FIG. 5 is a bottom view thereof;

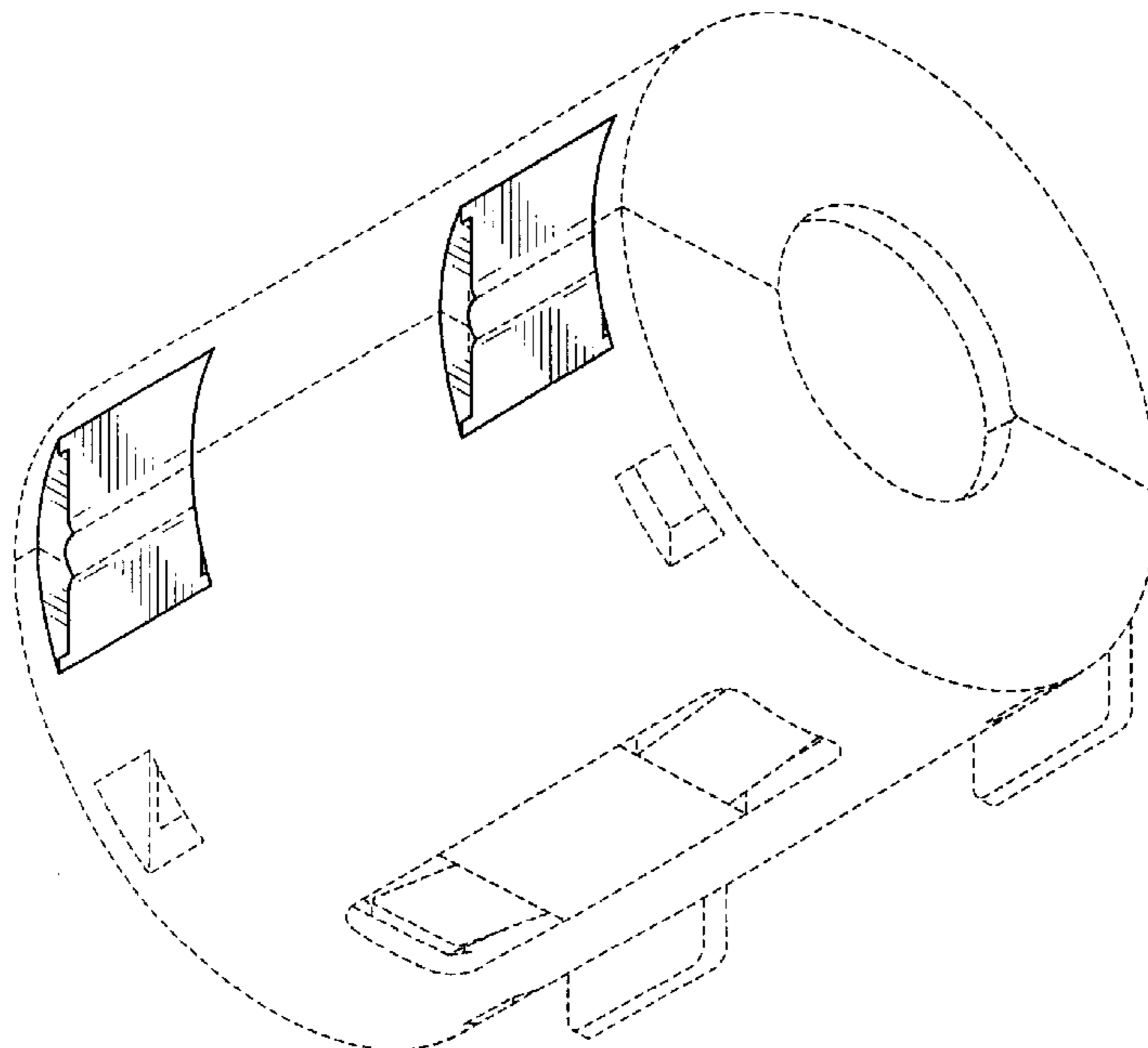
