DESCRIPTION

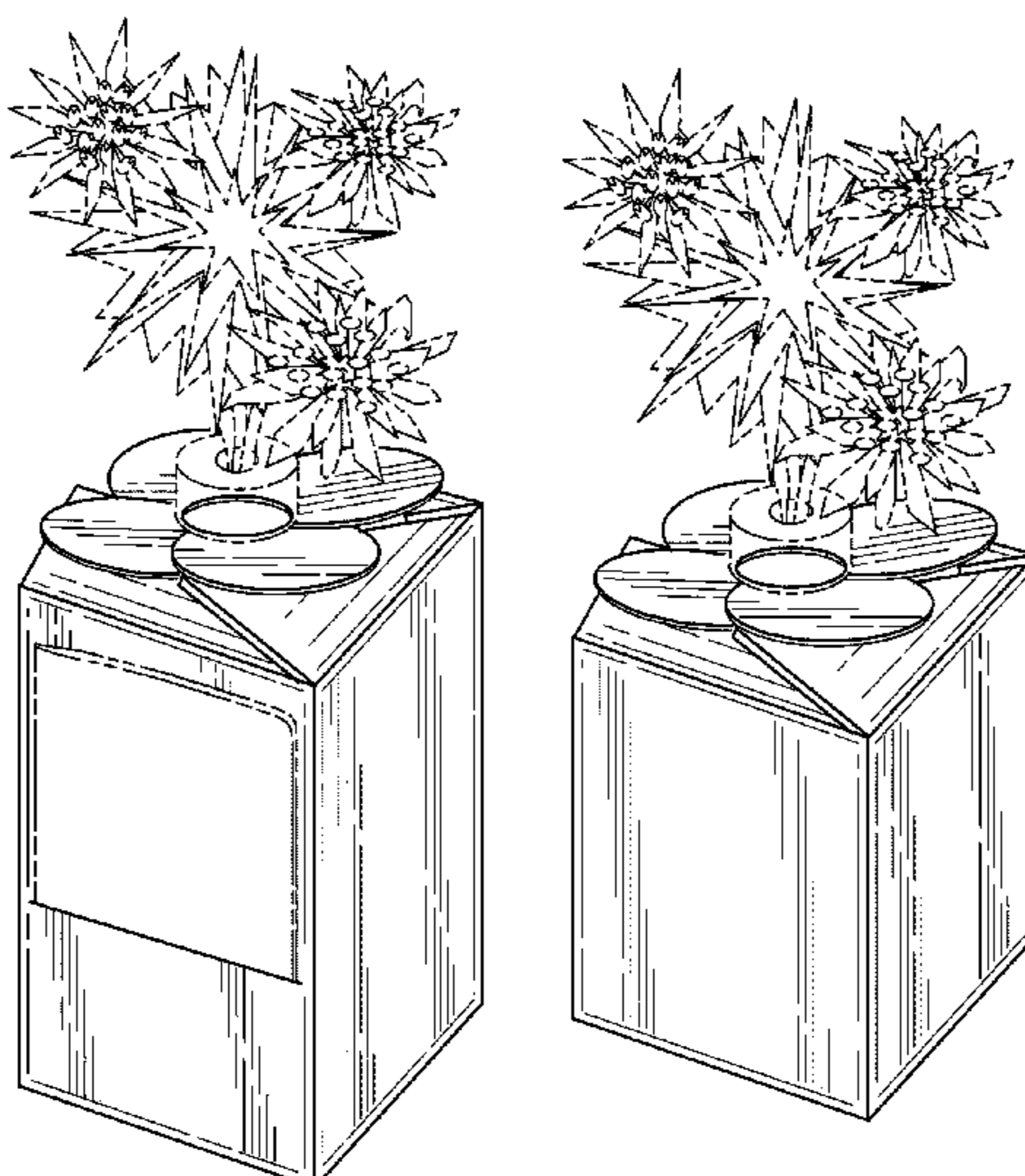
FIG. 1 is front perspective view of a box vase showing a first embodiment of my new design;

