FIG. 12 is a side plan view in full lines, and the environmental associated matter in broken lines of the embodiment in FIG. 8;

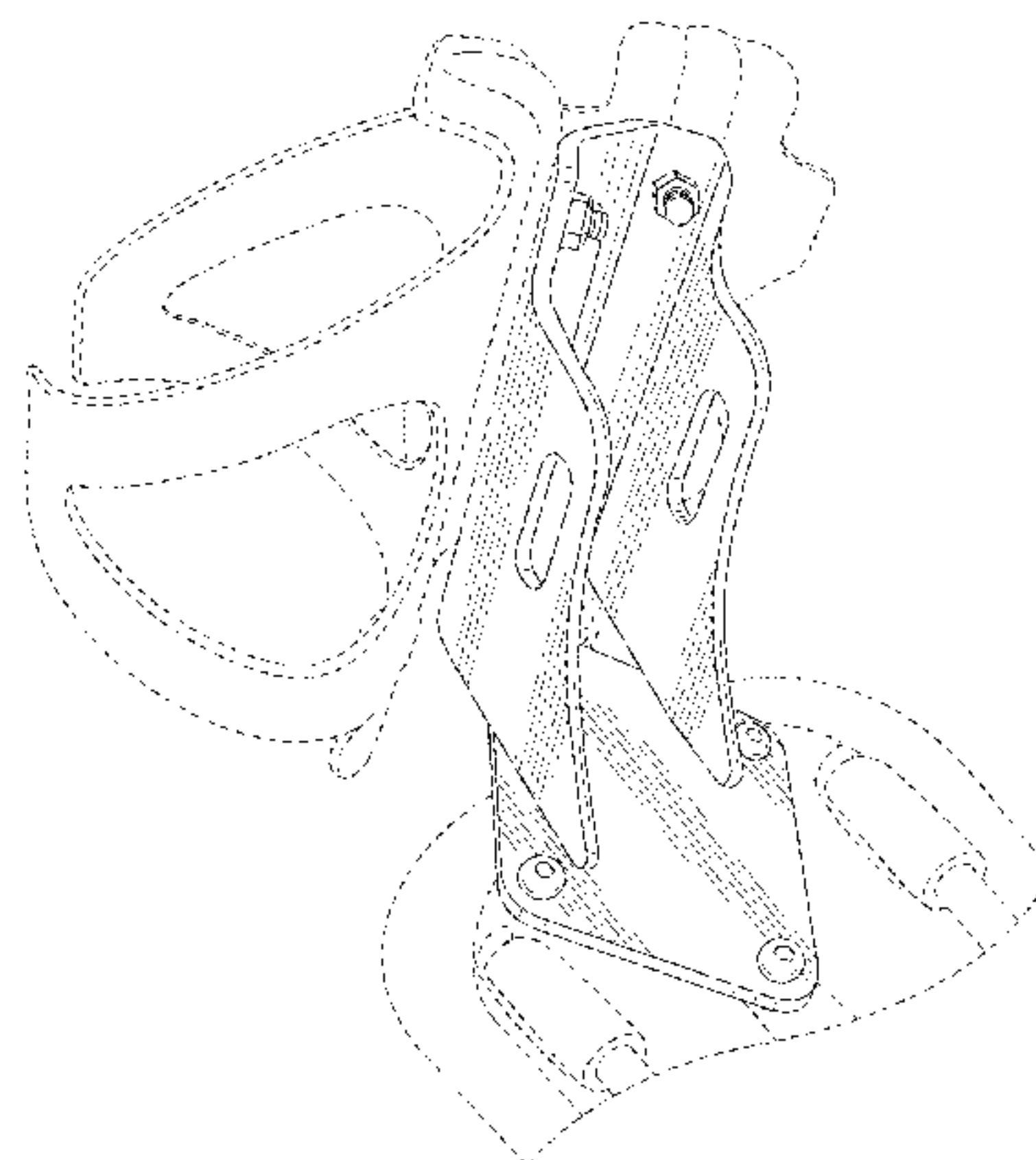
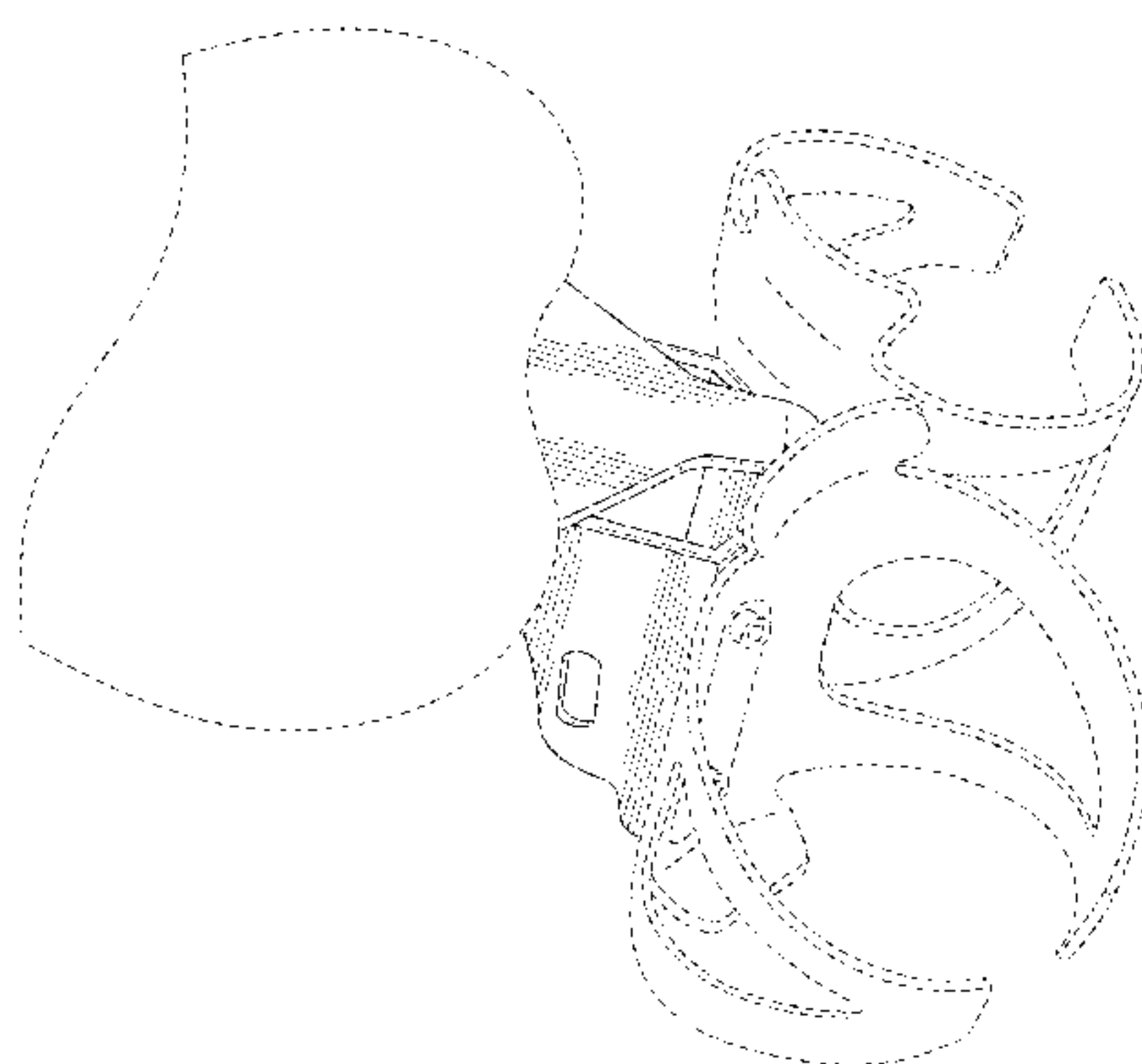


FIG. **13** is a top plan view in full lines, and the environmental associated matter in broken lines of the embodiment in FIG. **8**;

