(57) **CLAIM**

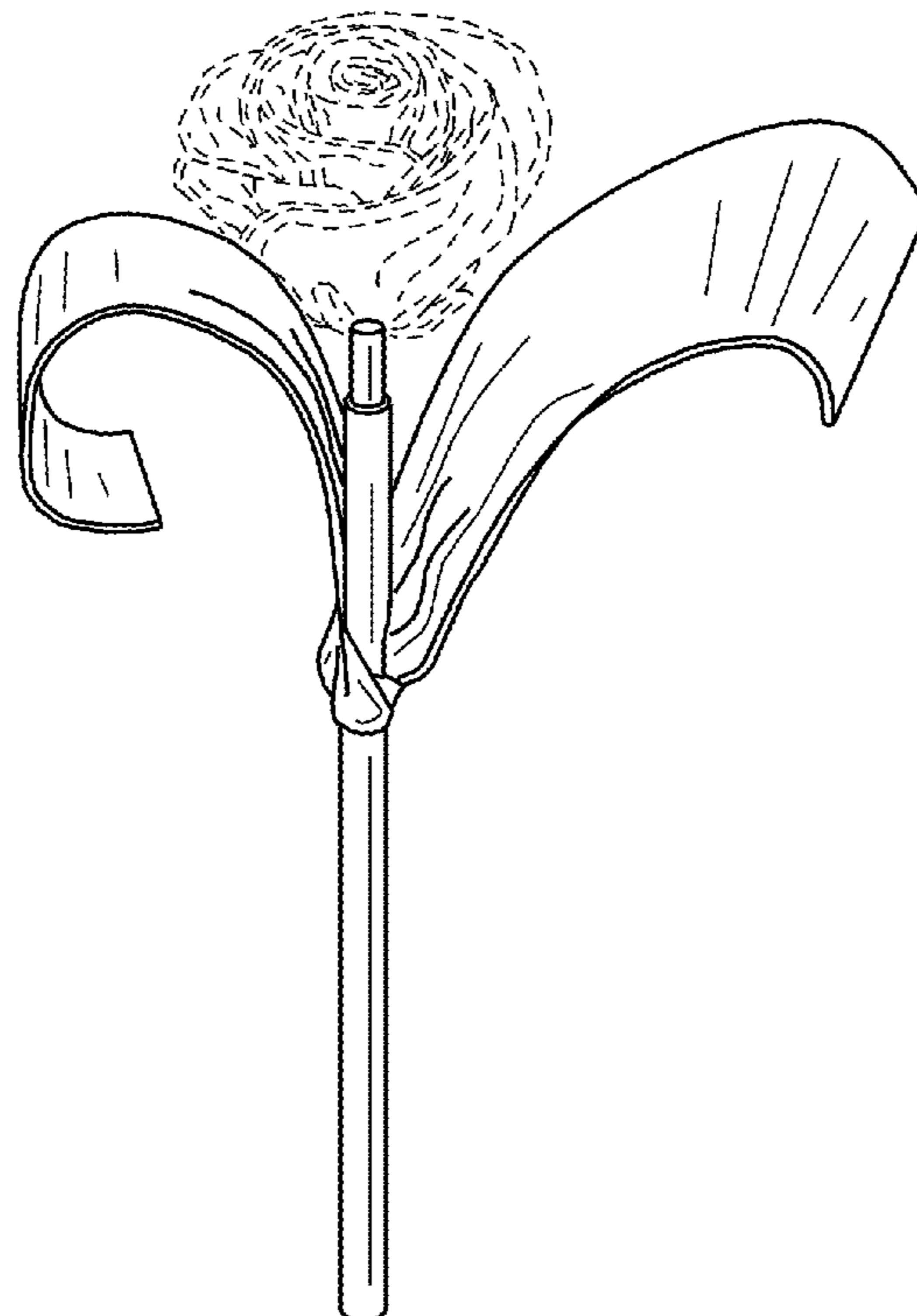
I claim the ornamental design for a artificial stem for edible flower, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a artificial stem for edible flower, showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a left-side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 5 is a right-side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 6 is a top plan view thereof; and,
FIG. 7 is a bottom plan view thereof.