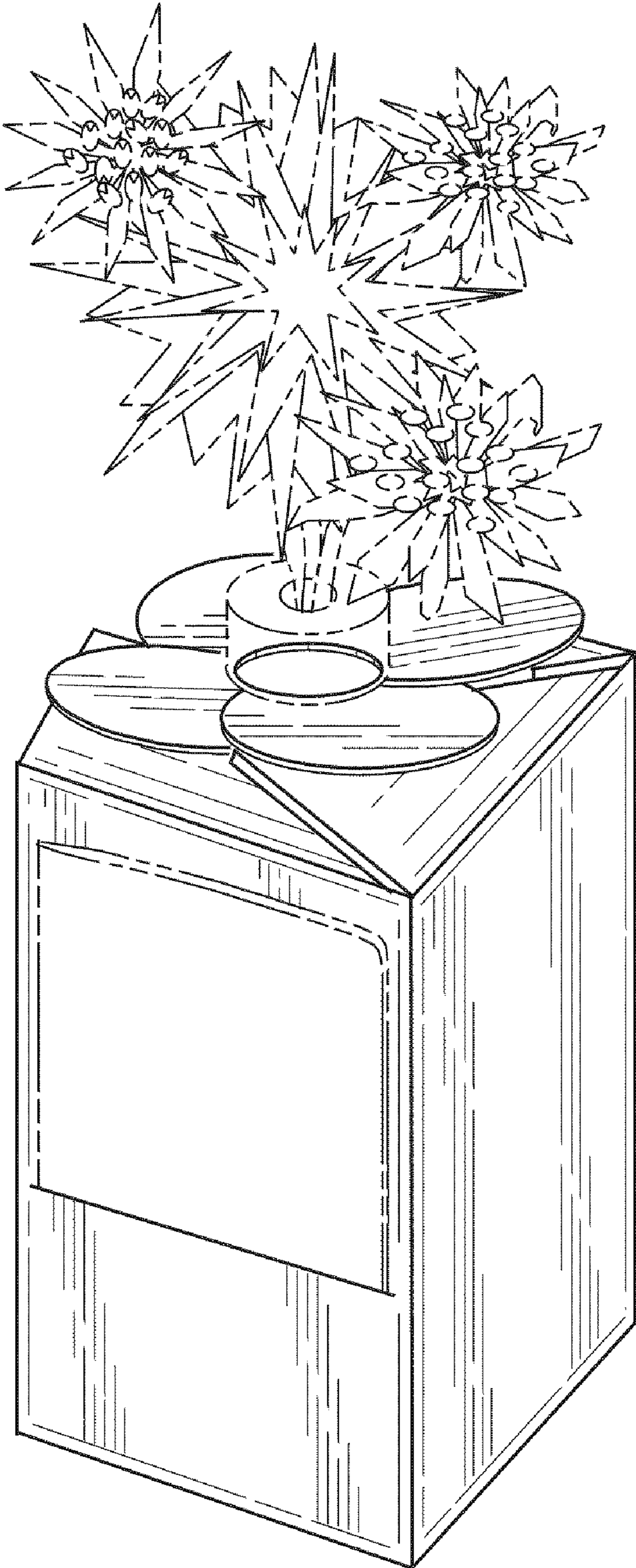

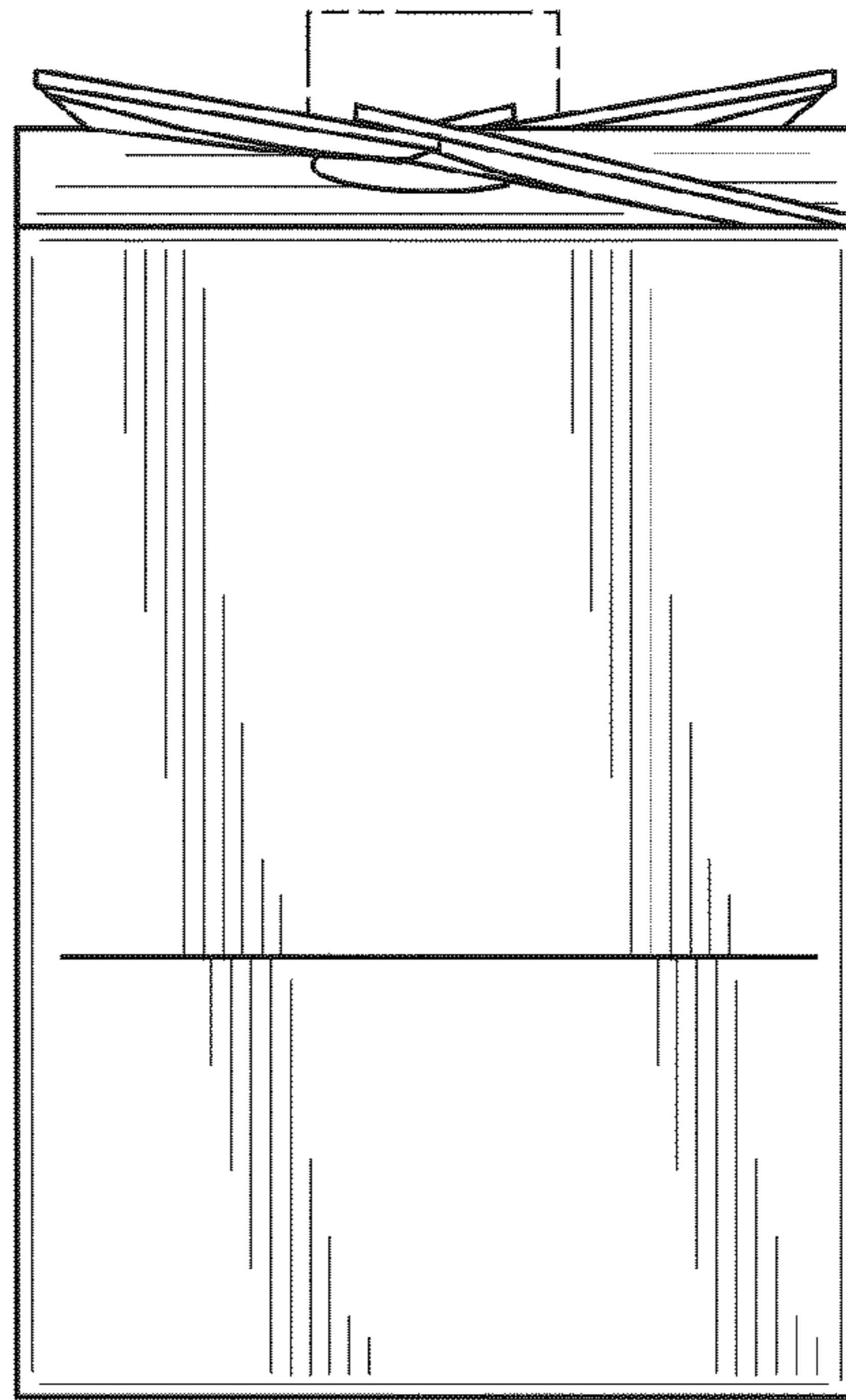

