(57) **CLAIM**

An ornamental design for a mat, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a plan view of the front surface of an embodiment of a mat, in accordance with the present invention. Bracket features at left and right sides of the mat are represented in broken lines and form no part of the claimed design.

FIG. 2 is a left side view of the mat of FIG. 1.

FIG. 3 is a top side view of the mat of FIG. 1.

FIG. 4 is a close-up perspective view of region 4 of FIG. 8. The bracket features are represented in broken line and form no part of the claimed design.

FIG. 5 is a close-up view of region 5 of FIG. 3. Features on the rear surface of the mat are represented in broken lines and form no part of the claimed design.

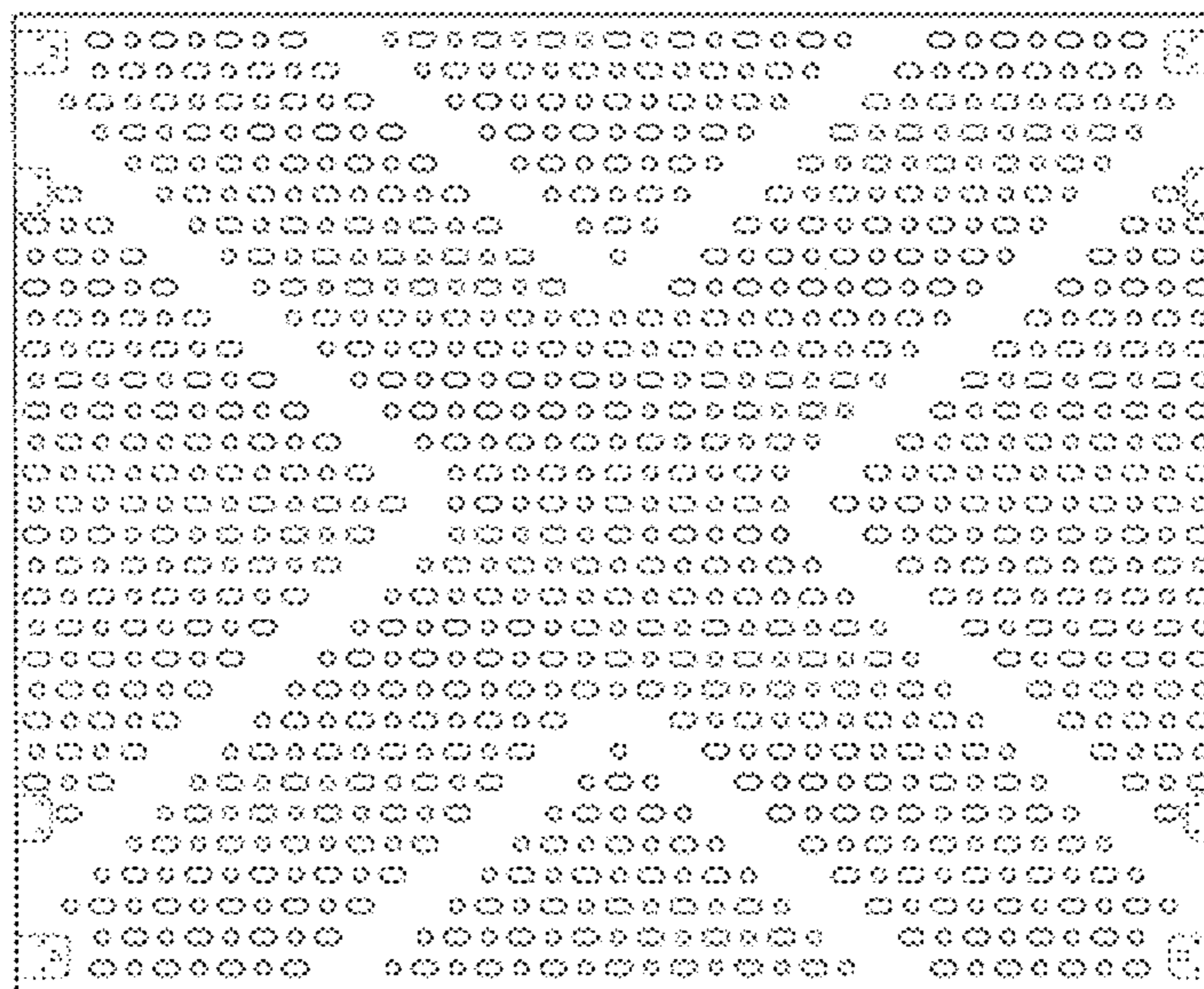
FIG. 6 is a close-up view of region 6 of FIG. 2. Features on the rear surface of the mat are represented in broken lines and form no part of the claimed design.

