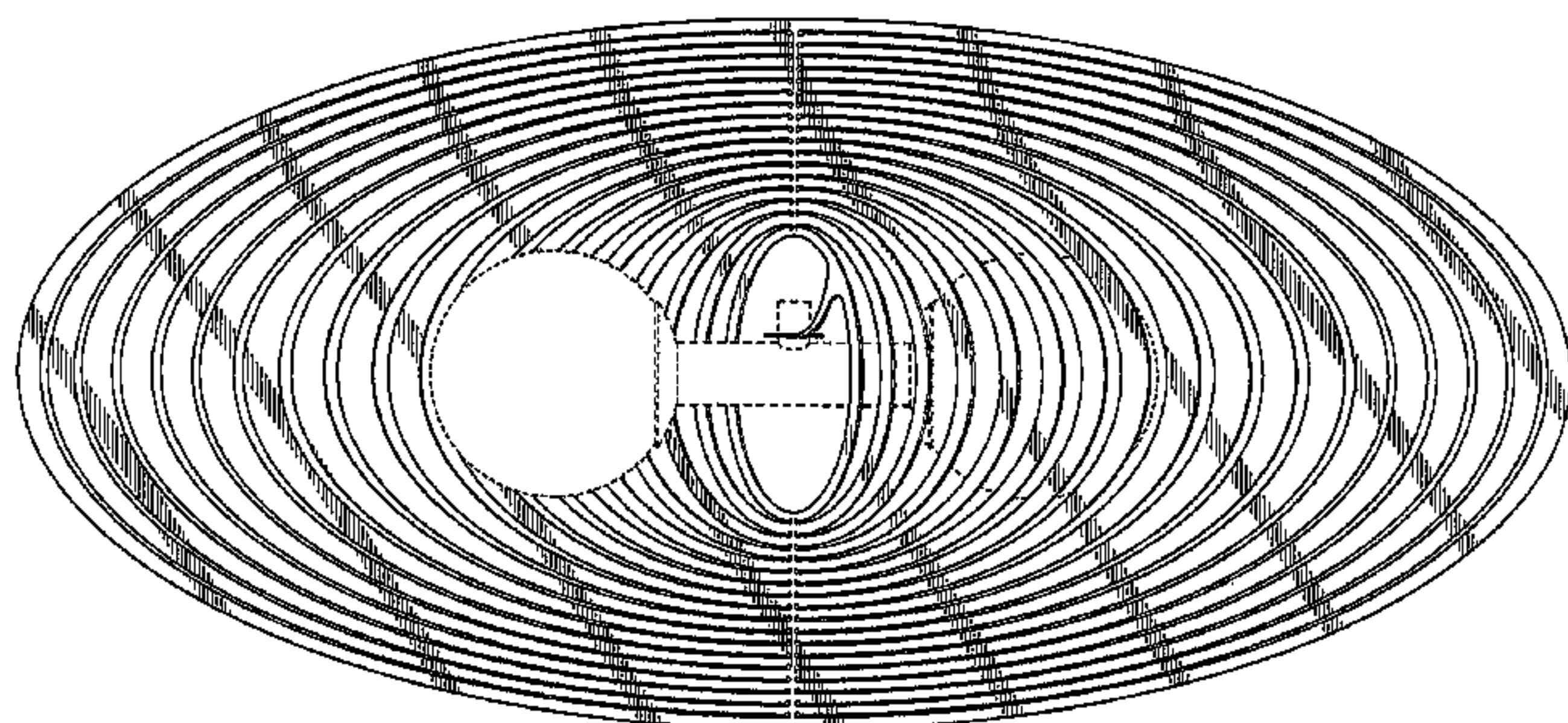
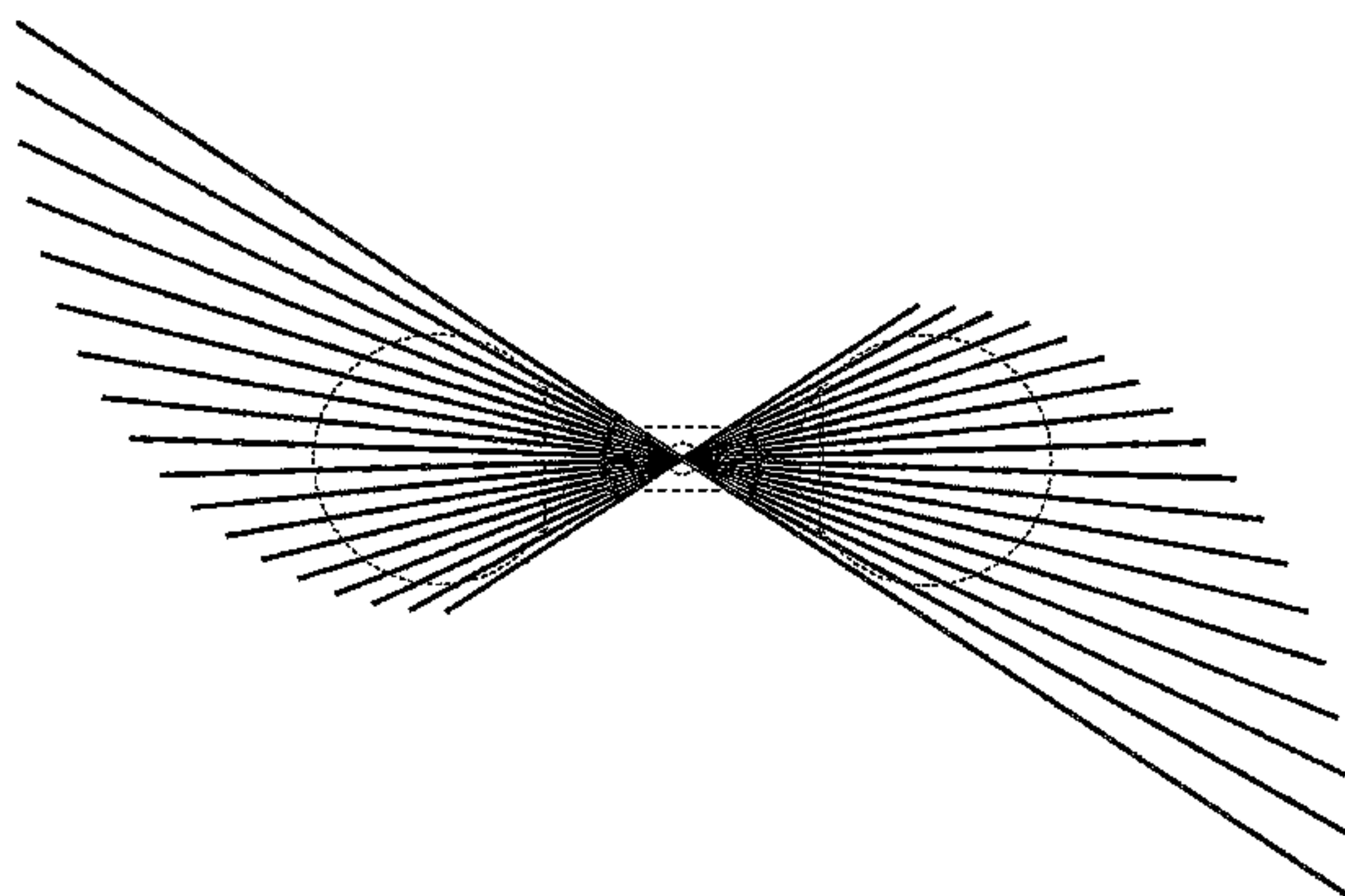
FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a light fixture in accordance with my design;

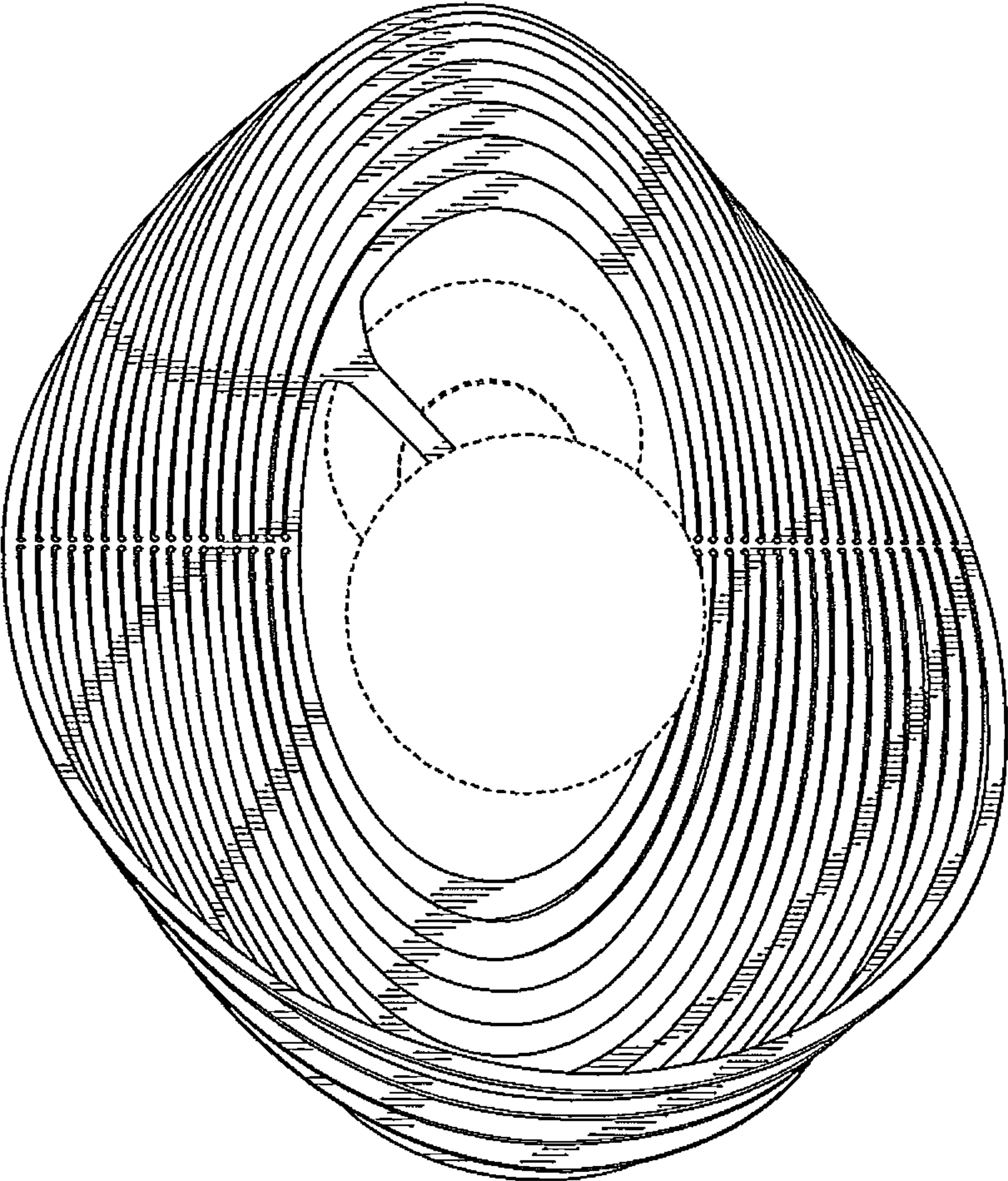
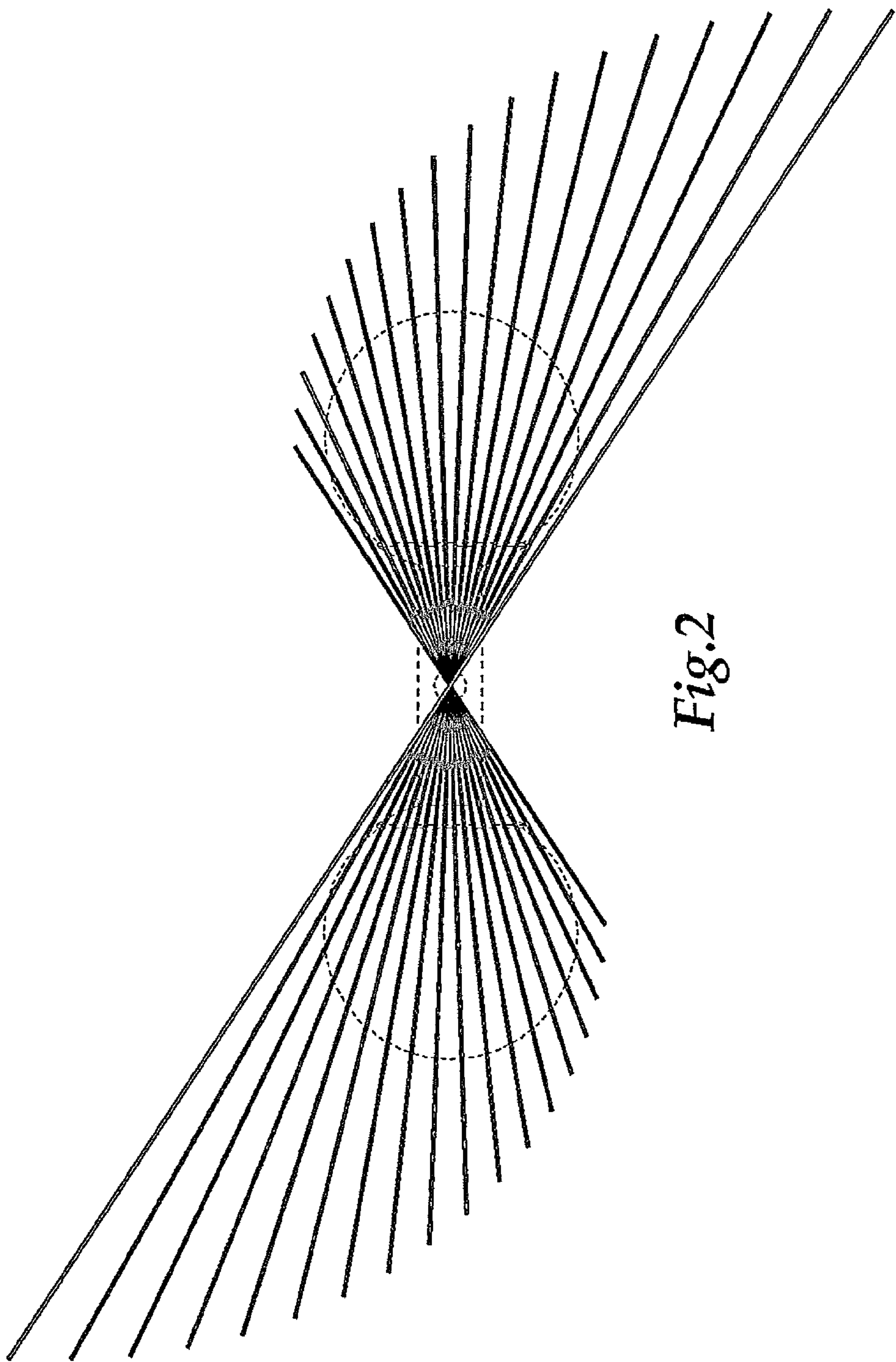