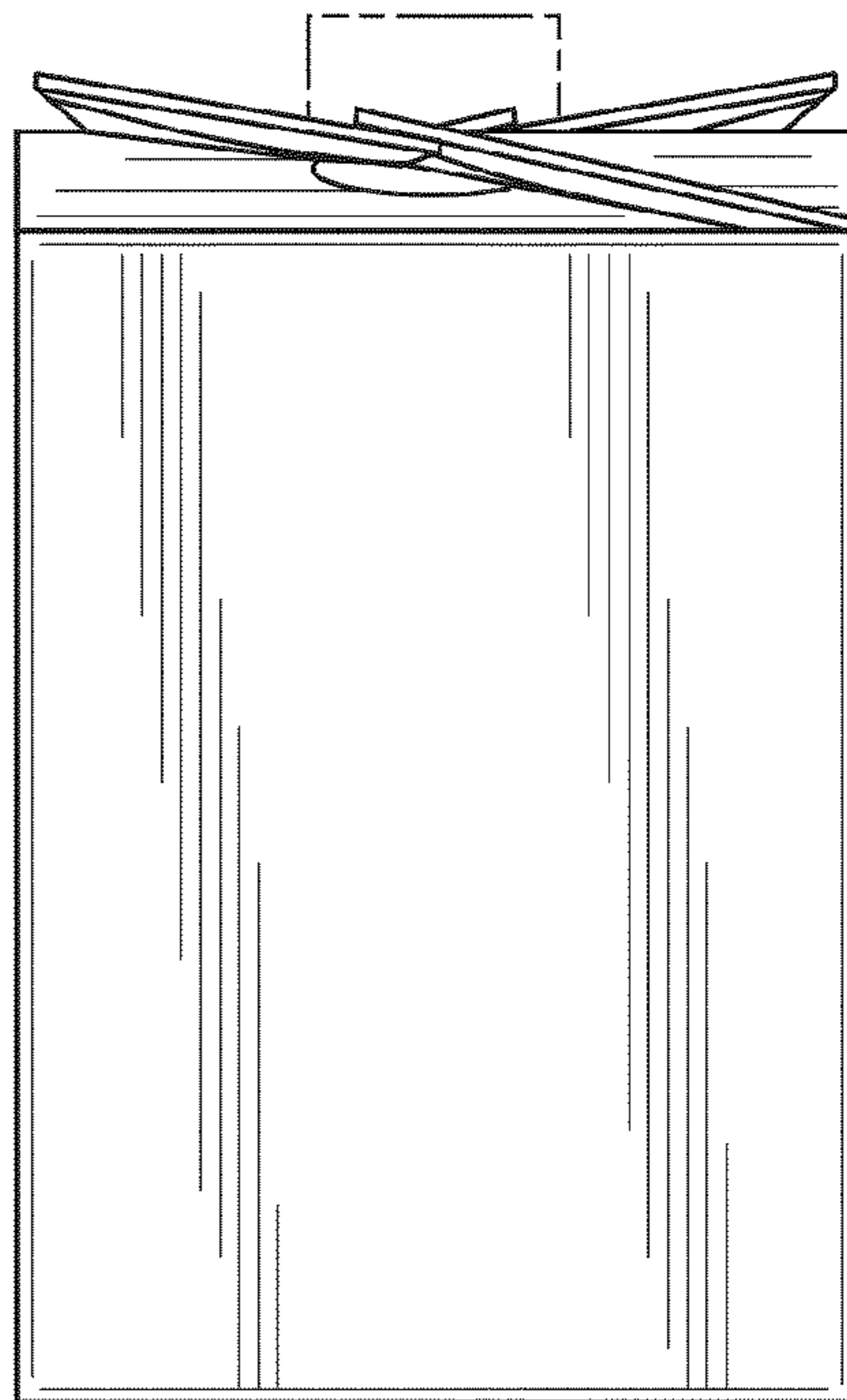

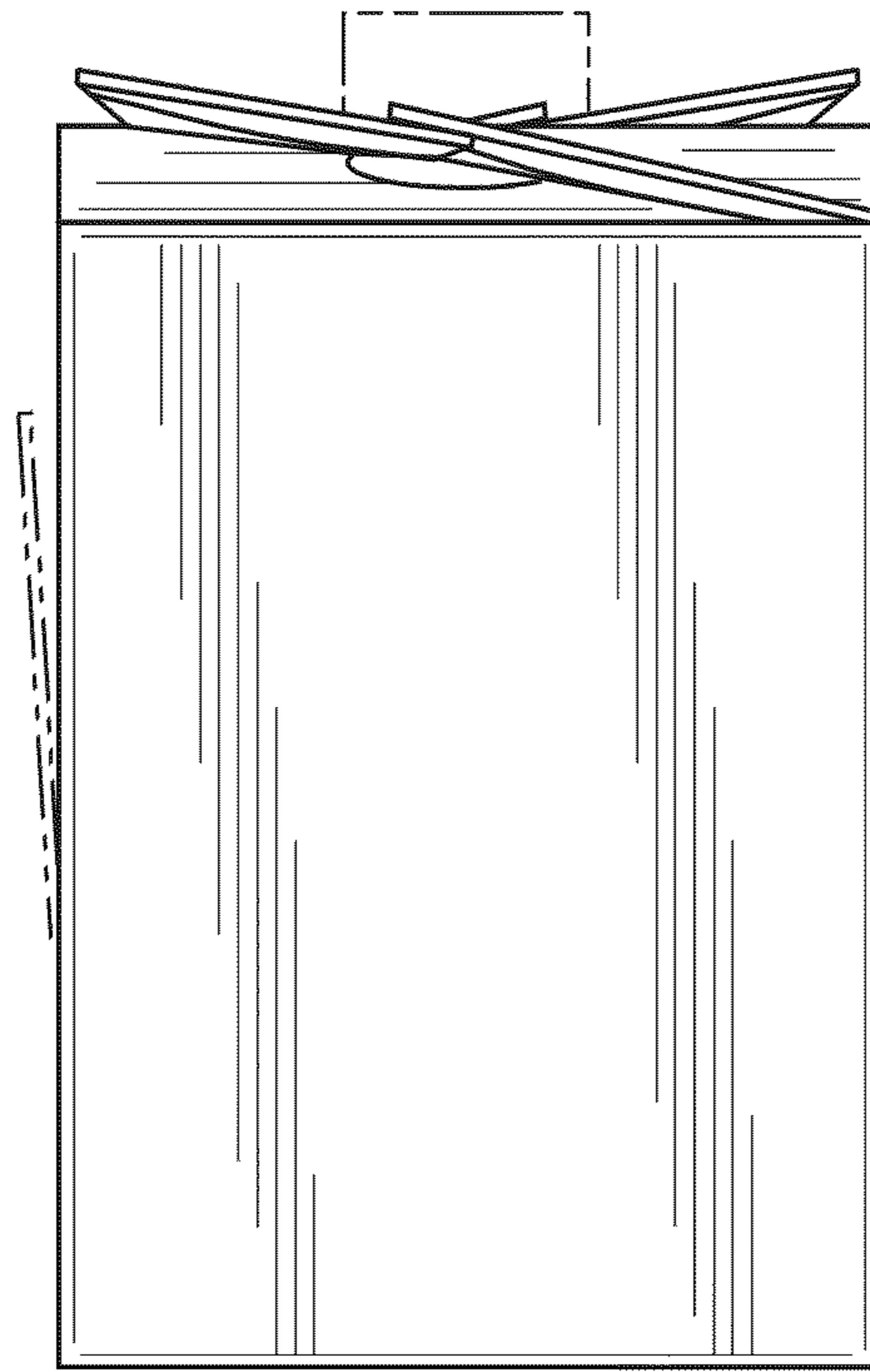

