(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a firewood rack, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front side elevational view wherein the rear side elevational view is a mirror image of the front side;

FIG. 2 is a top plan view;

FIG. 3 is a bottom plan view;

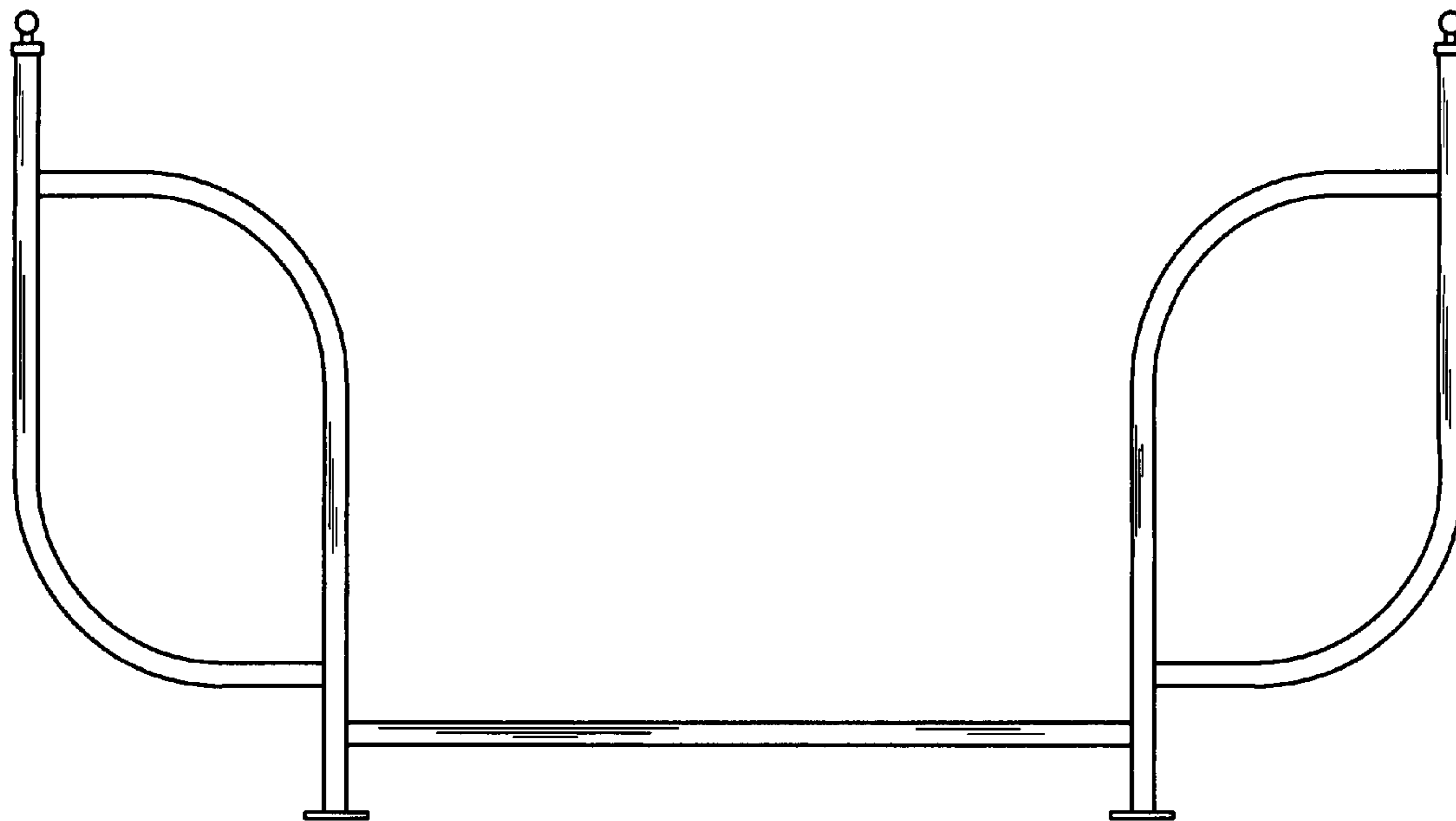
FIG. 4 is a left side elevational view wherein the right side elevational view is a mirror image of the left side; and,

FIG. 5 is an enlarged detail taken from FIG. 4

The broken lines in the drawing represent unclaimed environmental subject matter.

