FIG. 4 is a top view of the protective shoulder pad of the present invention.

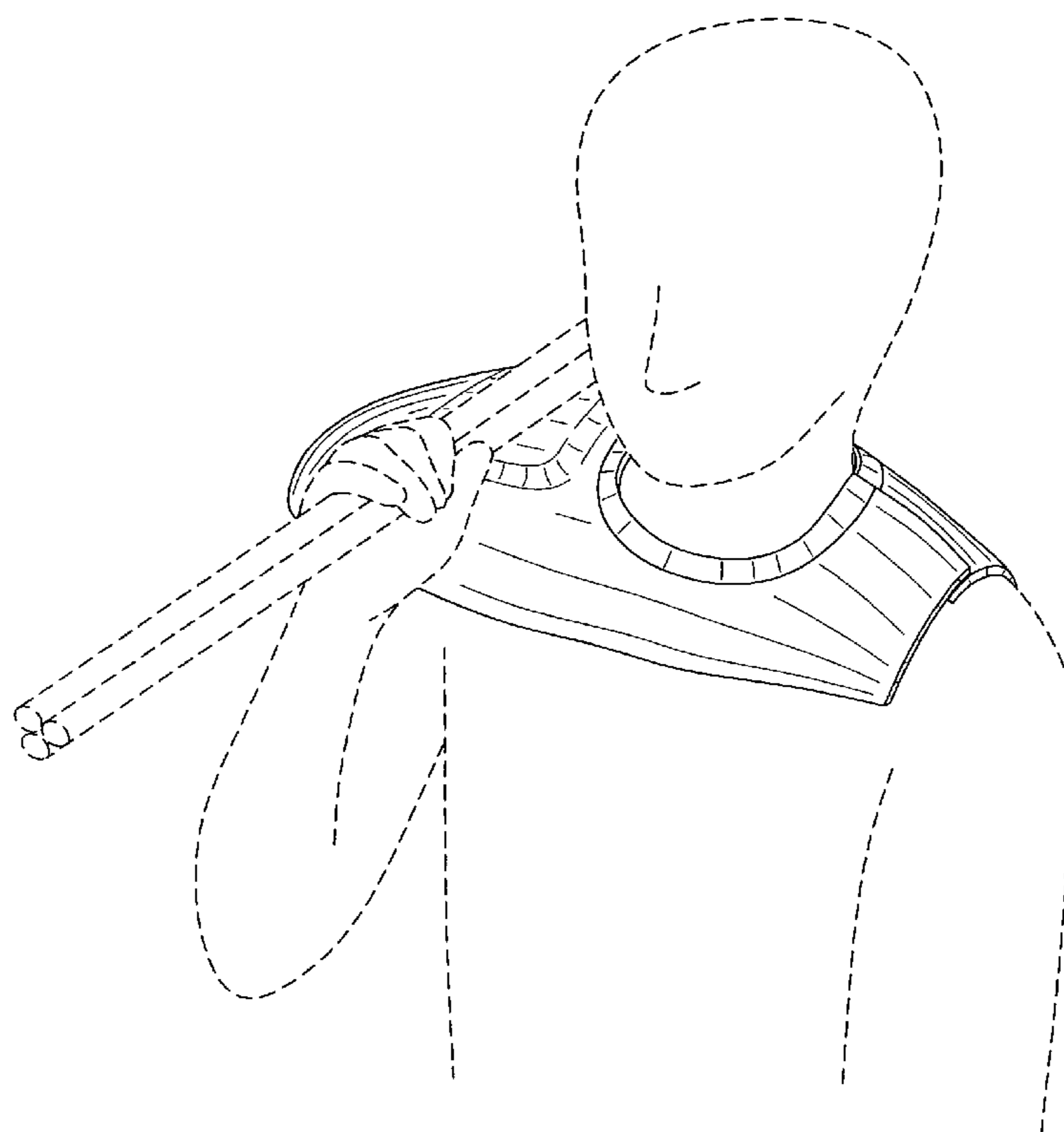
FIG. 5 is a bottom view of the protective shoulder pad of the present invention.