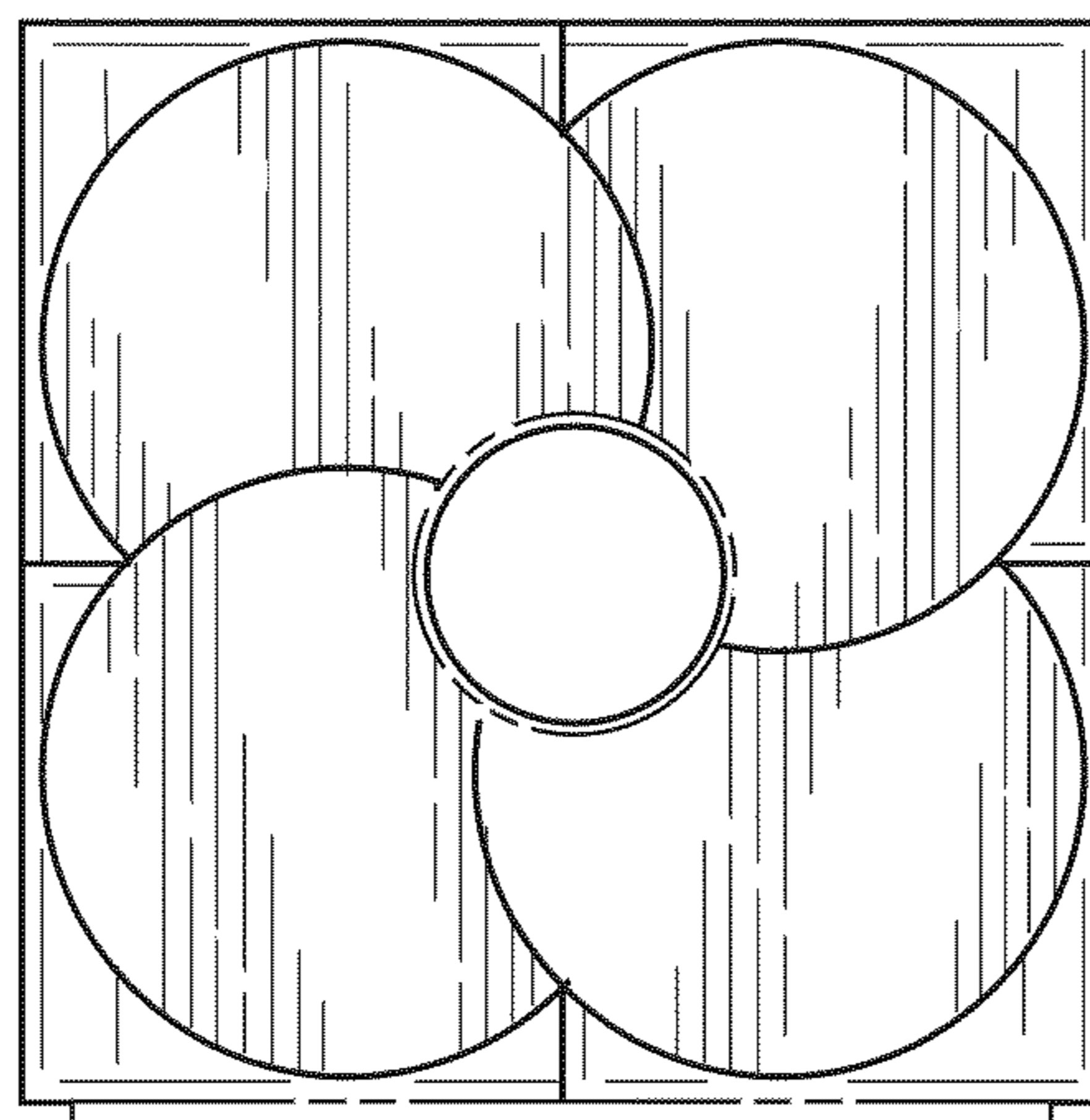

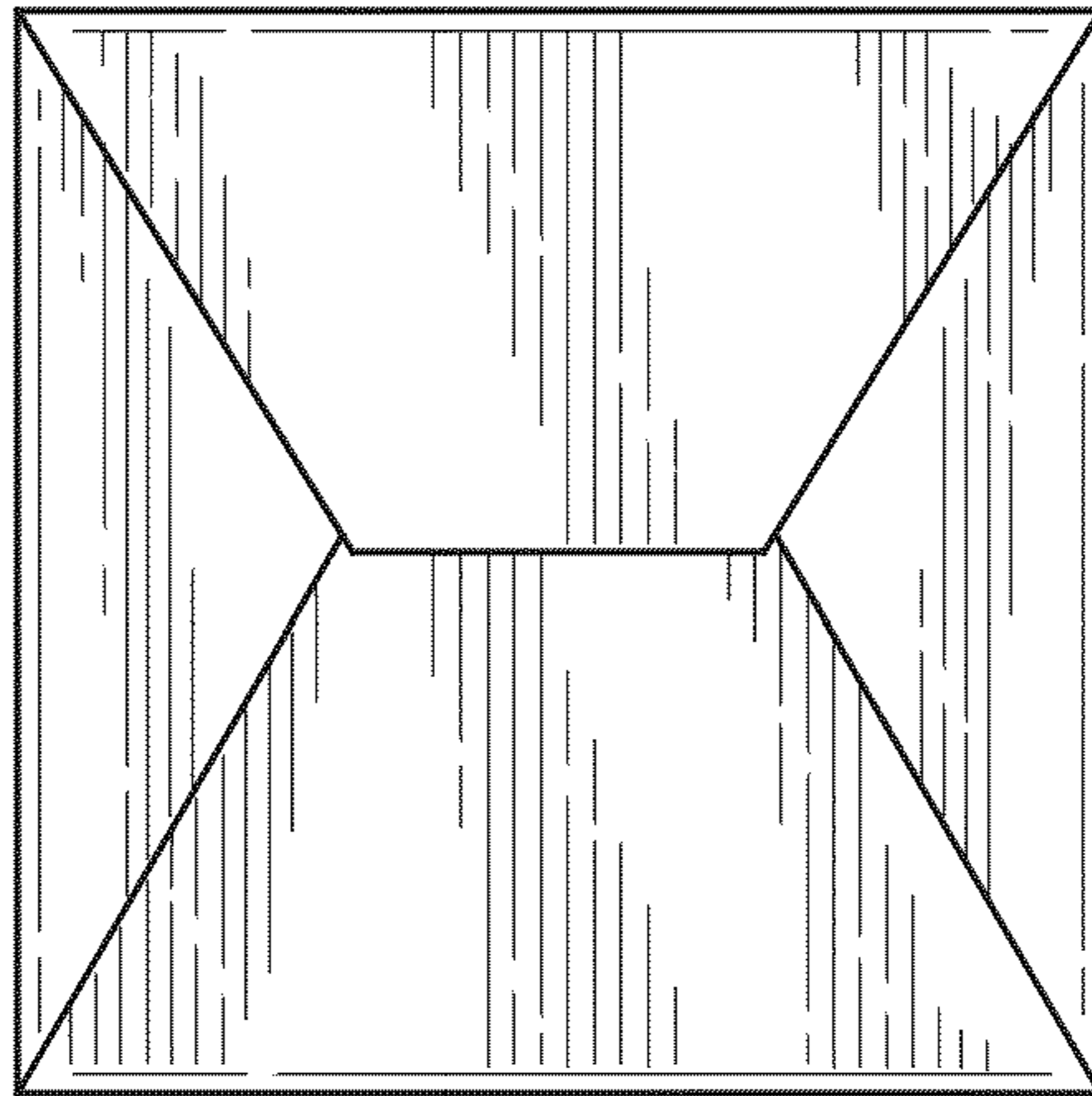

