FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a shoe upper showing my new design;

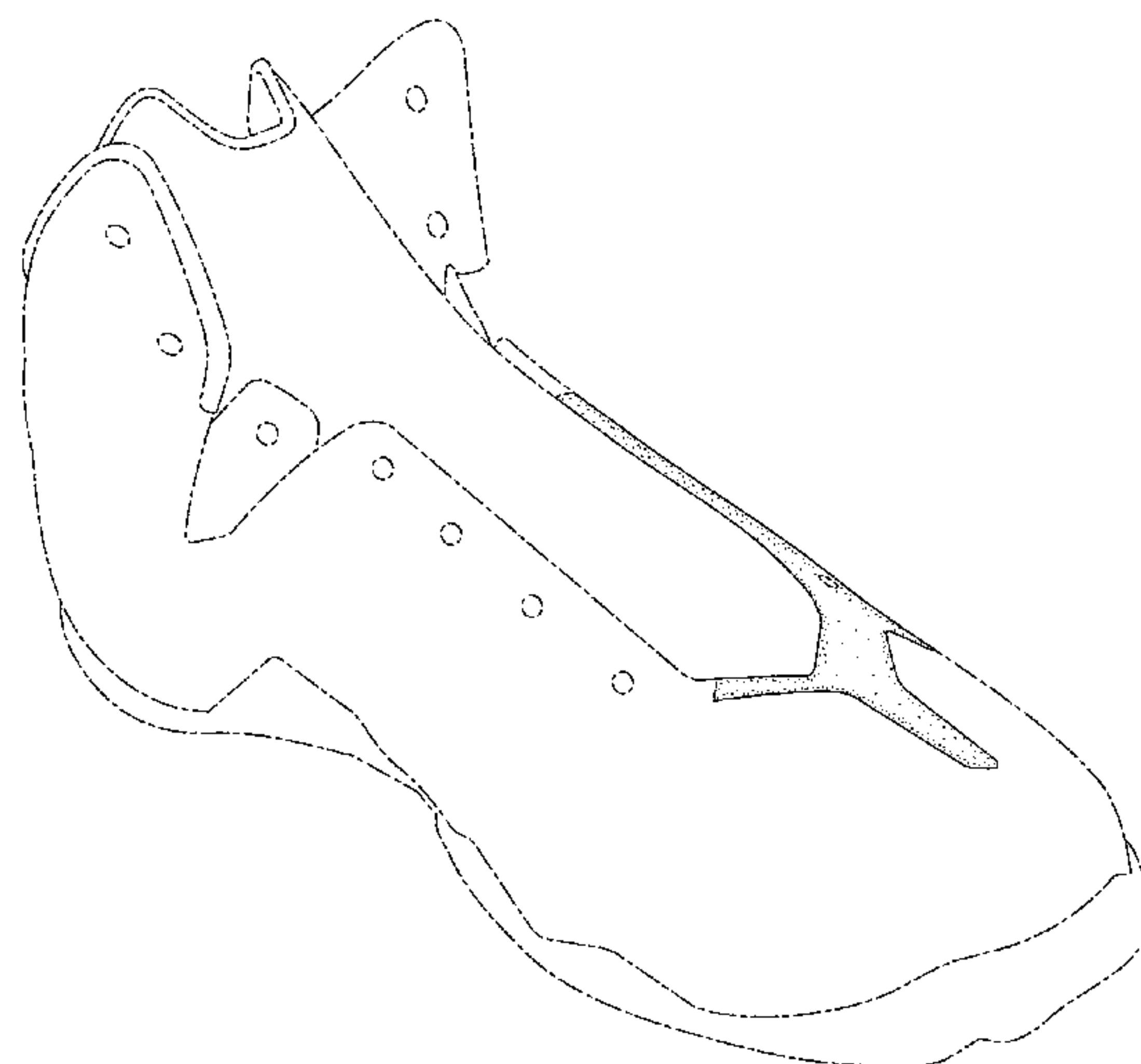
