FIG. 5 is a right side elevation view of the buggy;

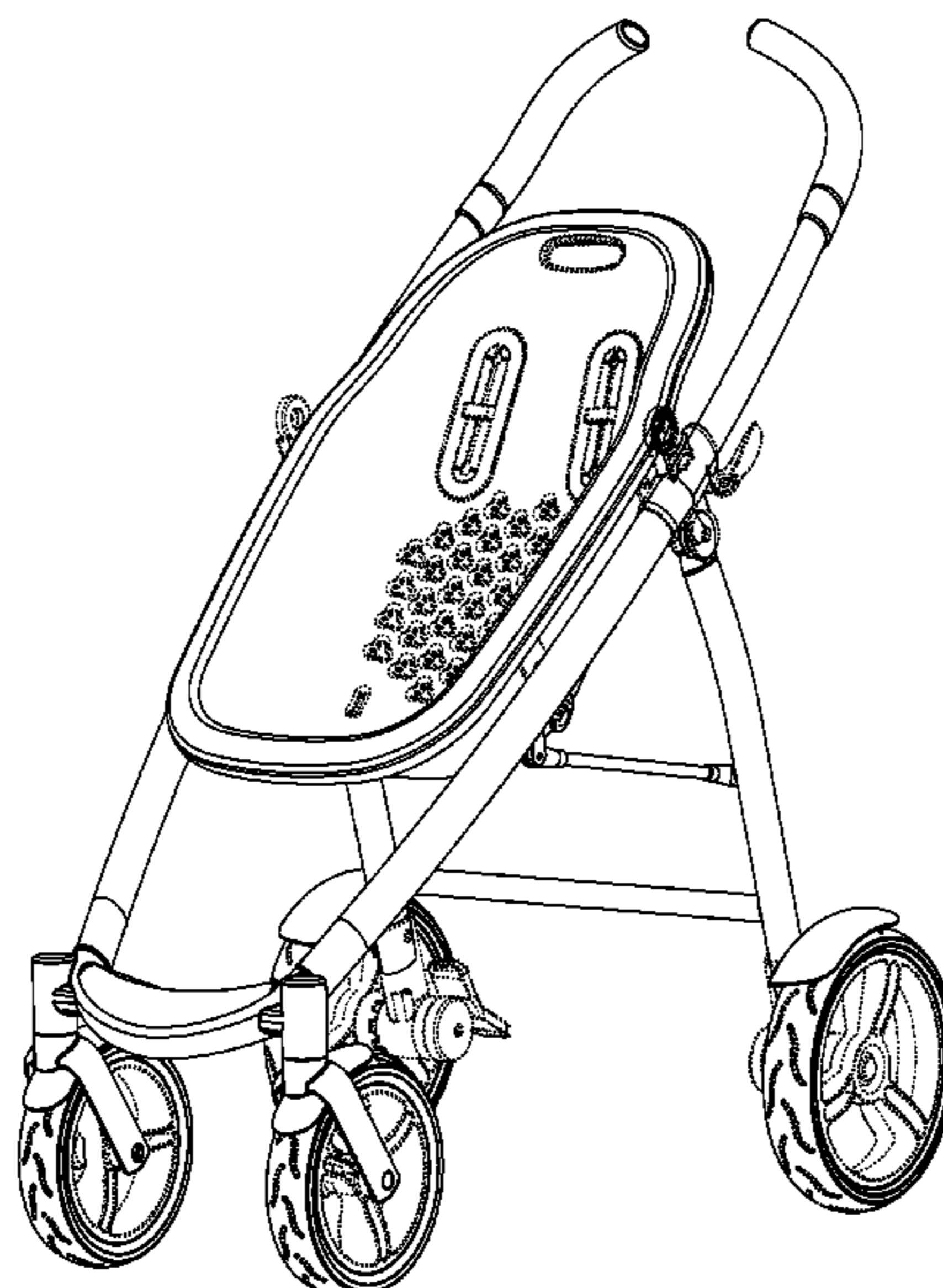
FIG. 6 is a top plan view