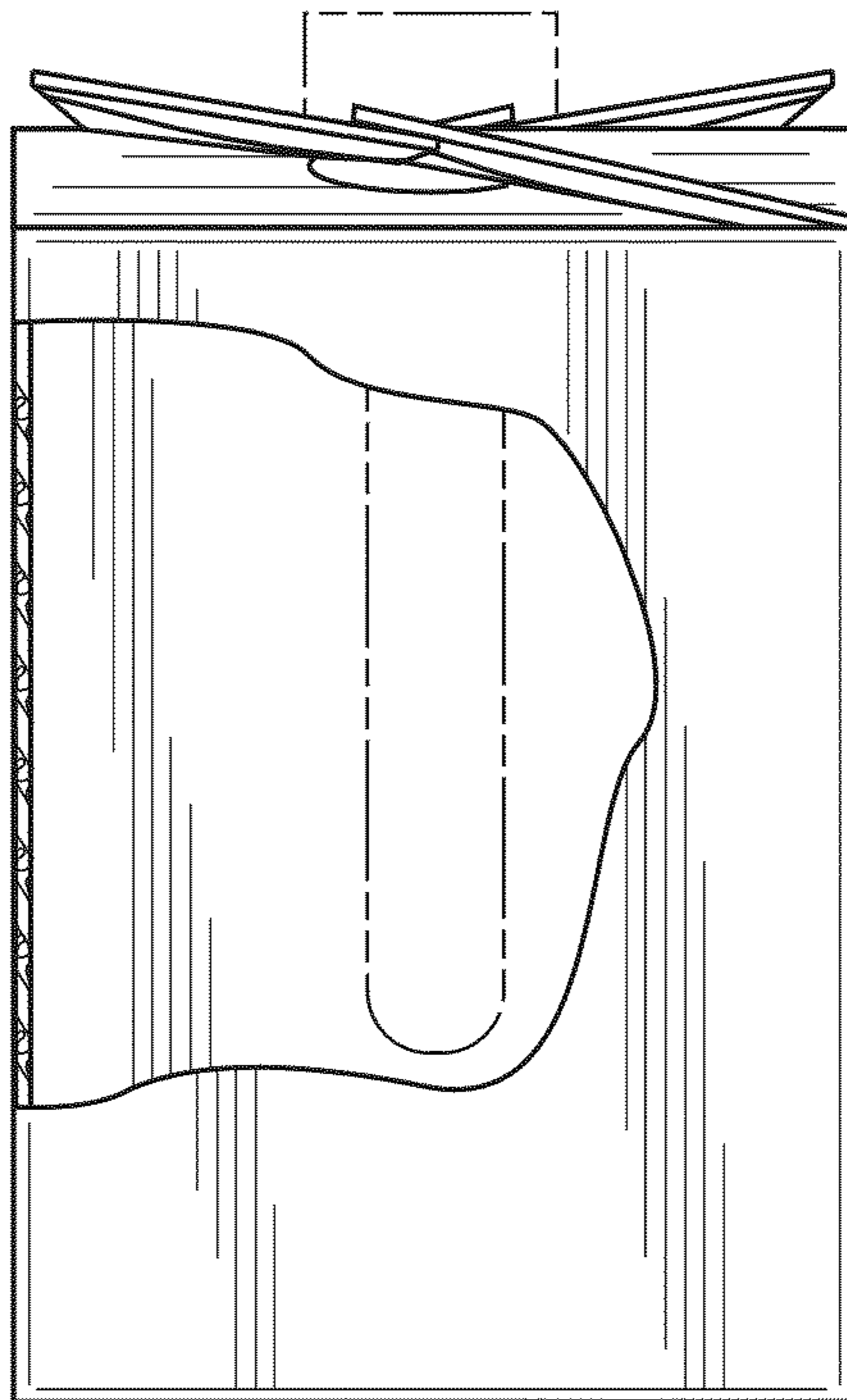

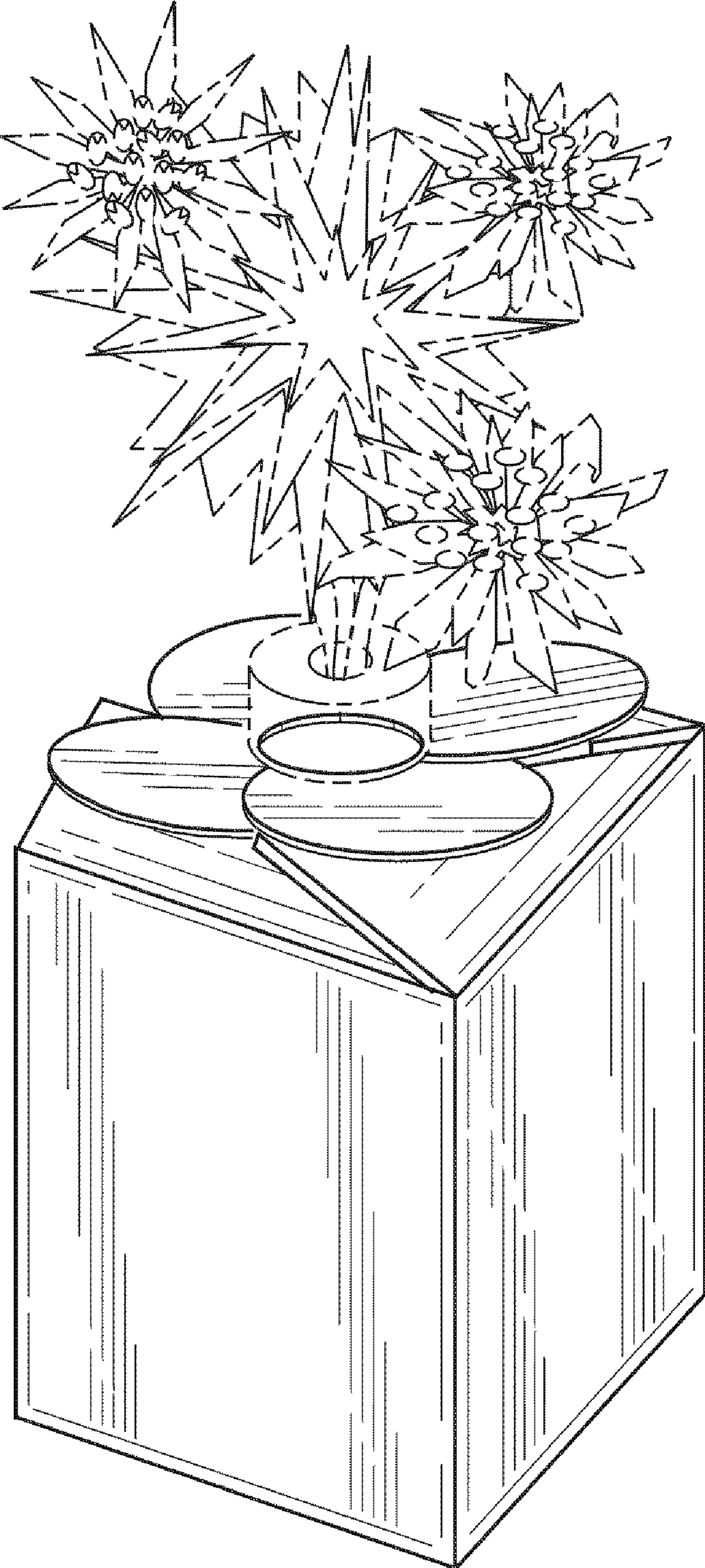

