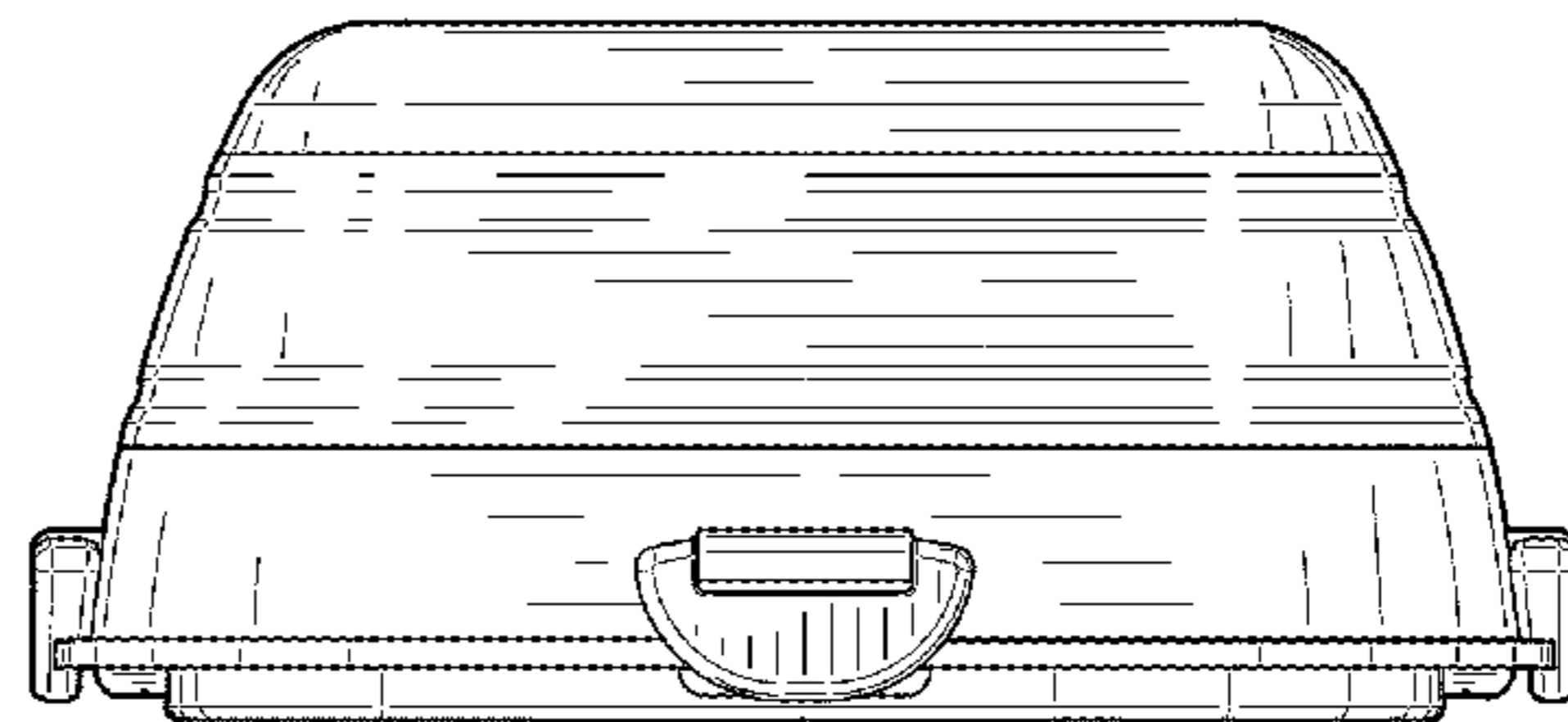