of the buggy; and,

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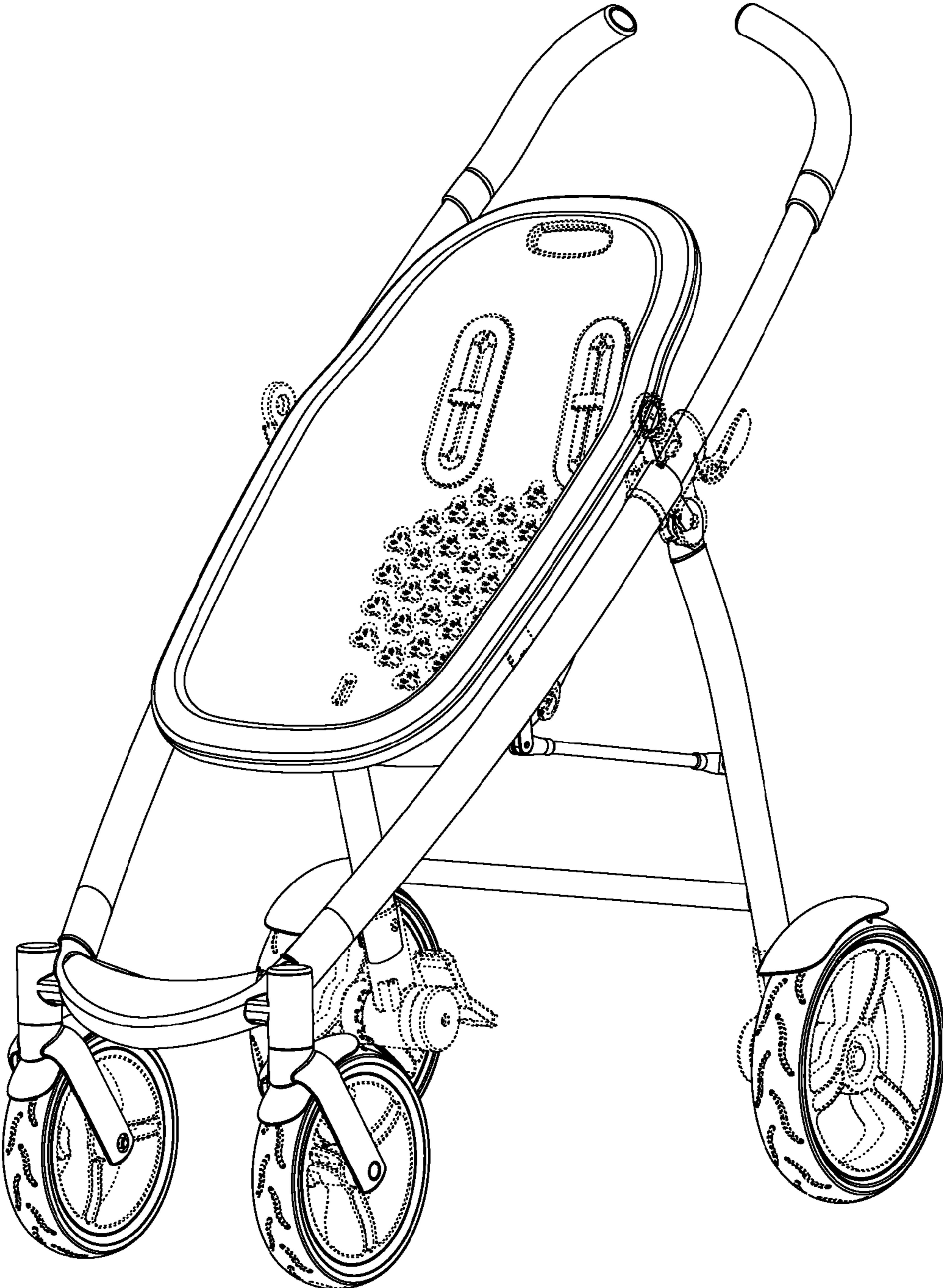