The firewood rack allows user to separate and organize wood such as flavored smoker wood, seasoned, green wood, and wood of different lengths.

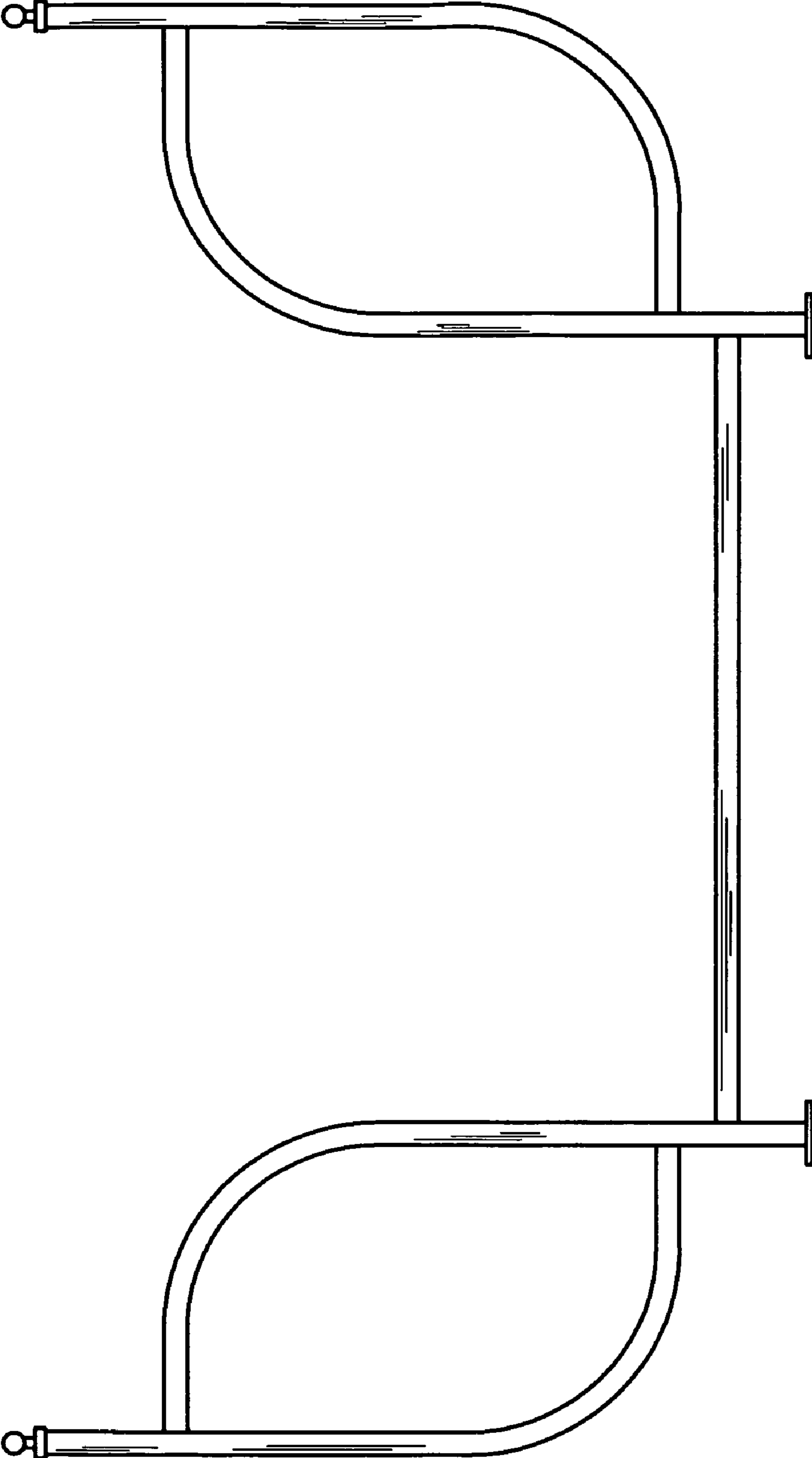

