FIG. 4 is a rear view of FIG. 1.

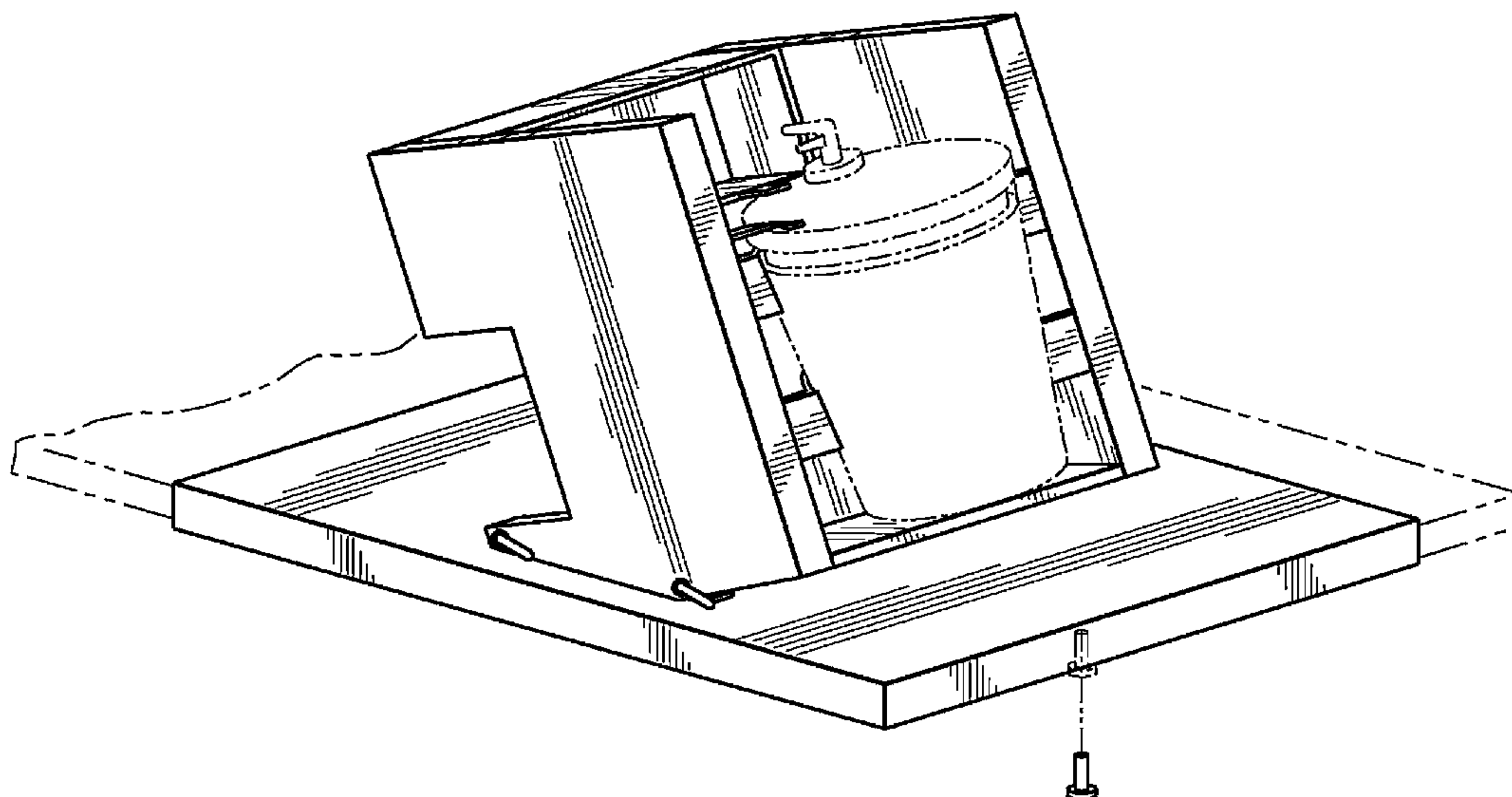
FIG. 5 is a front view of FIG. 