(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a case for a mobile telephone or portable digital media player case having interchangeable panels, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a case for a mobile telephone or portable digital media player case having interchangeable panels;
FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view thereof showing a plain rear panel;
FIG. 4 is a left side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof;
FIG. 6 is a top plan view thereof;
FIG. 7 is a rear perspective view thereof showing a plain rear panel;
FIG. 8 is a front perspective view thereof;
FIG. 9 is an alternate rear perspective view thereof showing a plain rear panel;
FIG. 10 is a rear perspective view of a rear panel with wood-grain structured surface;
FIG. 11 is a rear panel elevational view having a natural wood surface;
FIG. 12 is a rear panel elevational view having a fabric or canvas surface;
FIG. 13 is a rear panel elevational view having an imitation or faux leather surface; and,
FIG. 14 is a rear panel elevational view having a reflective or mirrored surface.

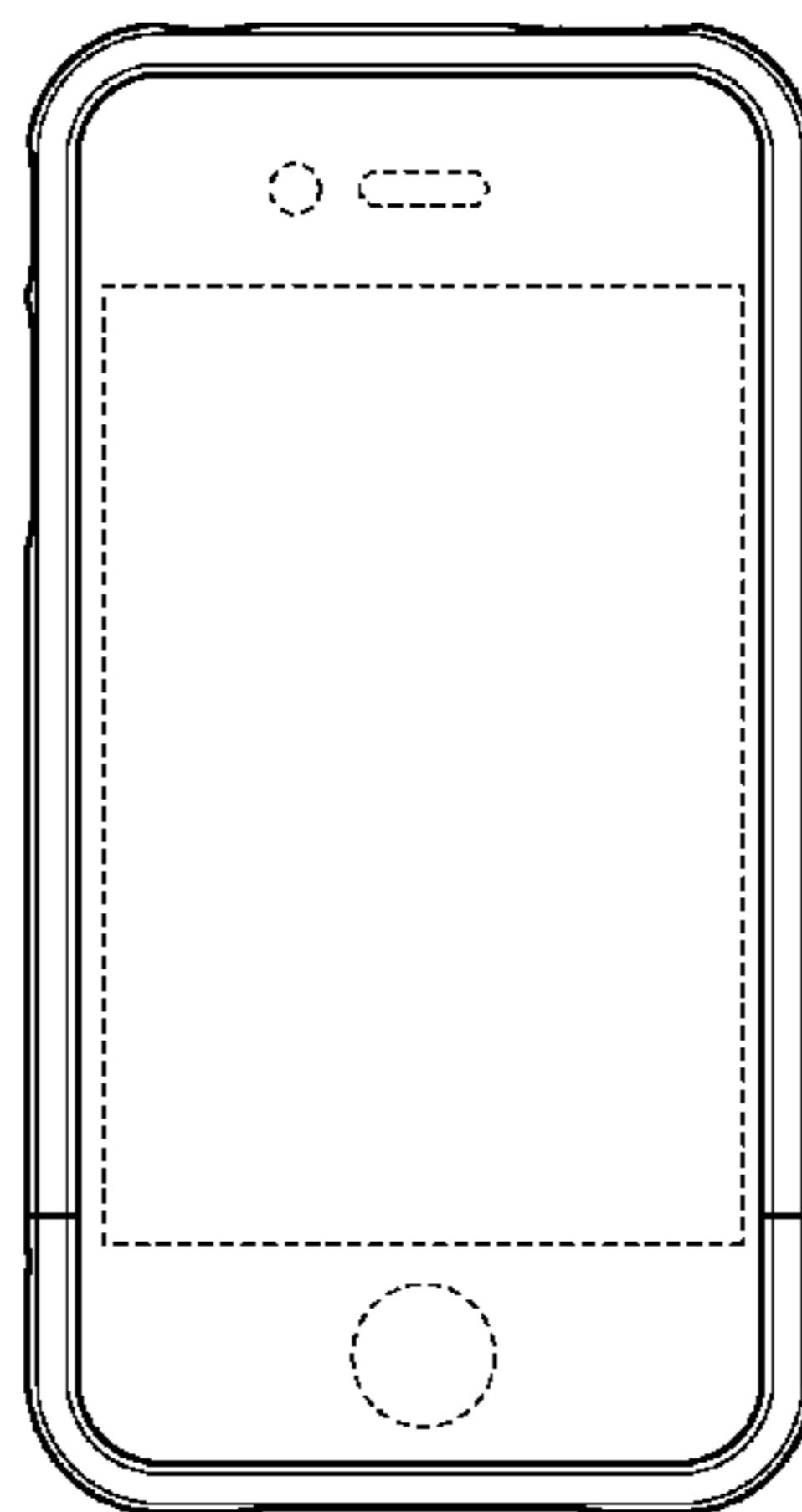

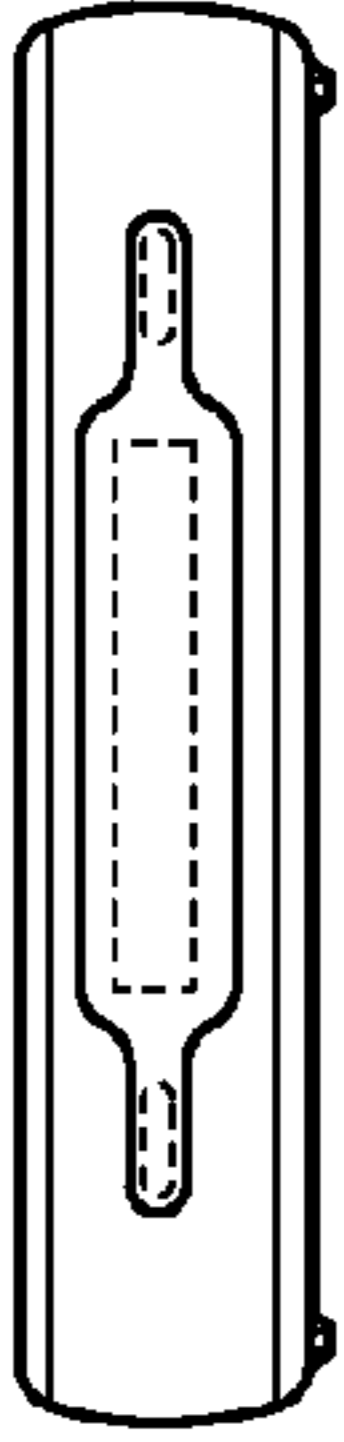

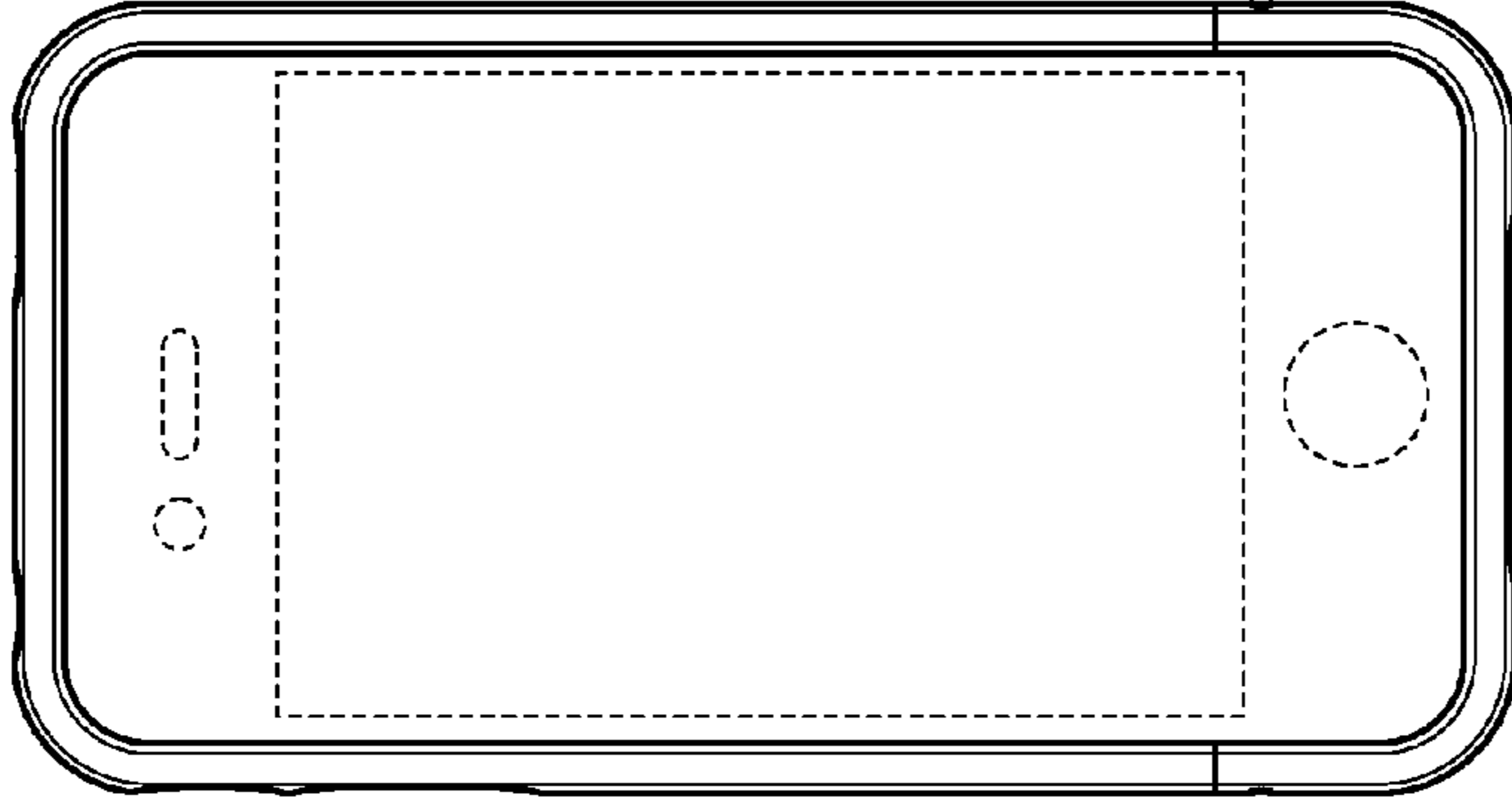

