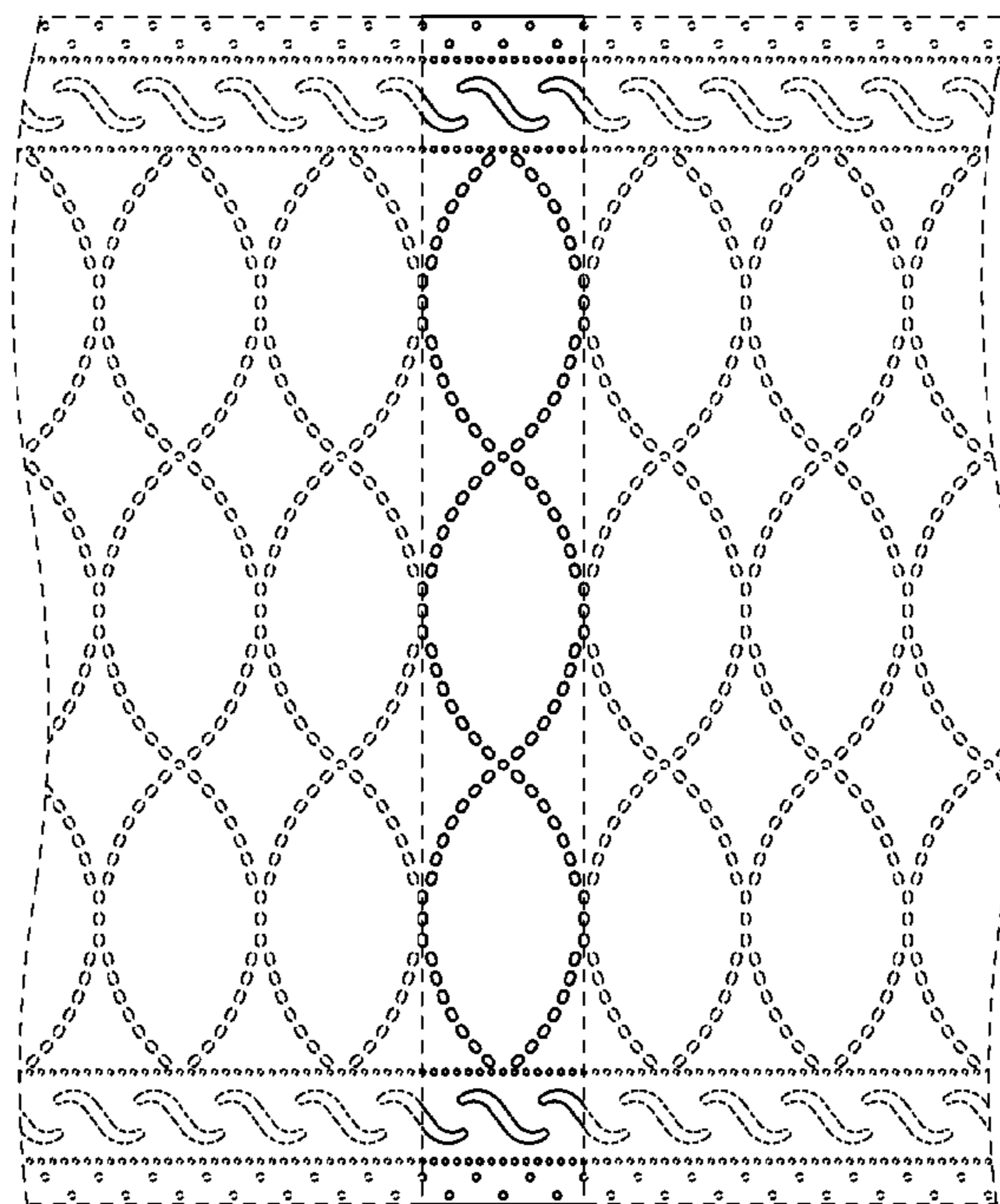
(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a paper towel, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of the paper towel of FIG. 1 representing our new ornamental design in an environment of use. The broken lines on the left and right