(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a seat cushion with side storage pockets, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is the top view of the seat cushion with side storage pockets in an open position showing our new design;

FIG. 2. is the bottom view of the seat cushion with side storage pockets of FIG. 1 with attached straps in the closed position;

FIG. 3. is a bottom view of the seat cushion with side storage pockets of FIG. 1 with attachable straps in the open position;

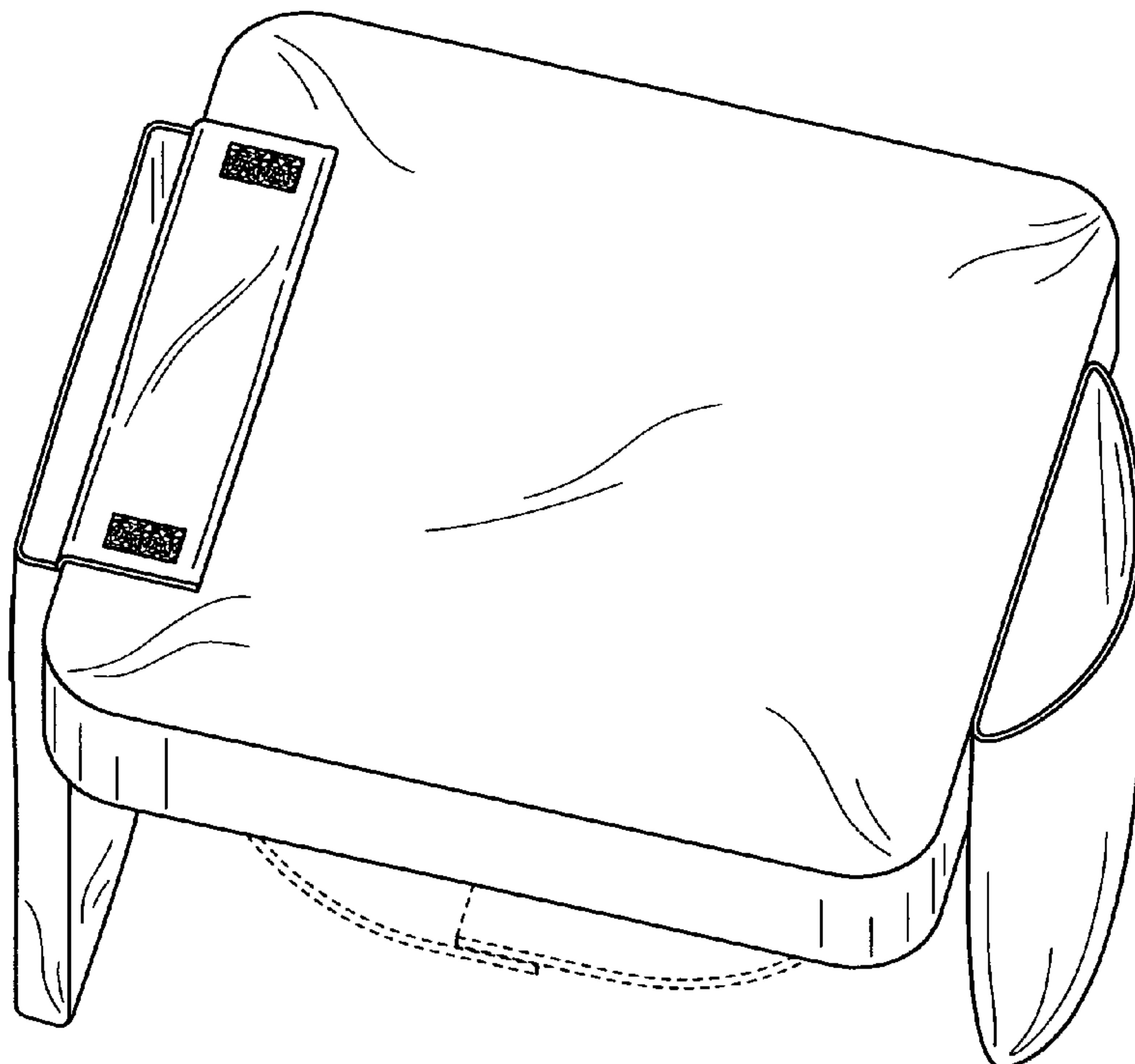
FIG. 4. is a single side view of the seat cushion with side storage pockets of FIG. 1

FIG. 5. is the opposite side view of the seat cushion with side storage pockets of FIG. 1; and,

FIG. 6. is a front to back perspective of the seat cushion with side storages pockets of FIG. 1.

