FIG. 9 is a front view of FIG. 8;

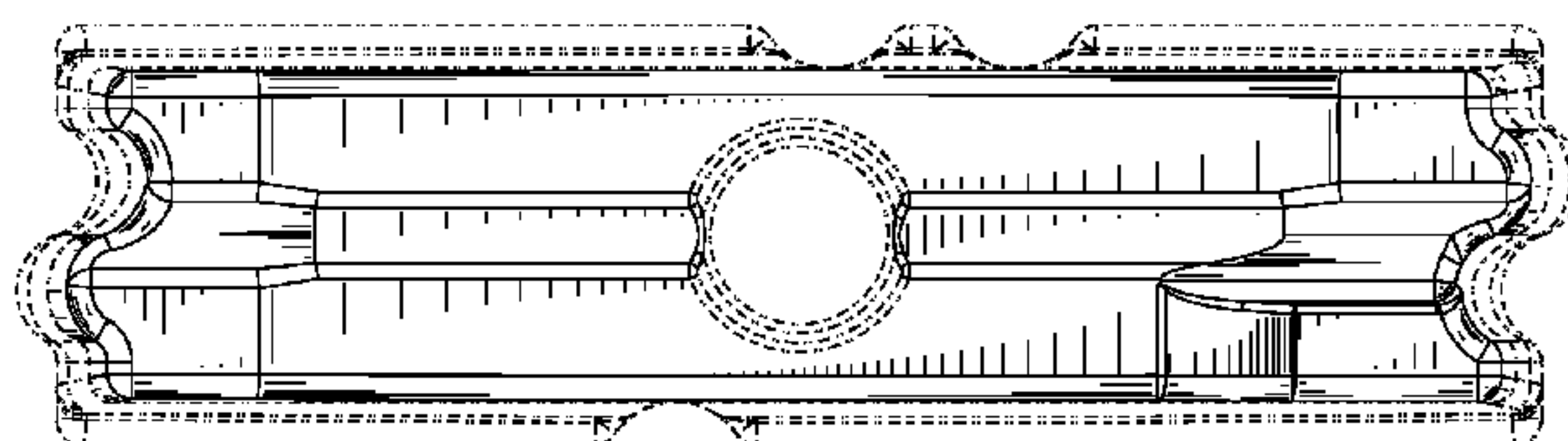