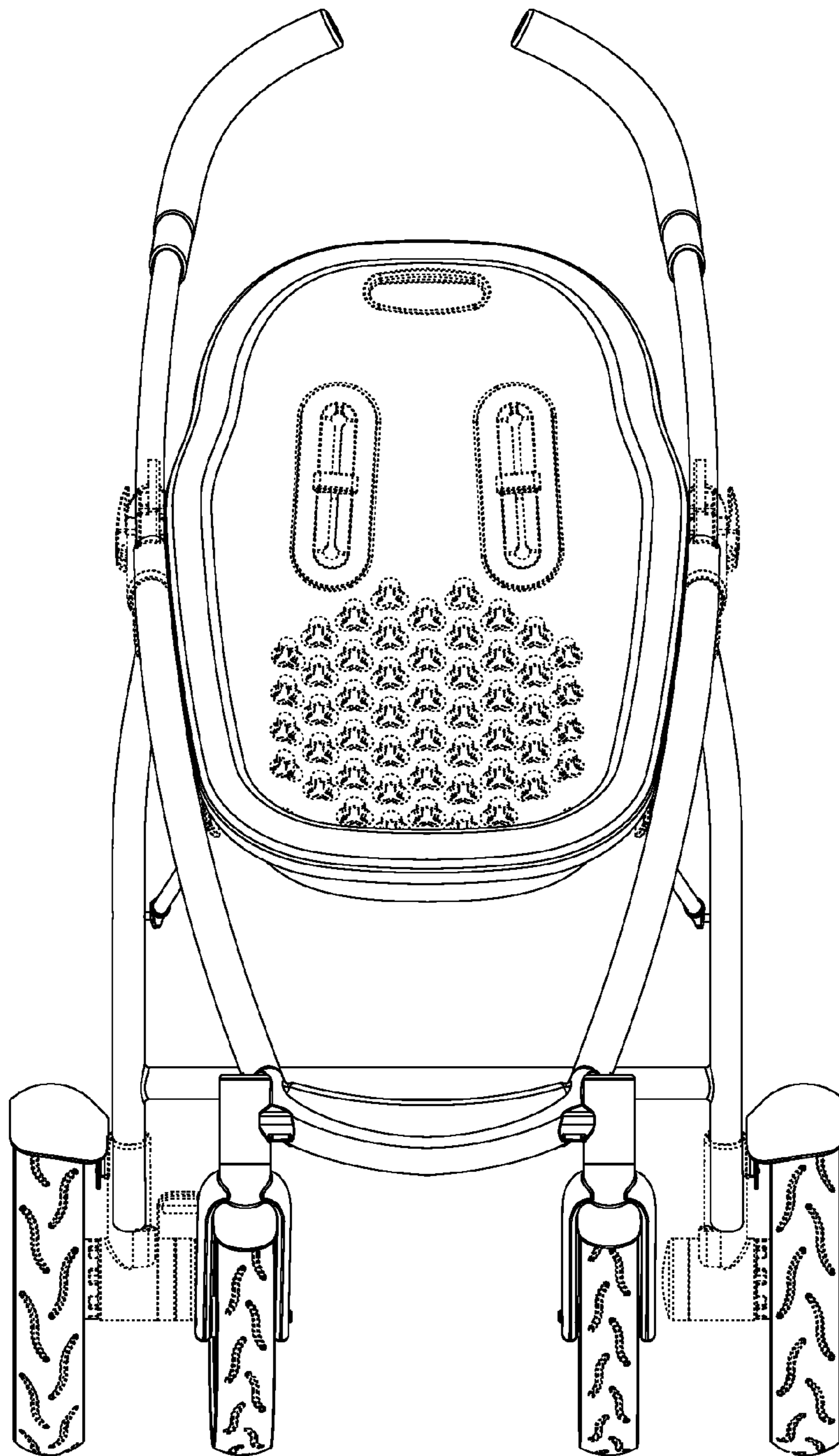

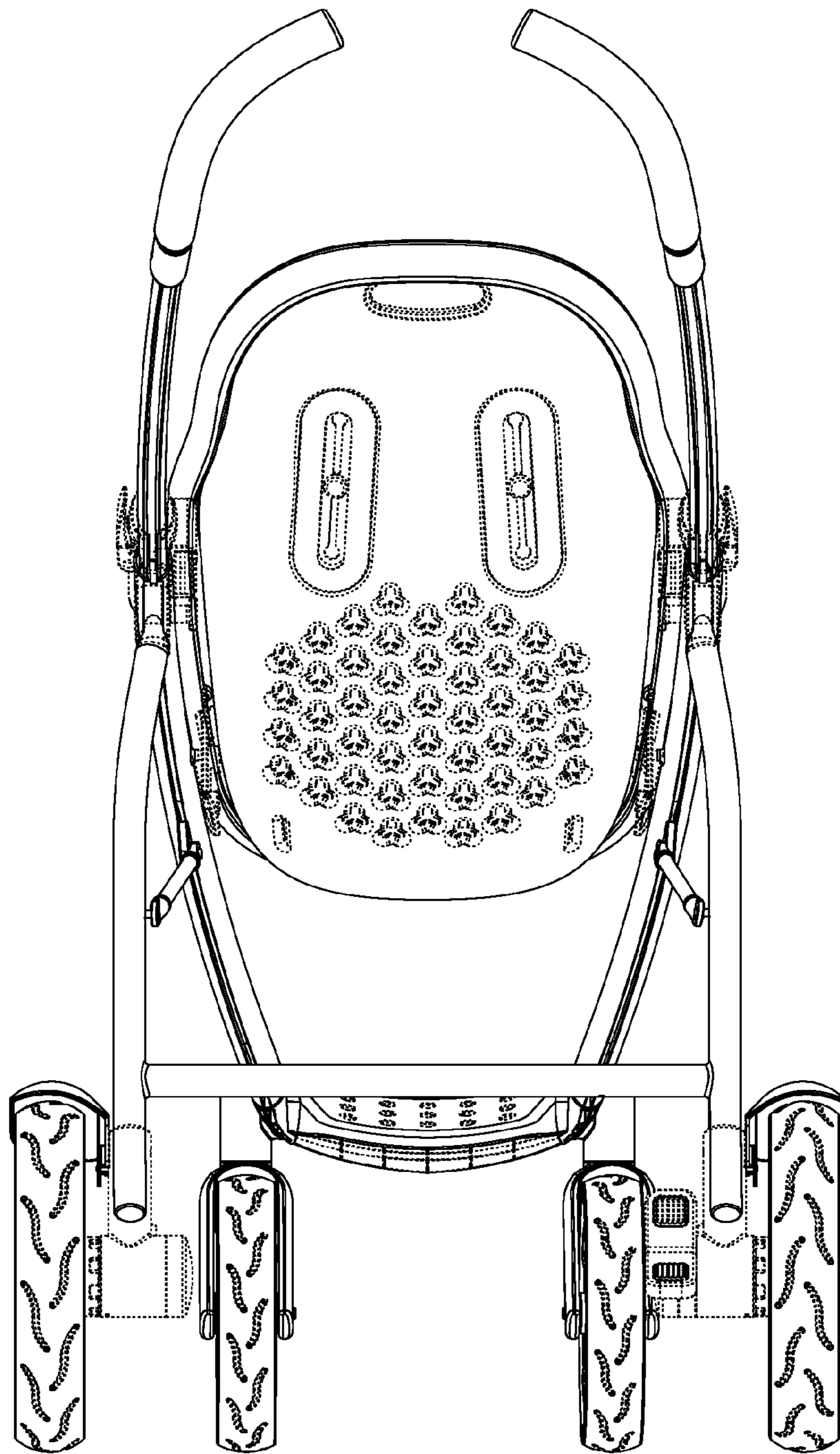