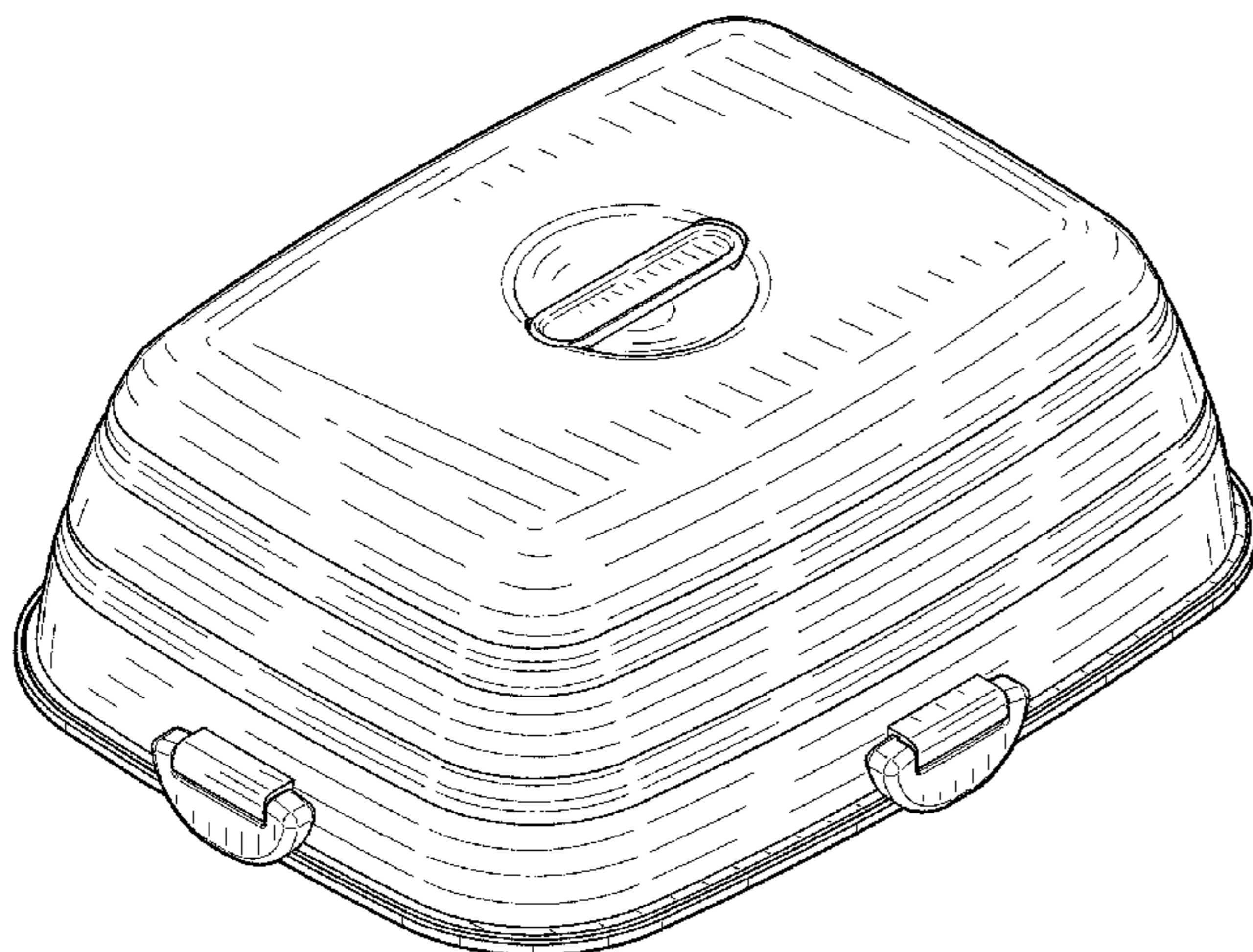
FIG. 3 is a front view of the collapsible