(57)**CLAIM**

The ornamental design for an assembling toy block, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of an assembling toy block according to the present design, as viewed from the top side; FIG. 2 is a front view thereof, the rear view being identical thereto;

FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof, the bottom plan view being identical thereto;

FIG. 4 is a left-hand side view thereof, the right-side view being identical thereto;

FIG. 5 is an enlarged sectional view taken along line 5-5 of FIG. 2;

FIG. 6 is an environmental top plan view showing the toy block according to this design combined with other toy blocks to assemble a toy; and,

FIG. 7 is another environmental perspective view showing the toy block according to this design combined with other toy blocks to assemble a toy.

The broken lines represent the environment in which the toy block resides and form no part of the claimed design.








