right side view shown;

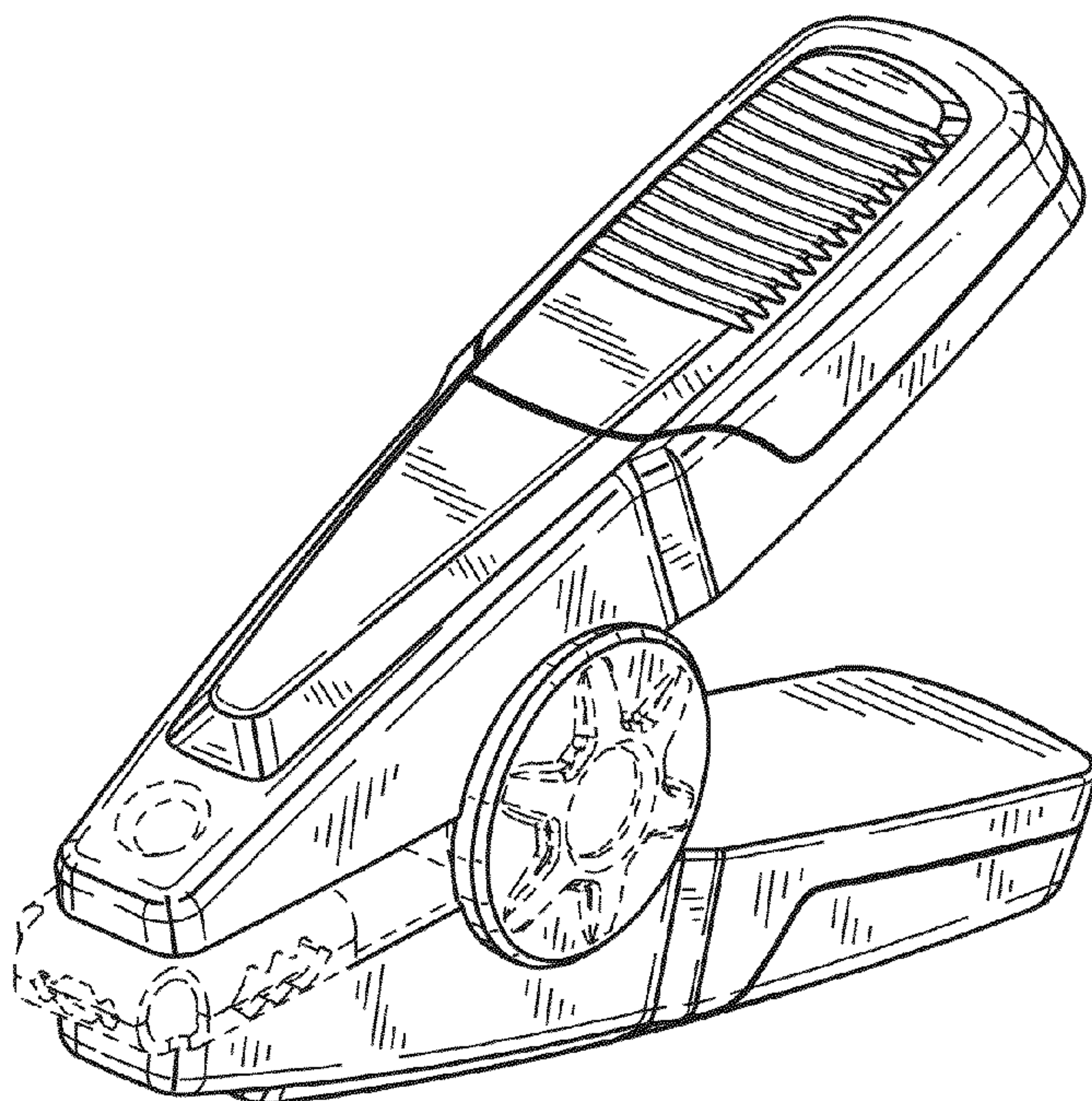
FIG. 3 is a top