(57) **CLAIM**

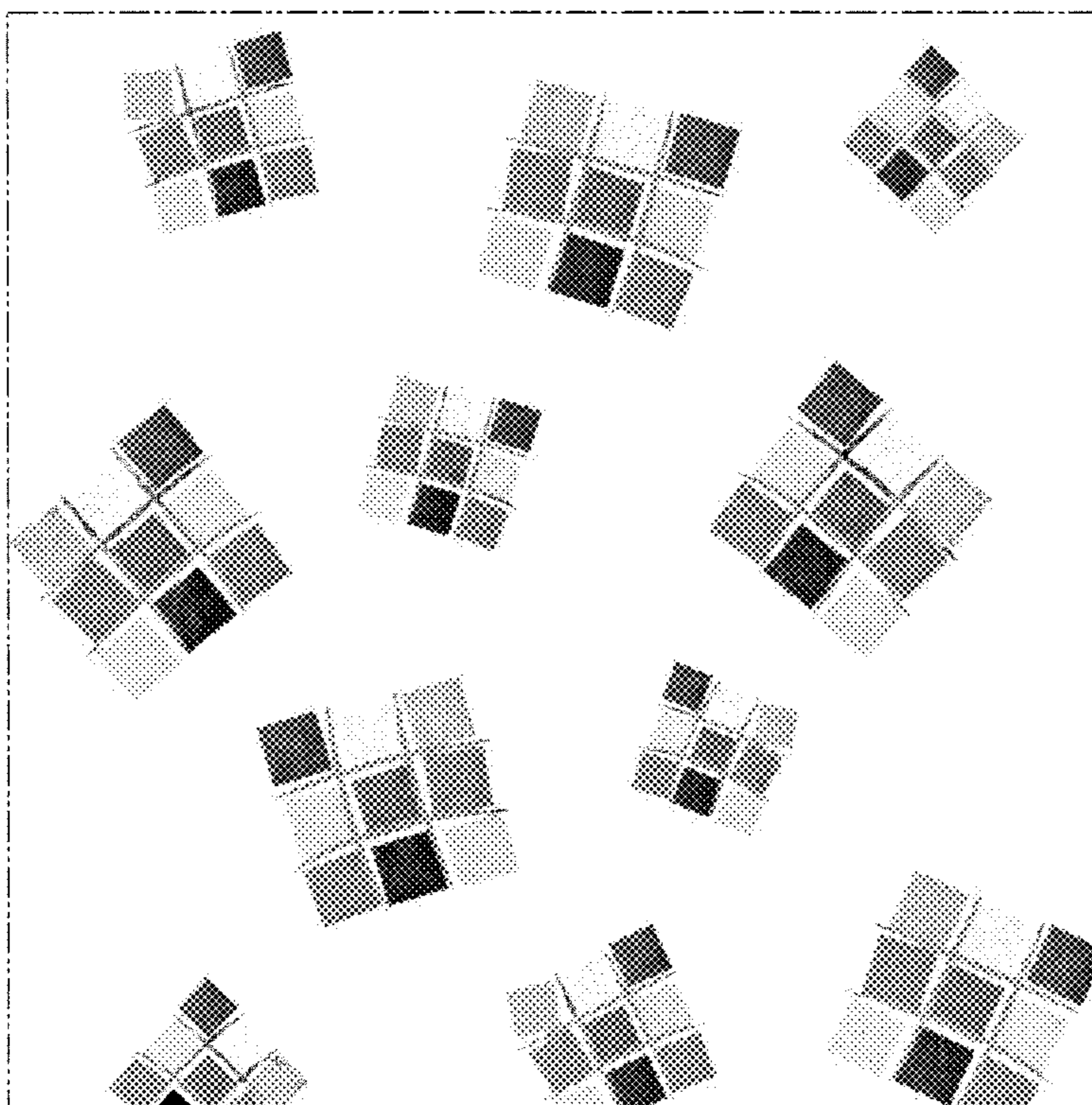
The ornamental design for a paper product, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of one repeat unit of a paper product showing my new design. The broken lines indicate that the design repeats uniformly throughout the length and width of a paper product, such as a paper towel or tissue product. A specific length and width of the paper product forms no part of the claimed design; and,

FIG. 2 is a top plan view of one repeat unit of a paper product showing an alternative embodiment of my new design. The broken lines indicate that the design repeats uniformly throughout the length and width of A paper product, such as a paper towel or tissue product. A specific length and width of the paper product forms no part of the claimed design.

