FIG. 3 is a front elevation view thereof;

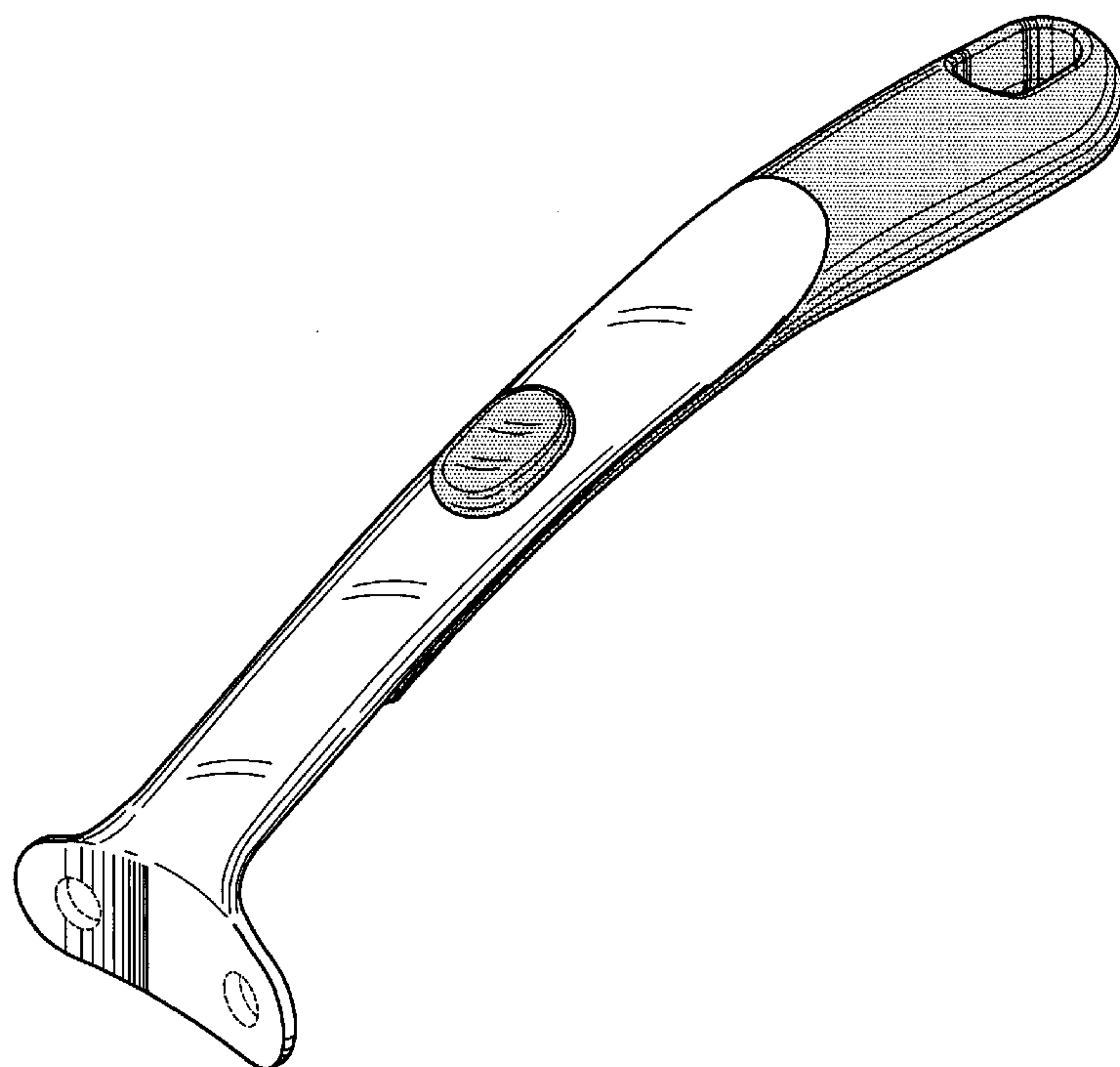