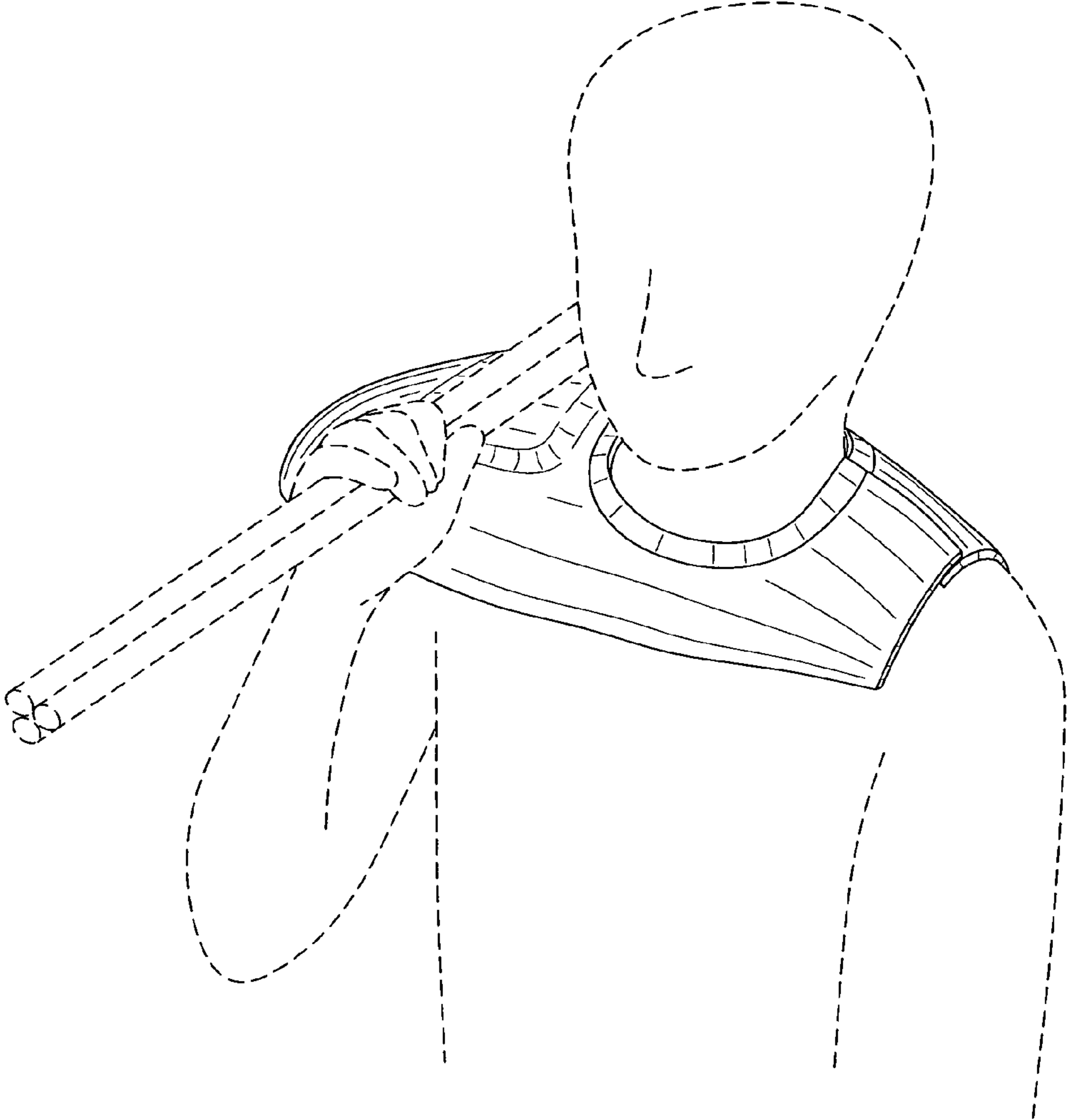