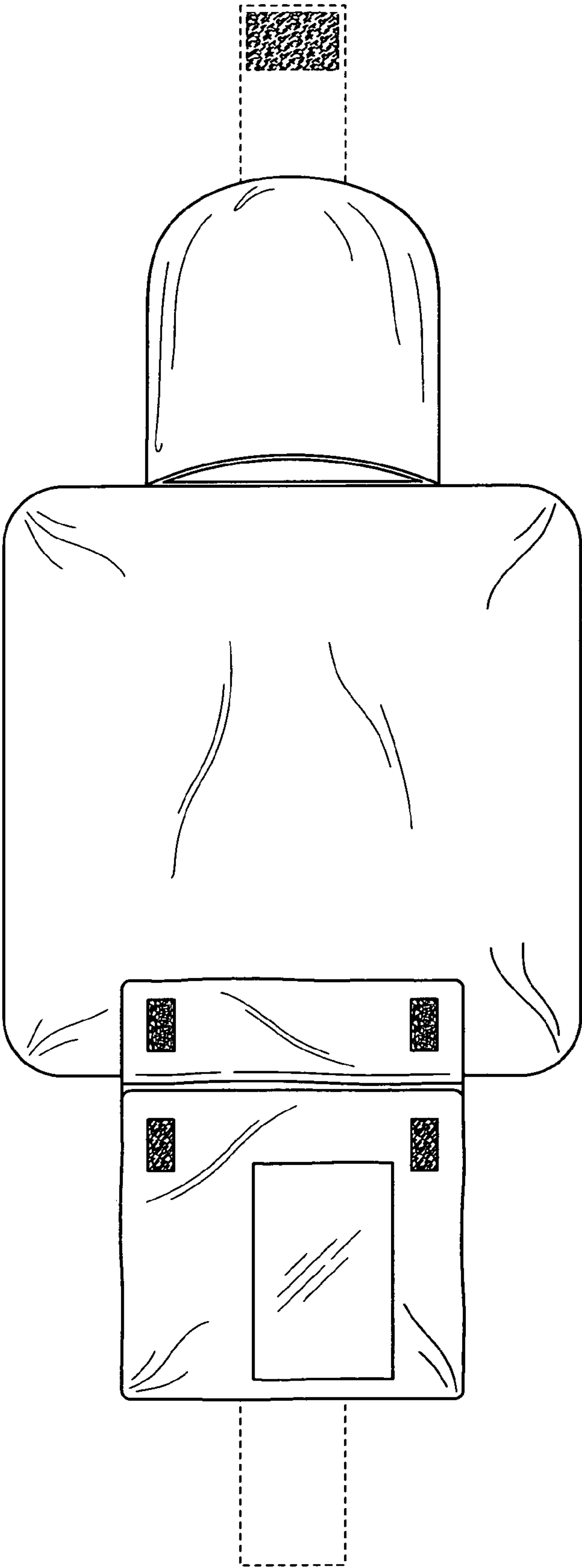

