FIG. 6 is a bottom view thereof;

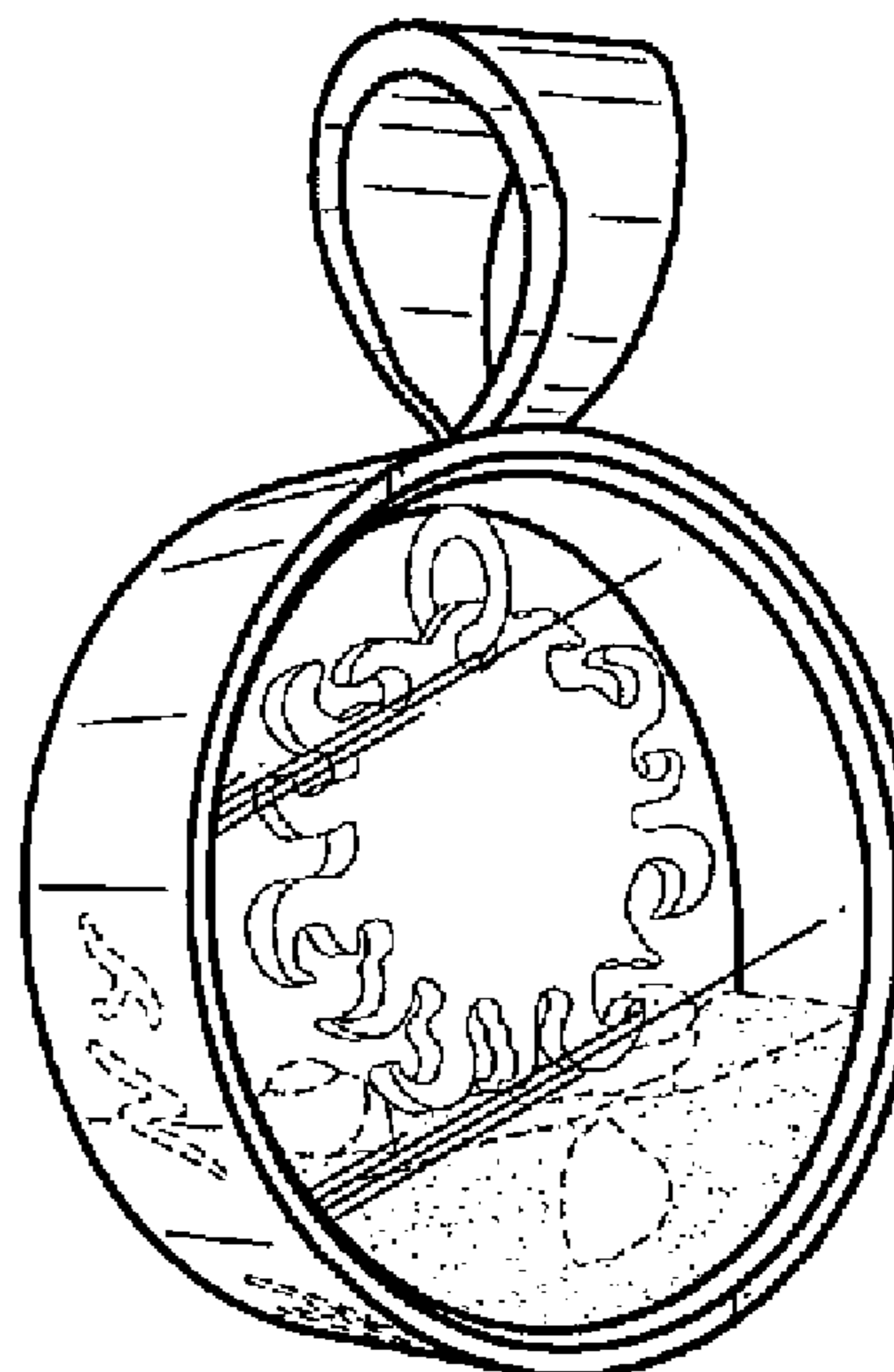