3; and,

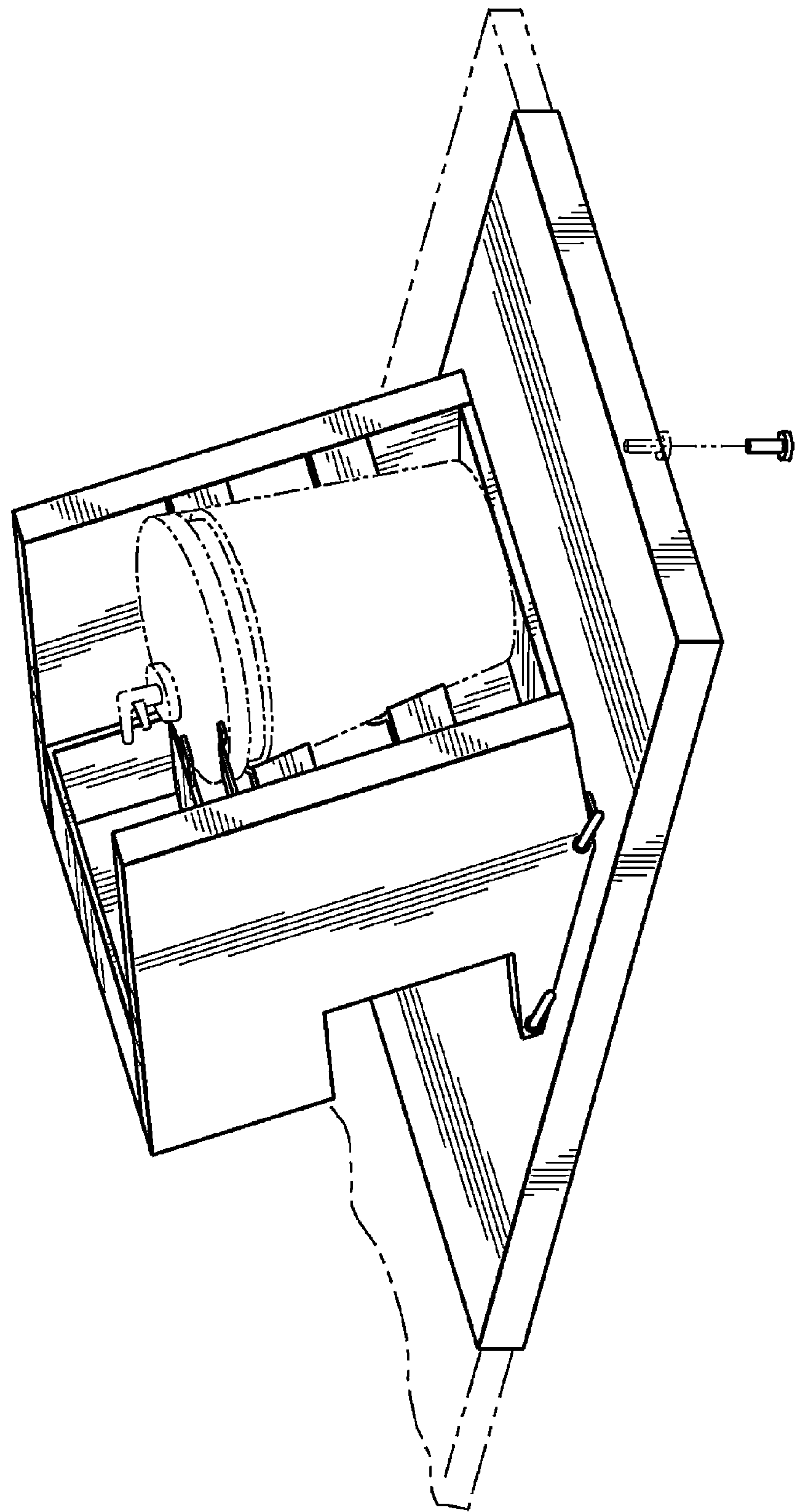