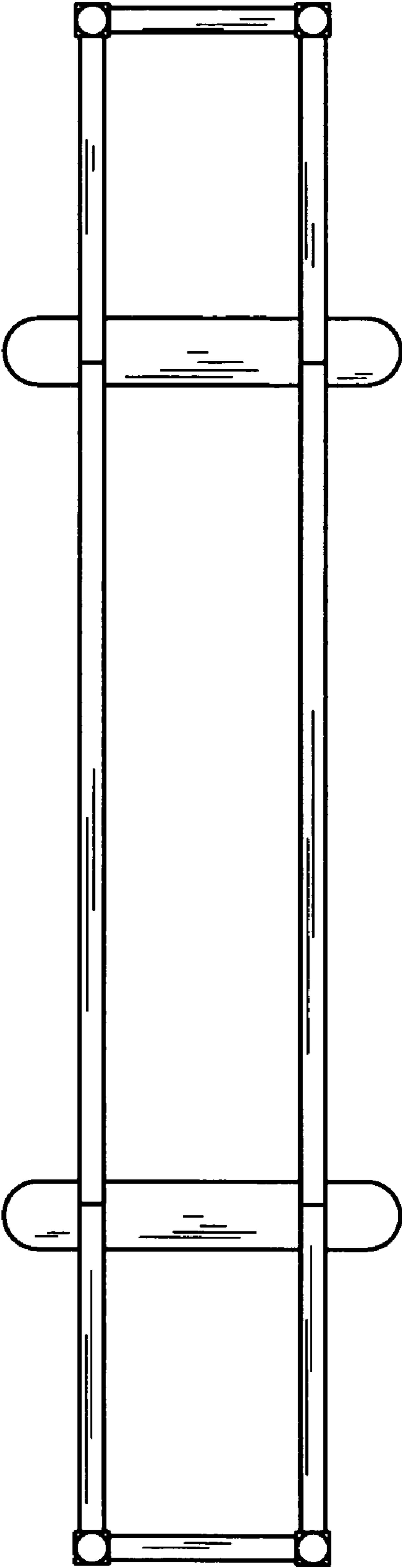

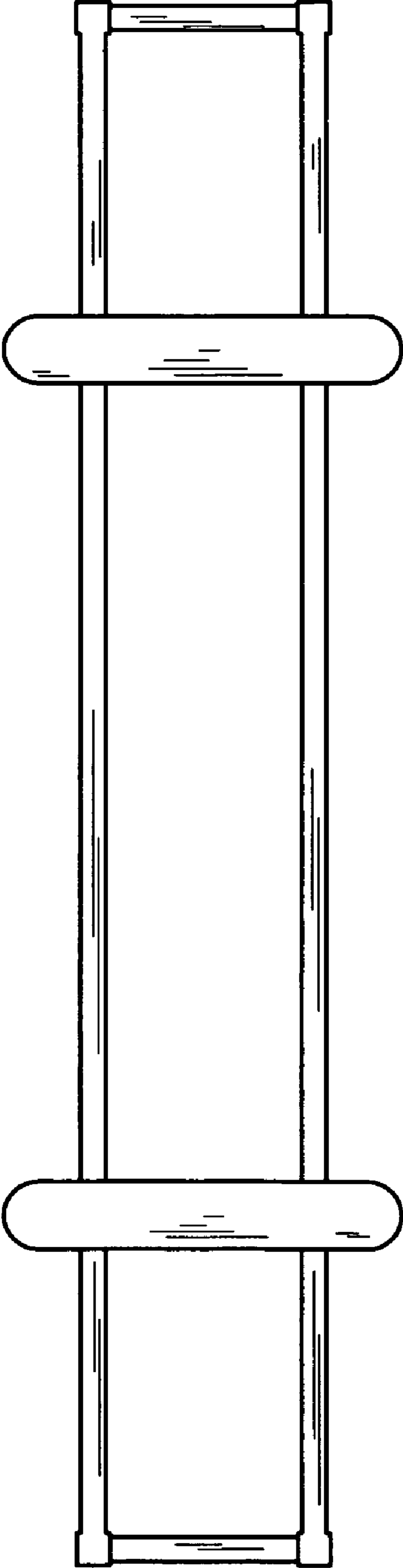