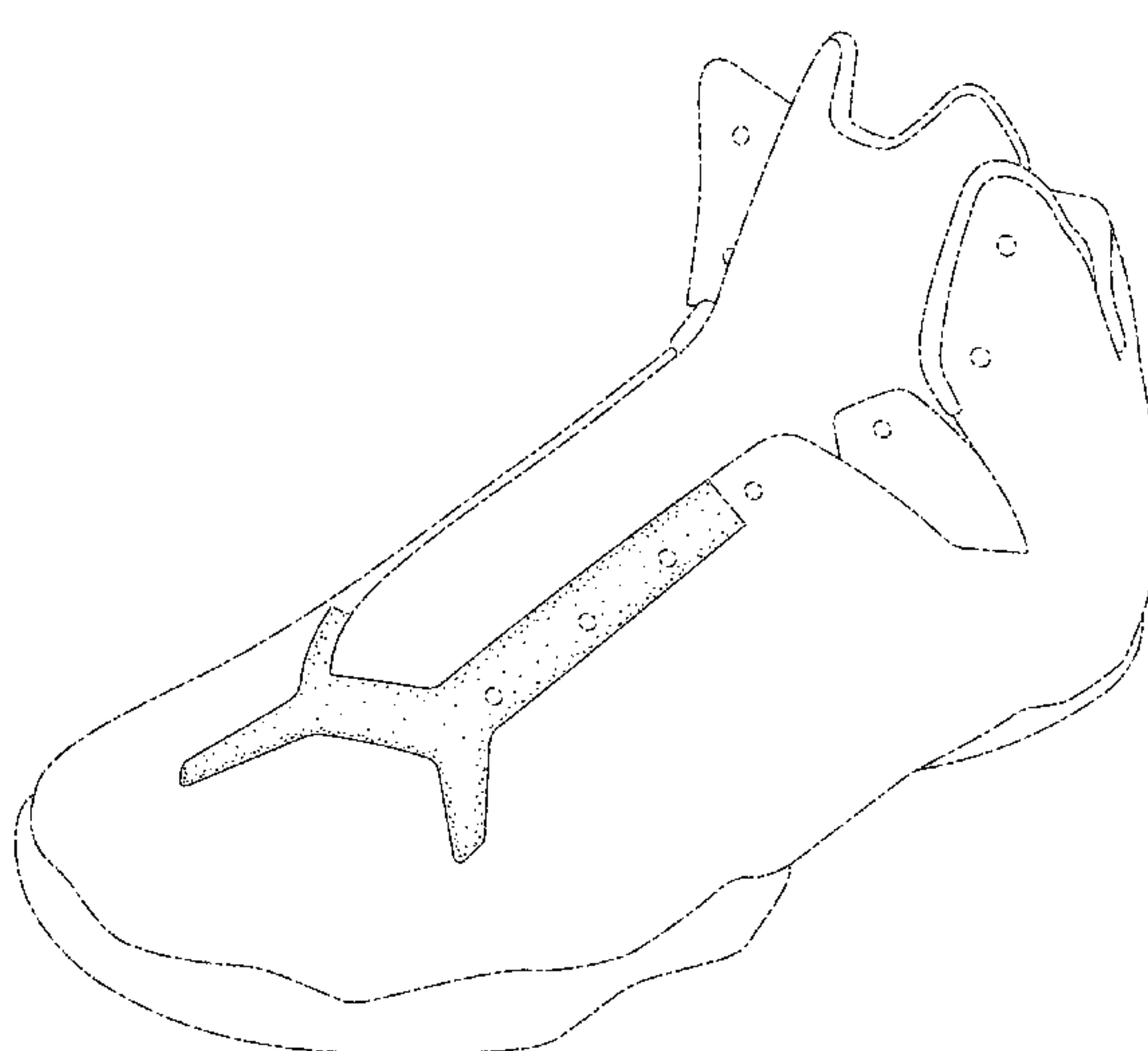
FIG. 2 is a