DESCRIPTION

FIG. 3 is a top plan view of a sun visor with detachable bug guard;

FIG. 4 is a front elevation view of a sun visor with detachable bug guard;

FIG. 8 is an opposing side elevation view of a sun visor with detachable bug guard;

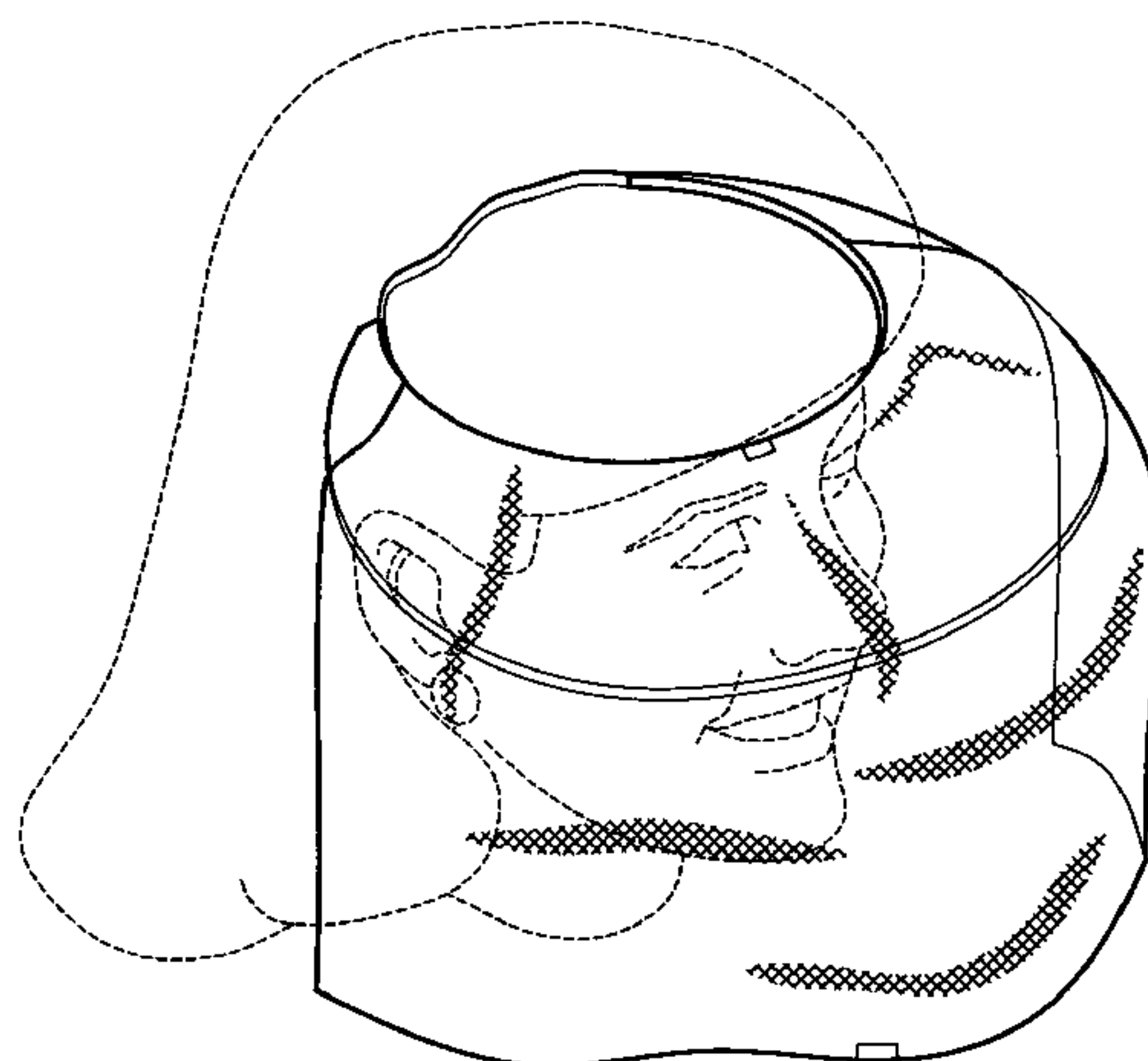
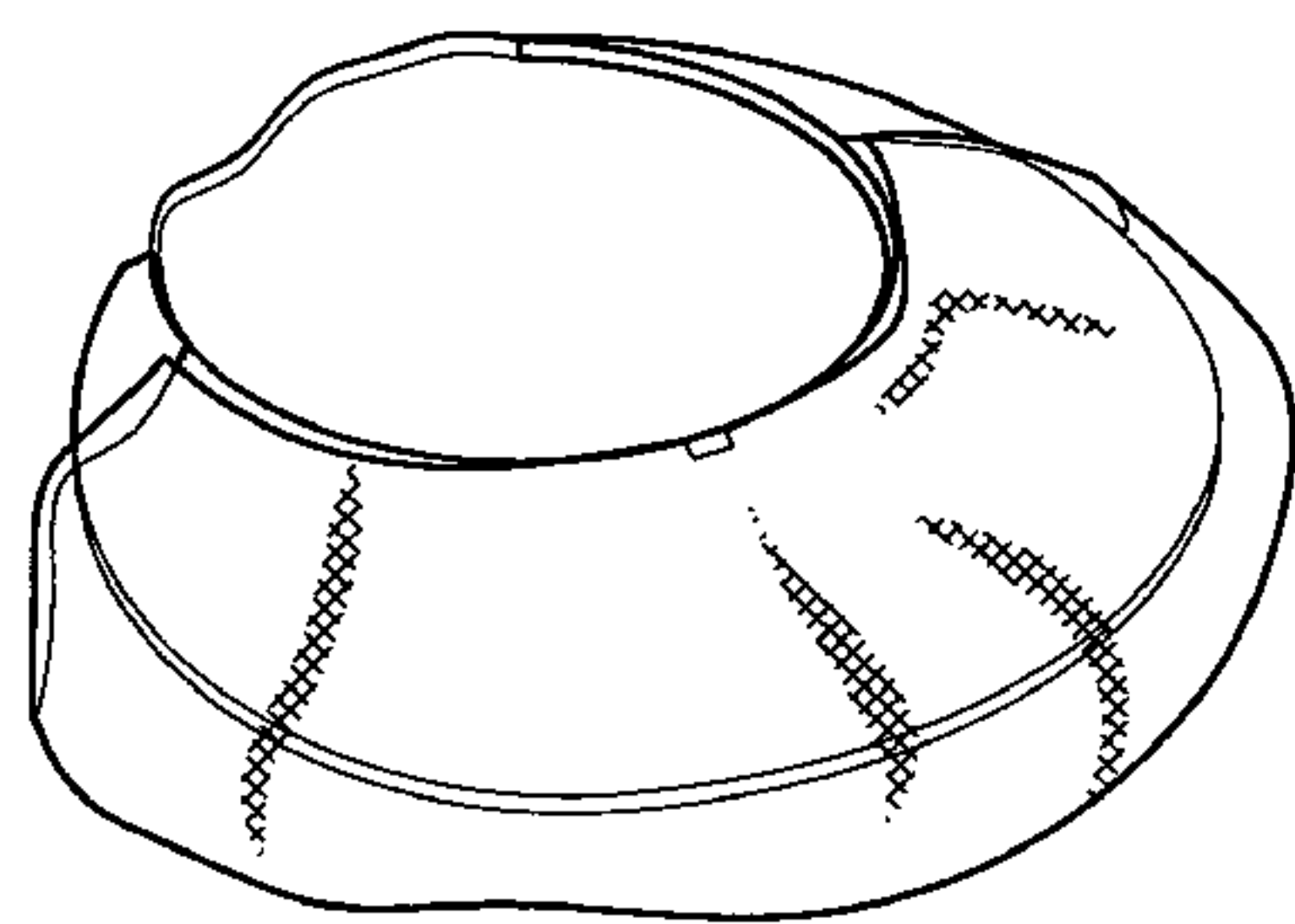
FIG. 9 is a front perspective