view of the battery charger terminal clamp of

shown;

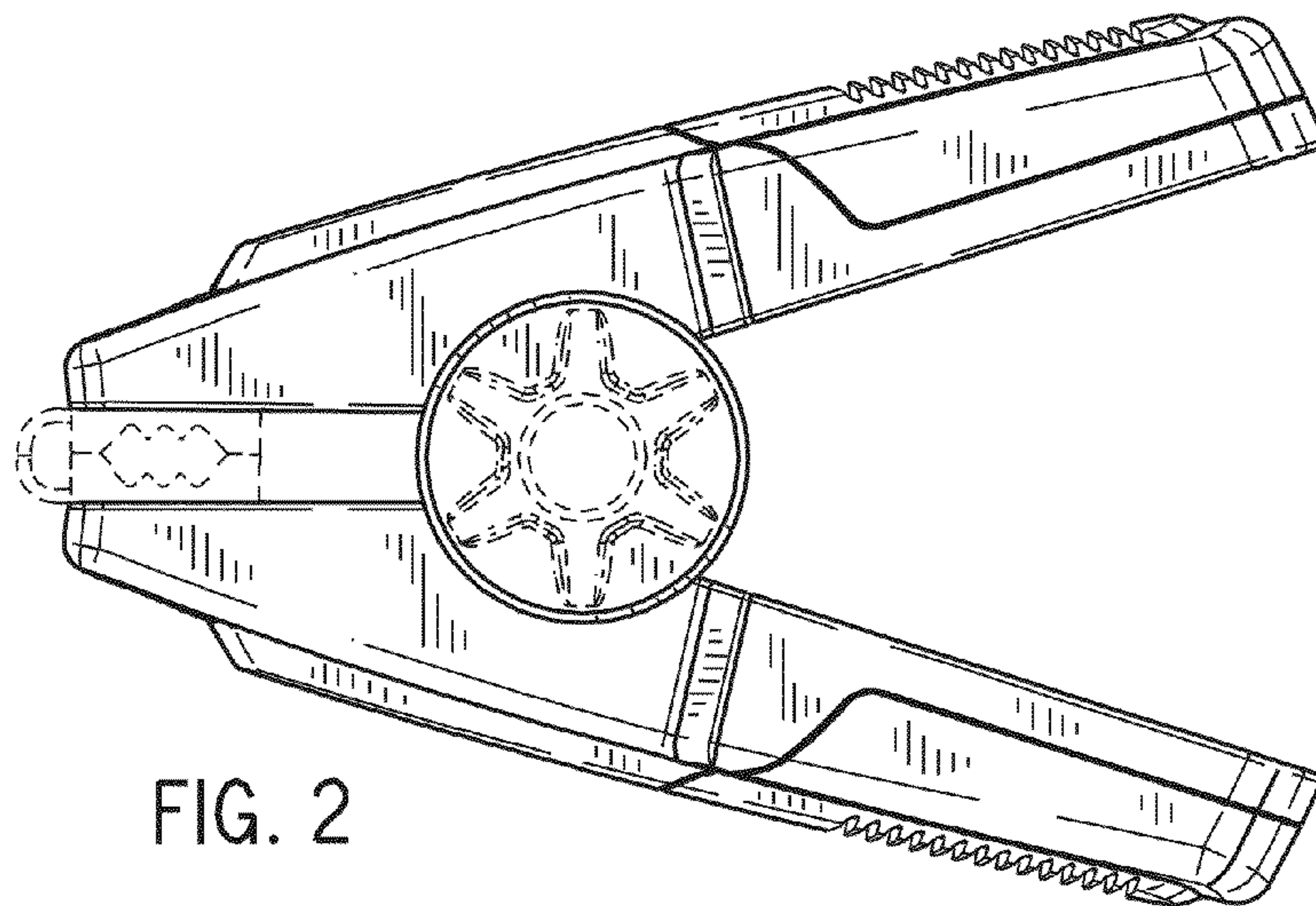
