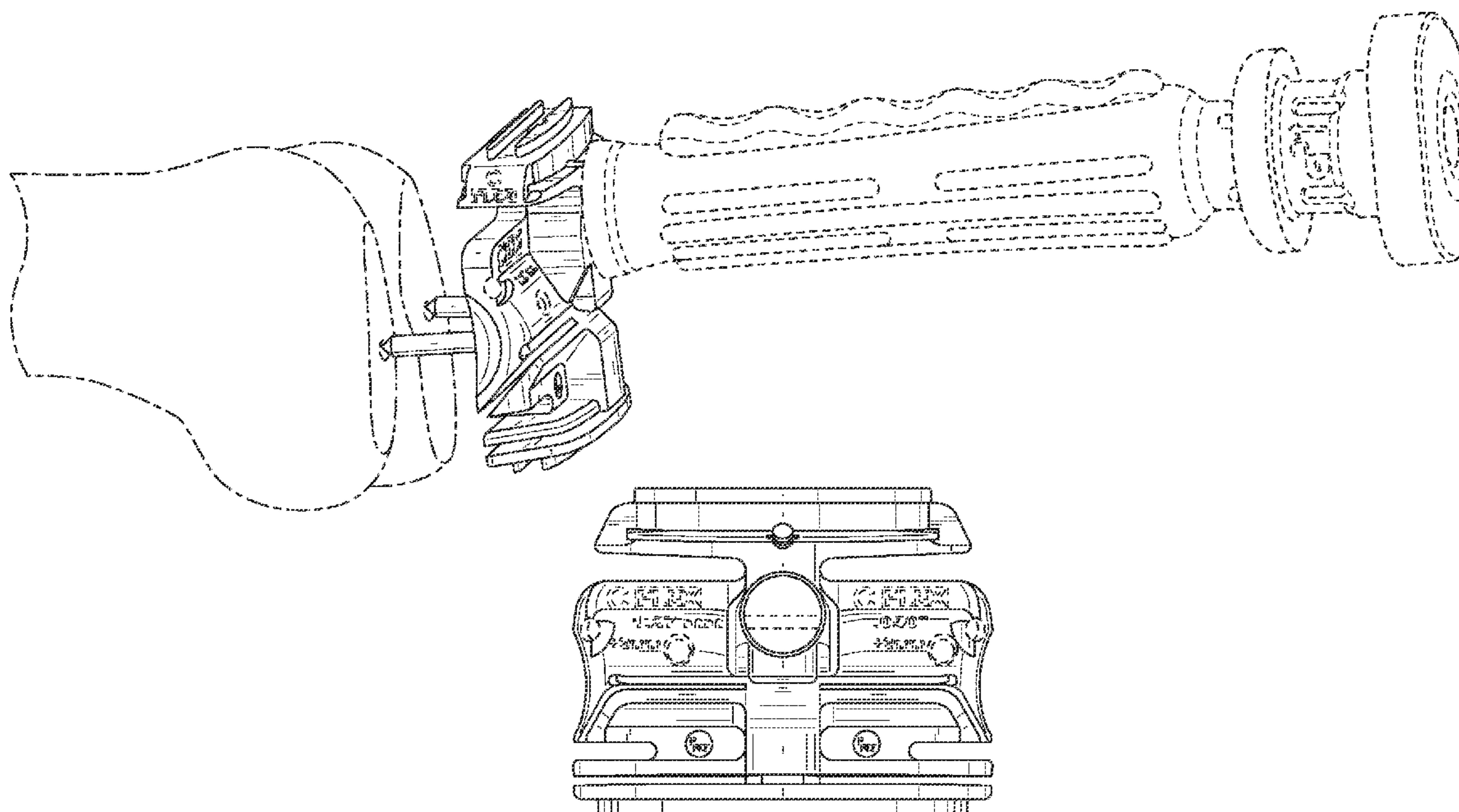
The ornamental design for a femoral cut guide, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a femoral cut guide shown in an environment illustrating our new design;
FIG. 2 is a bottom plan view of the femoral cut guide shown removed from its environment in order to show aspects of the design that are not apparent in the perspective view;
FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a left side elevation view thereof;
FIG. 5 is a right side elevation view thereof;
FIG. 6 is a front end elevation view thereof; and,
FIG. 7 is a rear end elevation view thereof.