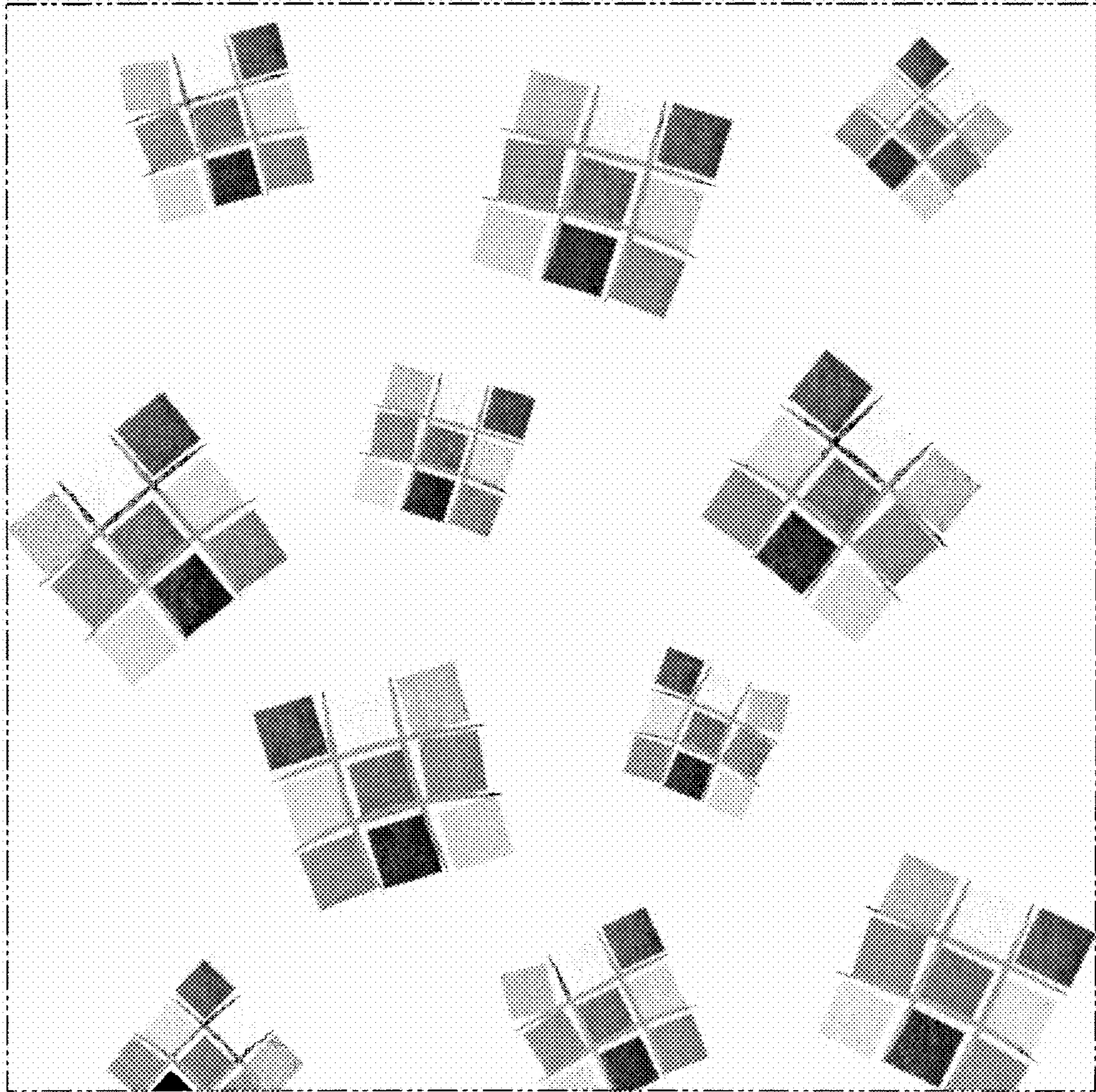

