FIG. 5 is a right side view thereof;

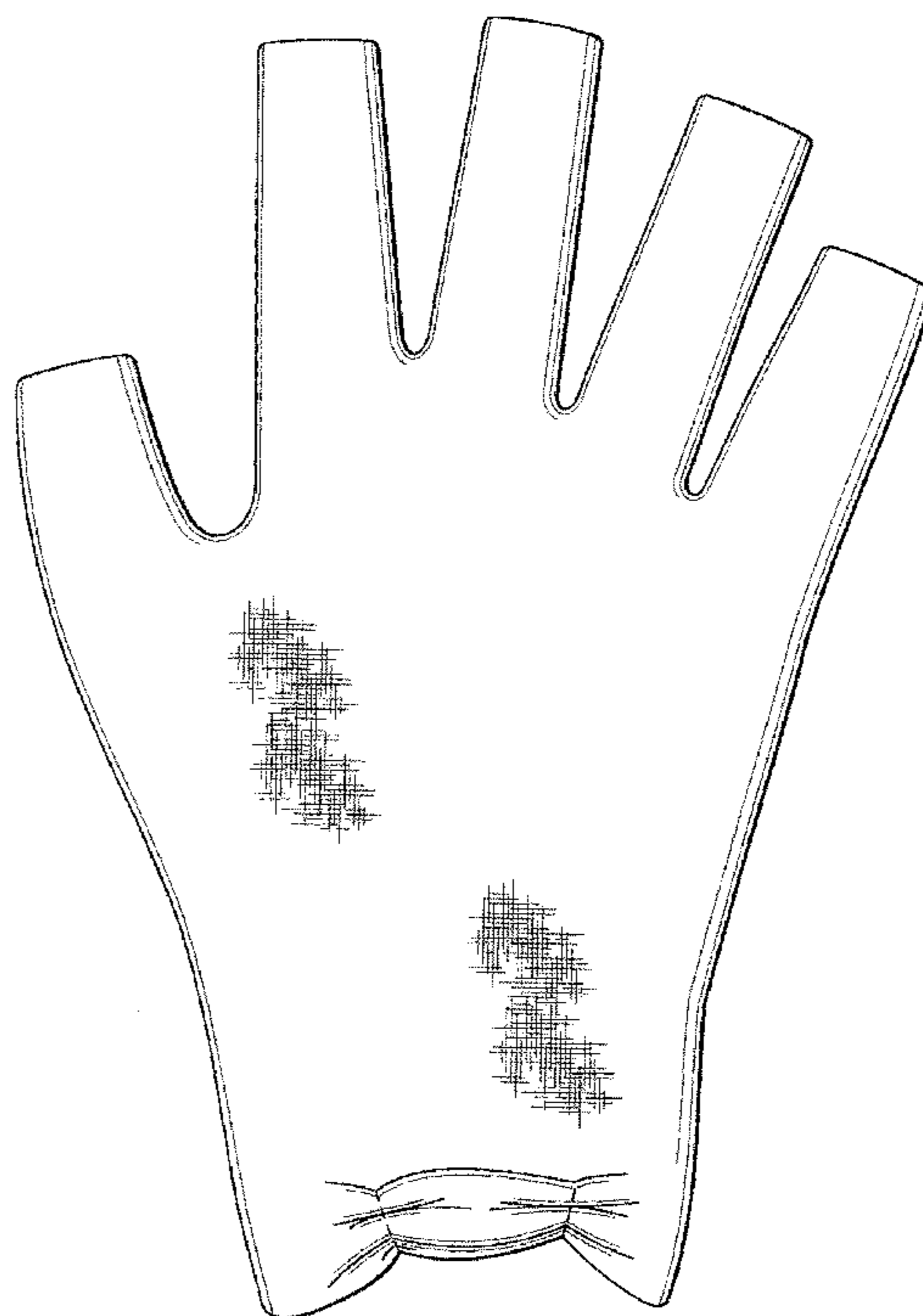
