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(57) **CLAIM**

I claim the ornamental design for a combined wrist wallet and phone holder, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top perspective view of a combined wrist wallet and phone holder, showing a first elastic embodiment of my new design;

FIG. 2 is a bottom perspective view of FIG. 1;

FIG. 3 is a top plan view of FIG. 1;

FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view of FIG. 1;

FIG. 5 is a right-side elevational view of FIG. 1;

FIG. 6 is a left-side elevational view of FIG. 1;

FIG. 7 is a rear elevational view of FIG. 1;

FIG. 8 is a front elevational view of FIG. 1;

FIG. 9 is a top perspective view of a second hook-and-loop fastener embodiment thereof;

FIG. 10 is a bottom perspective view of FIG. 9;

FIG. 11 is a right-side elevational view of FIG. 9;

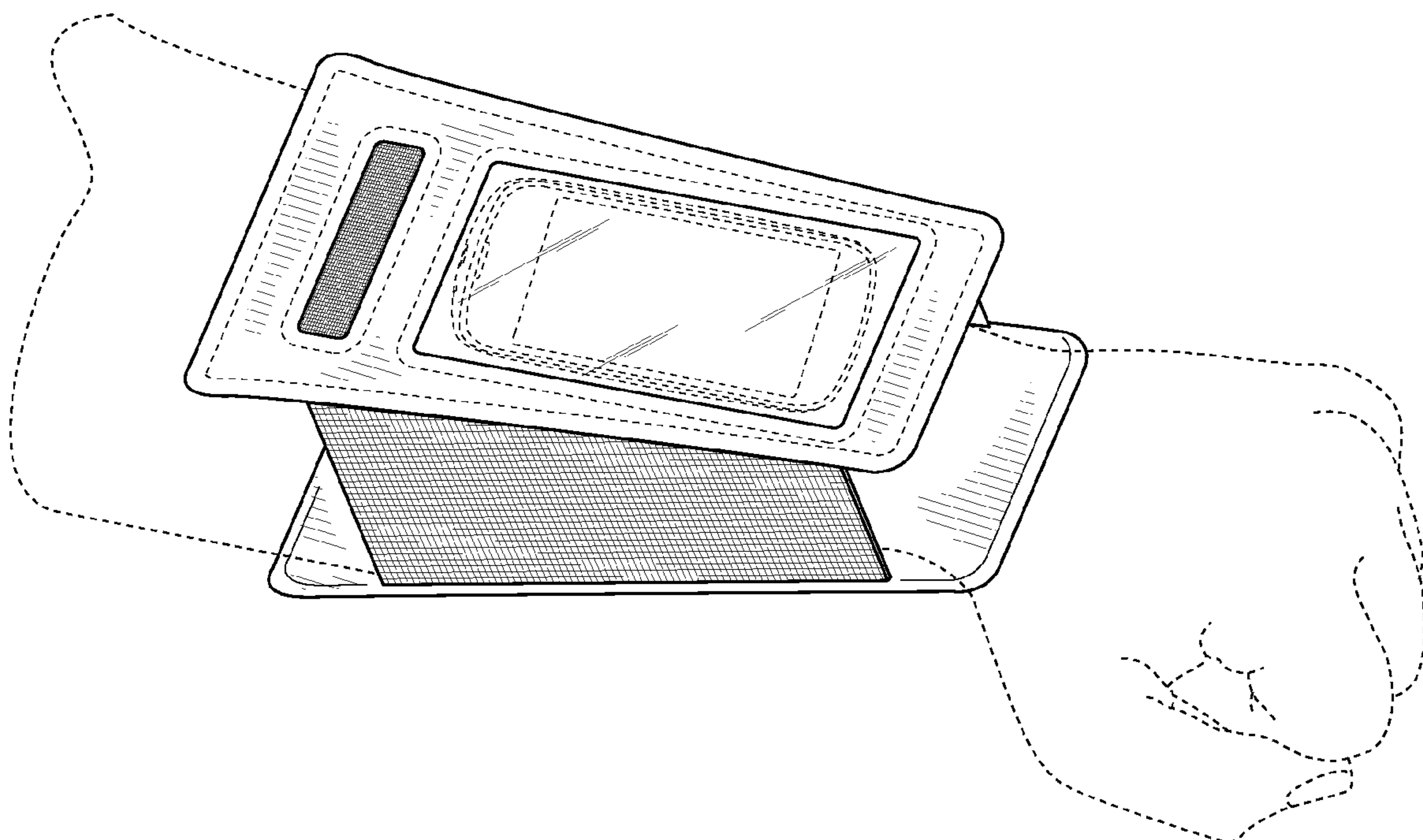
FIG. 12 is a left-side elevational view of FIG. 9;