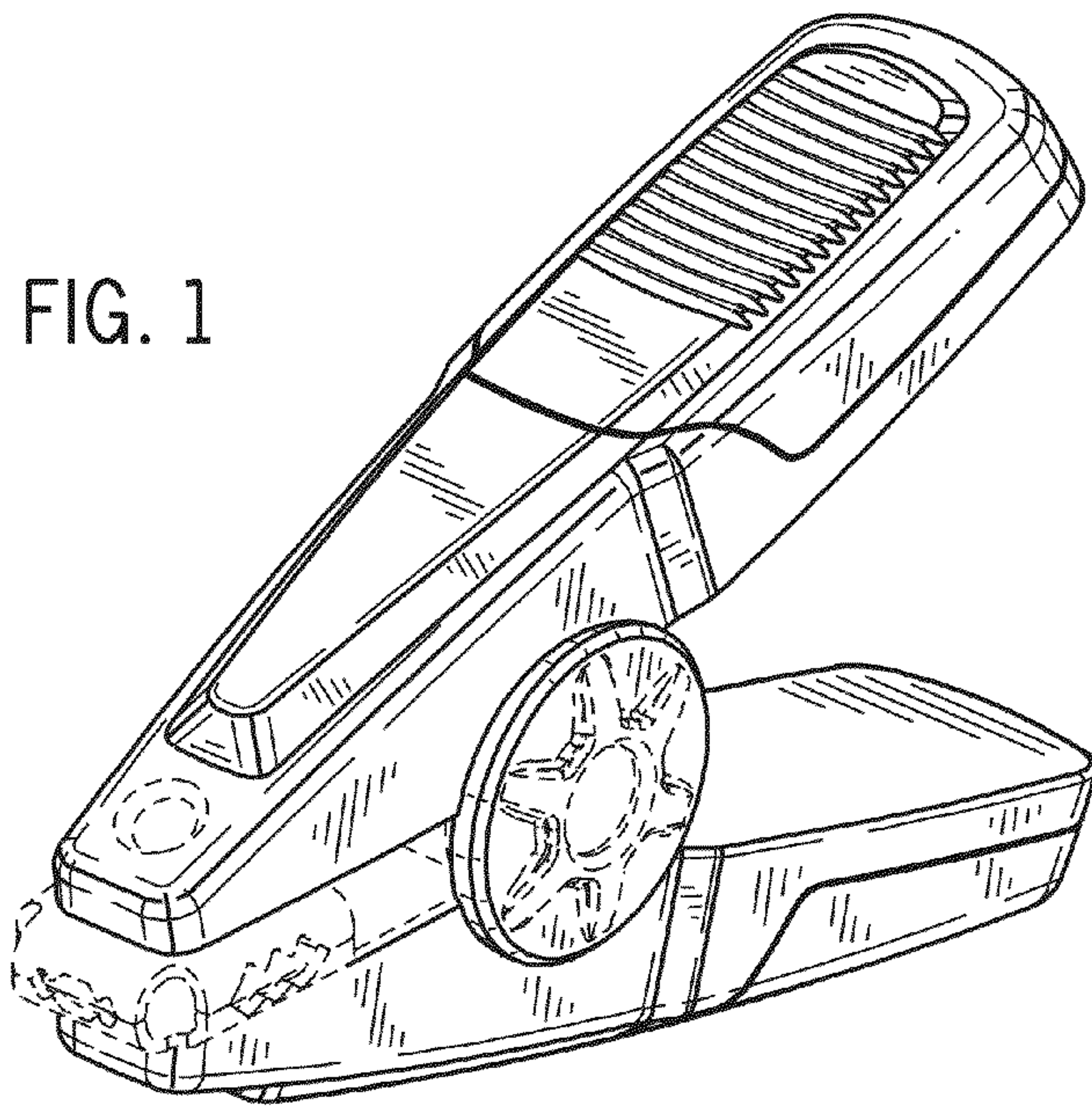
FIG. 4 is a front view of