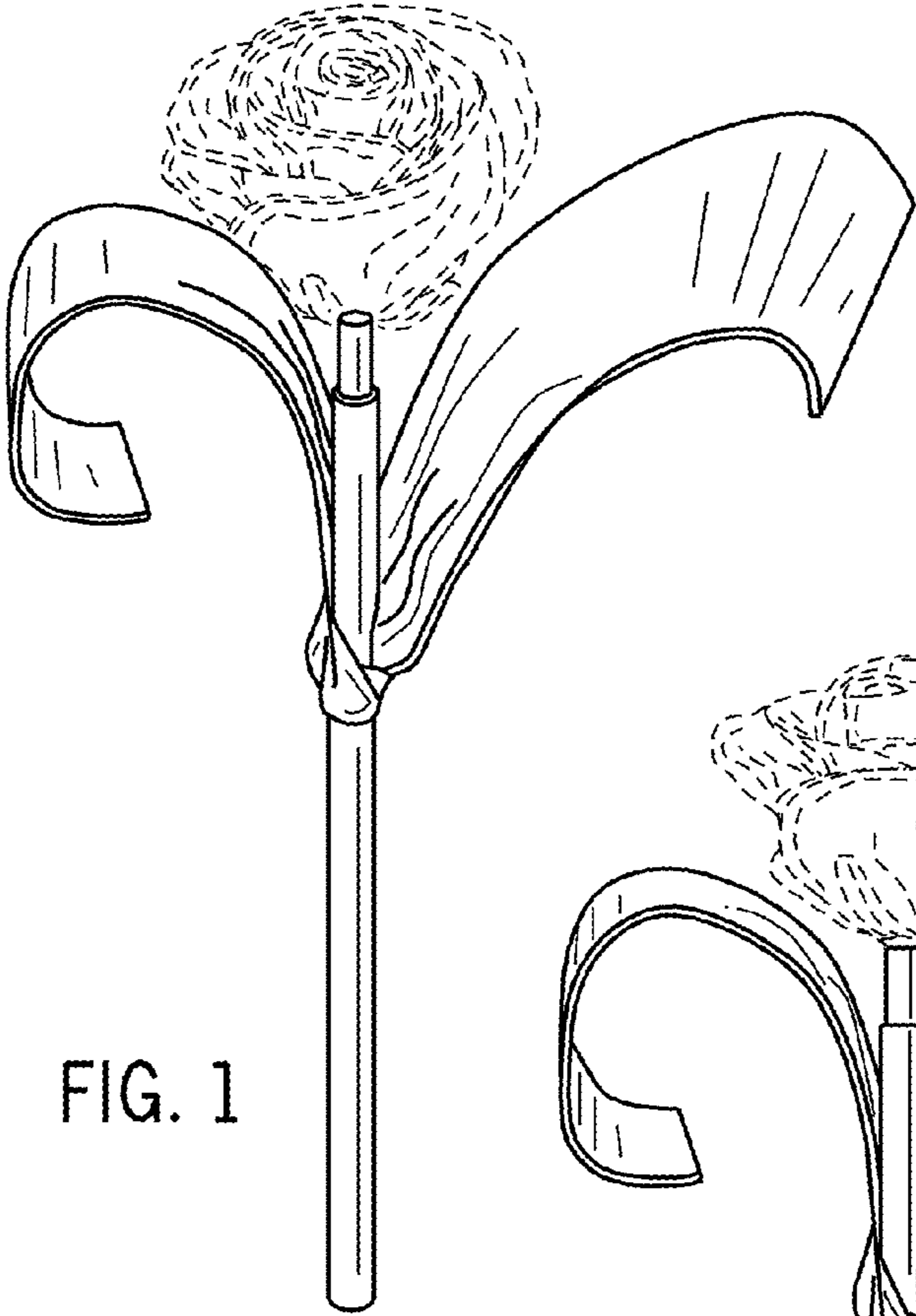