food carrier, the back

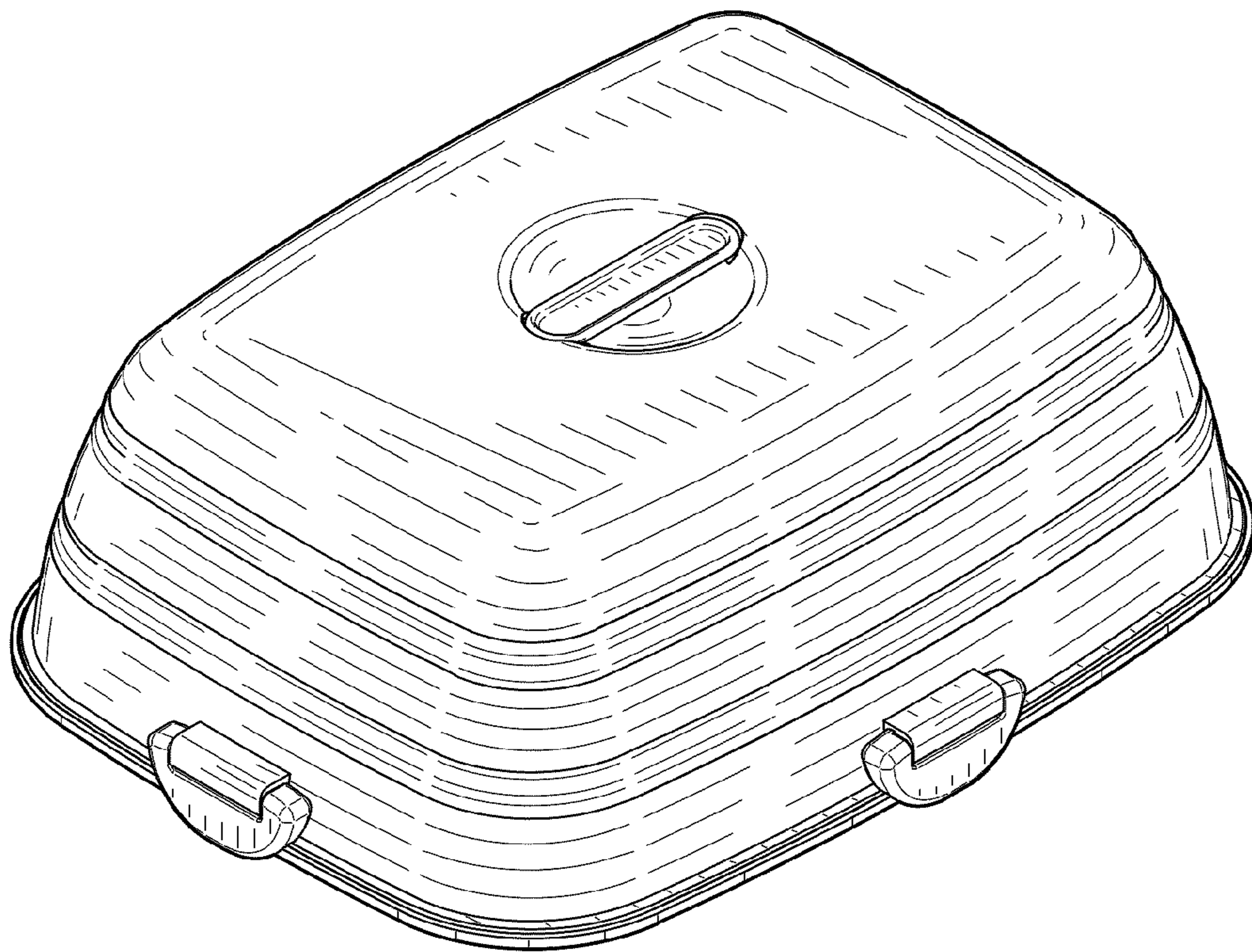