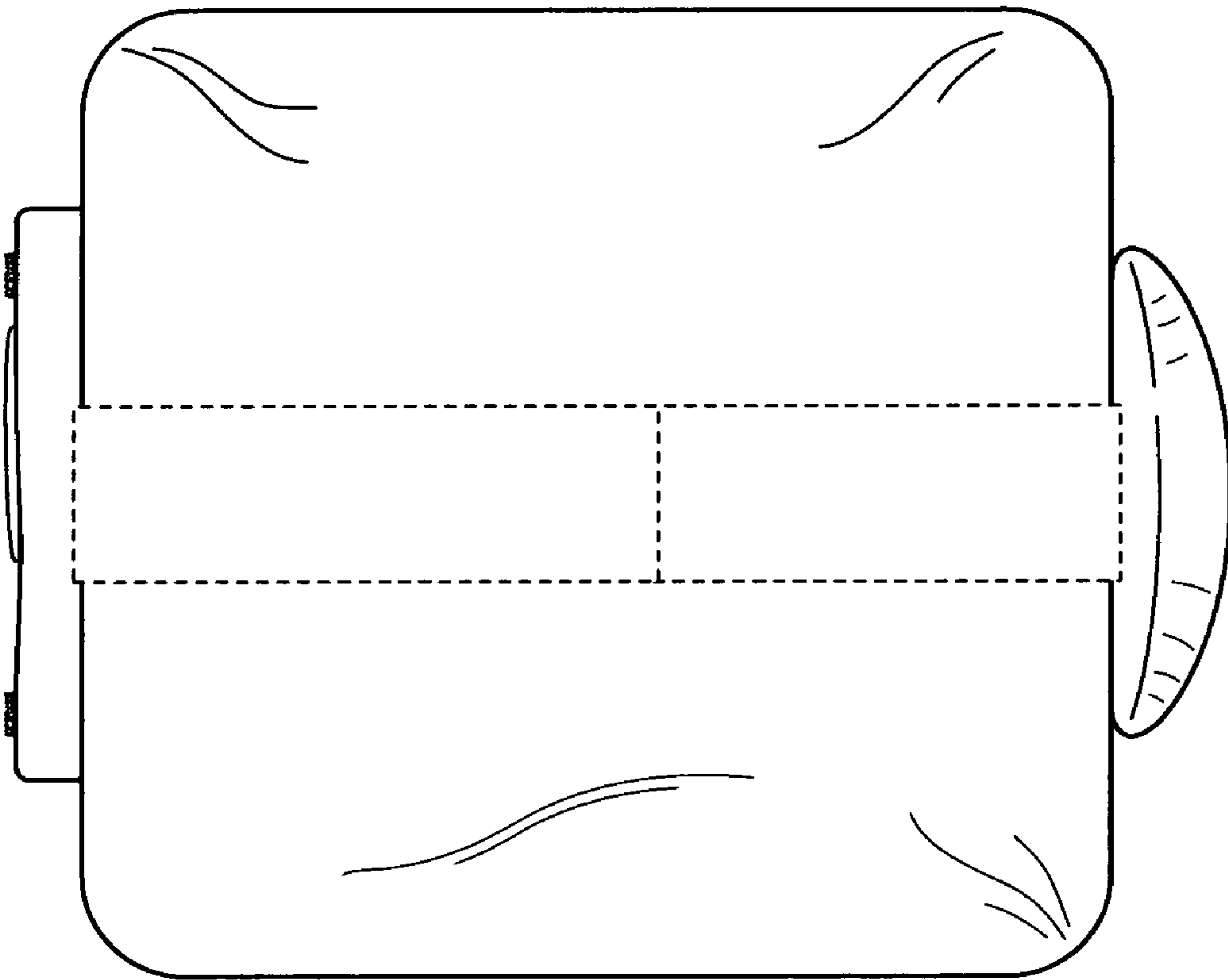