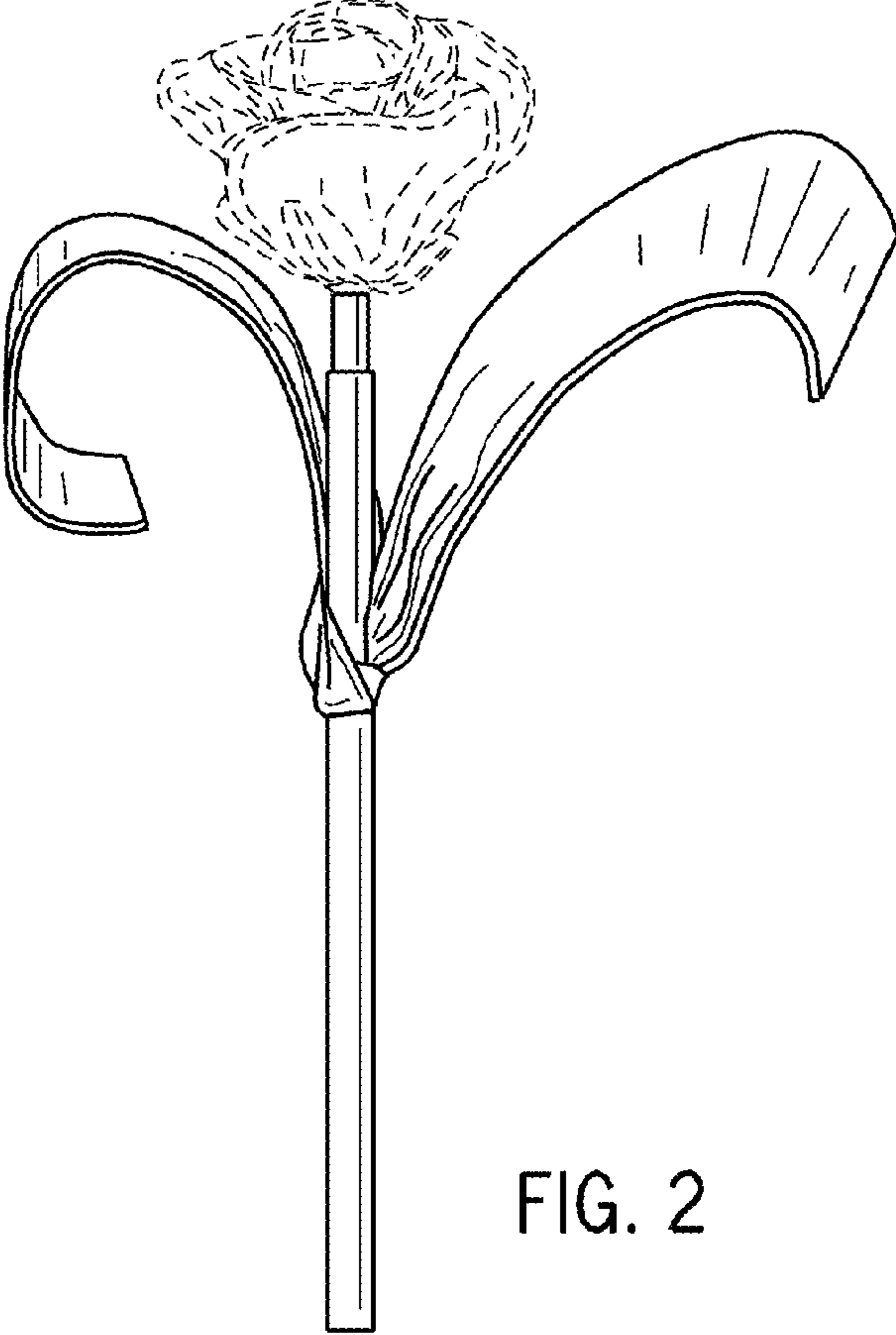