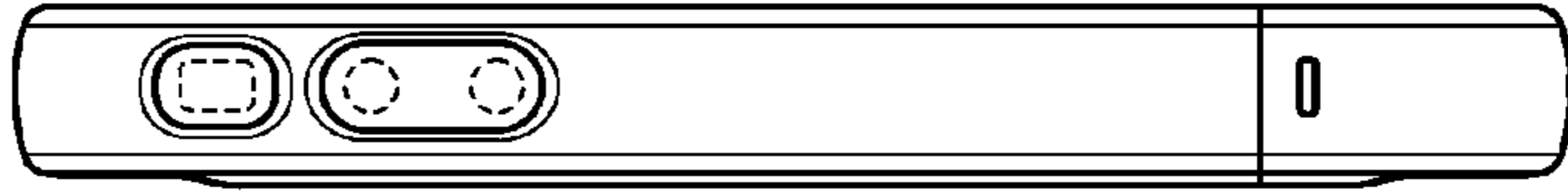

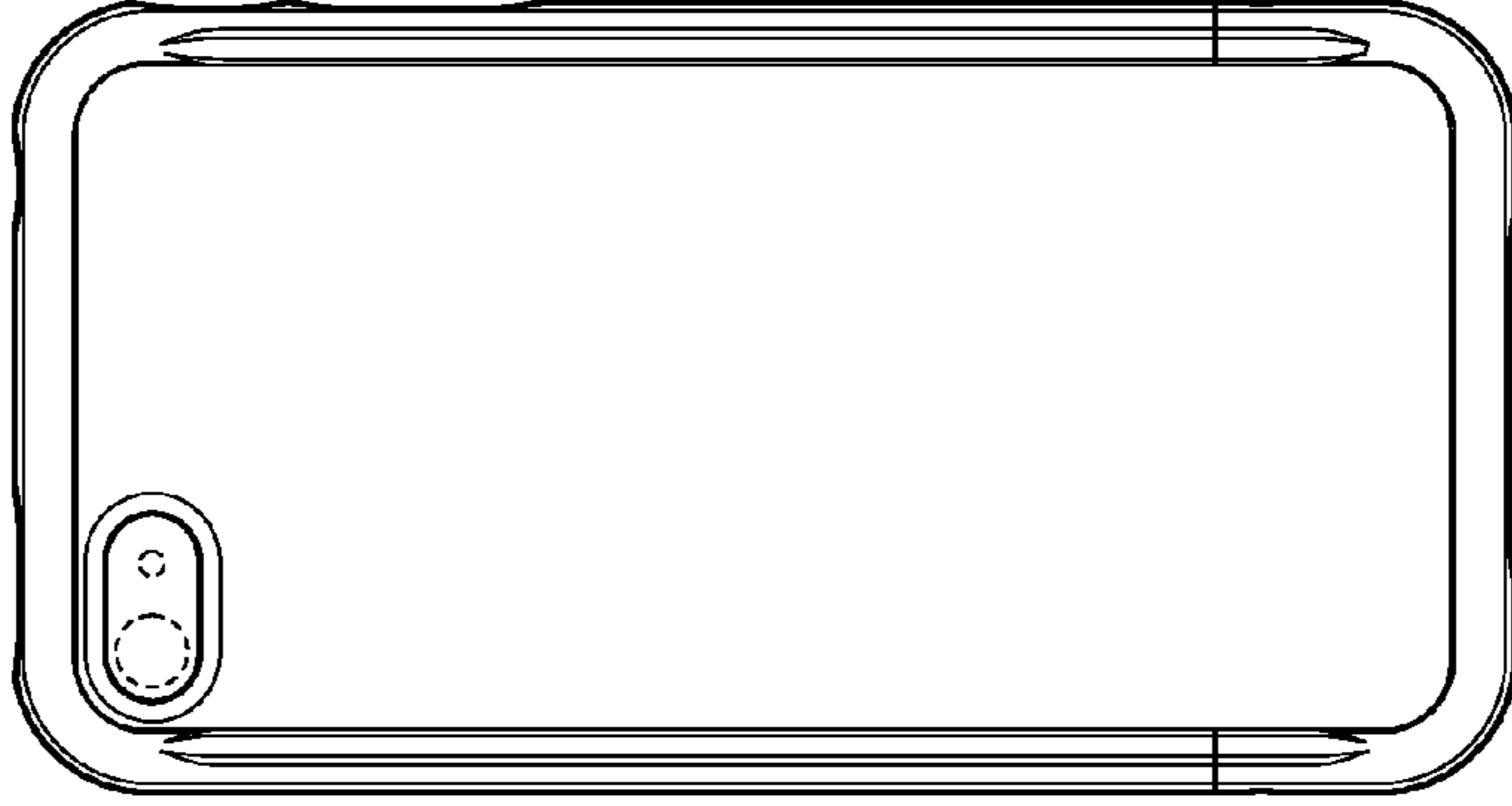

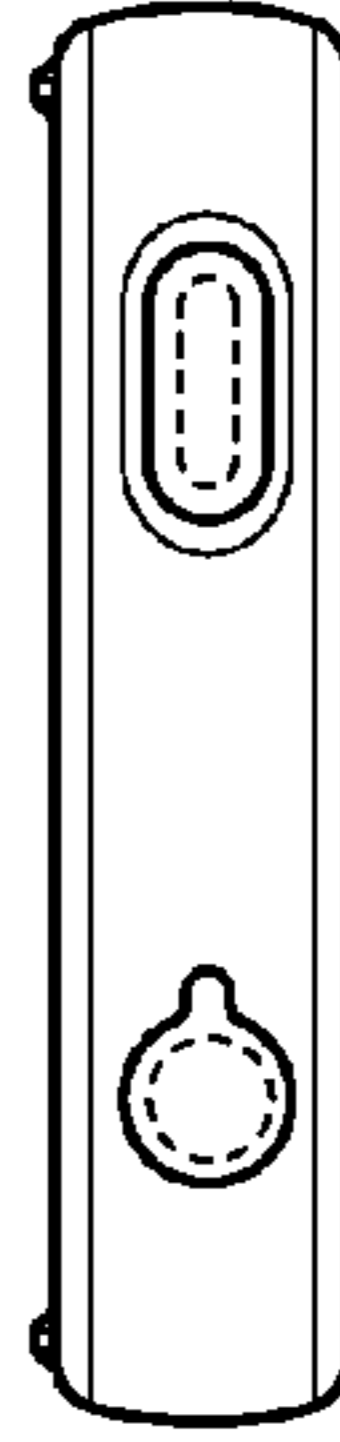

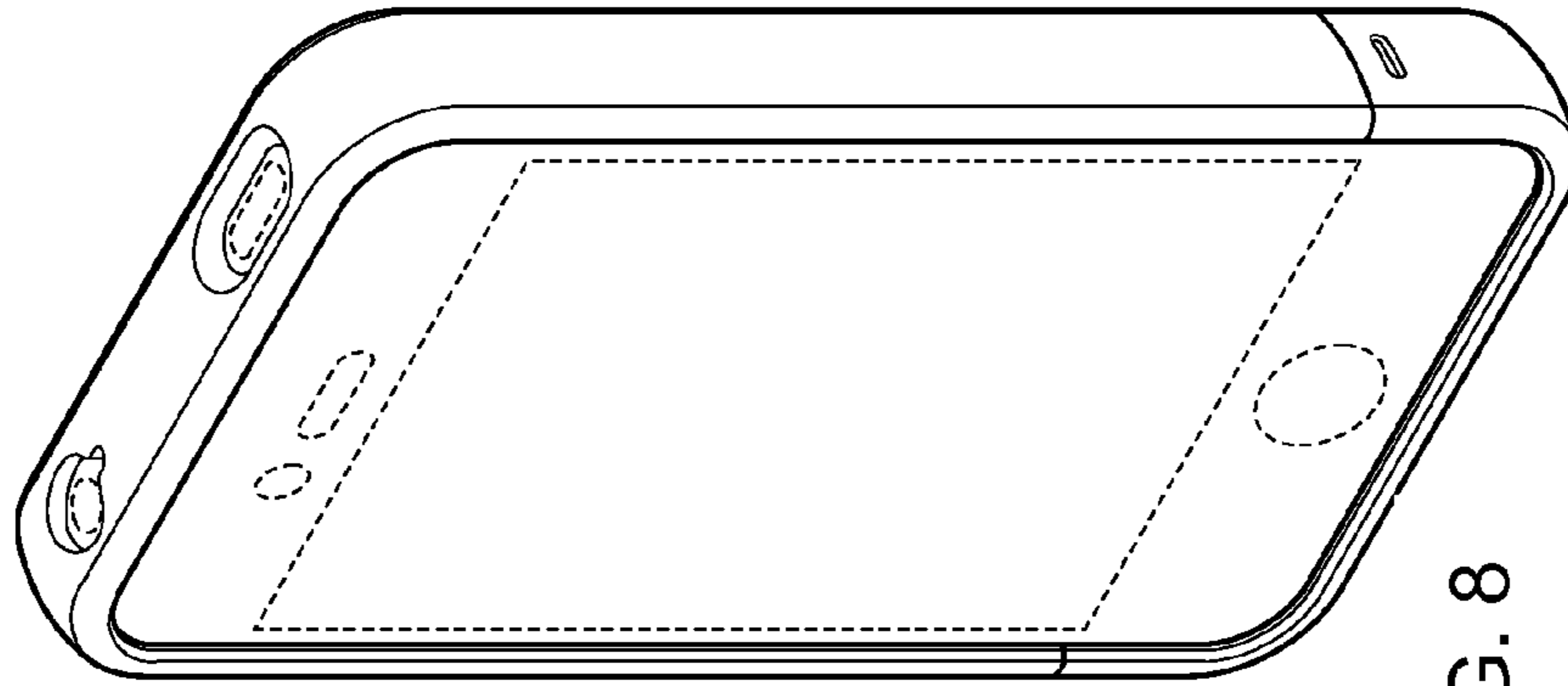

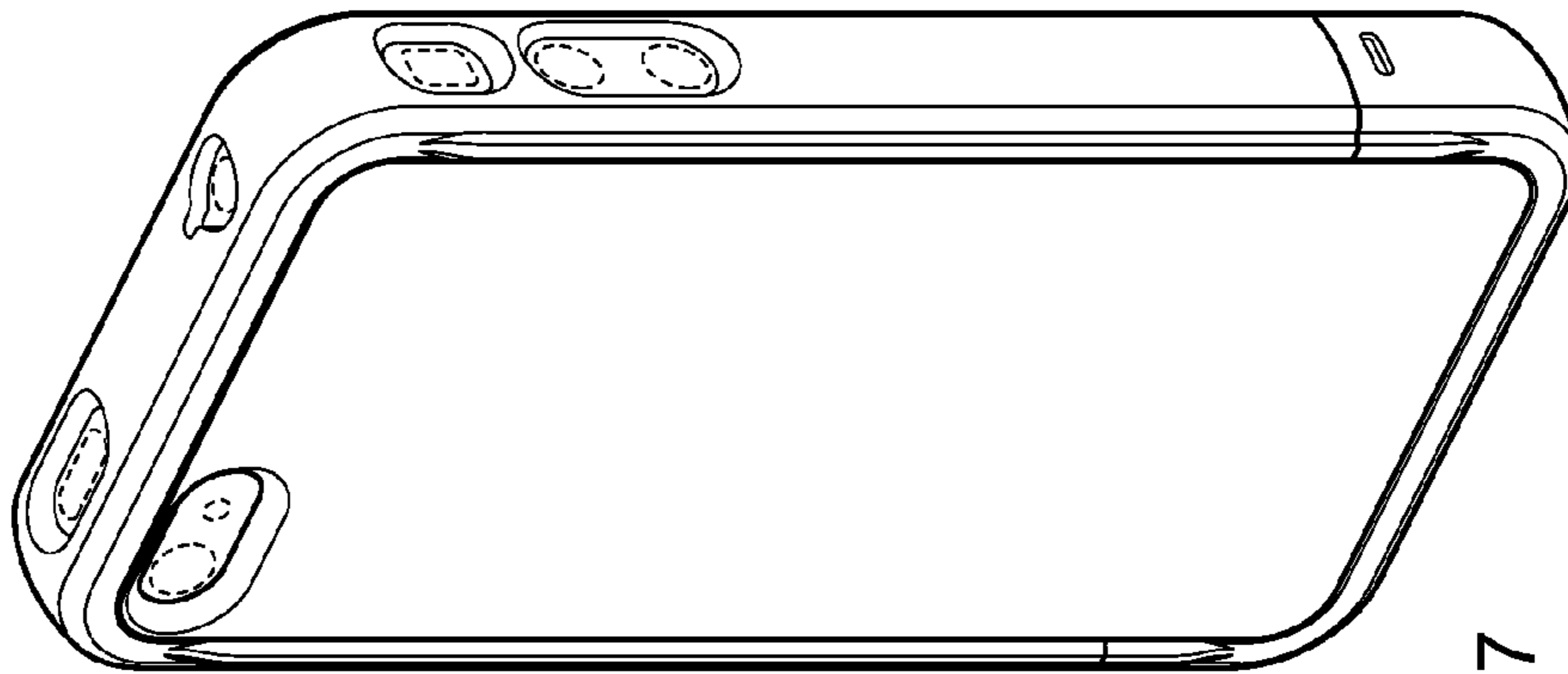