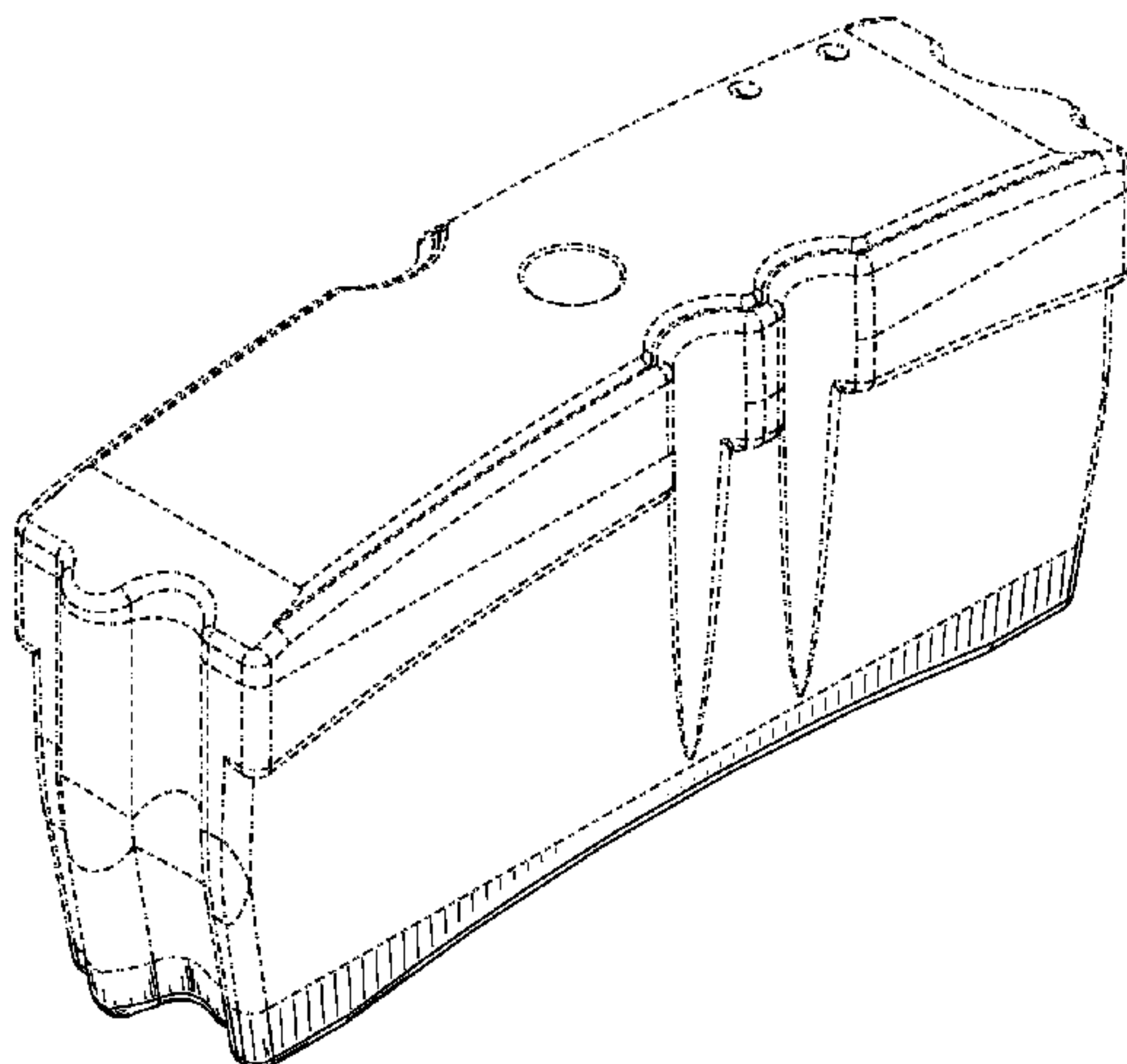
FIG. 10 is a right end view of FIG. 8;