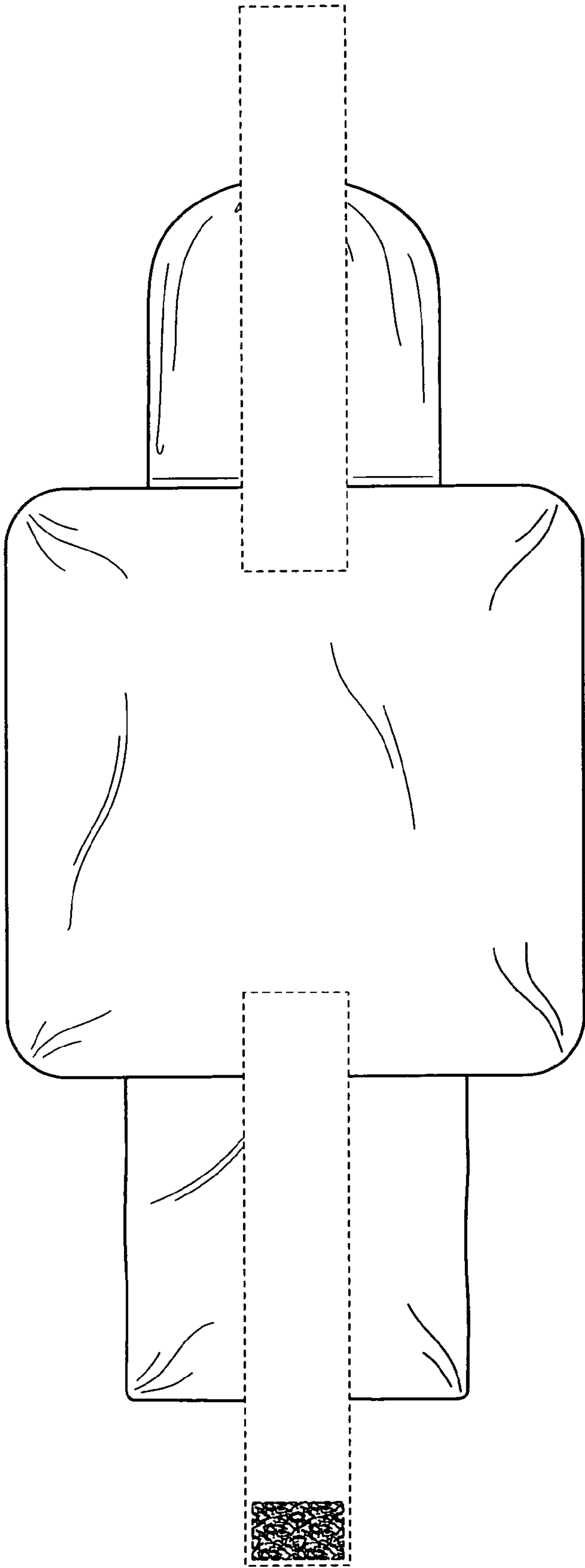

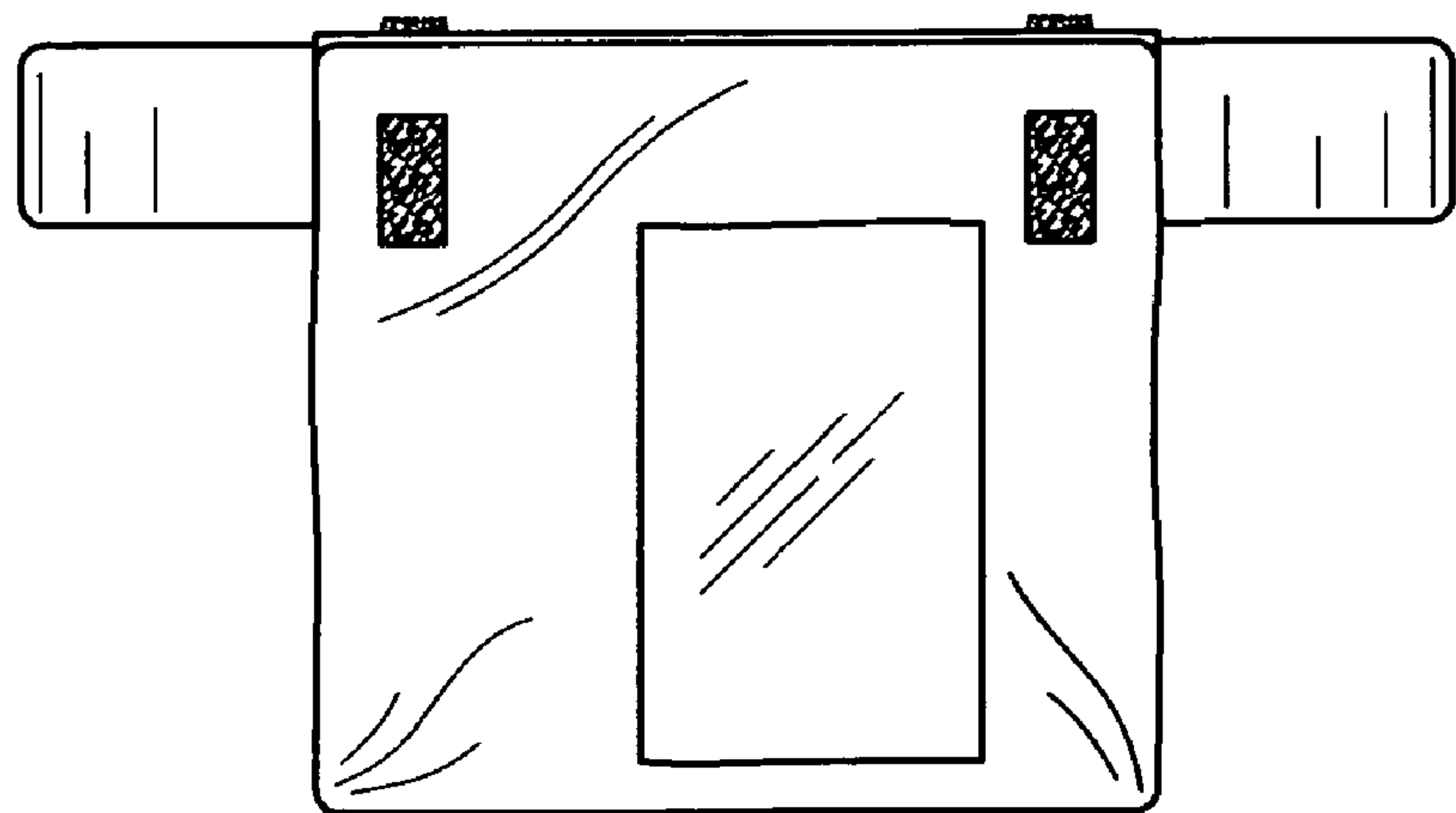