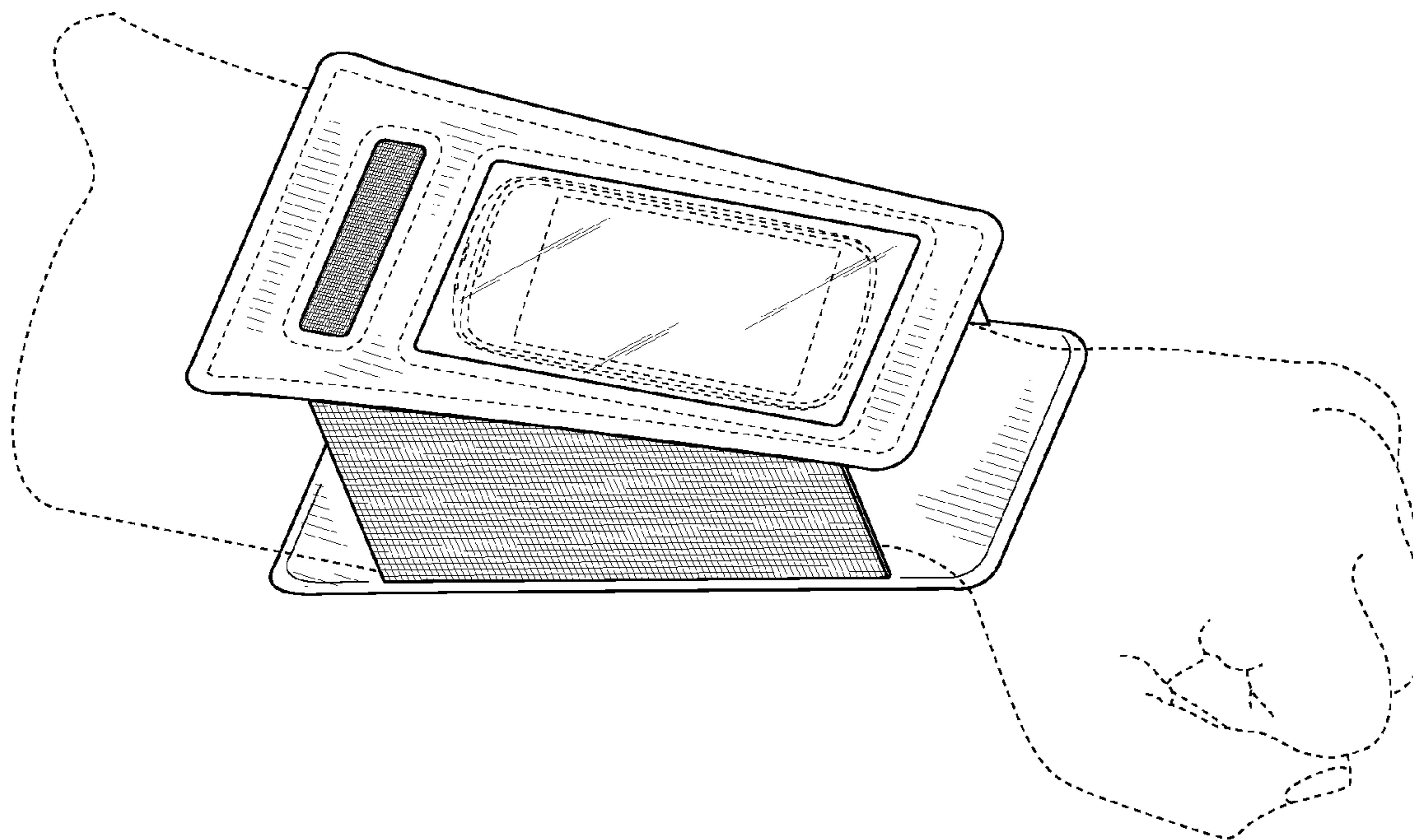

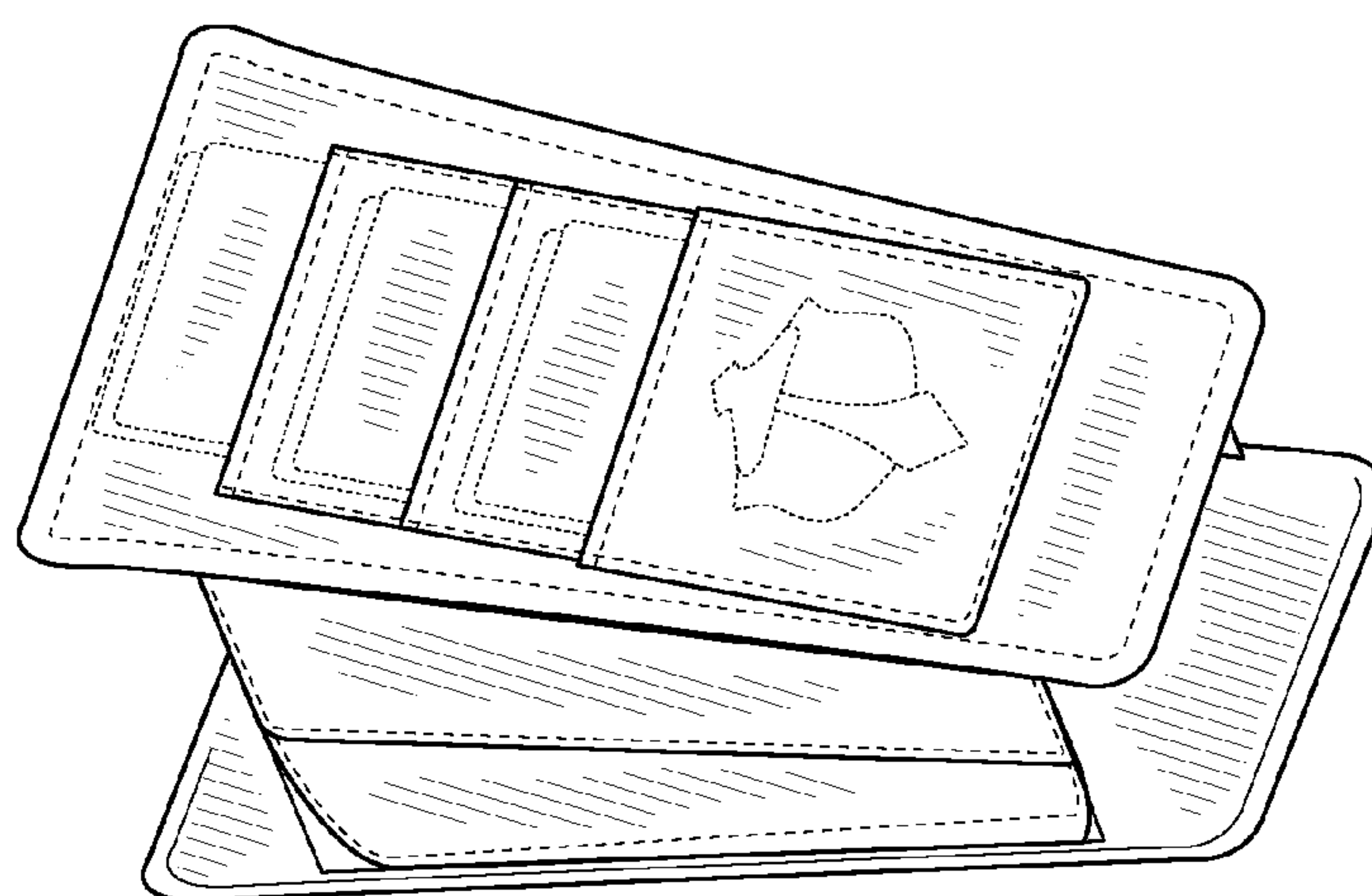