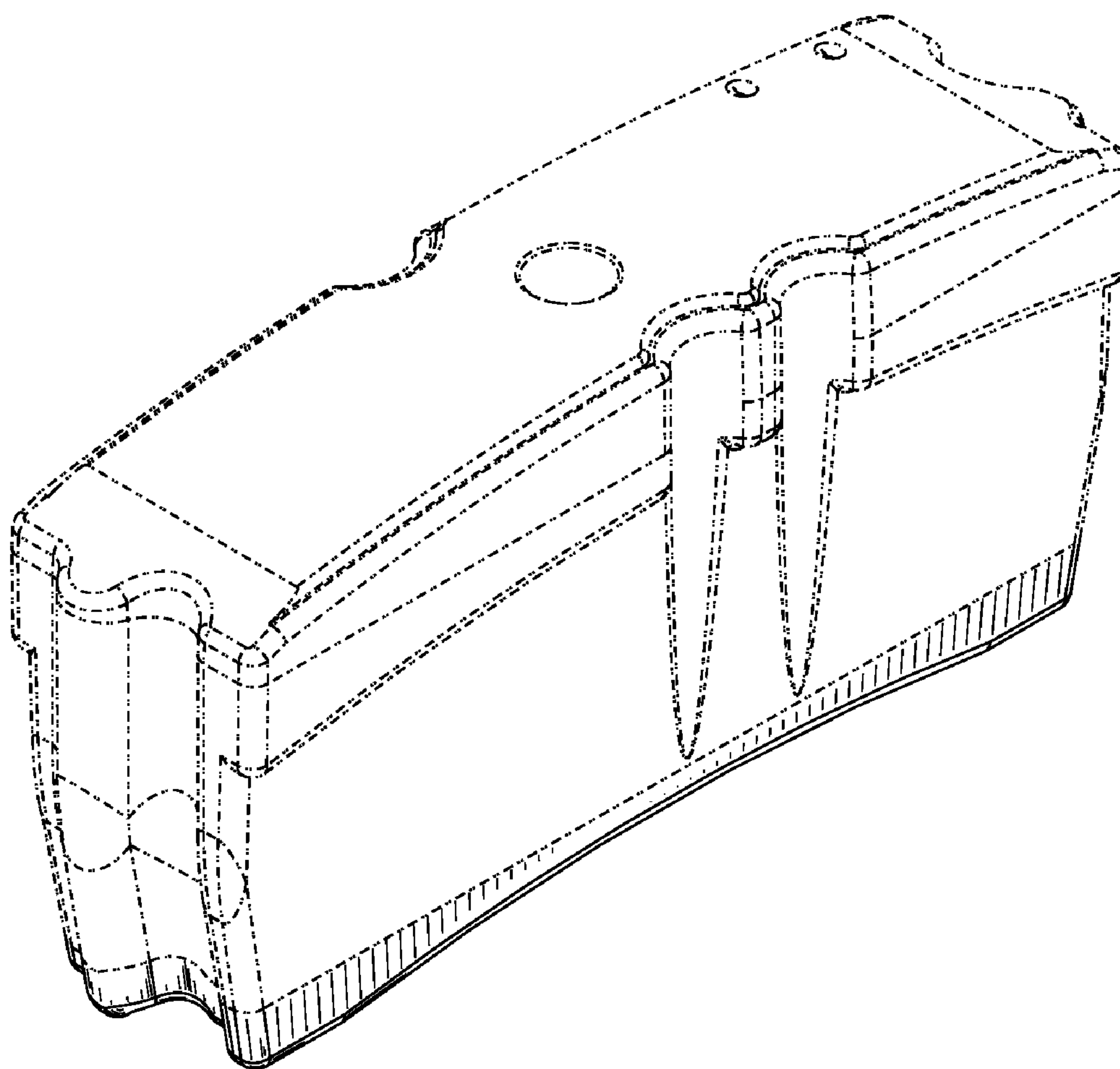

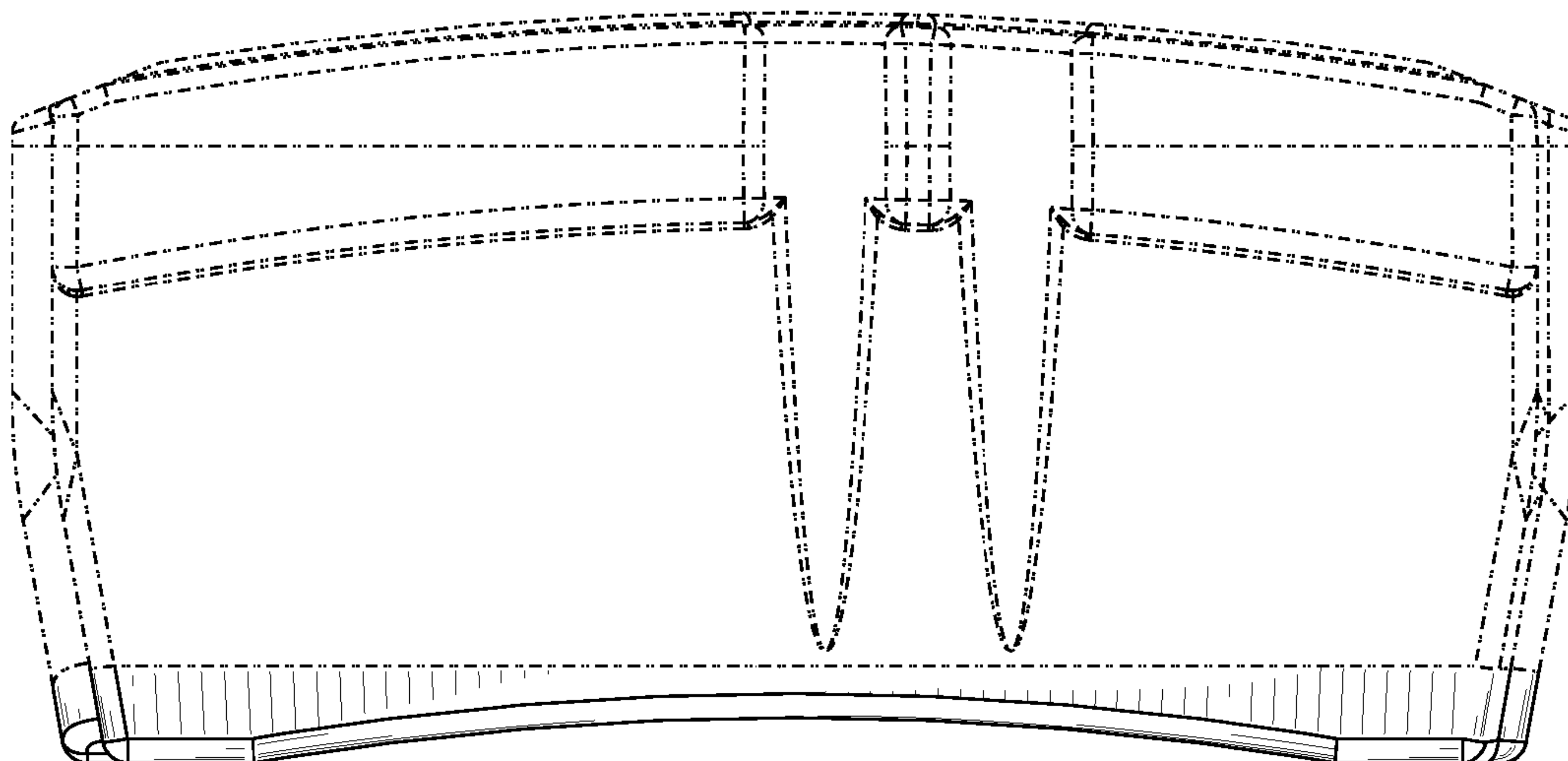

