The ornamental design for an edible maze, as shown and
described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top view of the edible maze.

FIG. 2 is a side view of the edible maze.

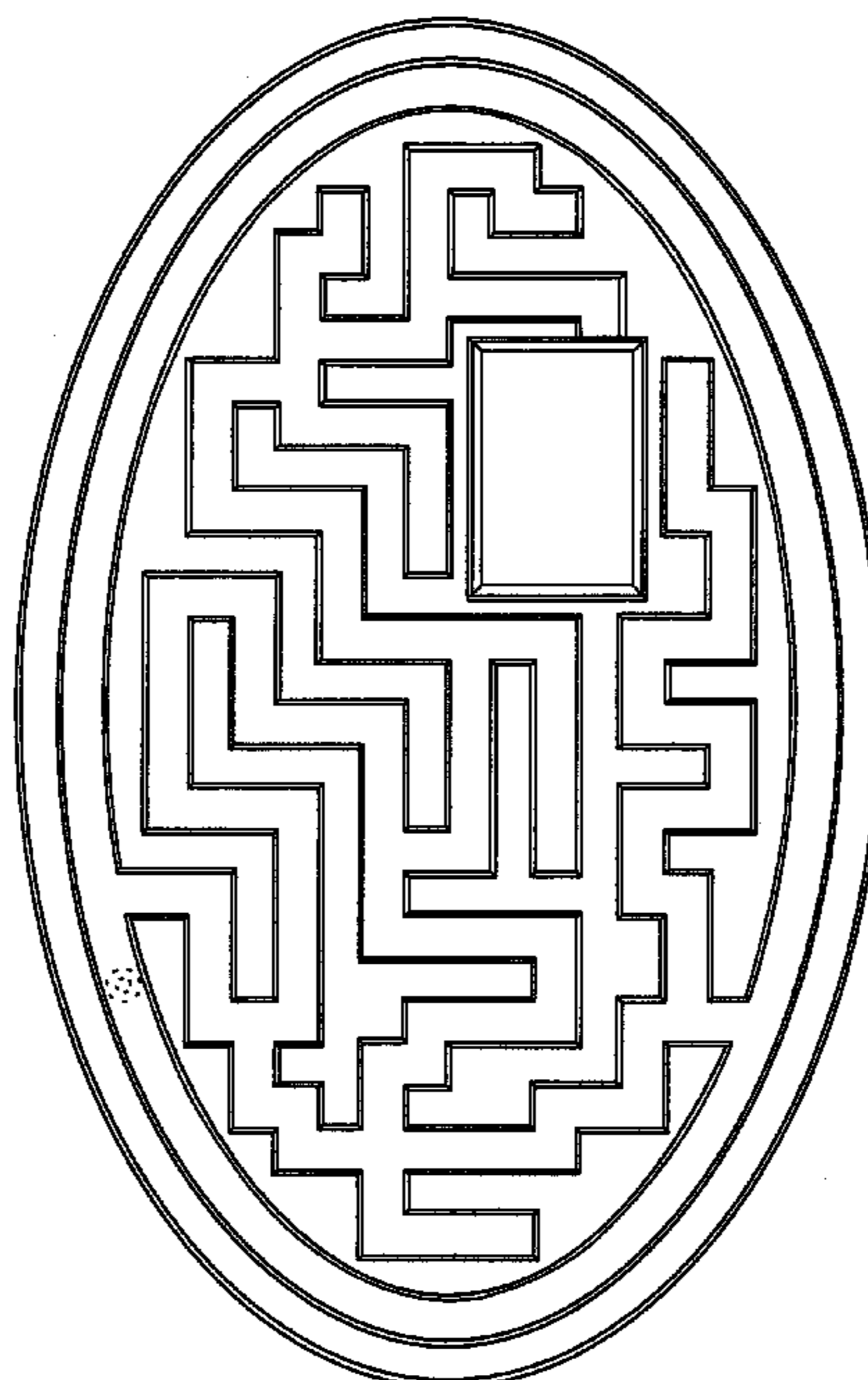
FIG. 3 is an end view of the edible maze; and,

FIG. 4 is a perspective view of the edible maze.

The broken lines shown in the drawings illustrate portions of
the edible maze, and form no part of the claimed design.

The characteristic feature of the edible maze resides in the
beginning and end-point of the maze, and with the raised
perimeter.