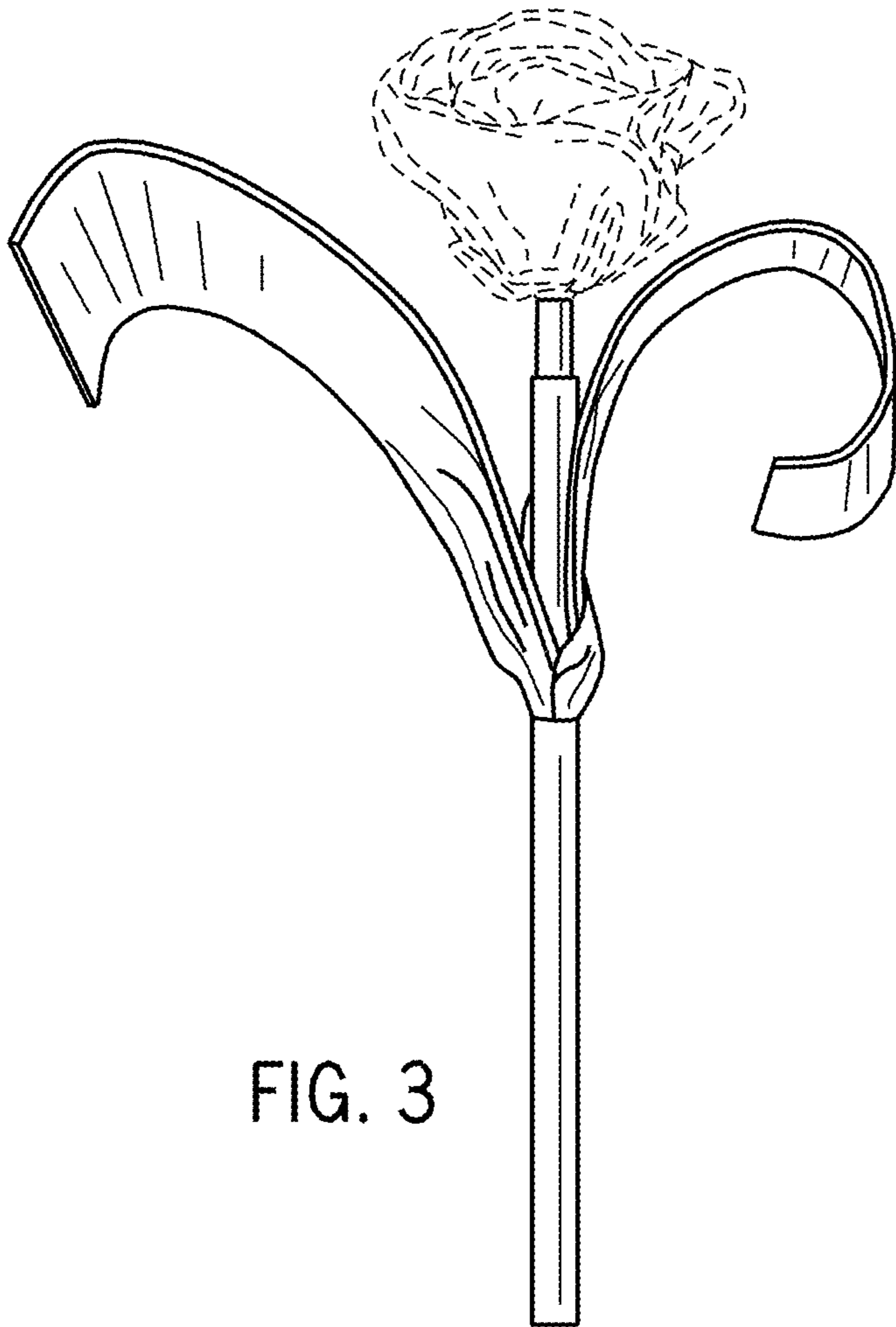