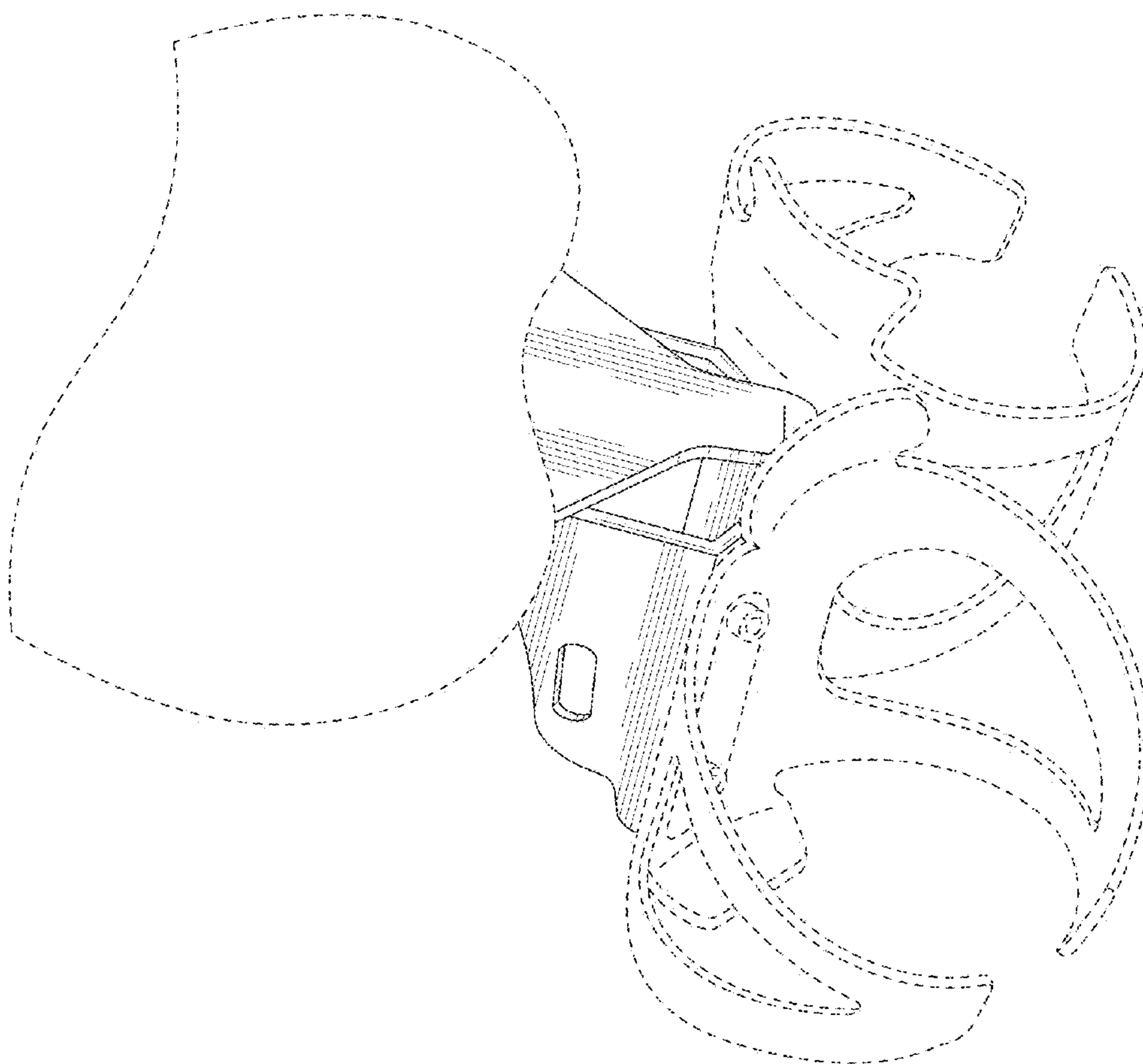

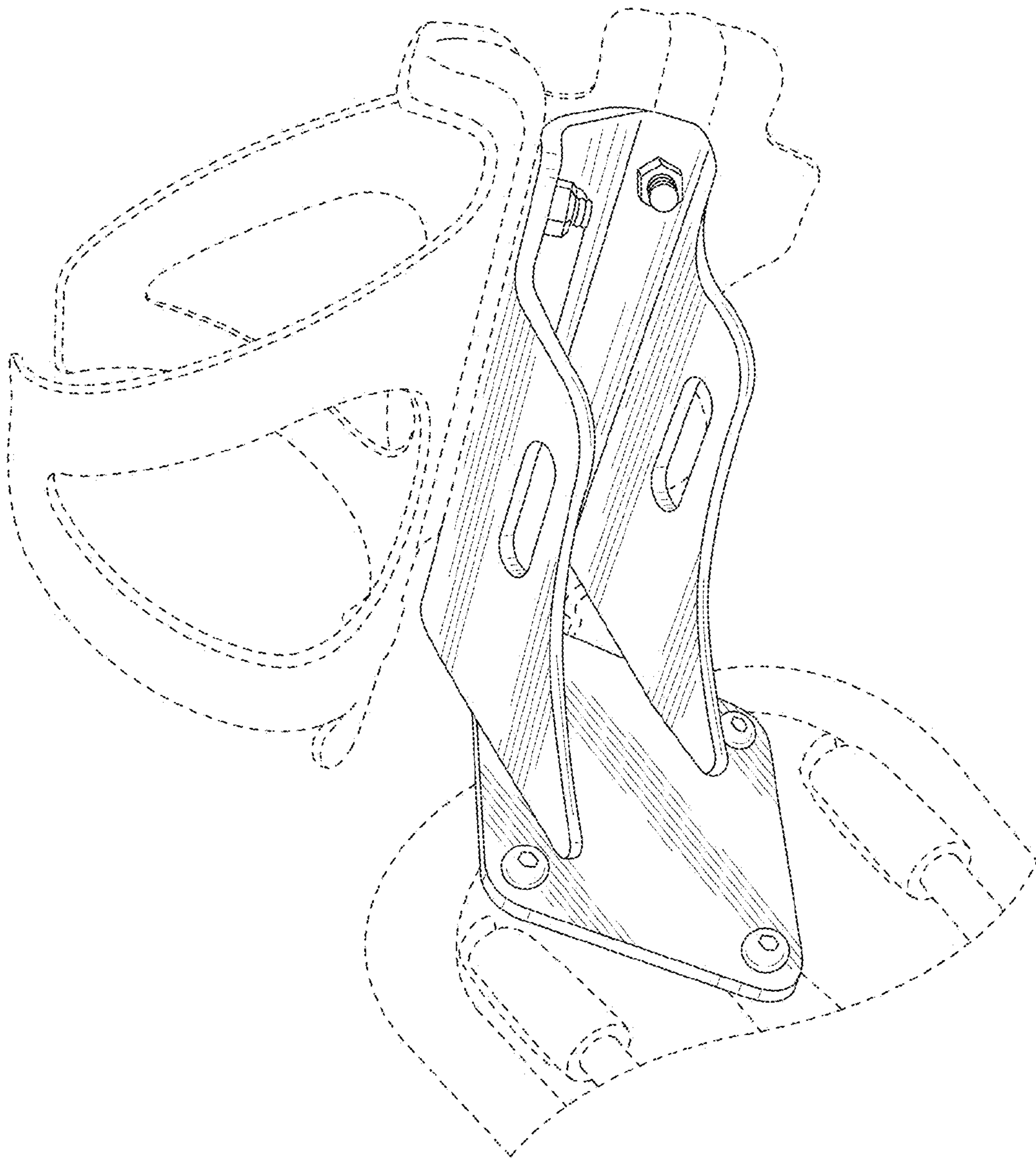

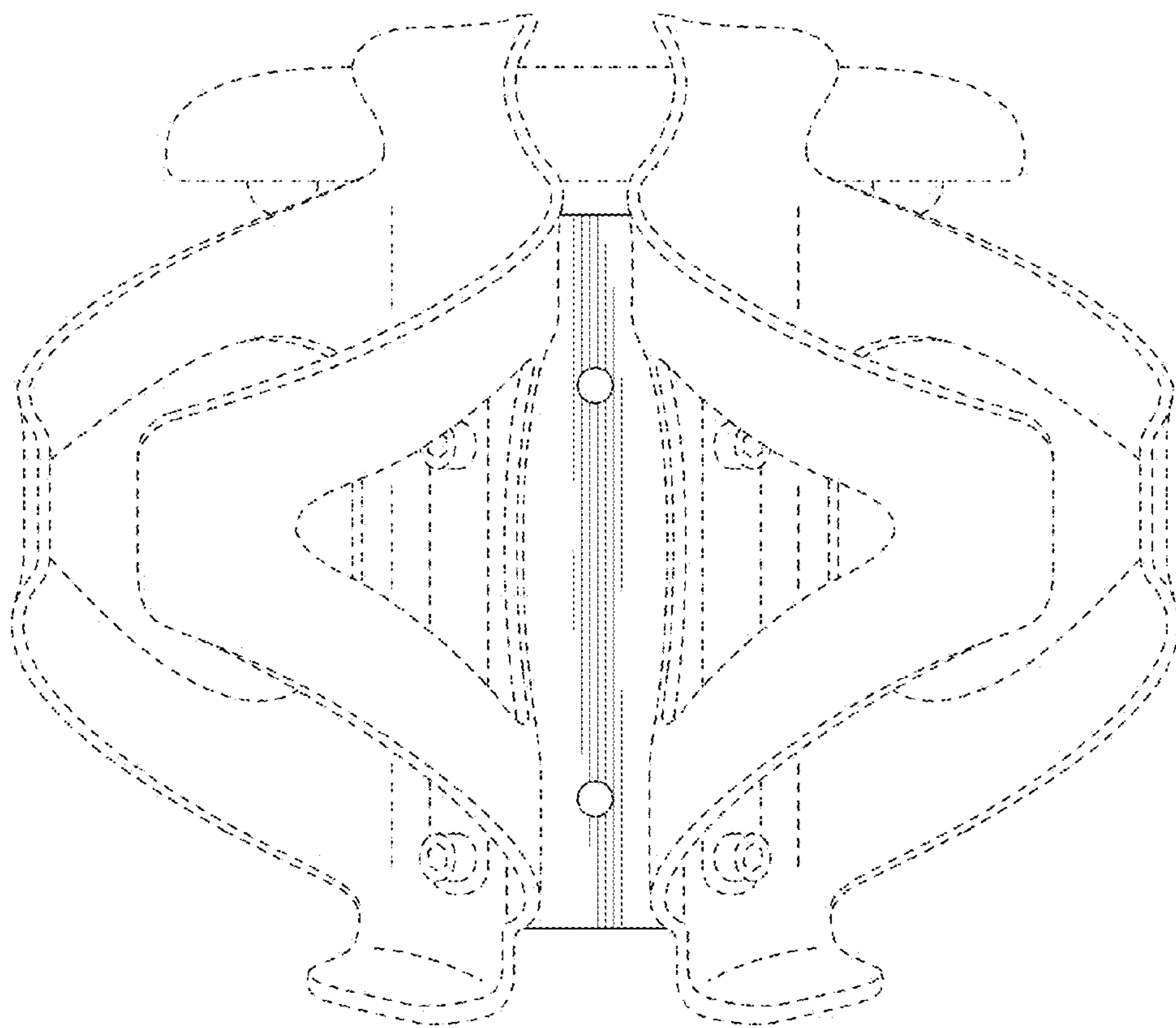