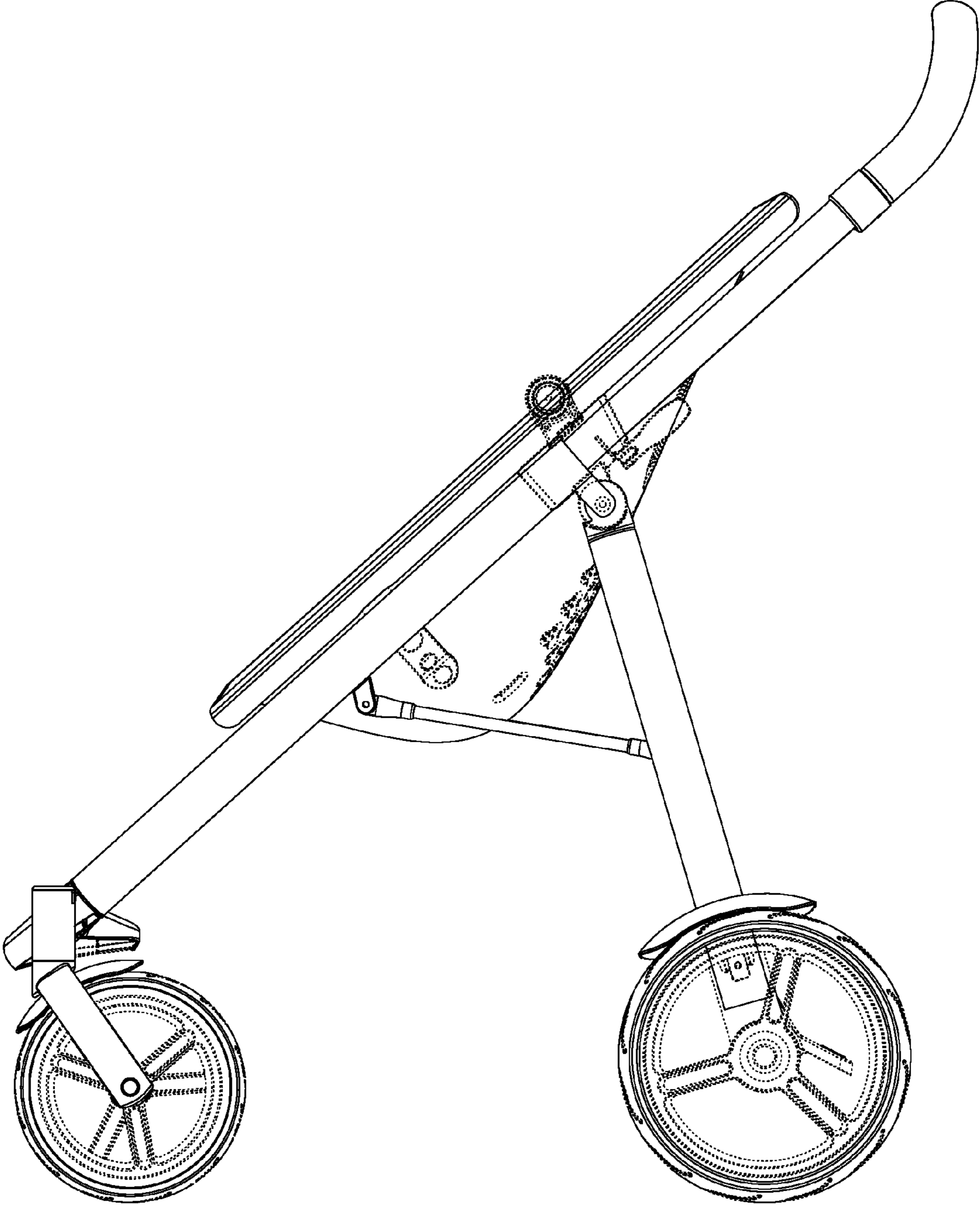