view of a sun visor with detachable bug guard with the detachable bug guard shown in a retracted position; and,

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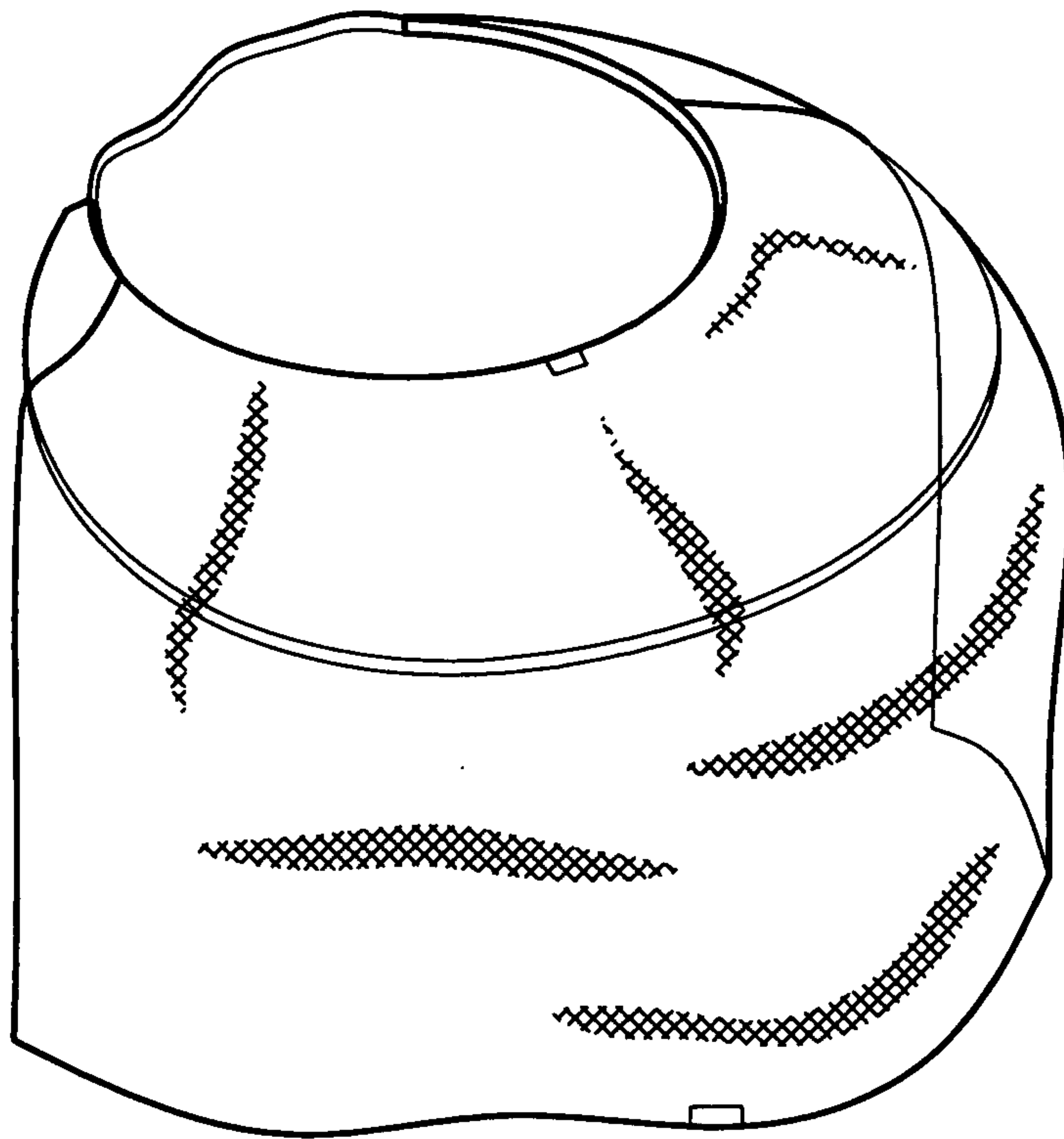

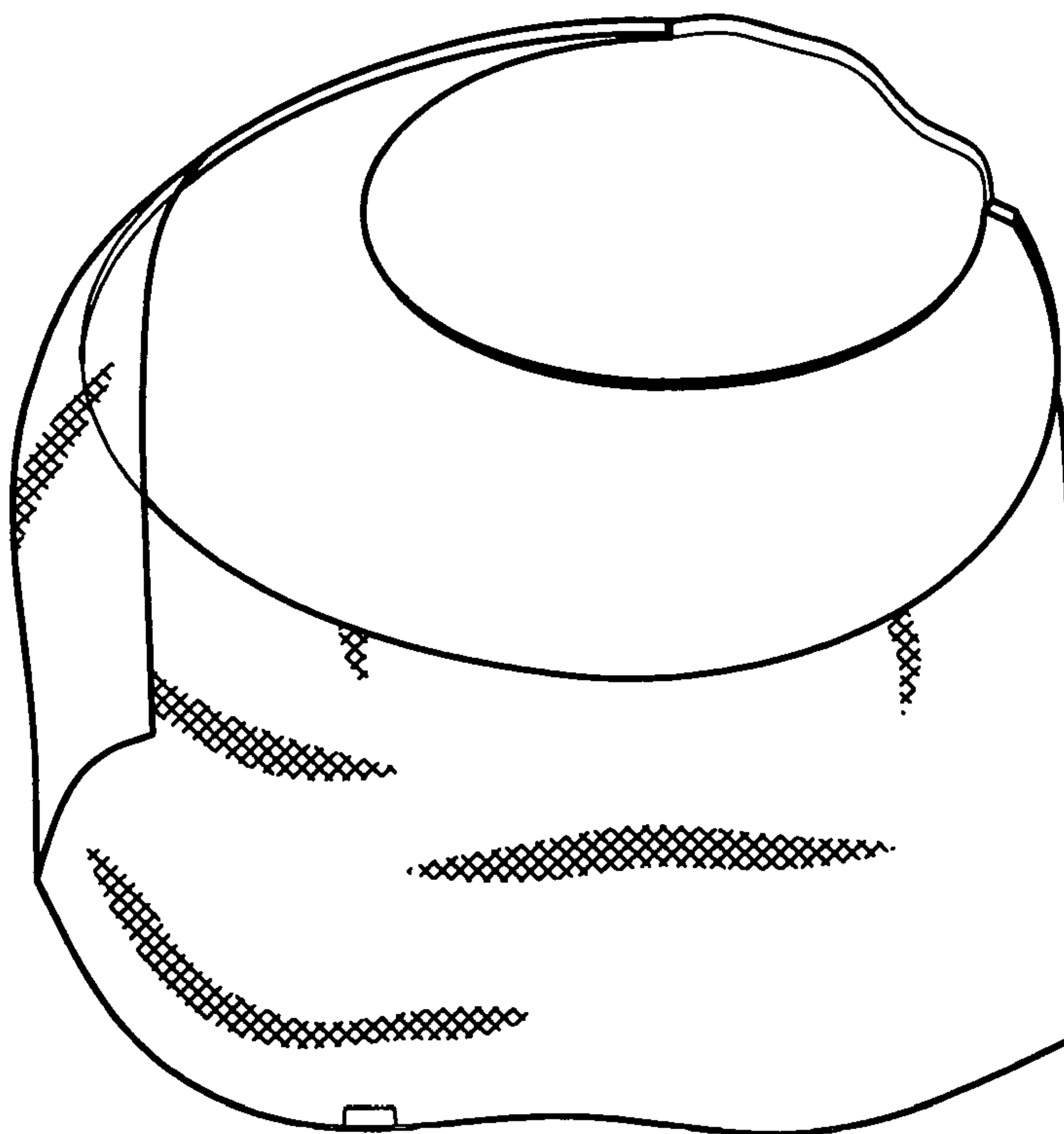