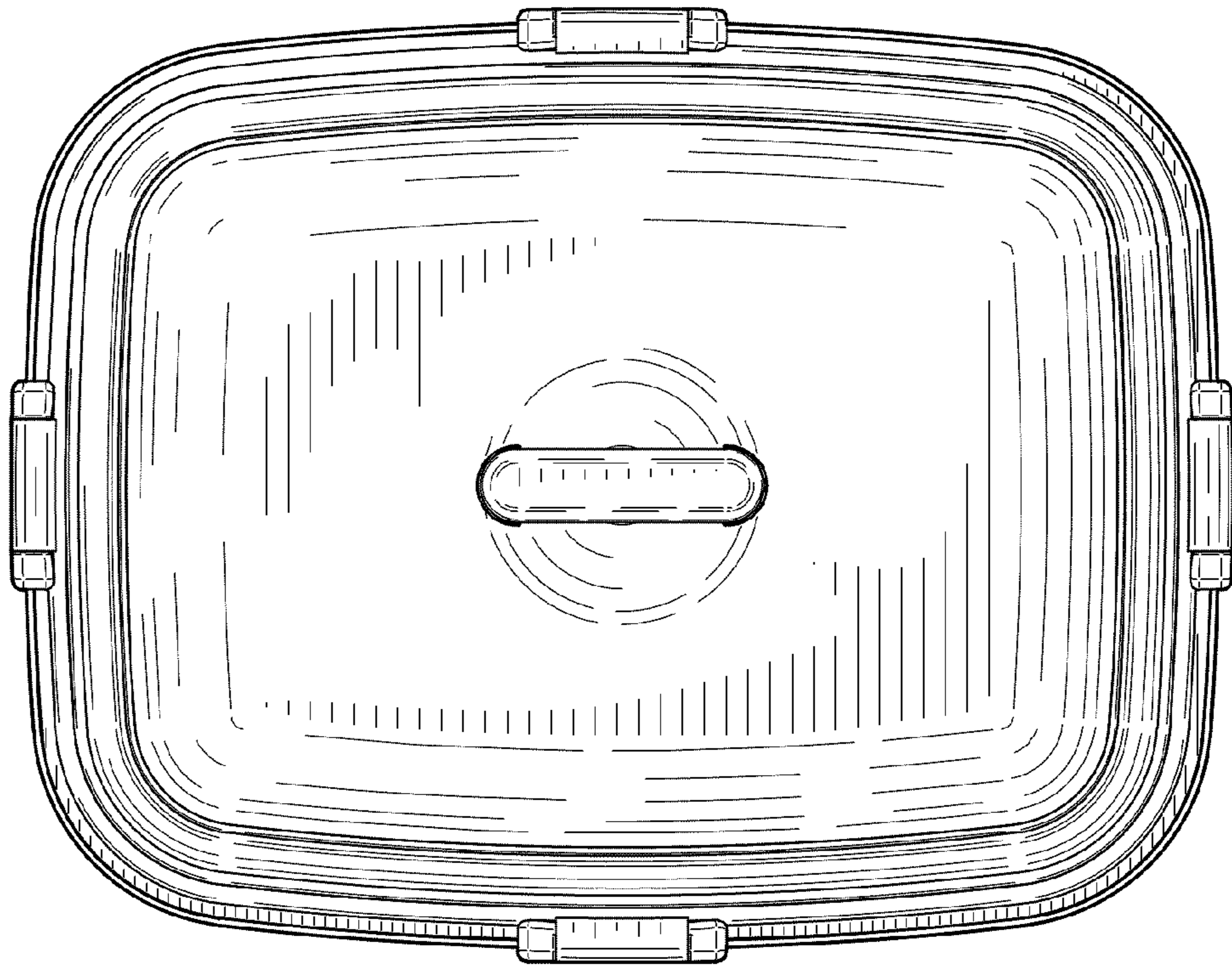