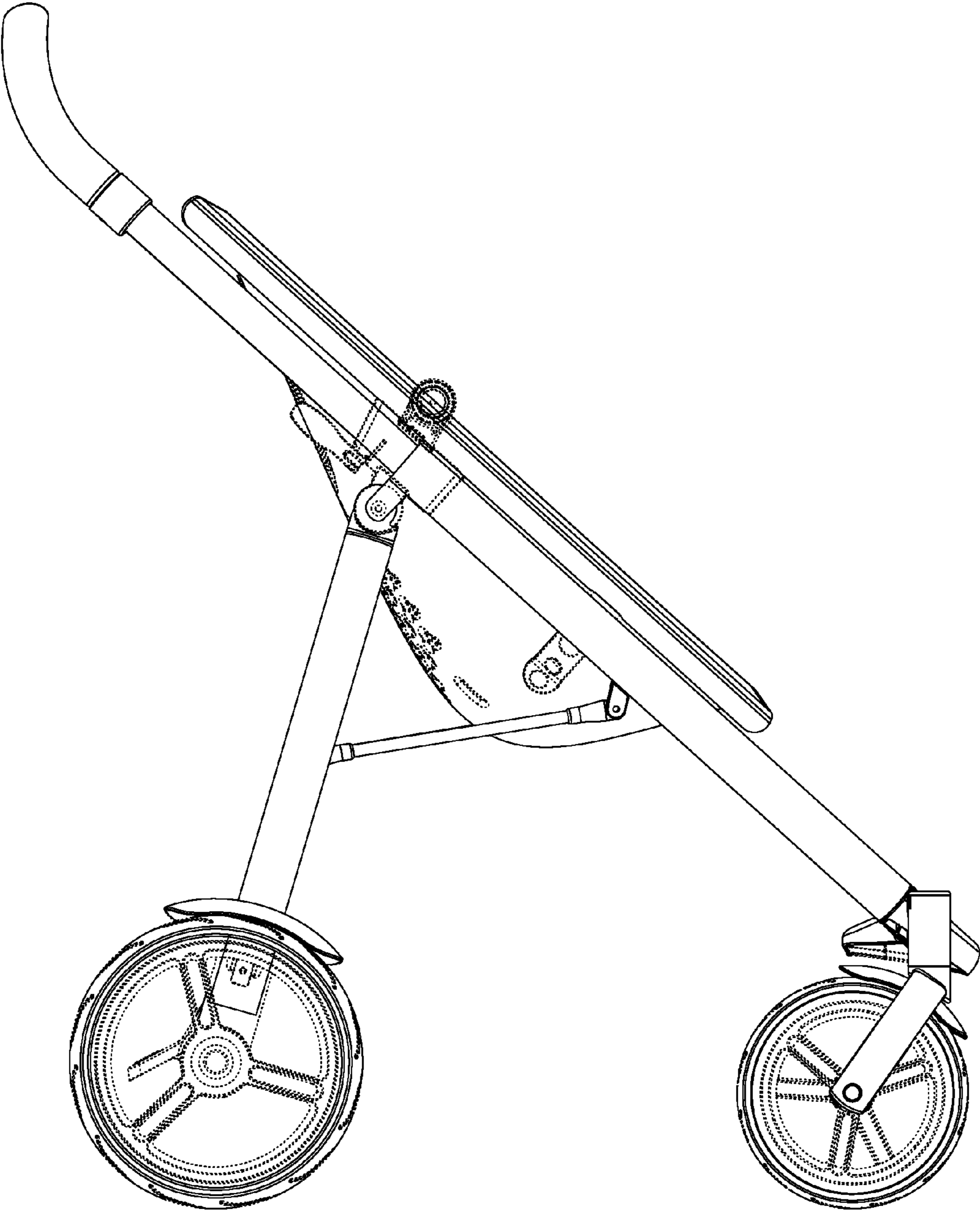

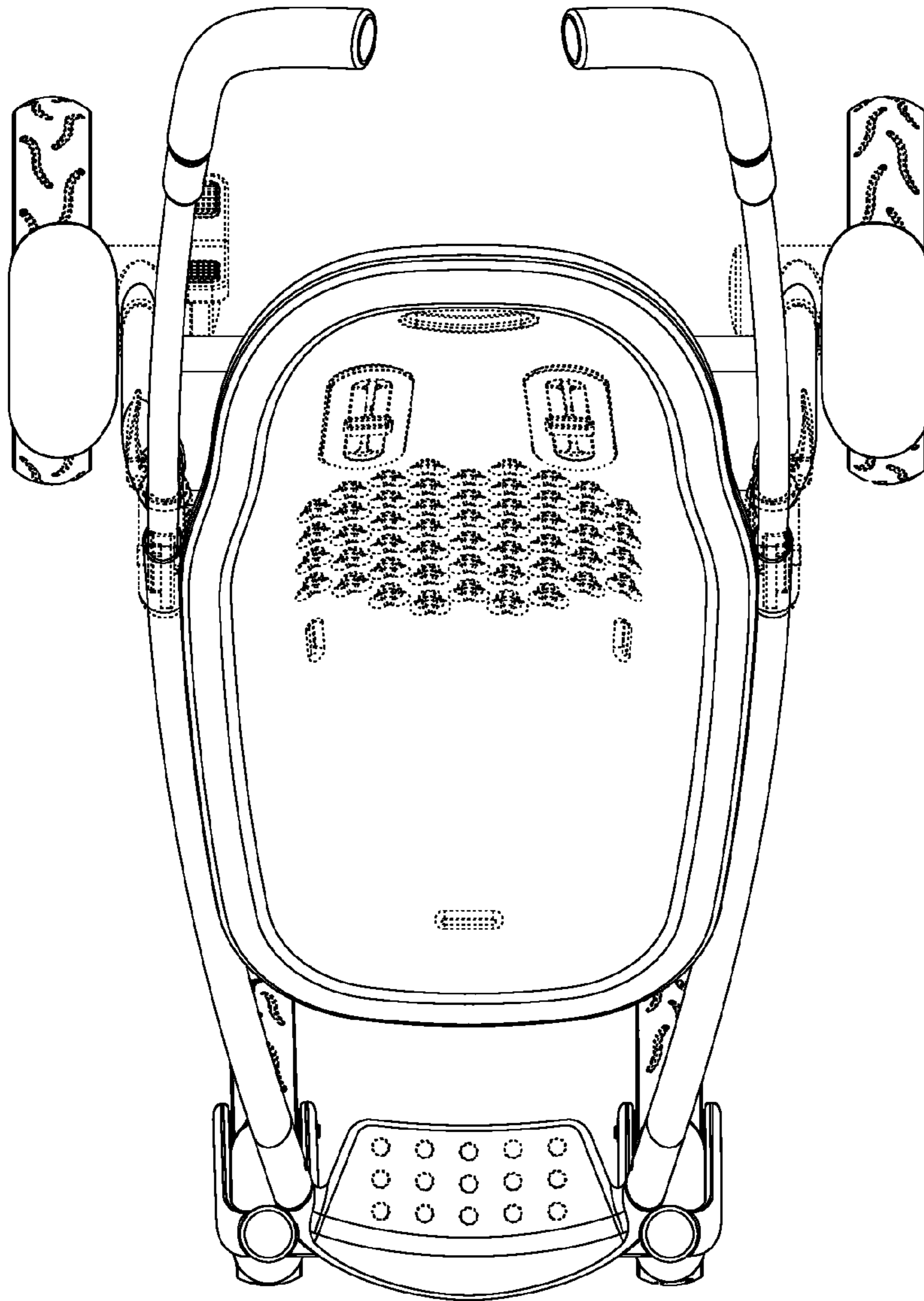

