(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a dental examination light reflector, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front, side perspective view of the dental examination light reflector;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view of the dental examination light reflector;

FIG. 3 is a side elevational view of the dental examination light reflector, the opposite side is a mirror image of this view;

FIG. 4 is a back elevational view of the dental examination light reflector;

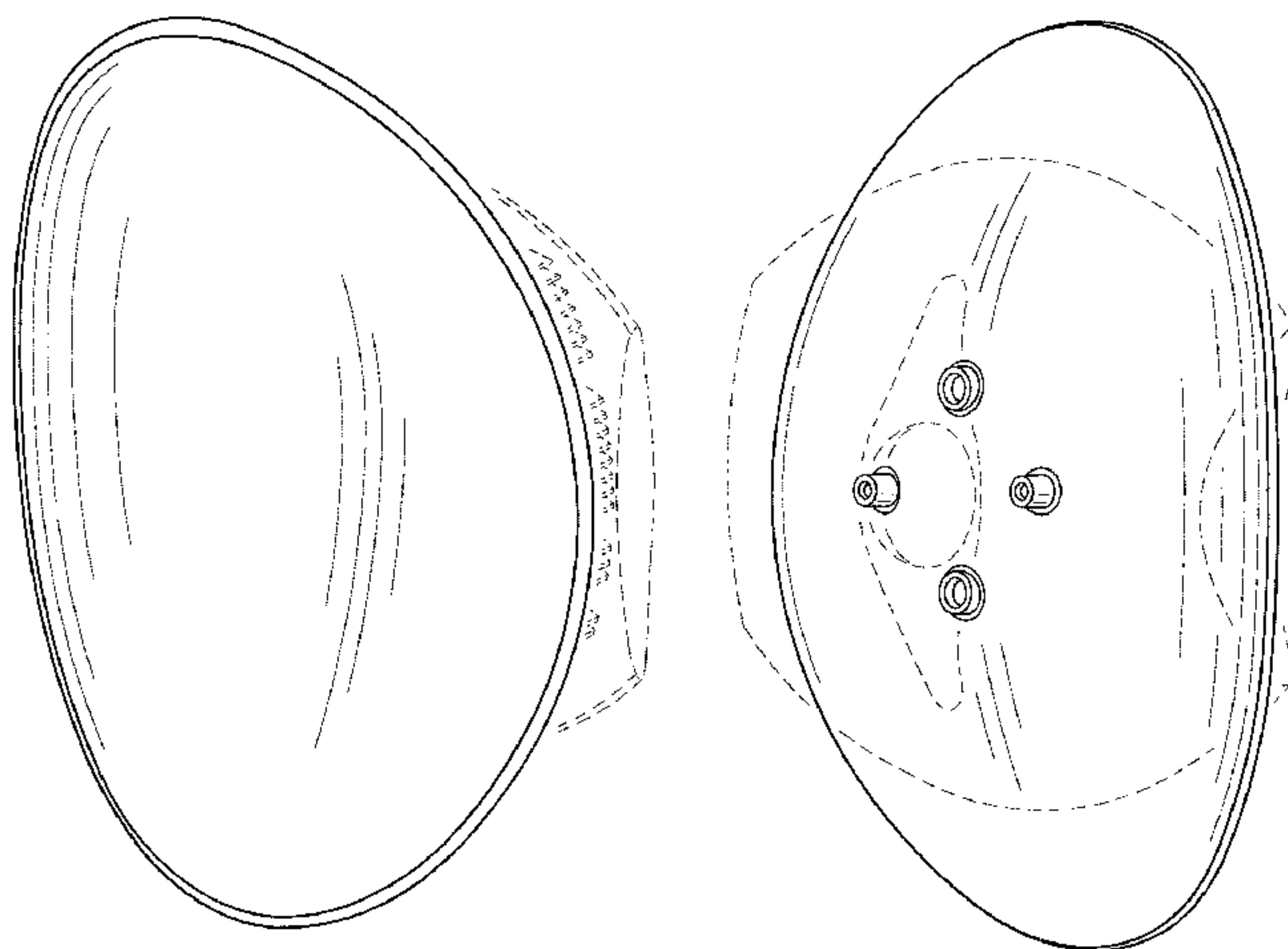
FIG. 5 is a top plan view of the dental examination light reflector, the bottom