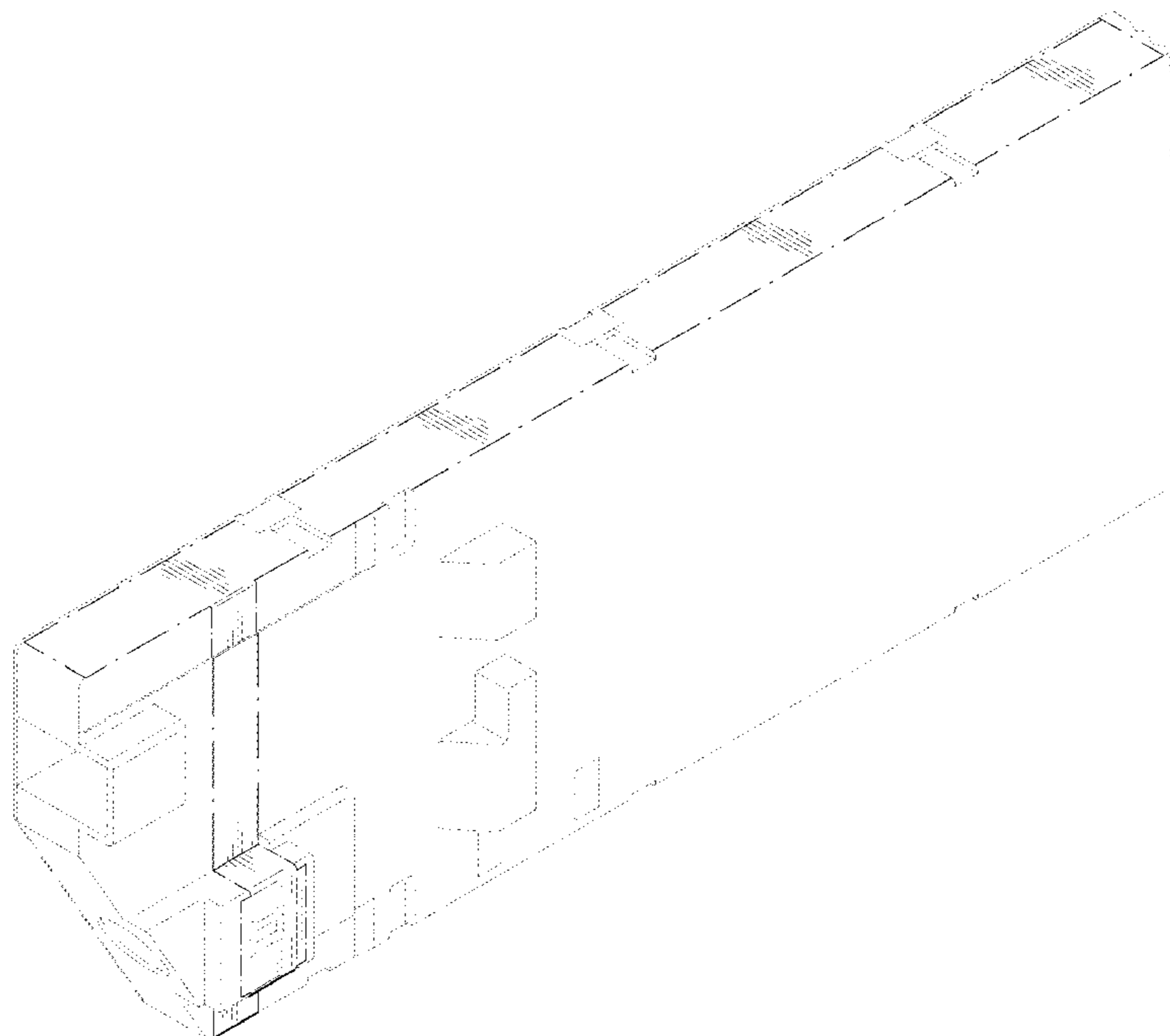
(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a cartridge for textile printer, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a cartridge for textile printer; FIG. 2 is a front view thereof; FIG. 3 is a top view thereof; FIG. 4 is a right-side view thereof; FIG. 5 is a left-side view thereof; FIG. 6 is a rear view thereof; FIG. 7 is a bottom view thereof; and, FIG. 8 is a partial enlarged perspective view thereof defined by the broken line box 8 in FIG. 1. The broken lines depict unclaimed subject matter only and form no part of the claimed design. The dot-chain lines depict a boundary between claimed and unclaimed surfaces and form no part of the claimed design. The broken line box 8 in FIG. 1 depicts environmental subject matter only and forms no part of the claimed design.