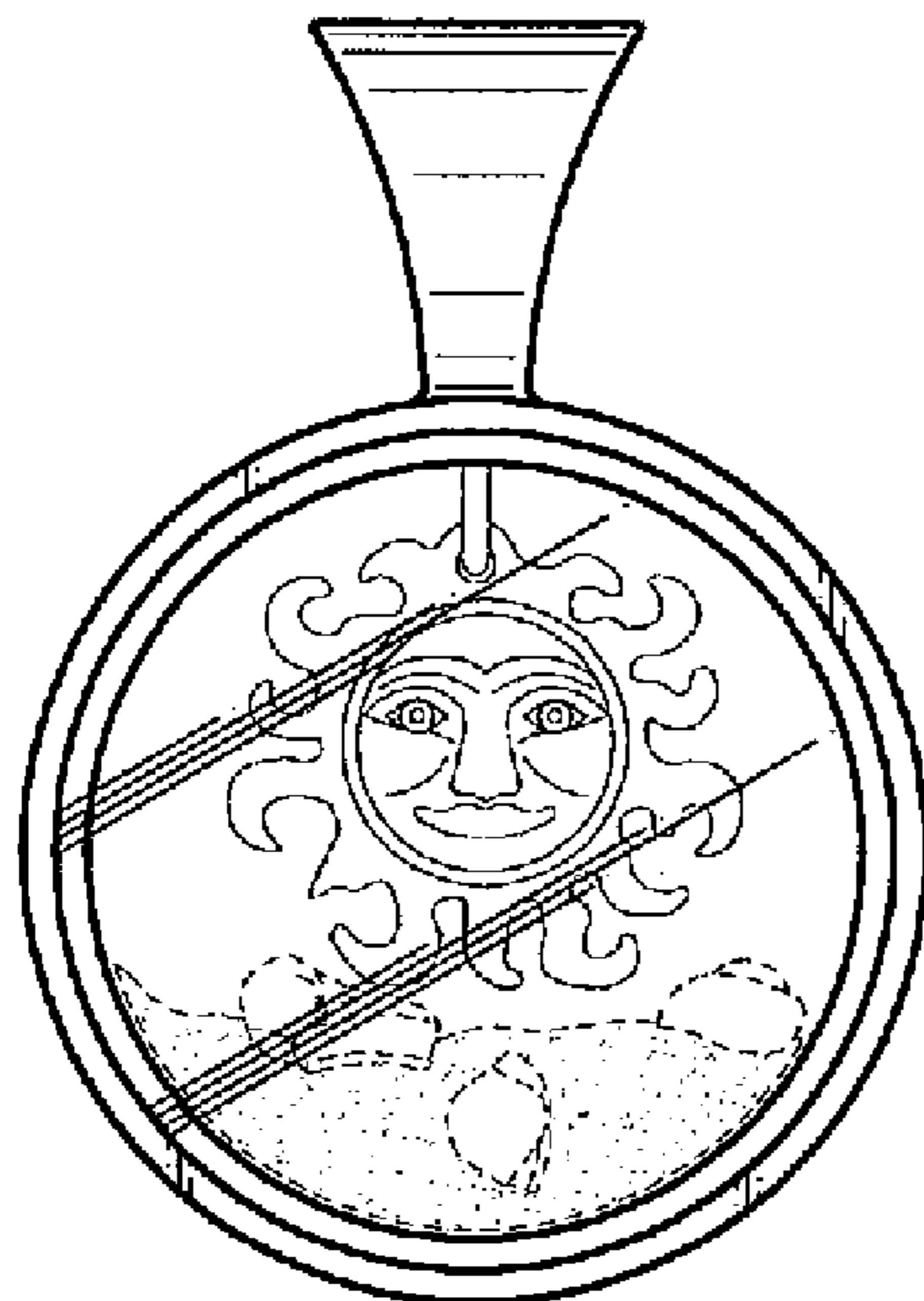
FIG. 7 is a front perspective view thereof; and,