plan view is a mirror image of the top end plan view;

FIG. 6 is a back perspective view of the dental examination light reflector; and,

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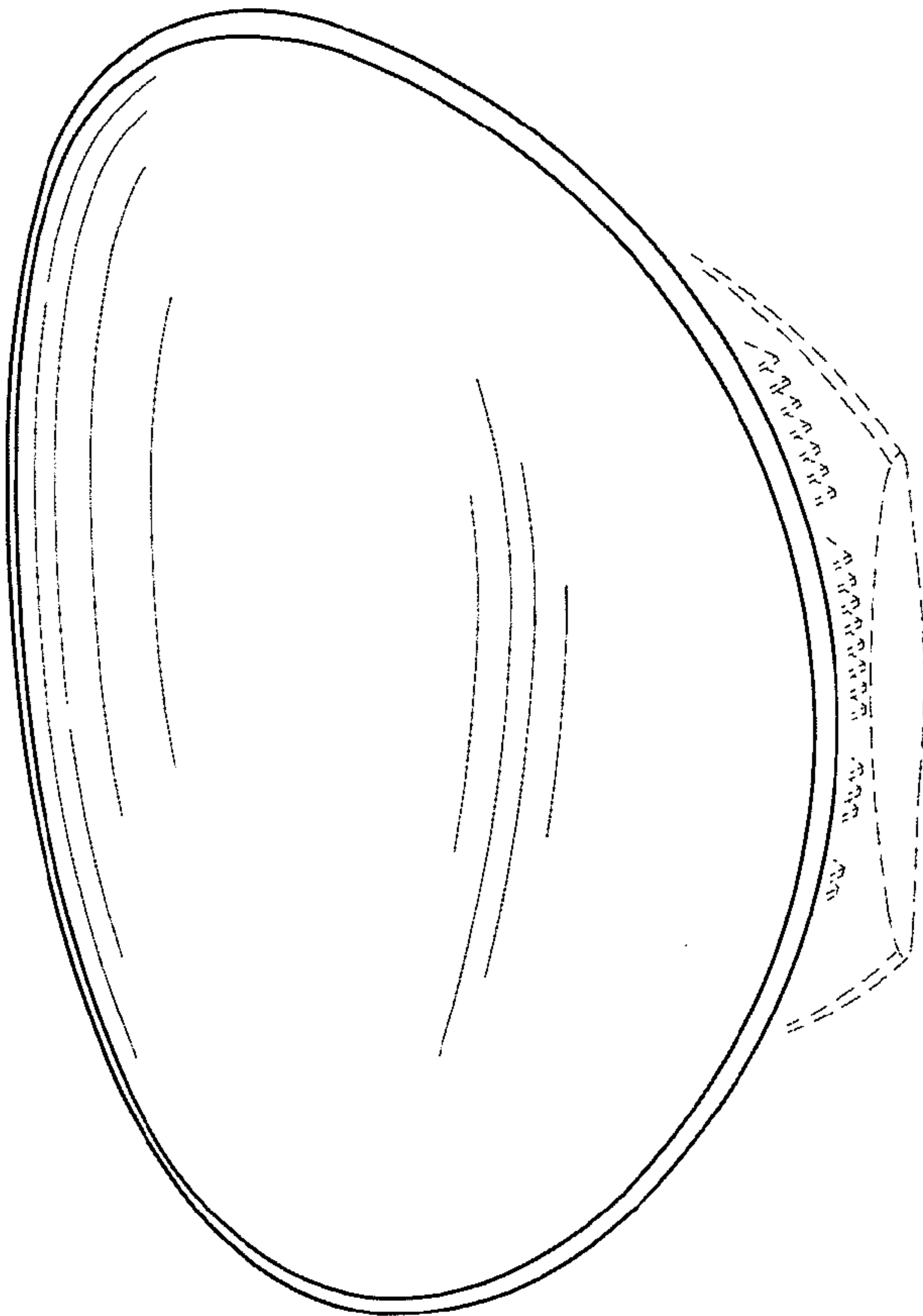

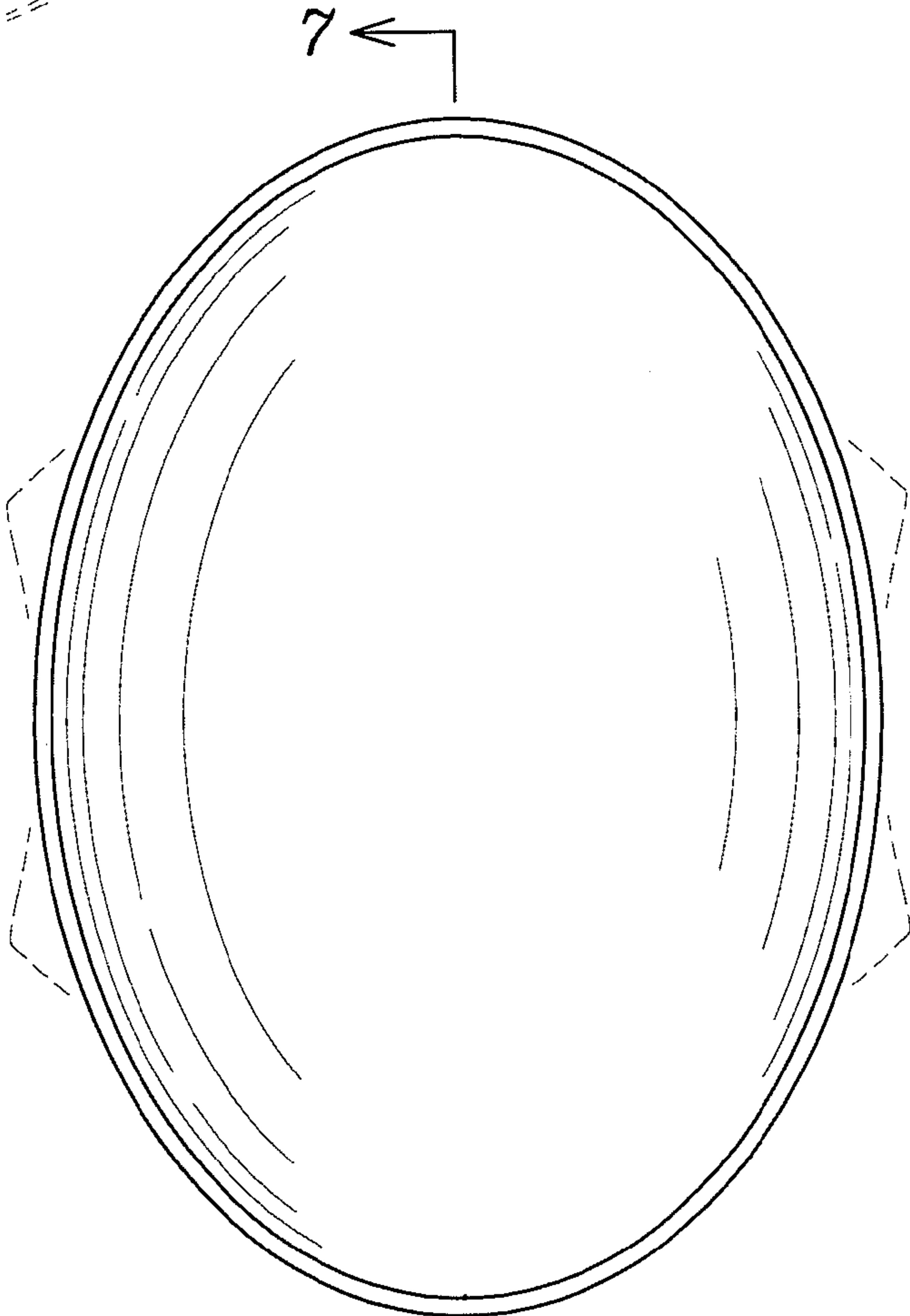

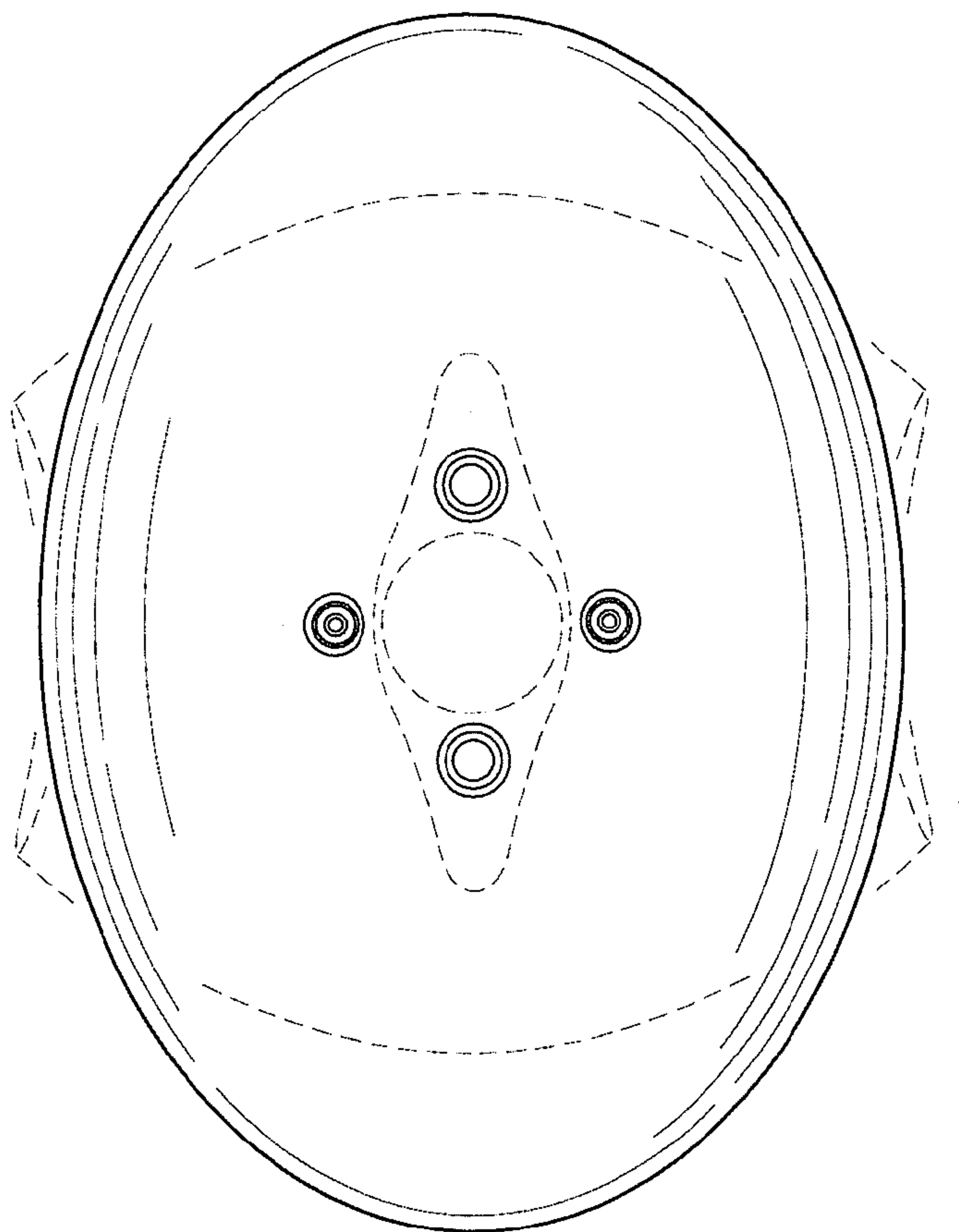