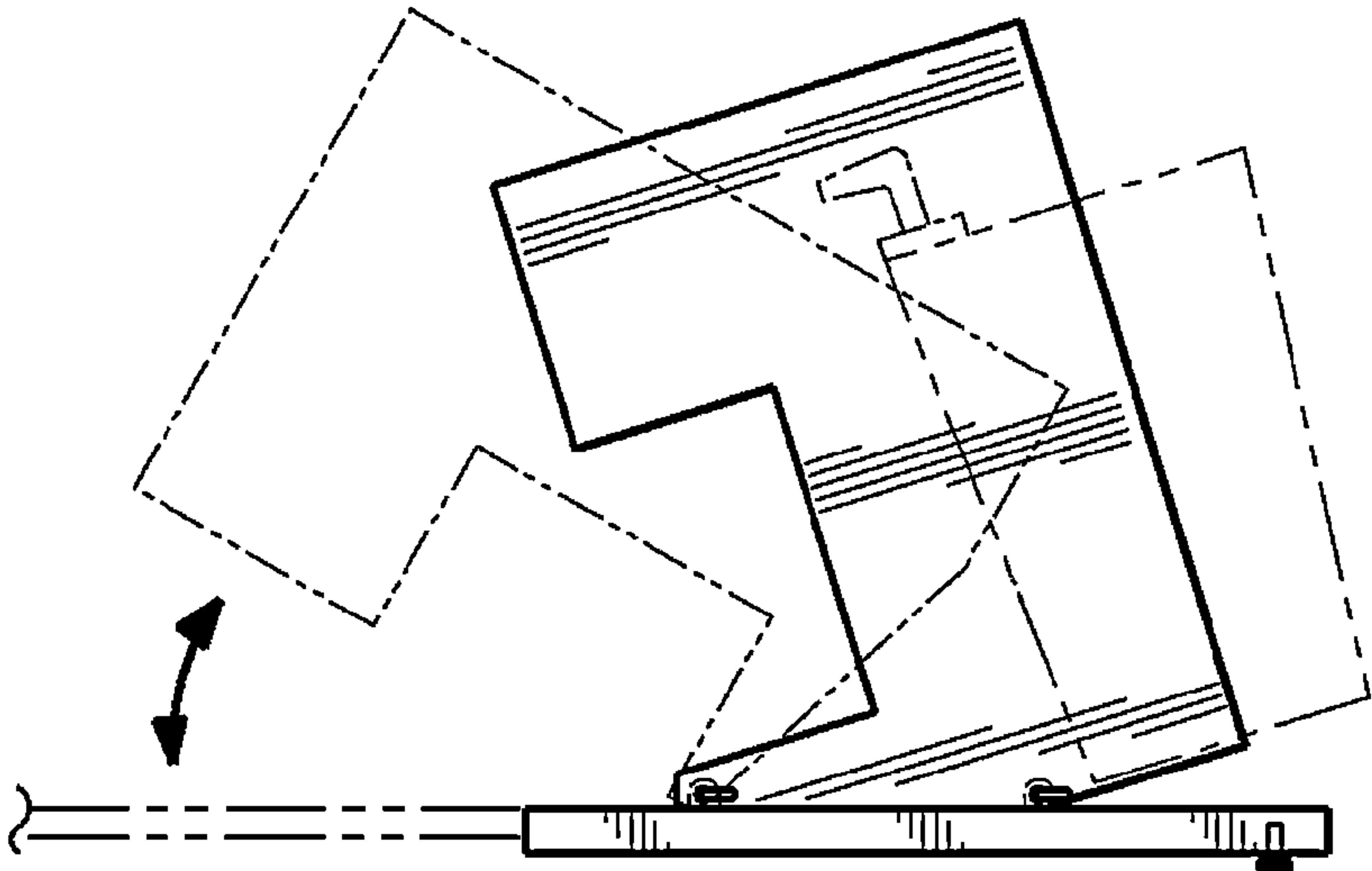