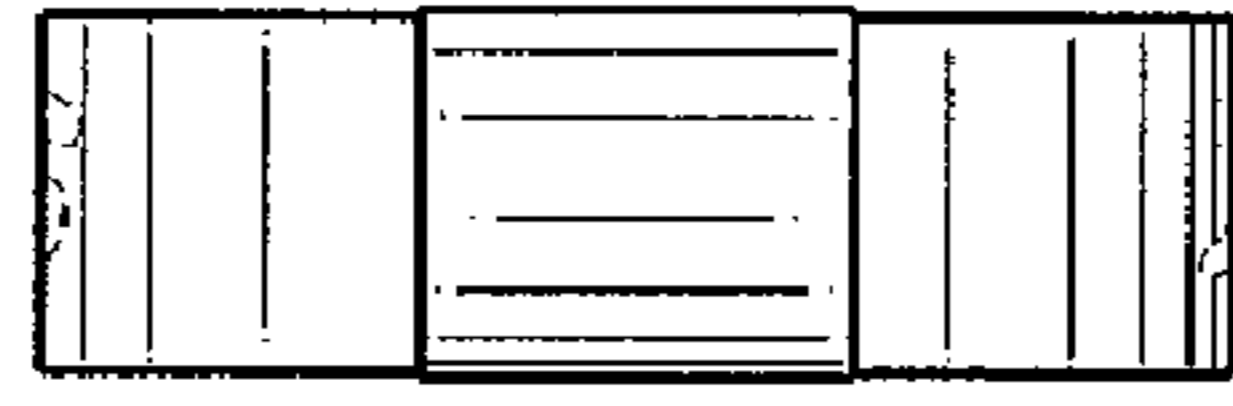

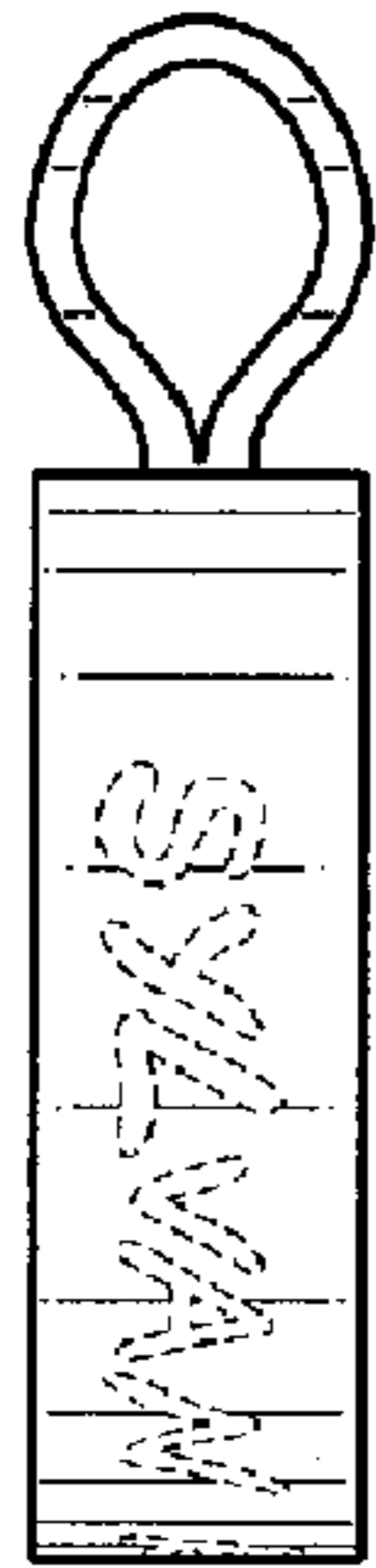