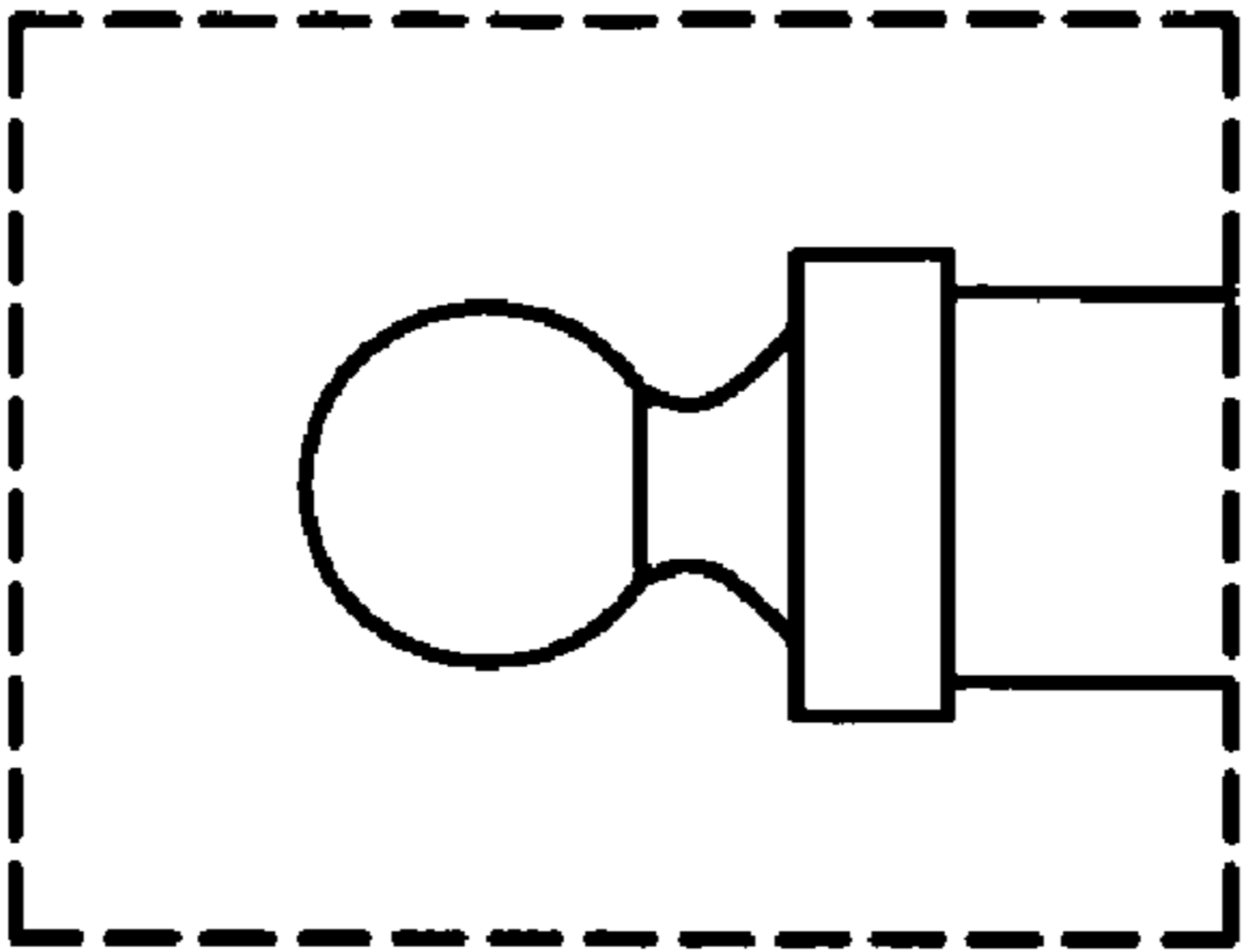

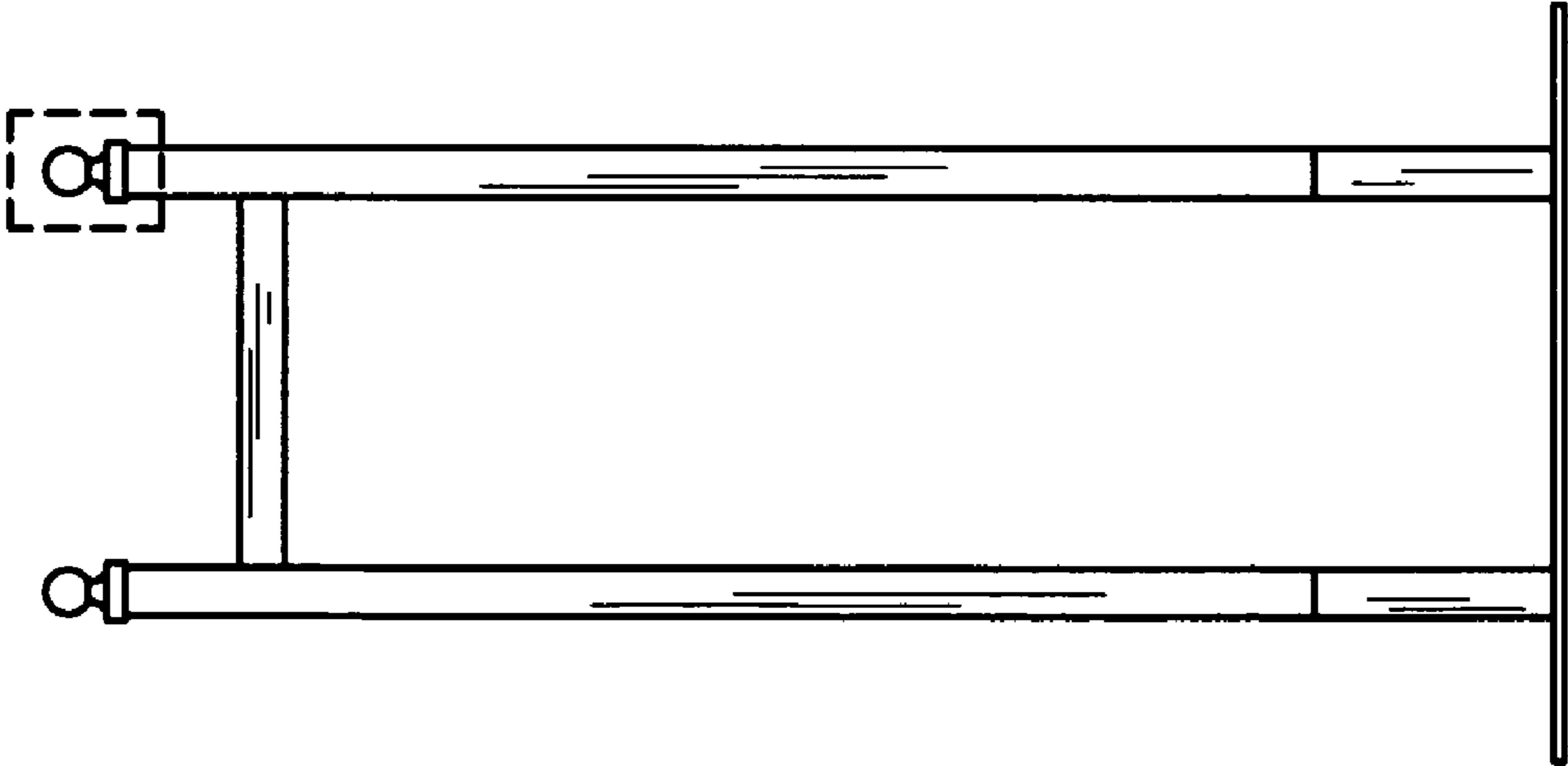