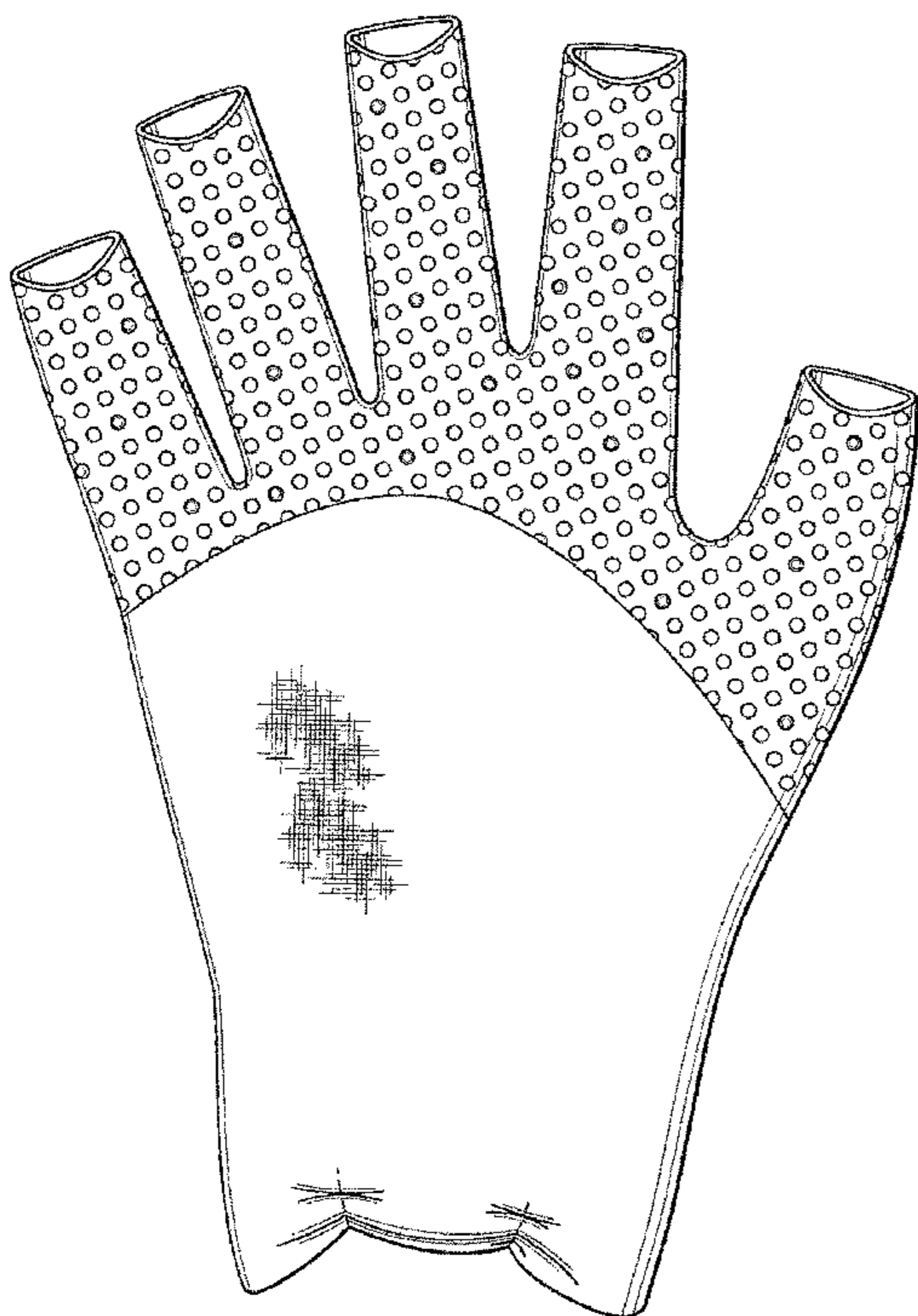
FIG. 6 is a bottom view thereof; and,