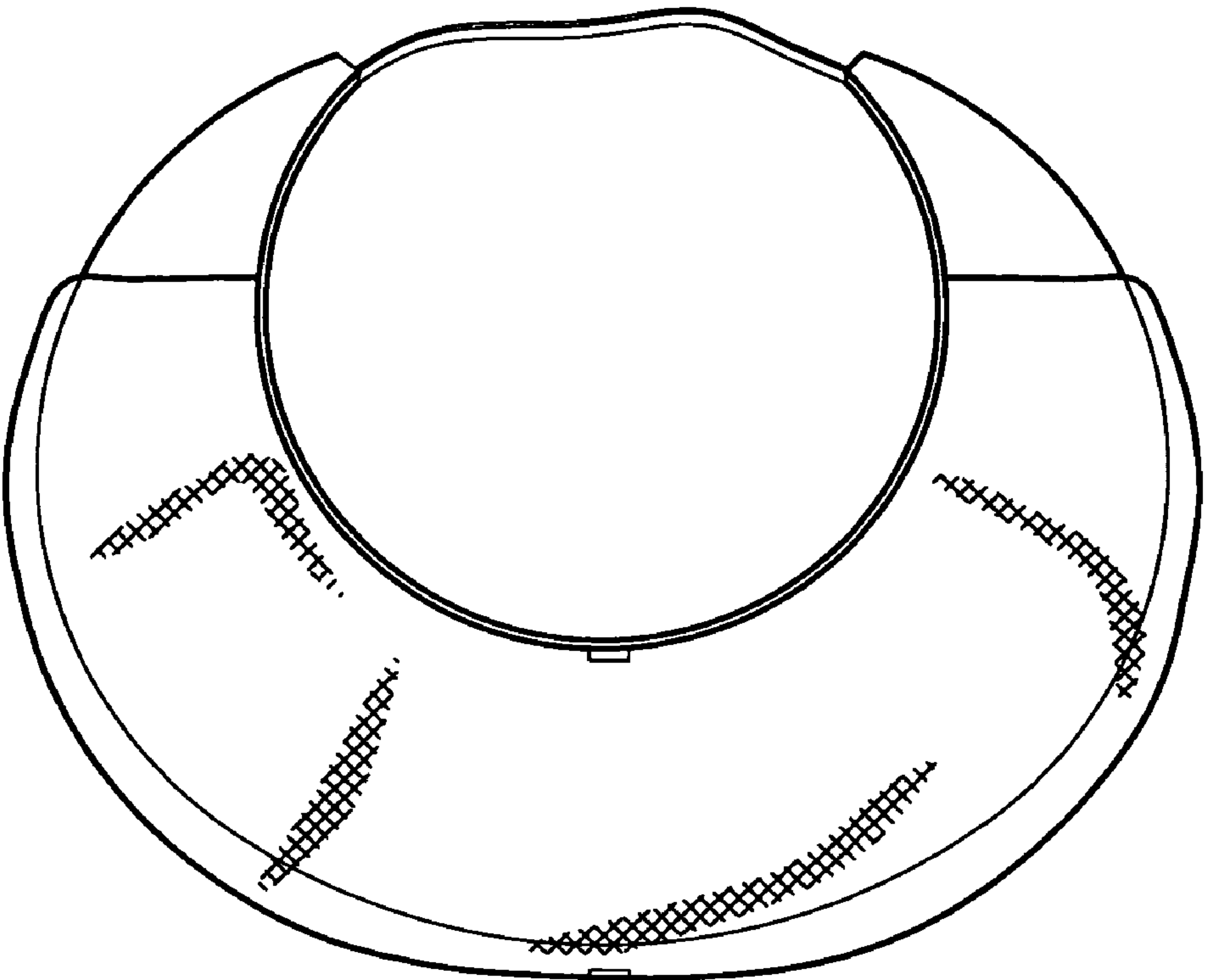

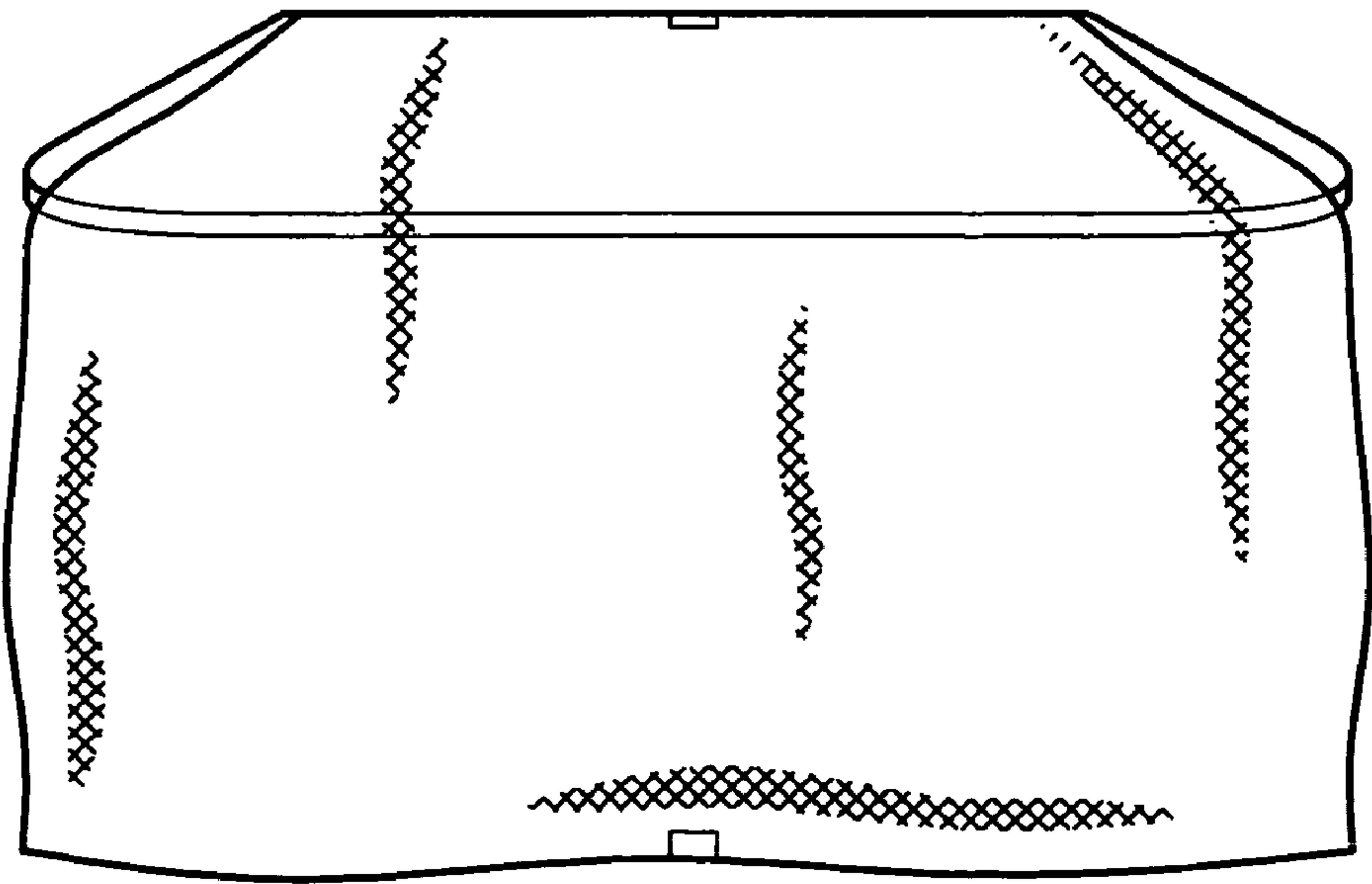