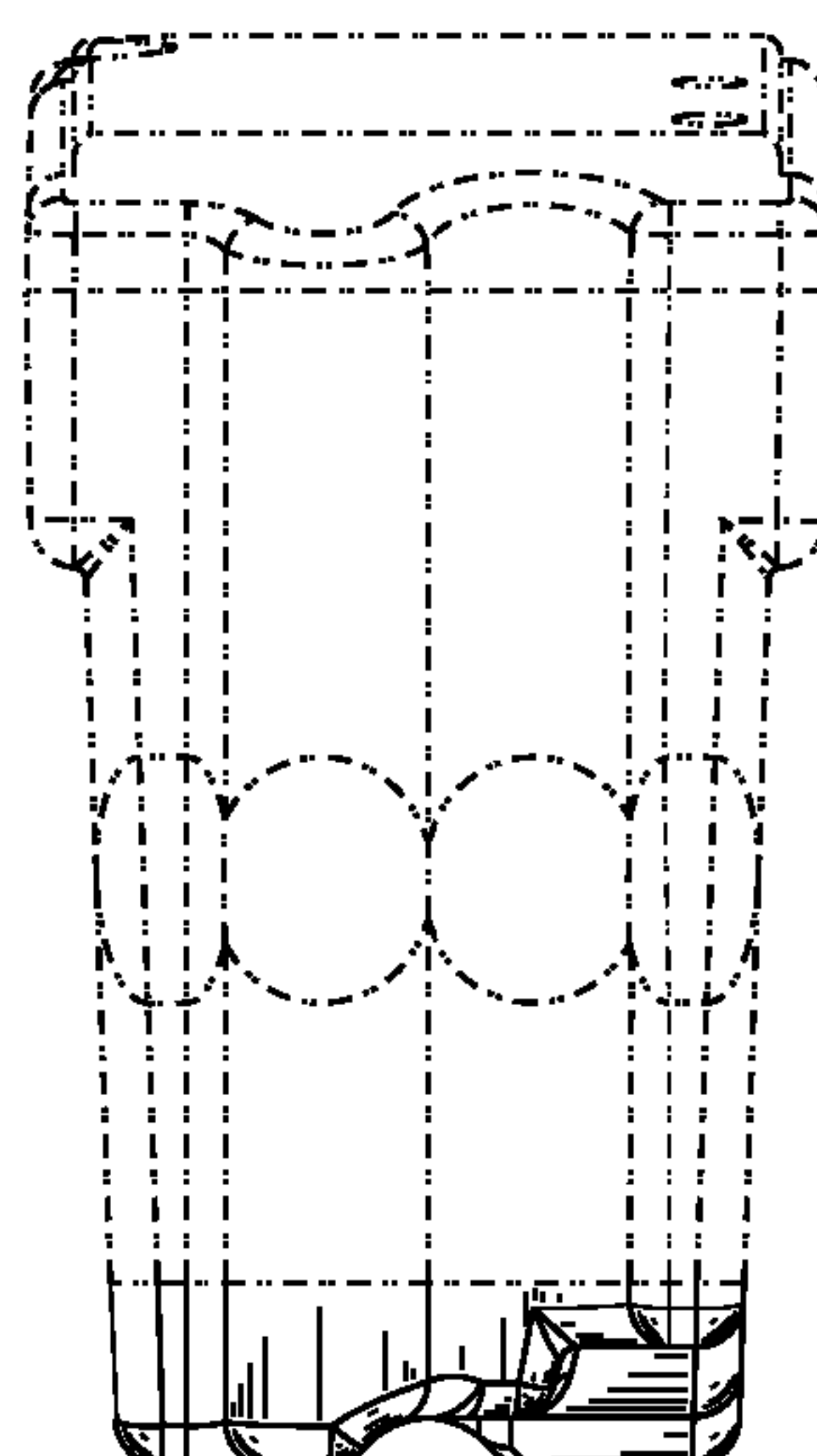

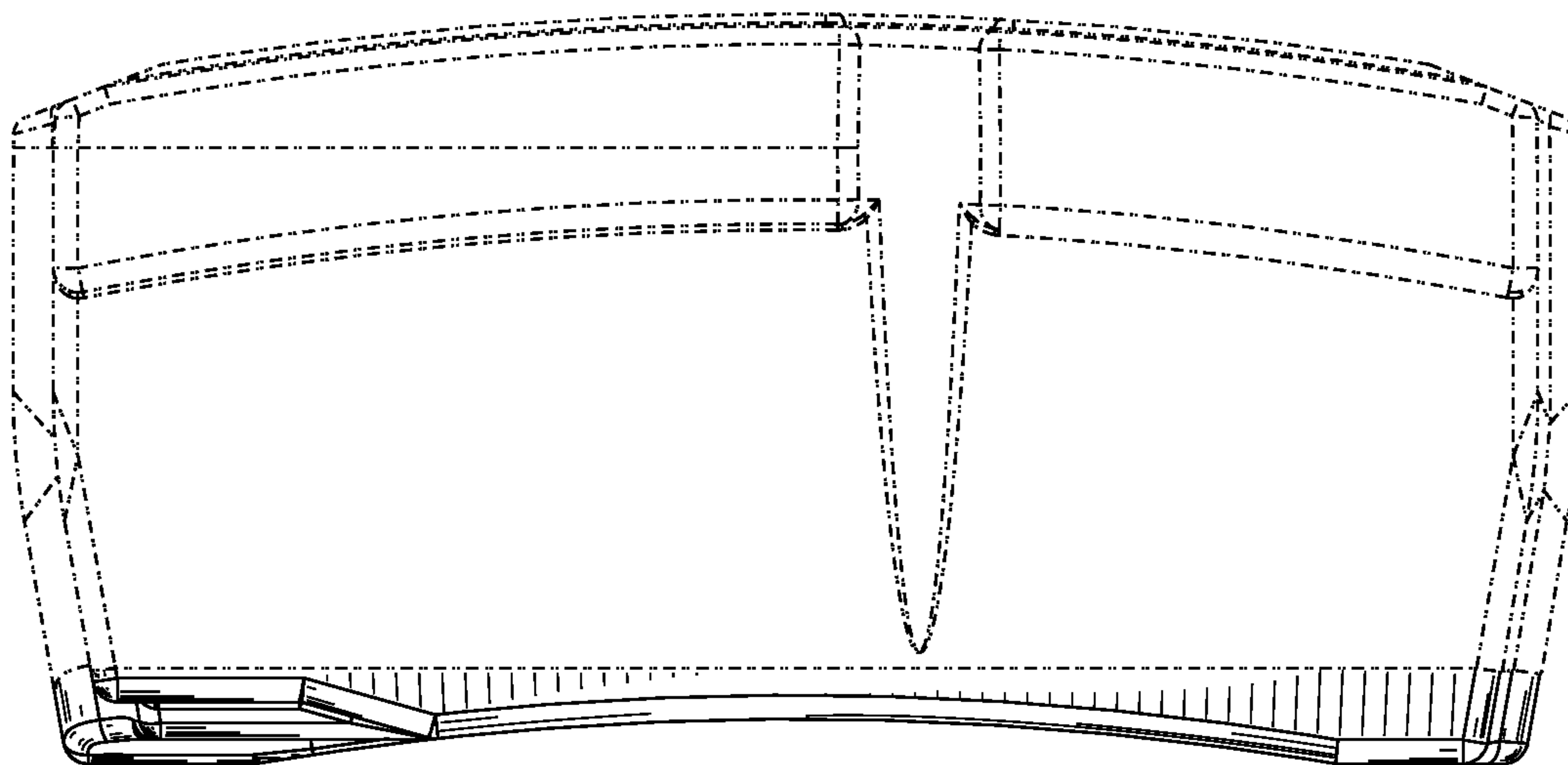