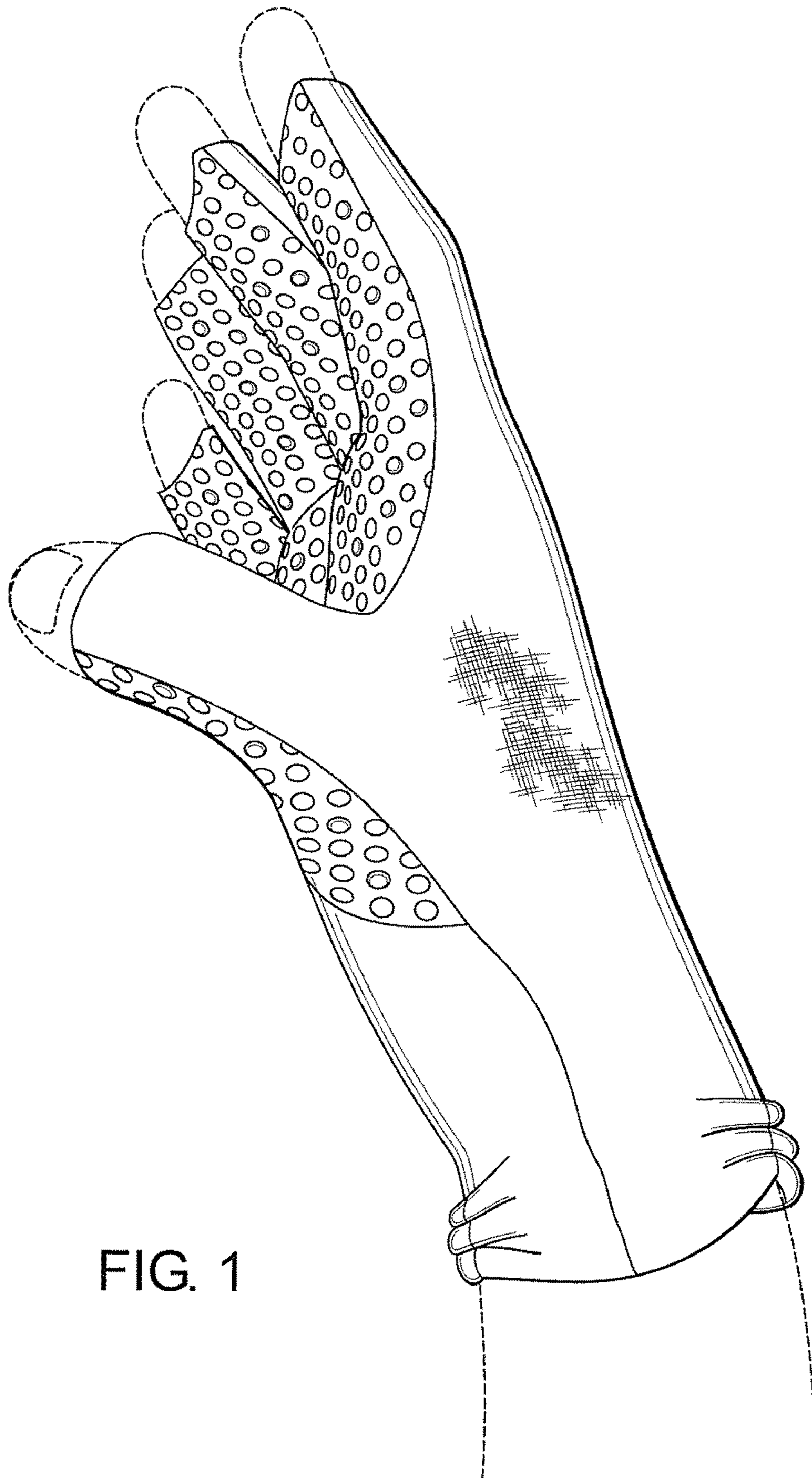

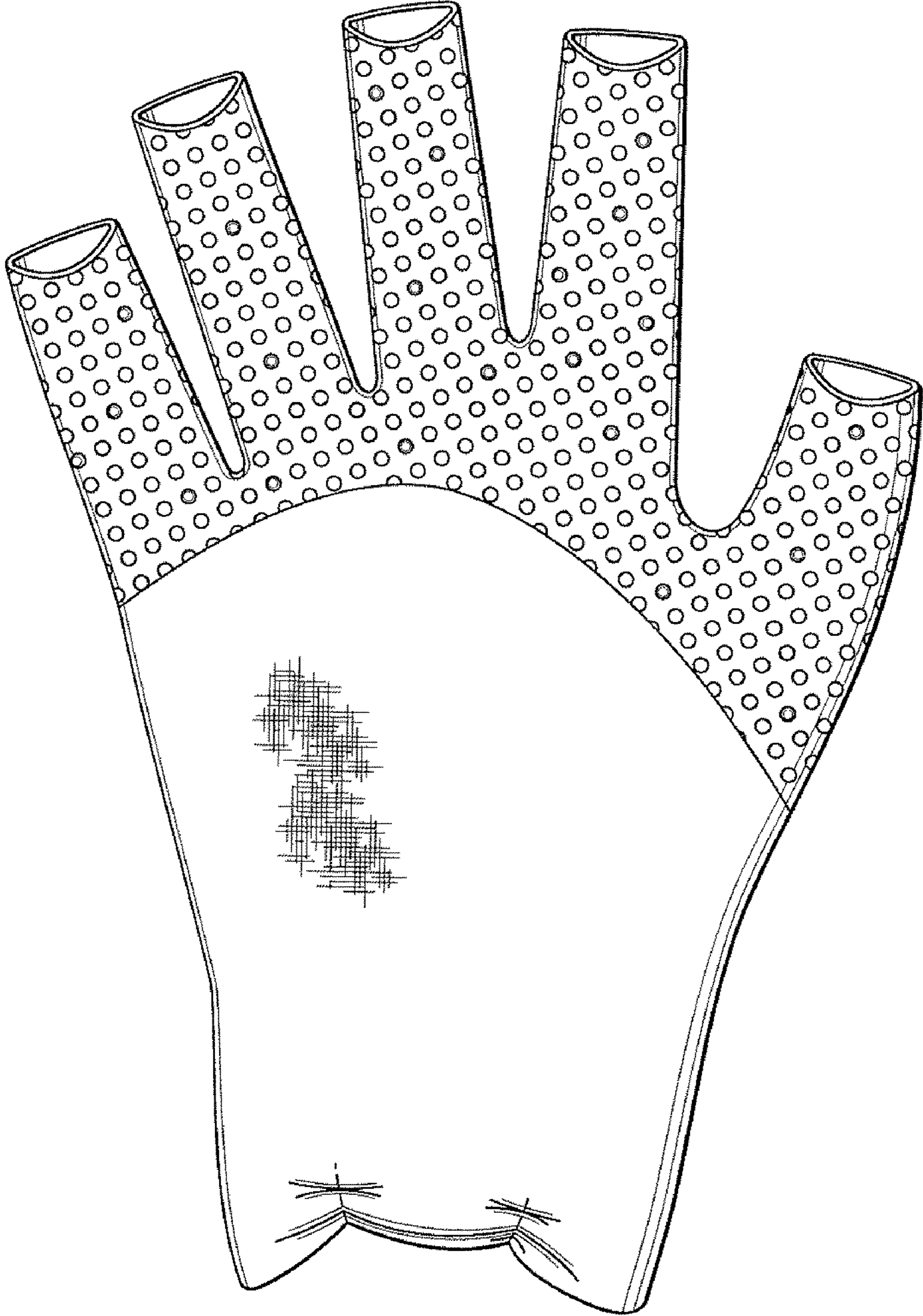