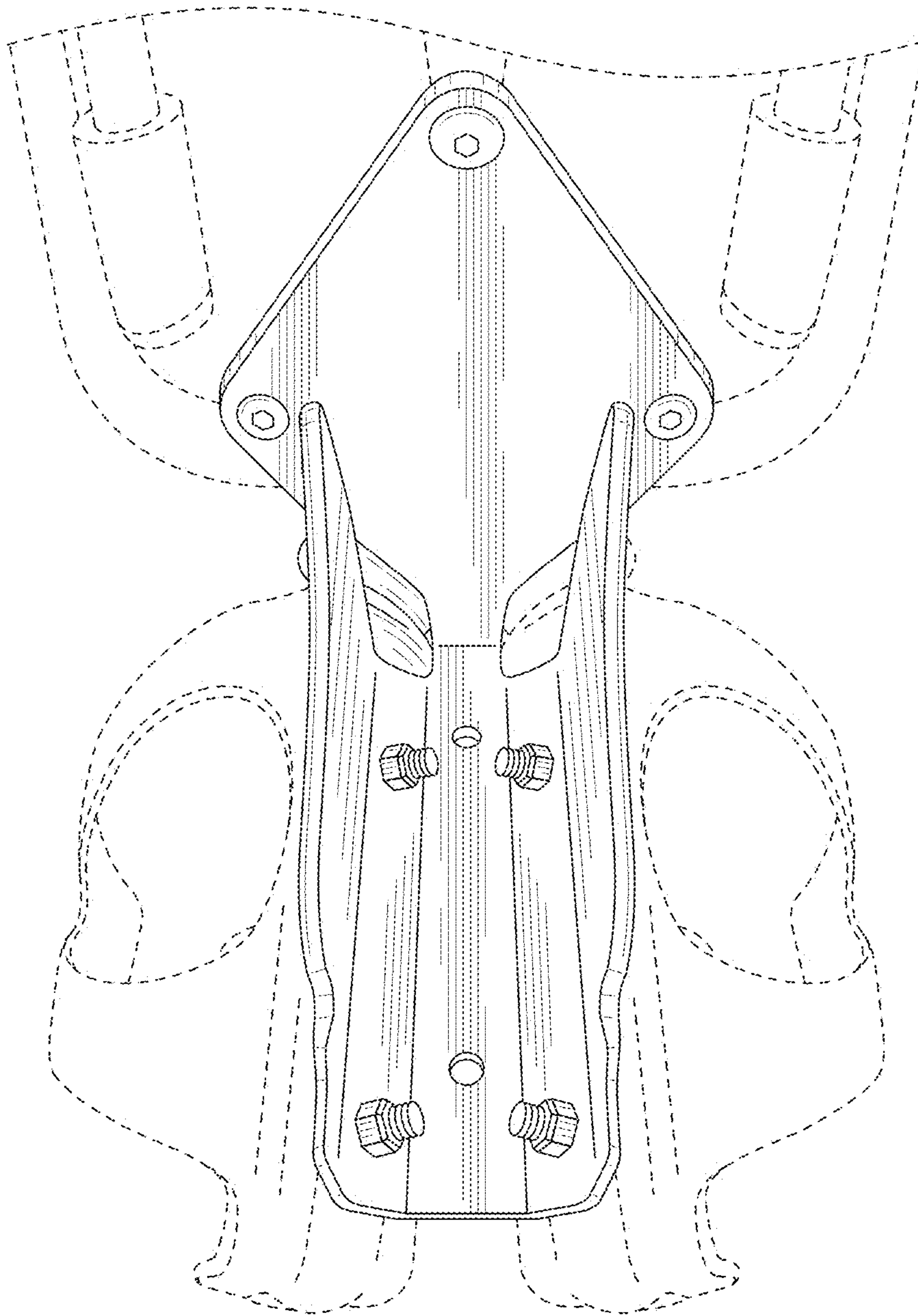

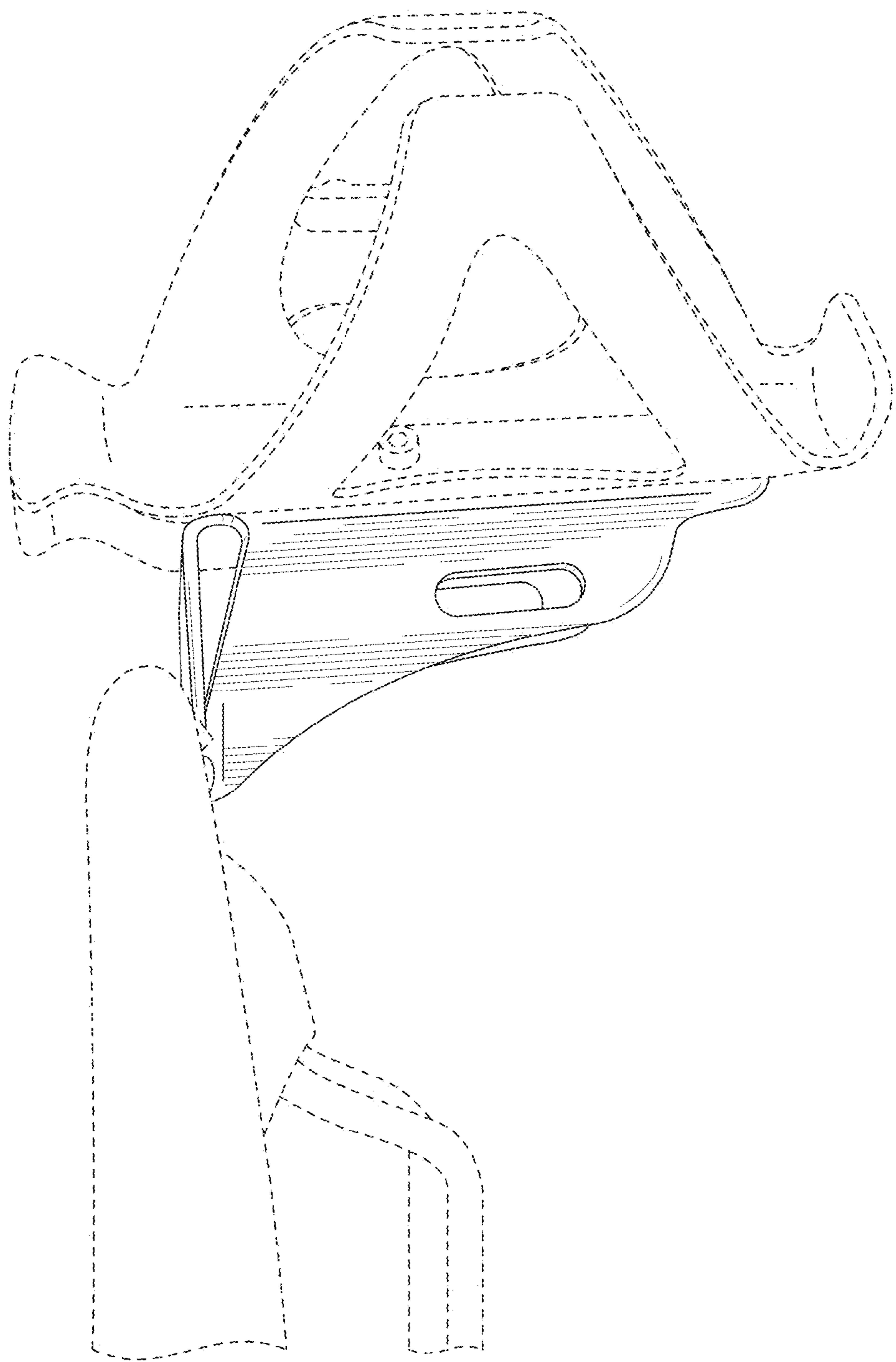

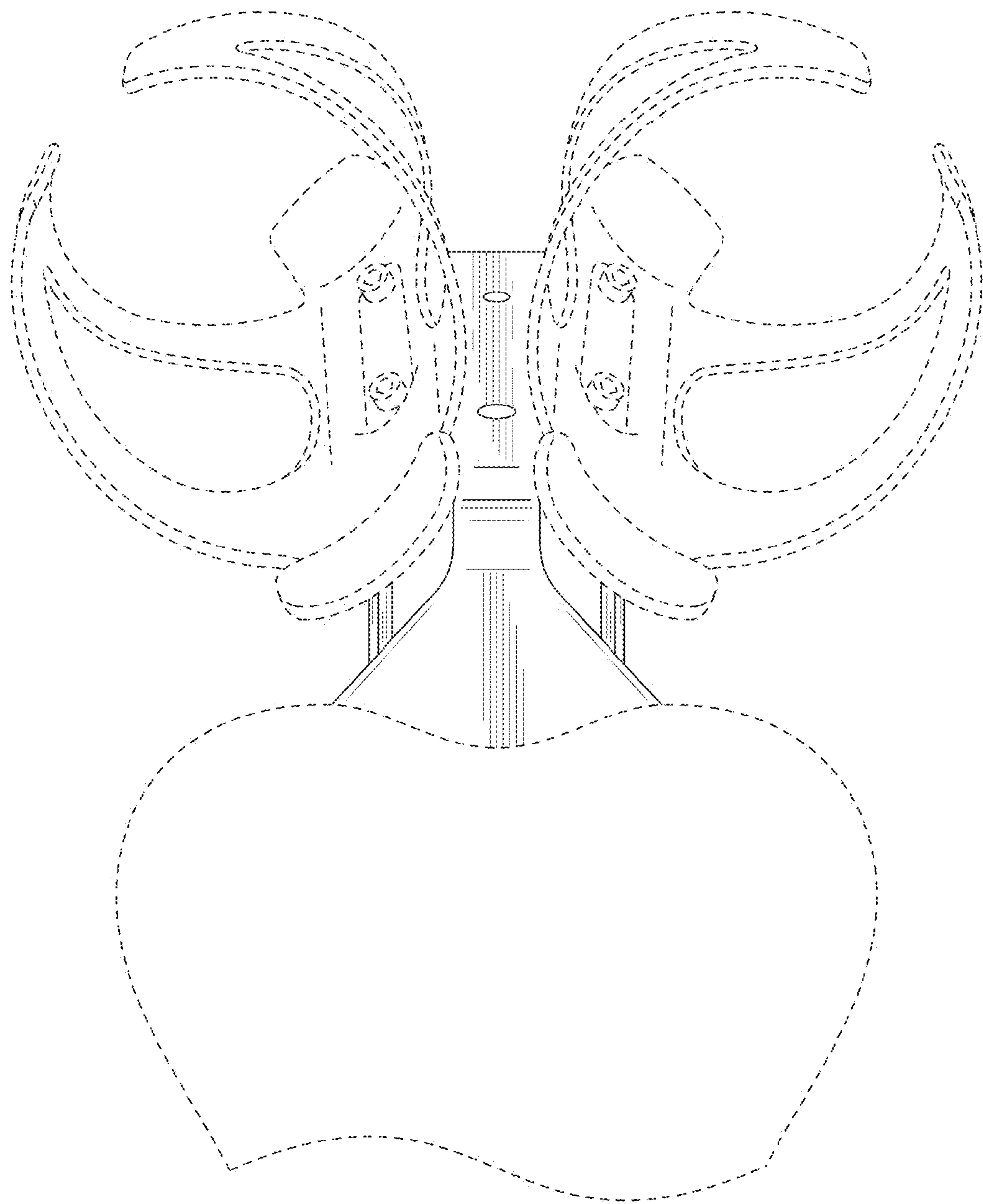