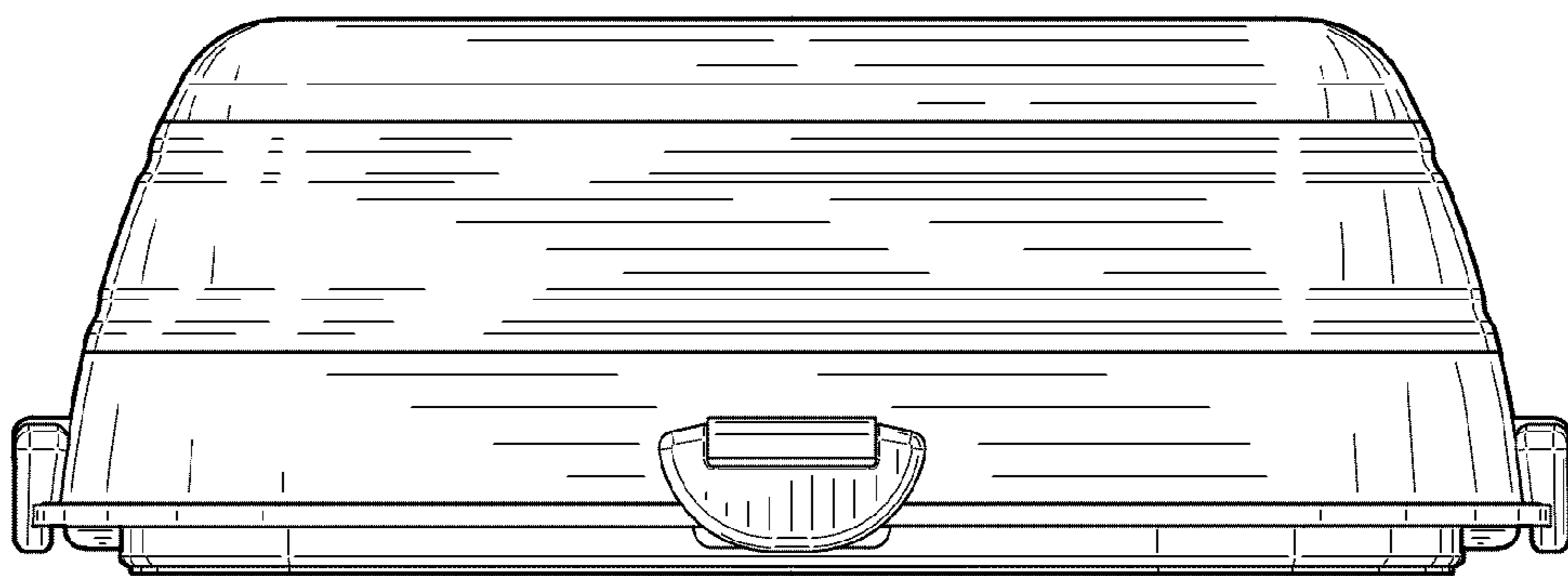

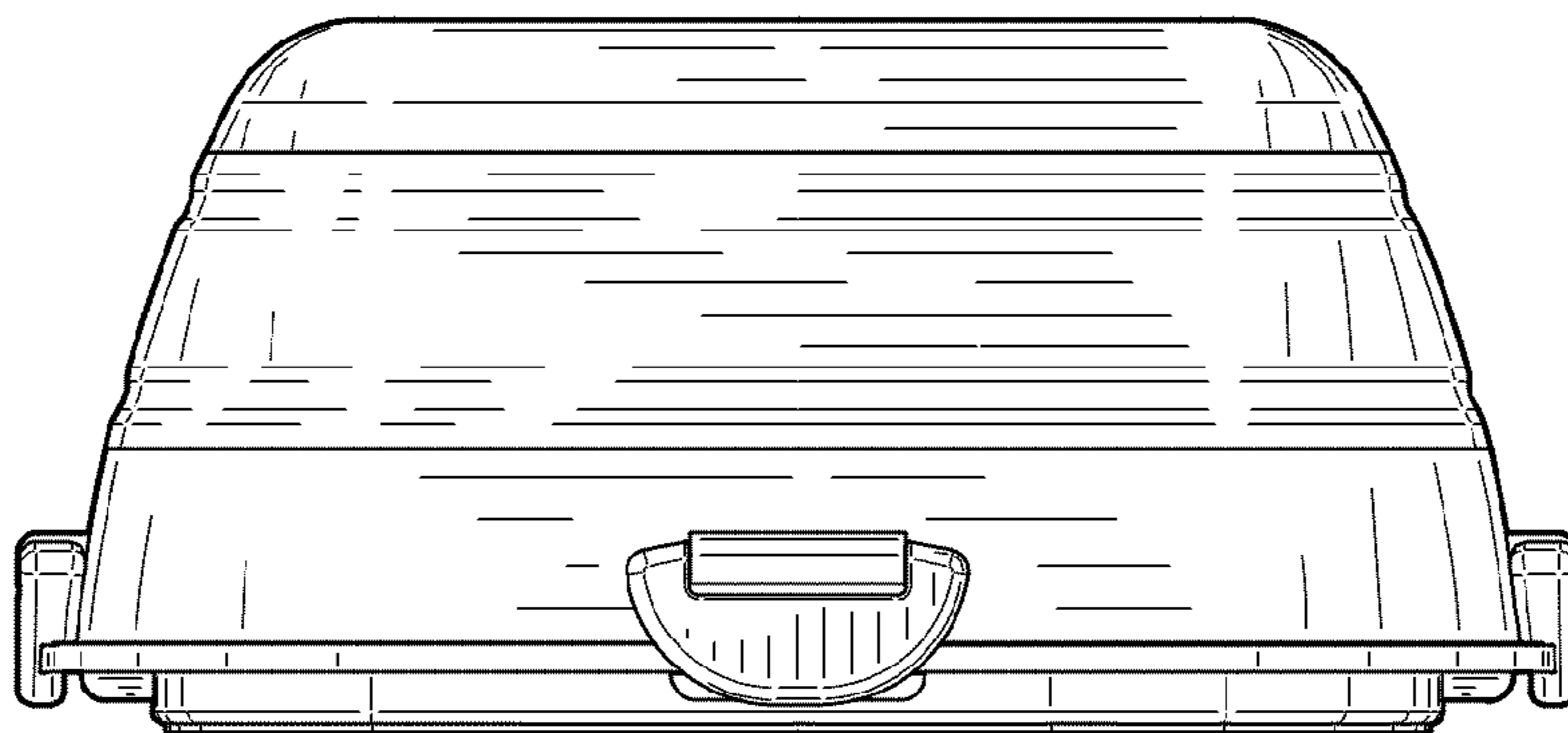