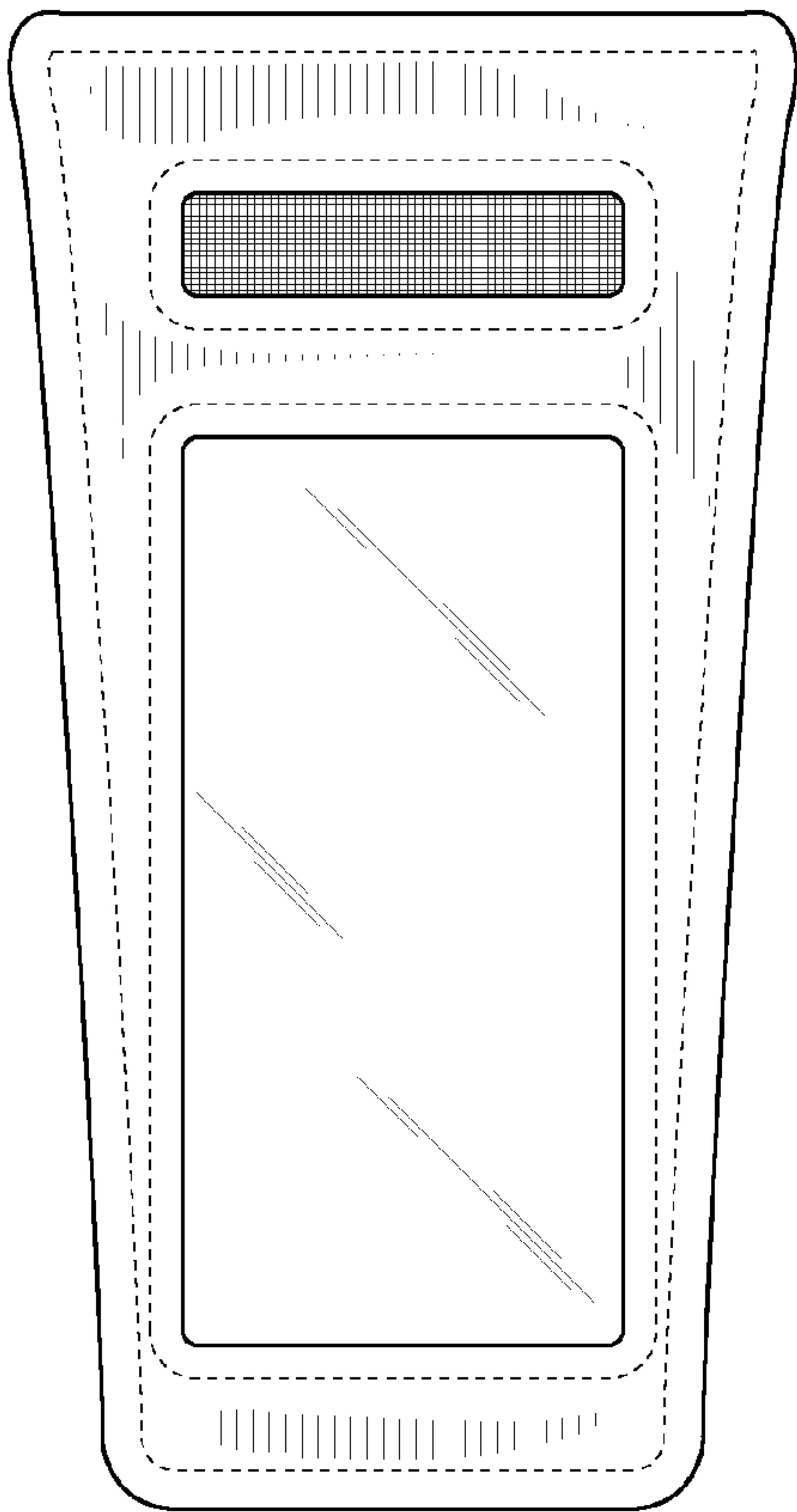

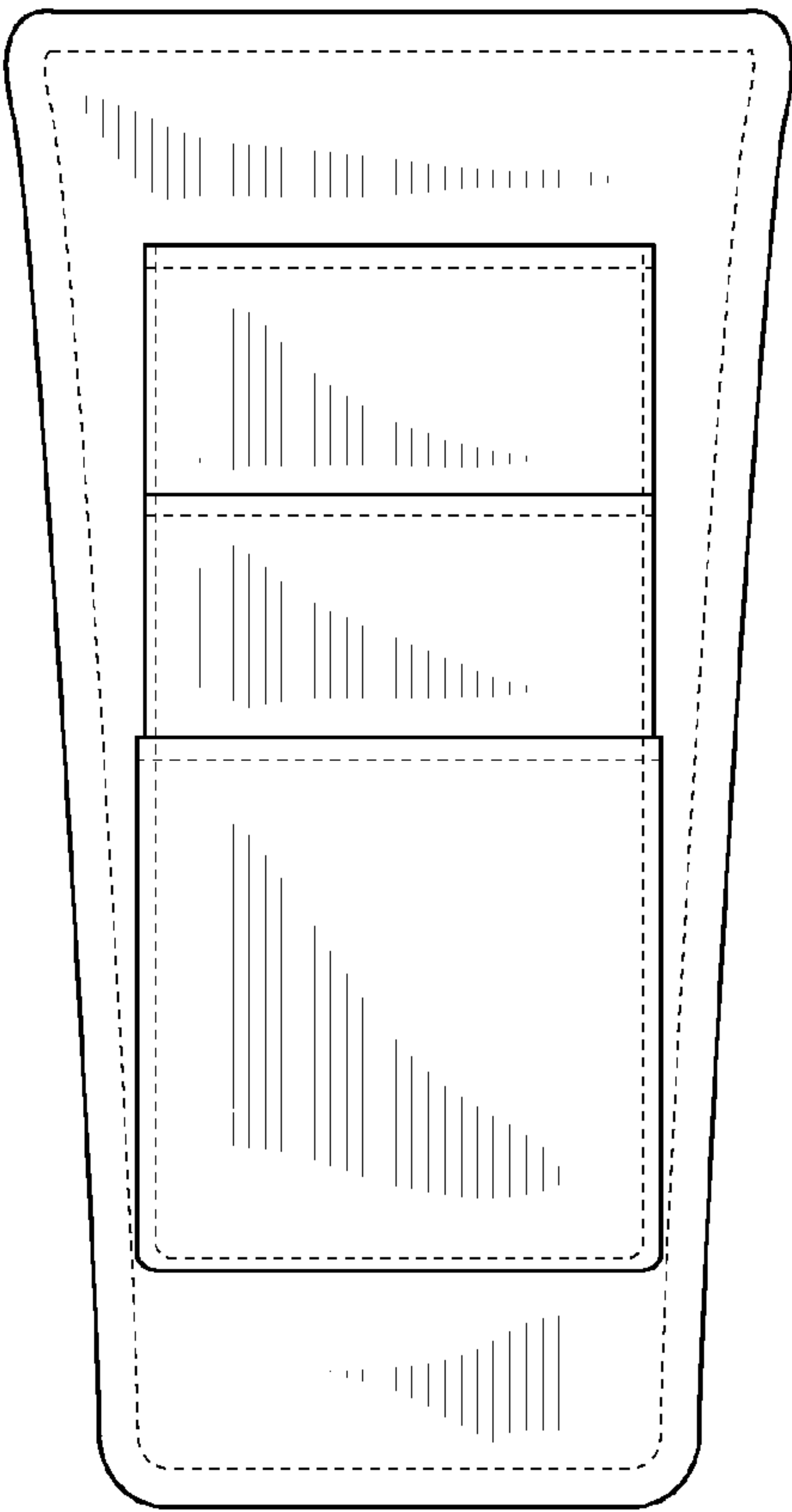