FIG. 6 is a left-side view thereof;

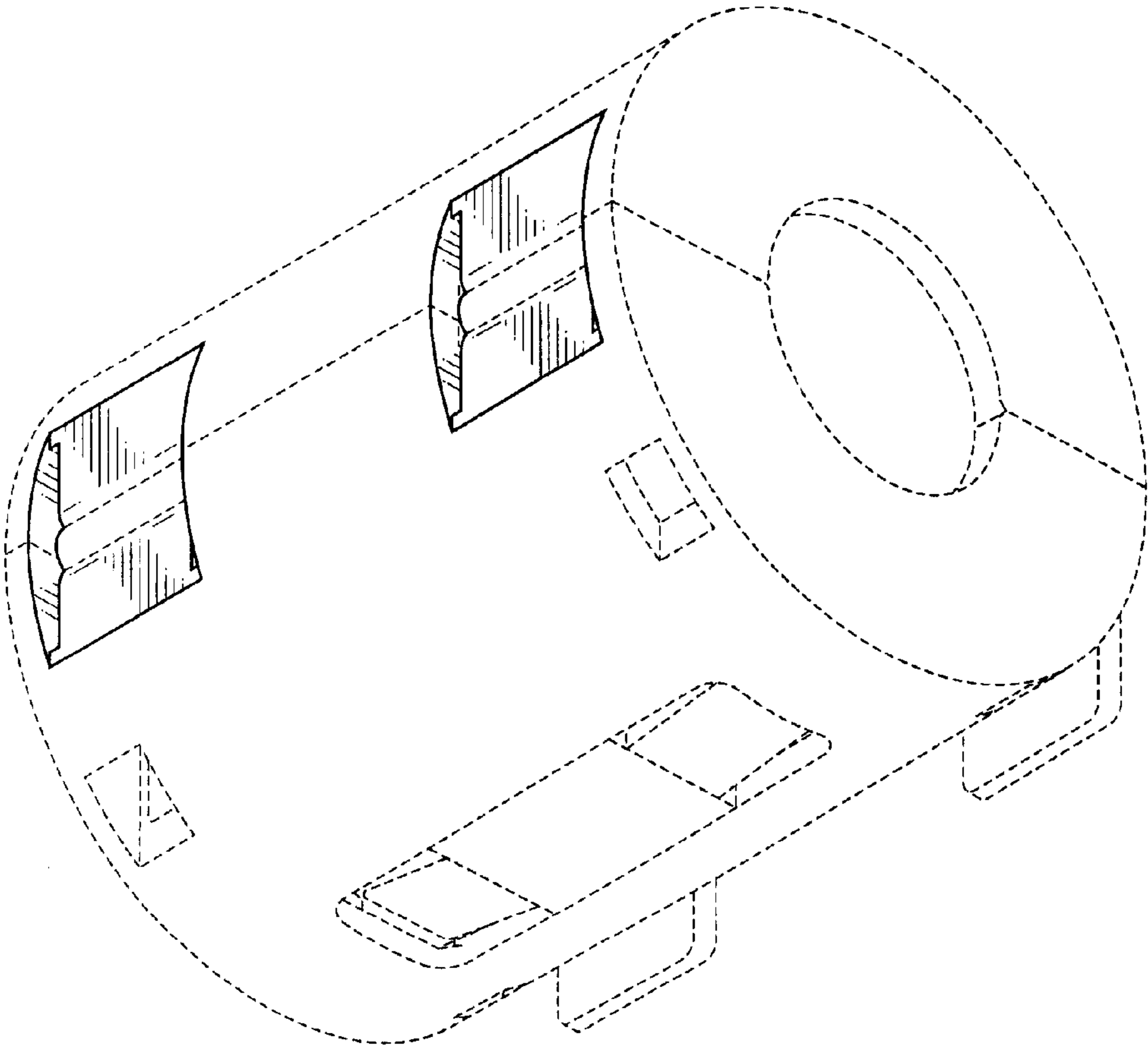