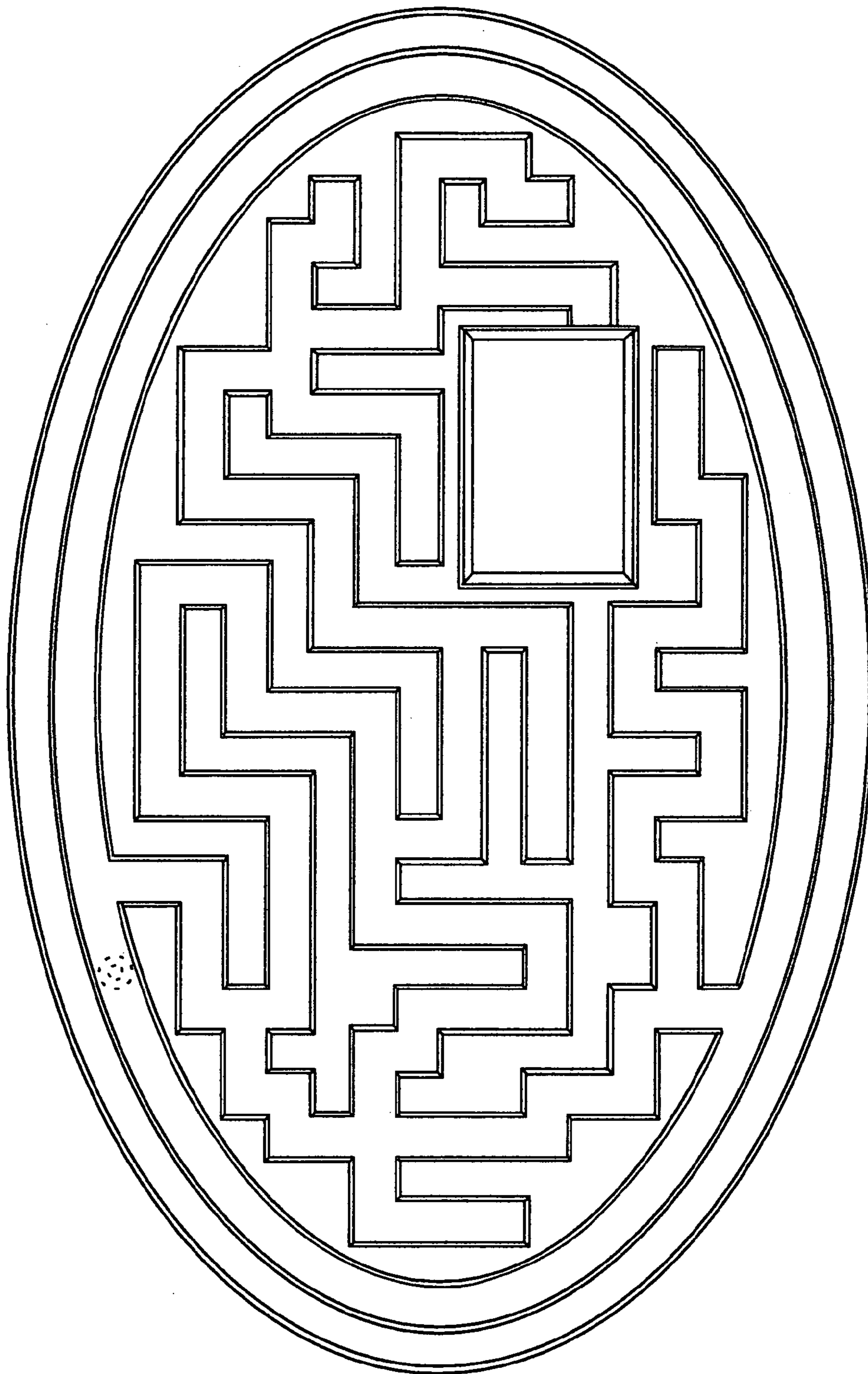

