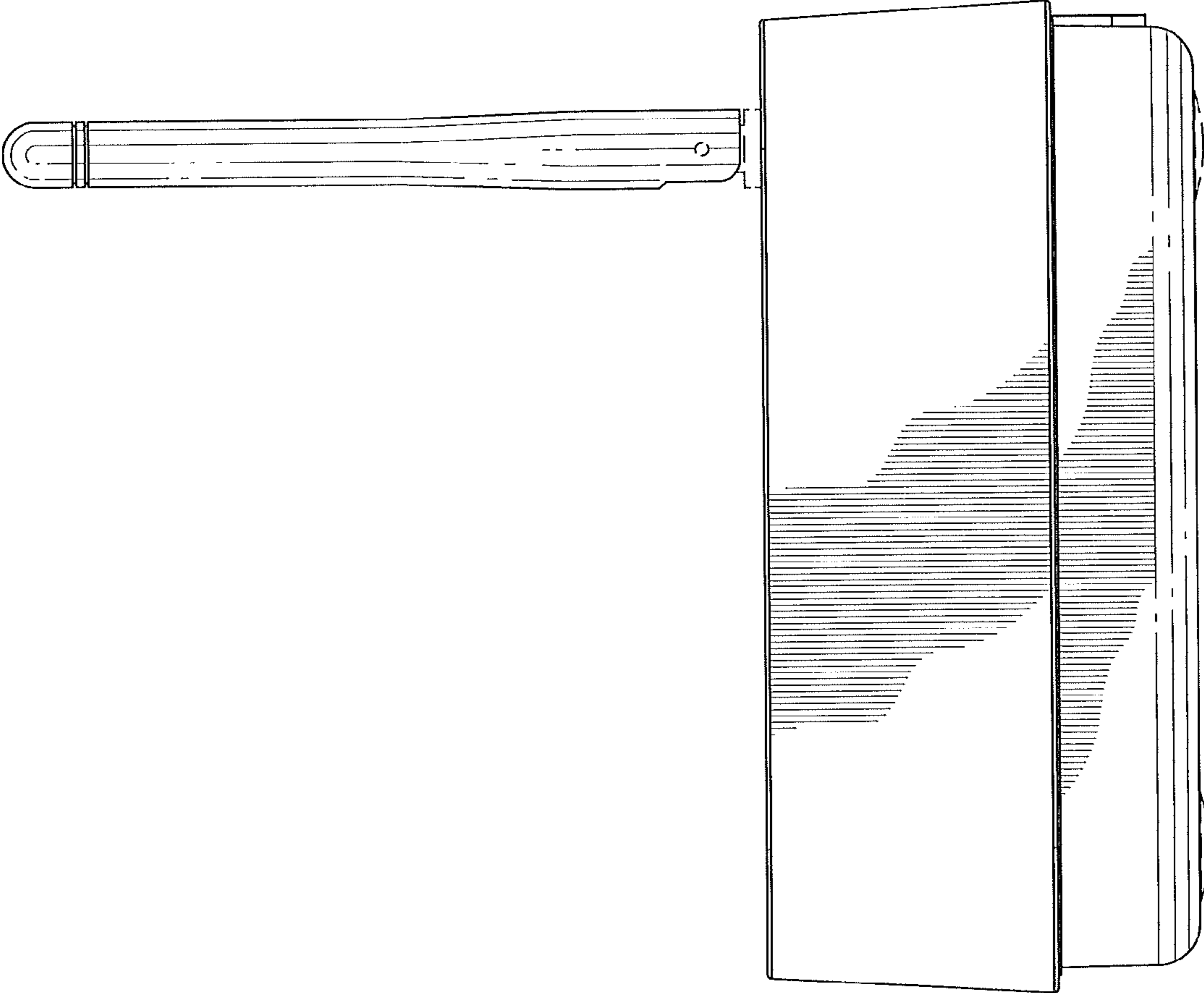