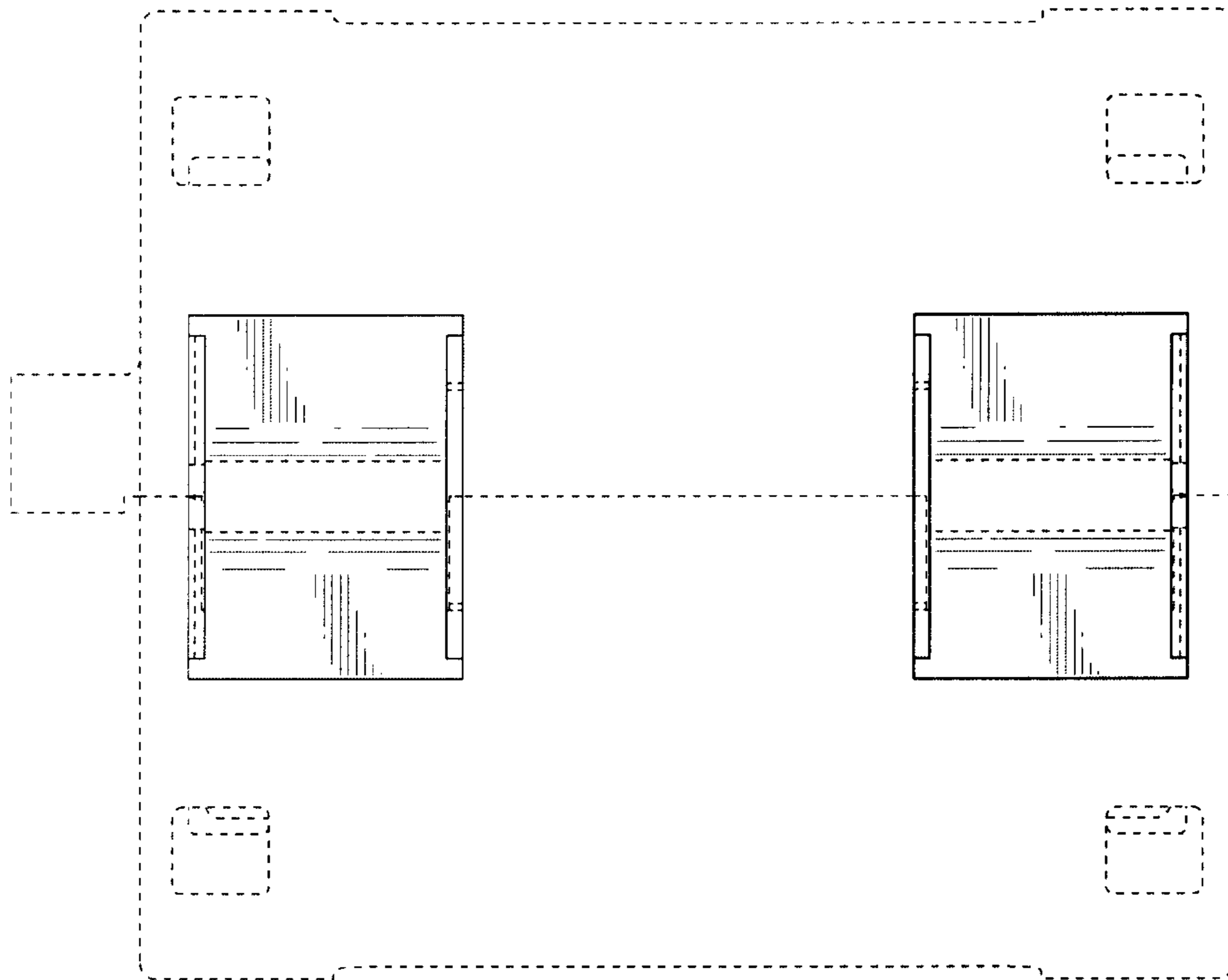

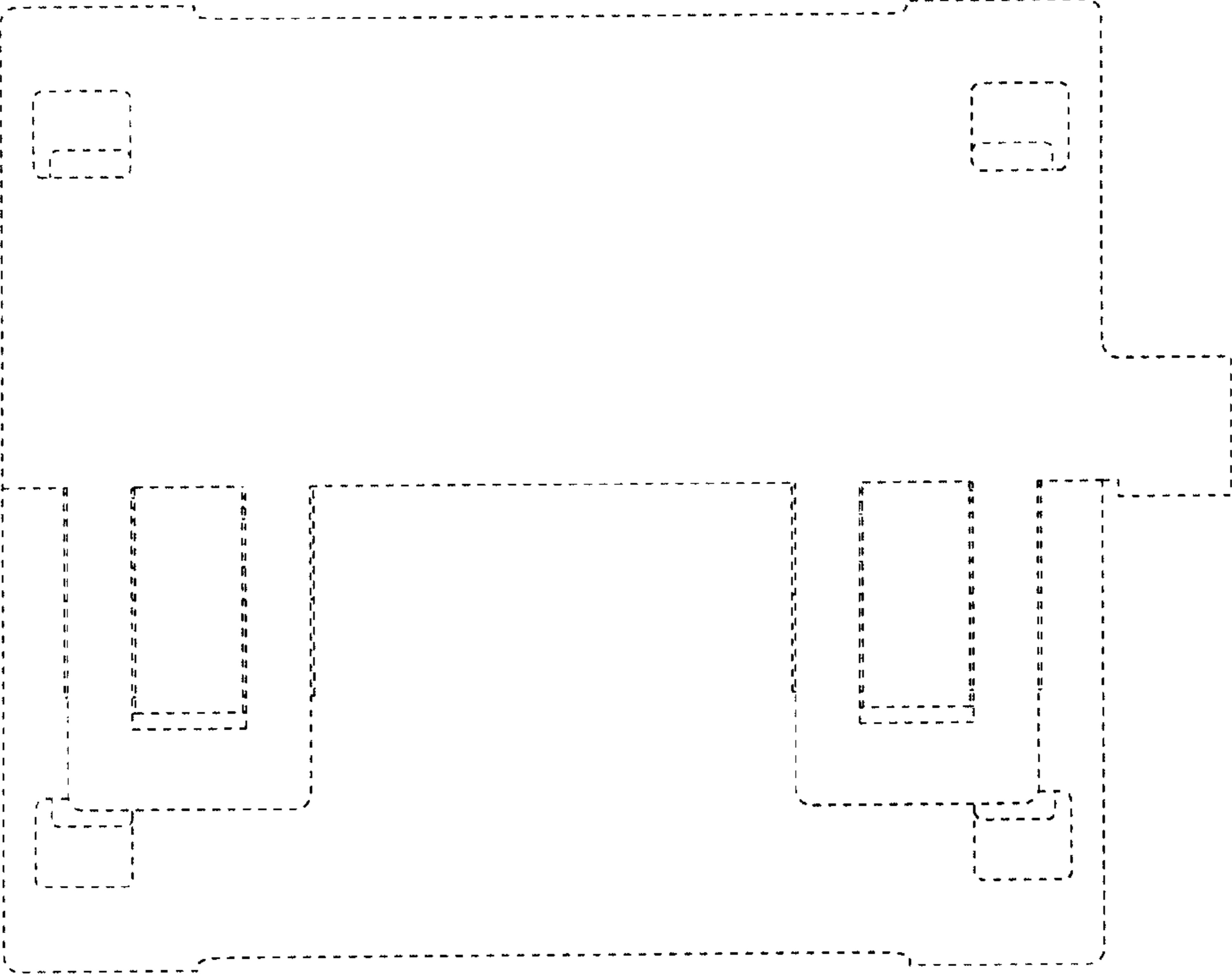