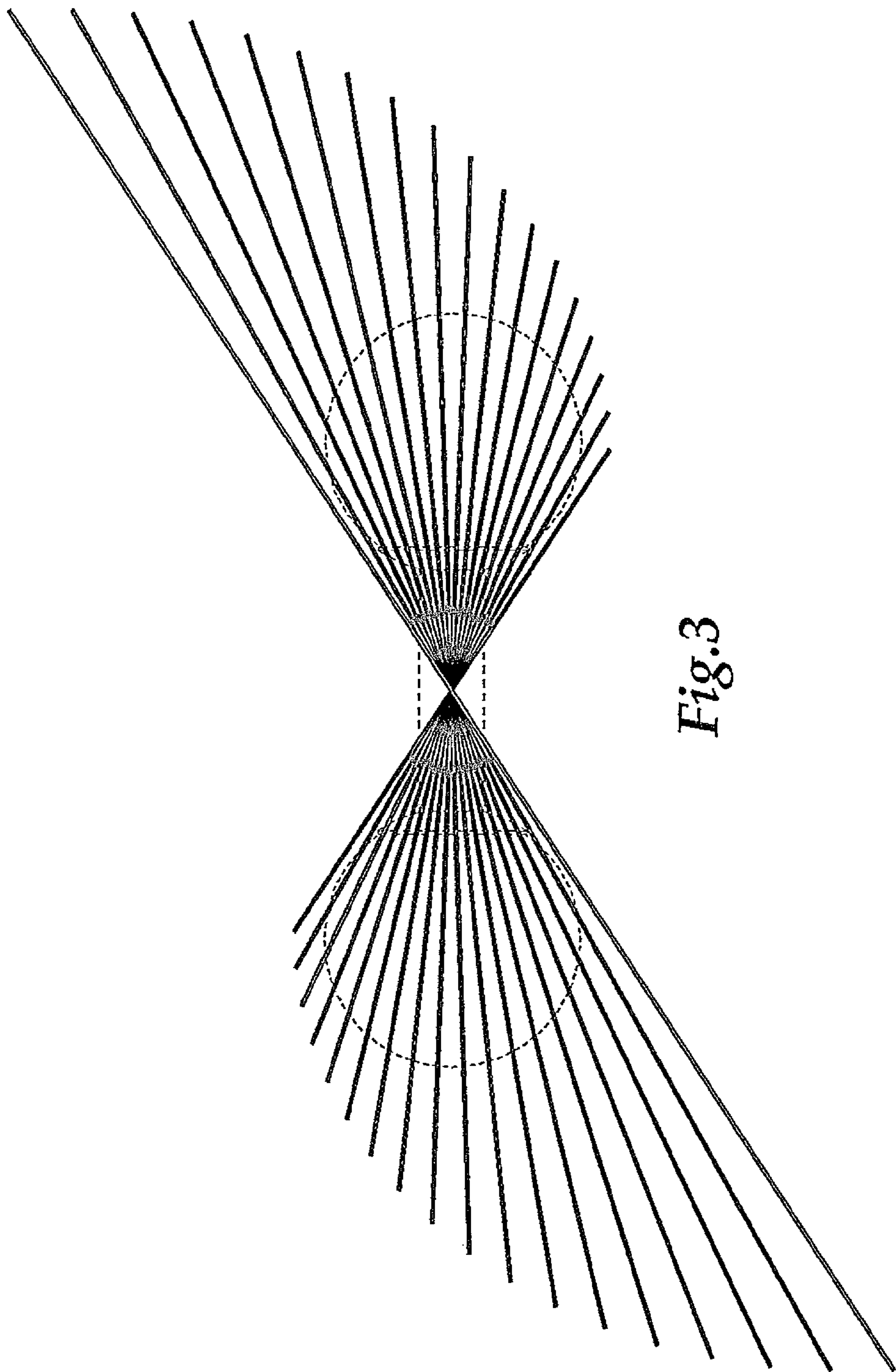