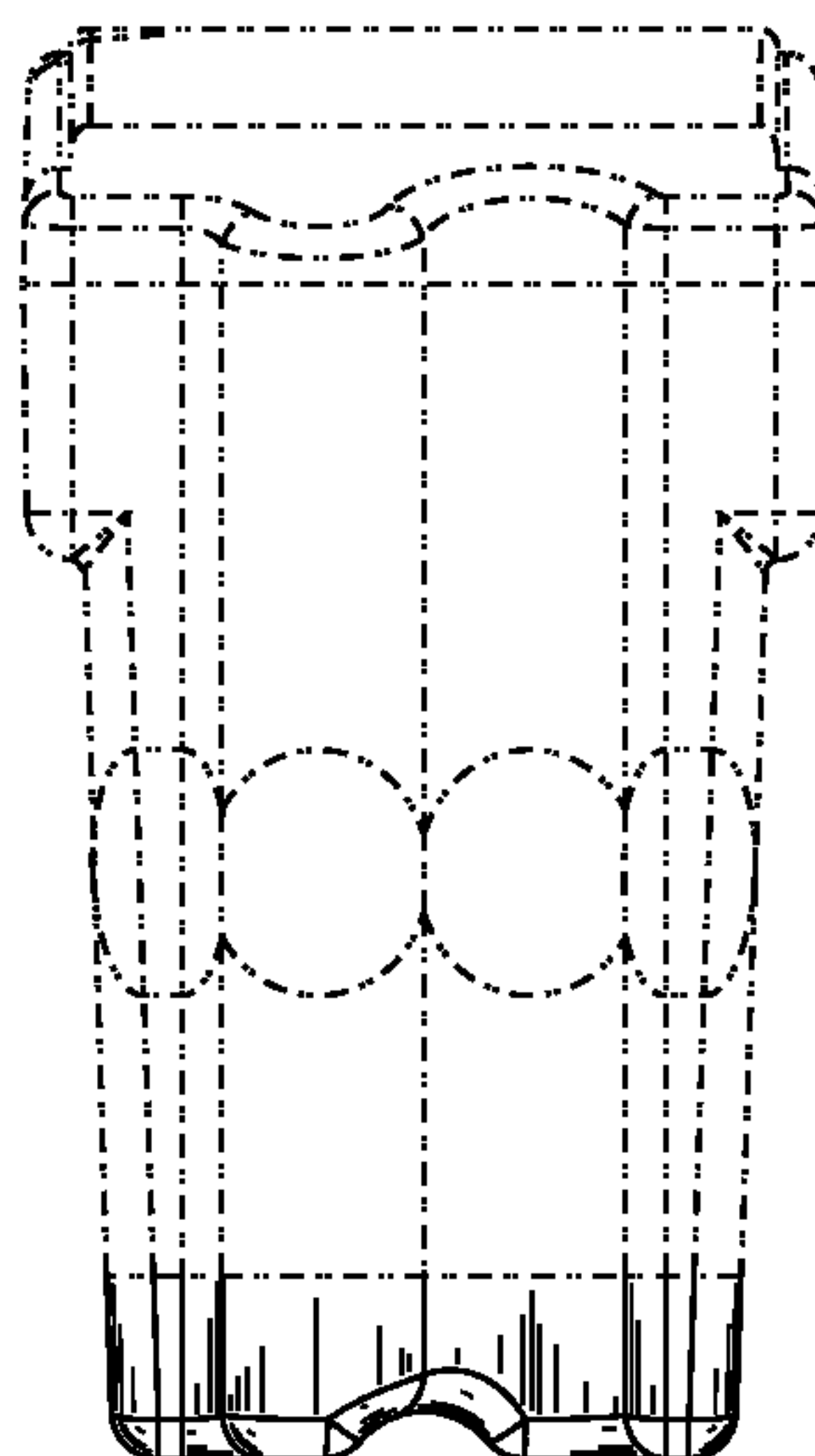

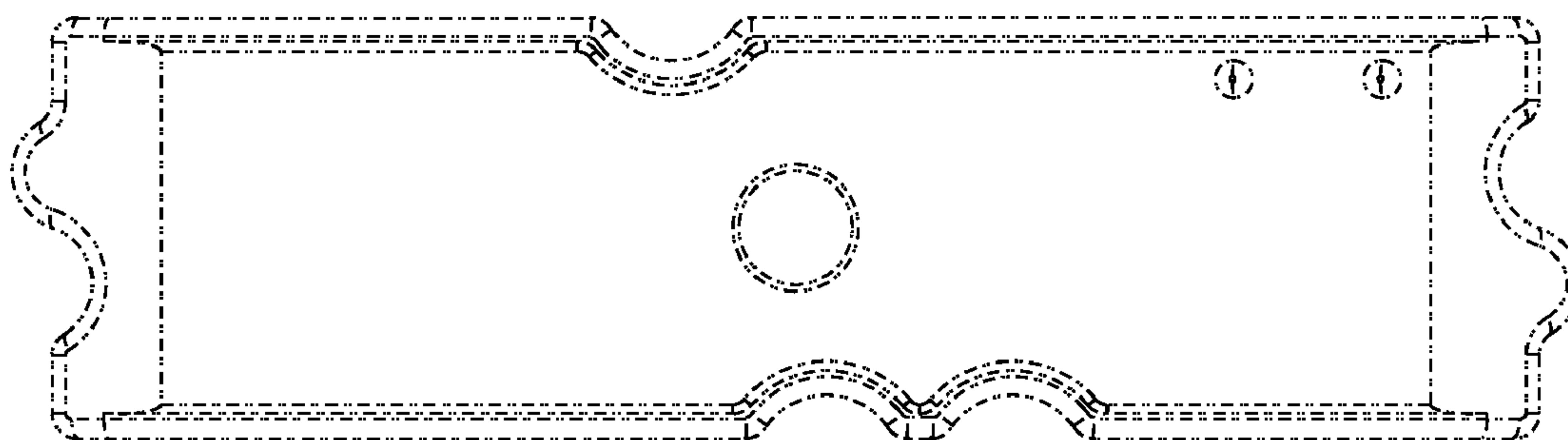

