1;

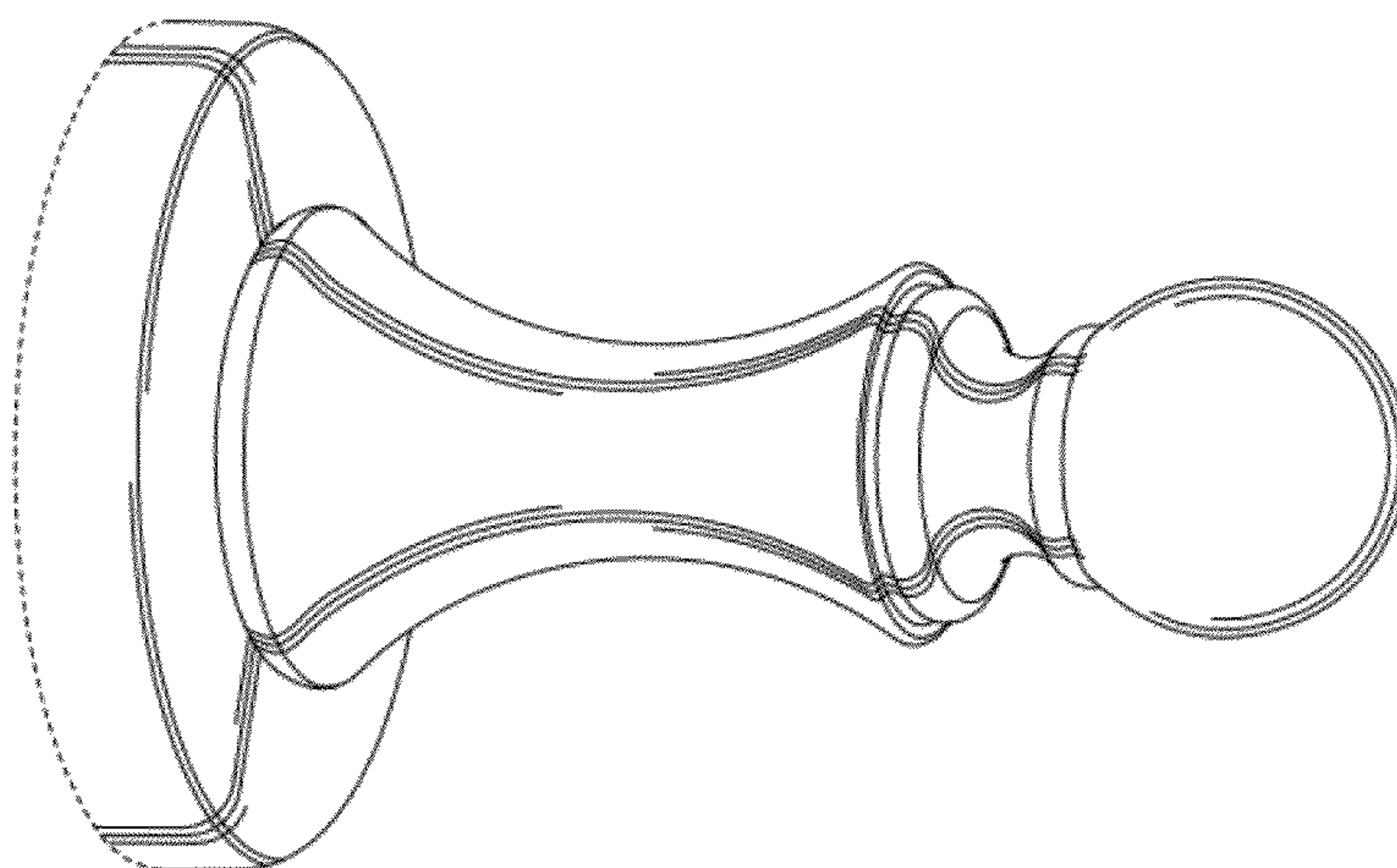
FIG. 3 is a left