FIG. 4 is a side elevation view thereof;

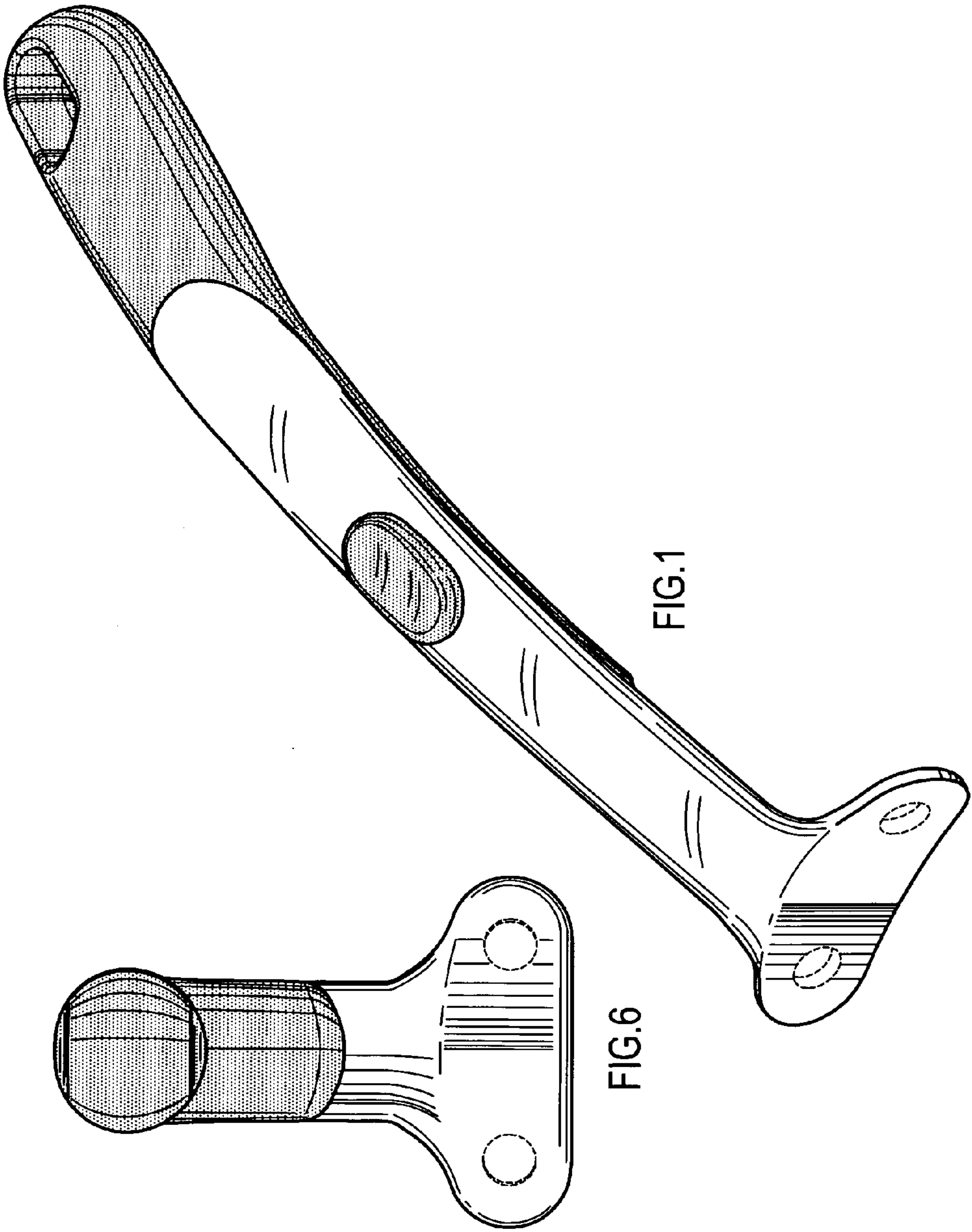
FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof; and,

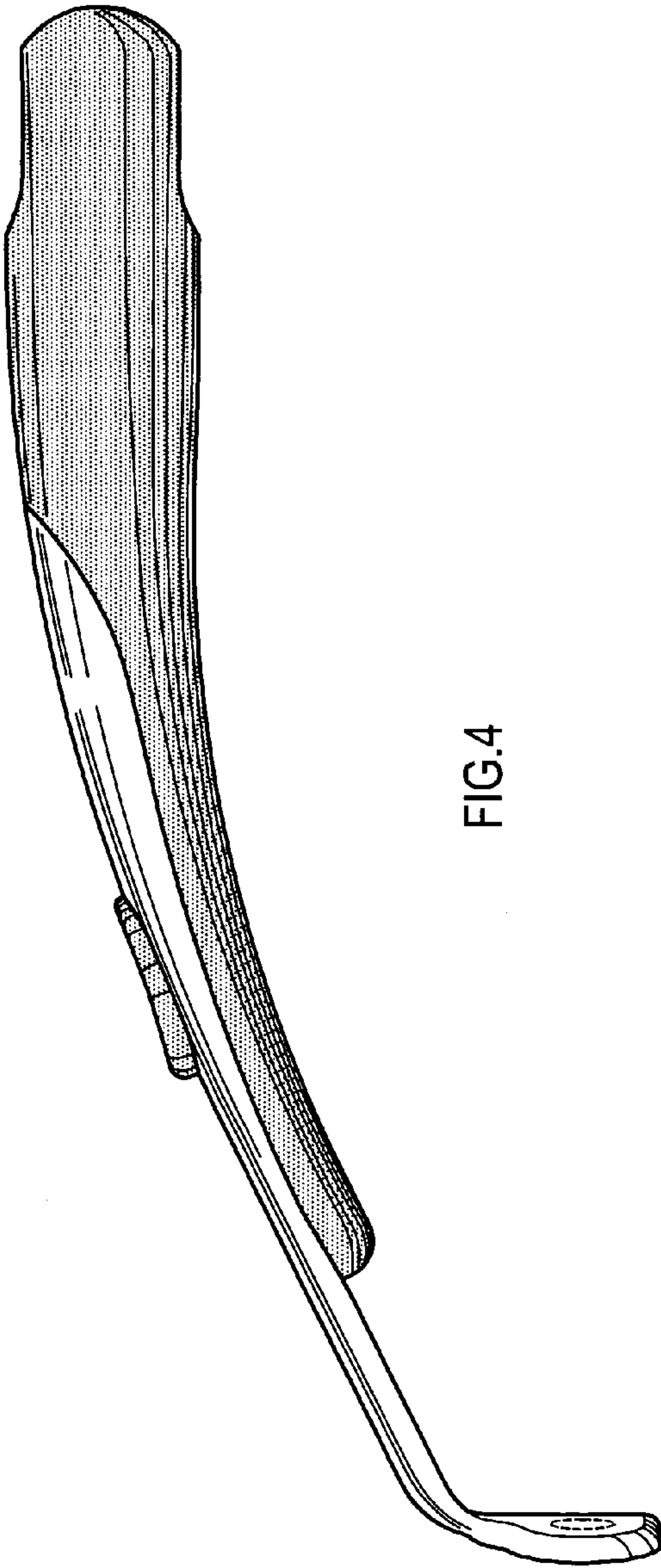

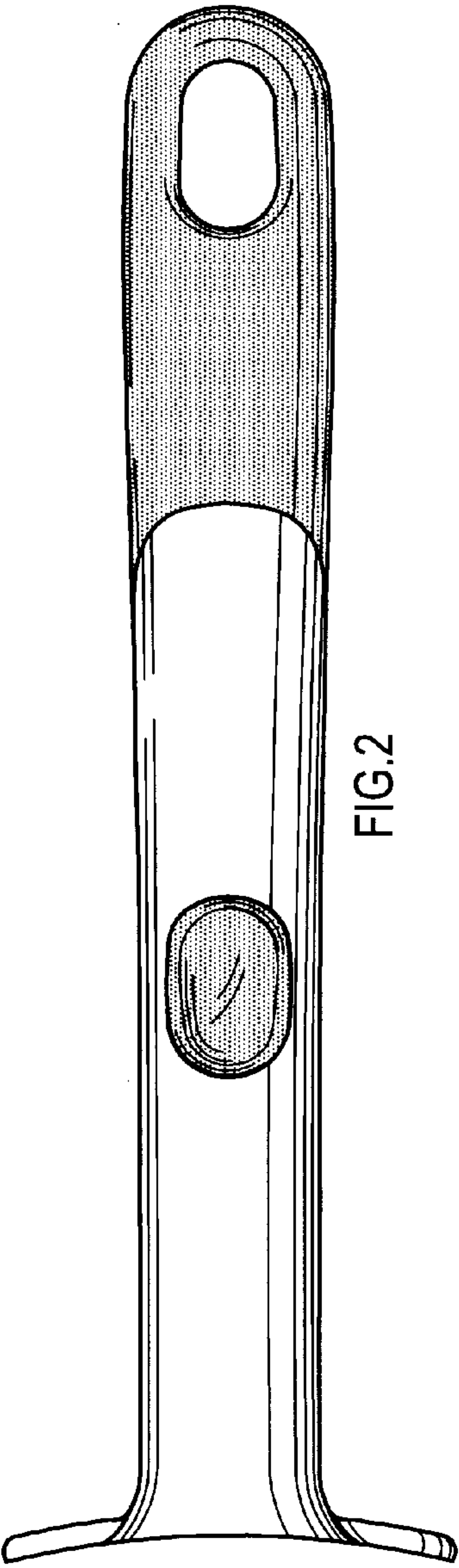