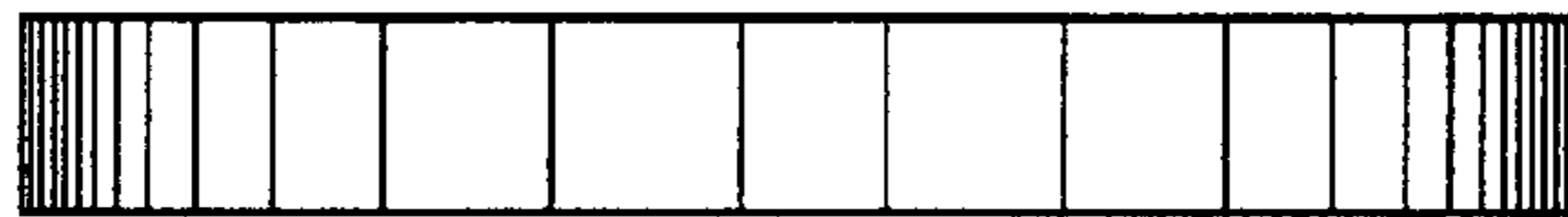

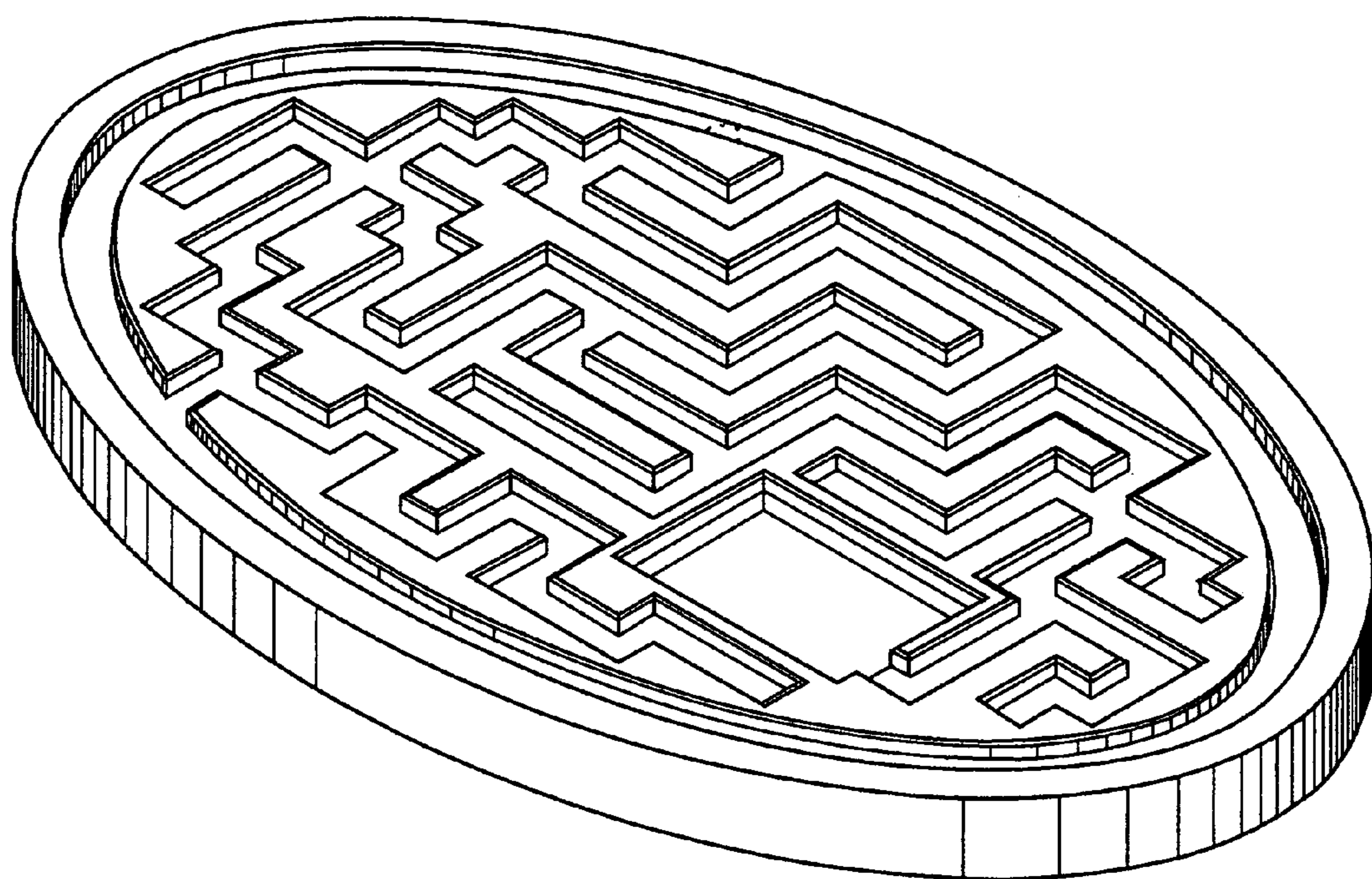