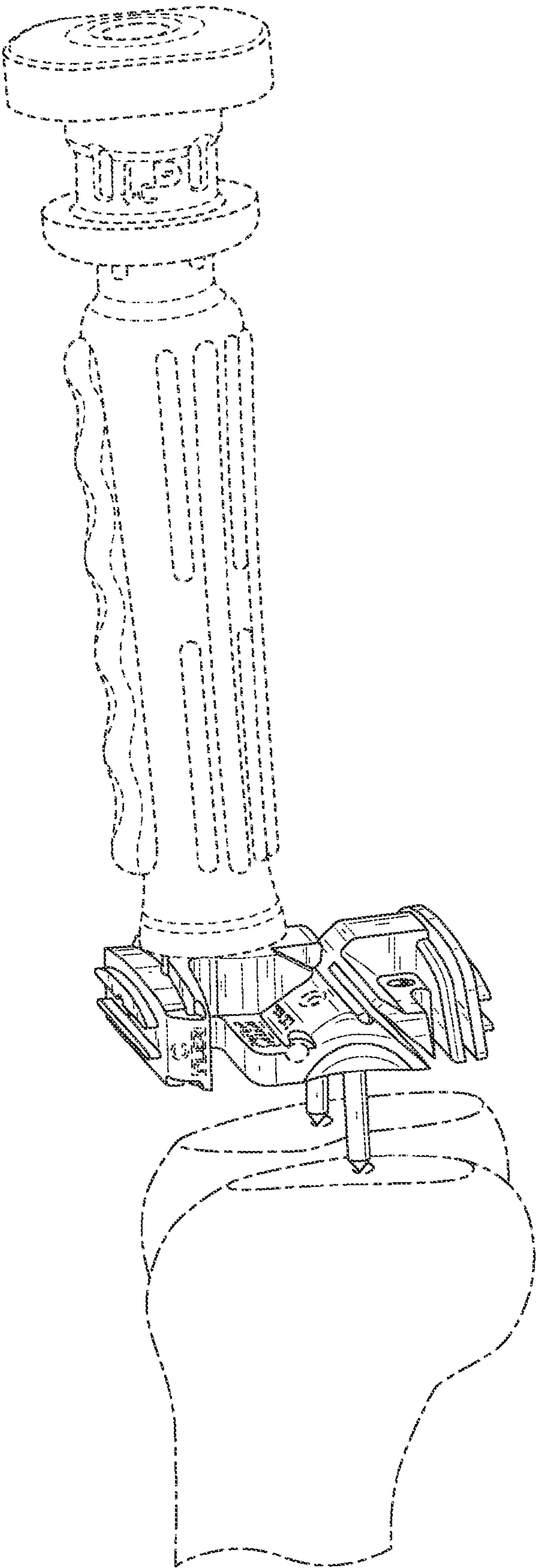