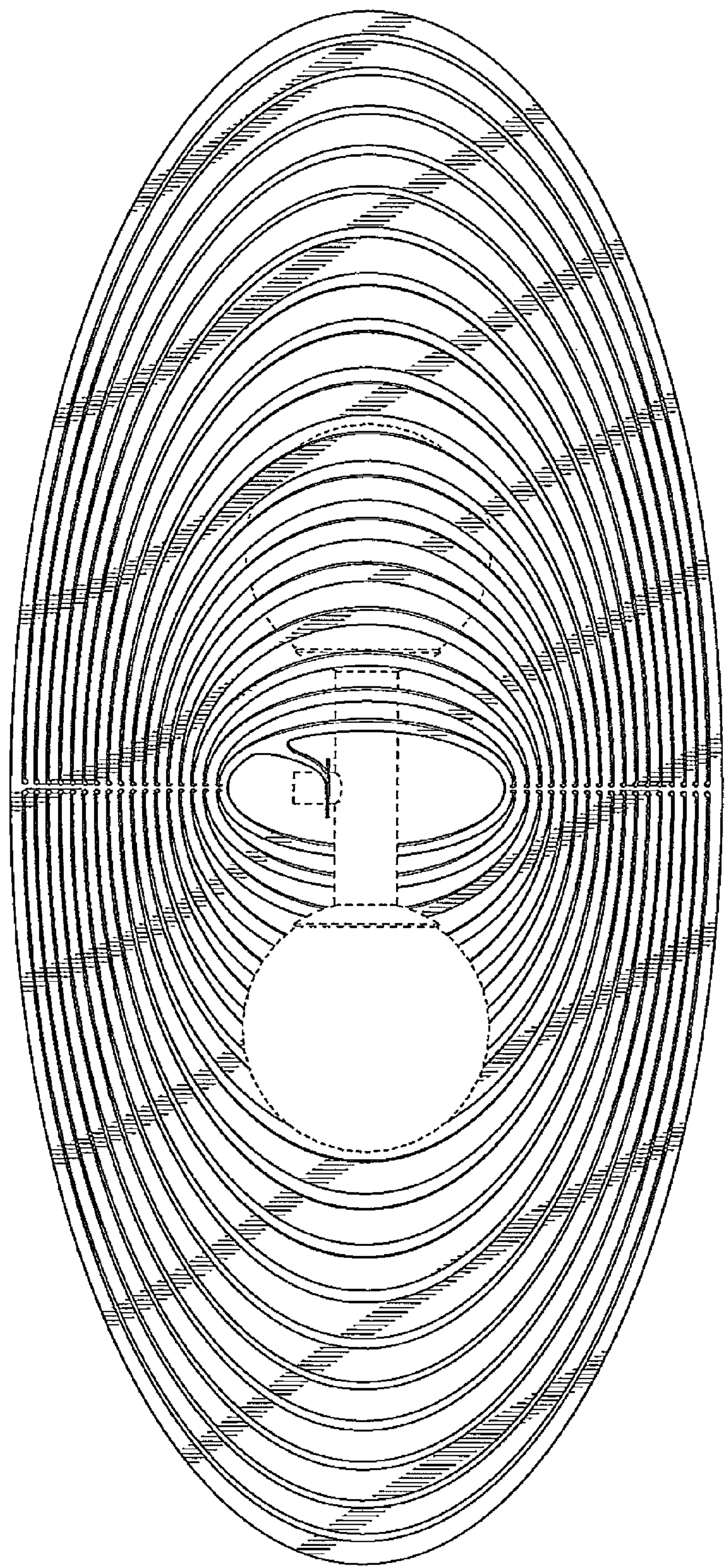

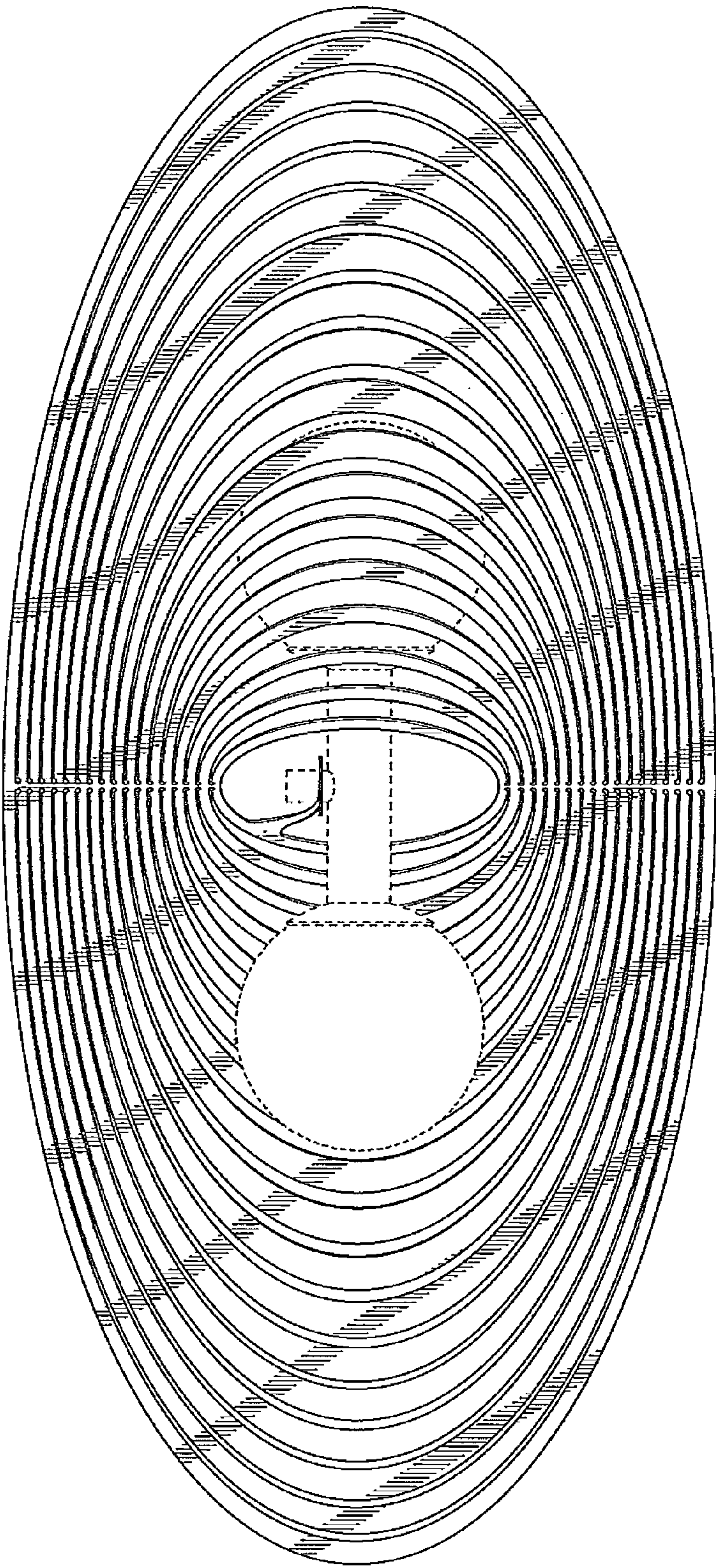