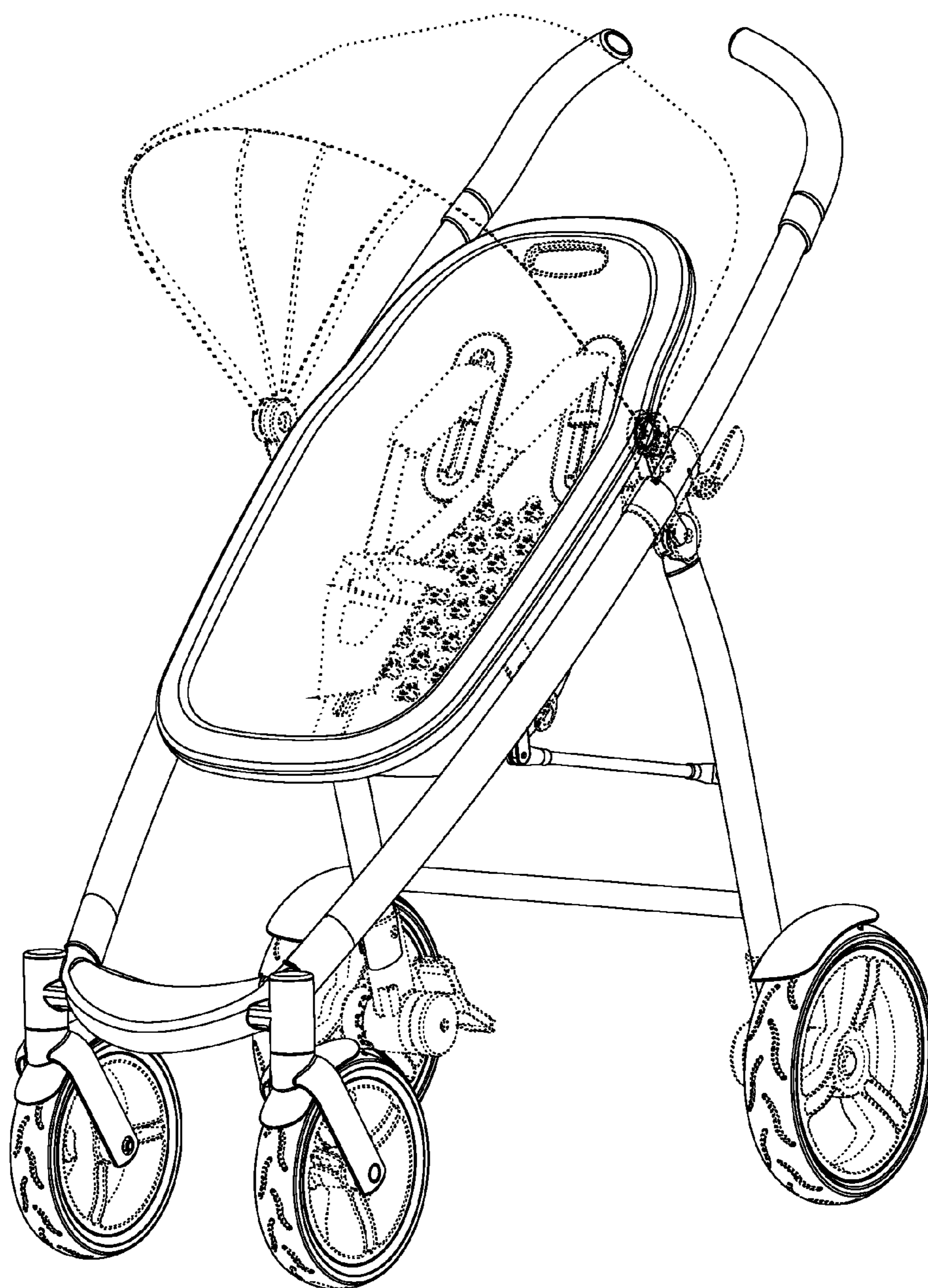