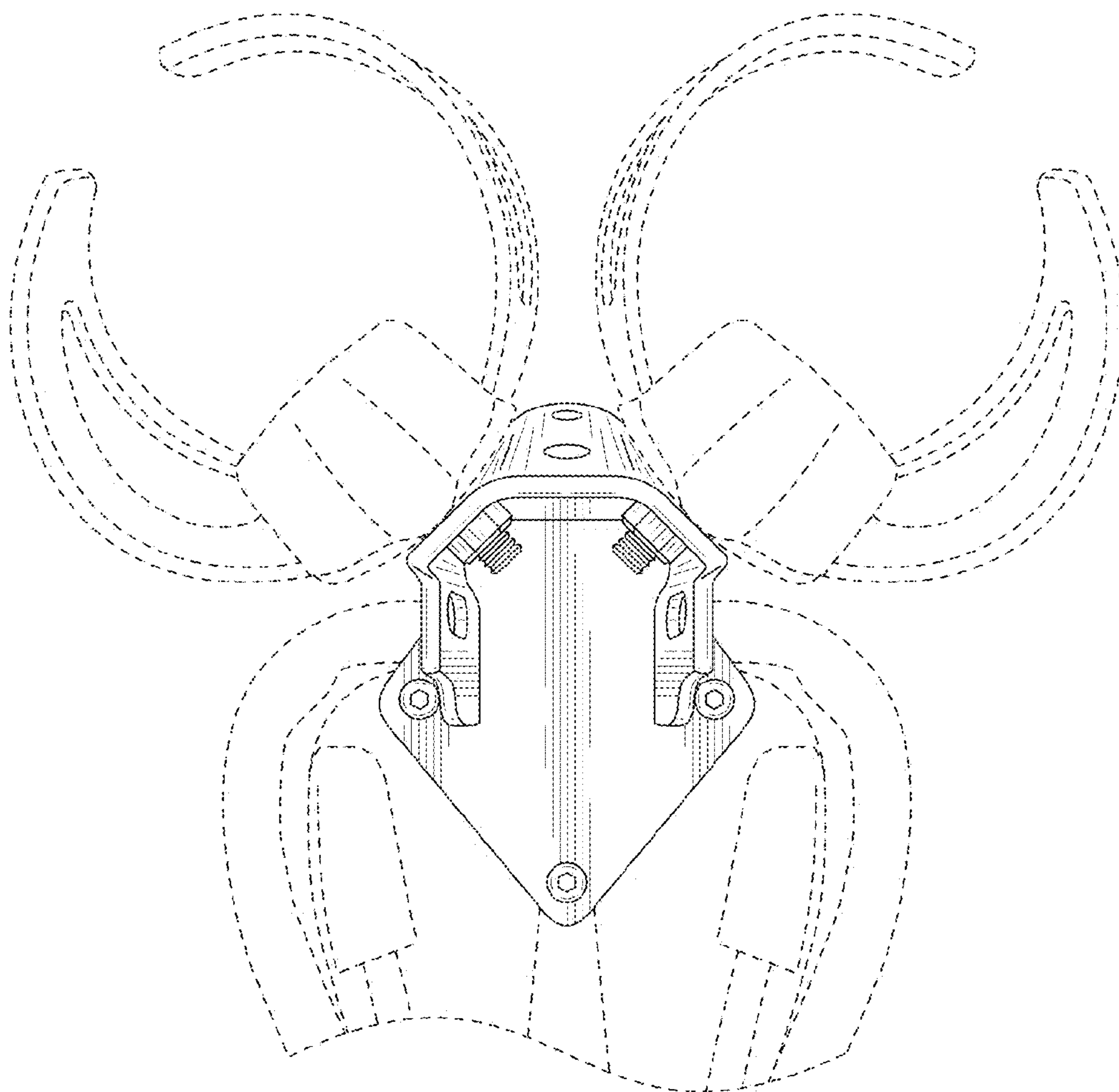

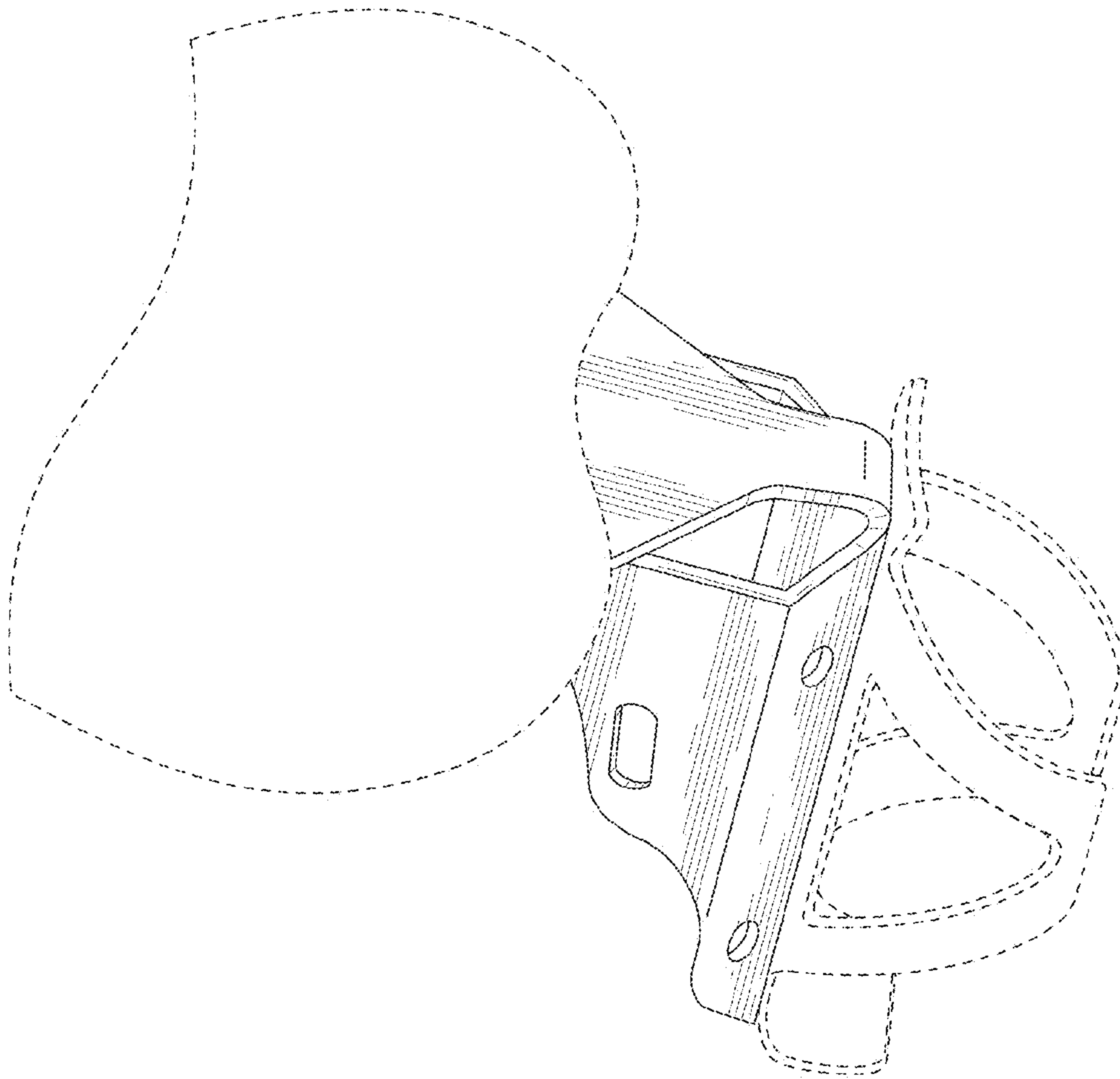

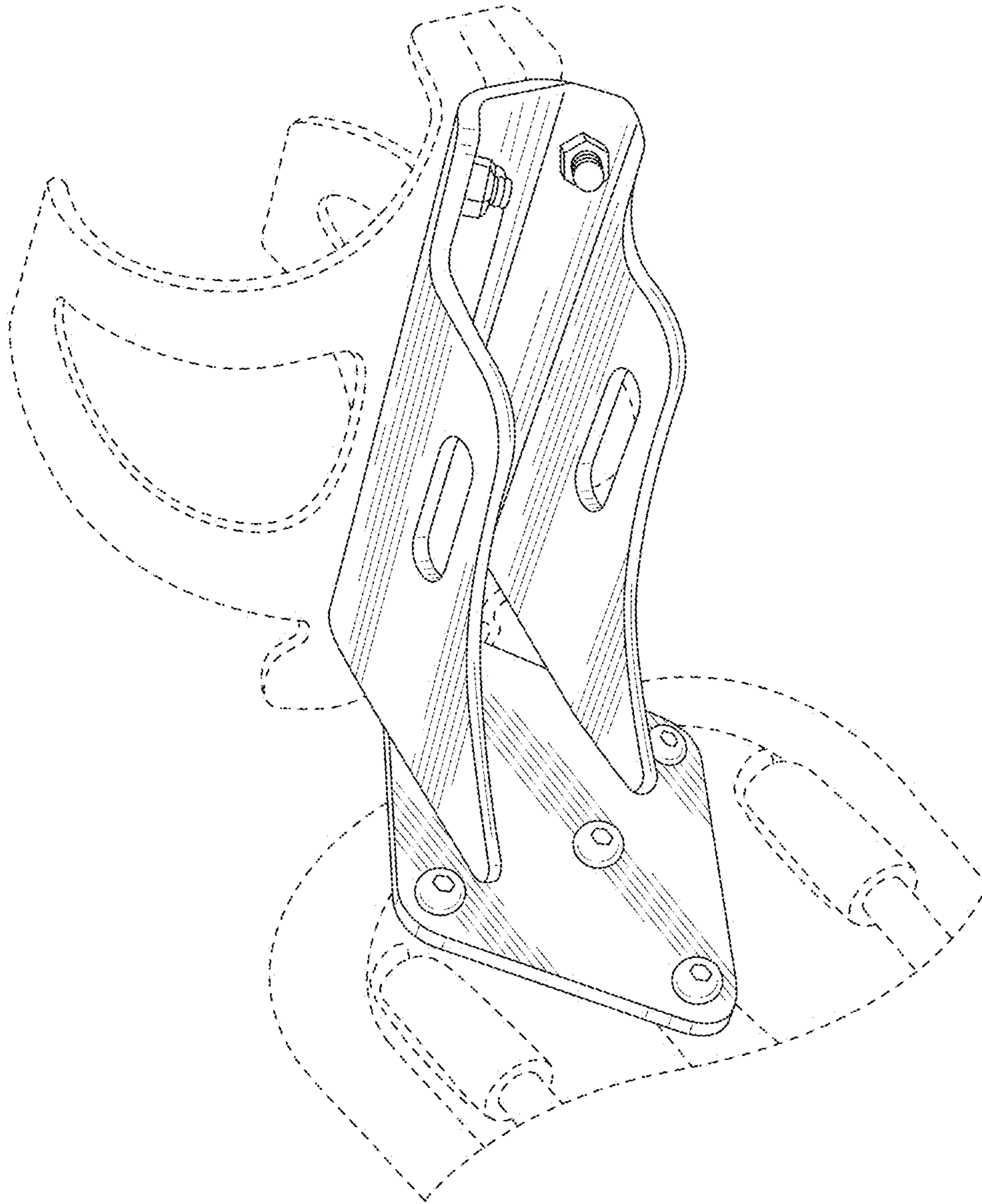