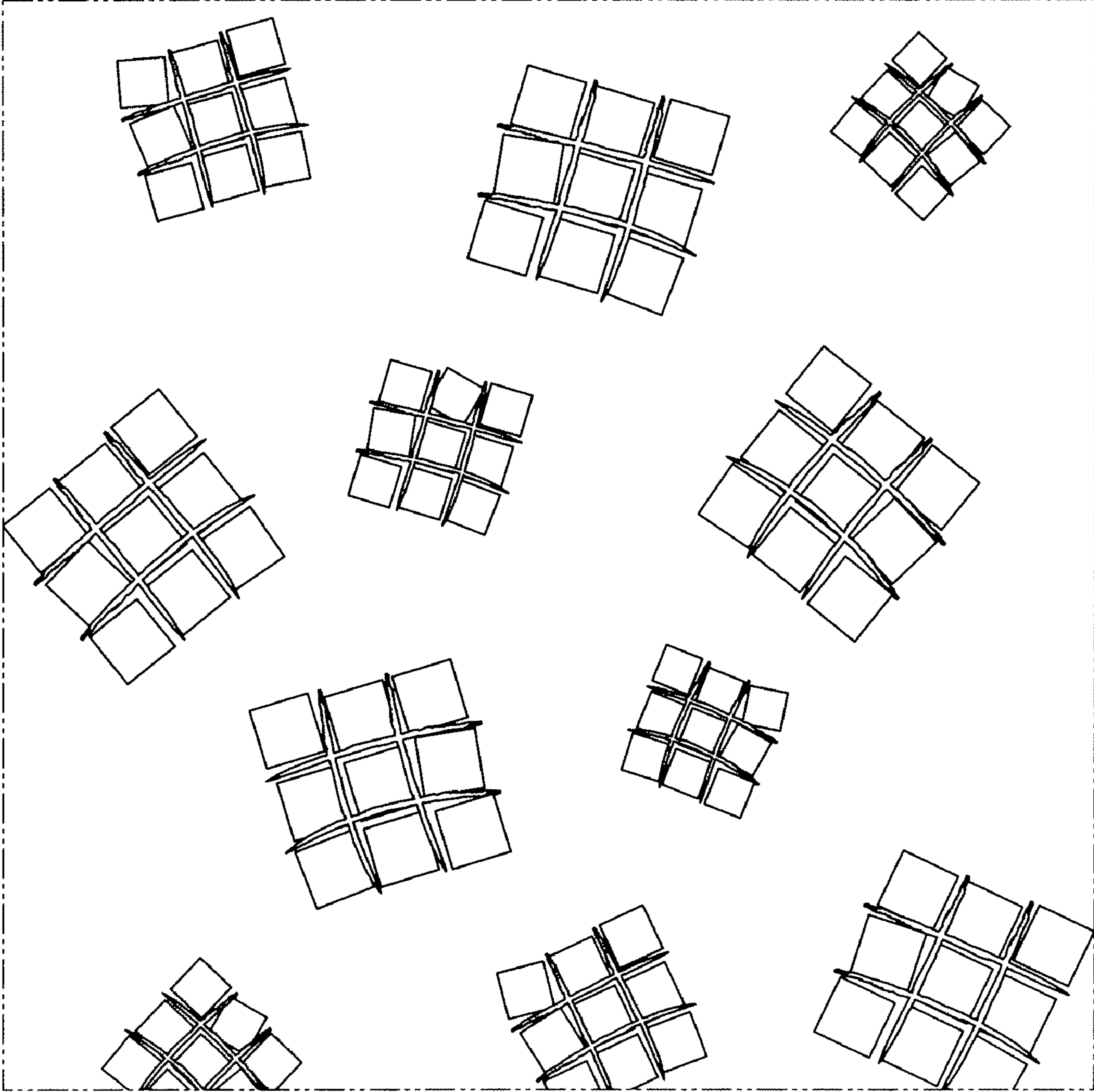