side view thereof;

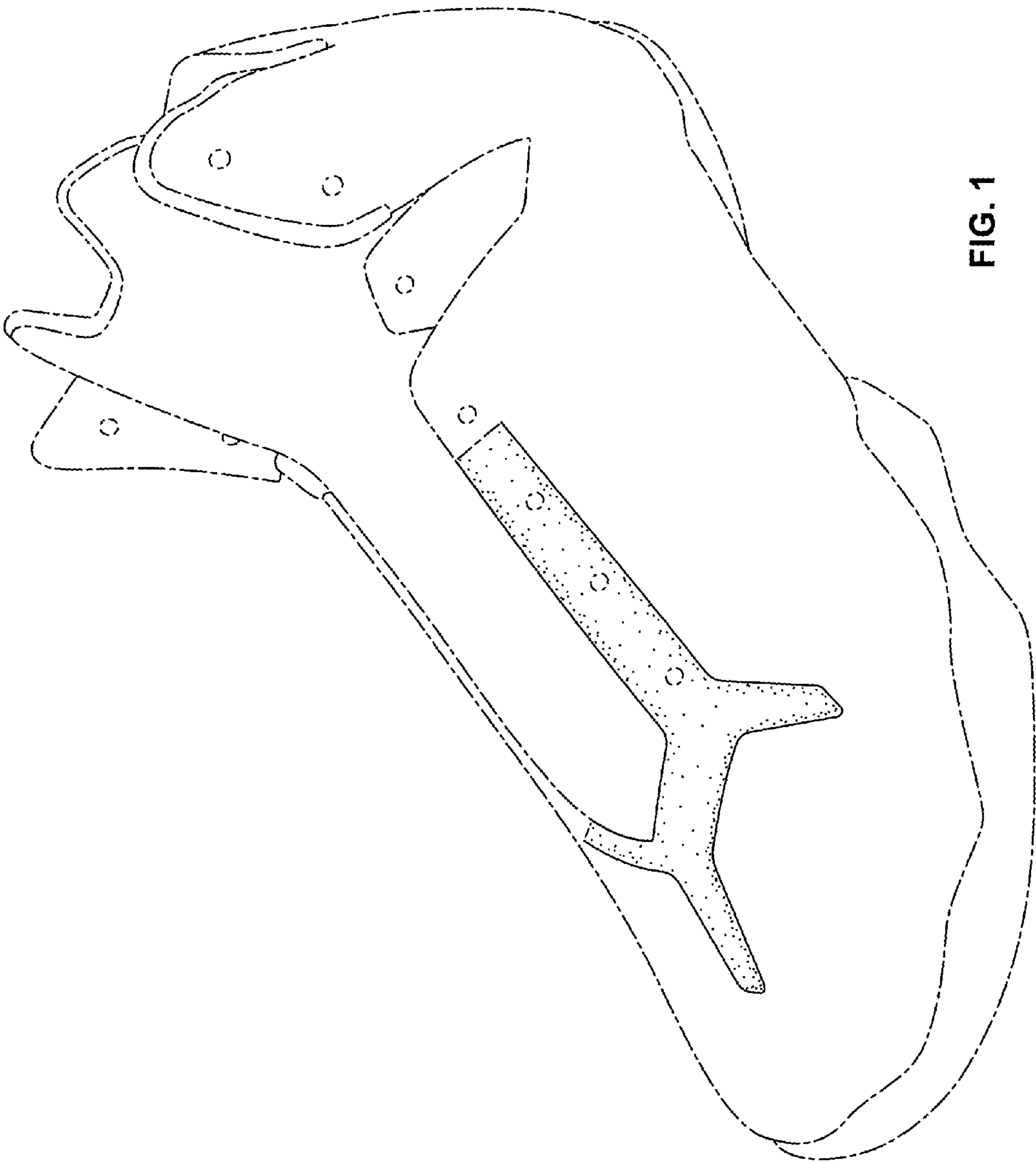