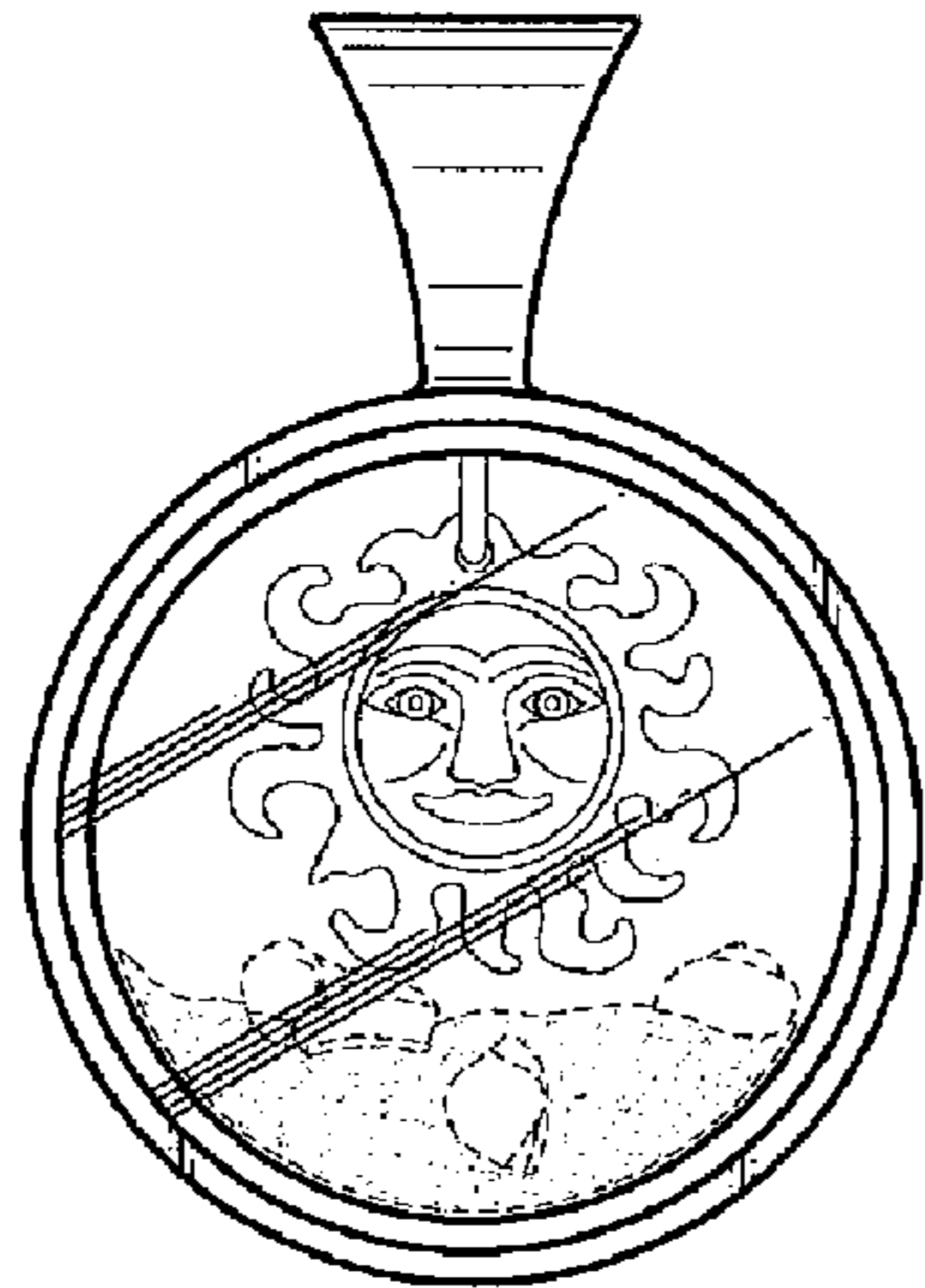

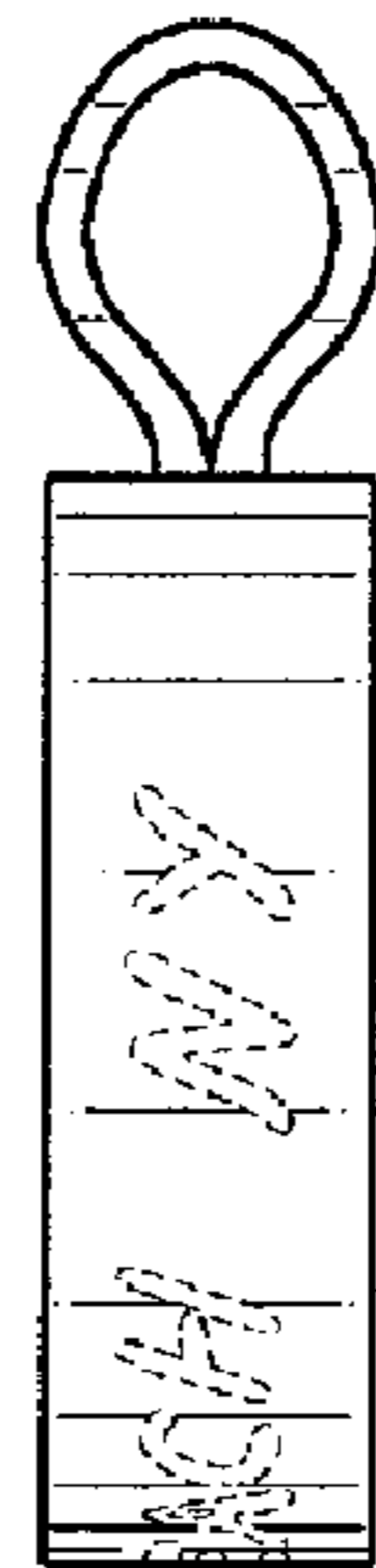