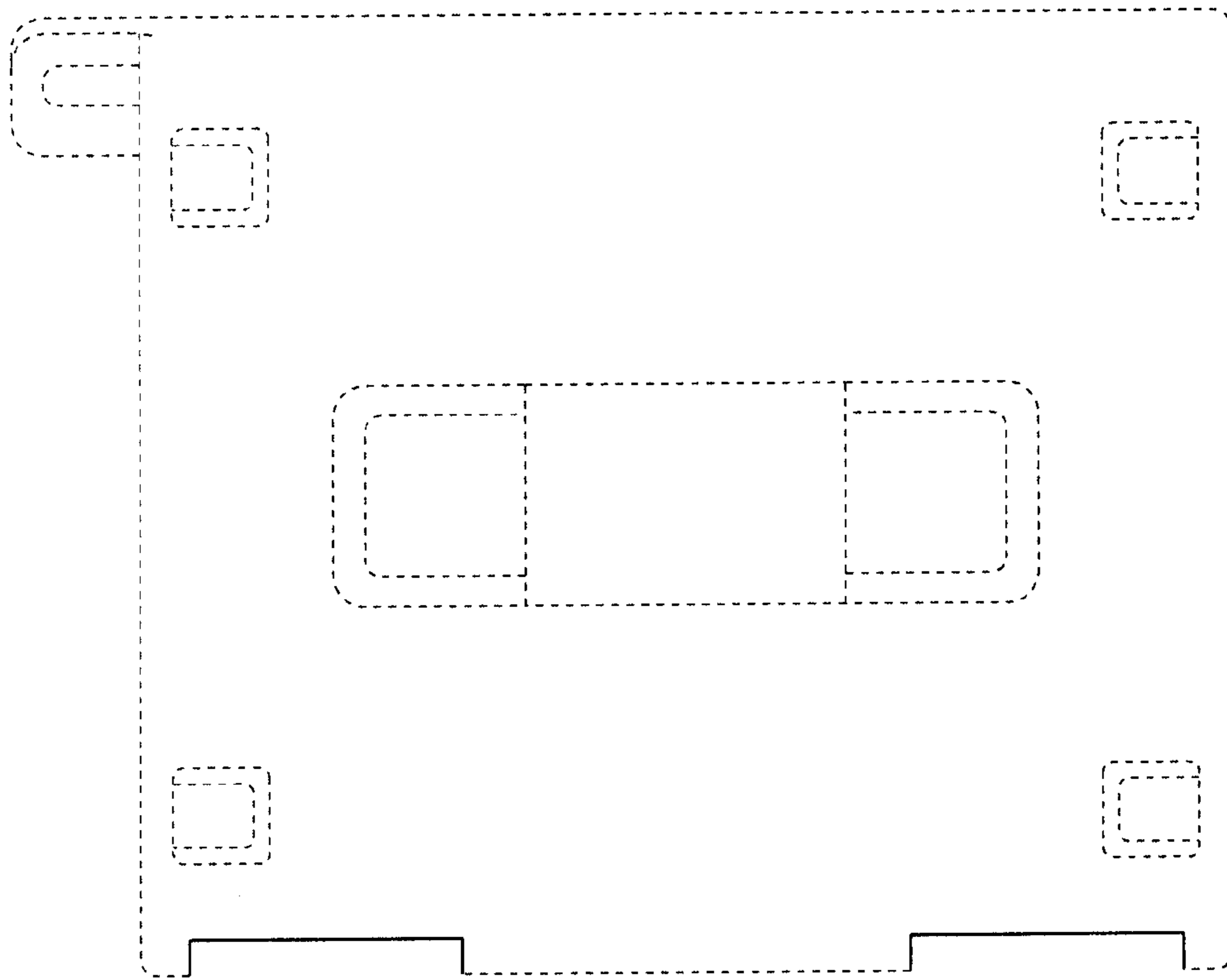