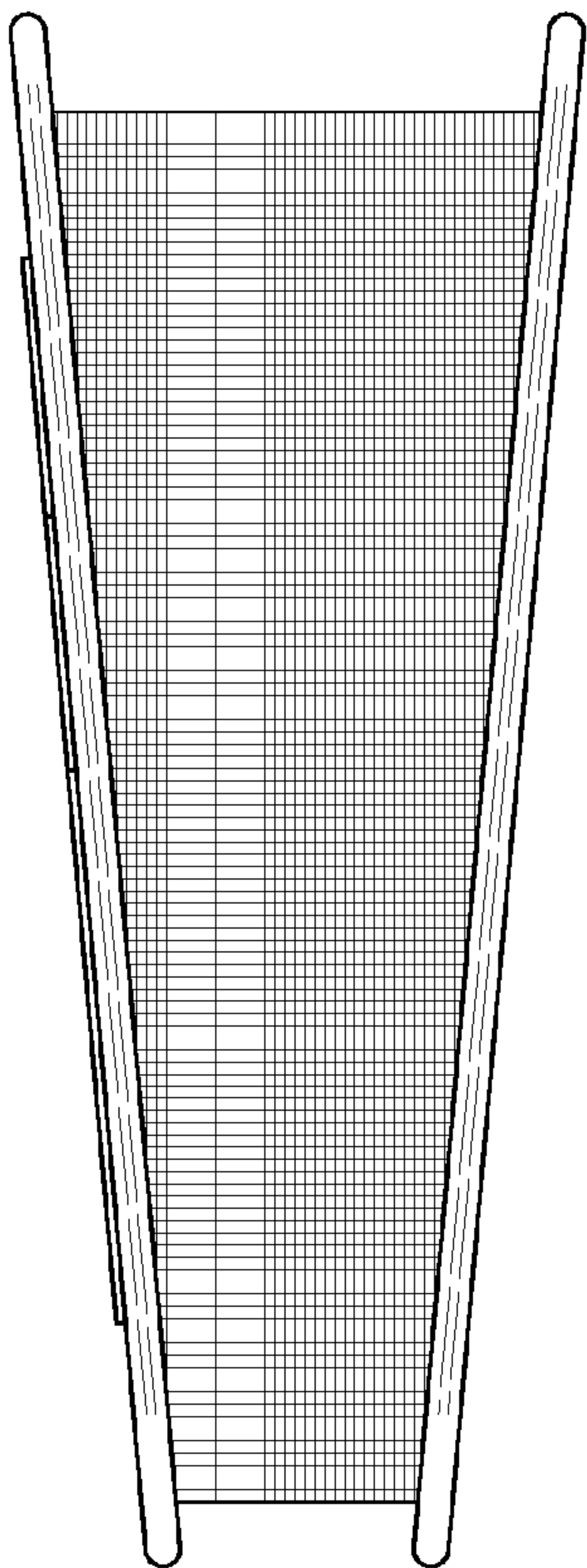

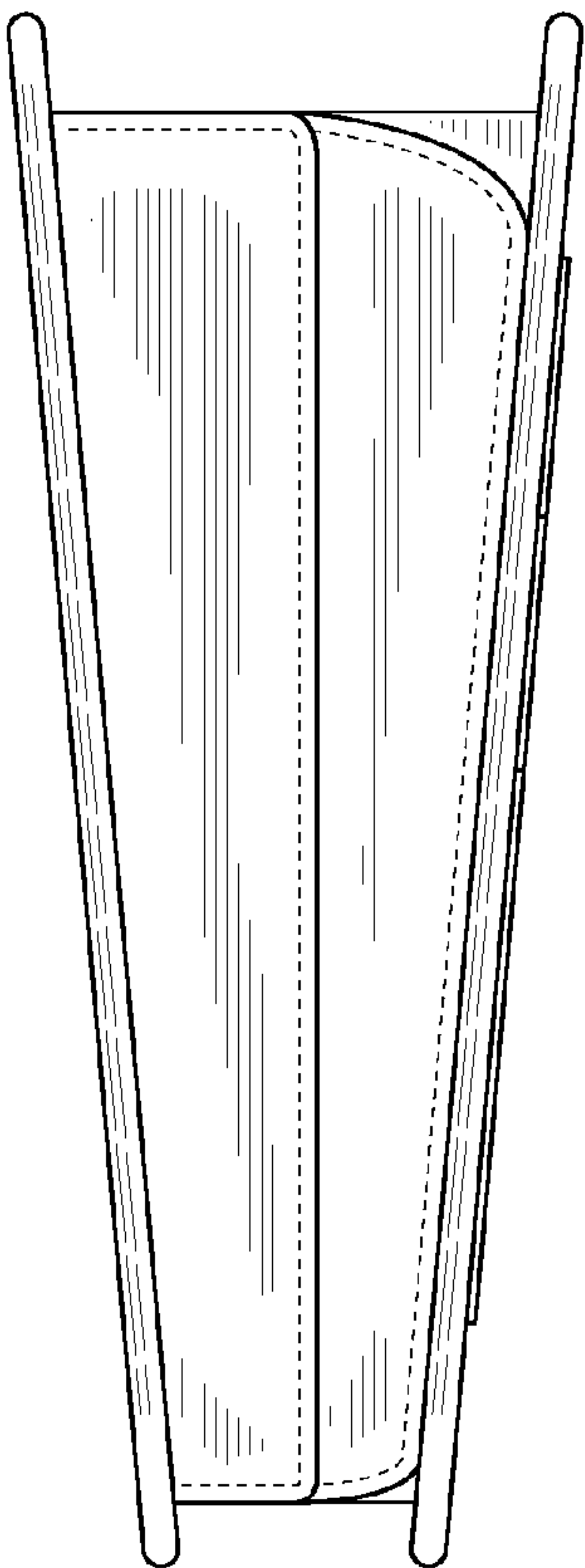