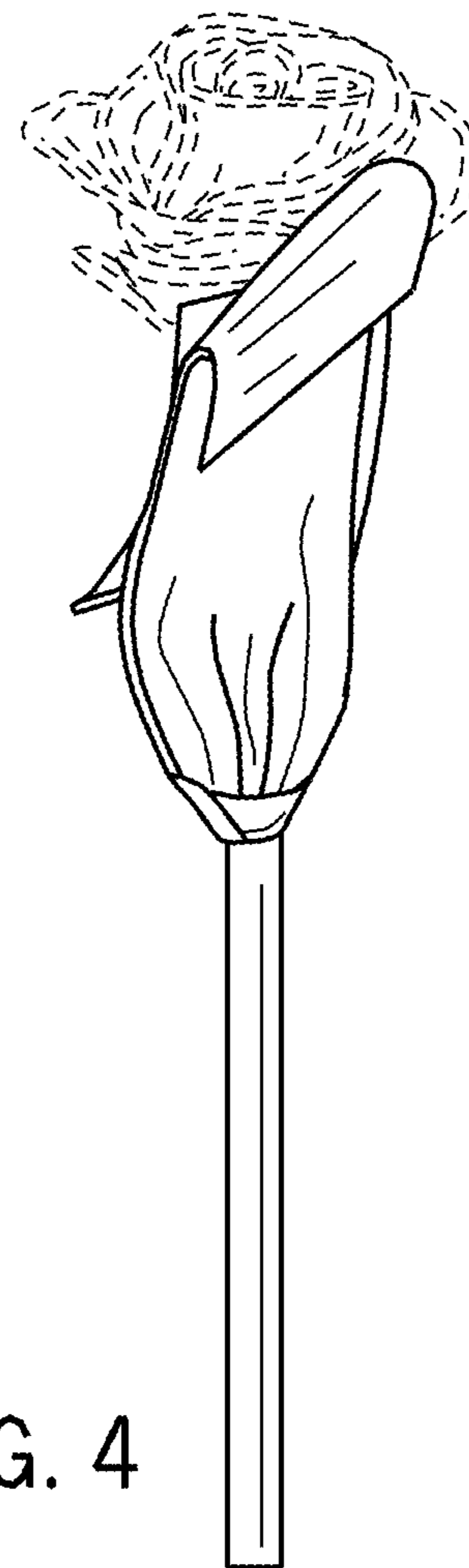

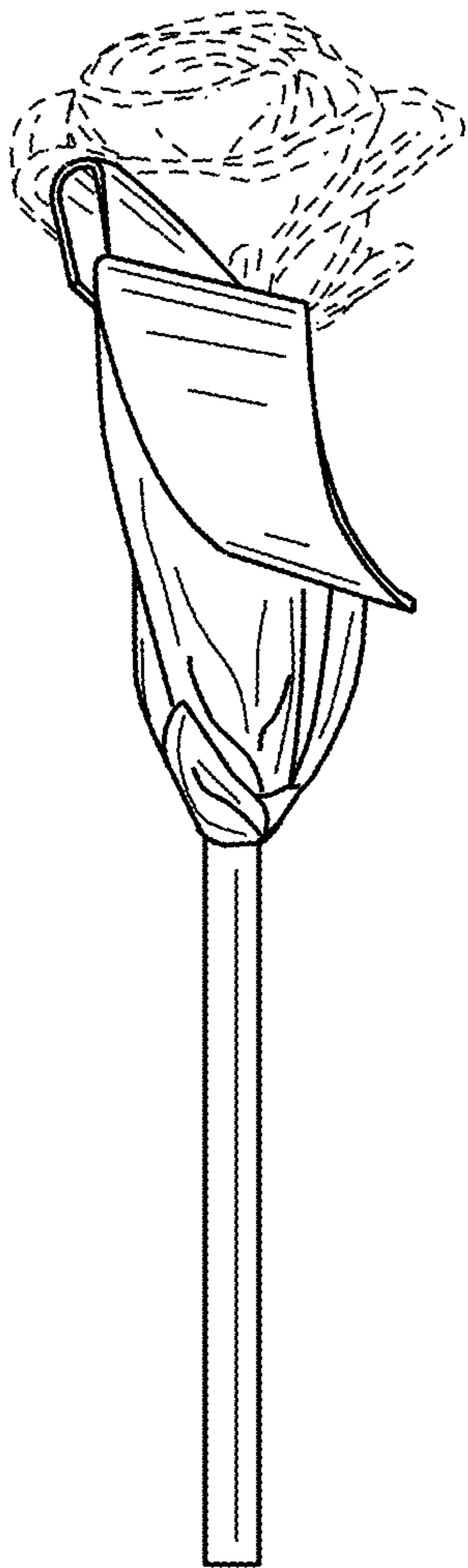