of the design represent the boundaries of the claim and environmental subject matter. The broken lines form no part of the claim; and, FIG. 2 is a top plan view of a paper towel showing our new ornamental design. 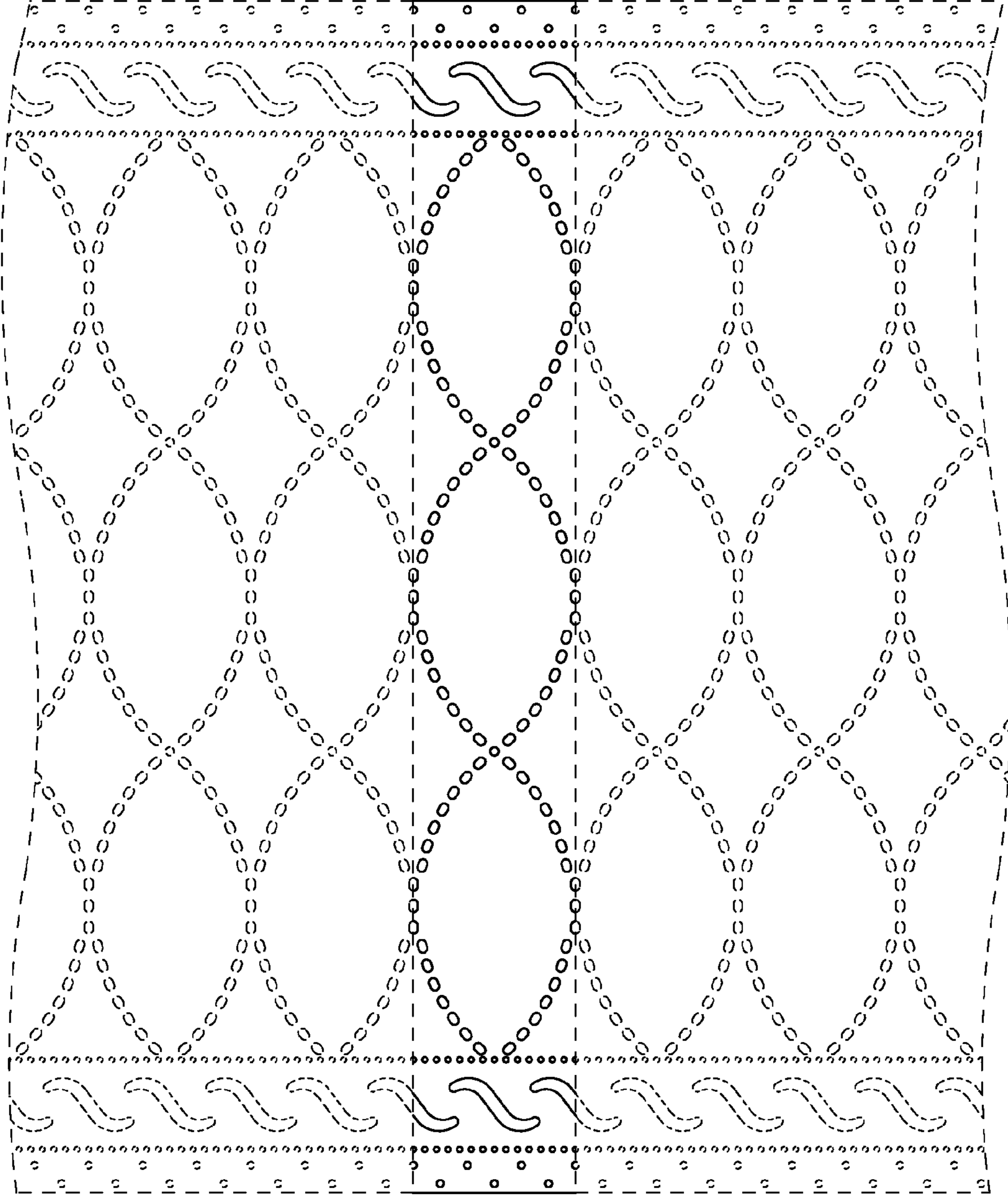

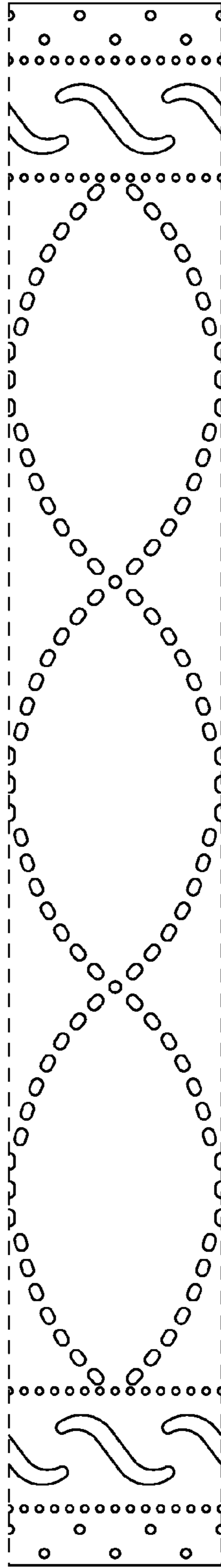