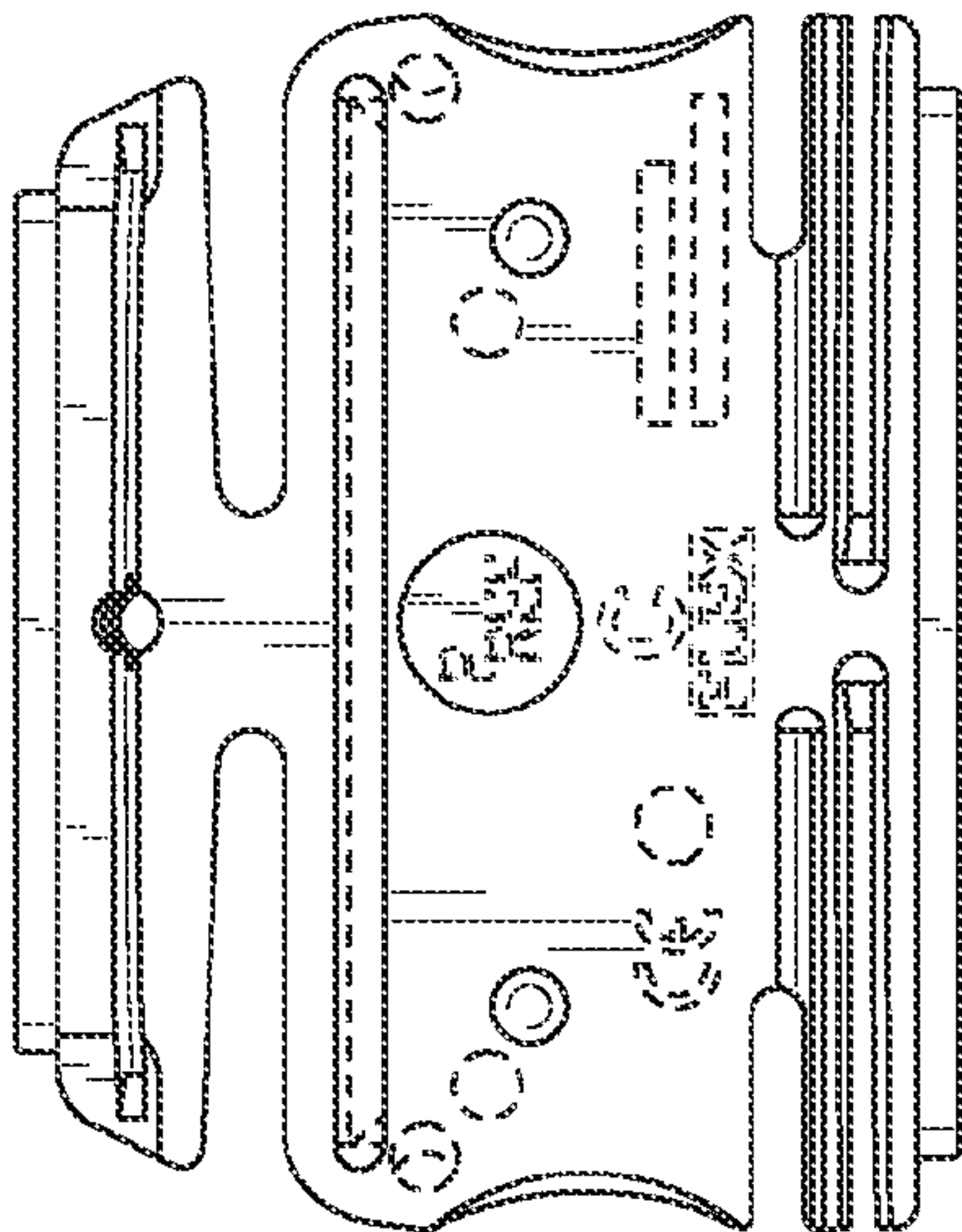