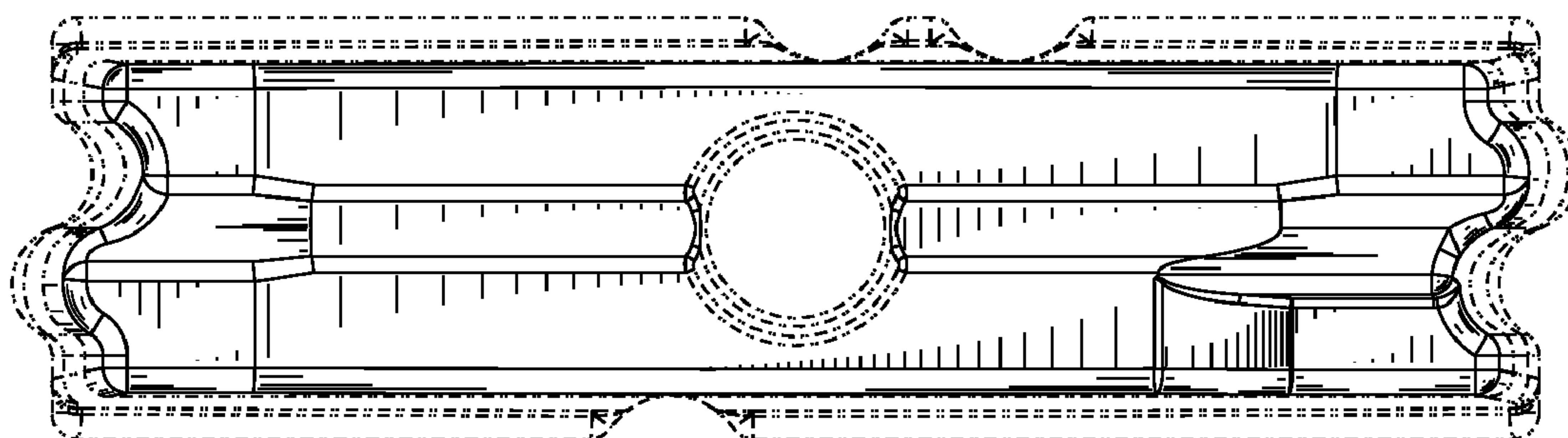

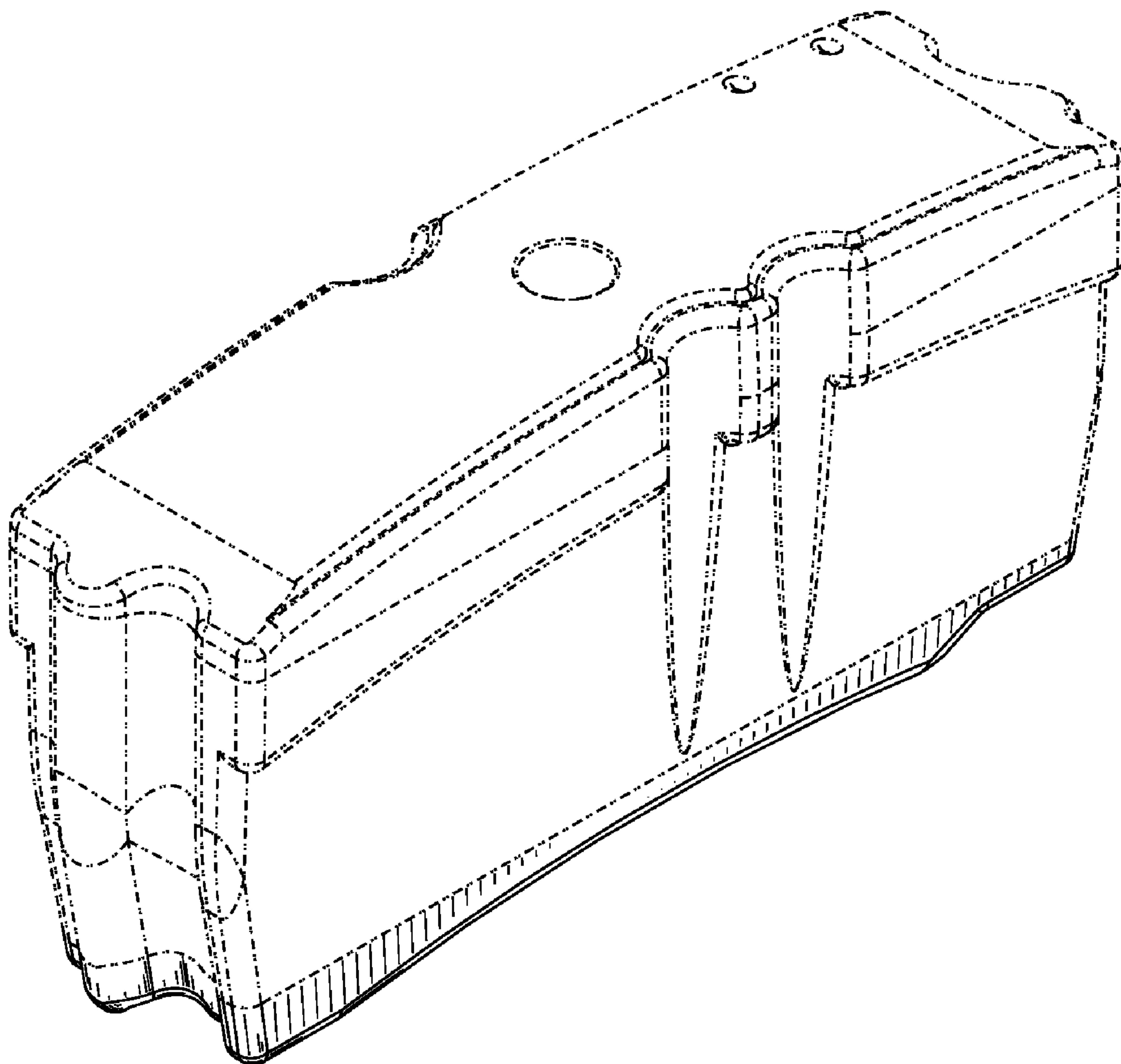