FIG. 7 is a plan view of the rear surface of the mat of FIG. 1. Features on the rear surface of the mat drawn in broken line form no part of the claimed design; and,

FIG. 8 is a perspective view of the front surface of the mat of FIG. 1. Bracket features at the sides of the mat are represented in broken lines and form no part of the claimed design.

The broken lines in the drawing represent unclaimed portions of the mat and form no part of the claimed design.

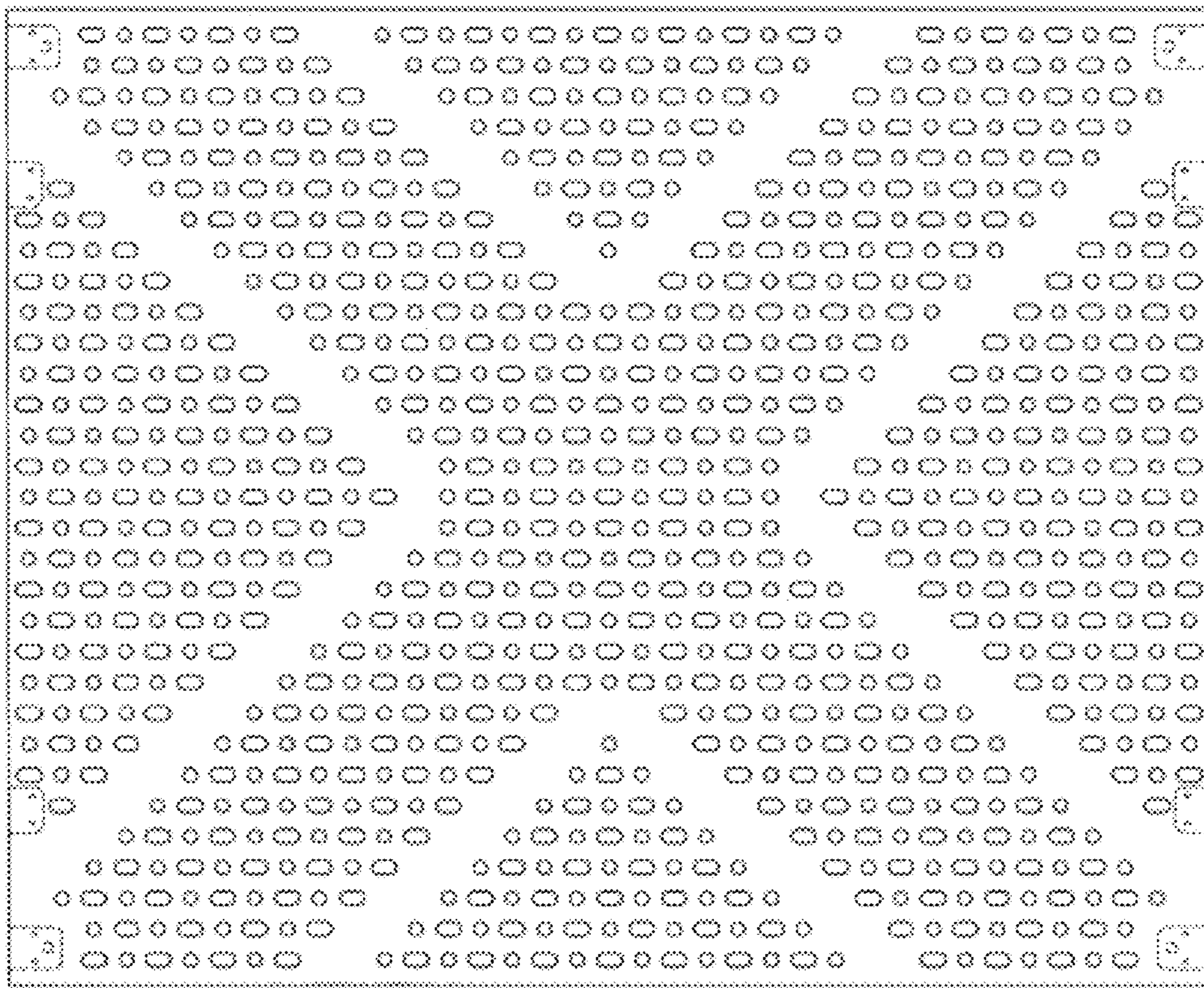

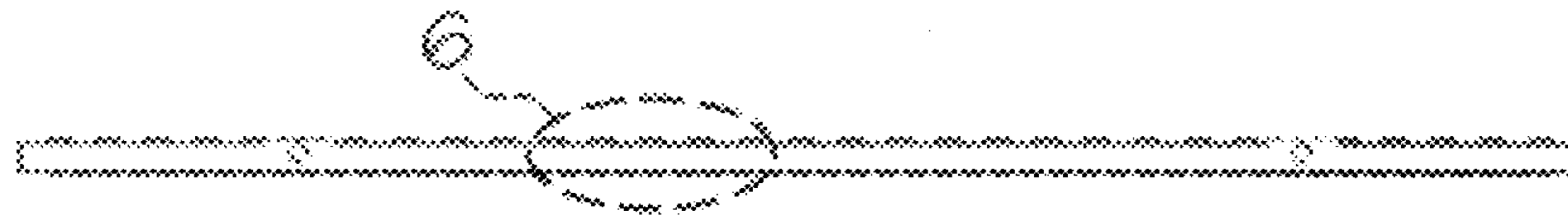

