FIG. 2 is a top plan view of the light fixture in accordance with my design;

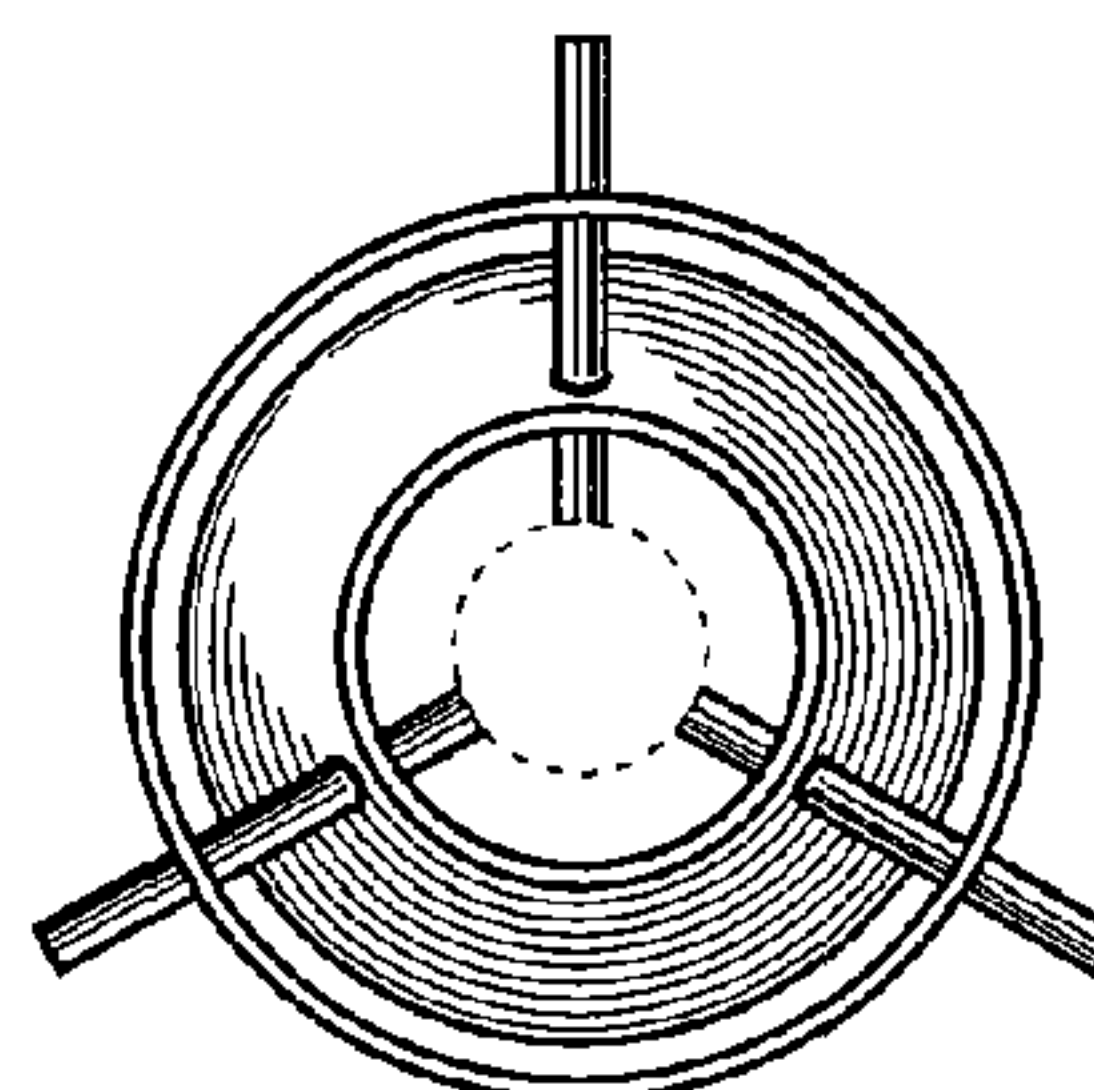
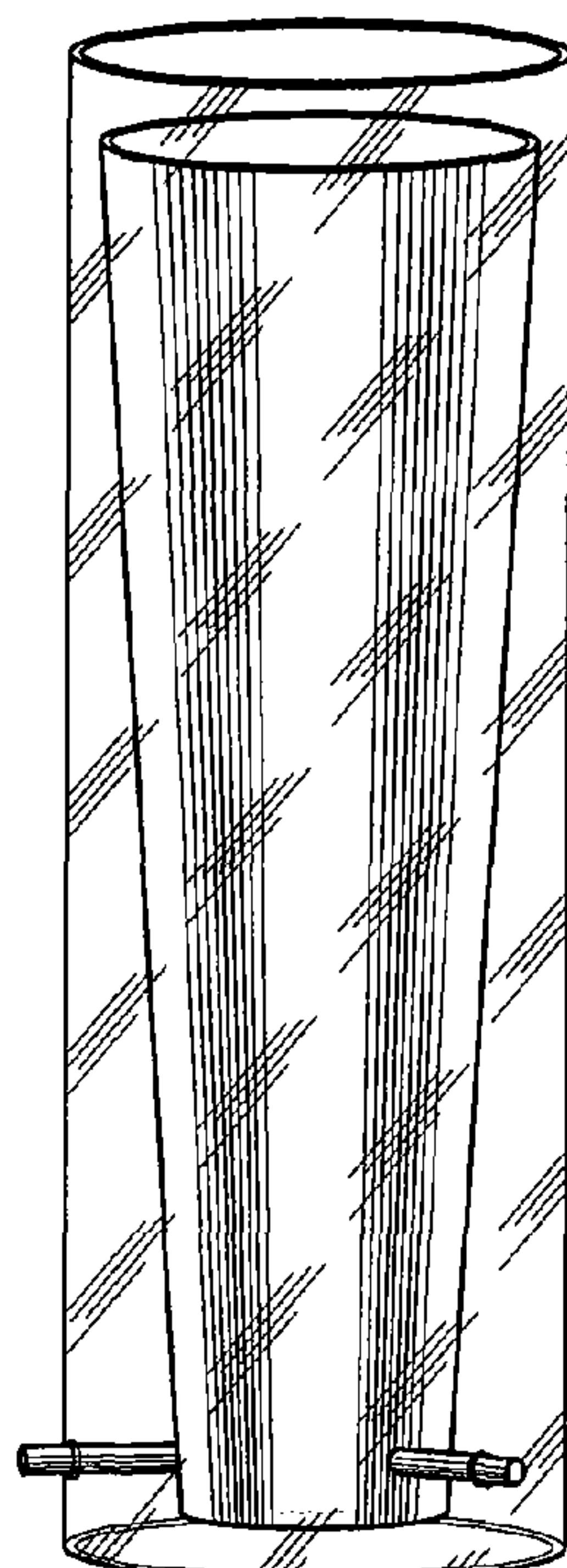