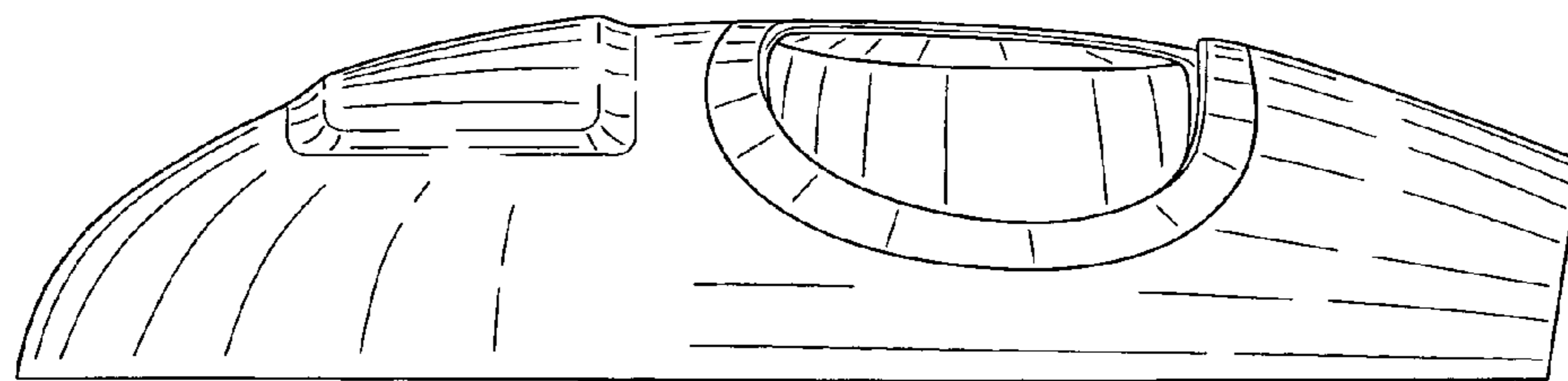

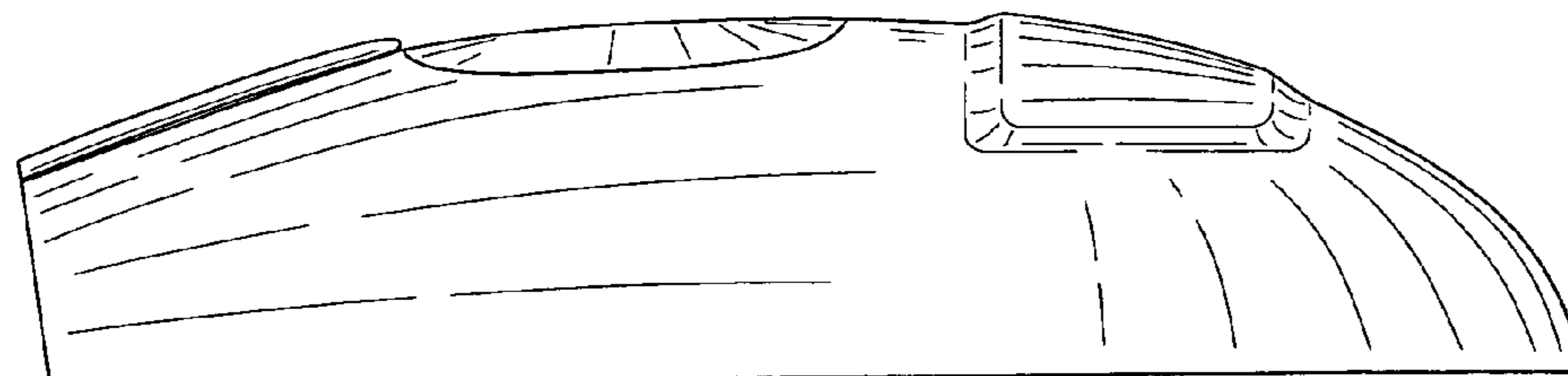