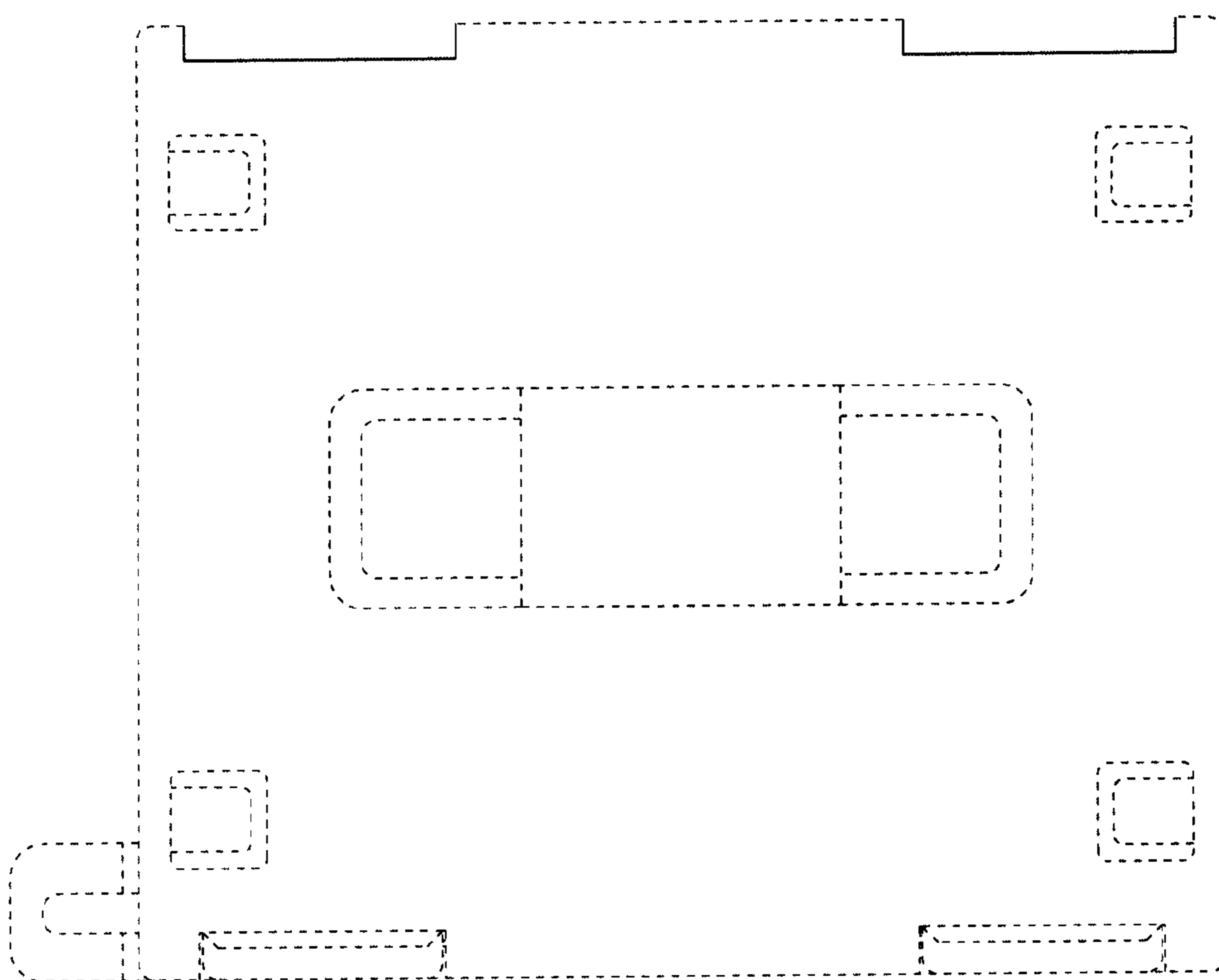

