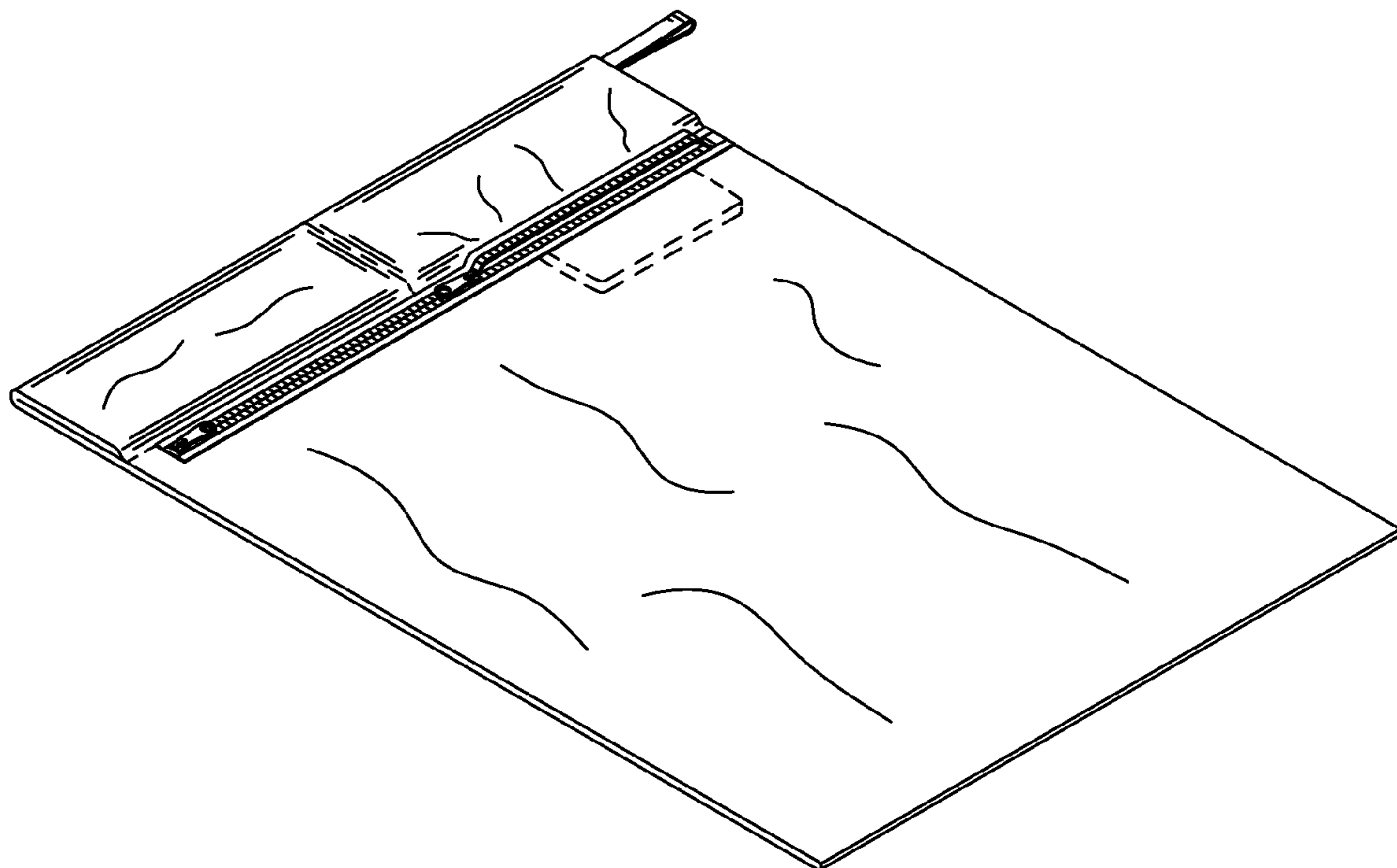
**DESCRIPTION**

(57) **CLAIM**

What is claimed is the ornamental design for a towel, as shown and described.