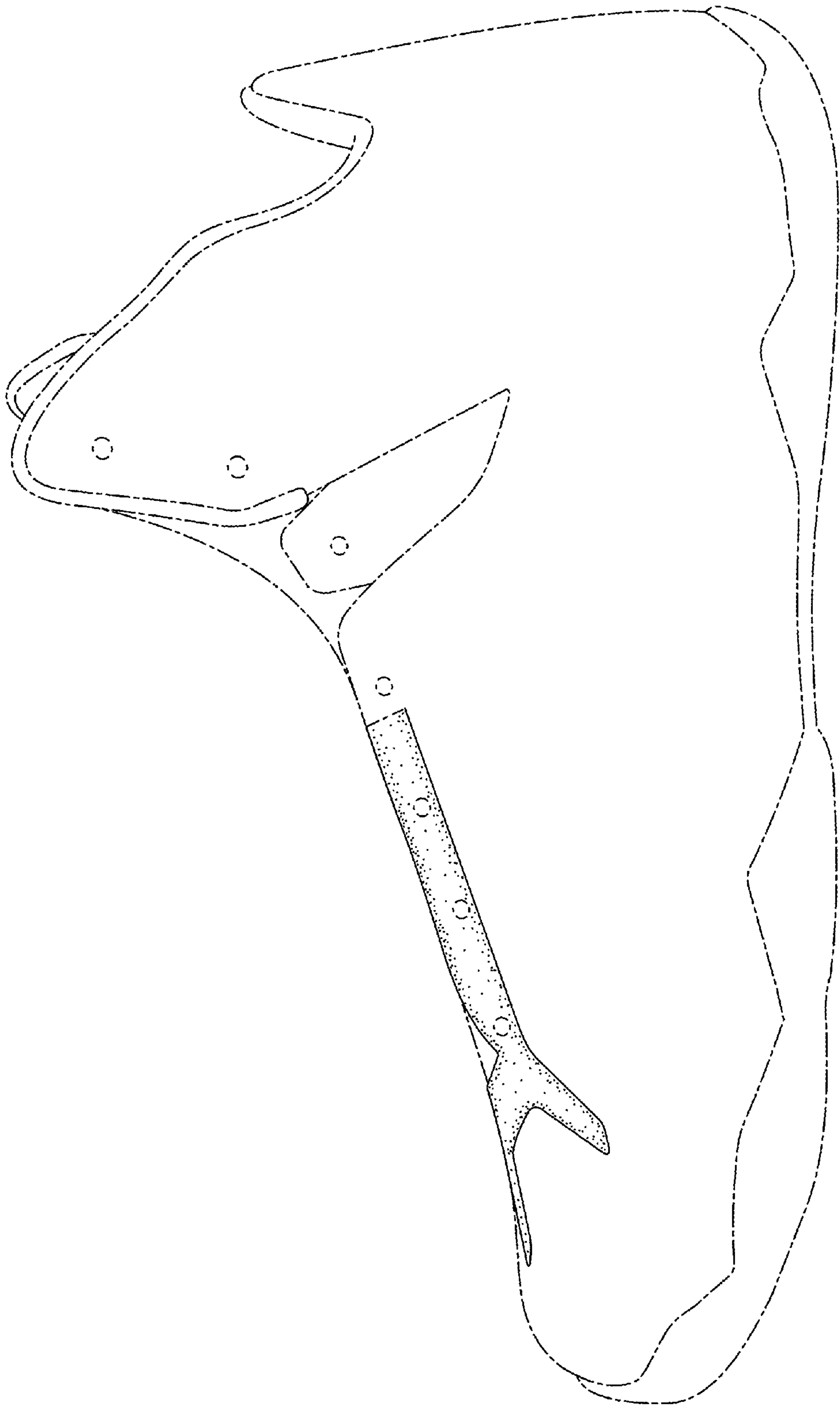

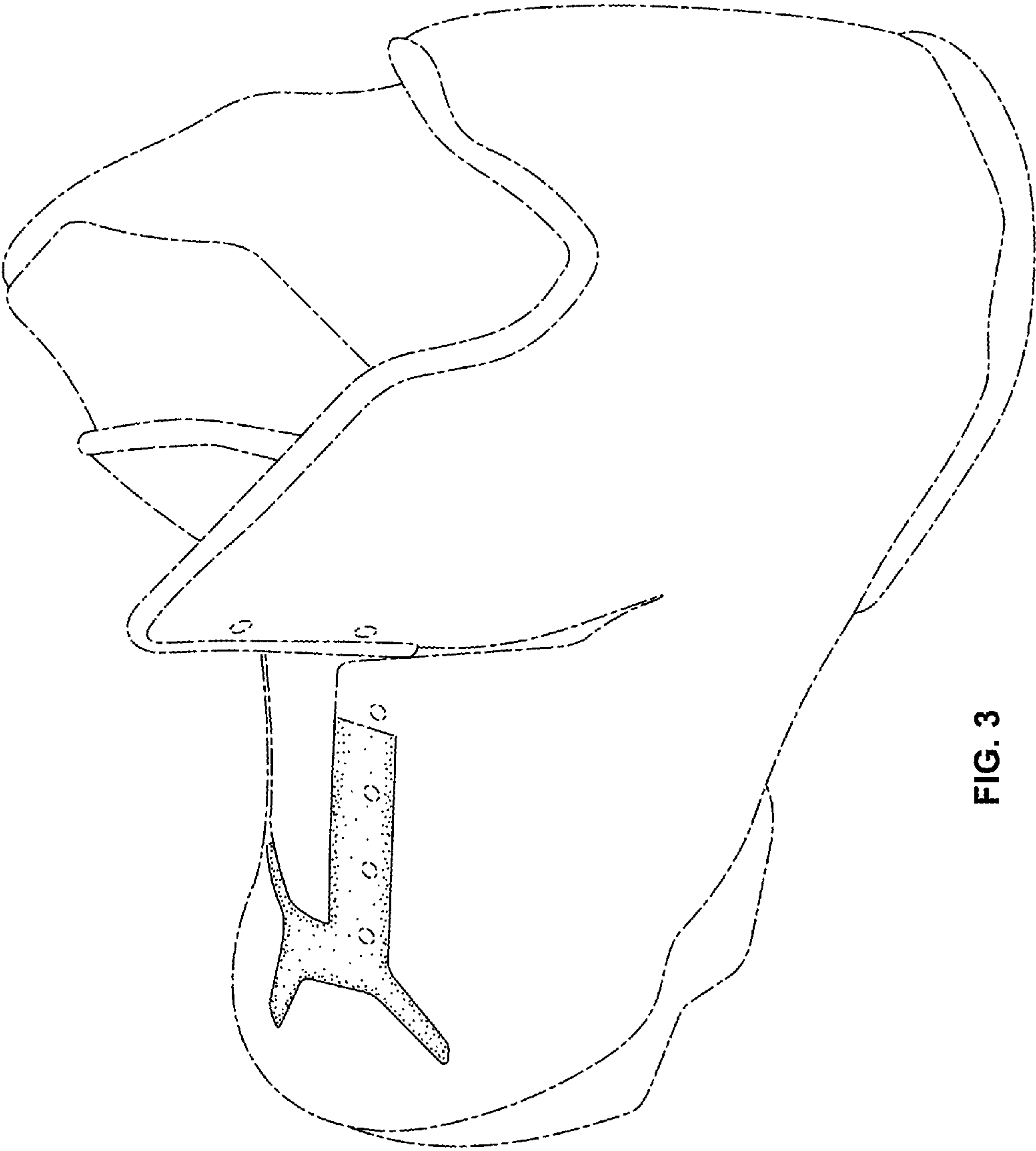