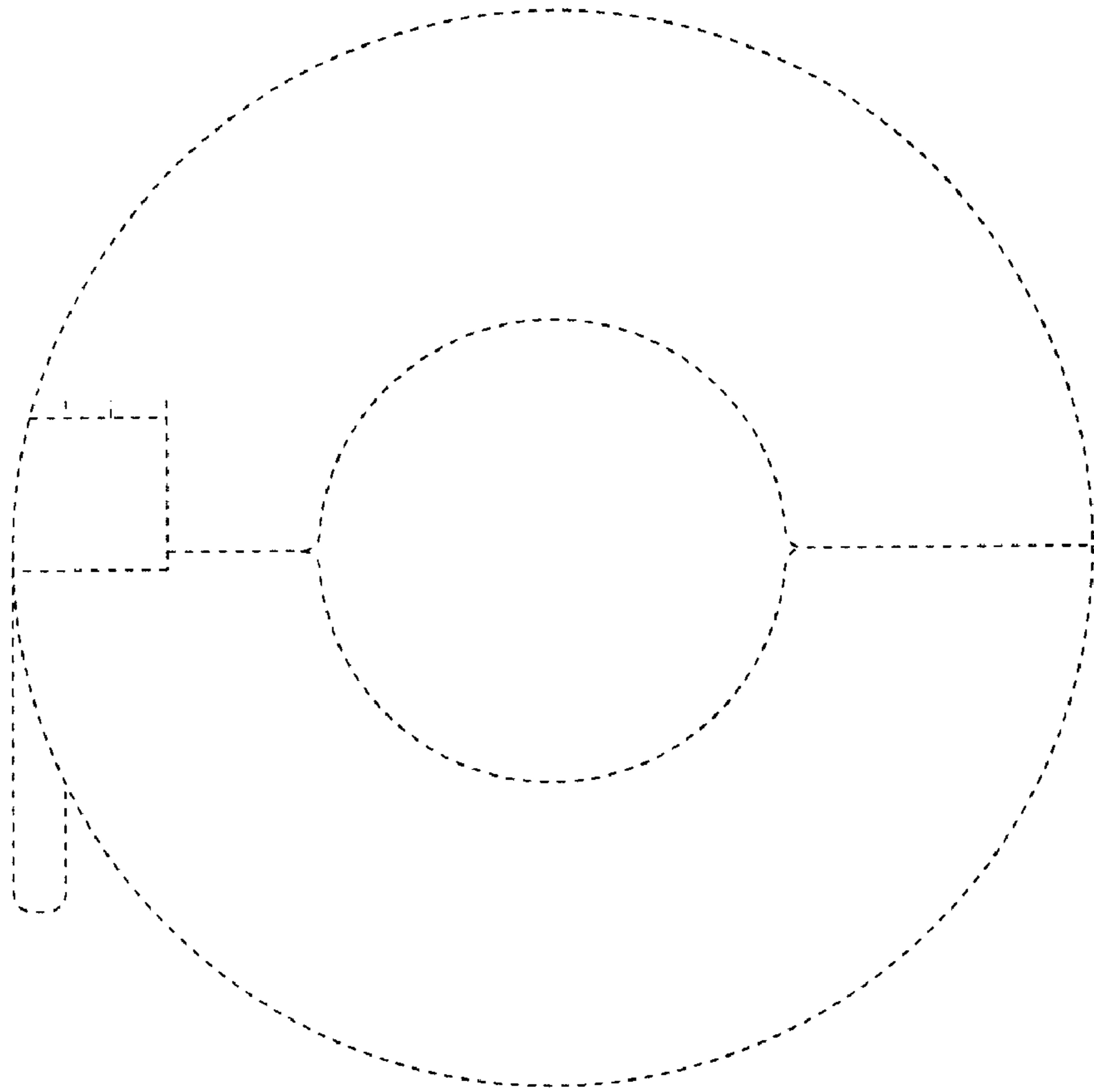

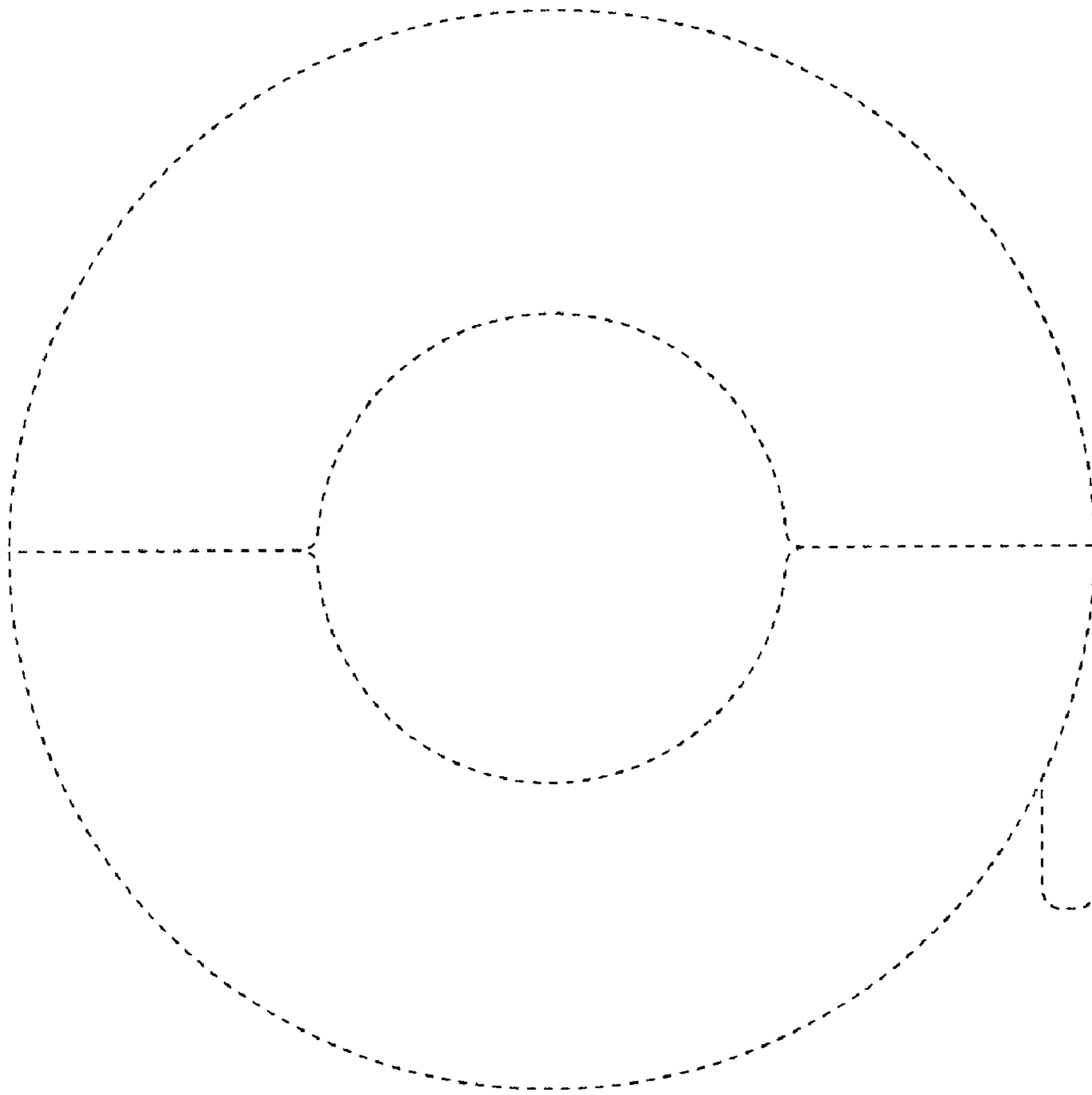