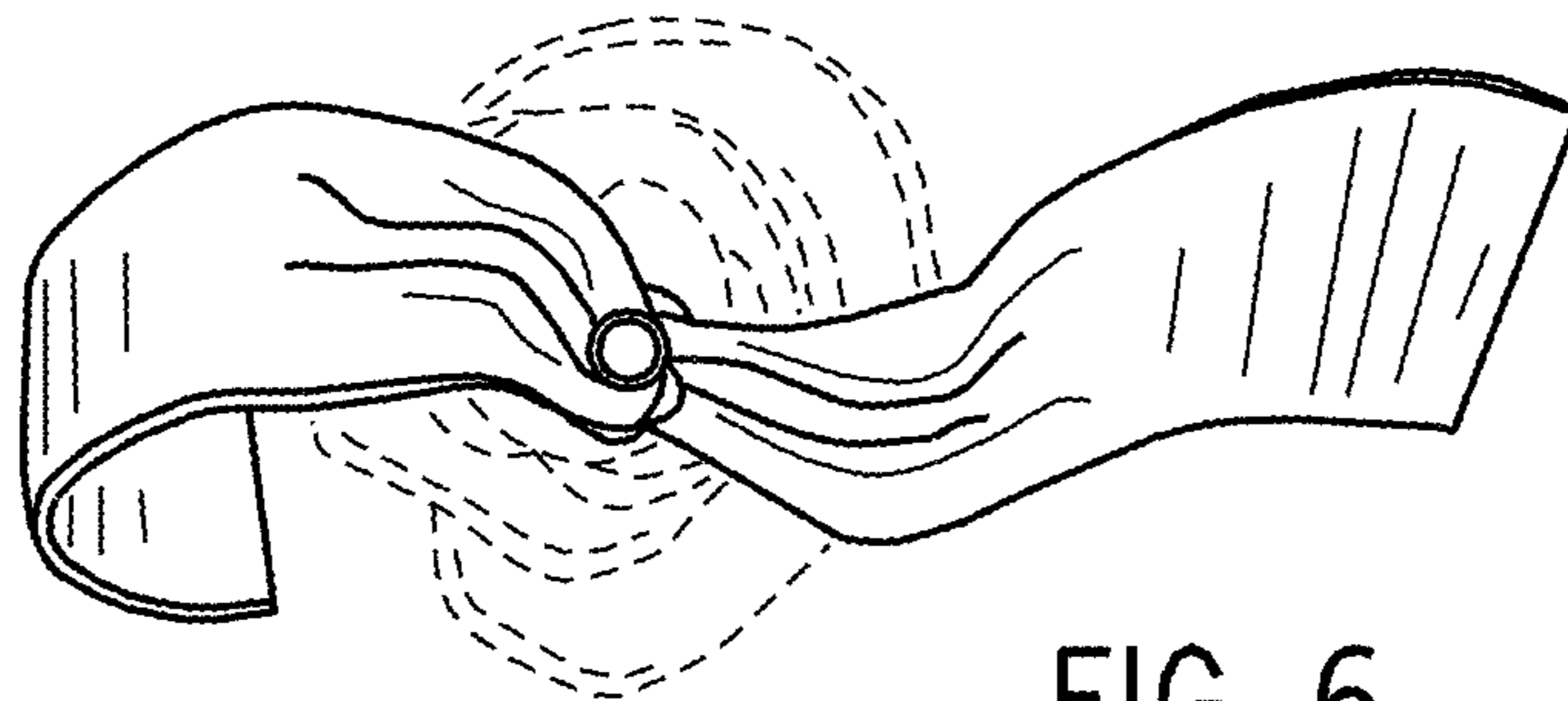