side elevational view of the accessory post of

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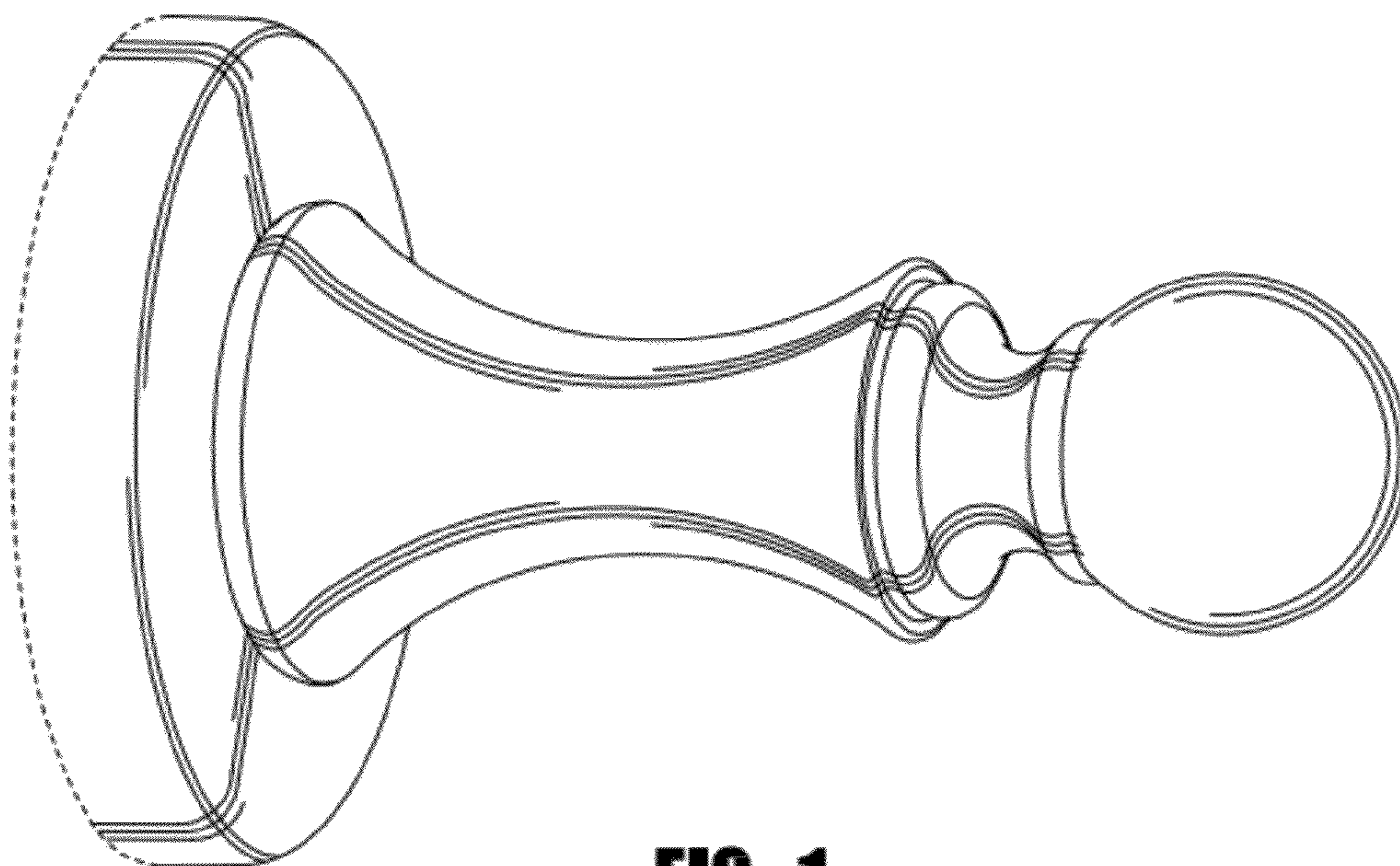