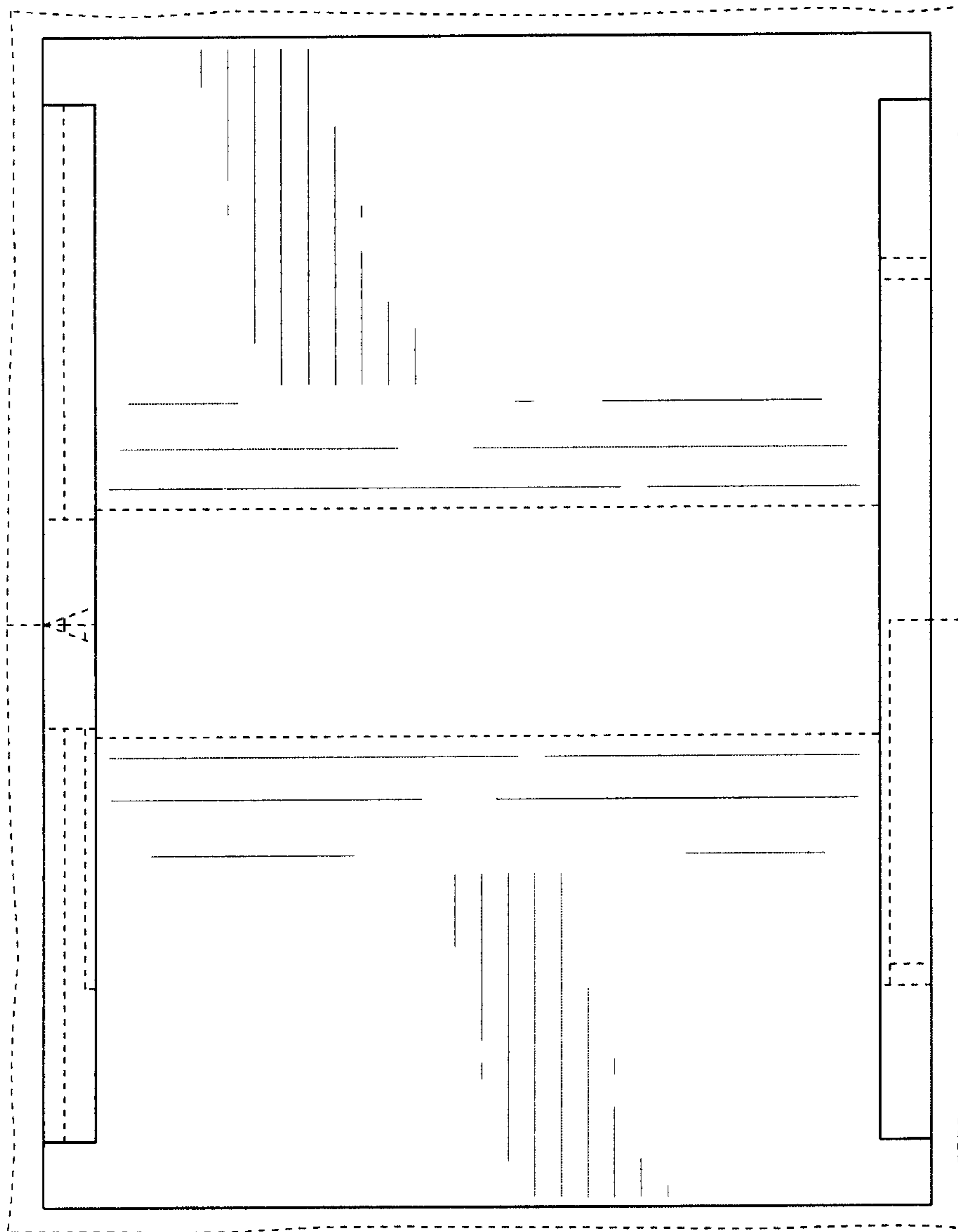