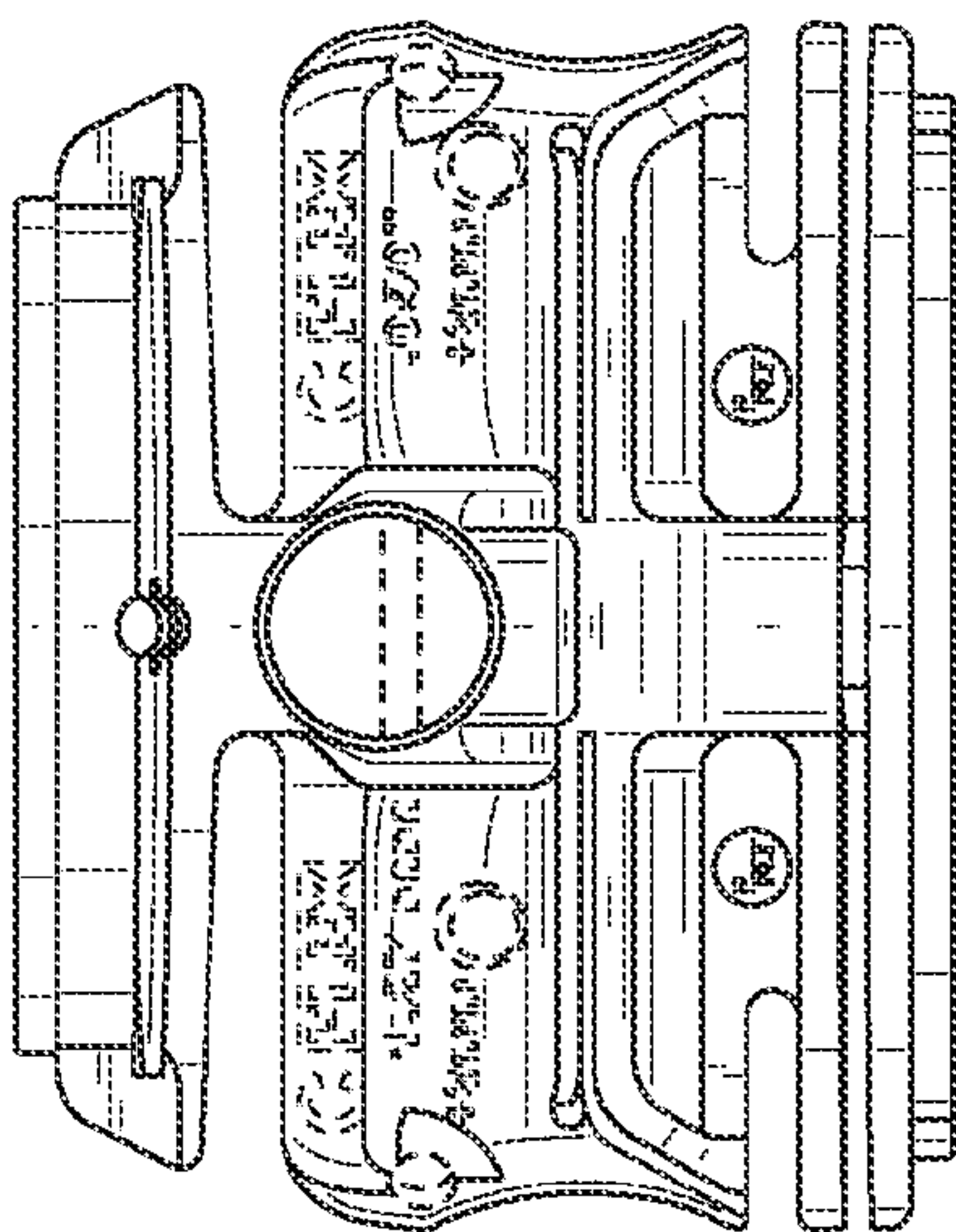