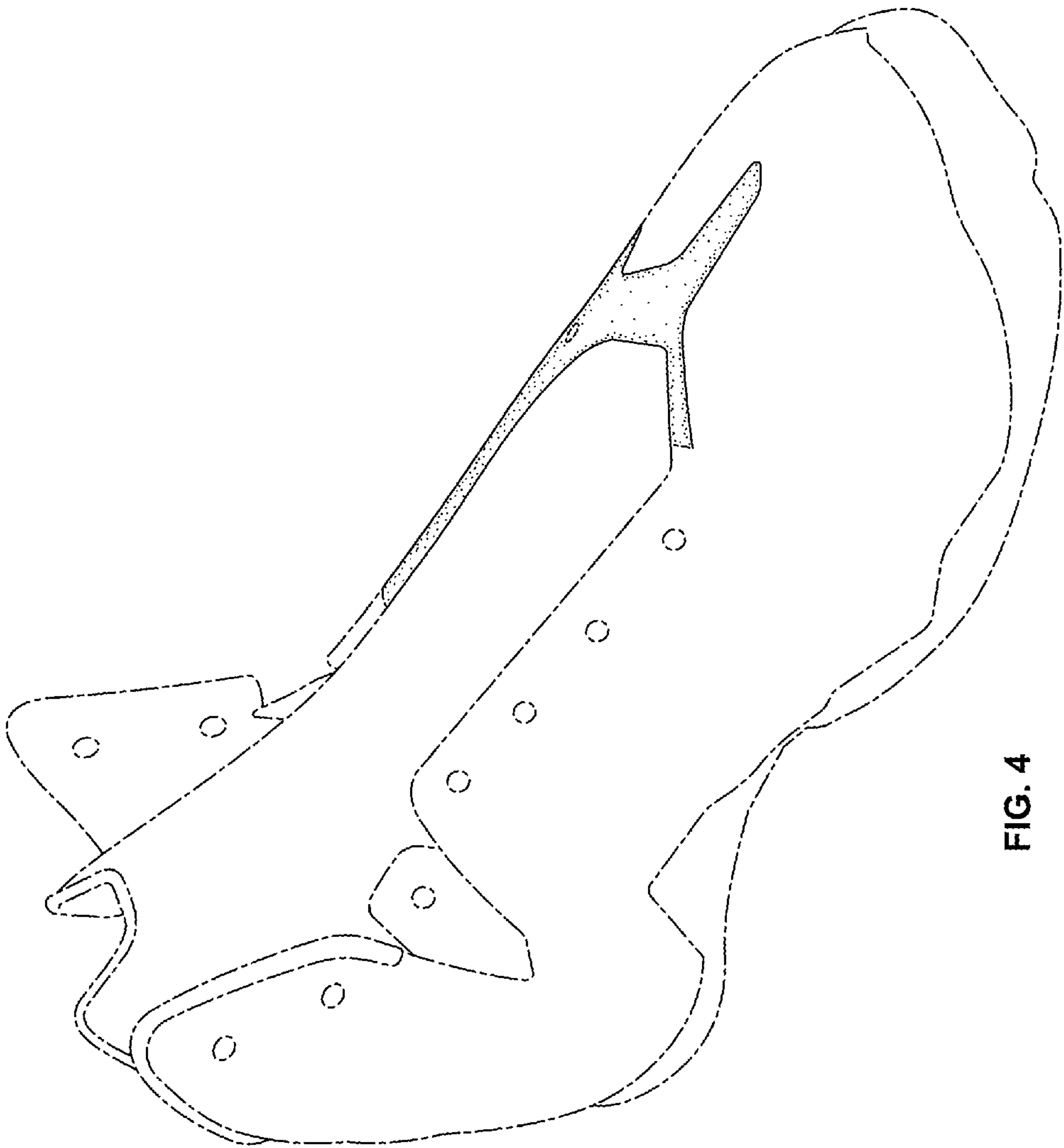