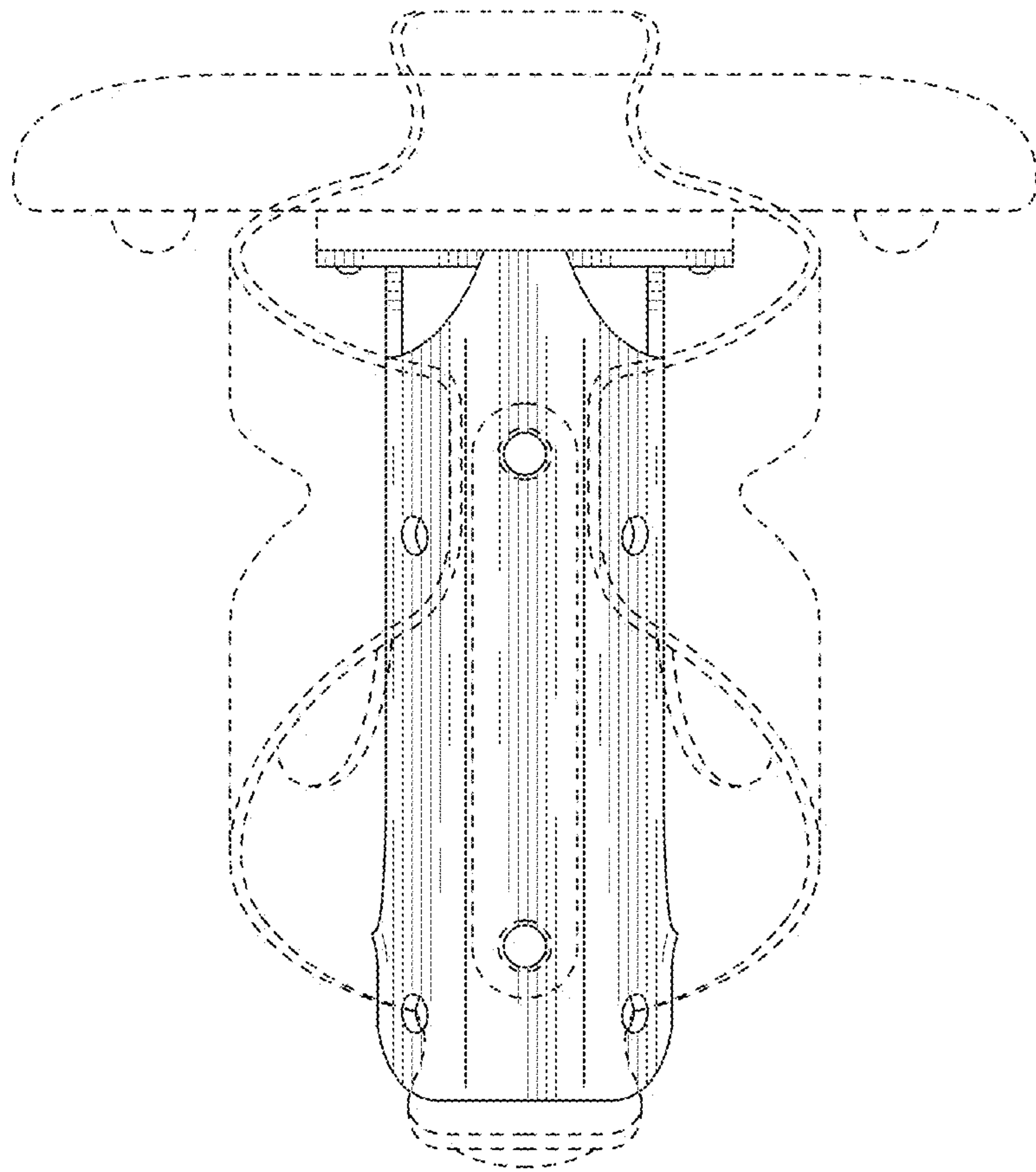

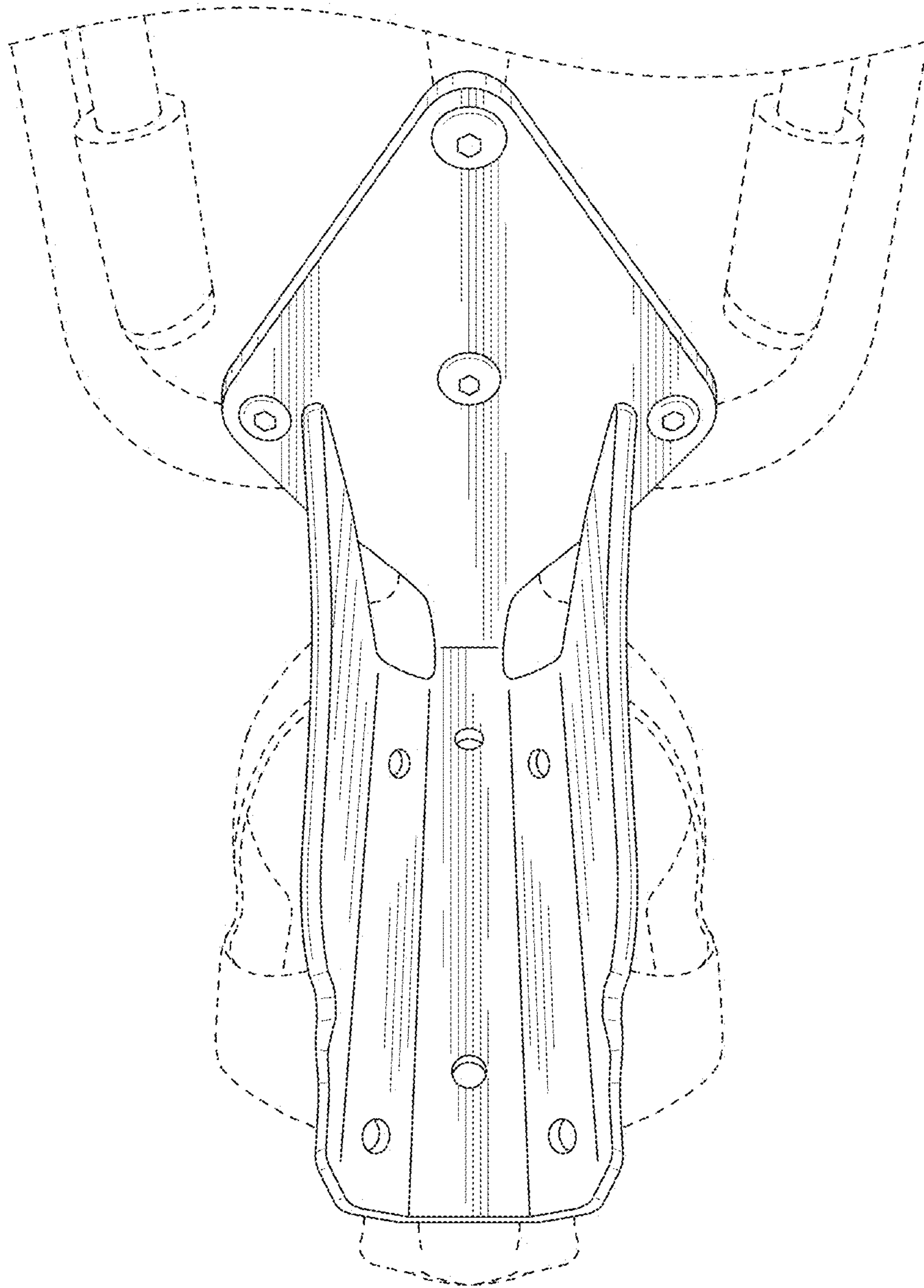

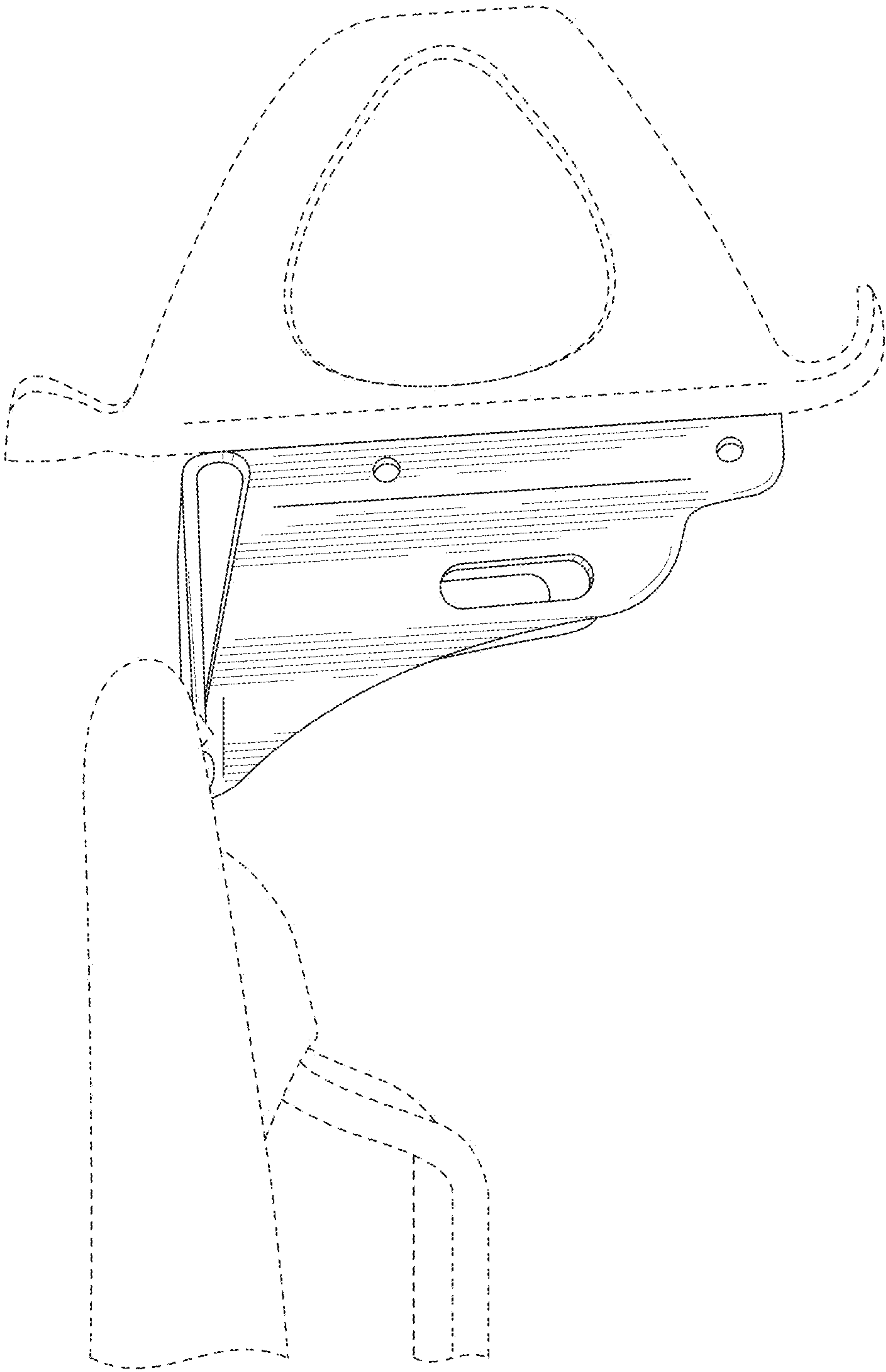