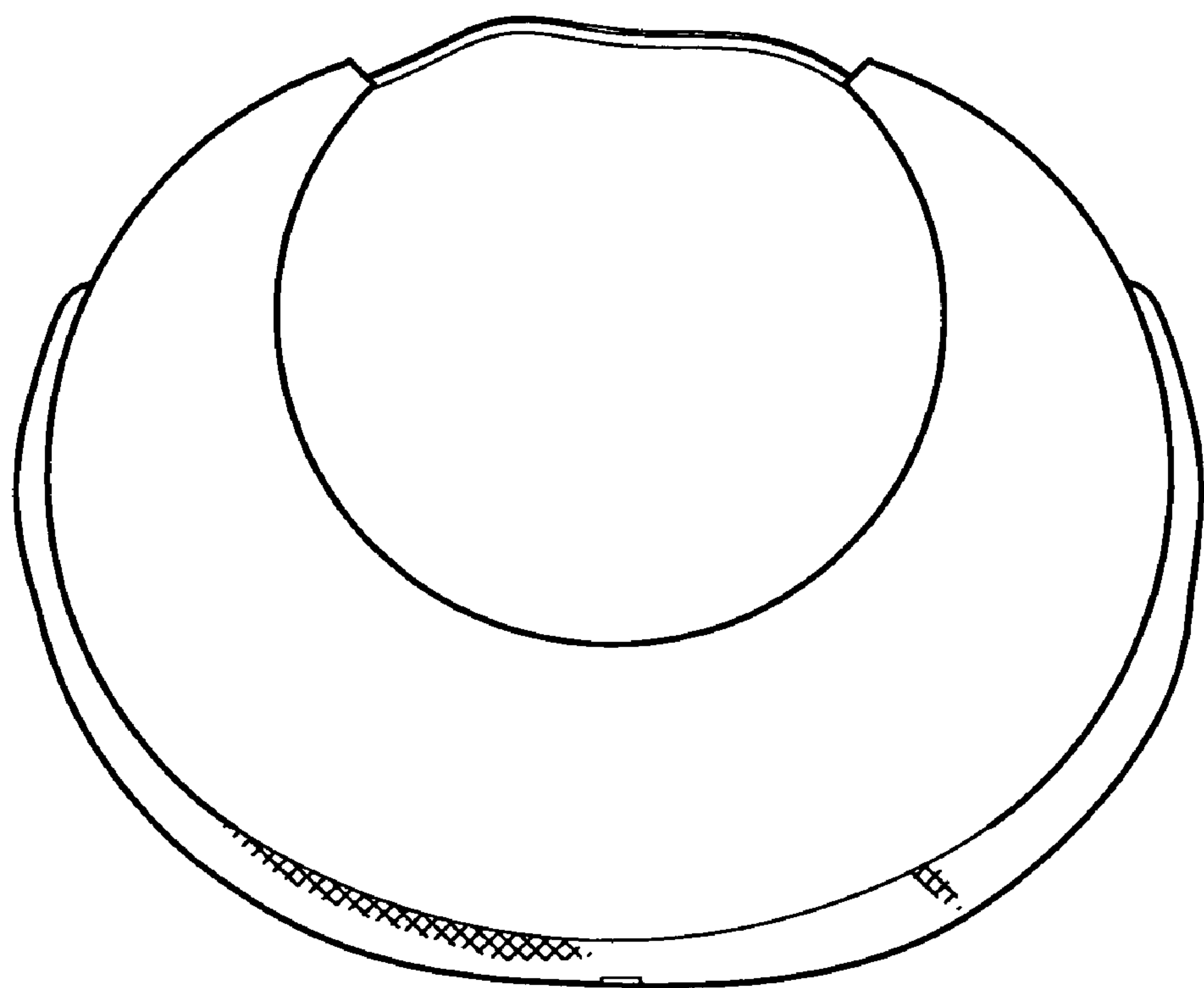

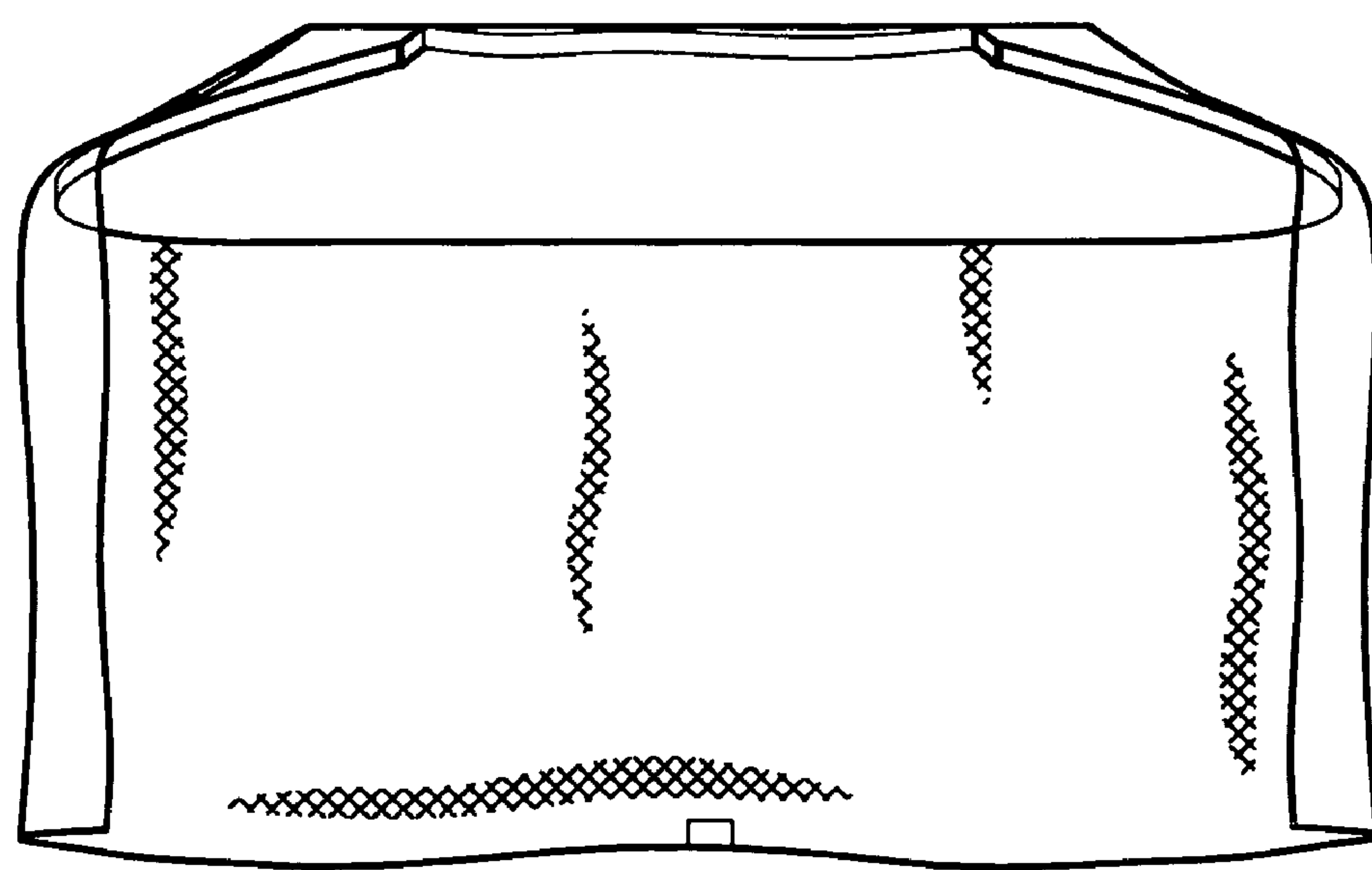

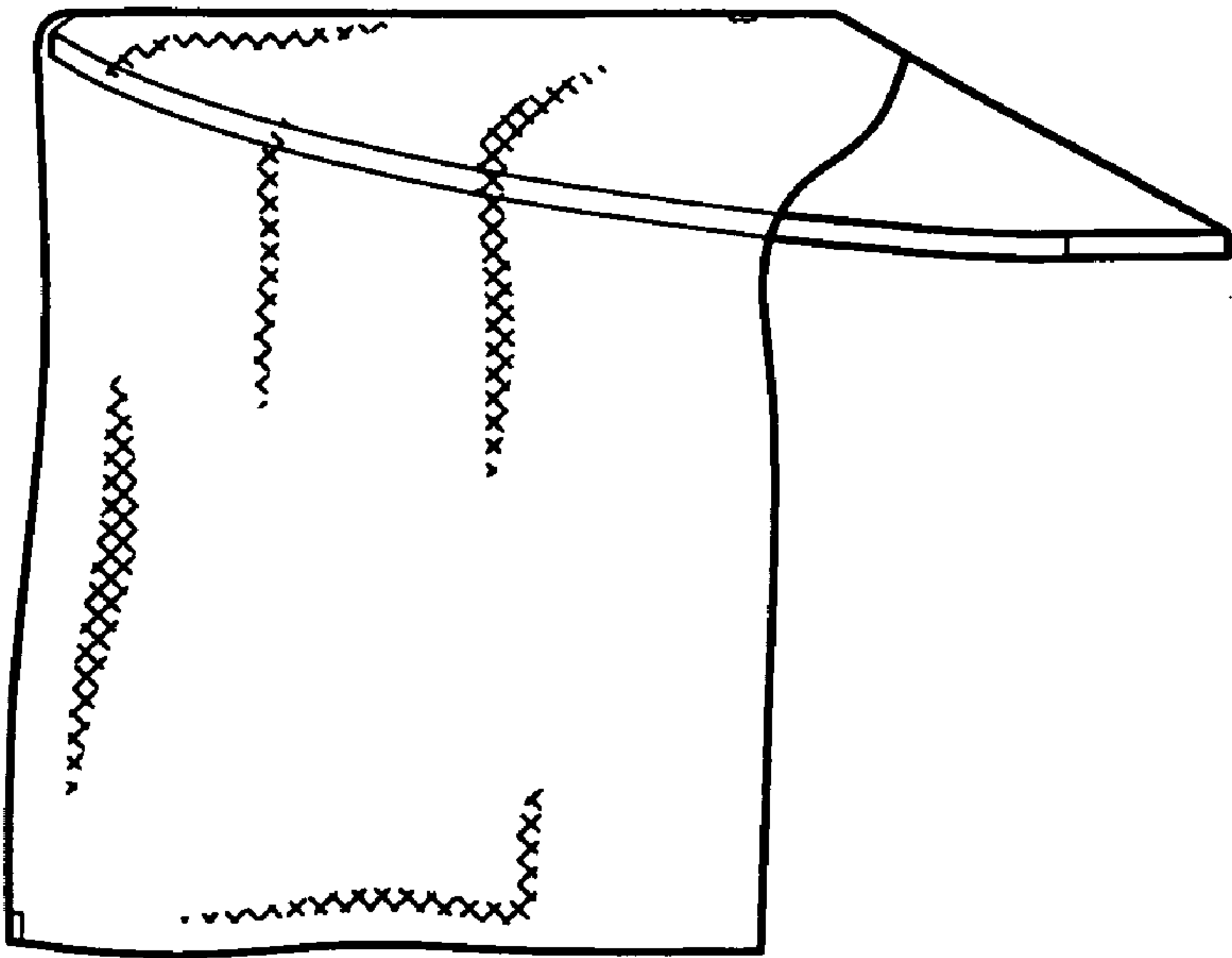