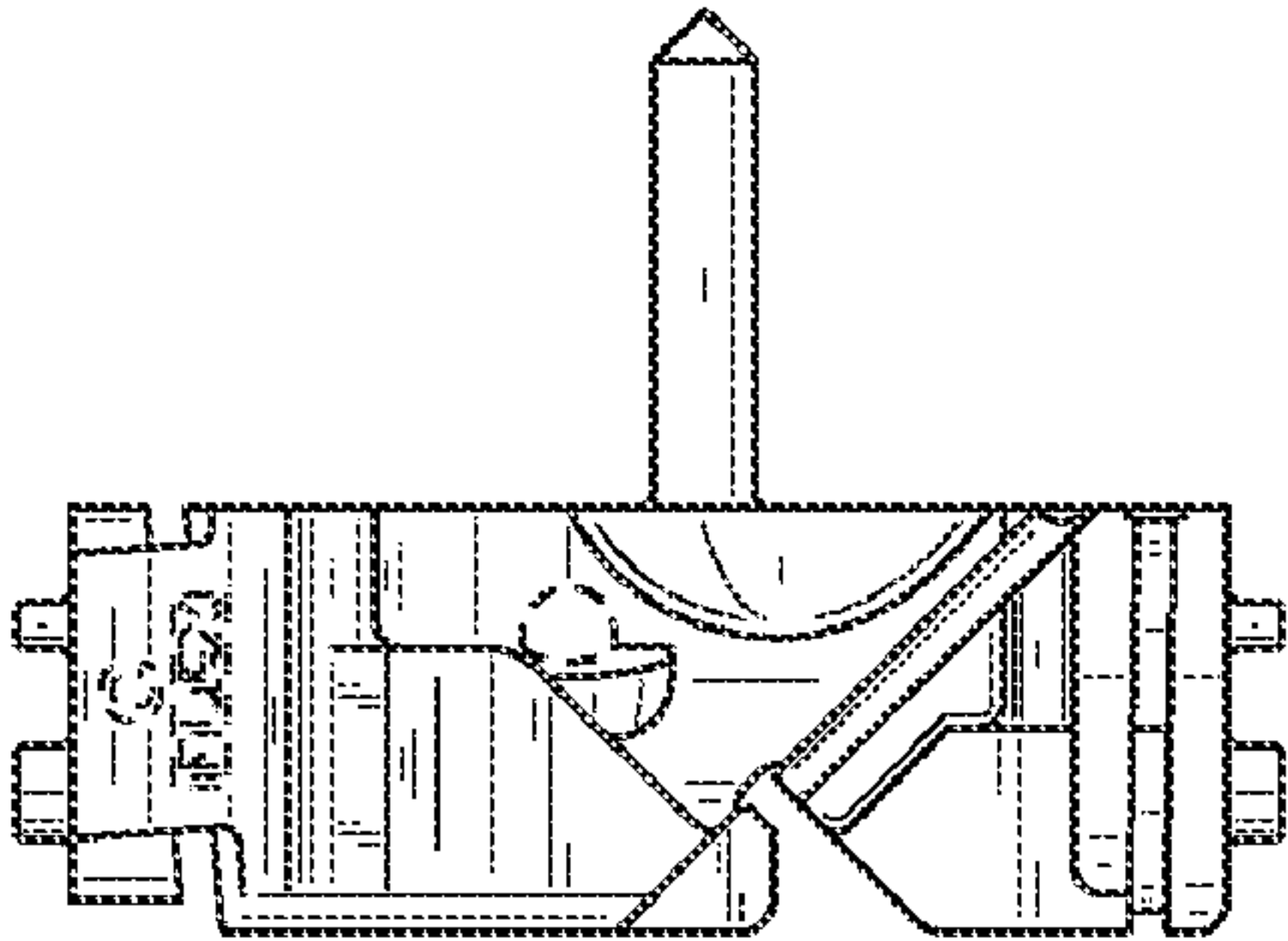

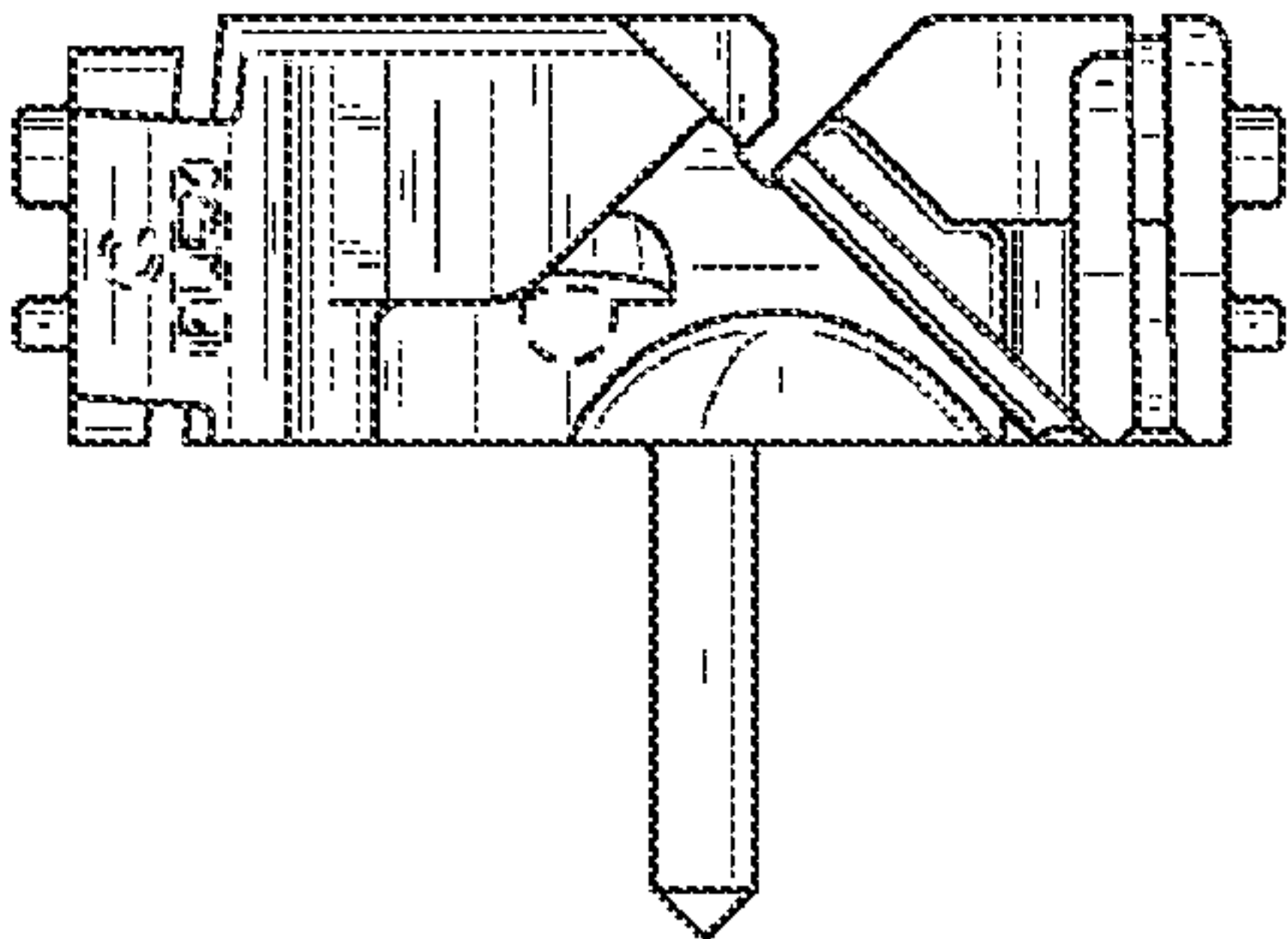