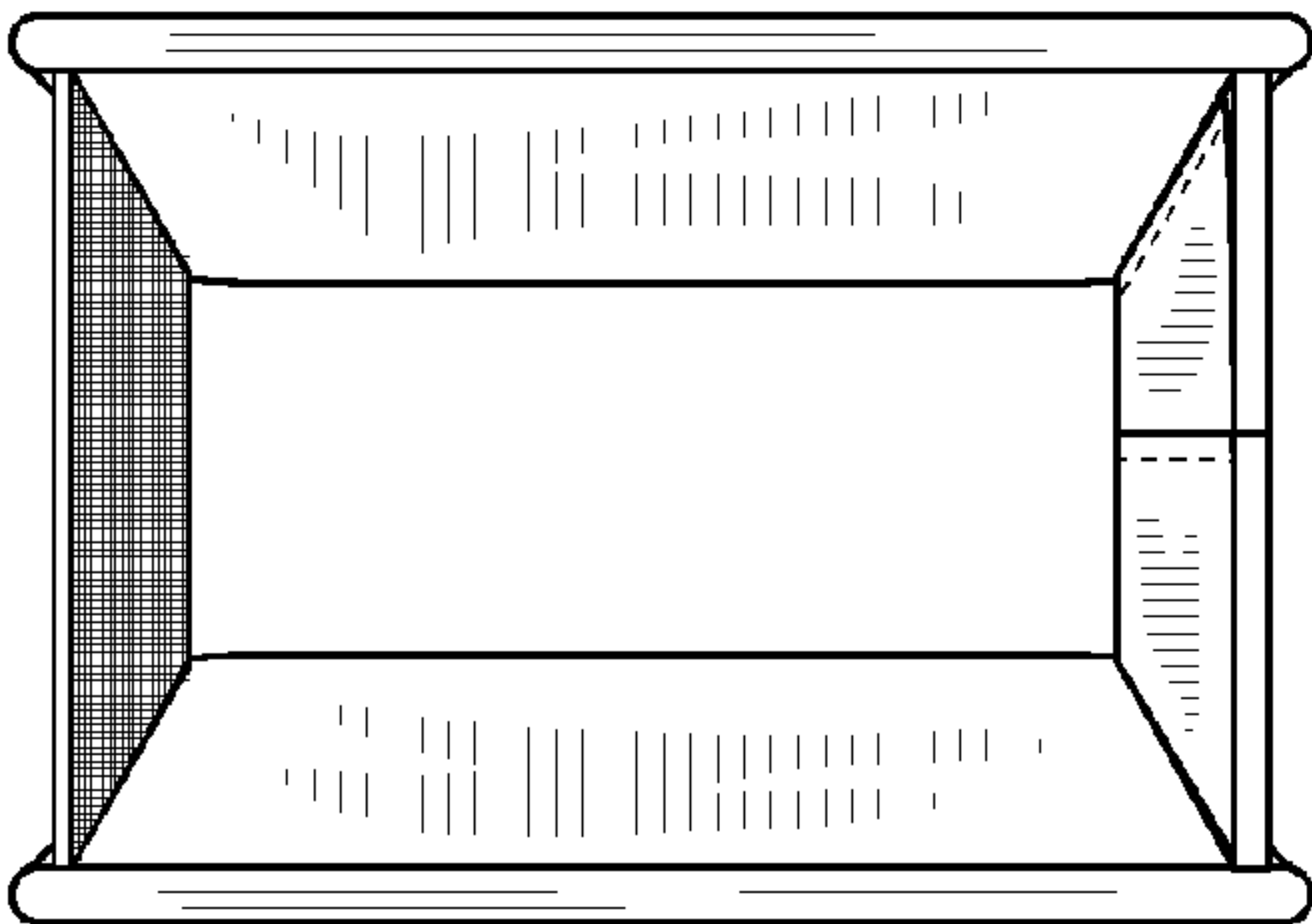

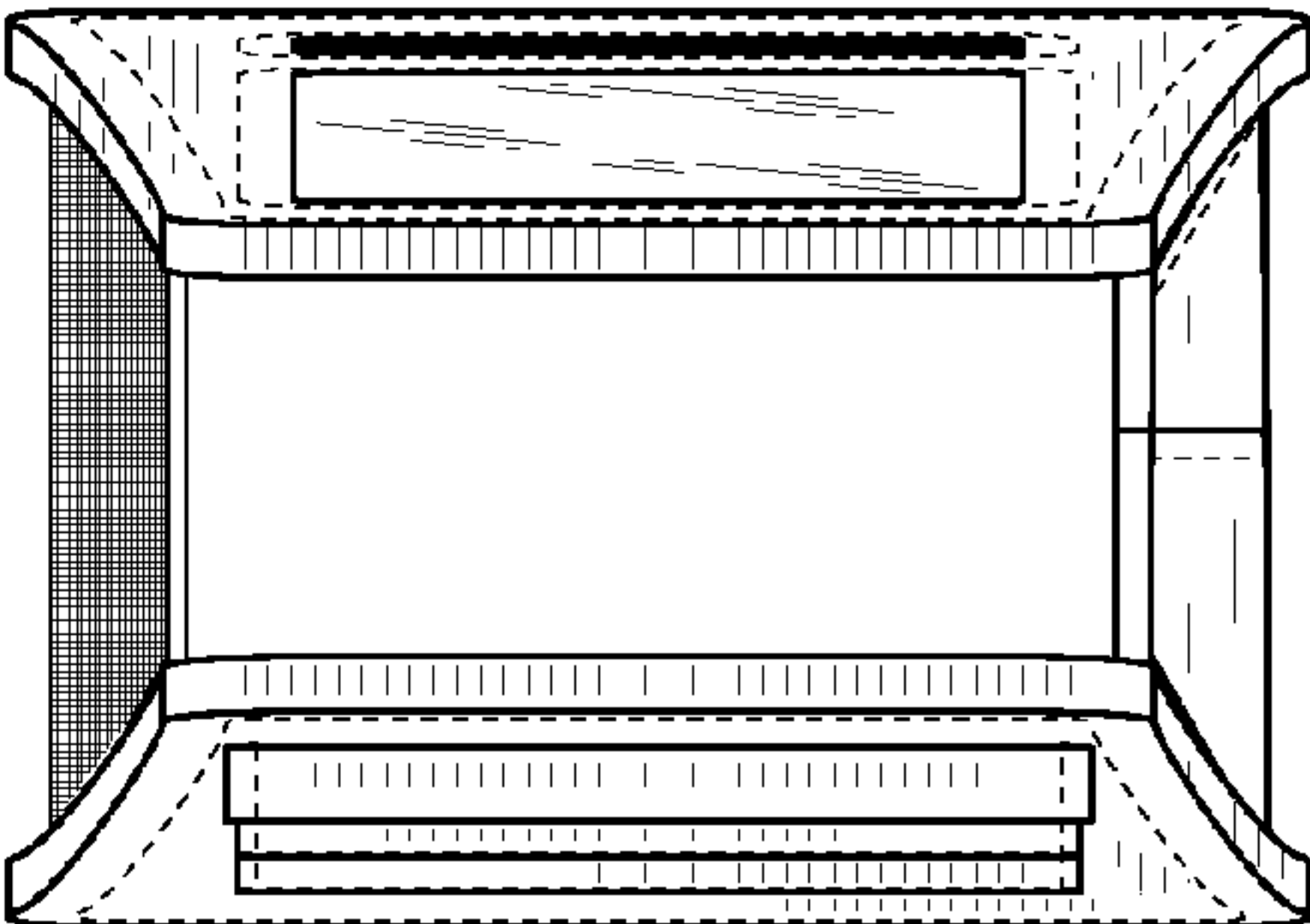