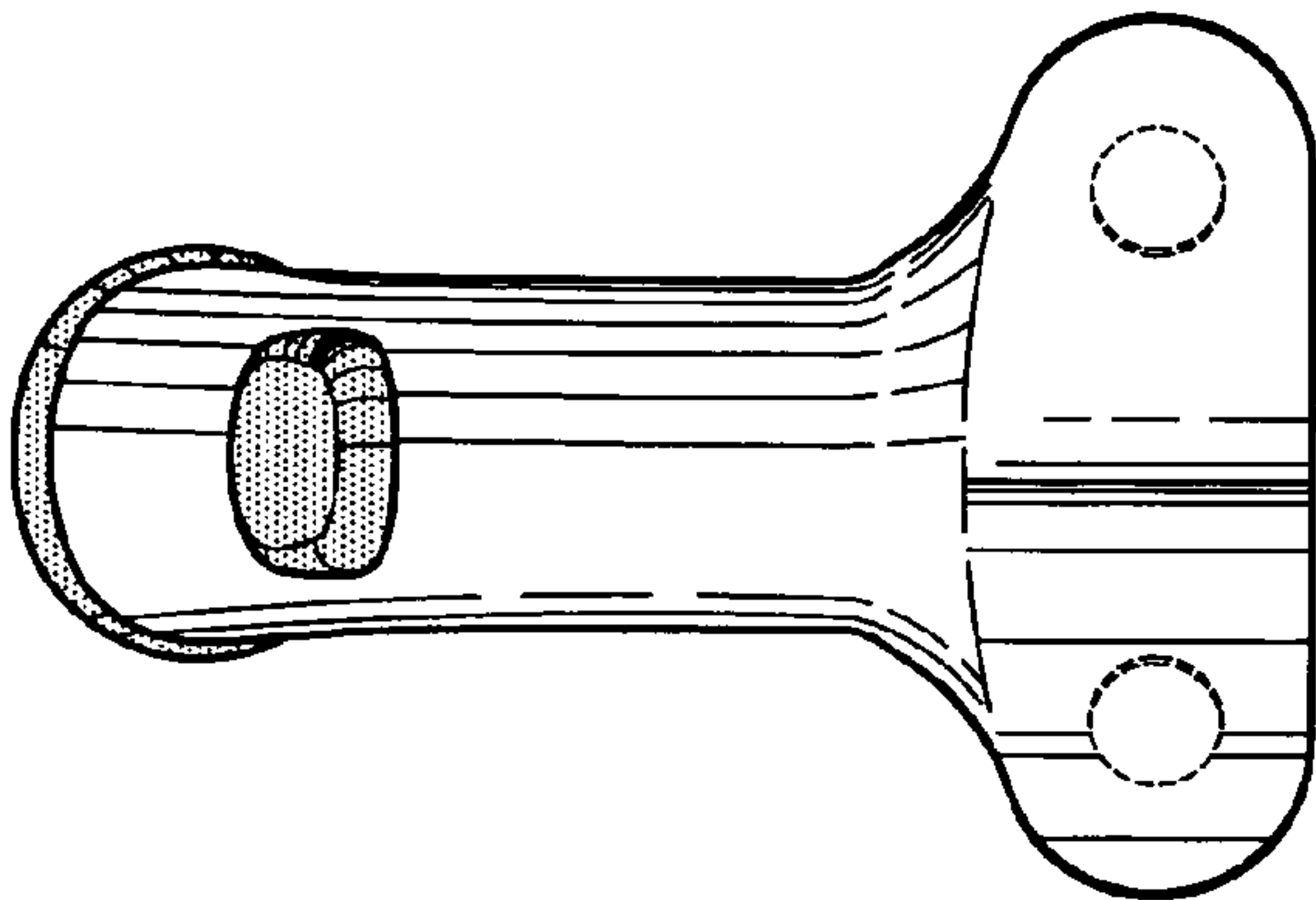

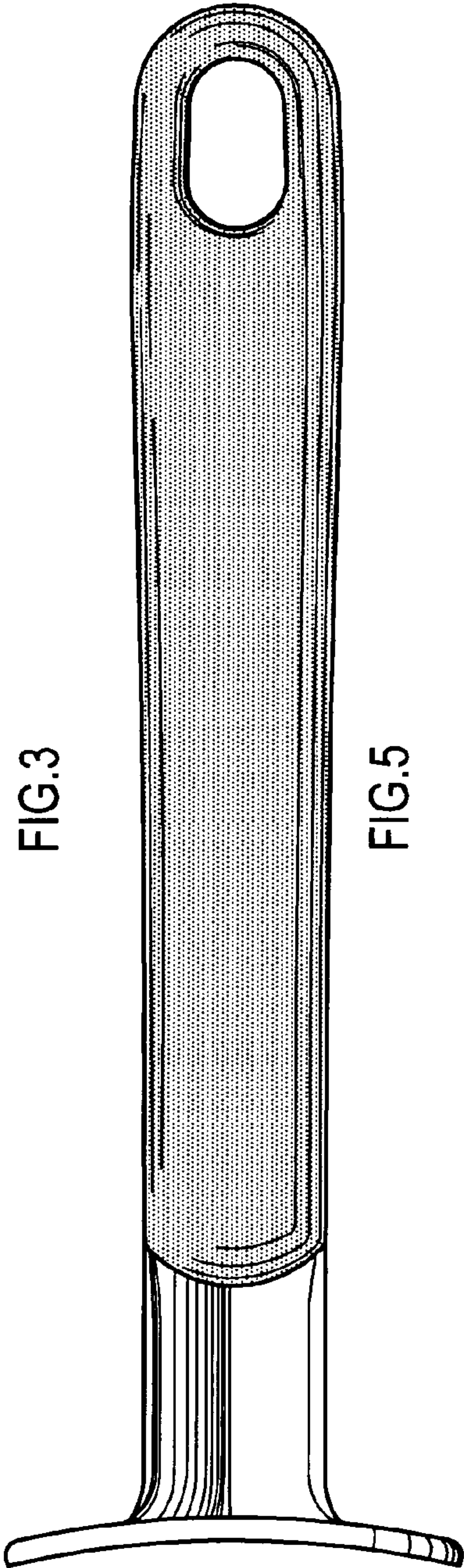