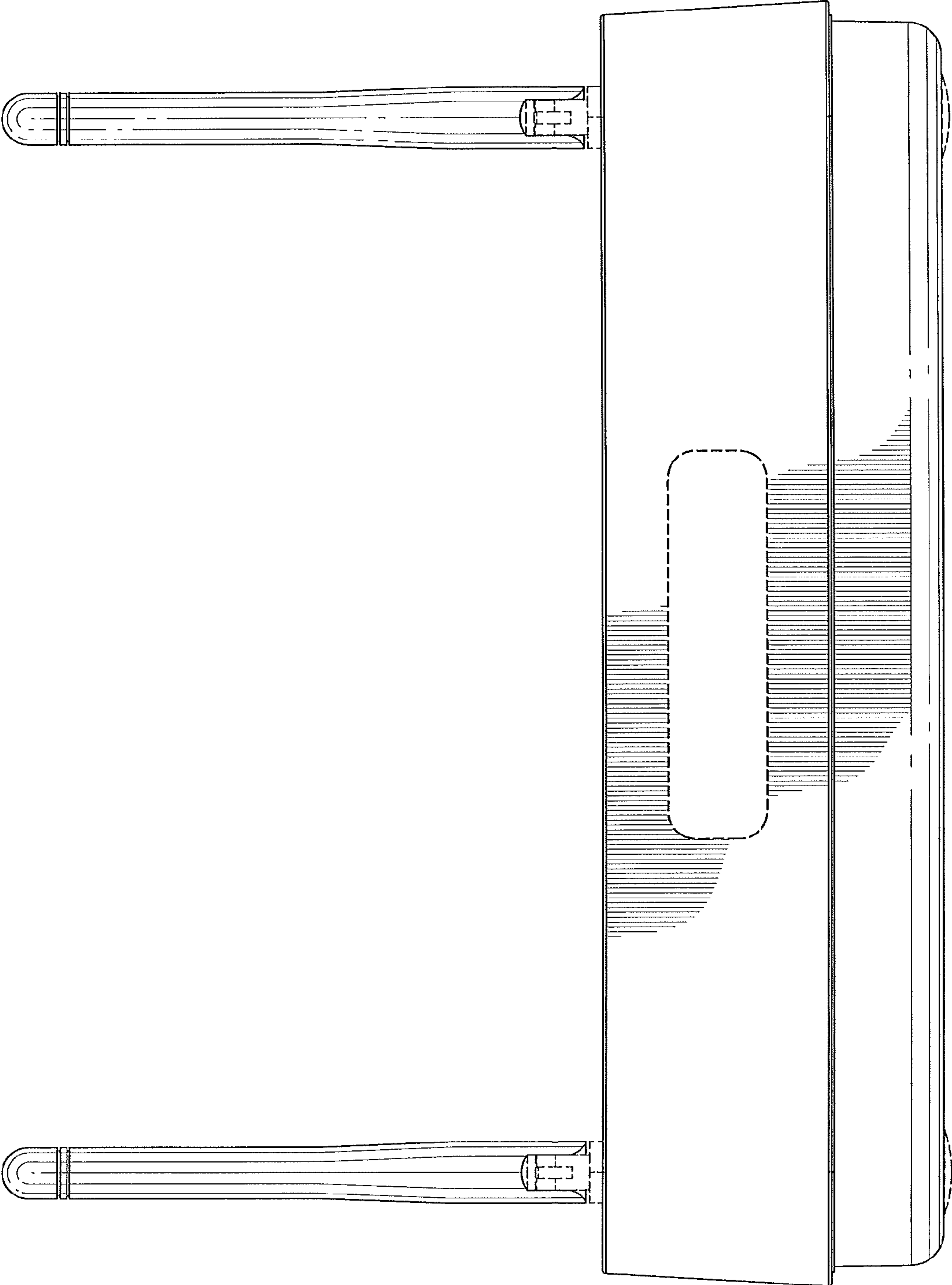