the battery charger terminal clamp of

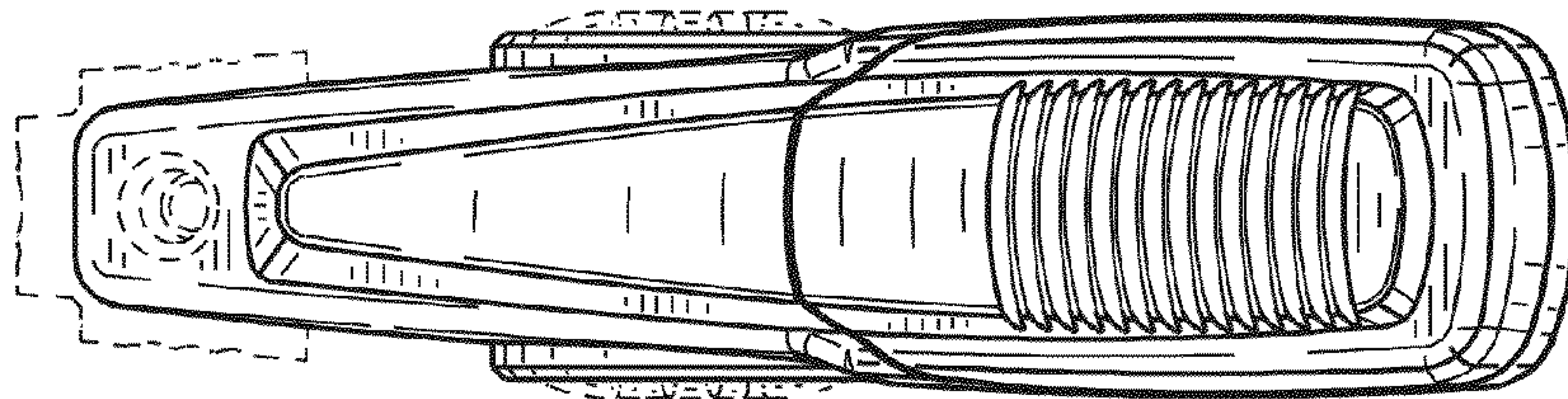