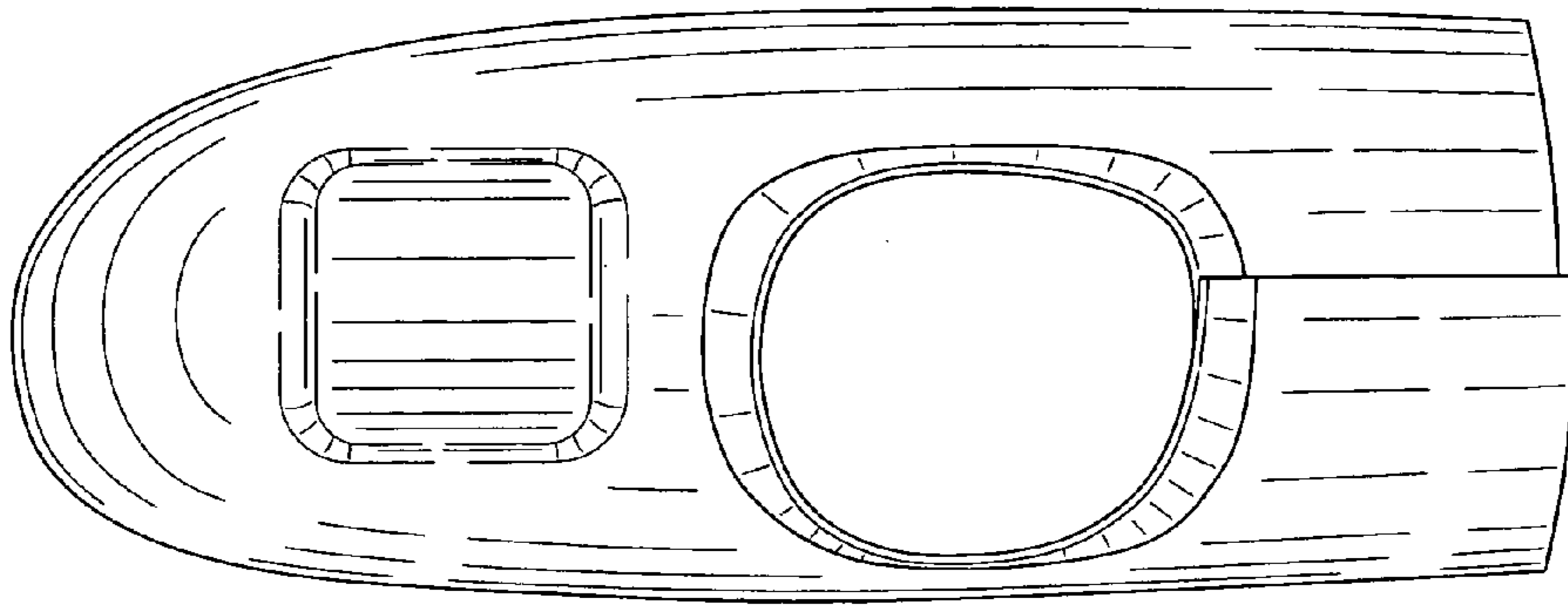