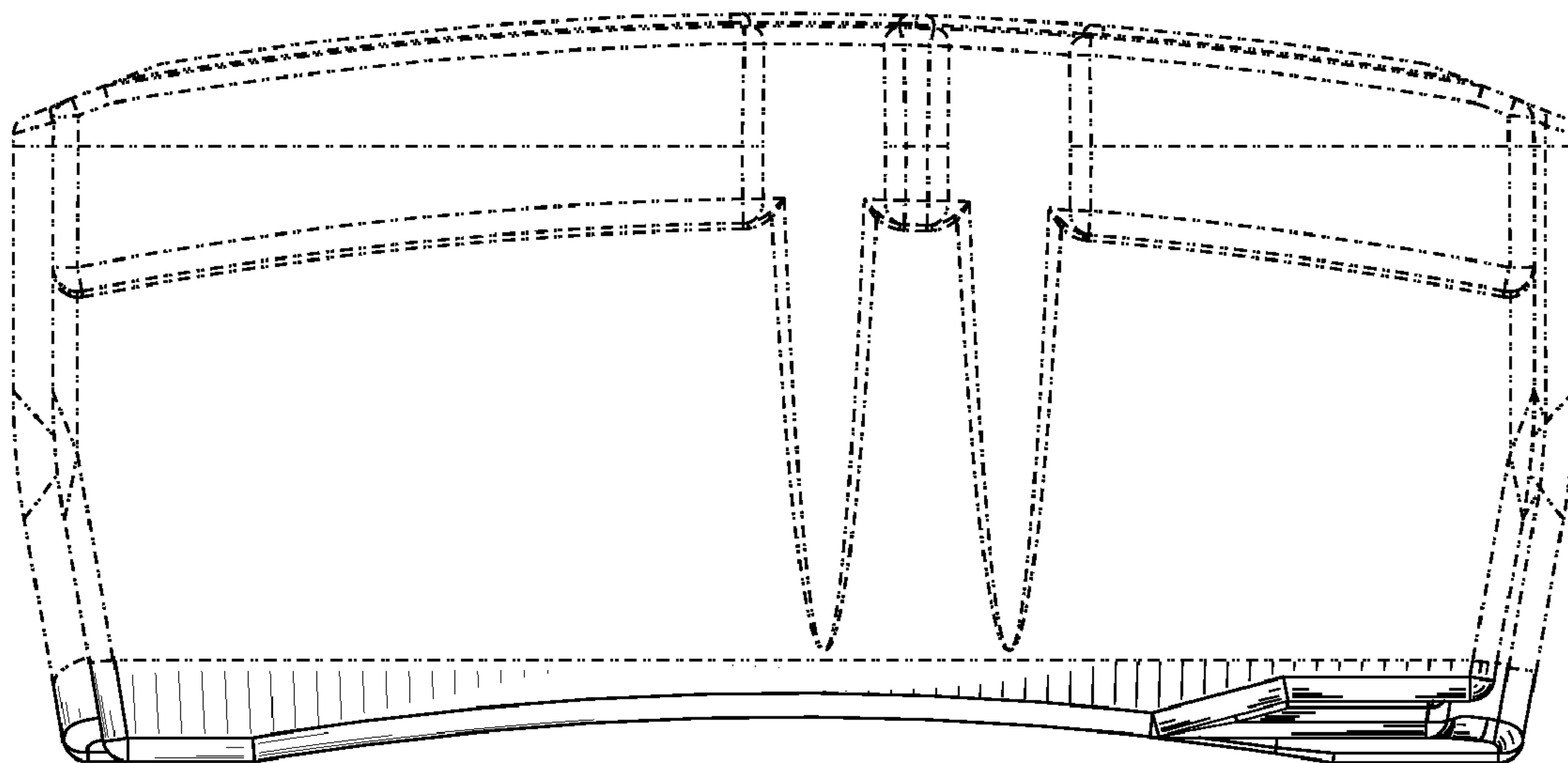

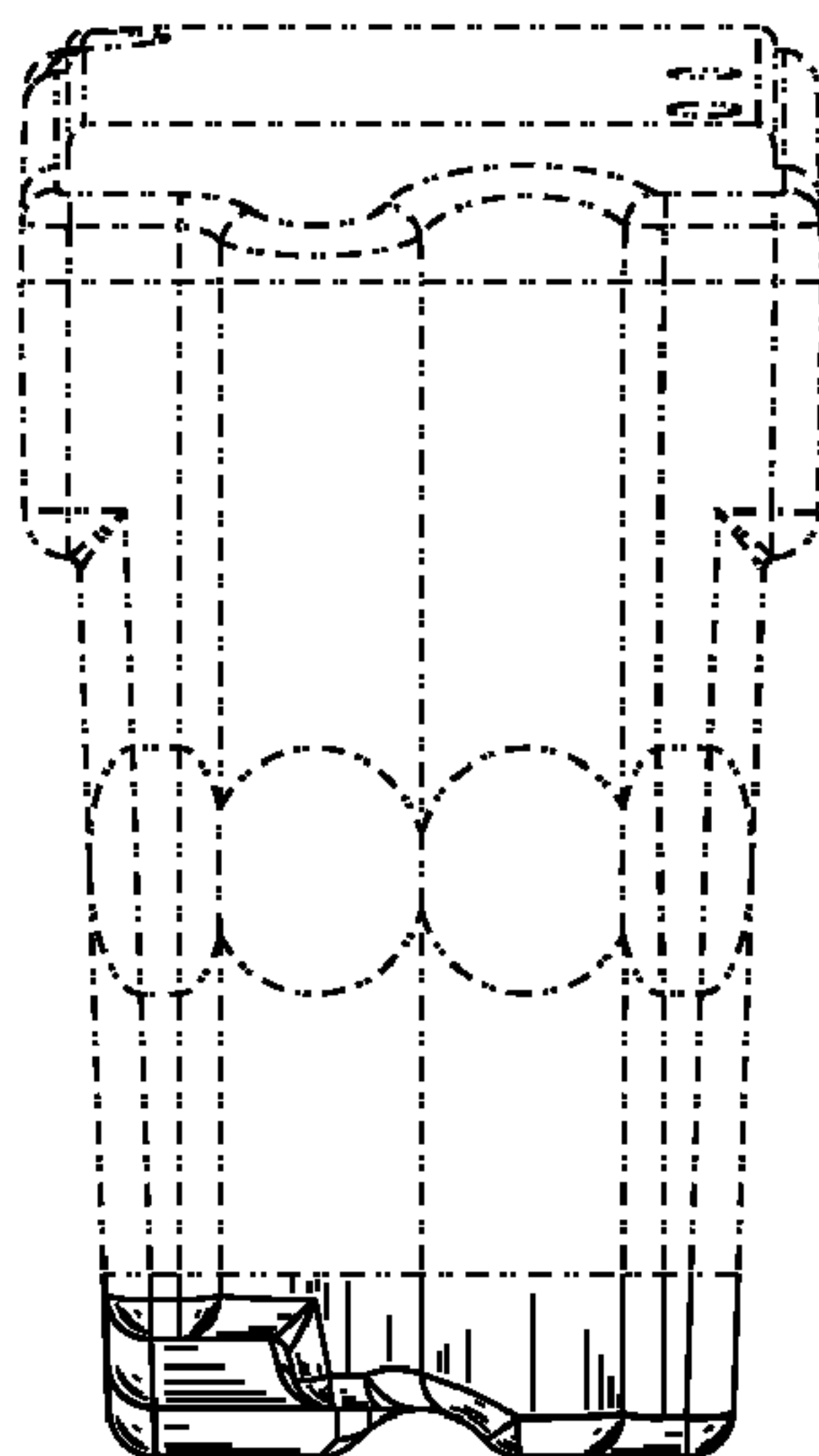