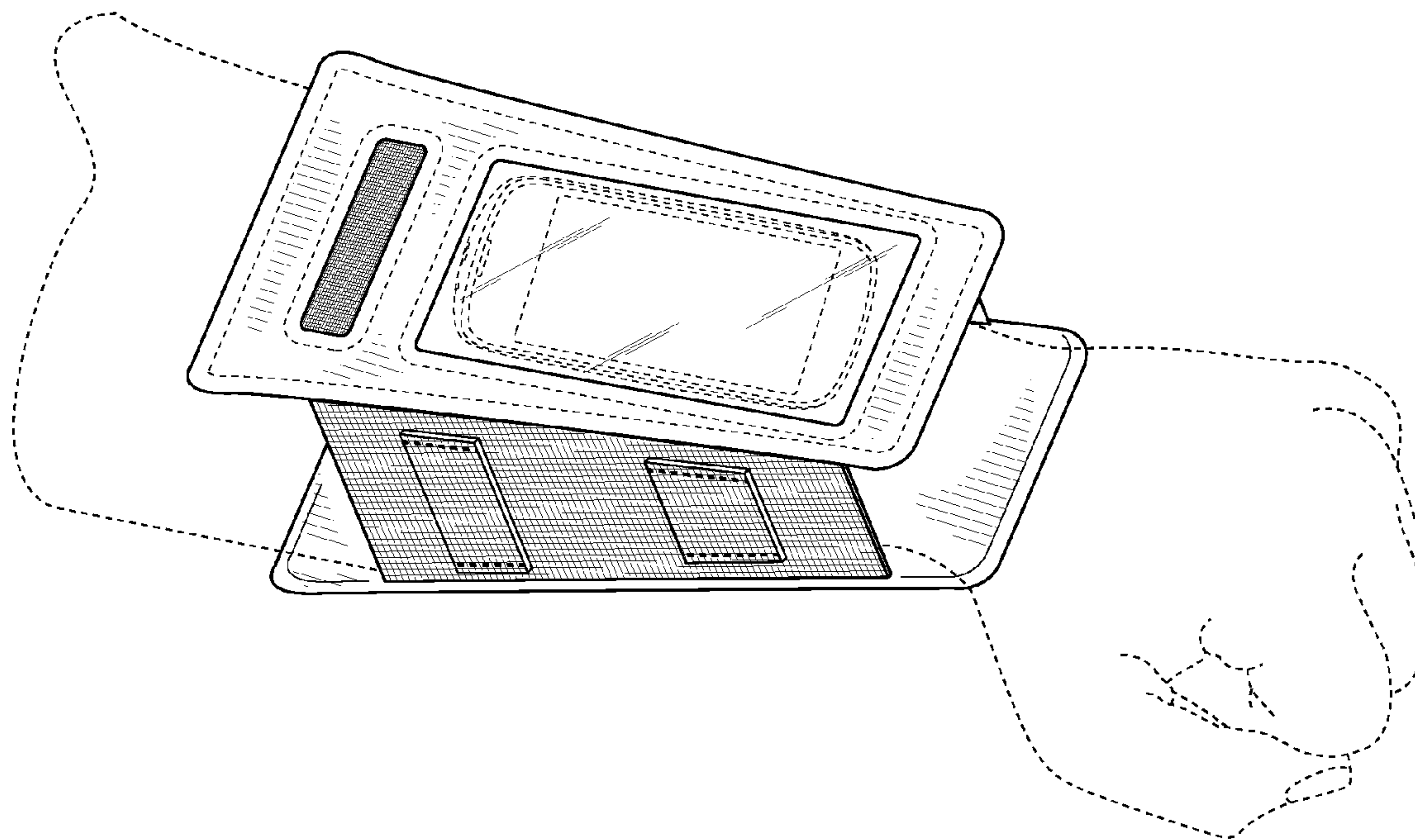

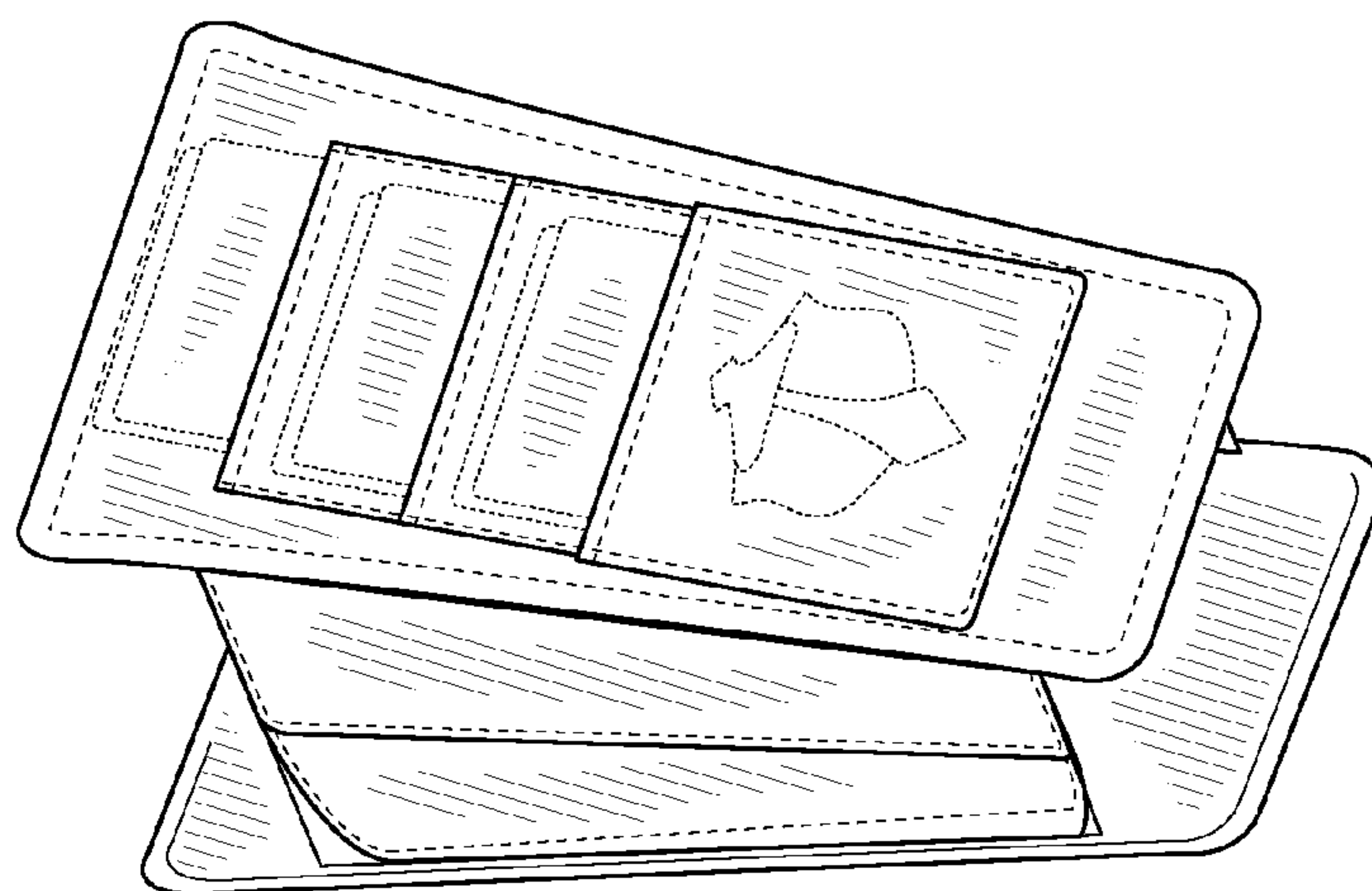