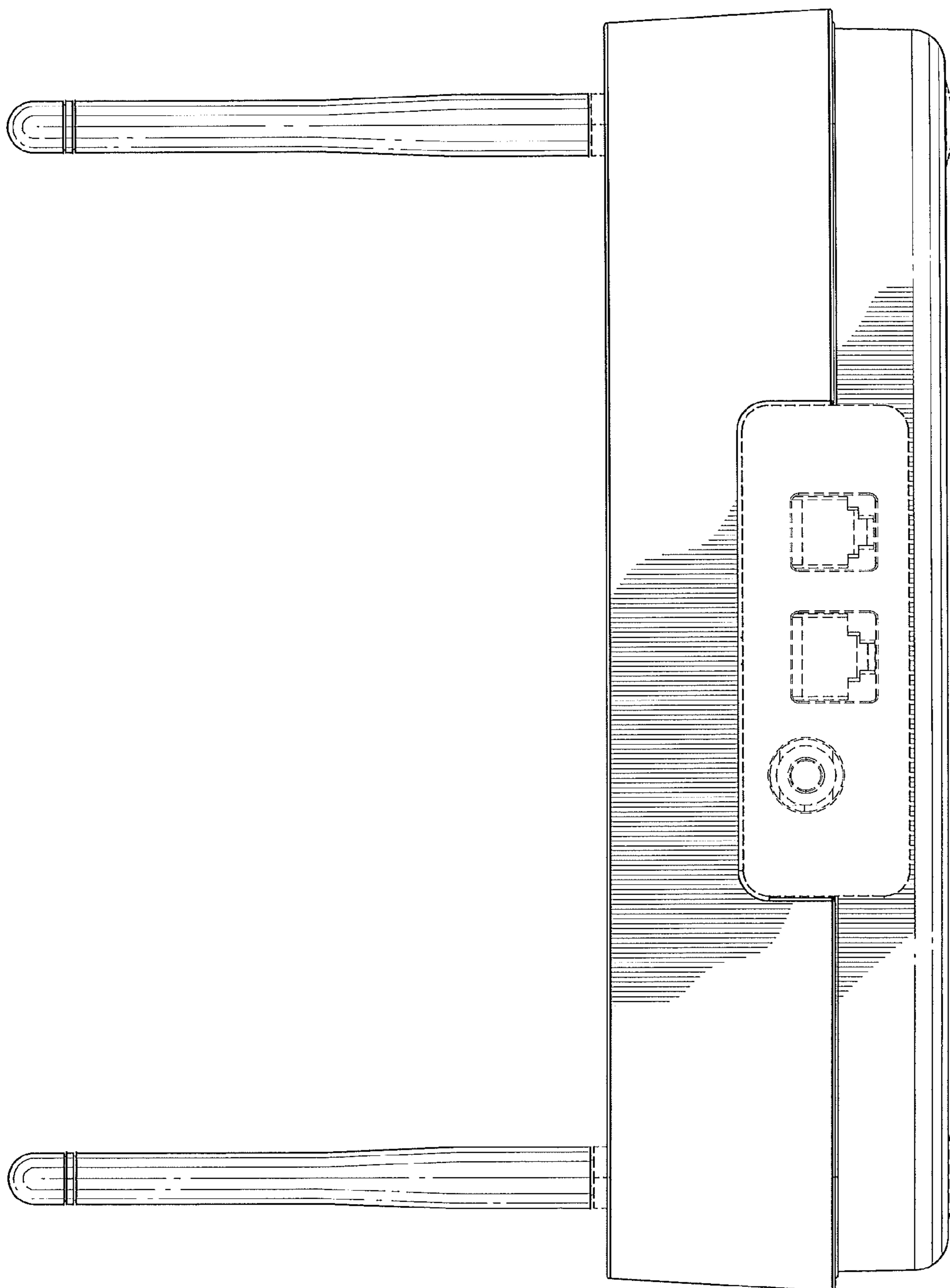