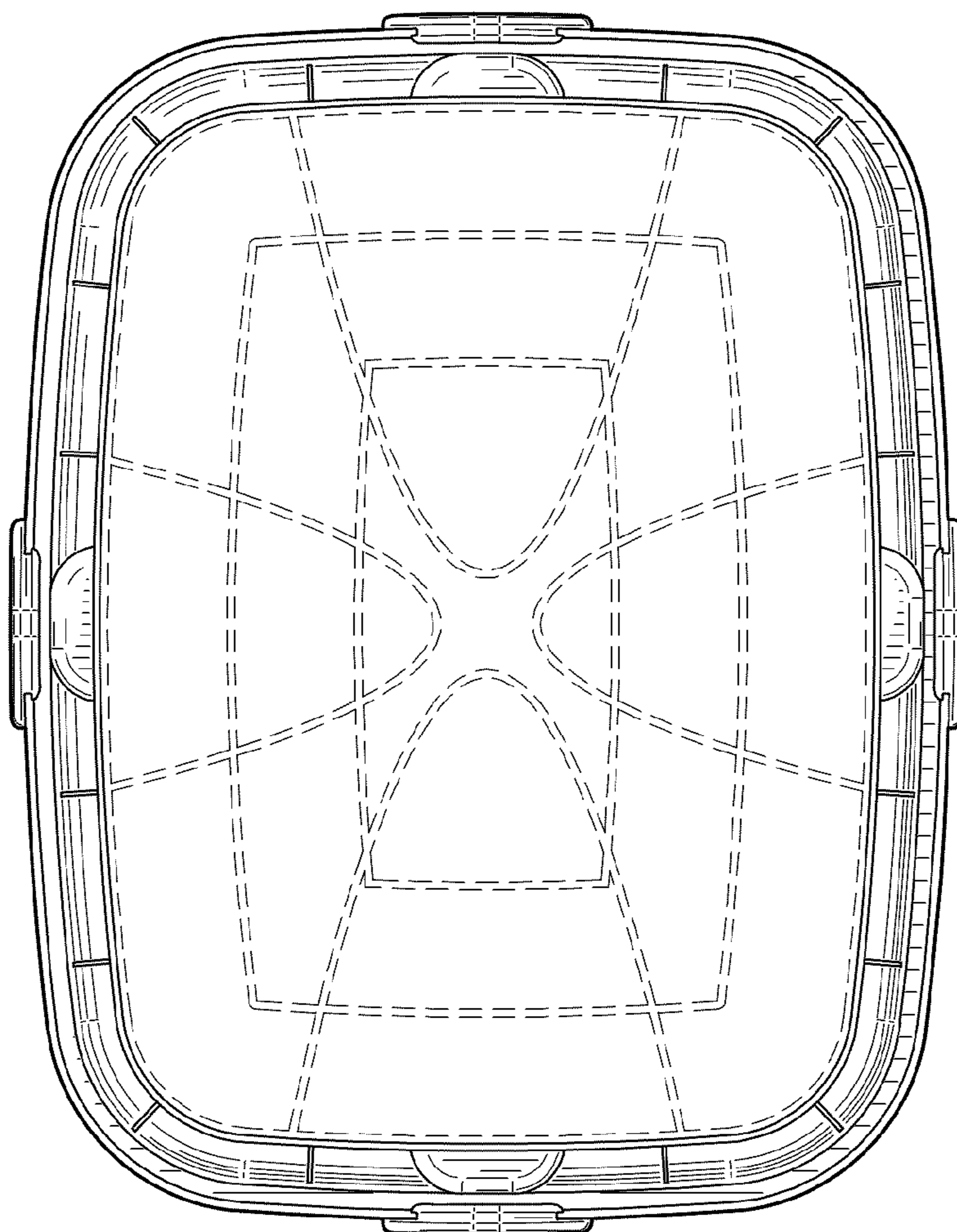