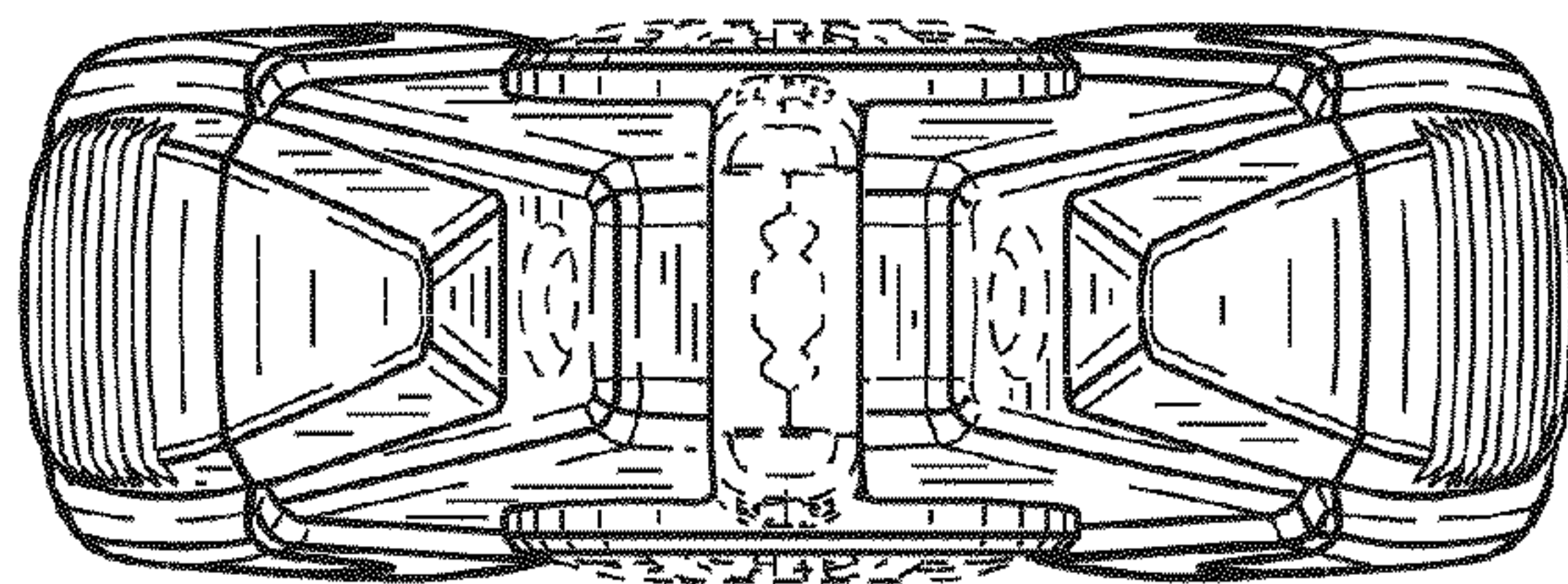

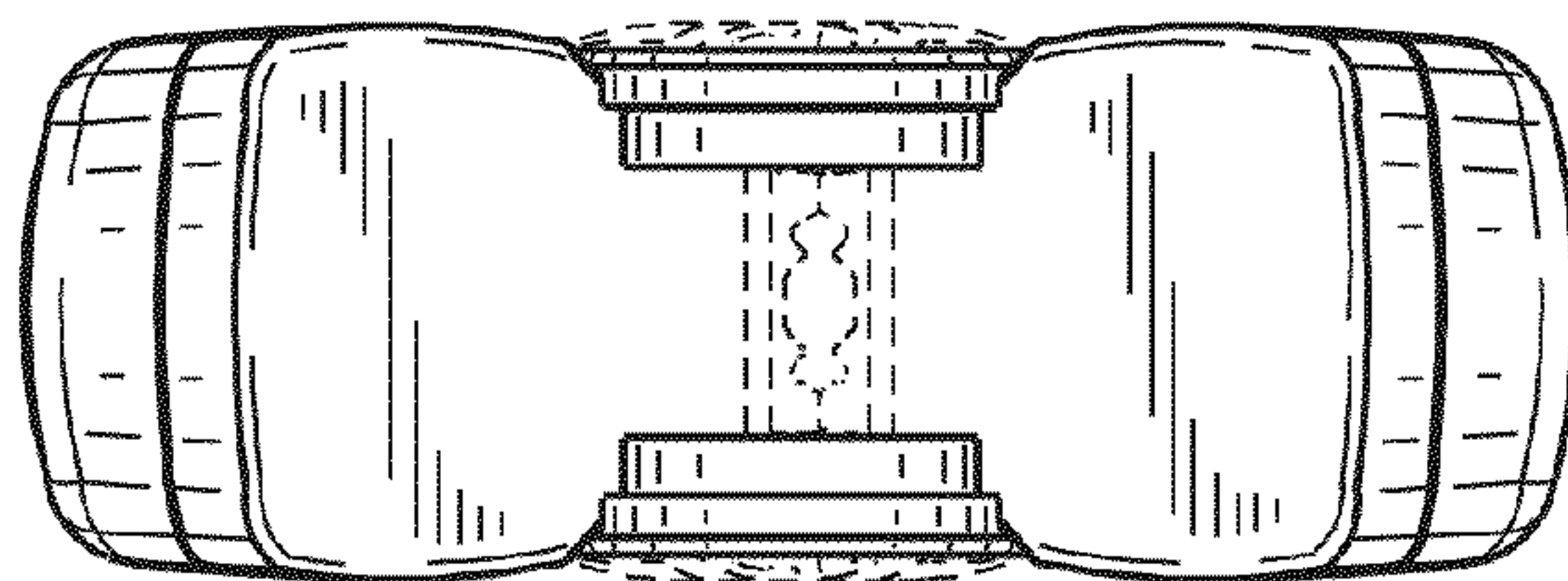