FIG. 3 is a bottom plan view of the light fixture in accordance with my design;

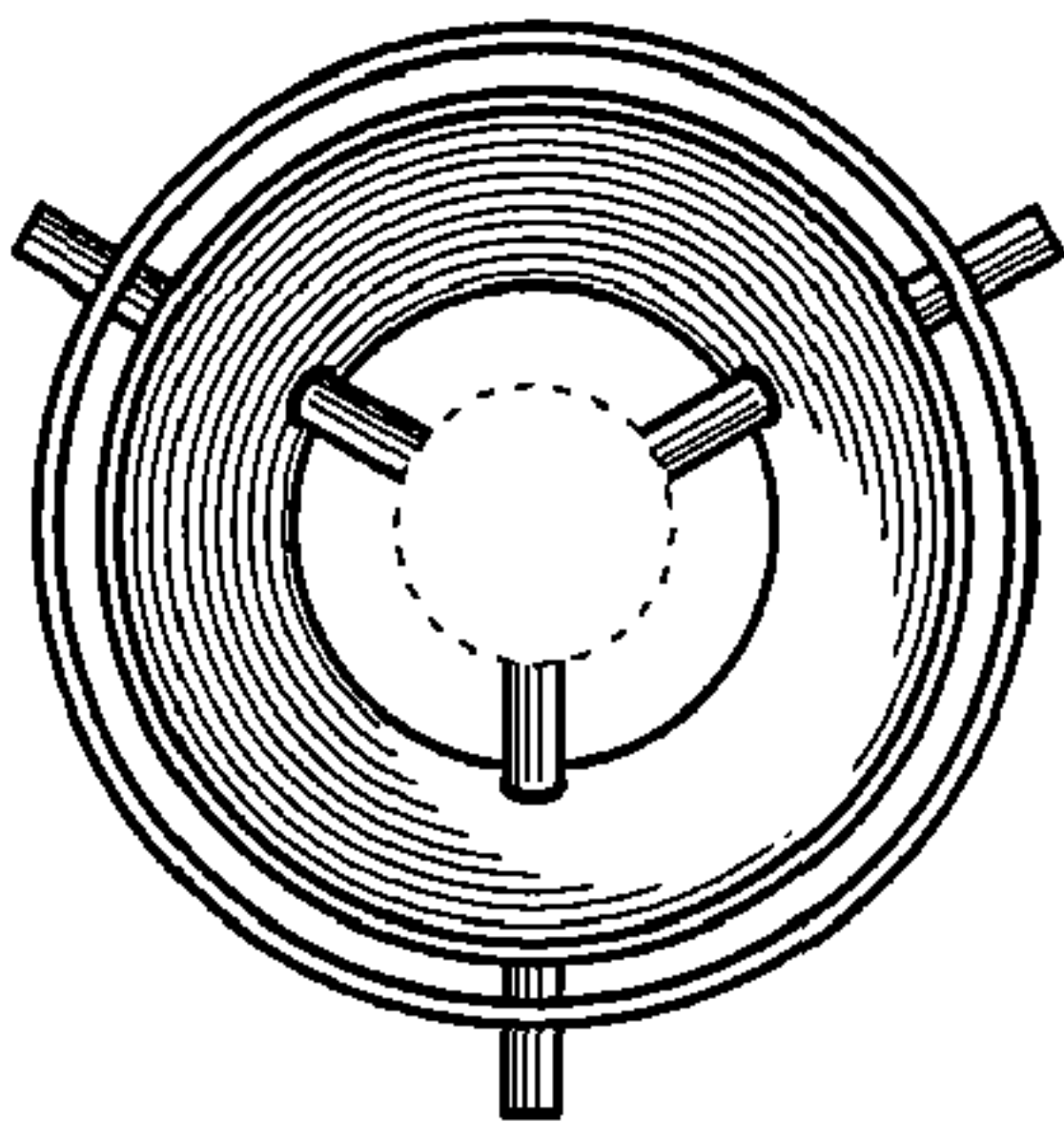