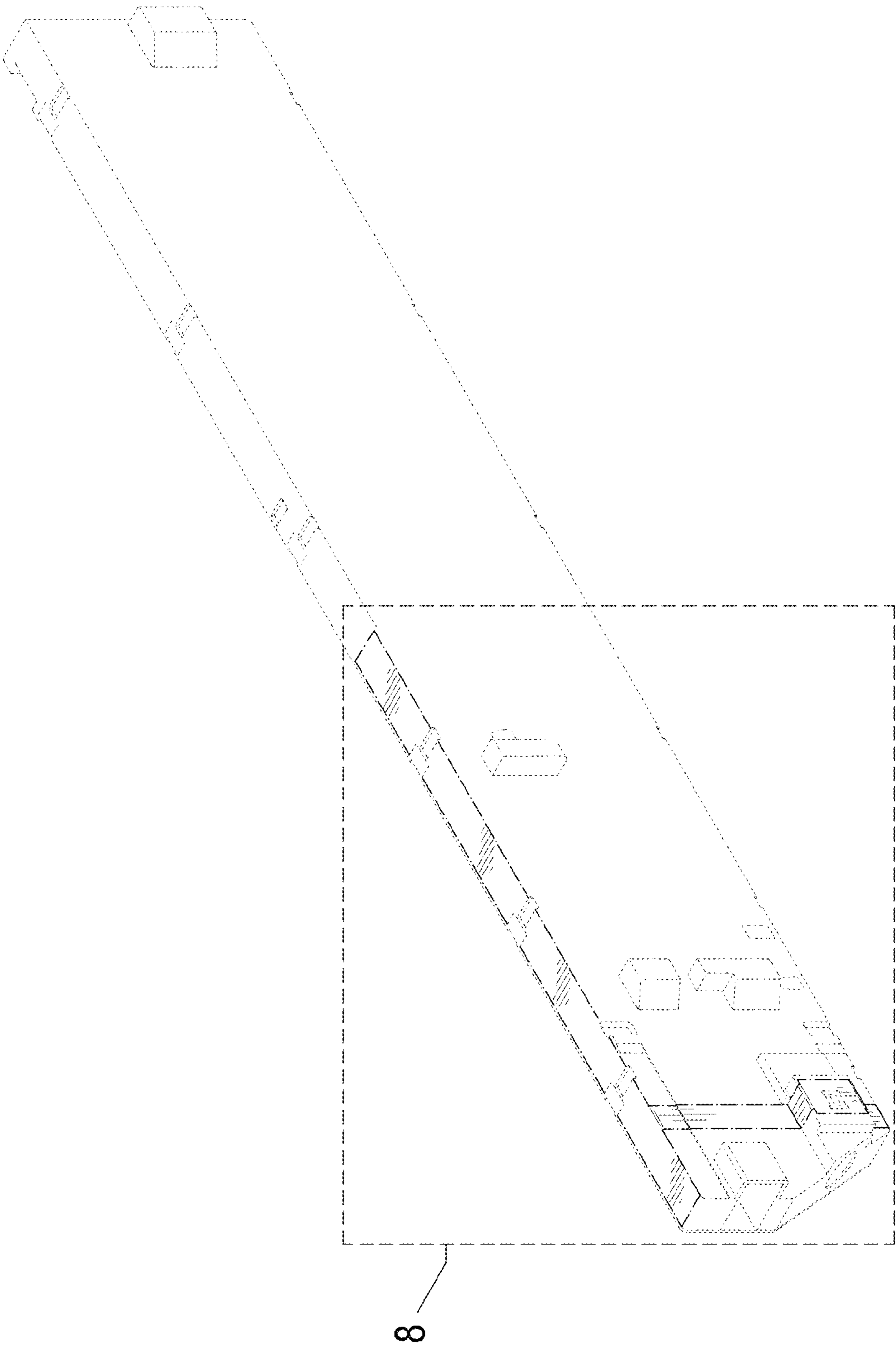

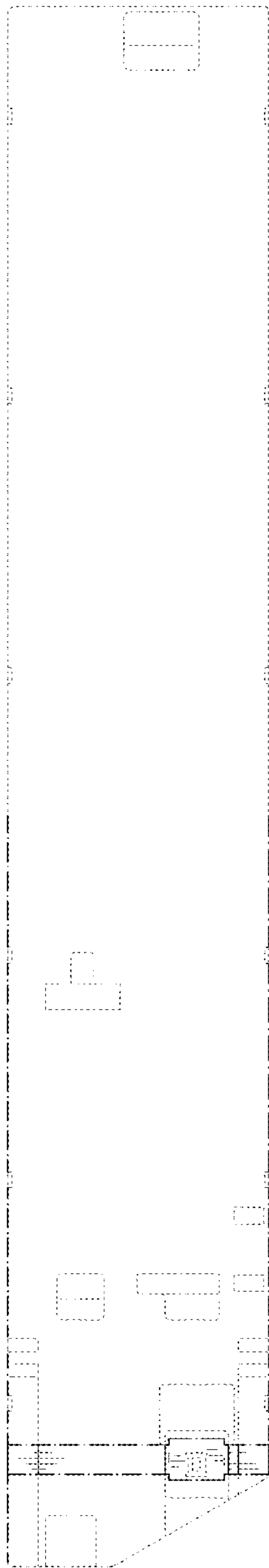

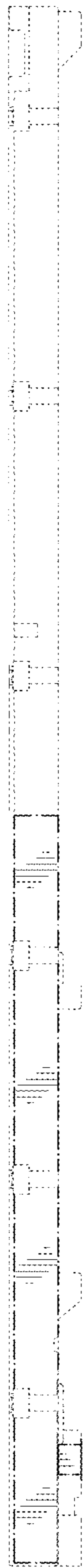