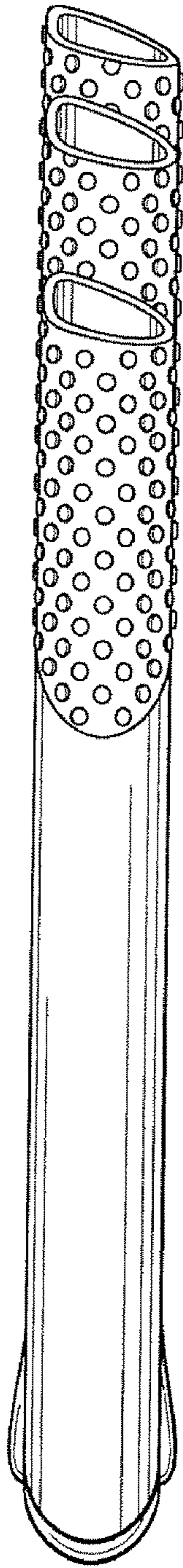

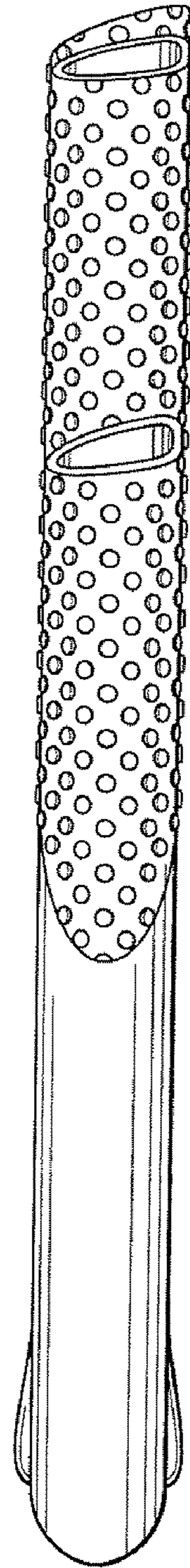

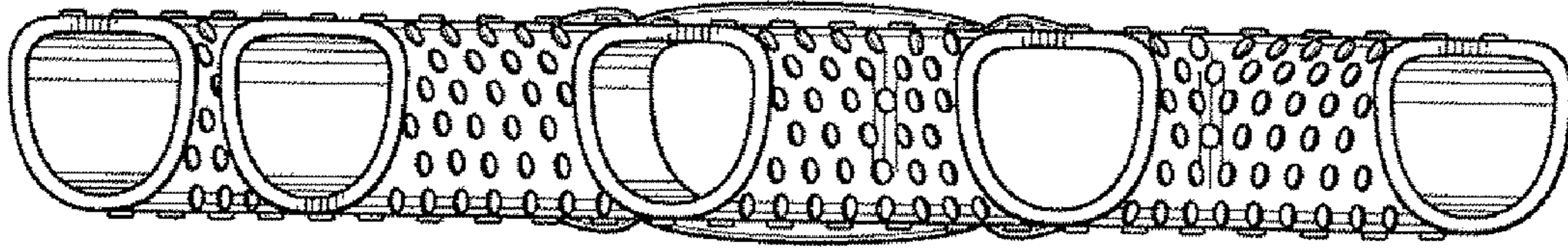