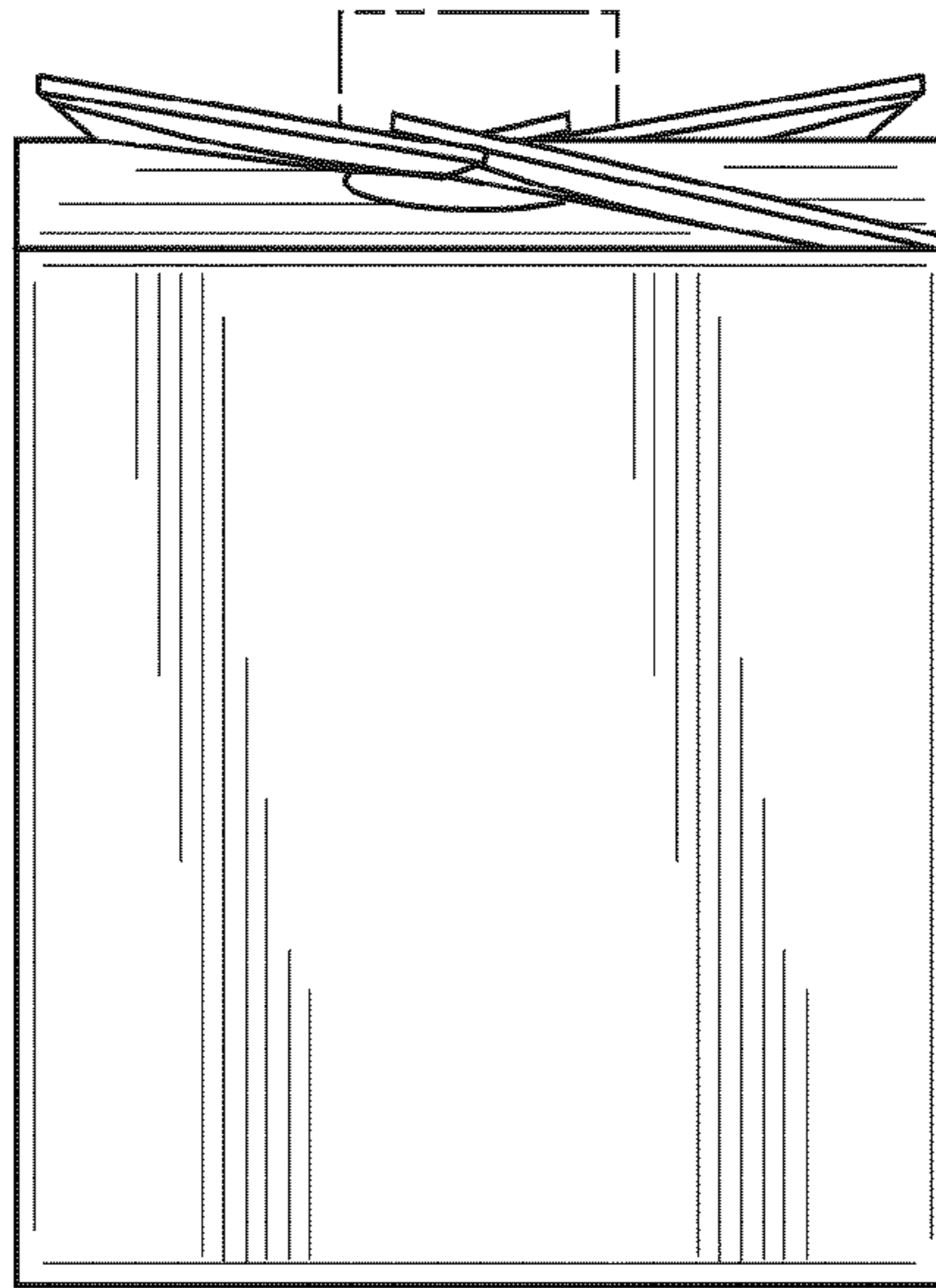

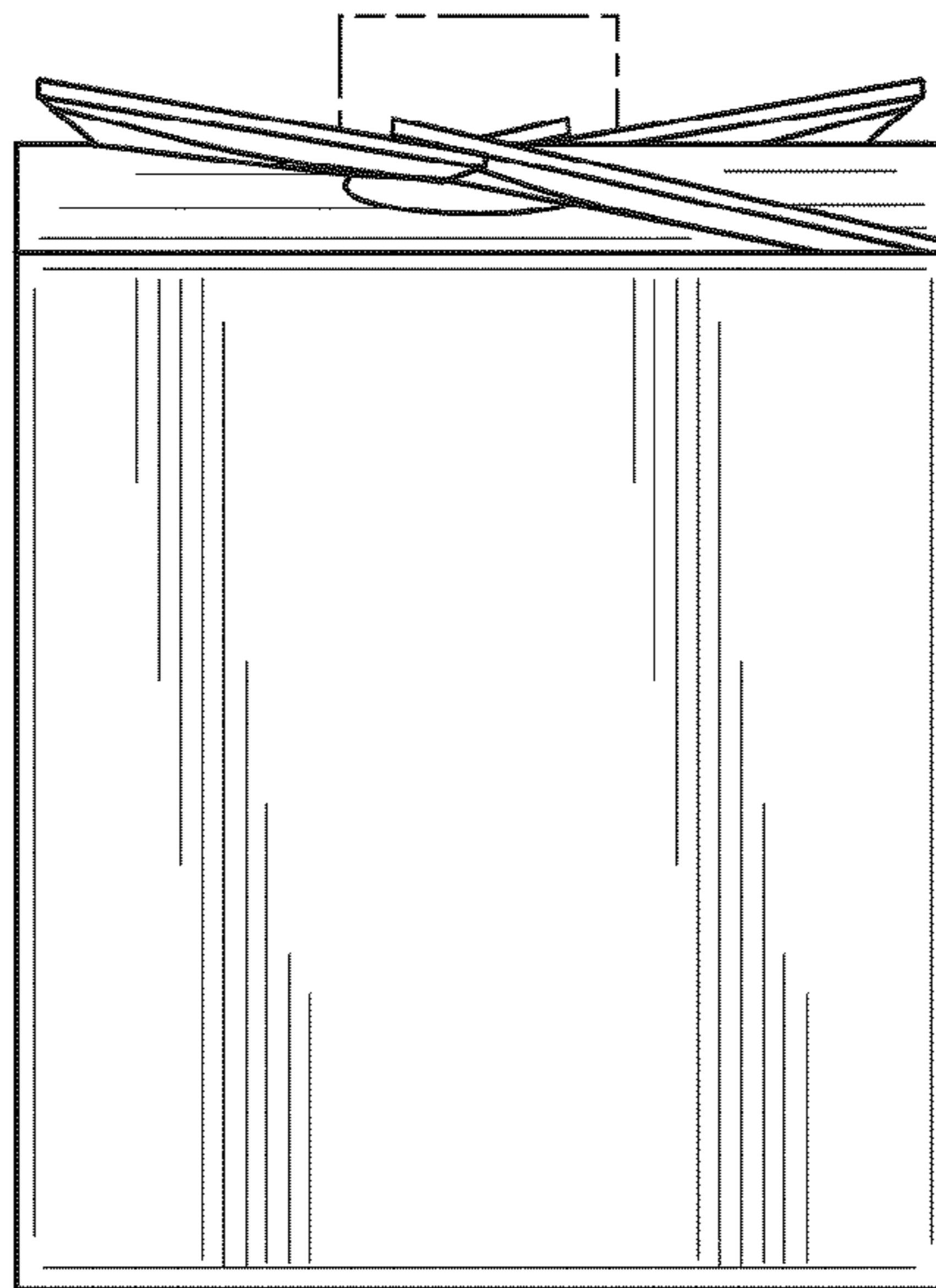