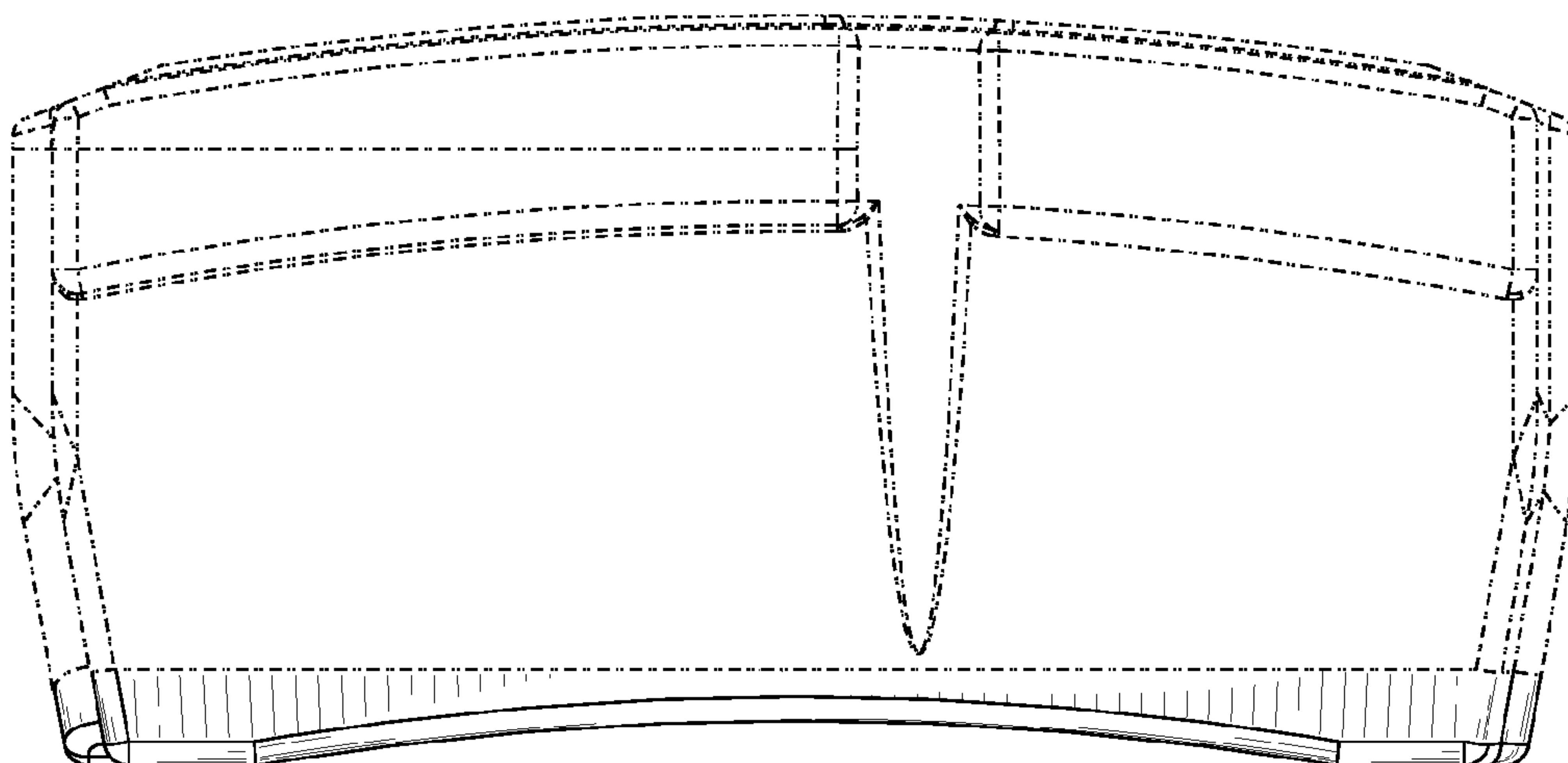

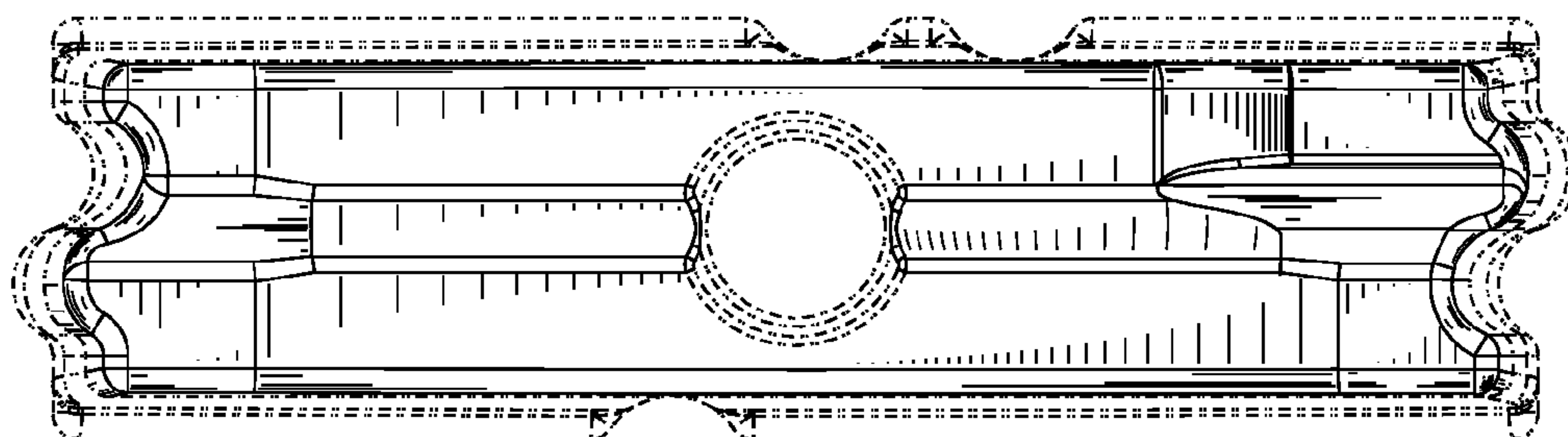