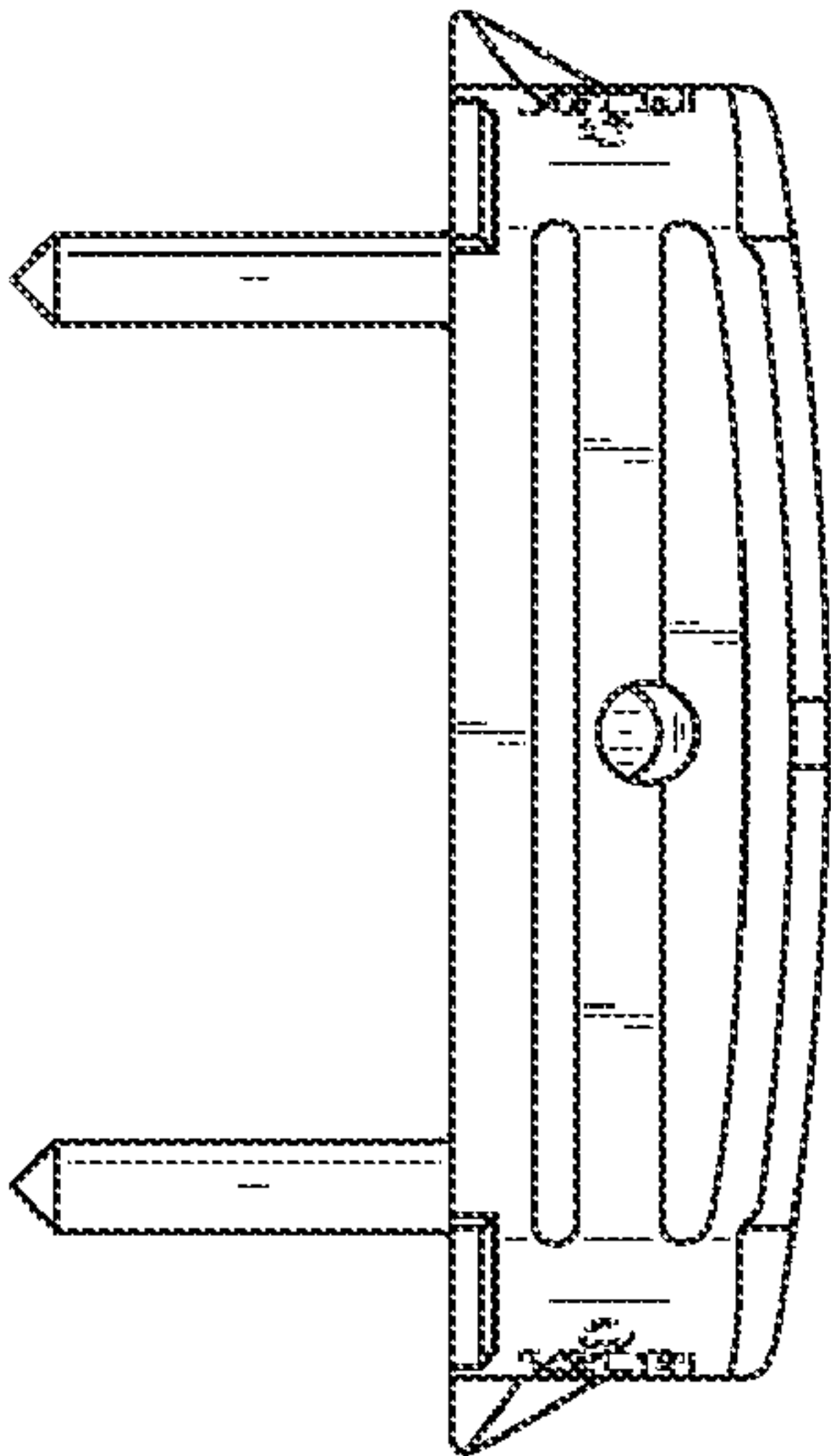