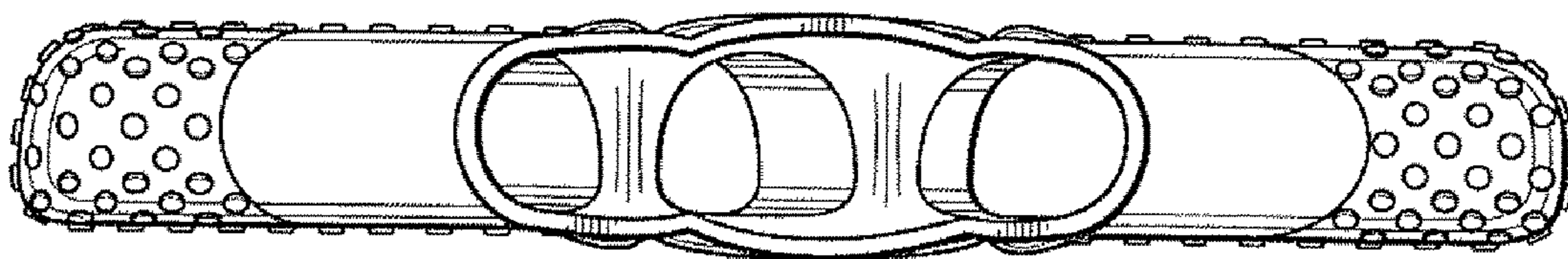

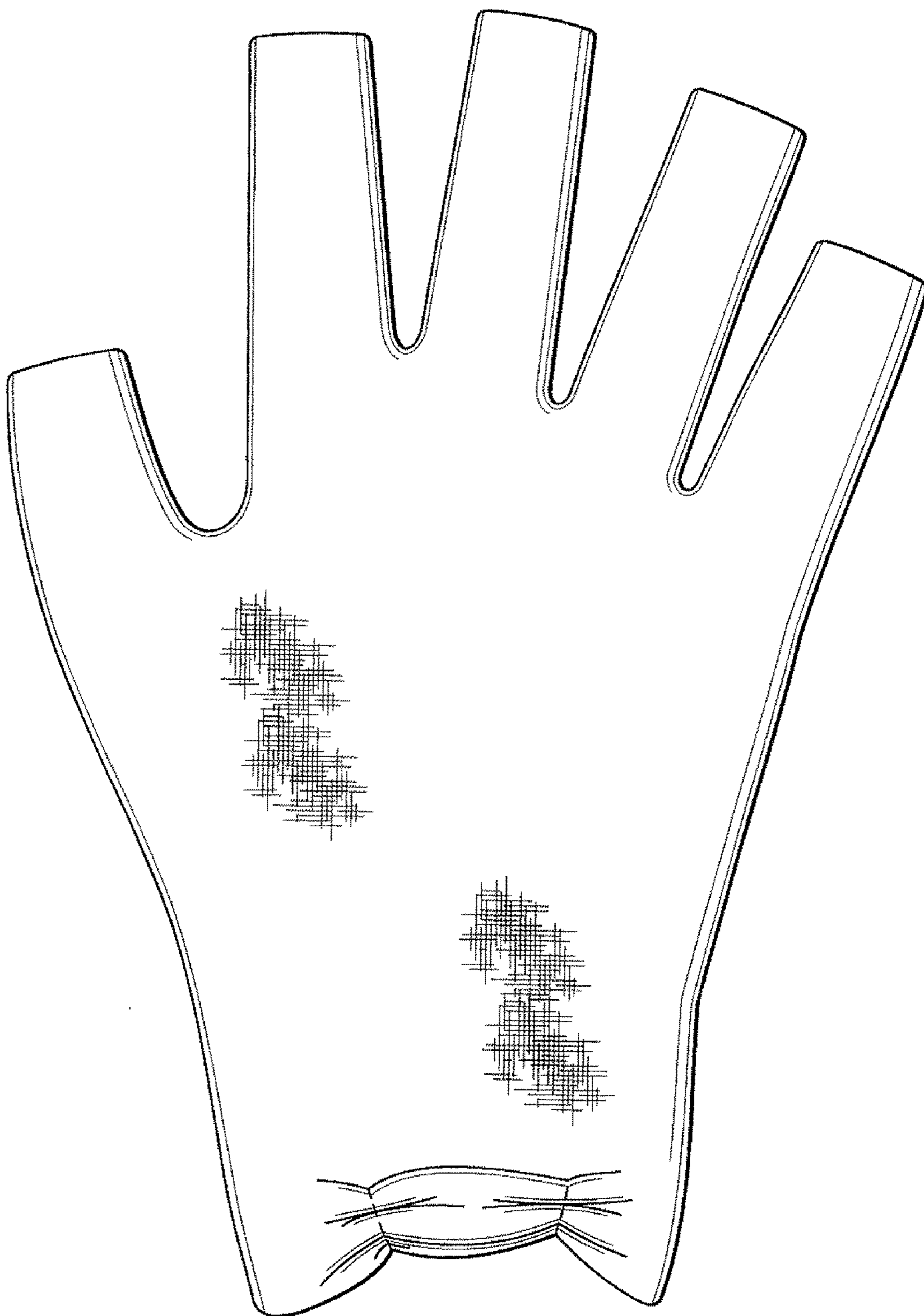