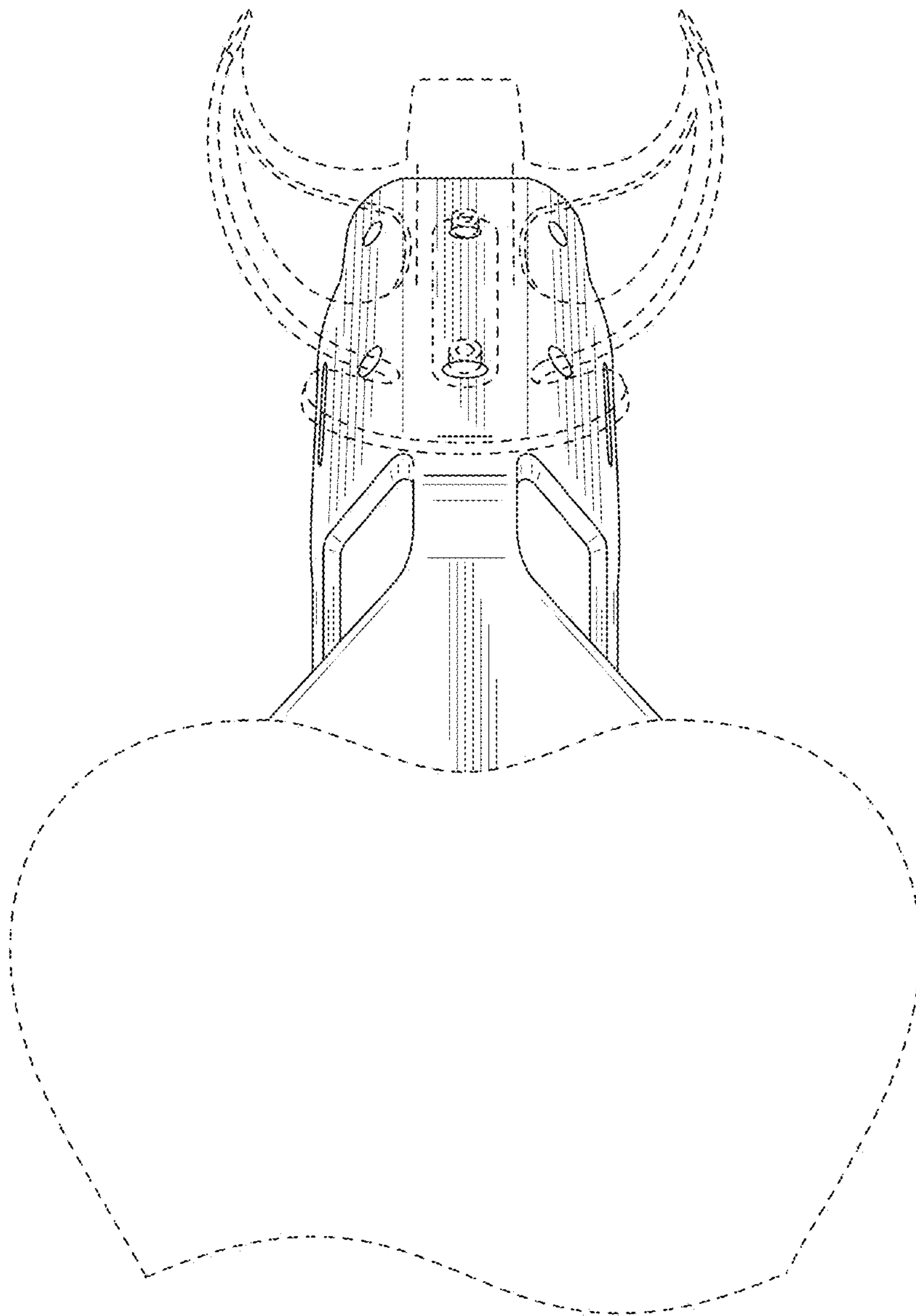

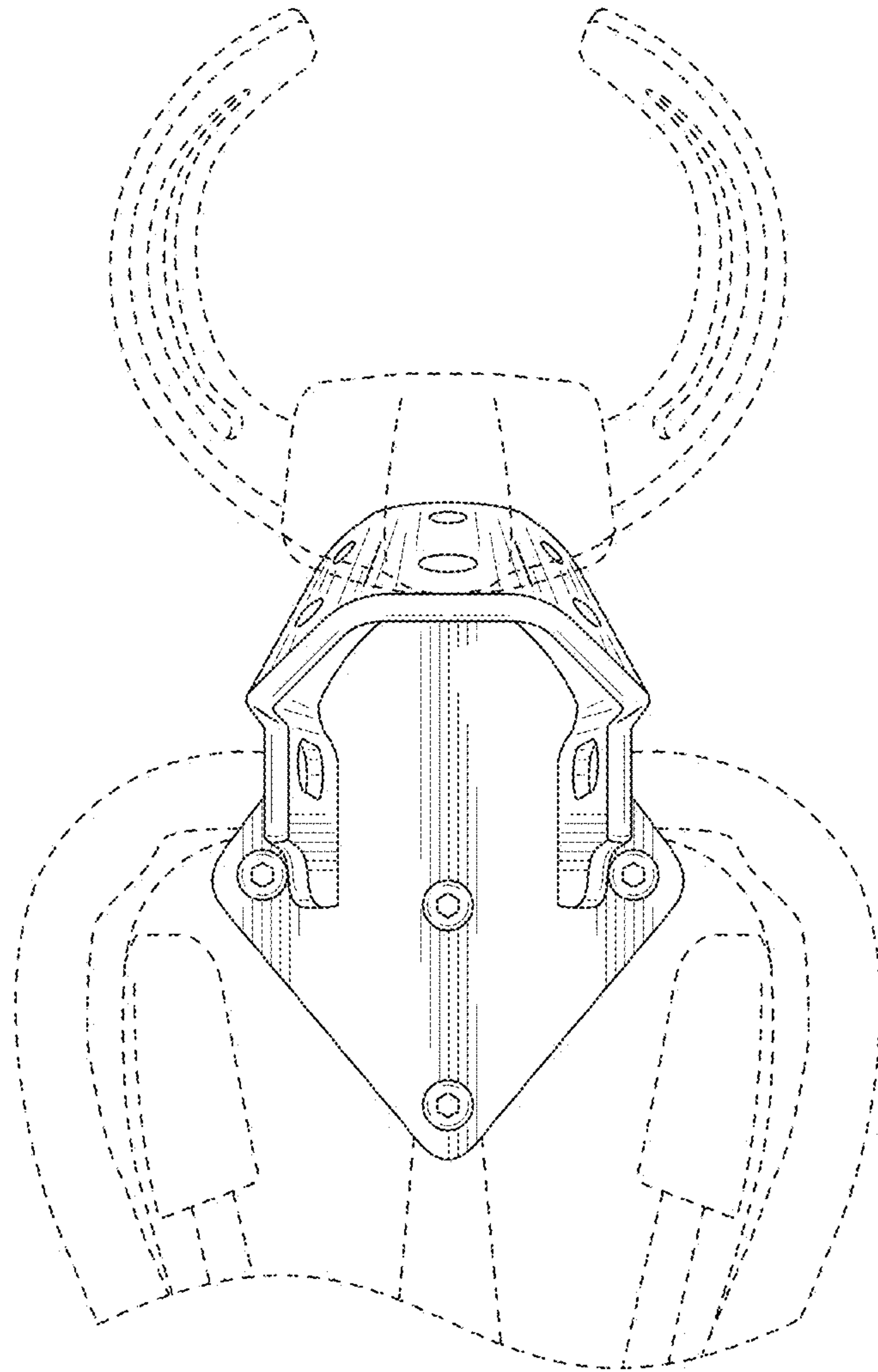

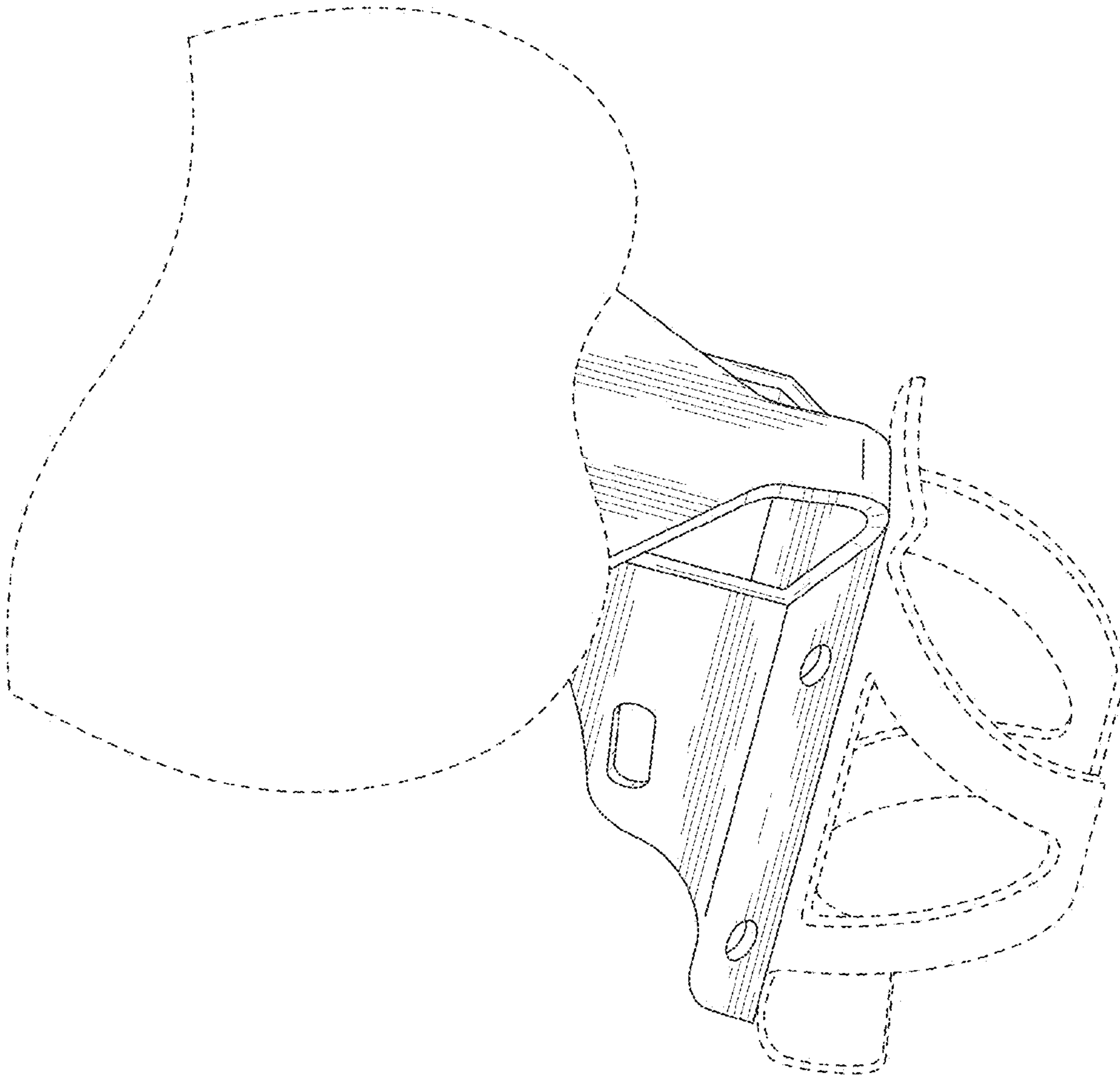