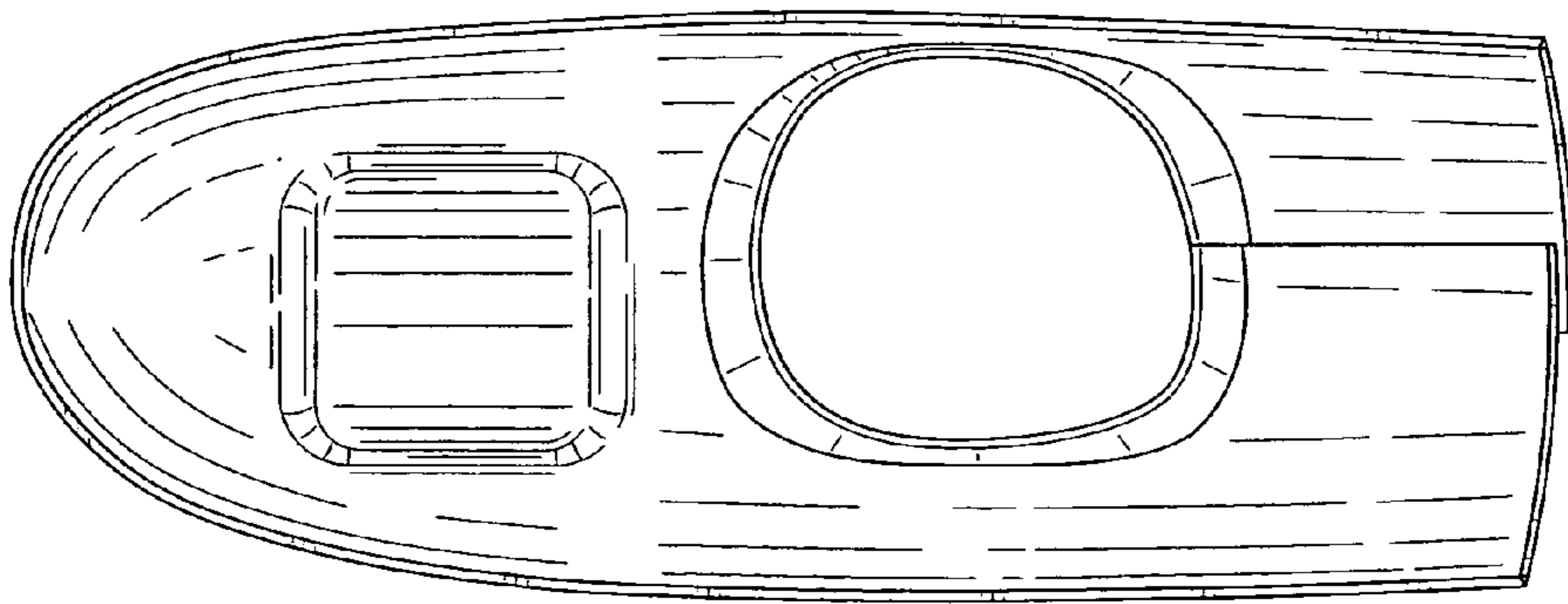

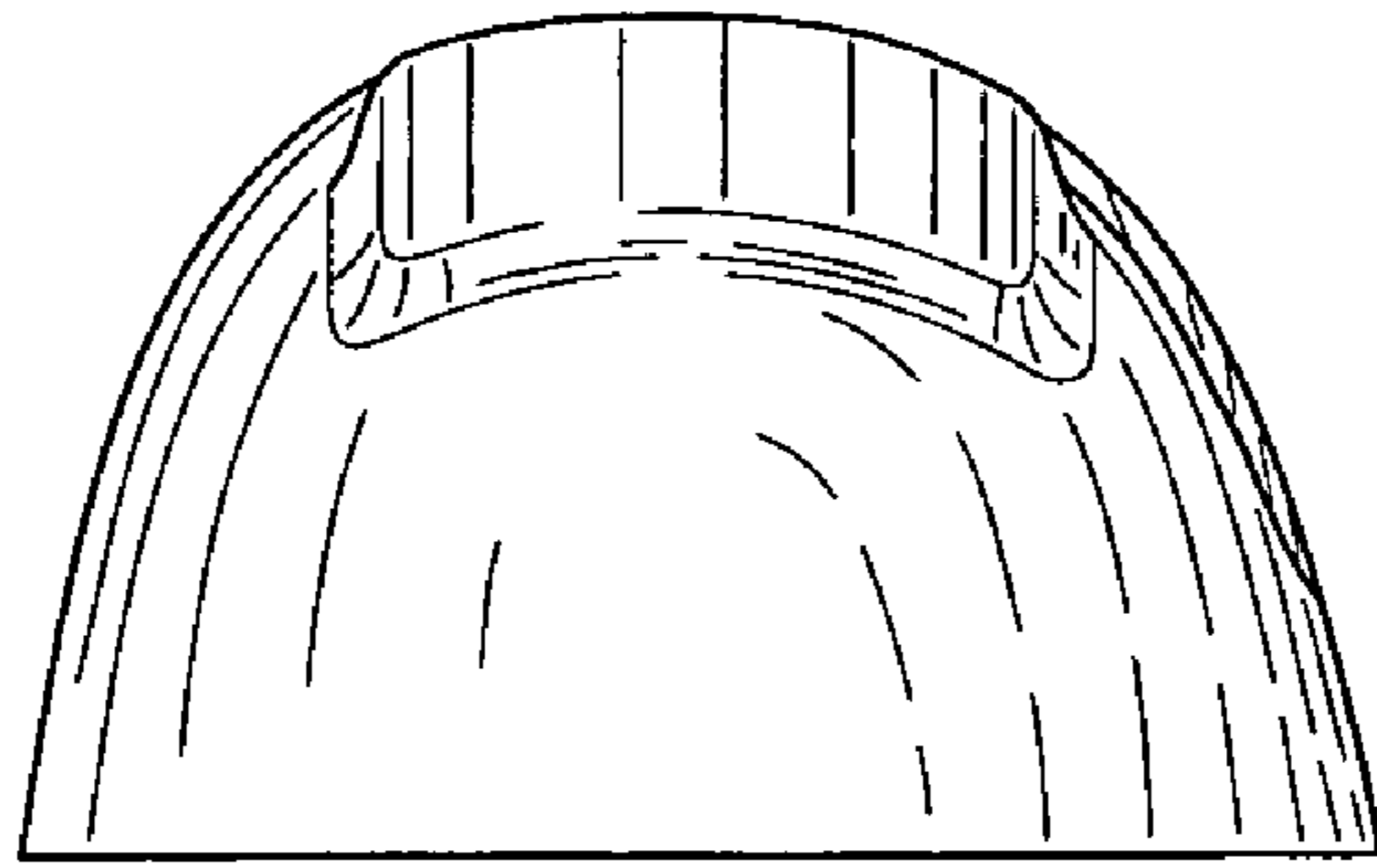