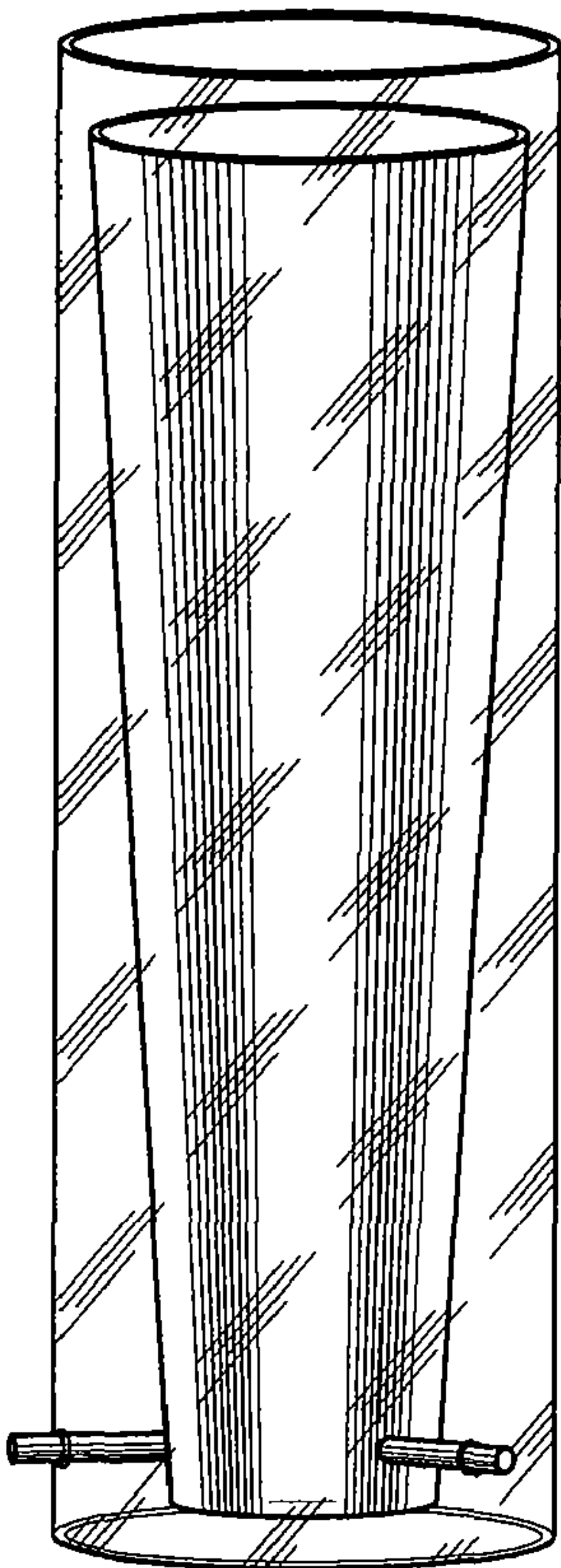

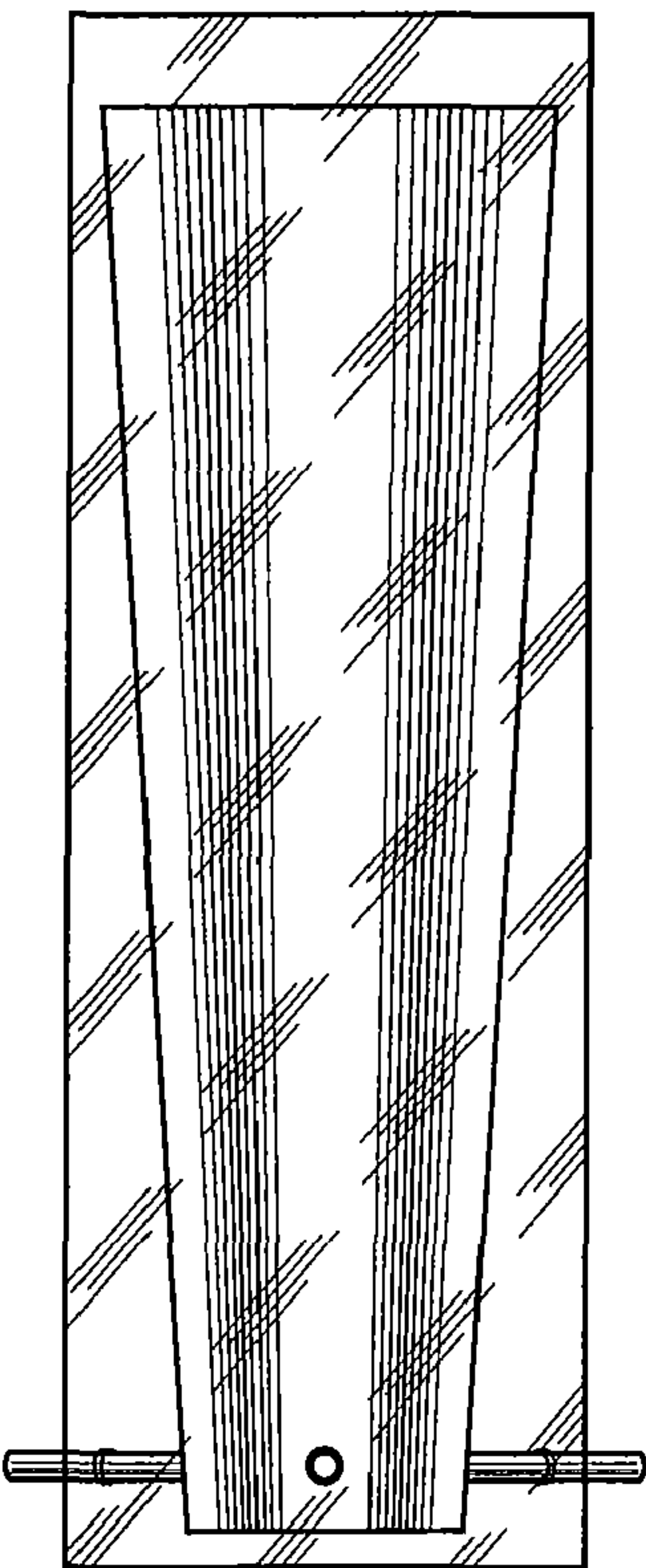