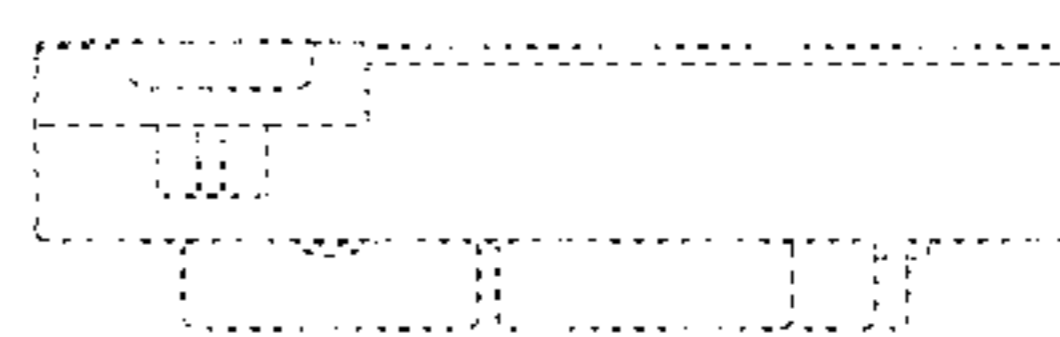

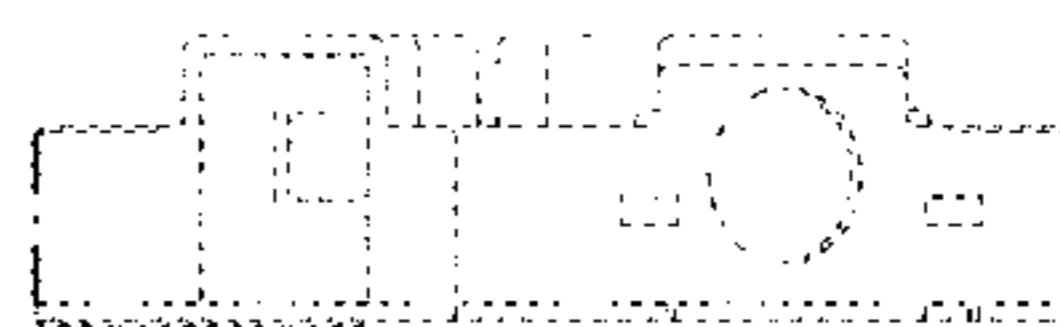