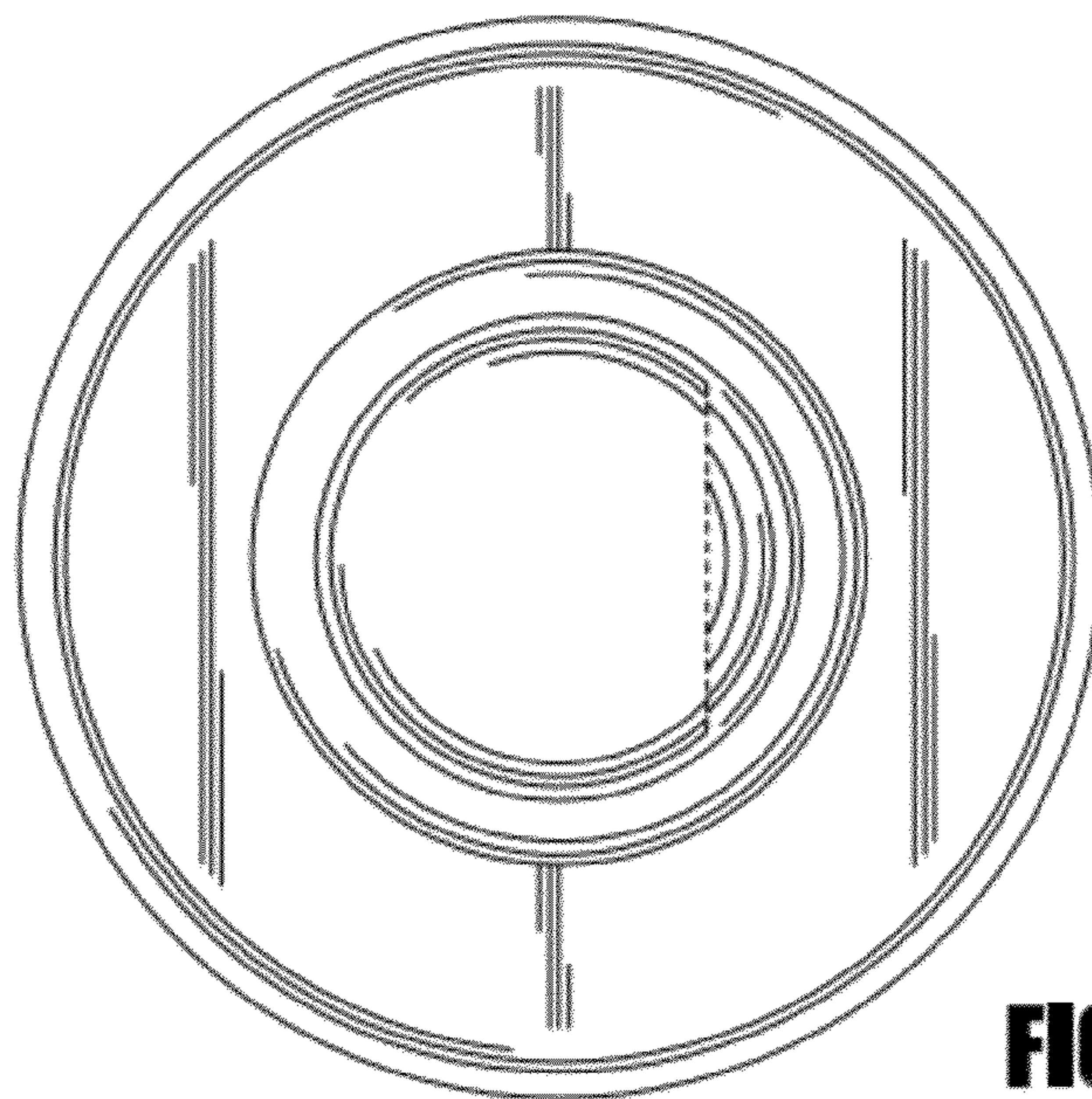