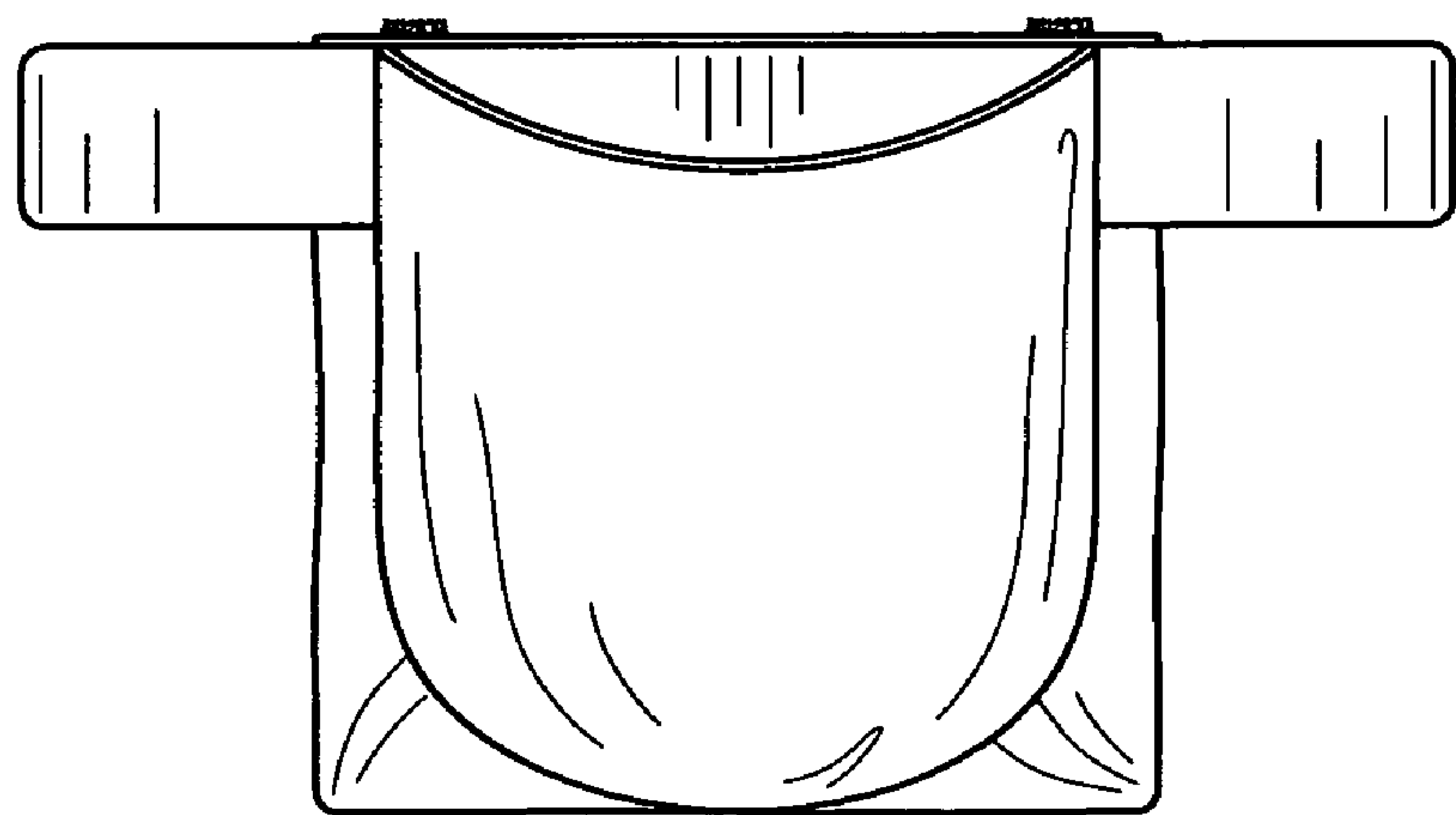