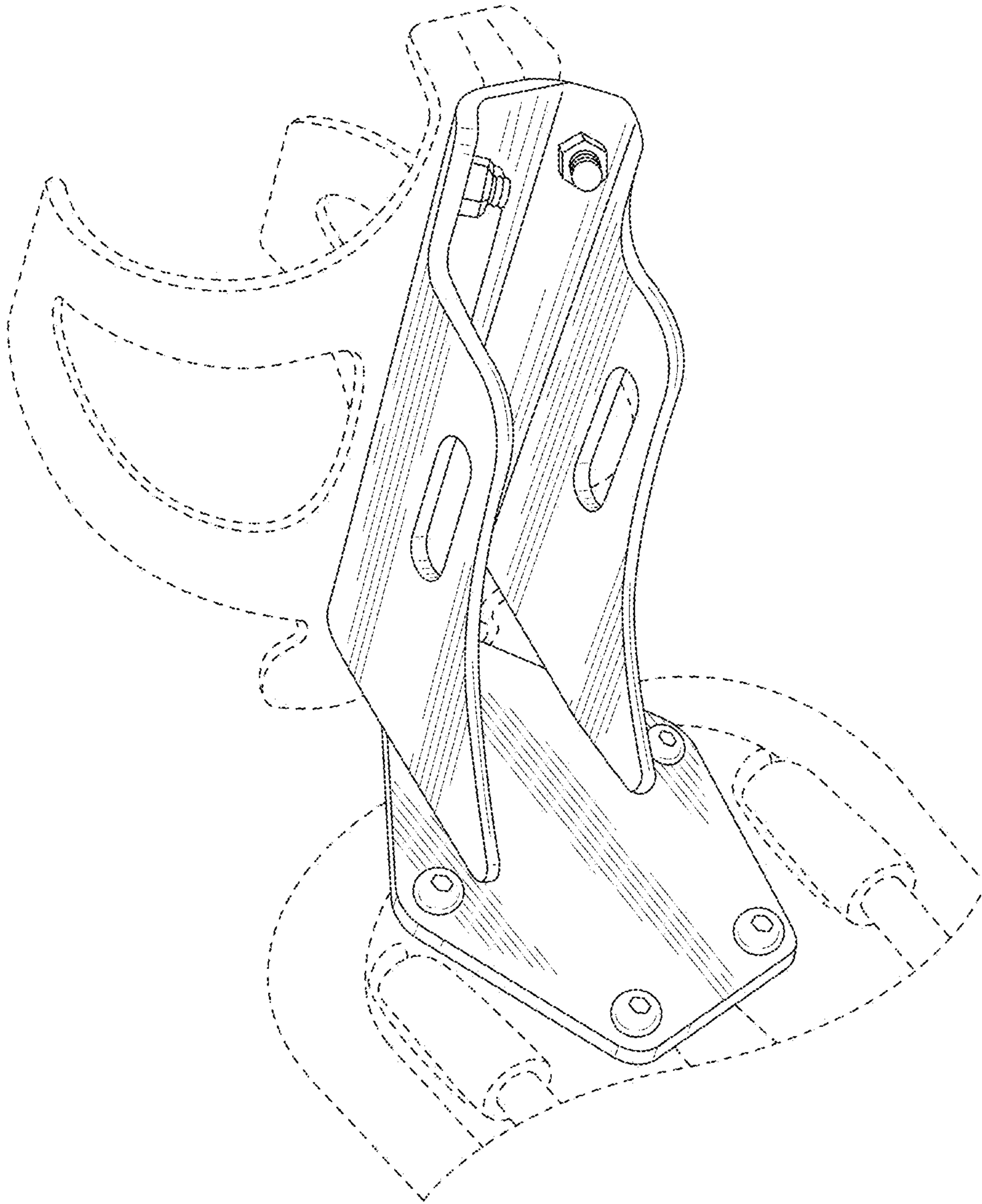

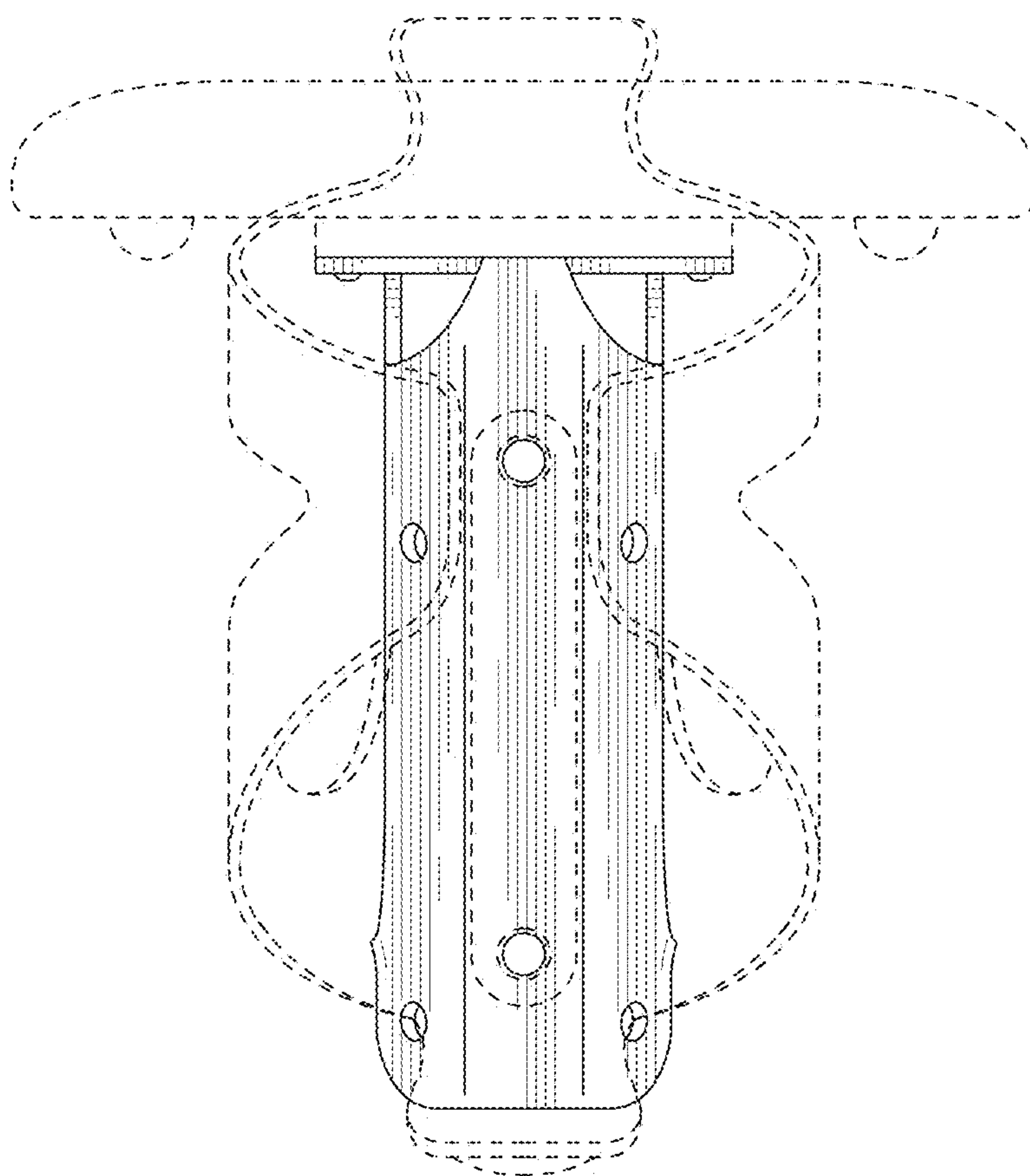

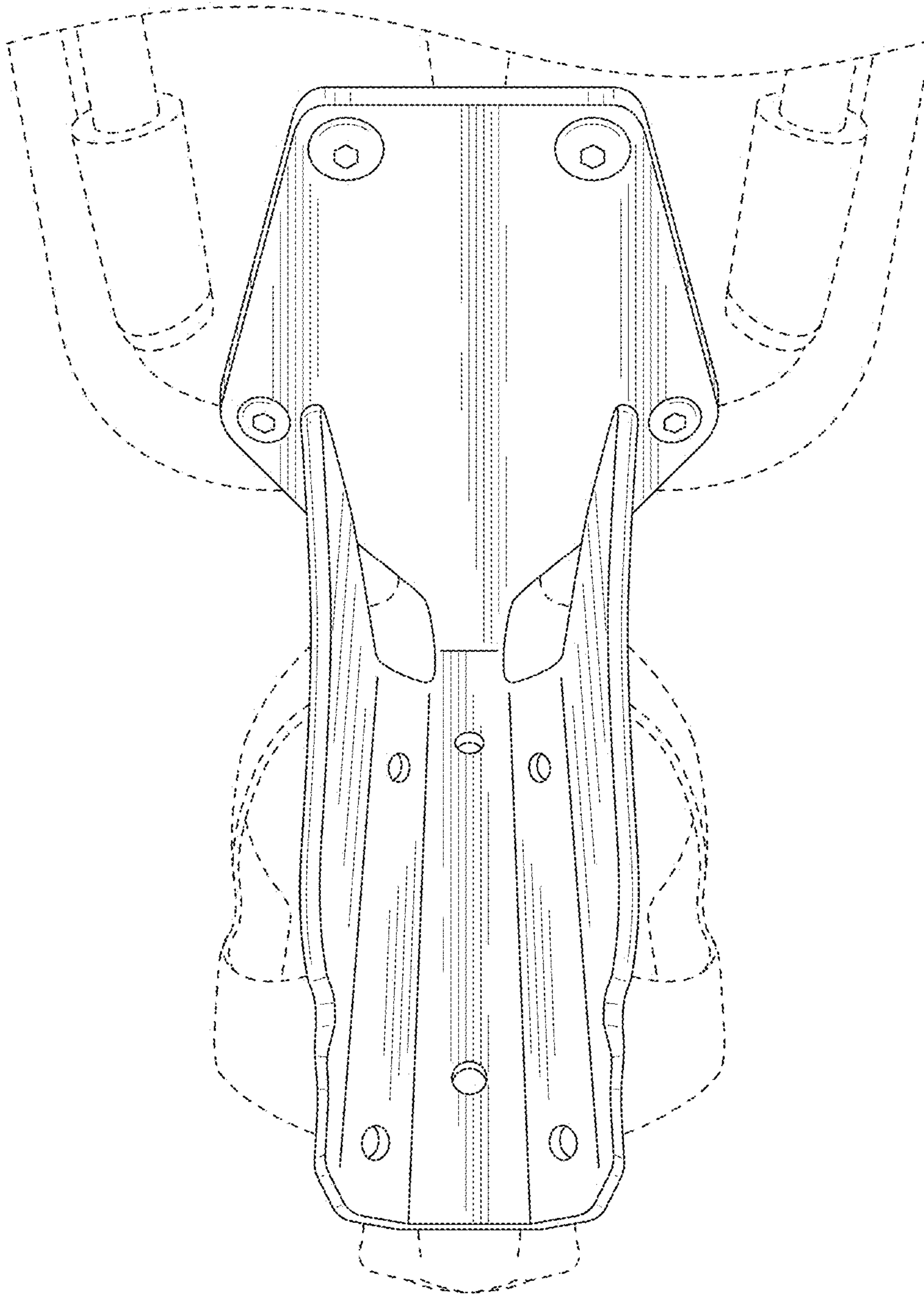