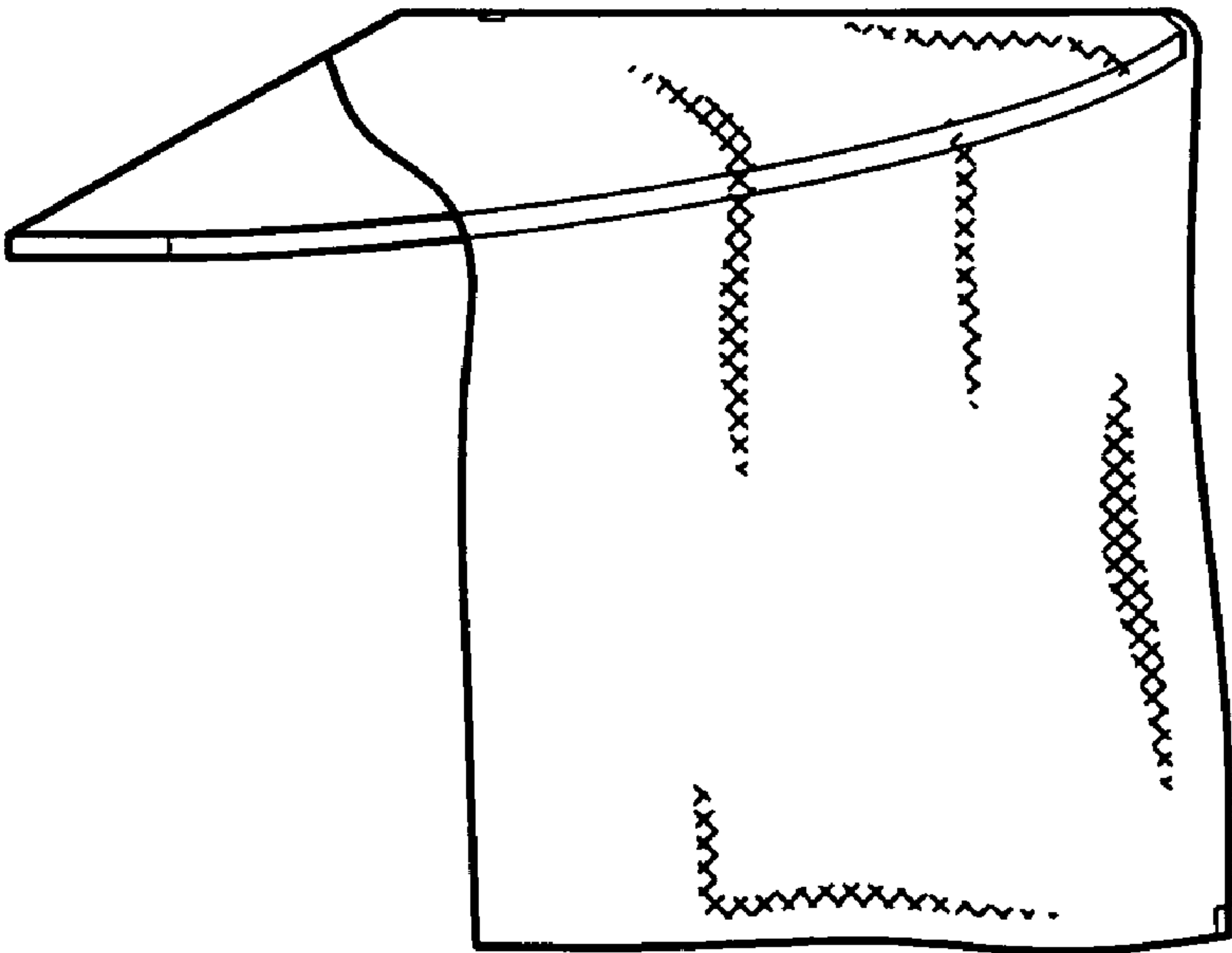

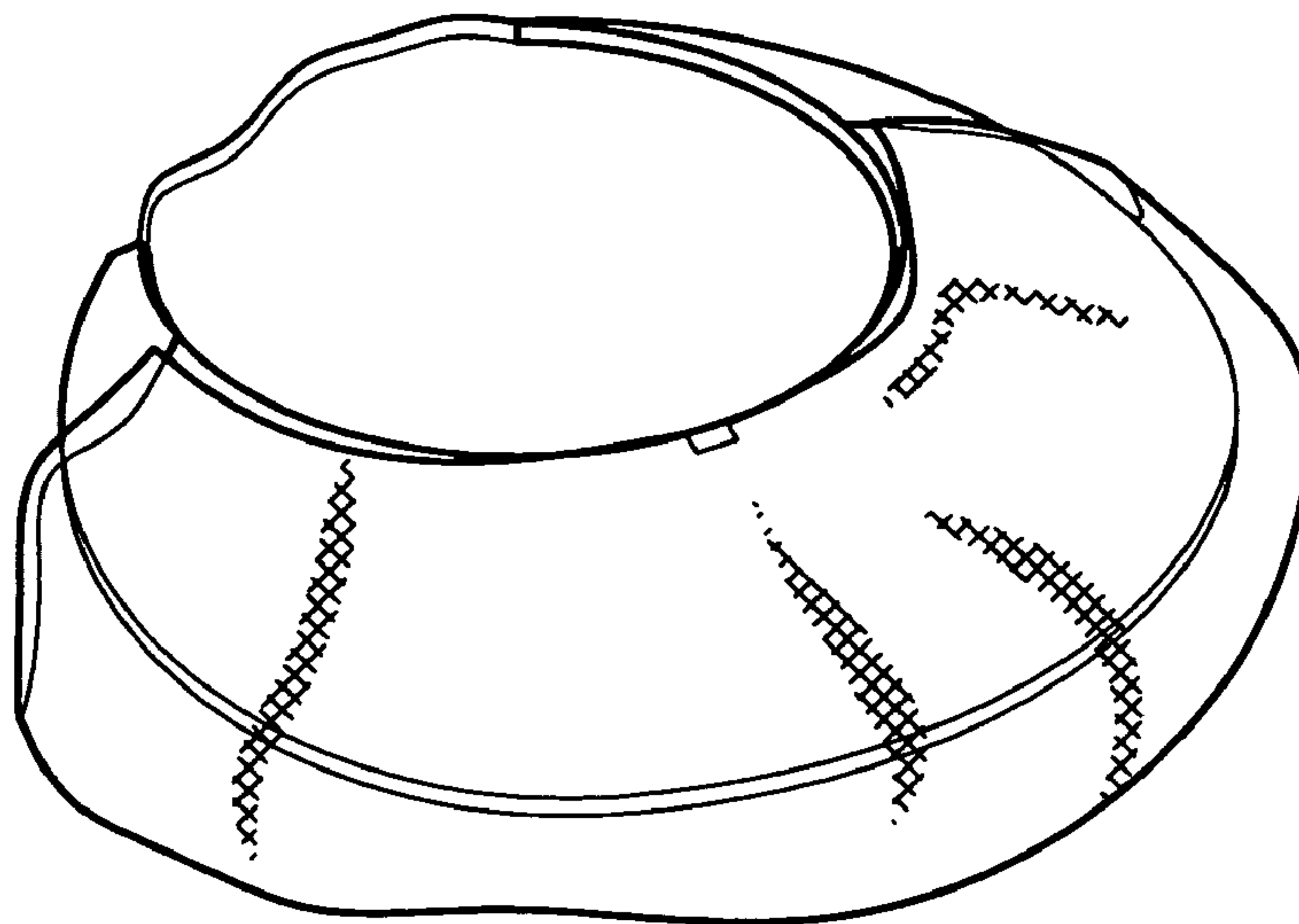

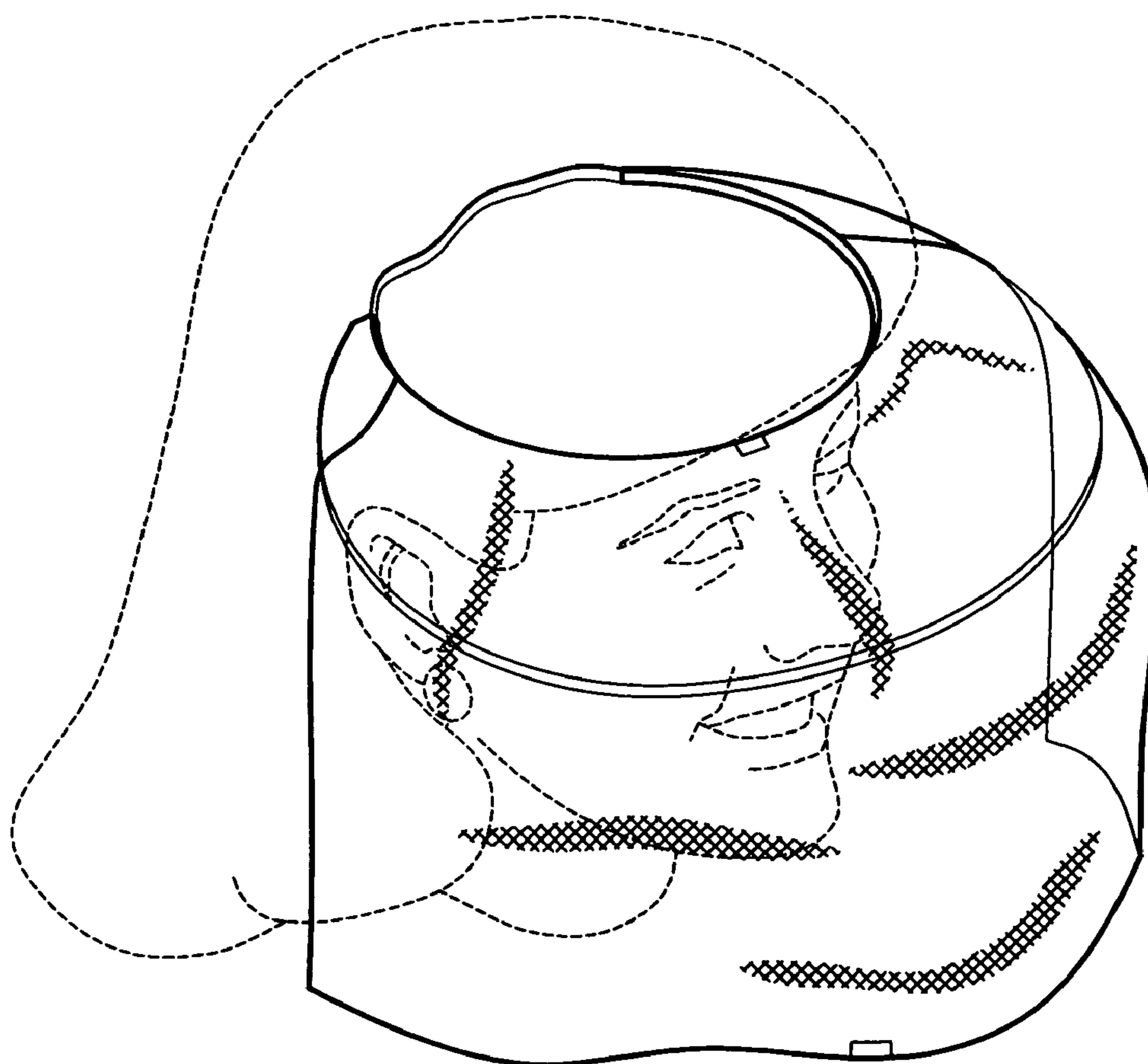