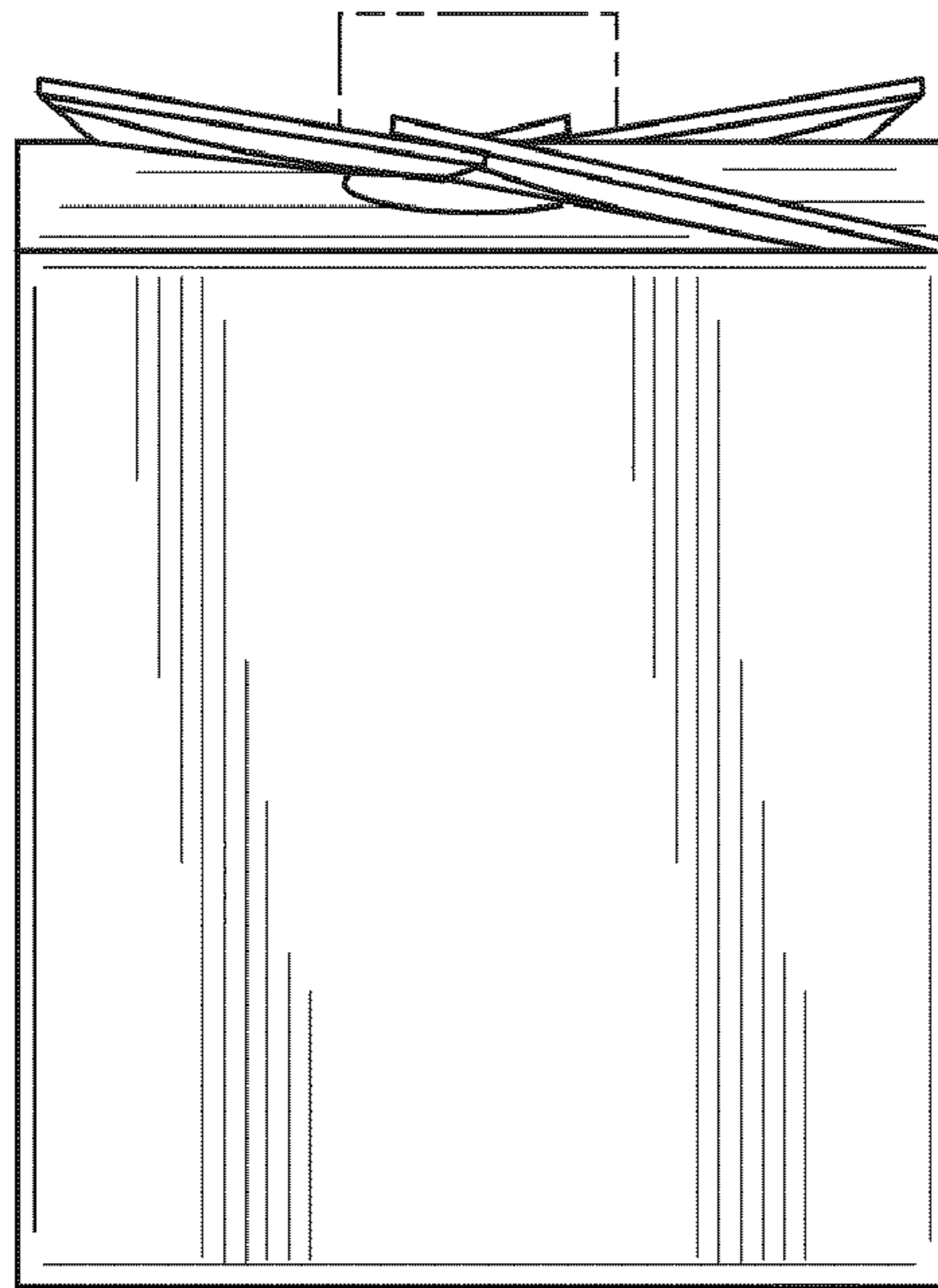

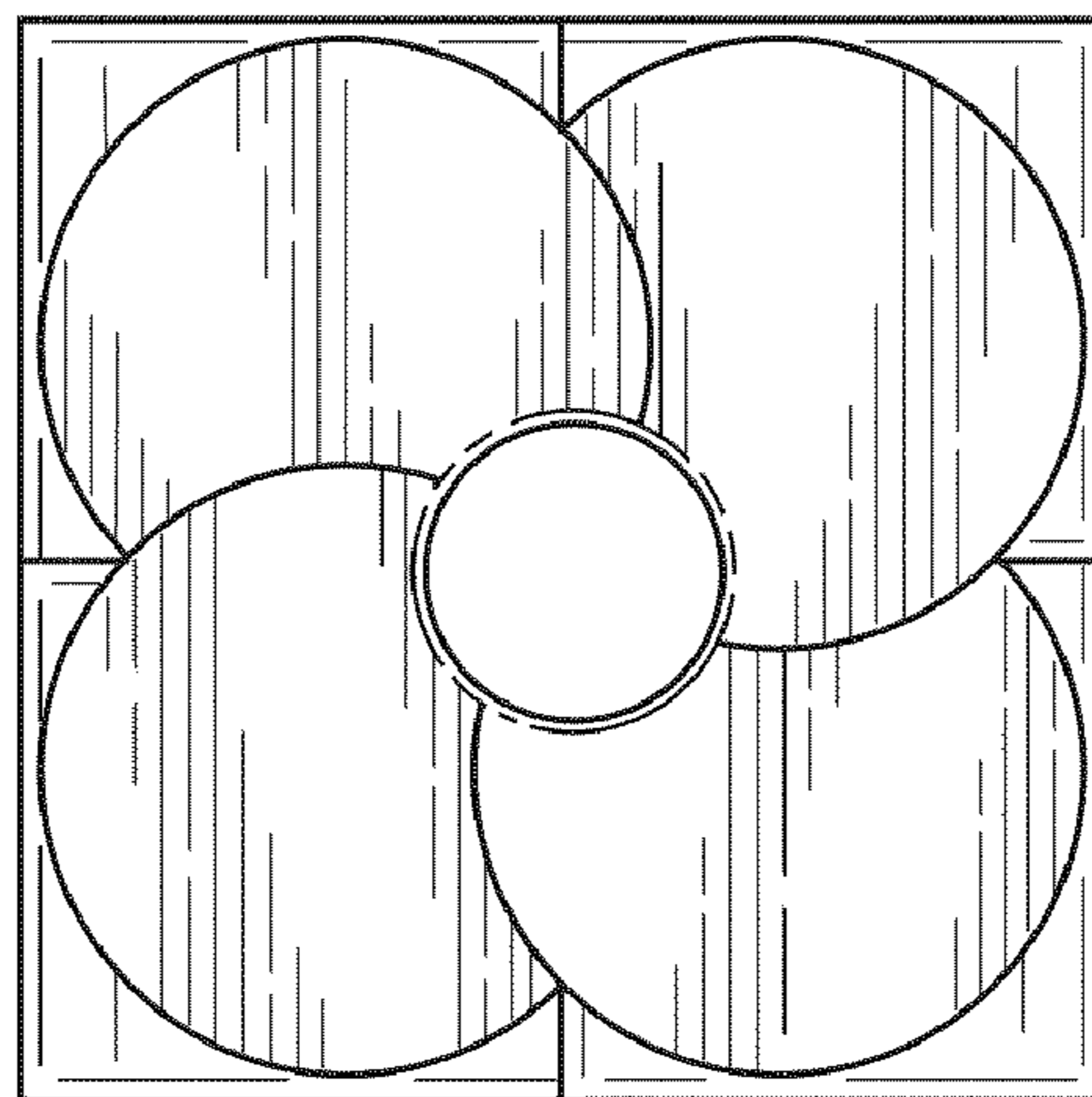