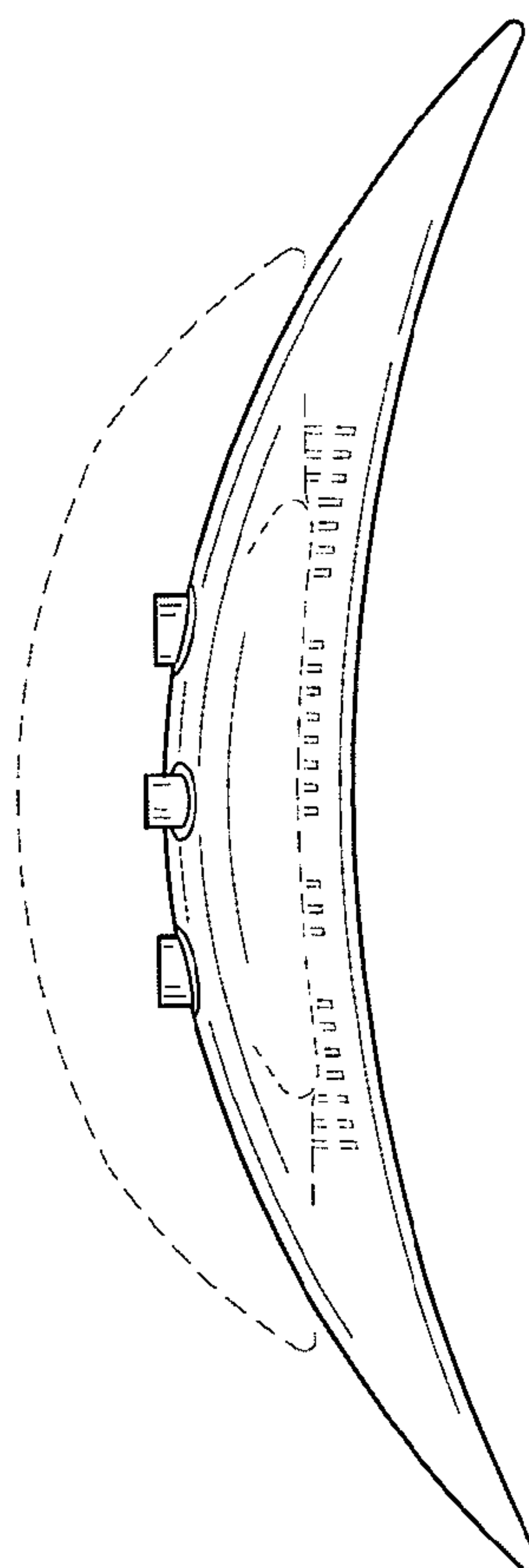

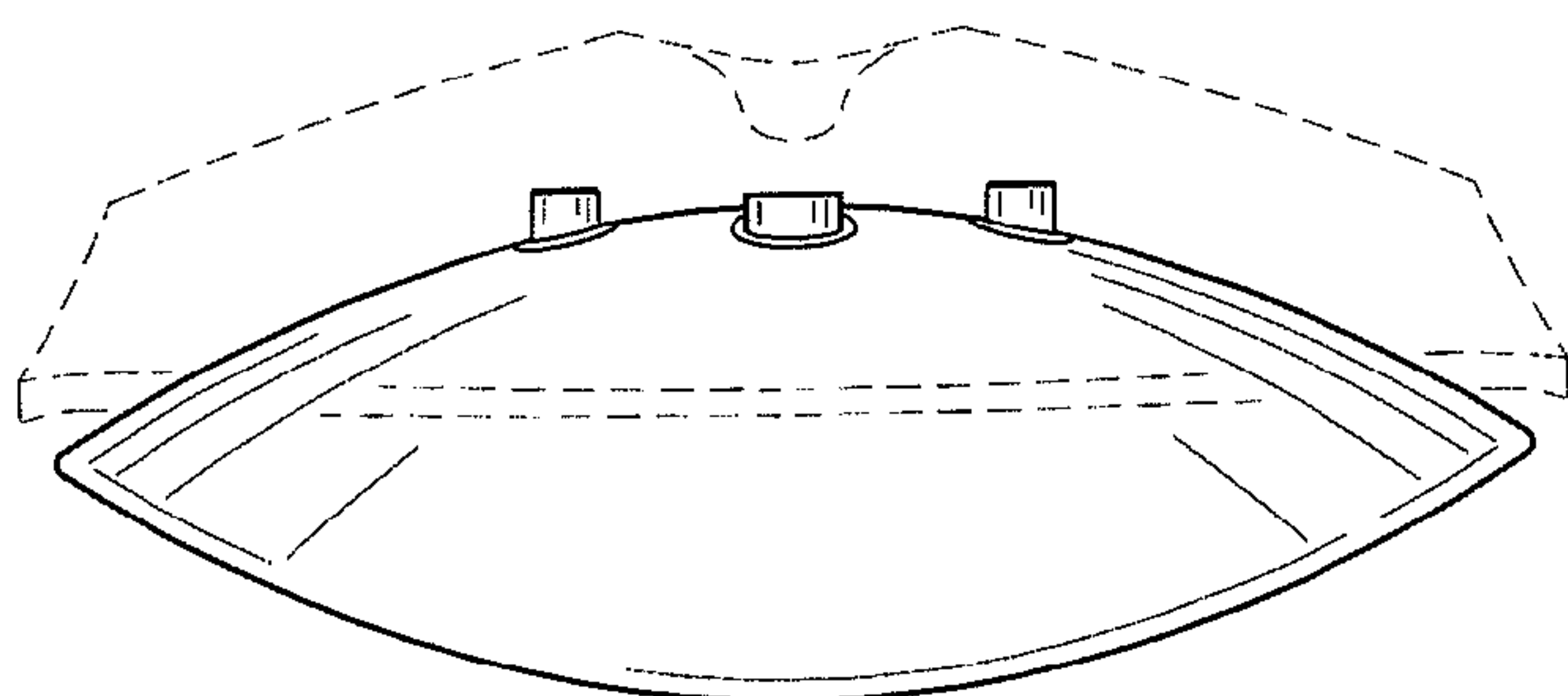

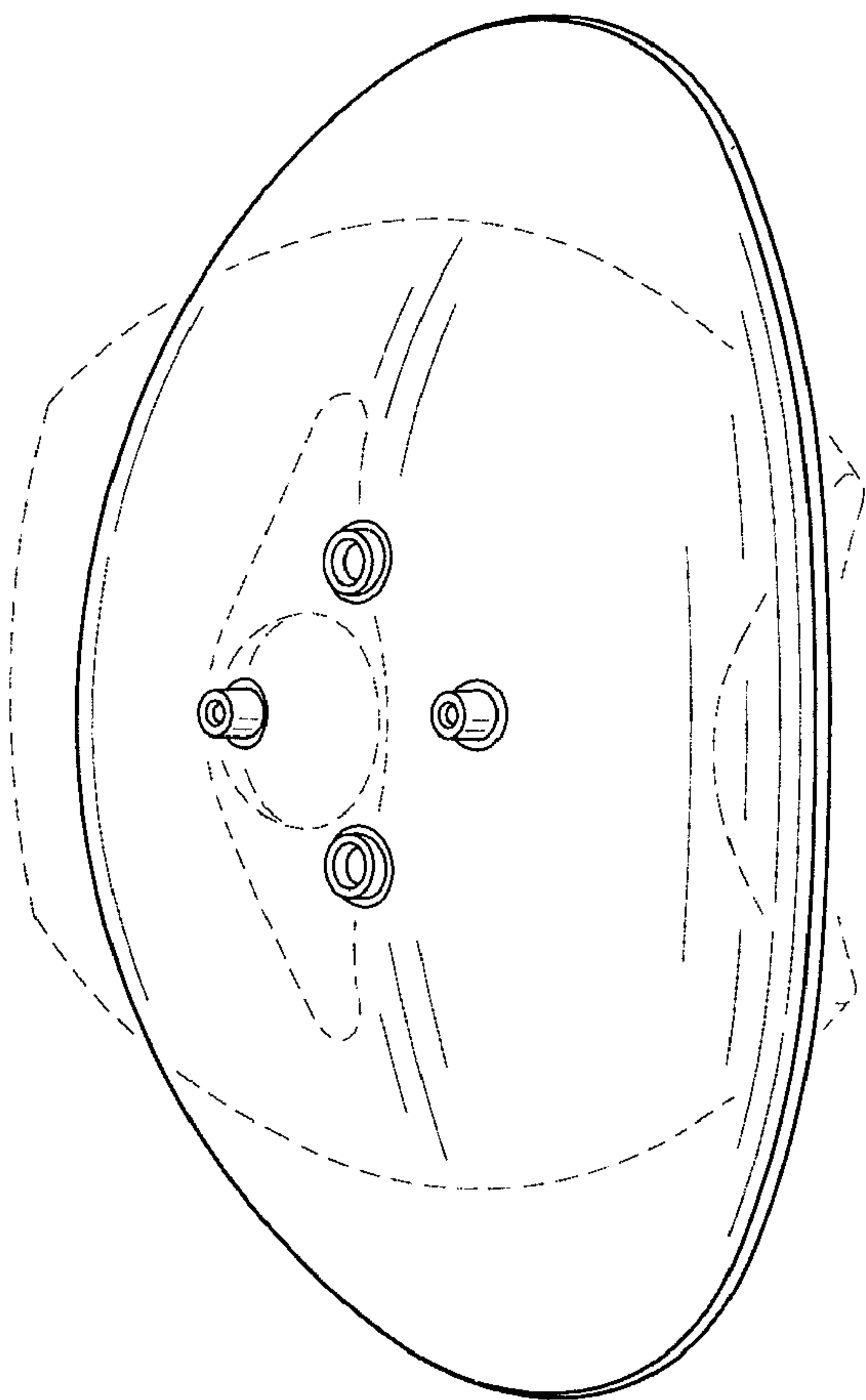

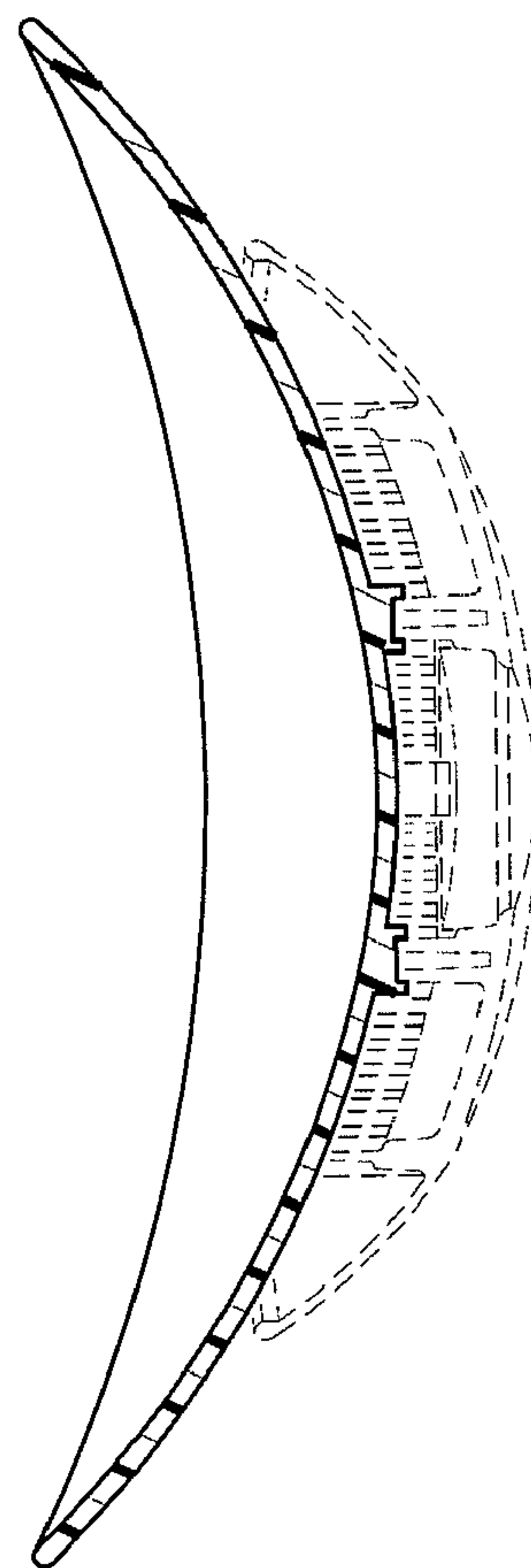