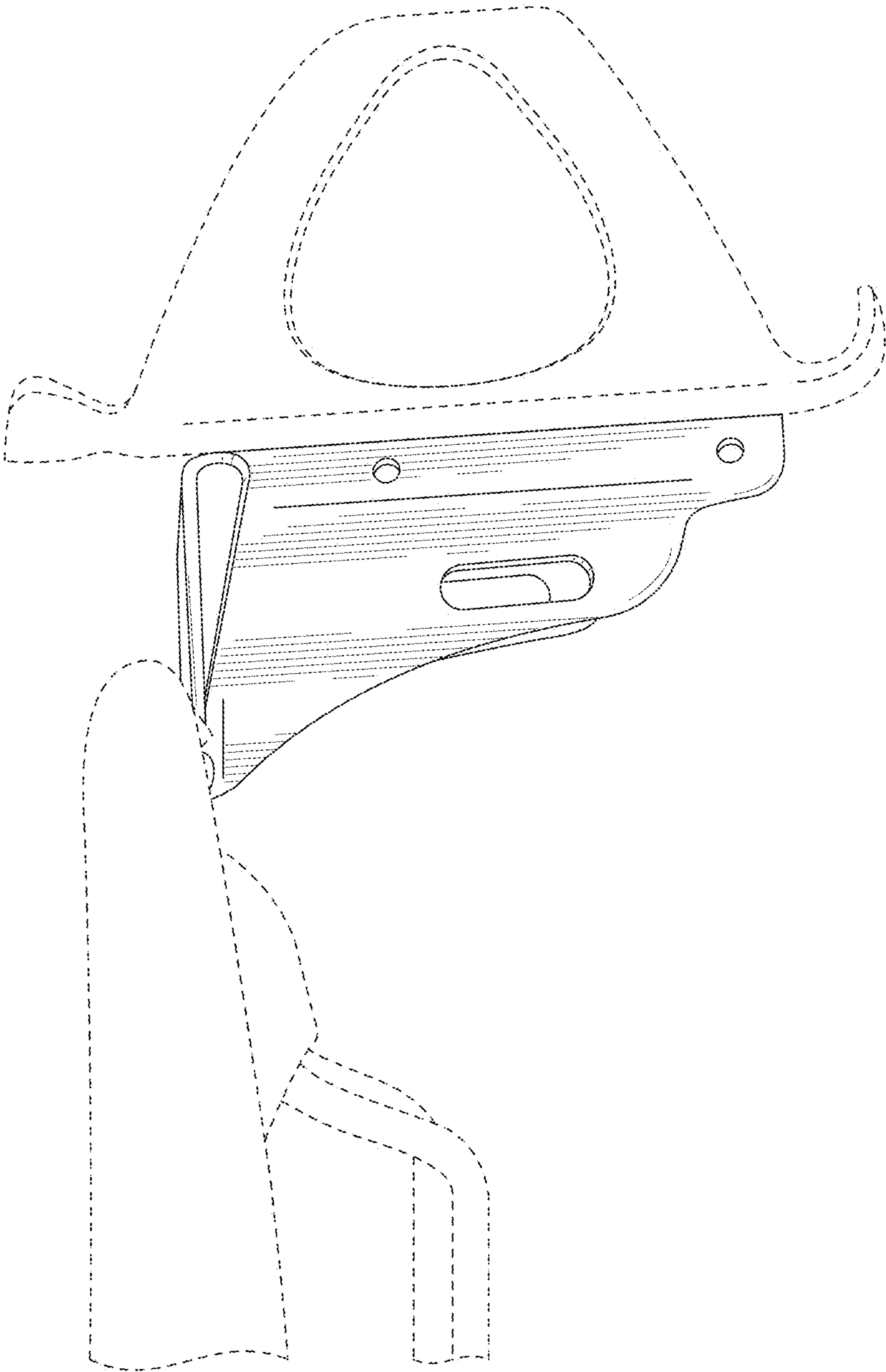

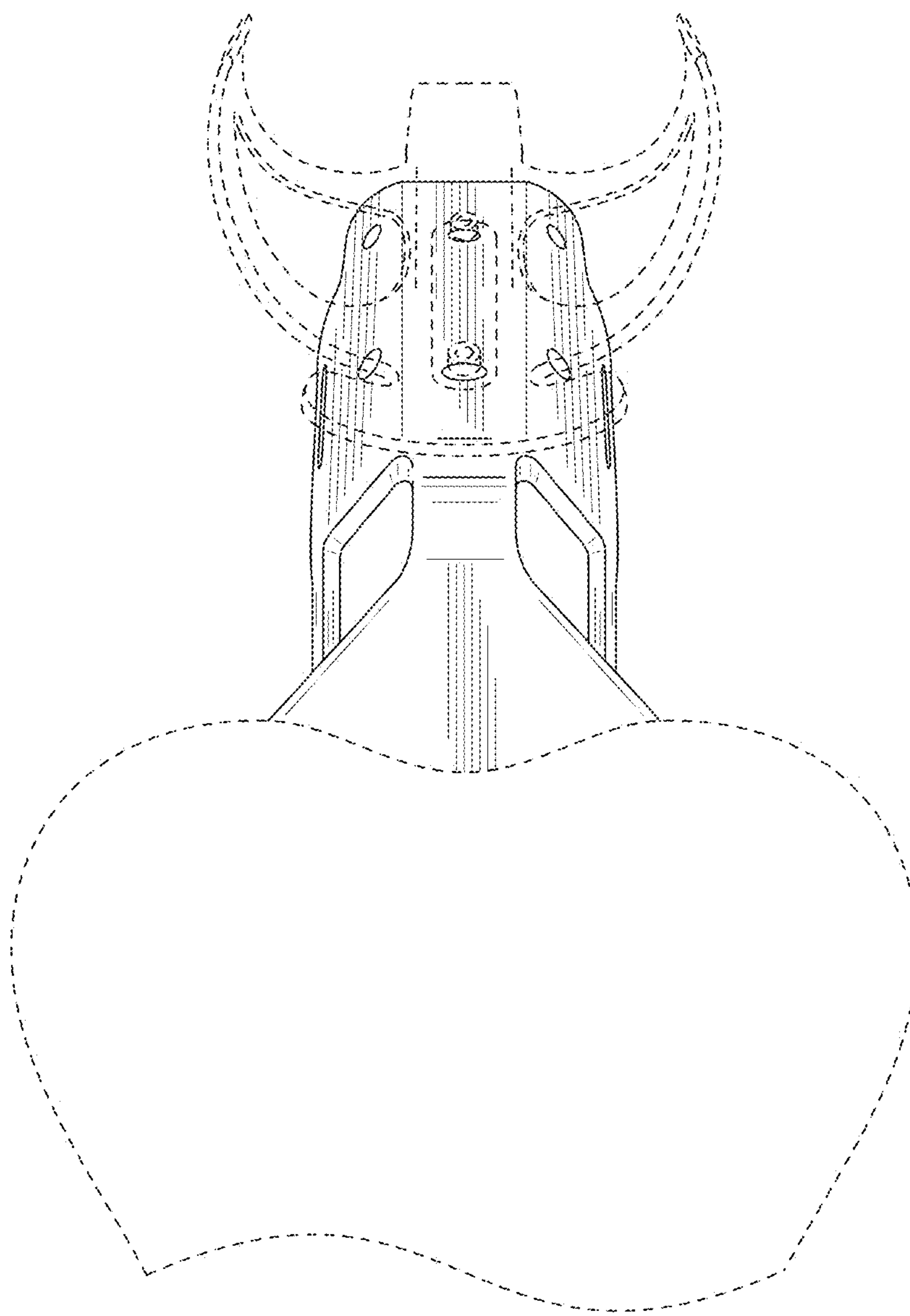

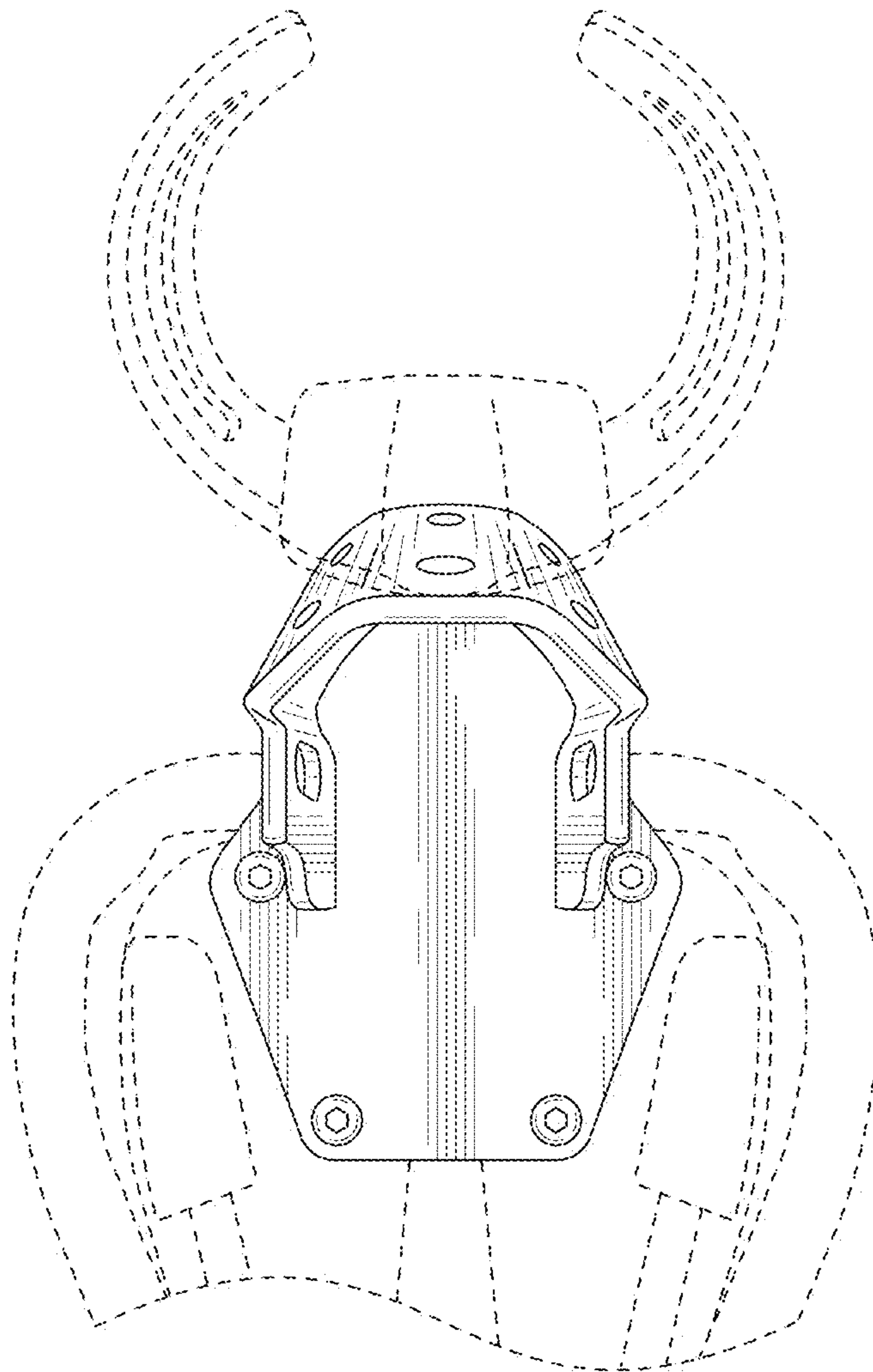