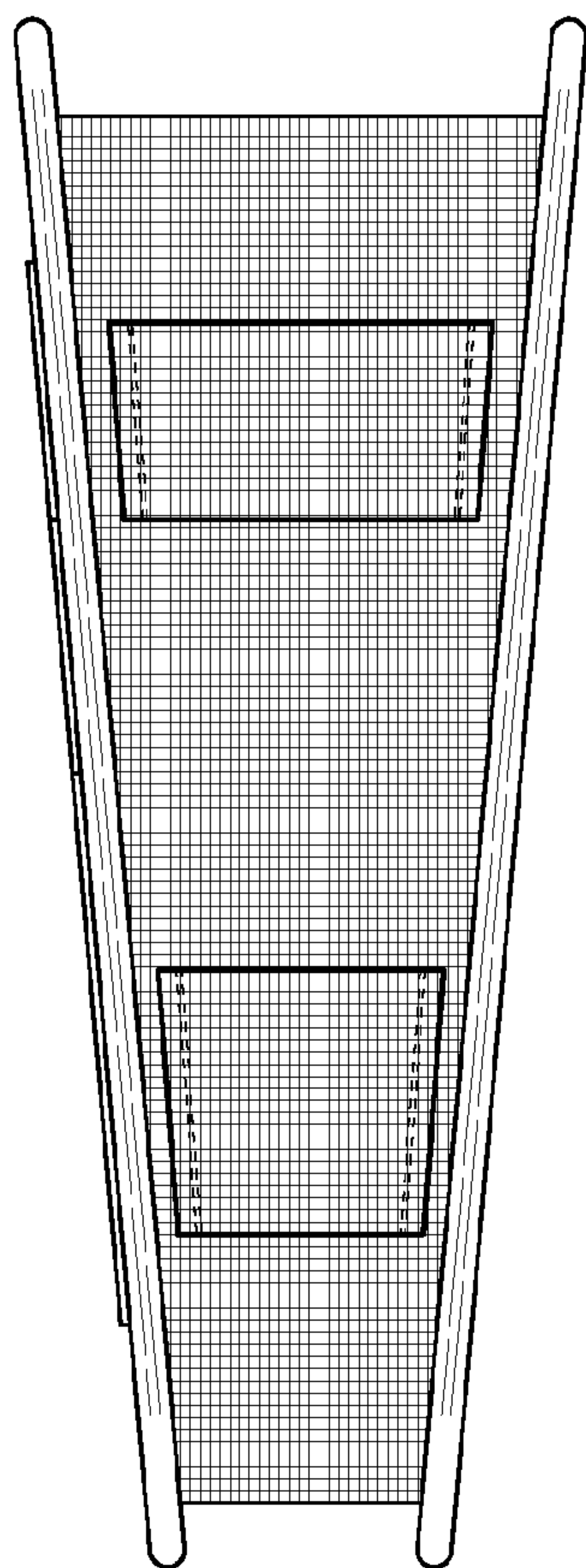

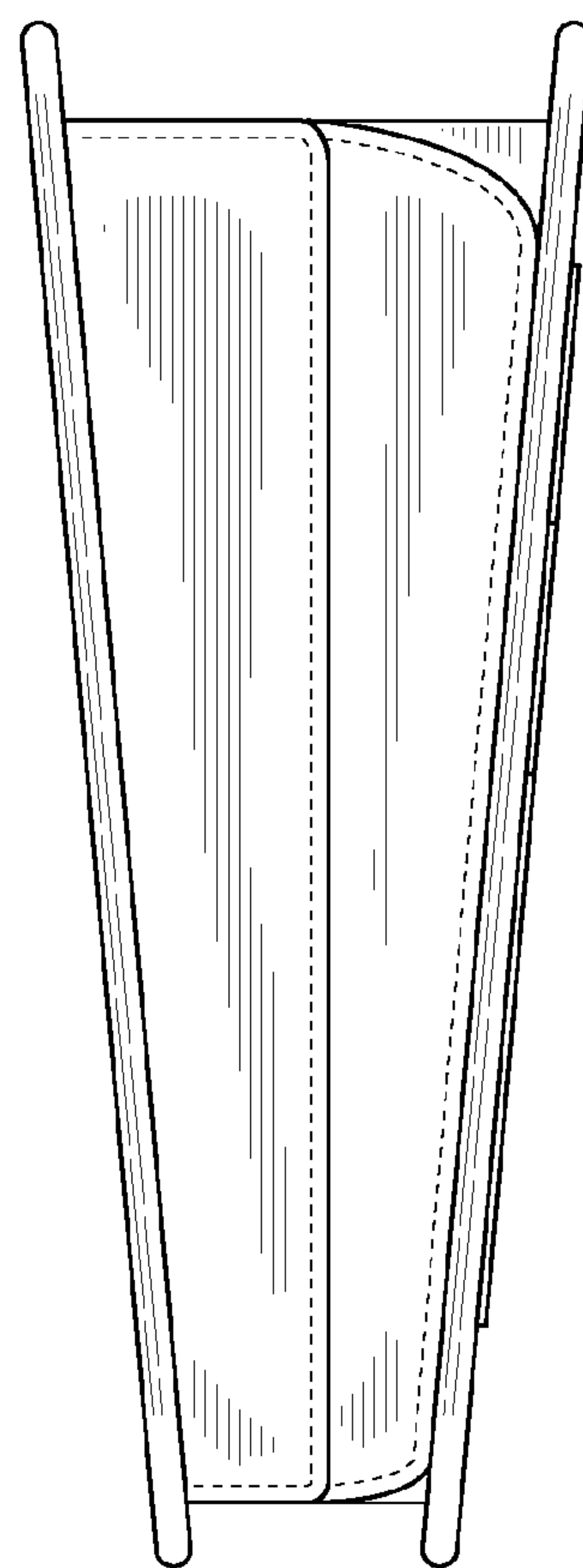