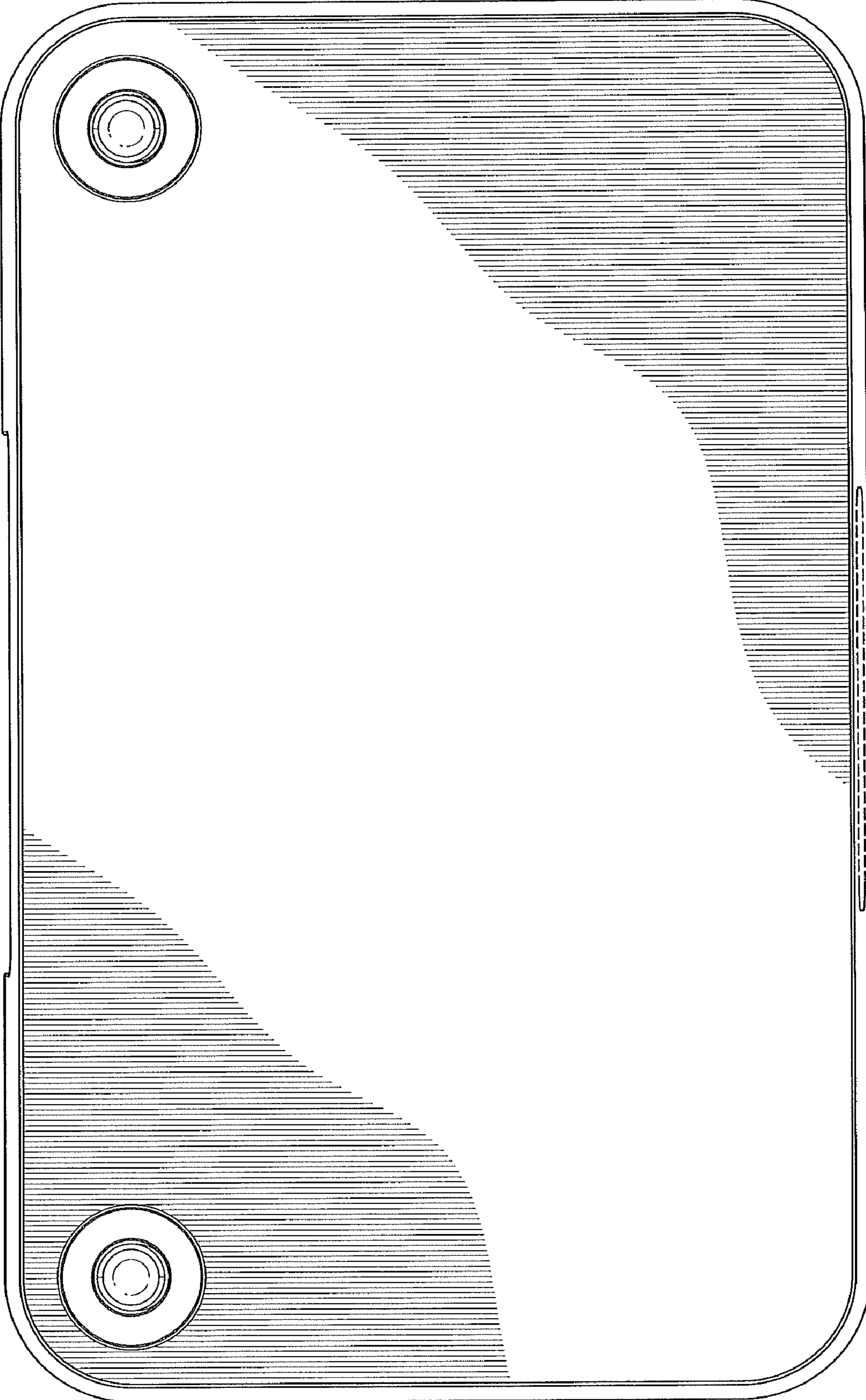