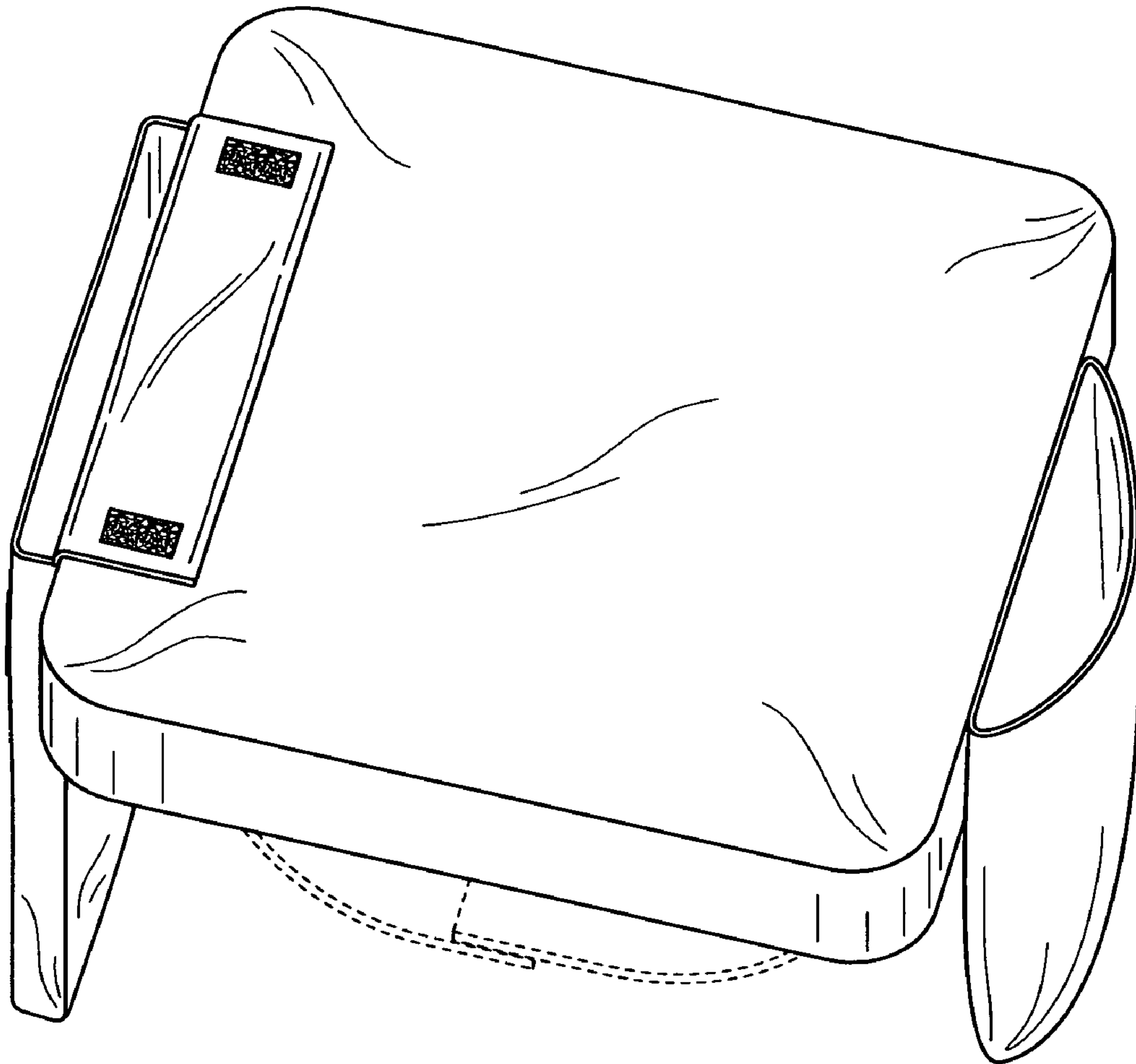