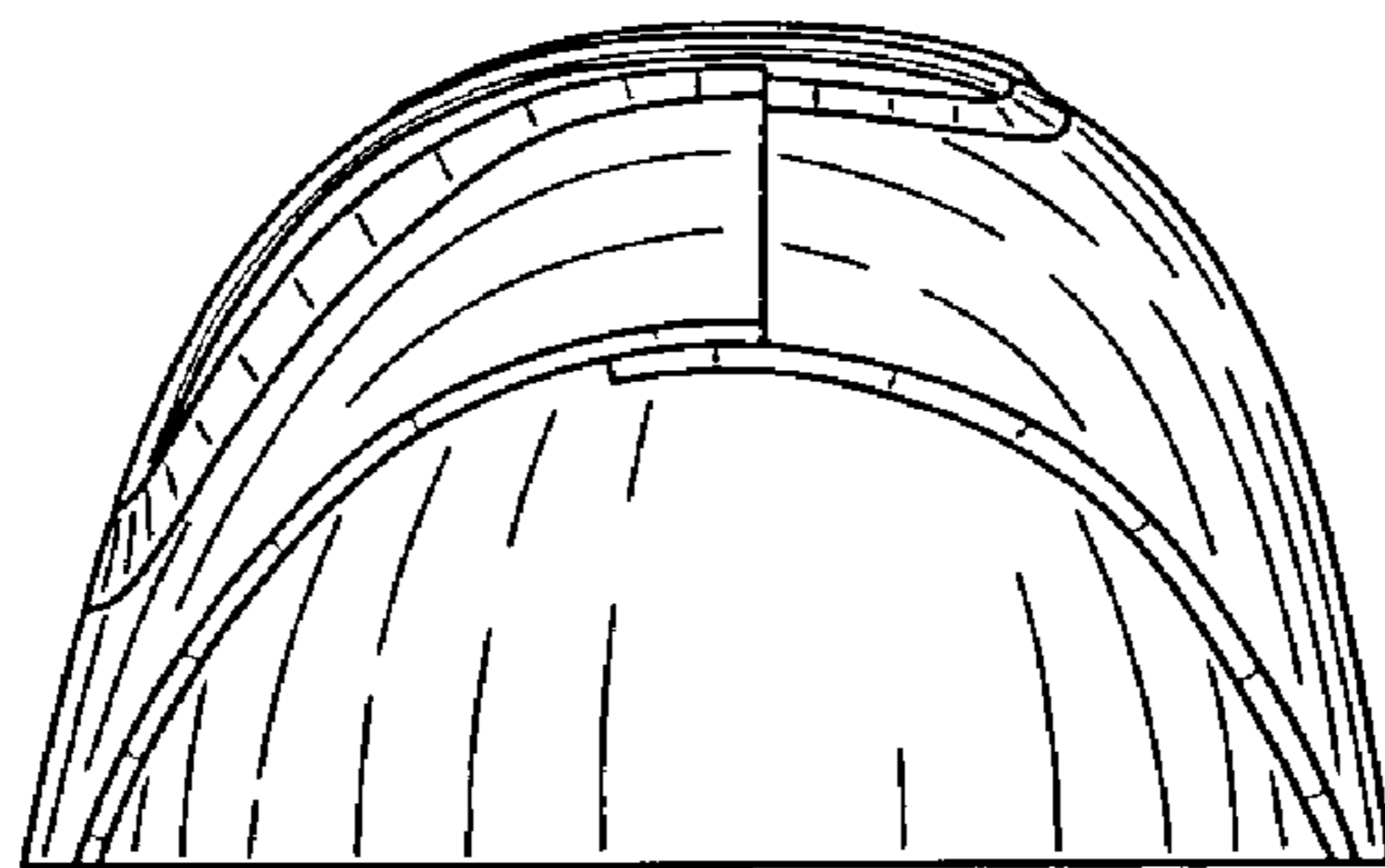