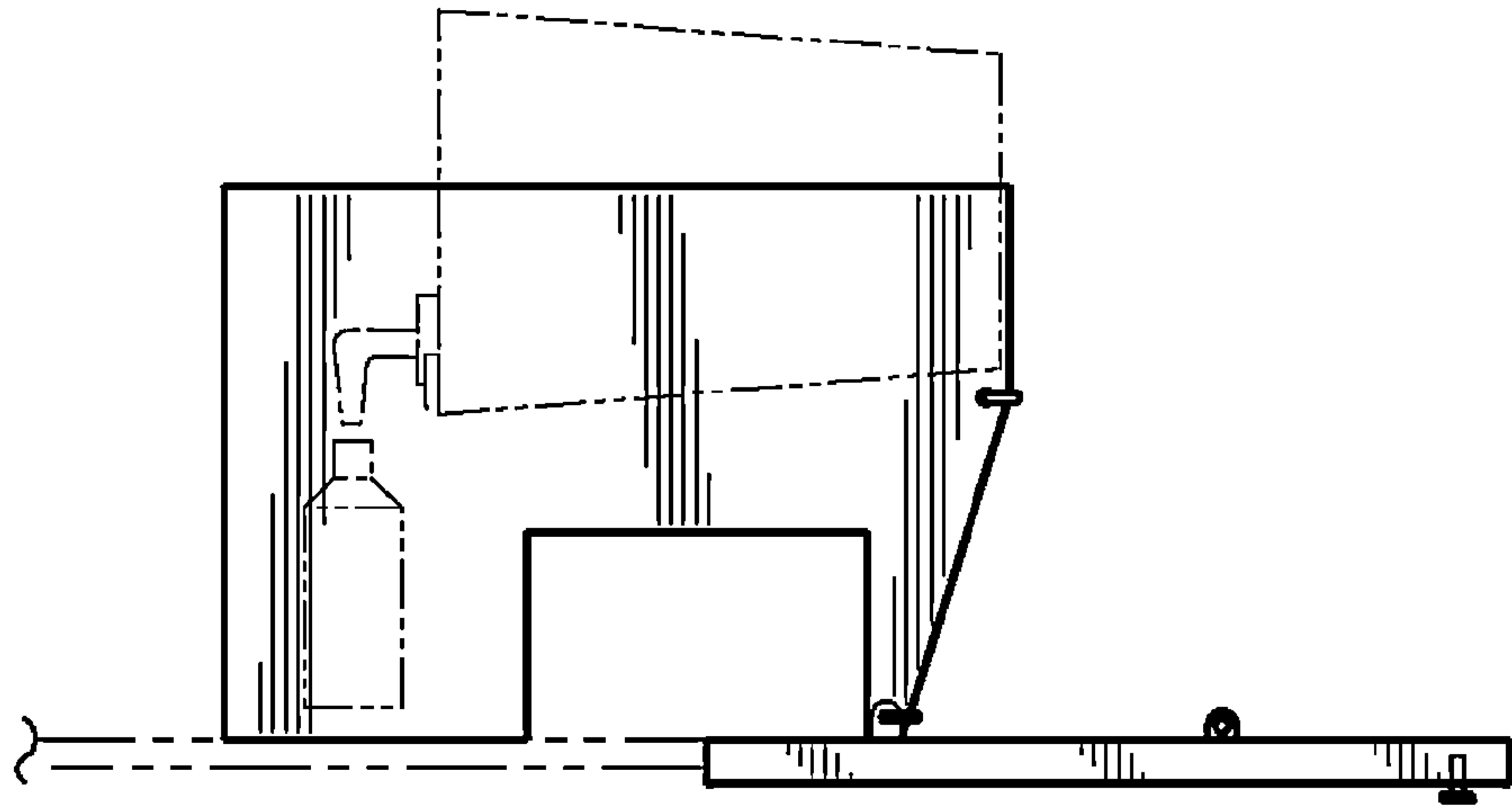