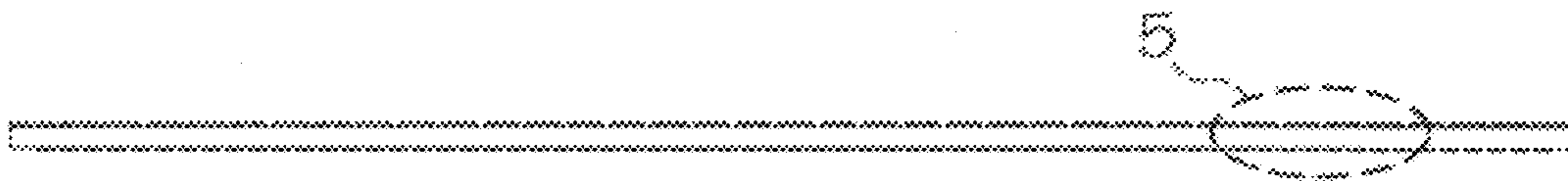

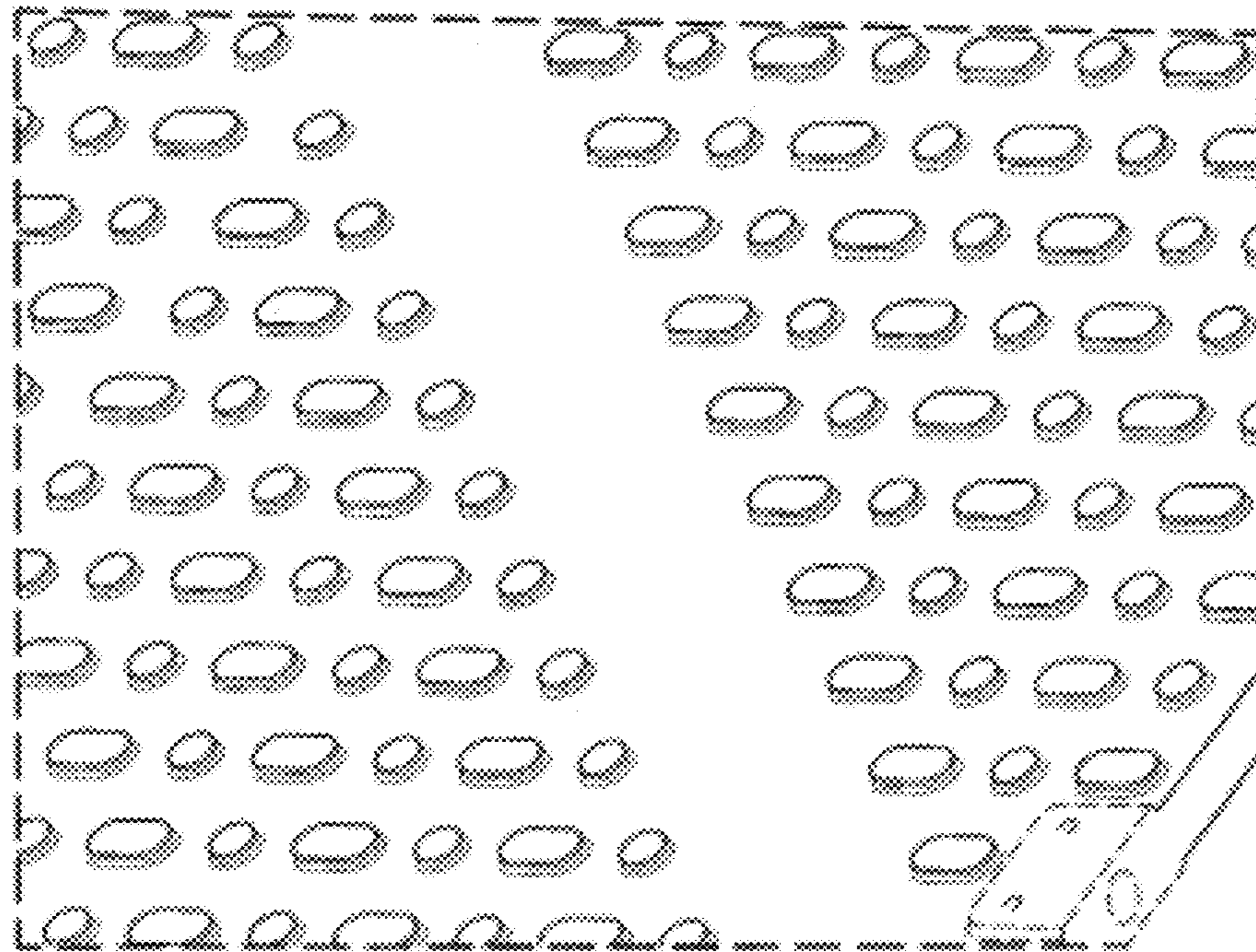

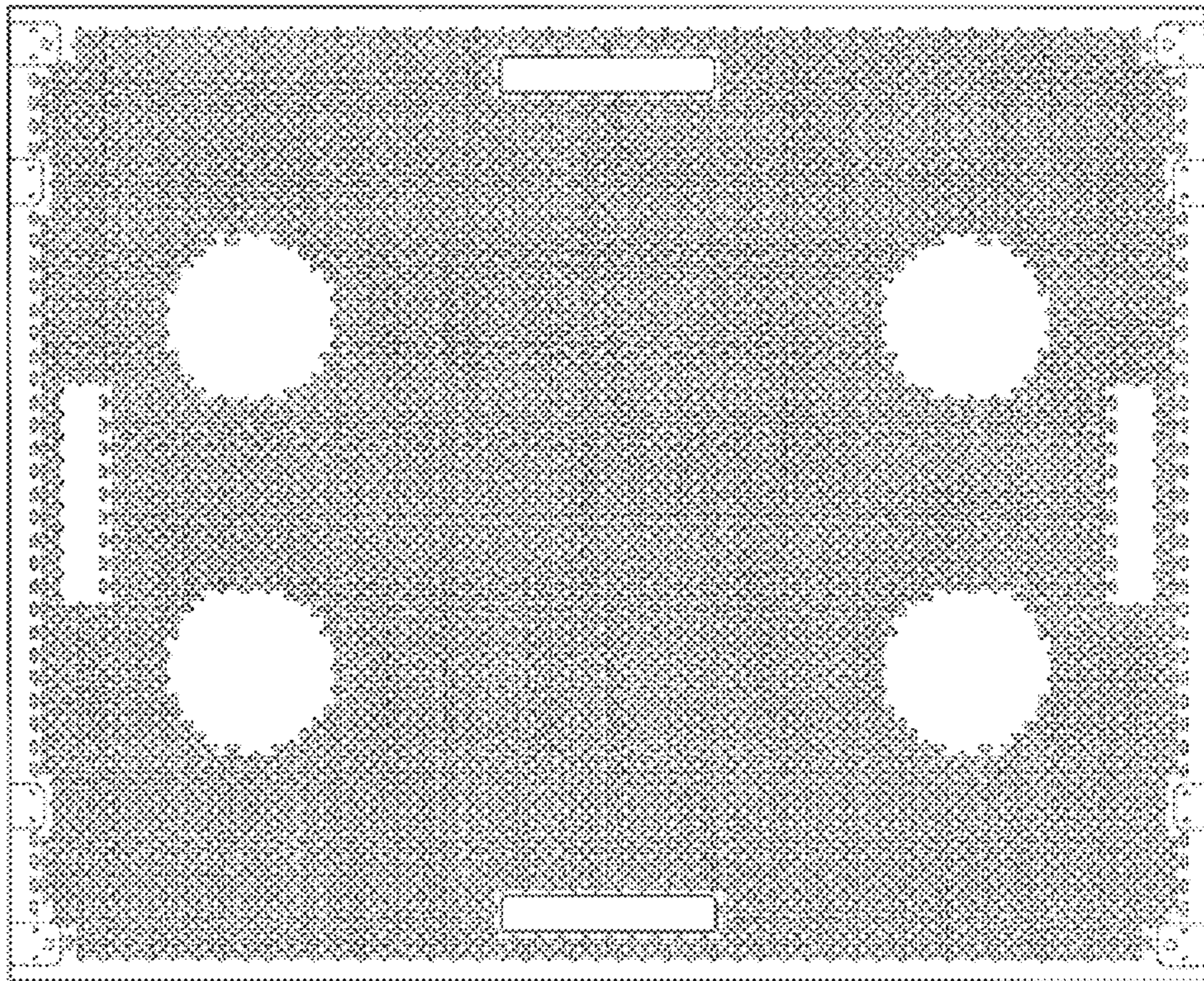

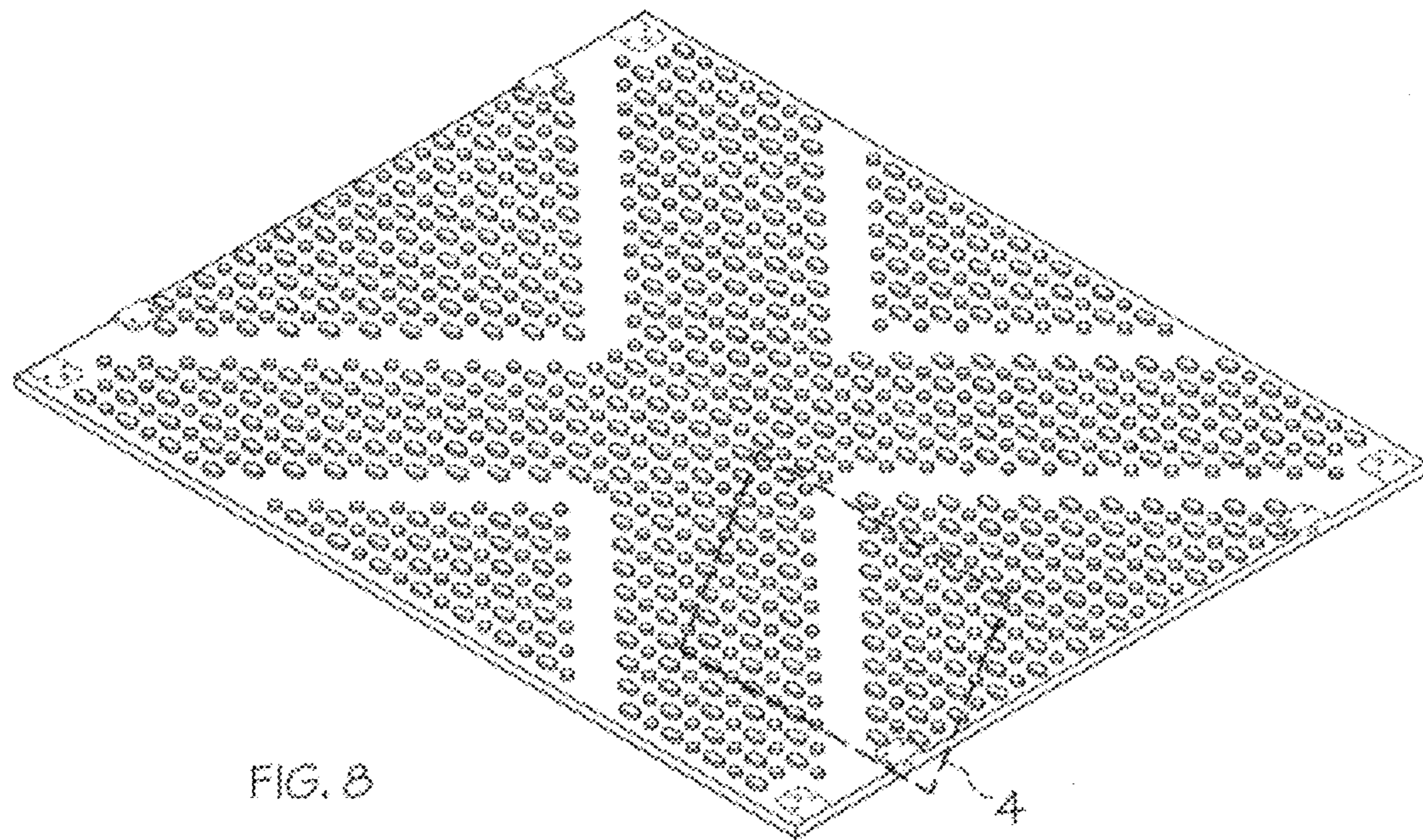