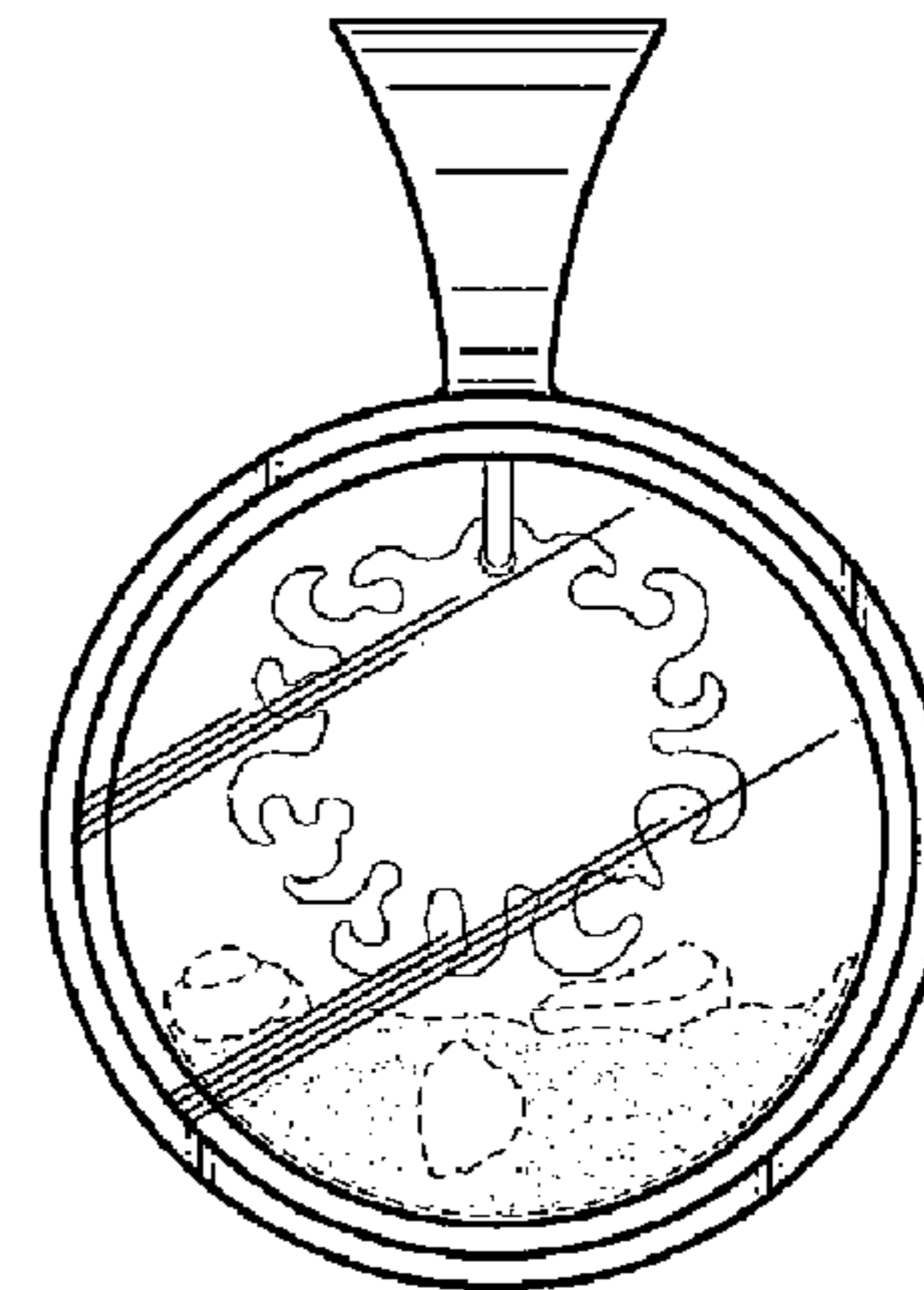

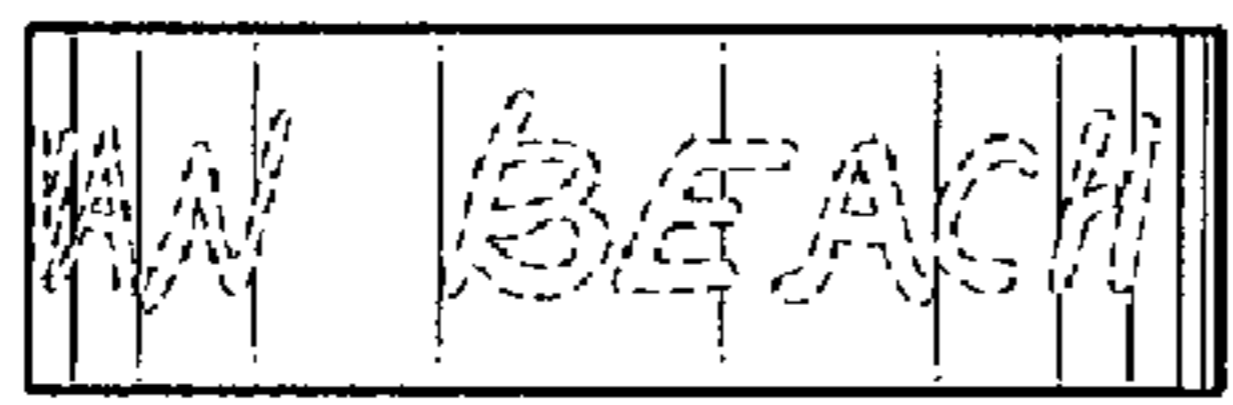