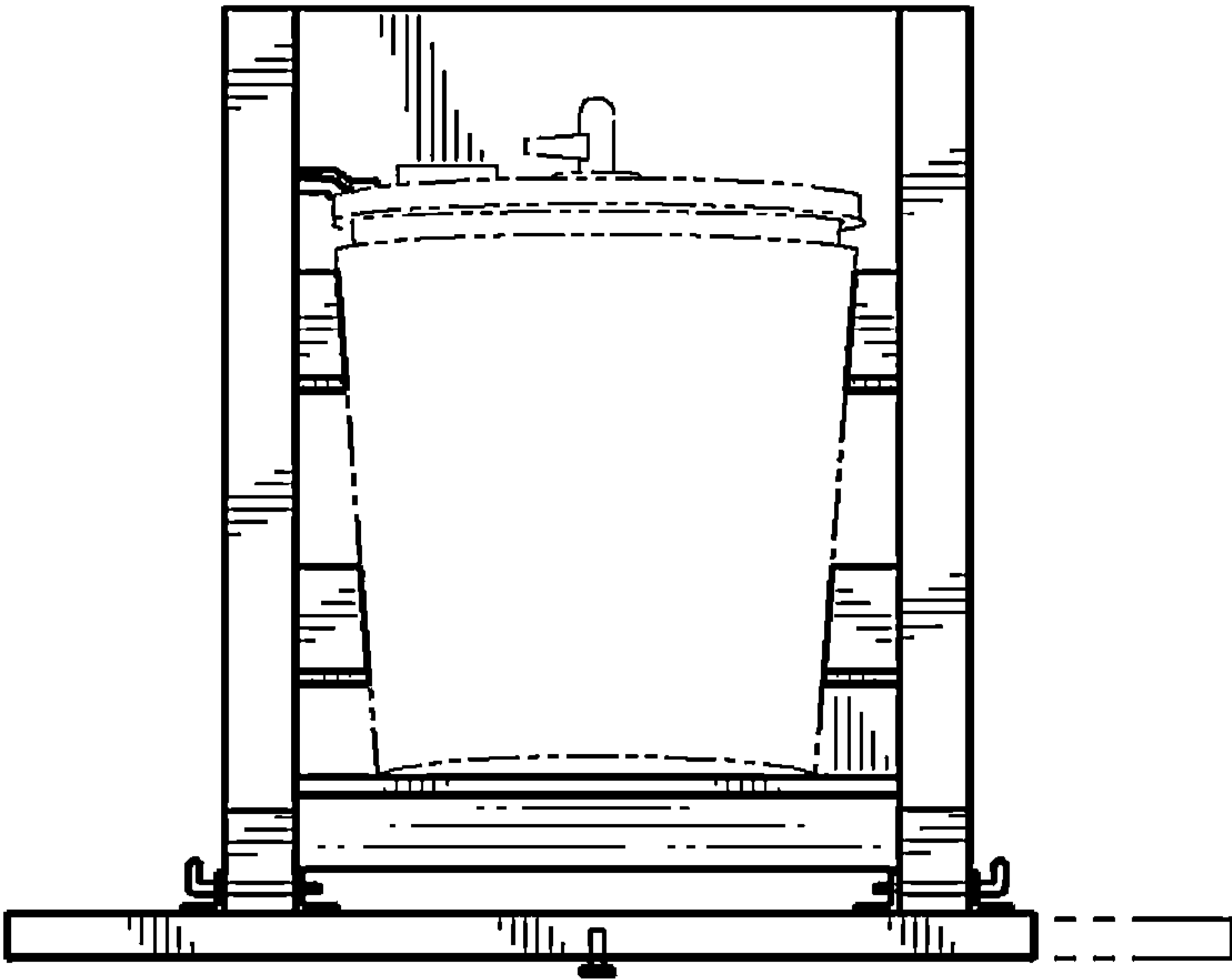

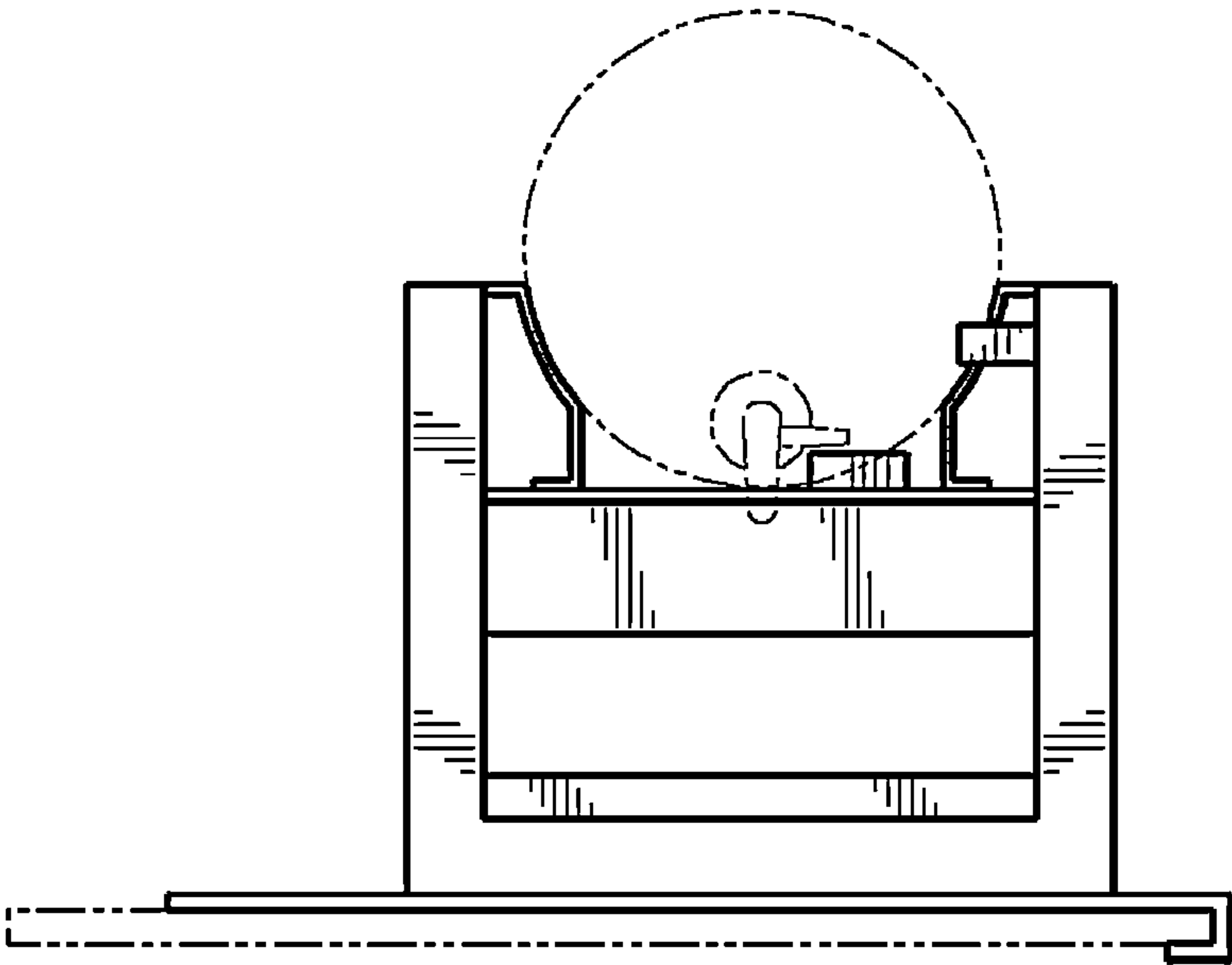