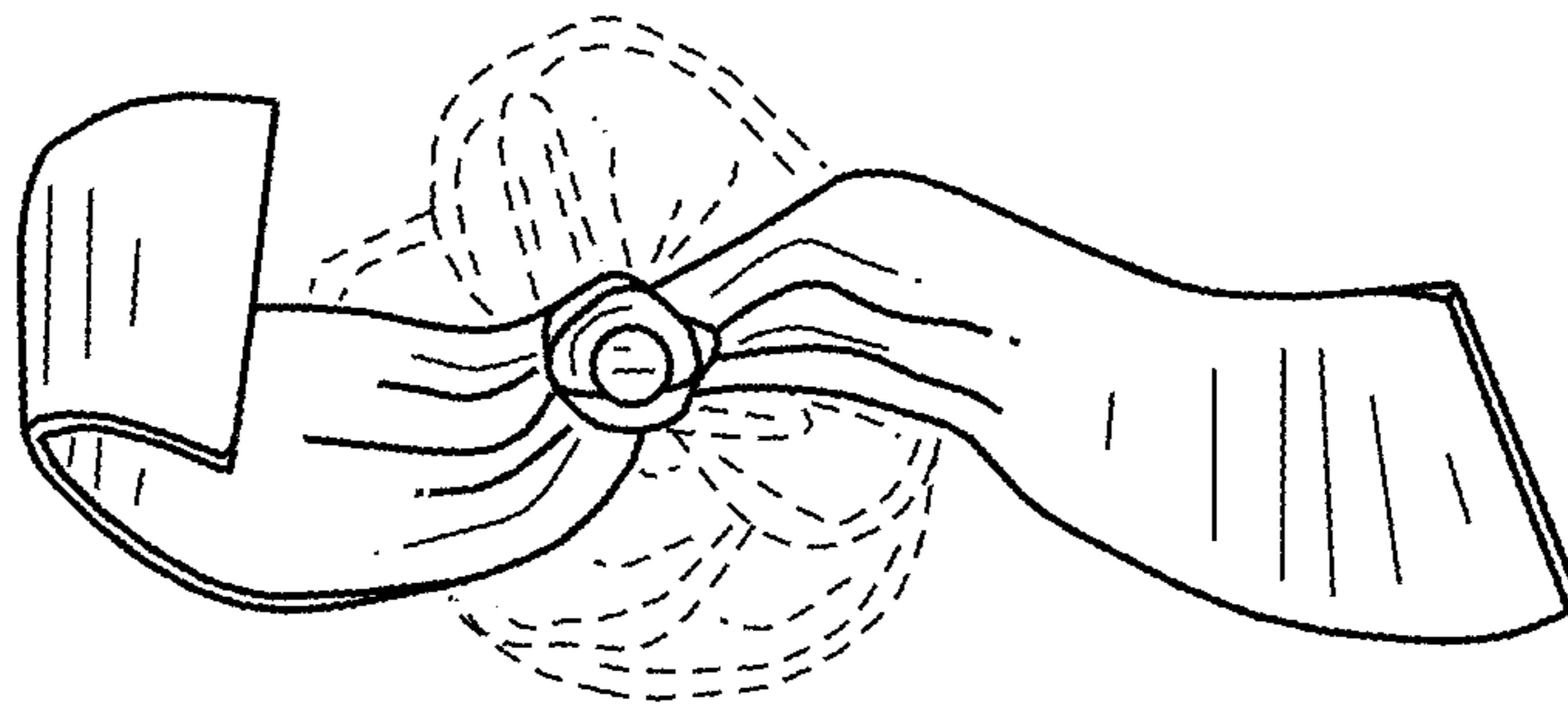