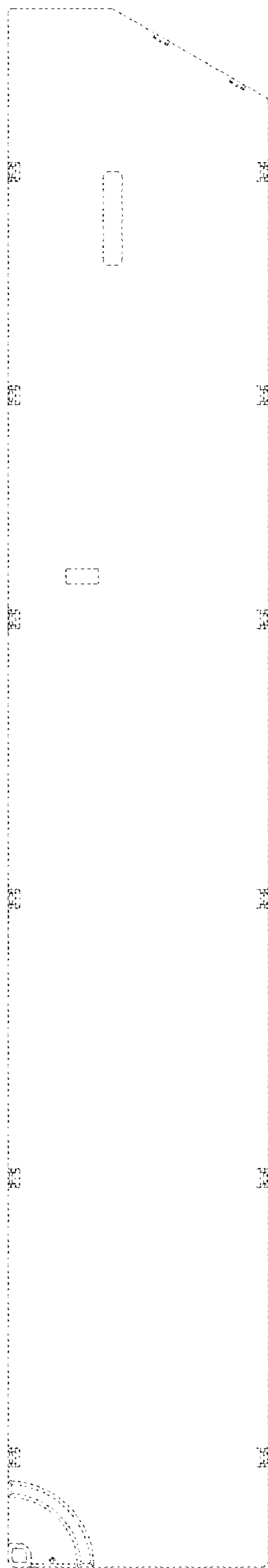

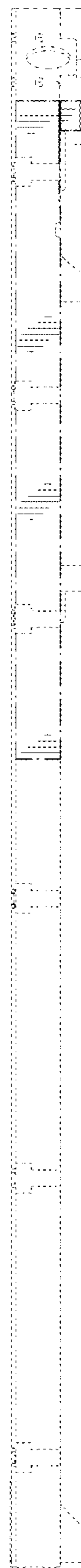

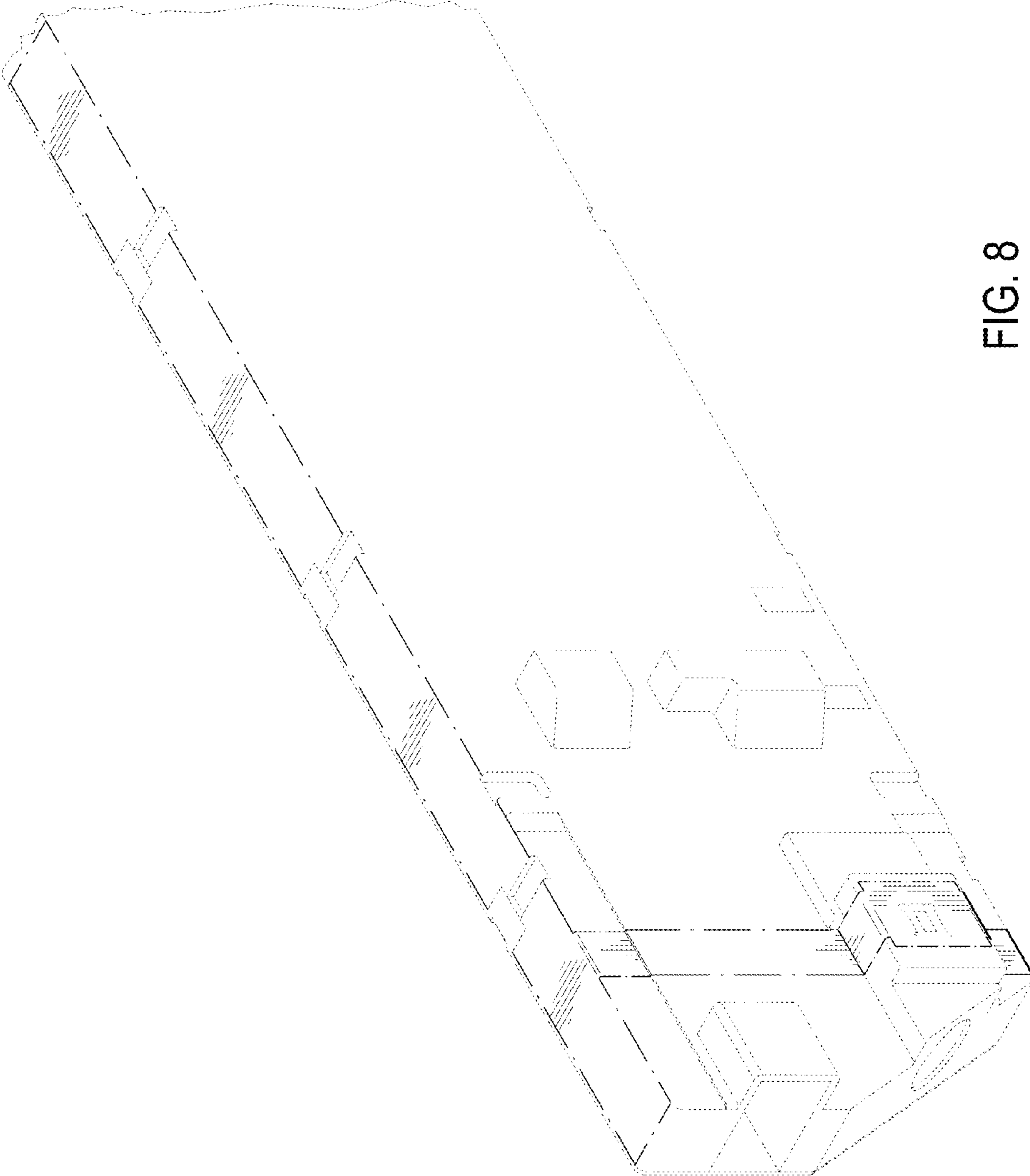