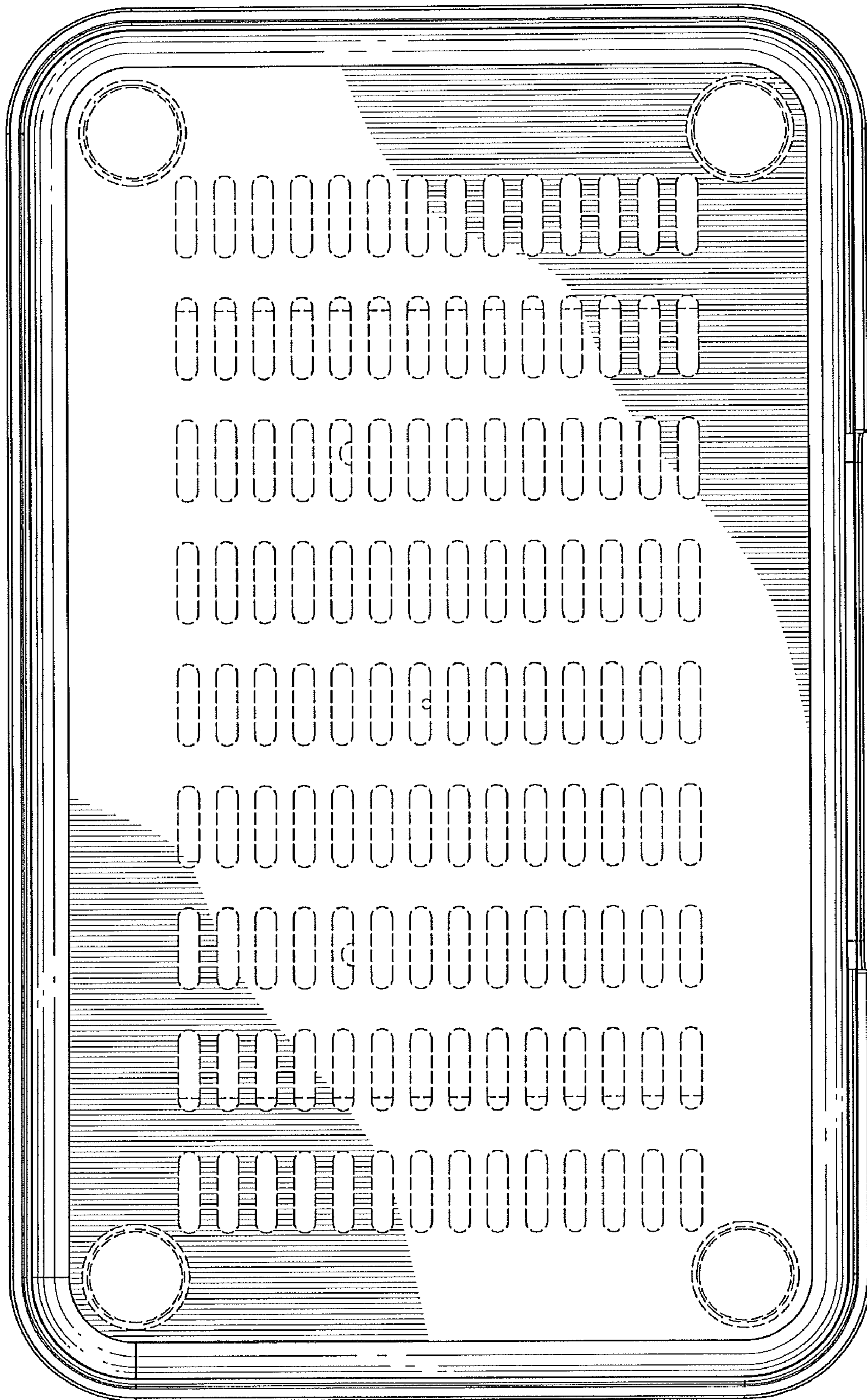