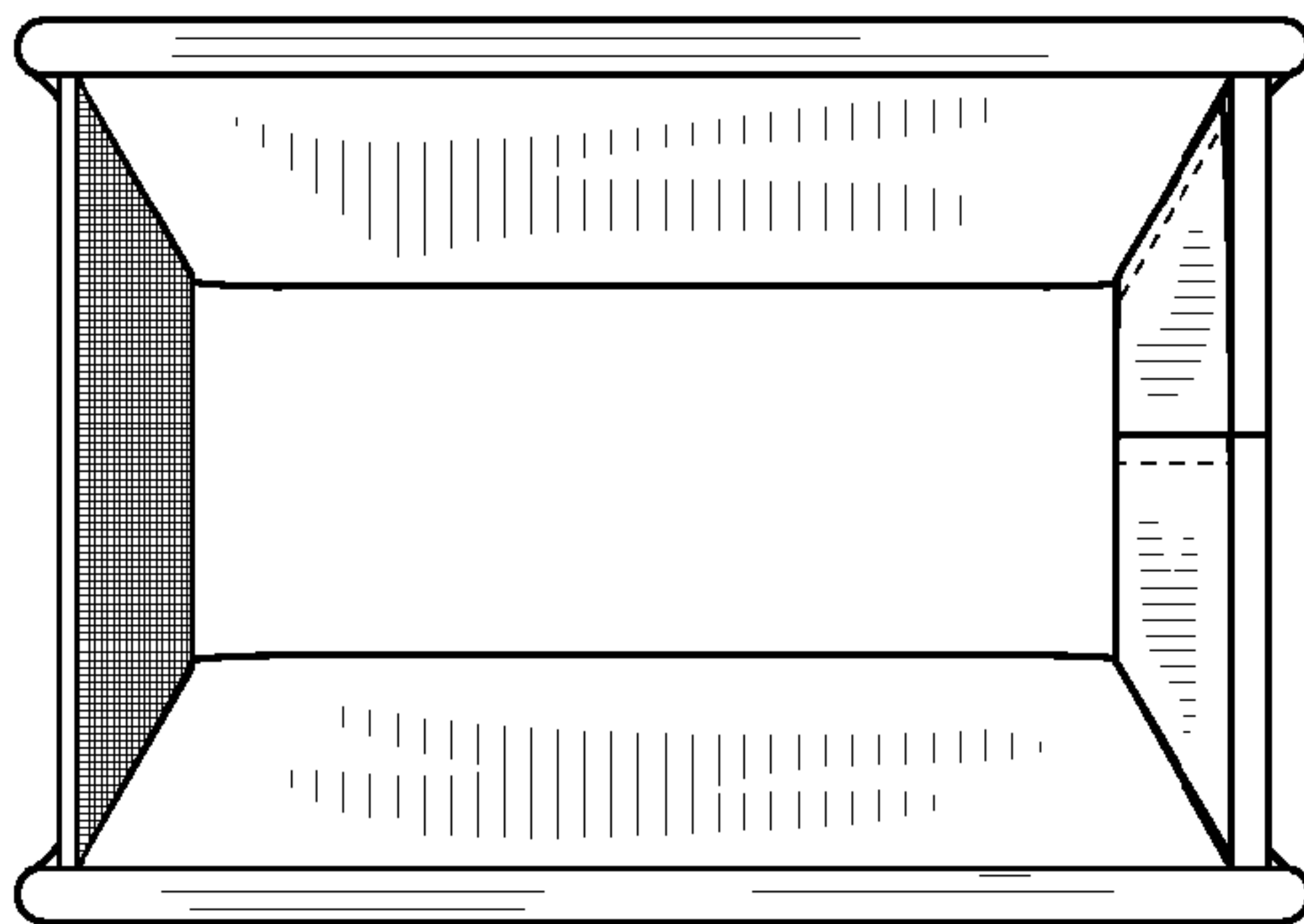

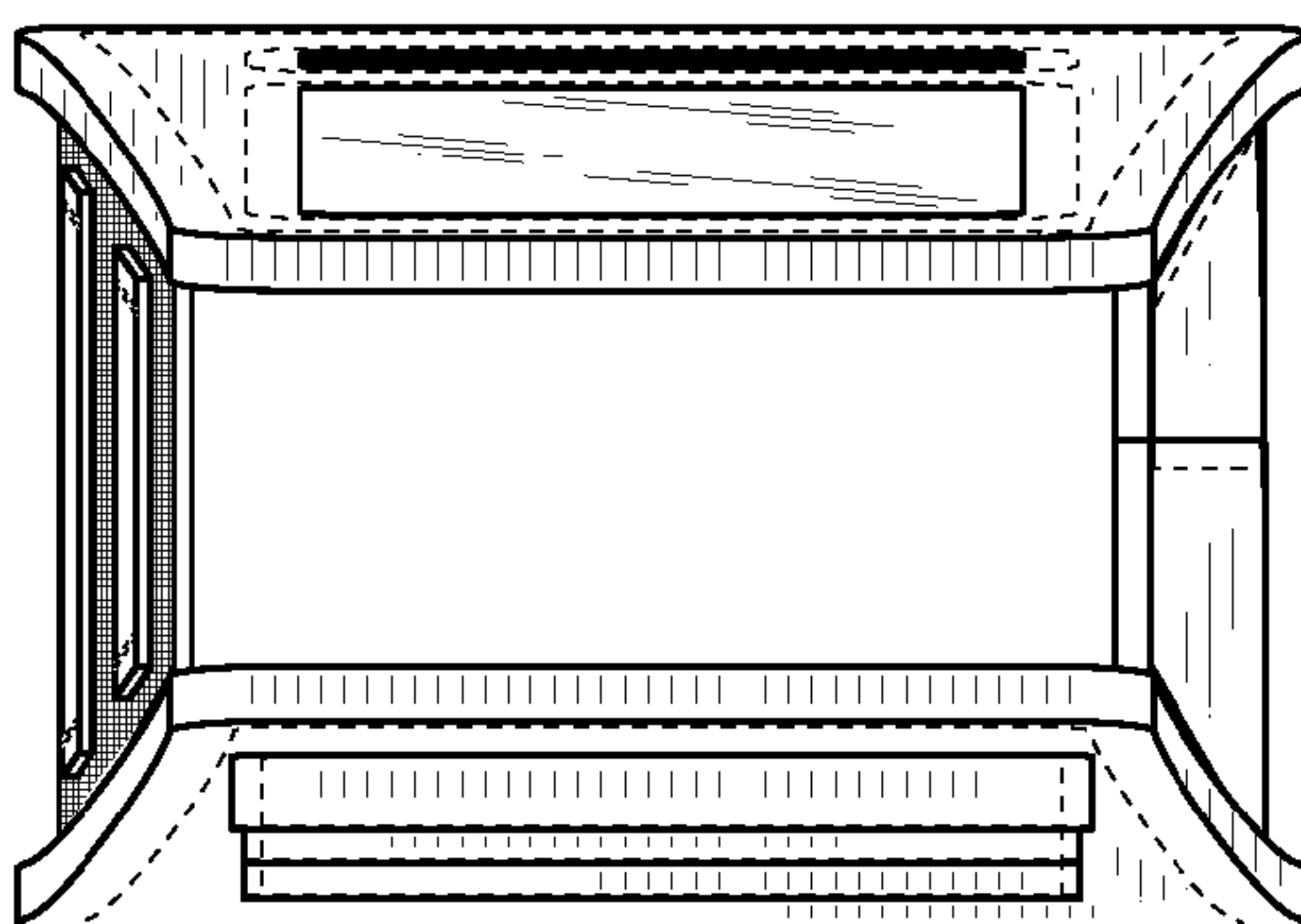