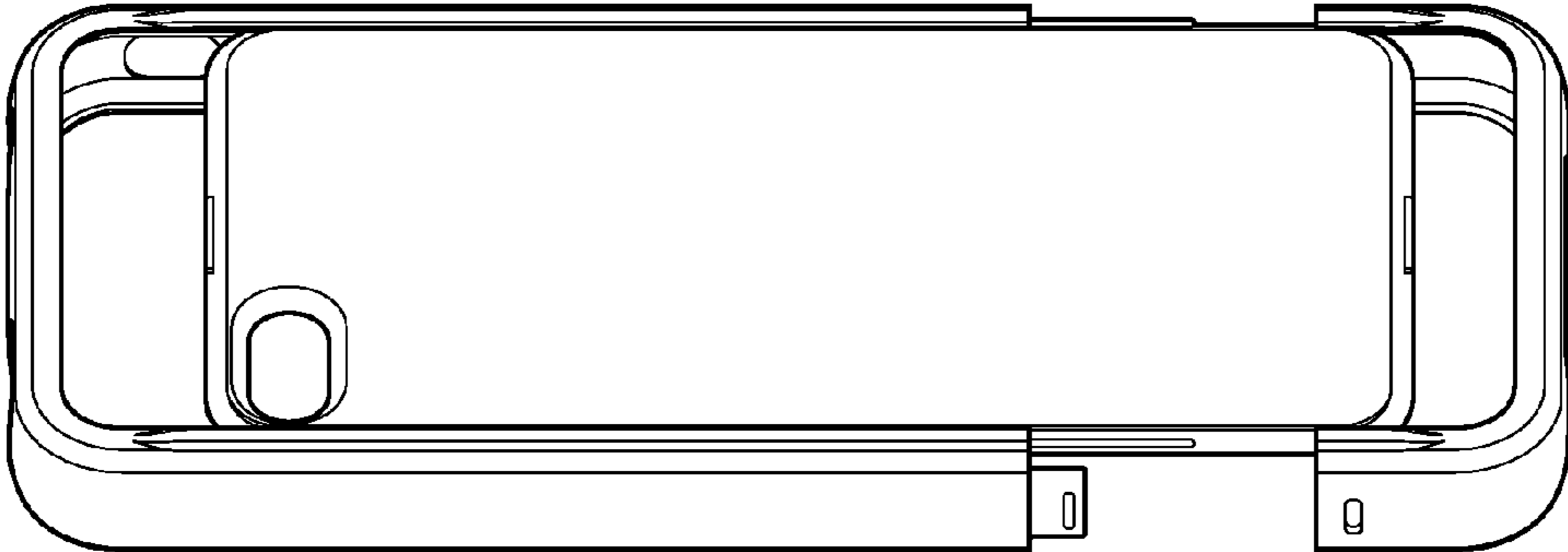

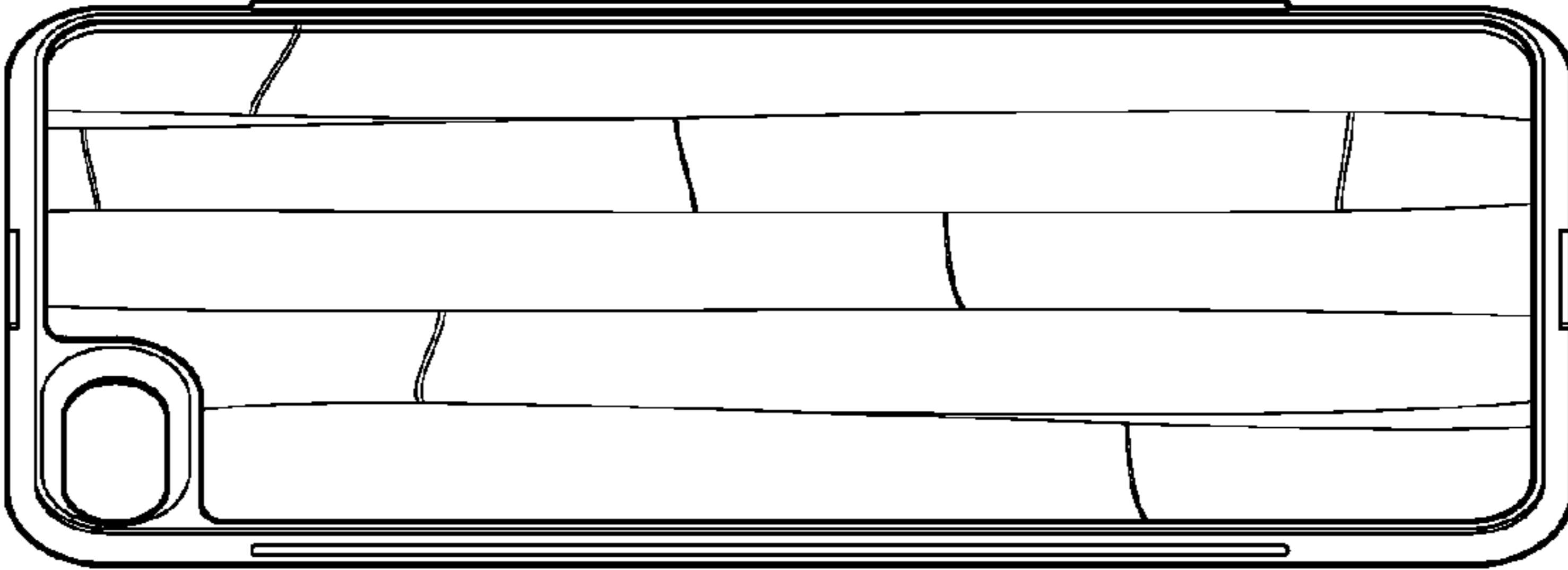

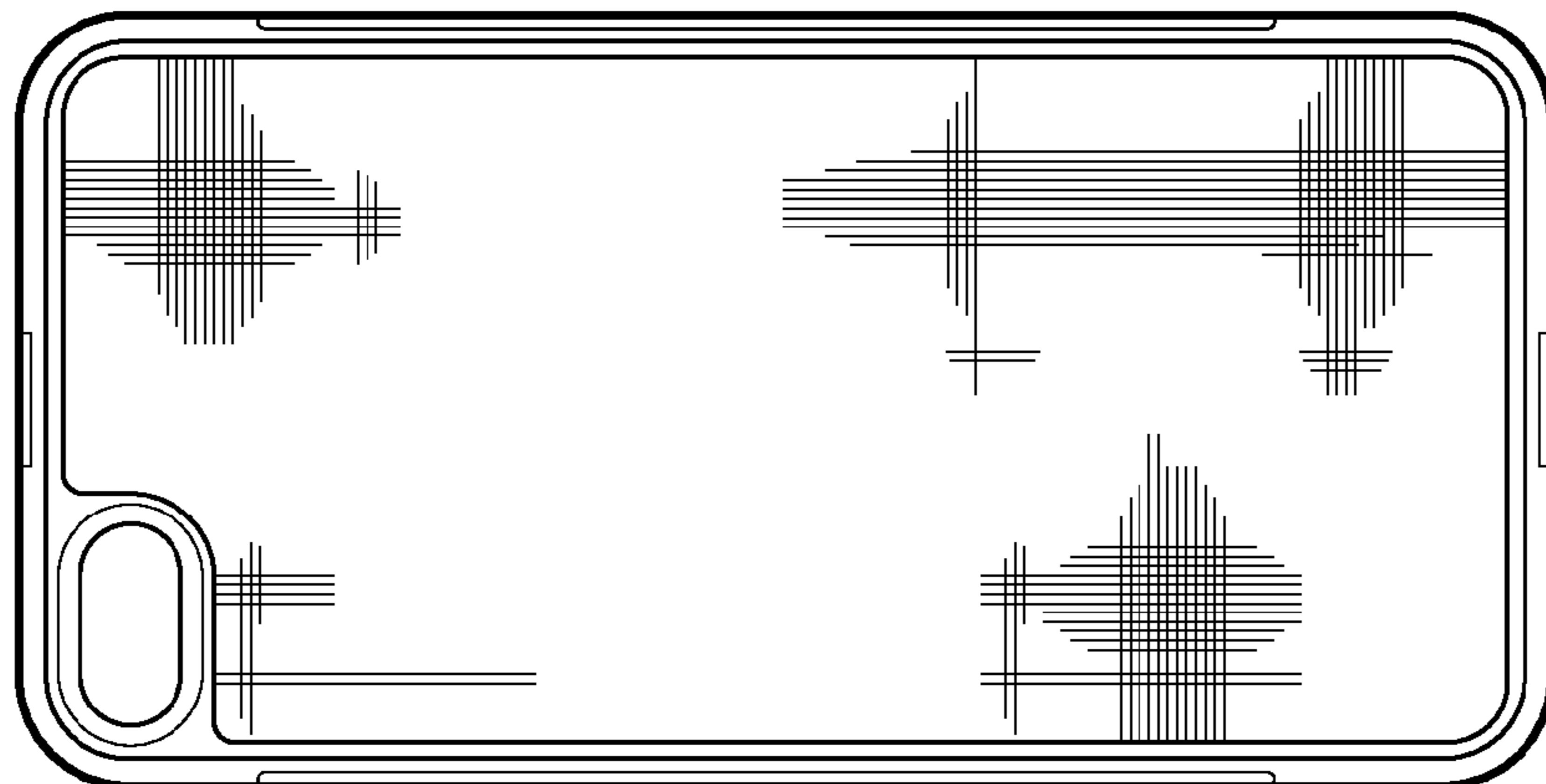

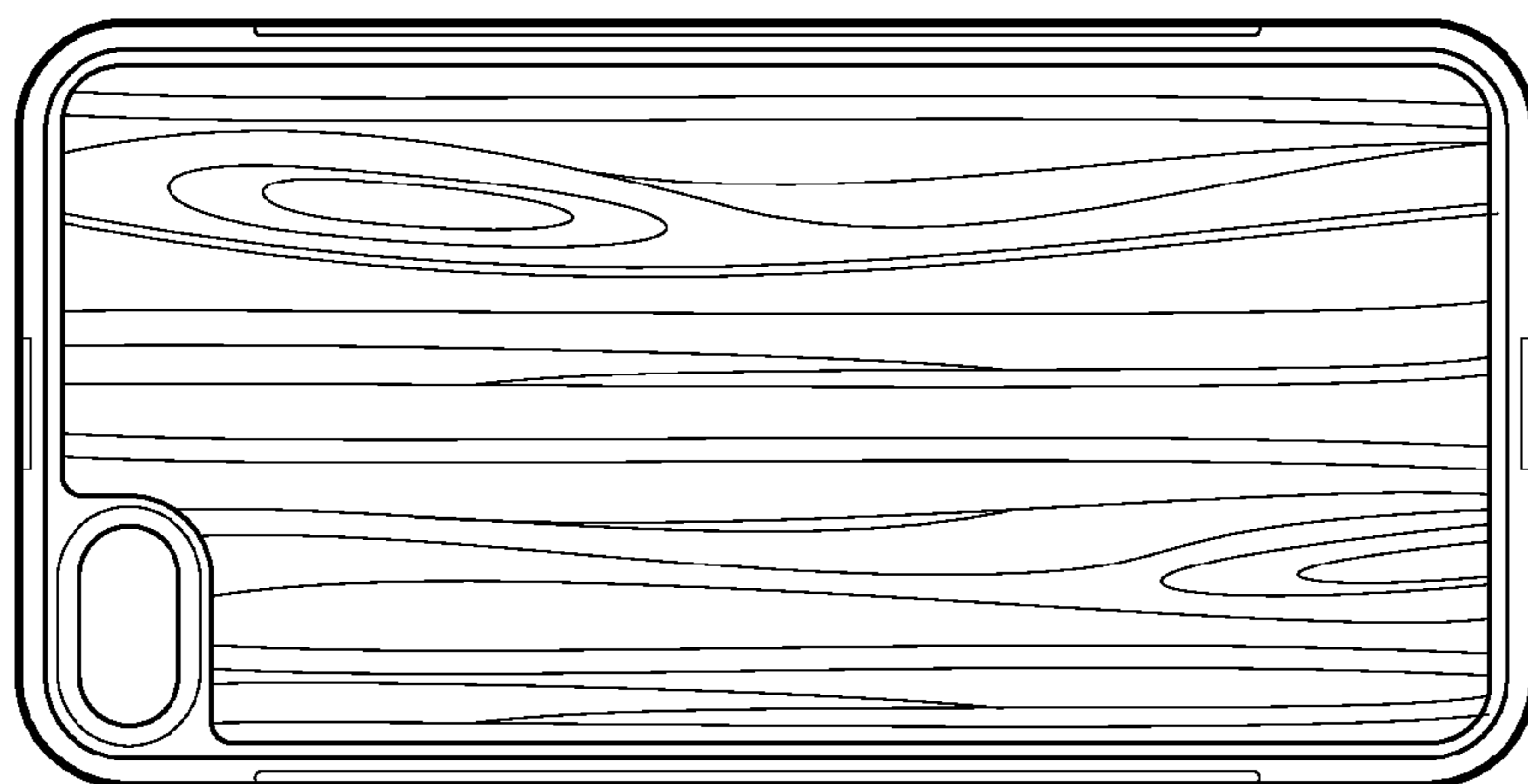

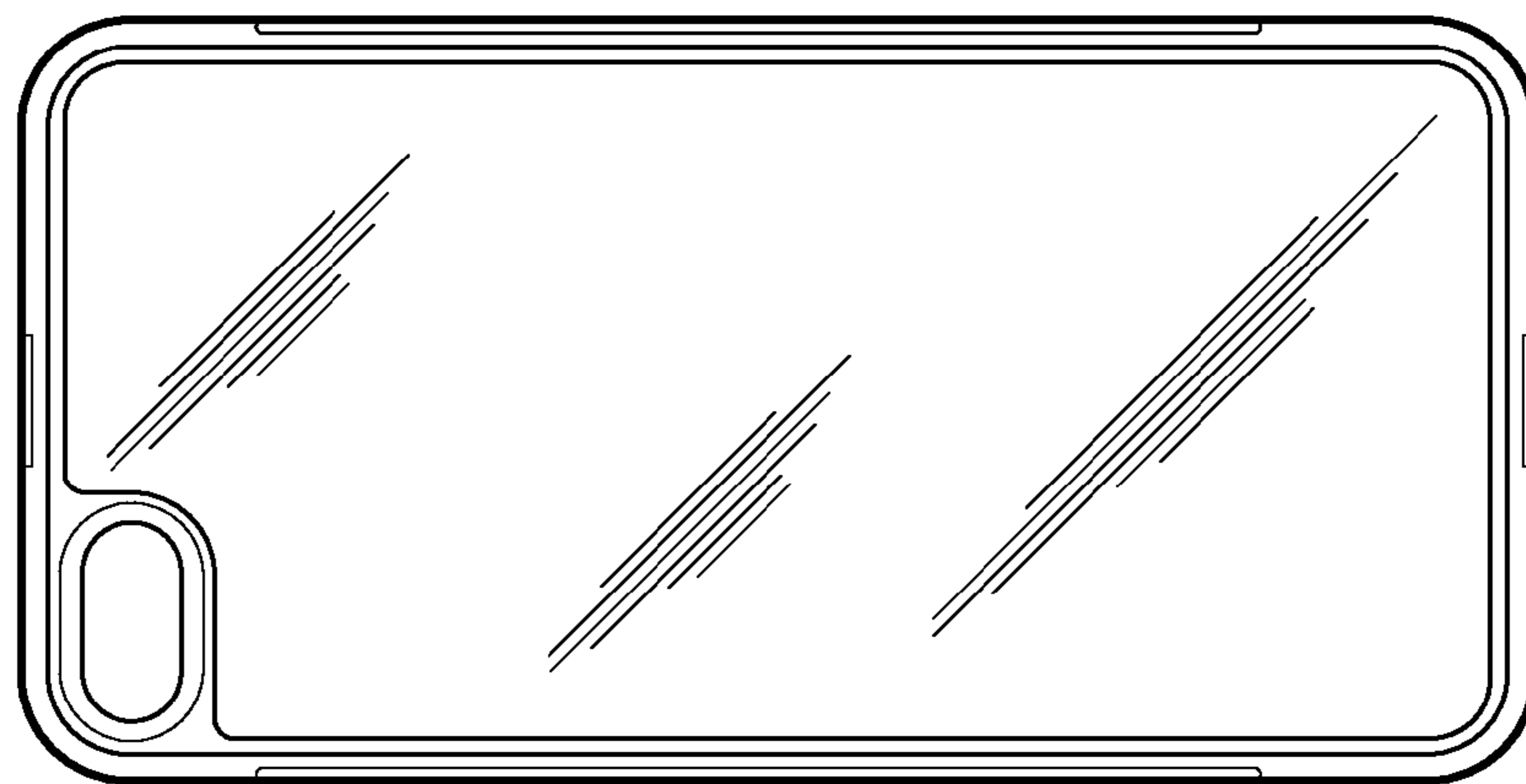