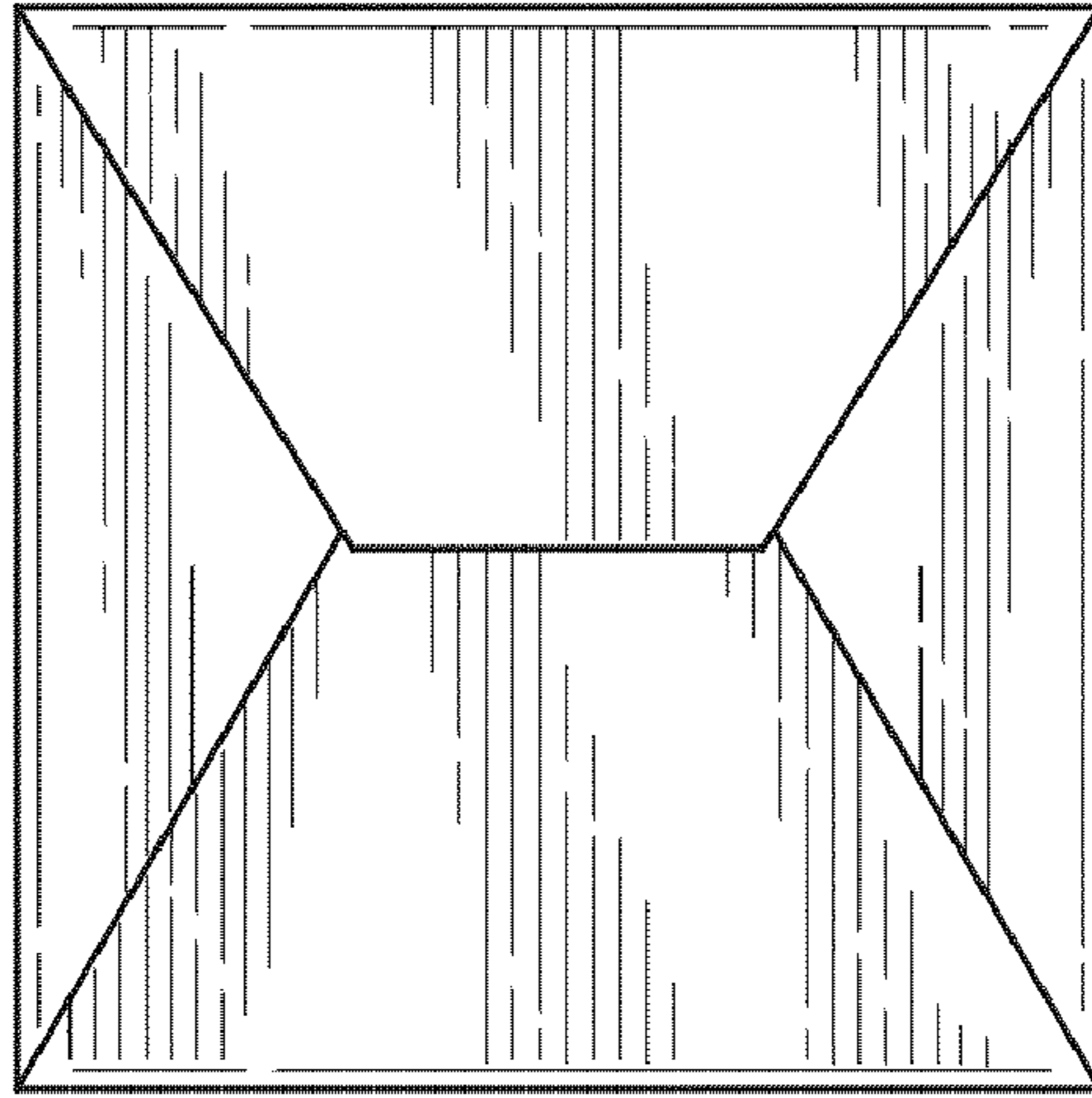

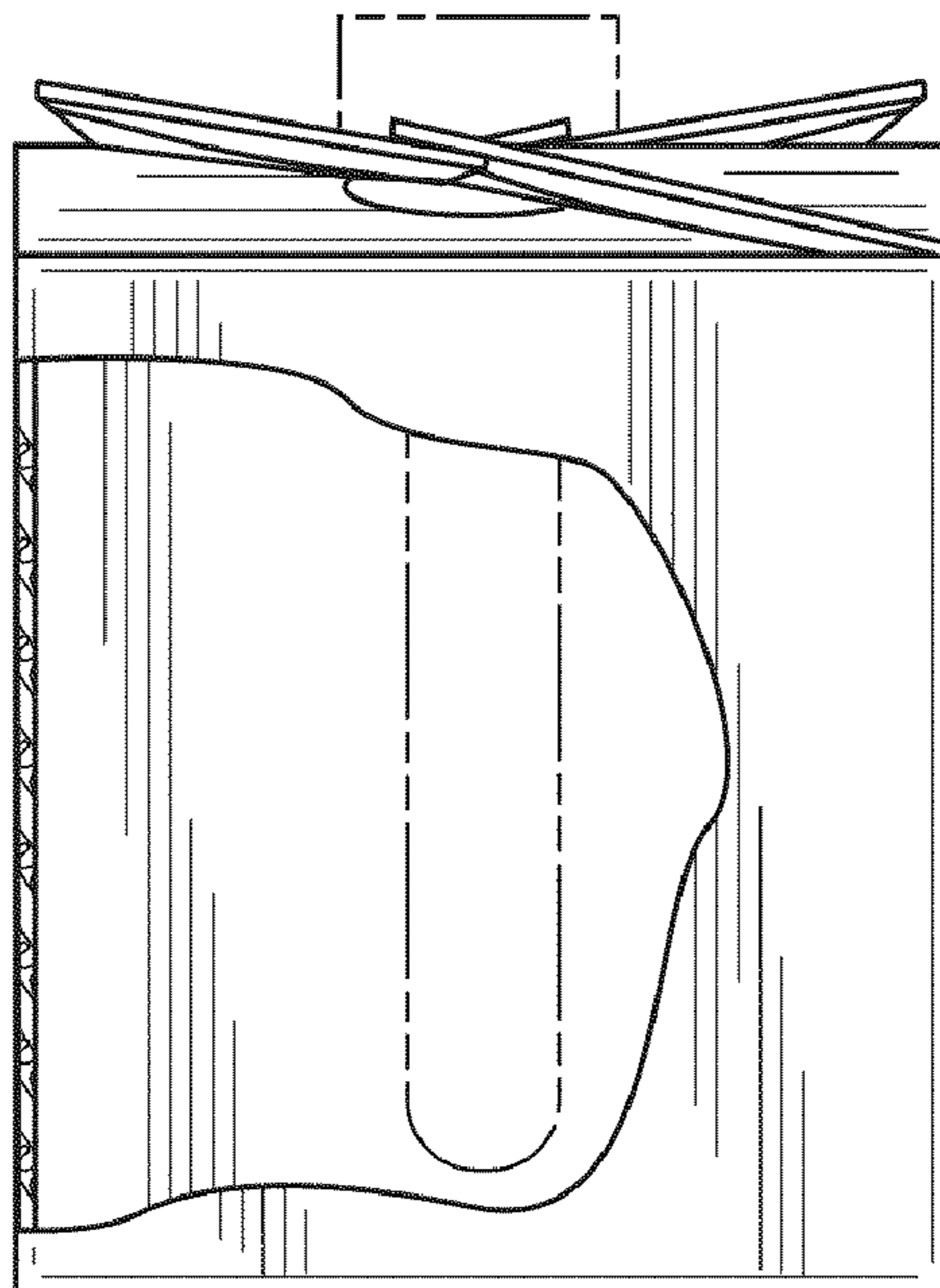