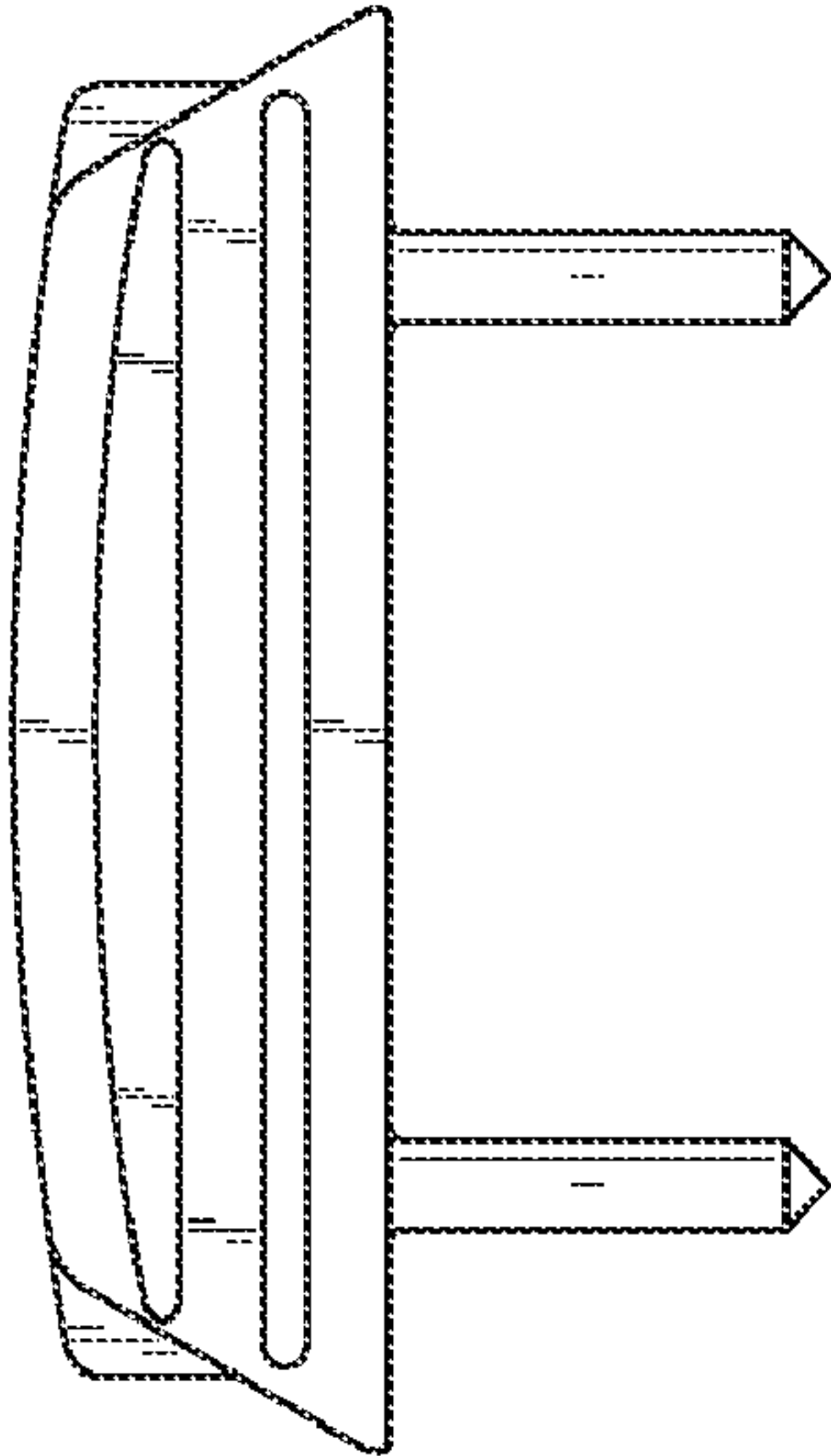