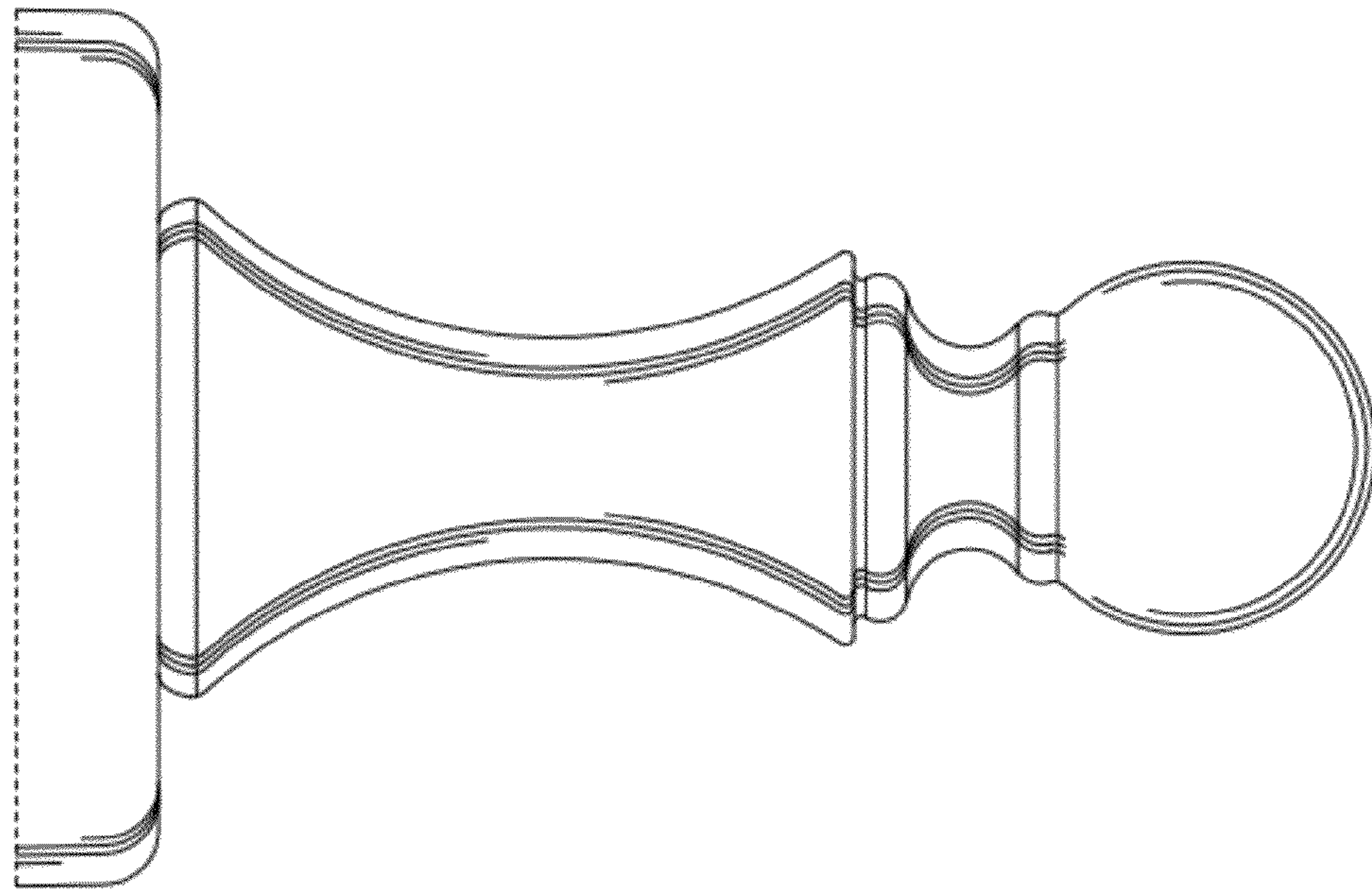

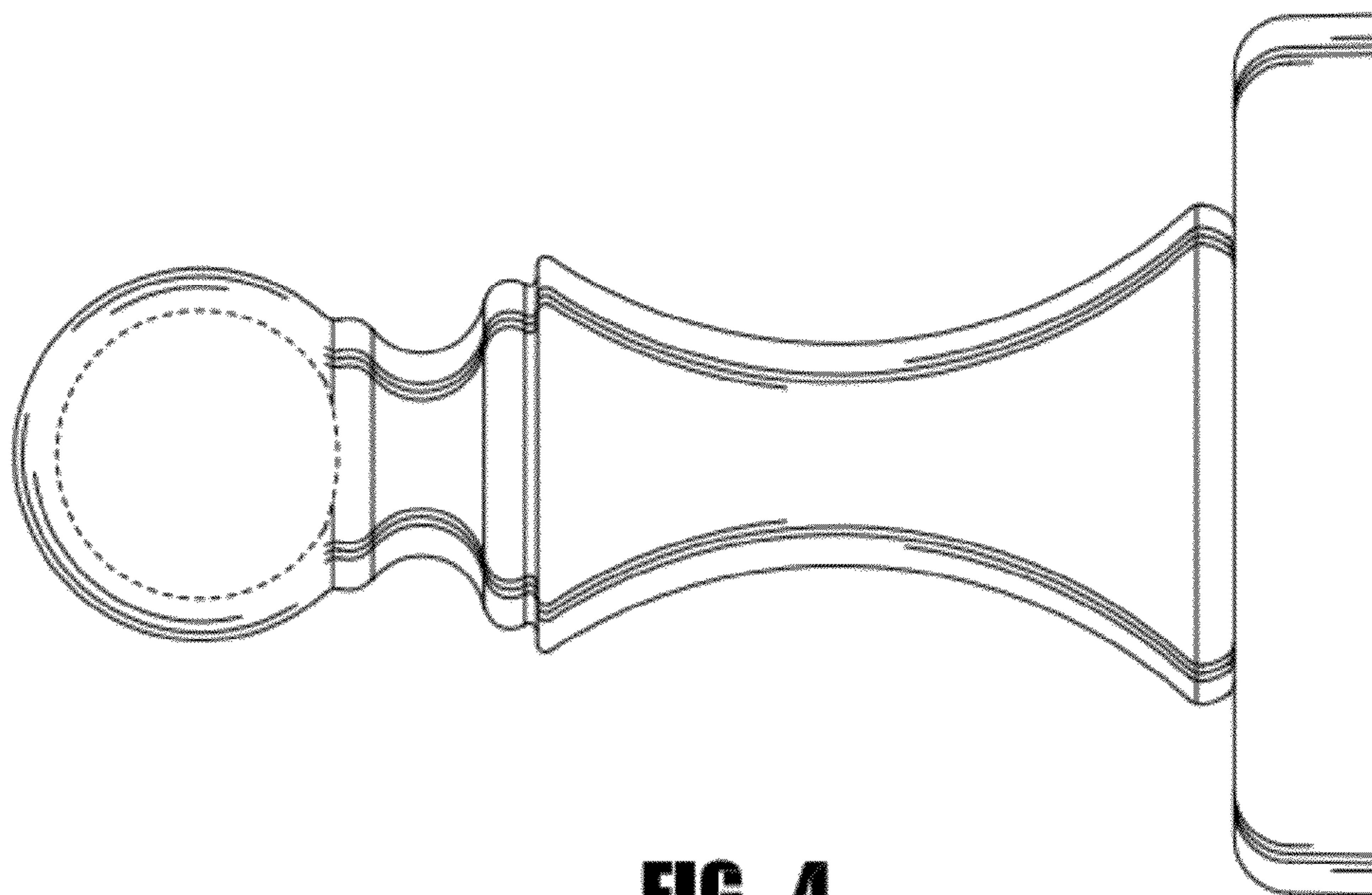

