CLAIM (57)

The ornamental design for a handle for electric toothbrush, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view showing my design;

FIG. 2 is a reduced front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a reduced rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a reduced right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a reduced left side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a reduced top plan view thereof;

FIG. 7 is a reduced bottom plan view thereof;


FIG. 8 includes the view of FIG. 3 and further indicates the upper portion of the handle that is depicted in FIG. 9;


FIG. 9 is a greatly enlarged, fragmentary view of the upper portion of the handle, which is indicated by a dash-dot-dash circle in FIG. 8;

FIG. 10 includes the view of FIG. 5 and further indicates the upper portion of the handle that is depicted in FIG. 11; and, FIG. 11 is a greatly enlarged, fragmentary view of the upper portion of the handle, which is indicated by a dash-dot-dash circle in FIG. 10.

The dash-dot-dash broken line shown in FIG. 7 represents the bounds of the claim and forms no part thereof. The areas within the two sets of broken lines shown in FIG. 7 illustrate portions of the handle that form no part of the claimed design.
