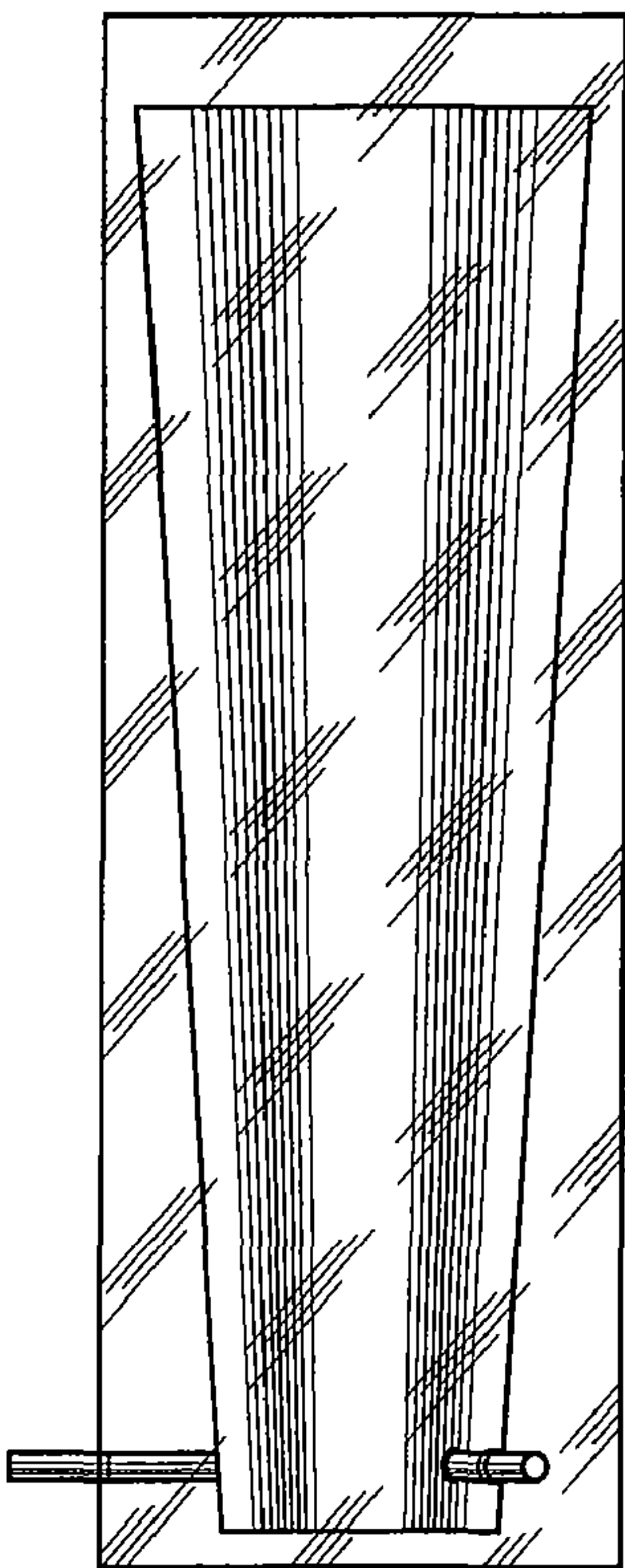

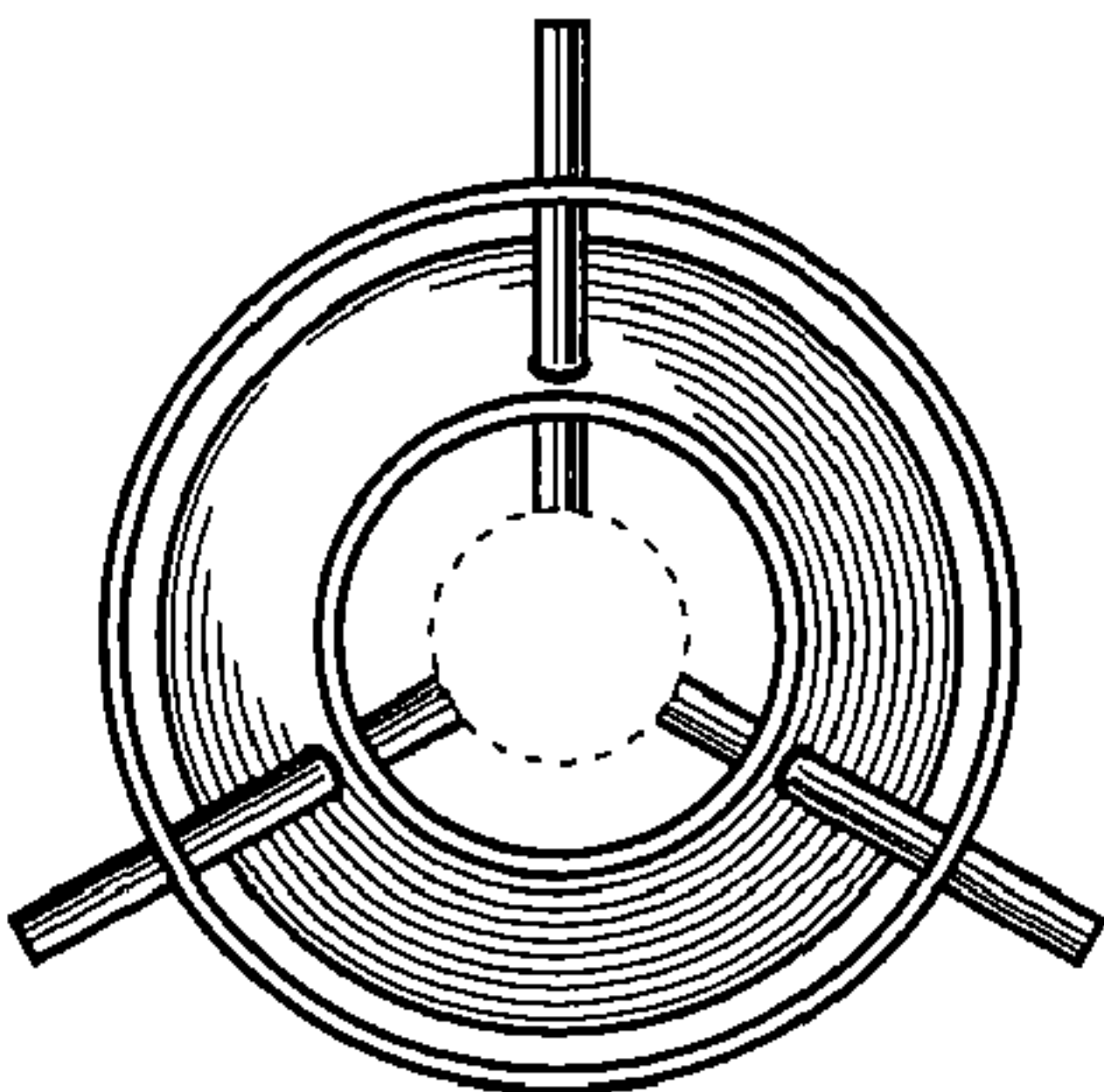