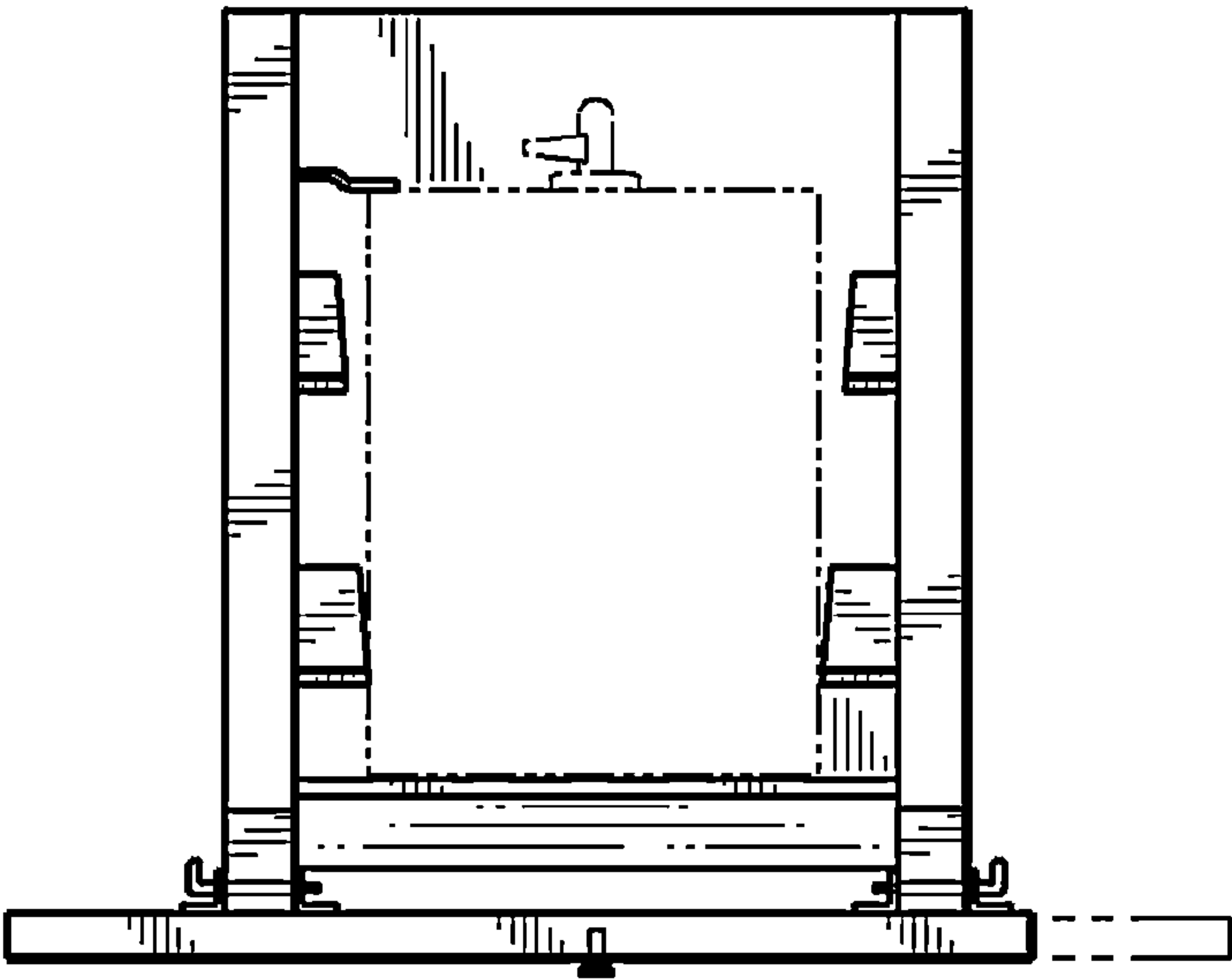
