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(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for scarf, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a first embodiment of the scarf, the rear elevational view being a mirror image thereof; FIG. 2 is a top plan view of the scarf shown in FIG. 1, the bottom plan view being a mirror image thereof;

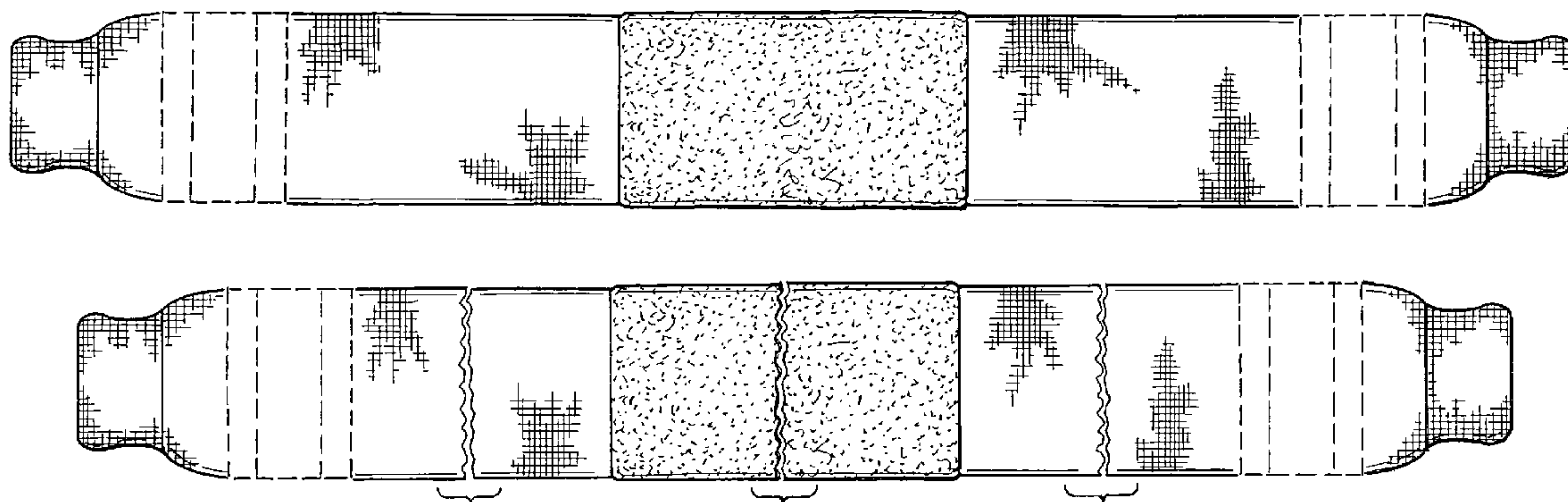
FIG. 3 is a left end view of the scarf shown in FIG. 1, the right end view being a mirror image thereof;

FIG. 4 is a front elevational view of a second embodiment of the scarf, the rear elevational view being a mirror image thereof; and,

FIG. 5 is a top plan view of the scarf shown in FIG. 4, the bottom plan view being a mirror image thereof, and wherein the left end view of the scarf shown in FIGS. 4 and 5 is identical to the scarf shown in FIG. 3, and the right end view being a mirror image thereof.

The features of the article shown in broken lines in the drawings form no part of the claimed design. The bracketed separations shown in FIGS. 4 and 5 indicate that the precise length of the scarf at these points is not claimed.

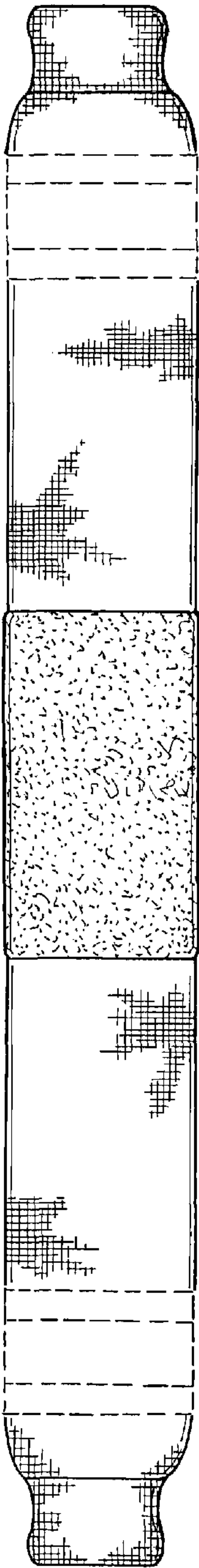

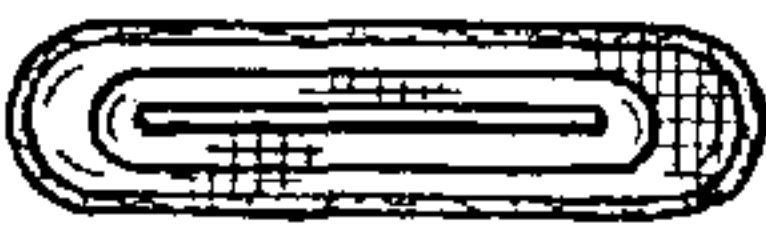

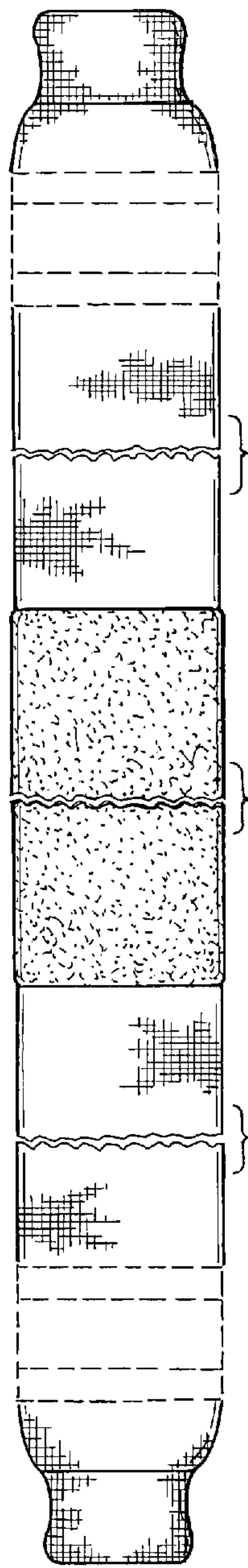

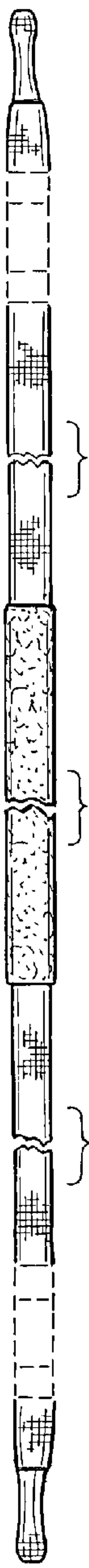