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a towel, showing the new design, a zipper of the design in a partially open position; FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof, the zipper in a closed position; FIG. 3 is a bottom plan view of FIG. 2; FIG. 4 is a front elevational view of FIG. 2; FIG. 5 is a rear elevational view of FIG. 2; FIG. 6 is a left-side elevational view of FIG. 2; and, FIG. 7 is a left-side elevational view of FIG. 2. The broken lines showing a wallet in FIG. 1 depict environmental matter and form no part of the claimed design. The broken lines on FIG. 3 represent stitching.

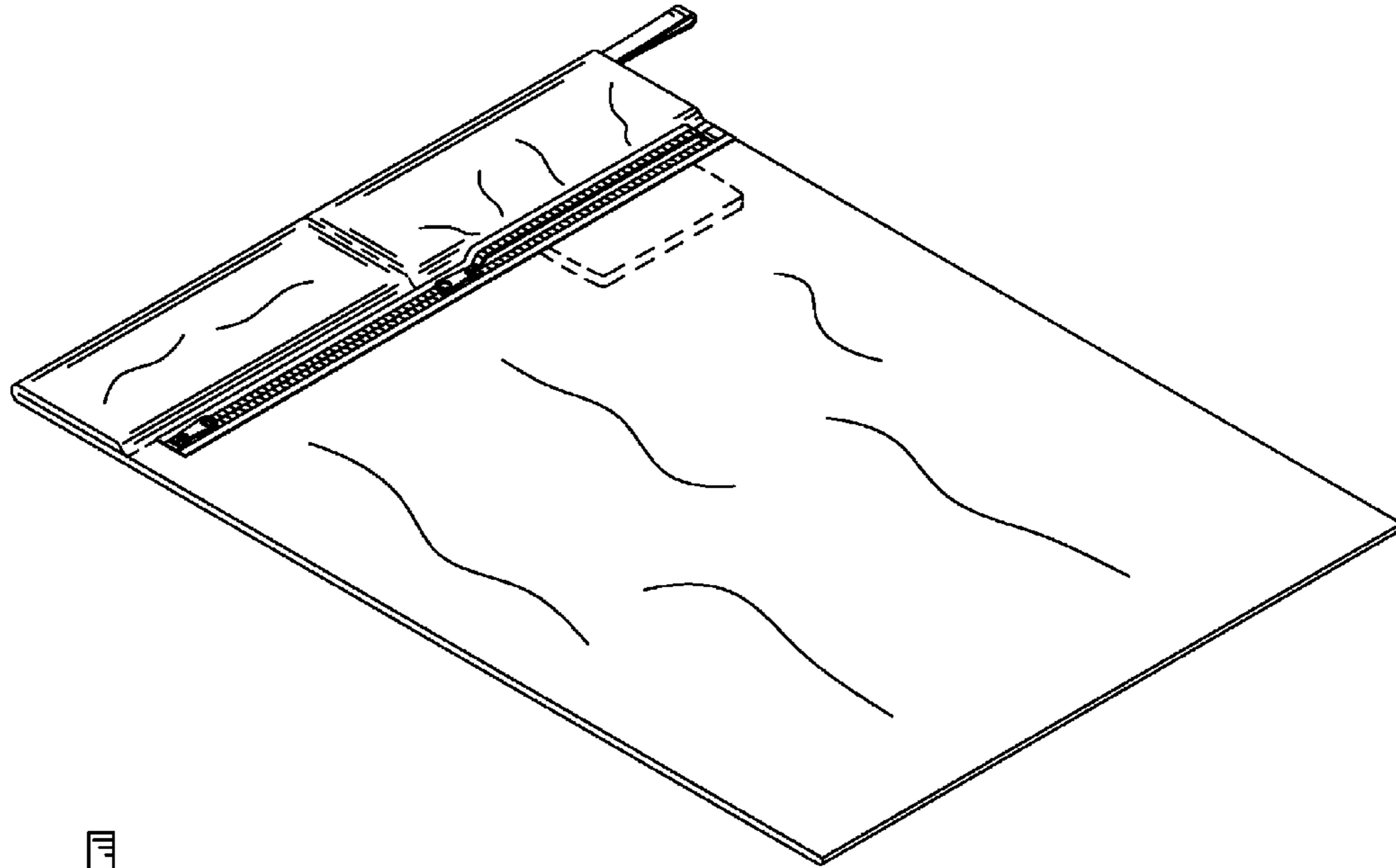

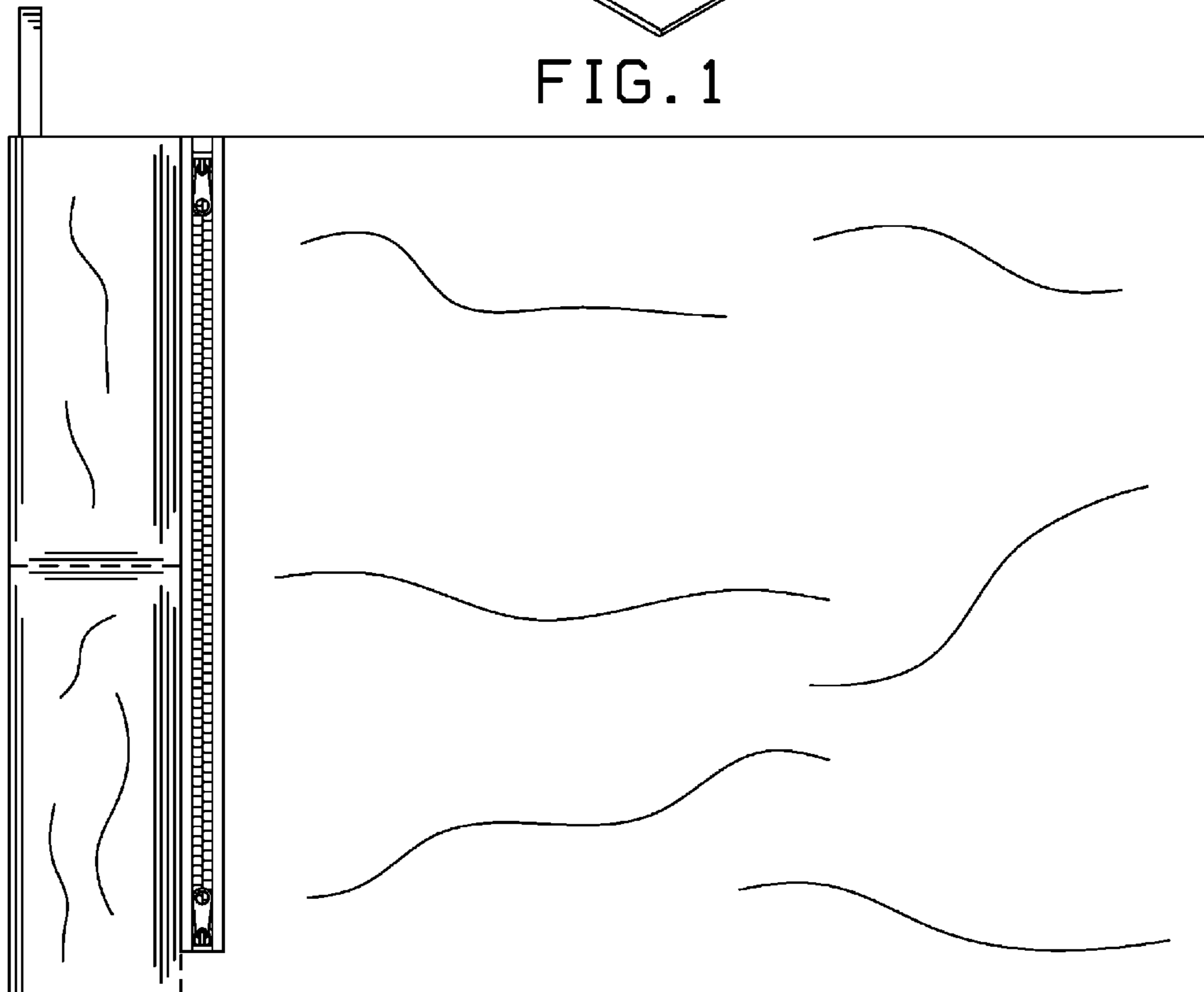

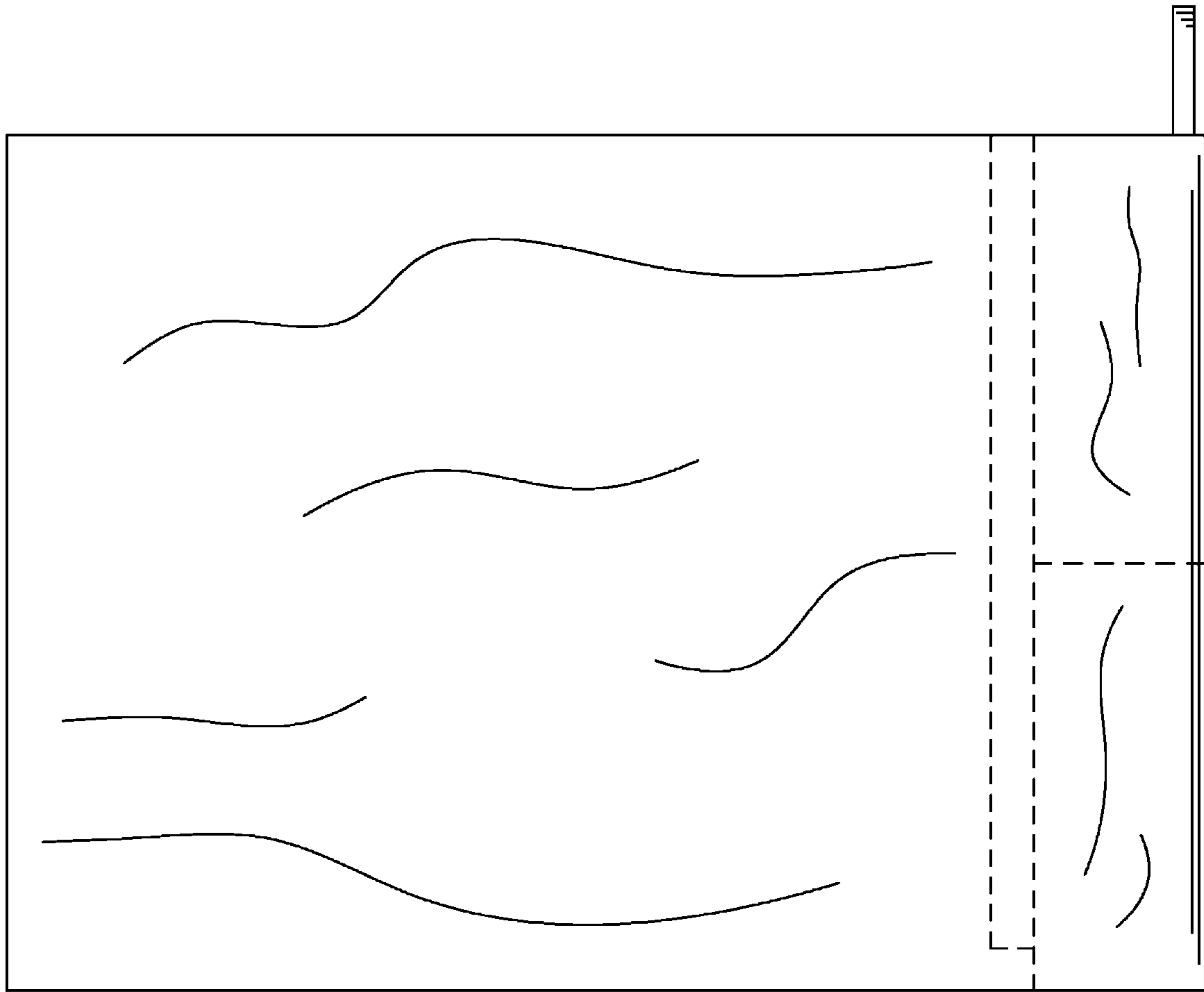

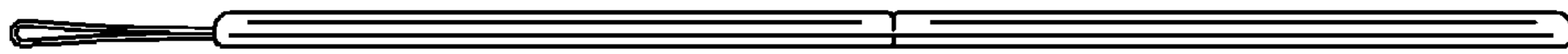

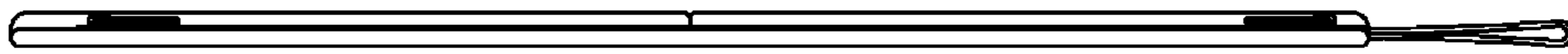

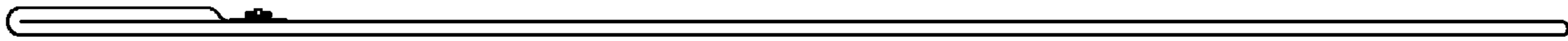