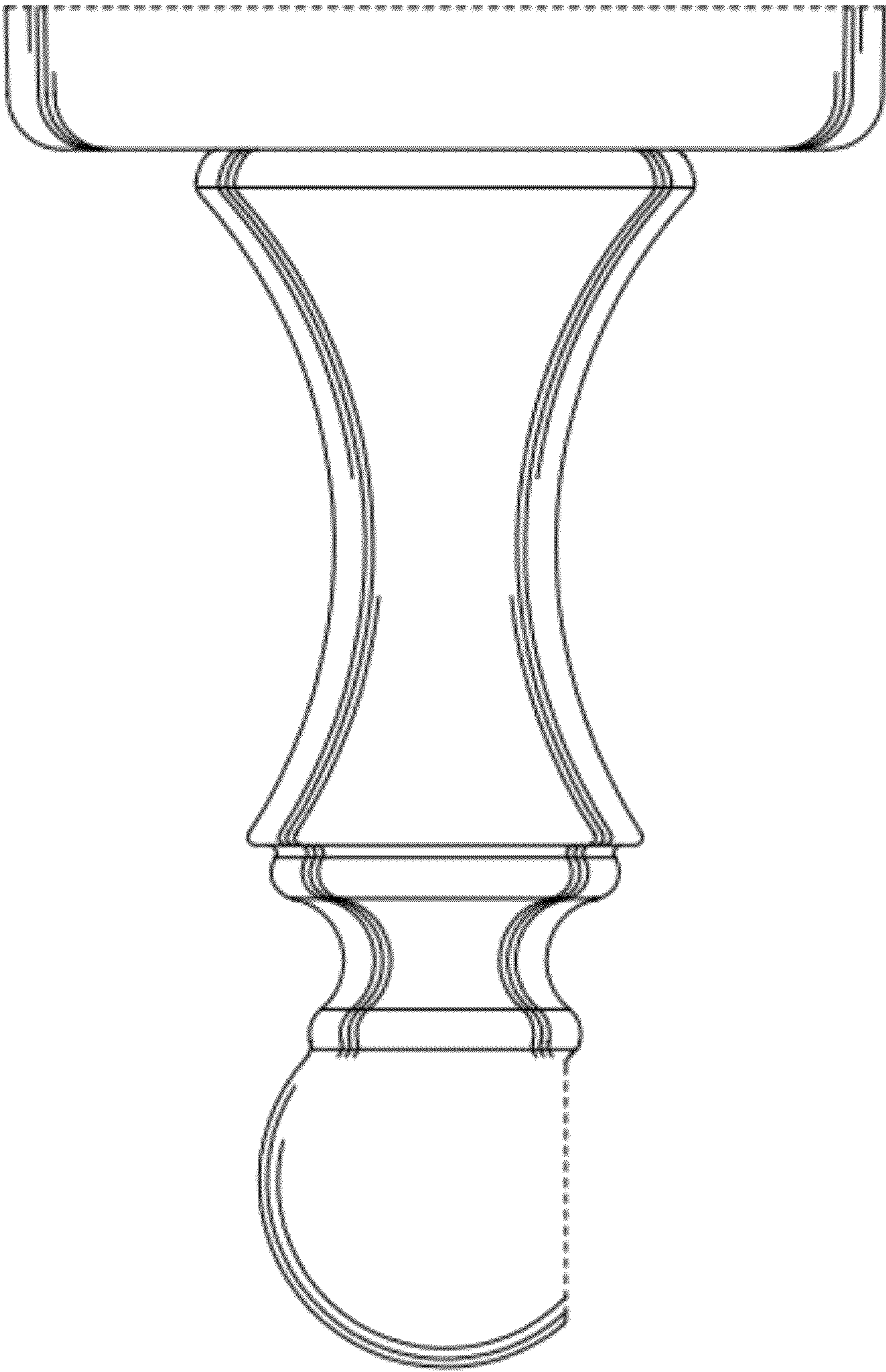
